I inquired as to whether or not they were in receipt of the evidence from police and state's attorney. Mr. Malley advised that they had received it all. I requested Mr. Malley to have all the evidence shipped via courier at the earliest possible time in the a. m. Mr. Malley advised that they were still going over the material that they had received from the police and that it would take several hours more to complete it. Mr. Malley was requested to have this material brought to the Bureau immediately upon completion of their review. The importance of Bureau receiving the third shell casing that was found in the place of employment of Oswald was explained. Mr. Malley said they had this shell and it would be included in the material sent.

He was advised that Inspector Moore of Domestic Intelligence Division would also be calling him requesting specific information that was needed for the preparation of these reports. Mr. Malley was requested to alert New Orleans that there would also be investigation needed there relative to the background investigation and finances of Oswald. It was explained to Mr. Malley that while it was recognized that the investigation into the finances was underway that the tempo would have to be considerably stepped up.

Following the conference with the Director, Inspector J. R. Malley was telephonically contacted and the information relayed to him that with respect to the investigation in both the Oswald and Ruby matters it must be completed at the earliest possible time in order that the reports on both of these individuals can be completed here at the Seat of Government without fail by Friday, 11/29/63. I advised Mr. Malley of the instructions of the Director and the importance that must be attached to the completion of these documents. Mr. Malley was advised that in working on material here at the Bureau leads which must be covered immediately would arise. Mr. Malley advised that he understood the situation and would do everything in his power to see that the end was accomplished.

Memorandum to Mr. Rosen  
Re: Assassination of President Kennedy

The only additional evidence that we would not have that could be used for exhibits in the report we are preparing would be the palm print of Oswald found and identified by the Dallas Police Department on a box on which it is believed Oswald sat while awaiting the arrival of the President. The other item was a map that the police had that showed drawings of the route of the Presidential parade with significant markings in the area of the locale where the assassination took place.

At this time, Mr. Malley advised that they had received a call from a person who refused to identify himself but gave information to the effect that Braniff Airways had several checks given to them by Oswald which apparently were no good. Malley stated that Dallas would be at the Braniff Airways as soon as the office opened in the a. m. and would make inquiry relative to these checks and if such checks were in existence they would obtain same.

Mr. Hoover called and advised that since receipt of this cablegram from the Ambassador in Mexico City he is very much concerned. He suggested that we should send an Agent immediately to Mexico to explode or to prove this situation completely. He instructed that arrangements be made to get an Agent to Mexico as quickly as possible and an Agent who has some background knowledge of the case and internal security and can speak Spanish.

Mr. Hoover was informed we would immediately get on this, find an Agent who can meet these requirements and get him en route as quickly as possible.

Dear Mr. Beach:

Unfortunately your letter of November 22nd indicates unfamiliarity with our jurisdiction.

At this time in the Nation's bereavement, I am disturbed by your unfounded accusation of negligence and feel it necessary to inform you that the protection of the President and his immediate family is the responsibility of the Secret Service of the United States Treasury Department and not the FBI. Secret Service Agents were with the President at the time he was assassinated.

The President has now instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibility in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

In addition, Mr. Malley advised that a student by the name of Saylor (ph) currently at Denton State Teachers College, Denton, Texas, supposedly has a photograph of the building showing two individuals standing in the window. The Dallas Office is currently attempting to locate Saylor through the Registrar's Office this evening and will verify this story and obtain the

The Dallas Office, however, has a photograph which was turned over by the Dallas Morning News, which photograph was taken by a news reporter. This photograph shows two colored individuals in adjoining windows on the fifth floor of the building apparently observing the parade. One of the two individuals depicted there has been interviewed and he advises that he heard three shots which seemed to have been fired from over his head.

Inspector J. R. Malley at 10:00 P.M., this date, contacted the Bureau and advised that the Dallas Office during this date has received many calls from the press concerning a photograph showing two persons in a window of the building from which the President was allegedly shot. The indication was that a French sailor was observing the parade and while he was winding his camera accidentally triggered the mechanism. He obtained a photograph of two individuals standing in the window of the building. The Dallas Office does not have a copy of this photograph.

Attached hereto are two photographs obtained from Mr. C. Q. Smith of the Administrative Division which were blown up from an 8 mm movie film. The photographs depict four sets of windows. The window in the lower right-hand corner of the picture indicates two individuals in the window. These two individuals are on the fifth floor of the building and according to ASAC Clark, both individuals have been identified and interviewed. Directly above this set of windows is another window which is partly opened and shows a box in the window. It is from this window that the bullet was fired which assassinated the President.

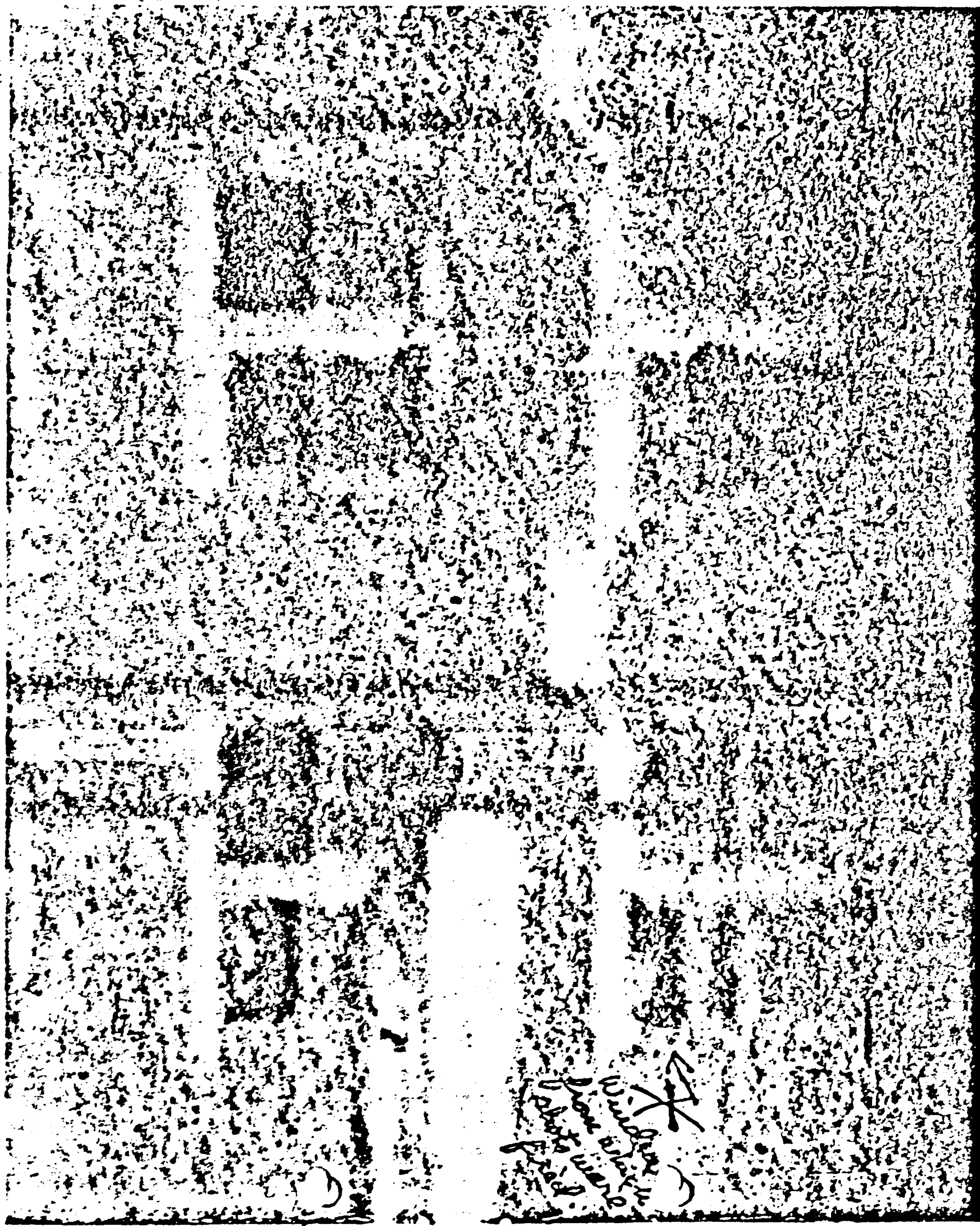

I advised Mr. Jenkins that I gathered they were not going to carry the editorial but, after the definite commitment Friendly gave us this morning, he has weakened down; he is now going through the action of an adult holding candy before a child and wanting him to beg for it. I said the thing we must do is go ahead and get the reports completed and get them ready for release as soon as possible; when we come to the matter of the release, I know how the President feels about its being released over here.

Mr. Walter Jenkins at the White House returned my earlier call. I told him I wanted to let him know later developments at the Post. I advised him that Mr. Friendly, who had given us a definite commitment that the editorial they were thinking of printing would not be run, later called back and said he was sorry but he had probably spoken too hastily because, when he took it up with Mr. Wiggins, Mr. Wiggins said no definite commitment could be given; that the arguments we had advanced as to why there should not be an editorial along that line they were quite impressed with but felt they owed the public the duty to keep the public advised and informed. Memorandum for Messrs. Tolson, Belmont, Mohr, Conrad, DeLoach, Evans, Rosen, Sullivan

Mr. Jenkins then stated that he told the President what I had said and that I personally felt that it should be released by the White House, and the President said he was inclined to go along with me whenever and whatever he can.

I said I talked to Mr. Katzenbach and he feels it should not be released by the Attorney General. I further stated I did not think the Bureau should release it but I thought, when we get it finished, we, of course, will send a copy to Mr. Jenkins and to the Attorney General and the decision can be made as to the release.

Mr. Jenkins then brought up the Texas Attorney General's announcement of a court of special inquiry today. I told Mr. Jenkins that I understood Wade was hopping mad at the issuance of such a statement; in the first place he was going to present the case to a grand jury tomorrow morning and will have an indictment against Ruby by 8:30 tomorrow morning; that he was not enthusiastic about a court of inquiry; that he had said he hoped the release of the report would not be made by Bobby Kennedy or by that "dumbbell" who calls himself the Attorney General of Texas.

I said it seemed to me they are going to get this indictment on Ruby tomorrow; that Ruby has five lawyers representing him there; that some bondsmen out in Los Angeles, California, has indicated they are willing to make whatever bond is necessary no matter how high. I advised Mr. Jenkins that we are checking out the background of the bondsmen and that I had told our Dallas Office to get the background on the Dallas lawyers representing him.

Mr. Jenkins noted that I had told him yesterday of some rumors that Ruby had underworld connections in Chicago. I mentioned that someone in union actively was killed and three or four were arrested, including Ruby, but he was only held one night. I said we were running out today his connections with hoodlums in Chicago; that he was not of any high caliber; that in Dallas the reports were the same; that he is kind of a police character and, therefore, they would probably let him in. I indicated that Wade, the District Attorney, said he did not know him and had not seen him until he saw him there at police headquarters.

Mr. Jenkins inquired if I knew that Wade used to be one of my men. I said I did not know this. Mr. Jenkins said he roomed with Wade in 1938, and he was working for me at the time. I told Mr. Jenkins that I had not heard that; that I would check on that; that Wade has handled himself pretty well; that he first said the investigation was closed and then

I called Supervisor James L. Handley and told him the wire in from the Embassy in Mexico City gives me a little bit of concern because, when I turned down the request to send someone down there yesterday, I had not received any such wire as that. I said he may be one of those pseudo investigators, a Sherlock Holmes, but that he has made a lot of statements which, if true, throw an entirely different light on the whole picture. I said I wondered if we shouldn't send someone down to Mexico City who is familiar with the case at this end and who preferably understands and speaks Spanish. Mr. Handley said he didn't think we would have anything to lose.

I asked Mr. Handley if we have anybody available who speaks Spanish, and he indicated he would check at once to see who is available. I instructed Mr. Handley to make the arrangement, preferably someone who speaks Spanish. Mr. Handley indicated he thought it should be a security agent. I said yes, we should take somebody in security work and preferably who knows Spanish and at the same time knows the case, who can assist and help our Legal Attache down there because regardless of what the report shows, with all the details given, if we haven't gone into them and exploded them, the Ambassador may some day decide to write a book and show what he pulled this Government of and that no action was taken.

DATE: November 23, 1963

Chief Curry, NA, at approximately 11:25 a. m. this morning, made varying statements as to the FBI's failure to keep the Dallas Police Department advised regarding the background and whereabouts of Oswald. Chief Curry, while being interviewed on television, also from United Press International attributed to Curry, made generally the following allegations:

(1) The FBI customarily advises Dallas Police whenever an individual of subversive background arrives in Dallas.

(2) The FBI recently interviewed Lee Harvey Oswald.

(3) The FBI had Oswald under surveillance in Dallas, however, did not notify the Dallas Police.

The Director was immediately advised of these allegations. Pursuant to instructions, SAC Shanklin was telephonically contacted and instructed to contact Chief Curry and set him straight regarding these allegations. I told SAC Shanklin that

Curry should get back on television, and should also inform the wire services, immediately of the falsity of his statements. I told SAC Shanklin that if Chief Curry did not take this action we would issue a statement here in Washington putting the lie to his false statements. Shanklin stated he would do this immediately. I asked him if he knew why Chief Curry would make such stupid statements. Shanklin stated that Curry was usually very cooperative, a very good friend of the FBI, however, did not think very fast and obviously made the above statements without giving any thought to the repercussions. I told Shanklin to call me back after he had talked to Chief Curry.

SAC Shanklin called back within fifteen minutes and stated he had discussed this matter with Chief Curry and that Curry had agreed to make the retractions in question. Curry apologized to Shanklin and told him he did not mean to place any blame on the FBI. I told SAC Shanklin that regardless of Curry's statements if Curry did not follow through, he should contact Curry again within thirty minutes.

At approximately 1:15 p. m., NBC Television quoted Curry as stating he had not meant to imply that the FBI had failed to keep the Dallas Police informed. Curry was further quoted as stating that the cooperation between the FBI and the Dallas Police was excellent, that the FBI had proved thoroughly cooperative. He stated that the FBI was under no responsibility to report to the Dallas Police any individuals of subversive backgrounds who might be in Dallas. He also was quoted as stating that he had not meant to imply that the FBI had Oswald under surveillance or that the FBI had recently interviewed Oswald. He stated that to his knowledge the FBI did not have Oswald under surveillance.

Chief Curry also gave the same report to the radio networks and this was heard both here in Washington and by SAC Shanklin in Dallas.

We, of course, were not satisfied with the above retractions. In an effort to further cover this matter, we called our sources at both United Press International and the Associated Press and talked with them on a confidential basis. They immediately called their representatives in Dallas and instructed them to contact Curry and get him on the record in repudiating the above false allegations. I also called Jerry O'Leary of the "Washington Evening Star" who is in Dallas at the present time. He agreed to contact Chief Curry immediately and get Curry on the record regarding the falsity of the above allegations.

Messrs. Belmont and Mohr were kept advised of the above activities.

There is attached a UPI item released as of 2:27 p.m. reflecting as follows: "Police at first said the FBI, knowing of Oswald and his procommunist, pro-Castro background, had questioned him a week ago in Dallas. Later the Police with-drew the statement as not in accordance with facts." O'Leary of the "Evening Star" article putting Chief Curry on record as stating that there was a misunderstanding. Curry told O'Leary that he had not meant to place any blame upon the FBI and that the FBI had been of great assistance to the police. Curry further told O'Leary that "some-one last night told him the FBI had recently interviewed Oswald." Curry added that he now knows this to be false and that he had issued appropriate retractions to the wire services, television and radio representatives. He also stated that he had not meant to imply that the FBI had Oswald under surveillance and that he had now indicated publicly the fact that this was not true as well as the fact that the FBI had no obligation to advise the Dallas Police whenever an individual of Oswald's background arrived in Dallas. O'Leary is preparing an article and will definitely straighten out this matter.

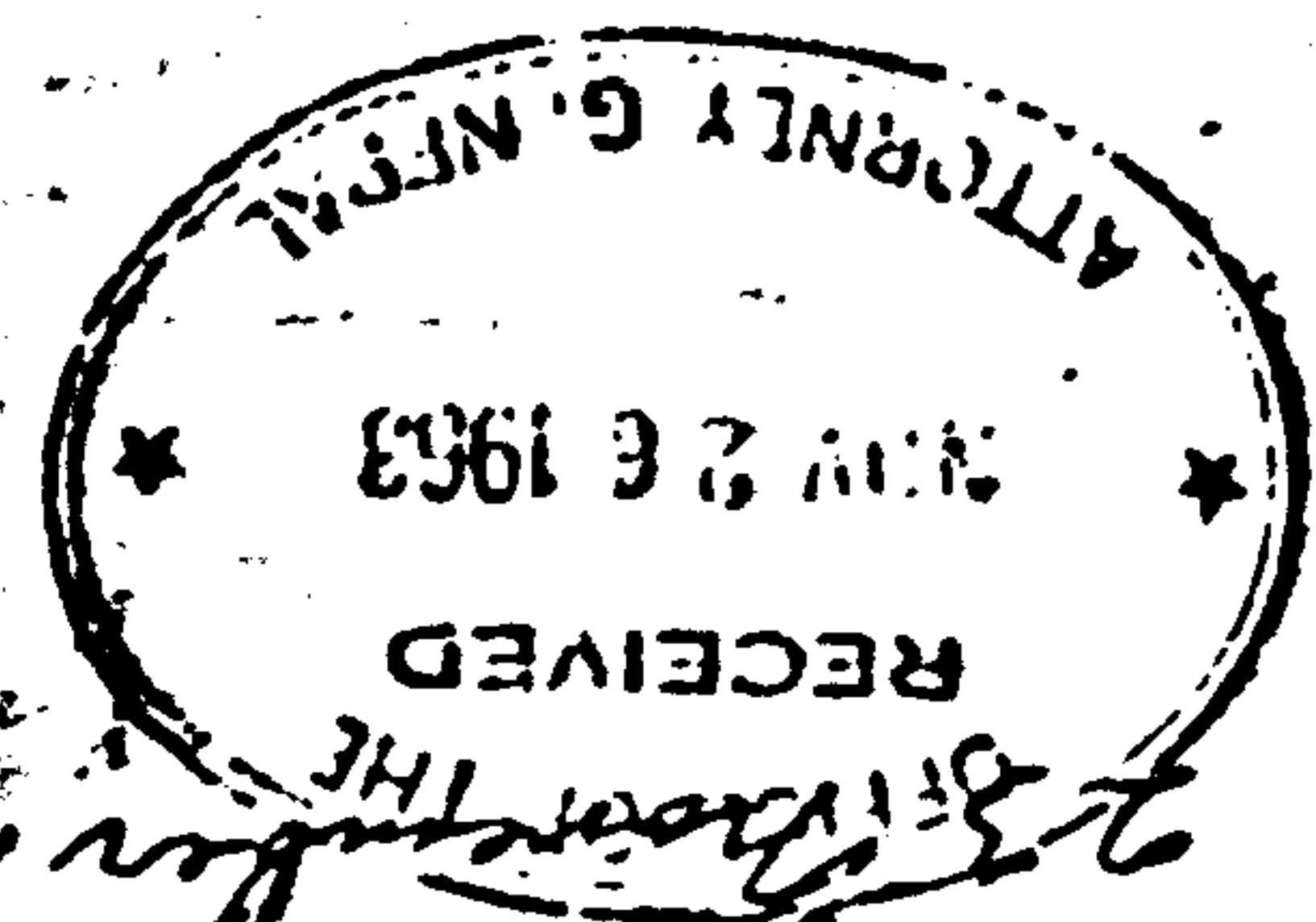

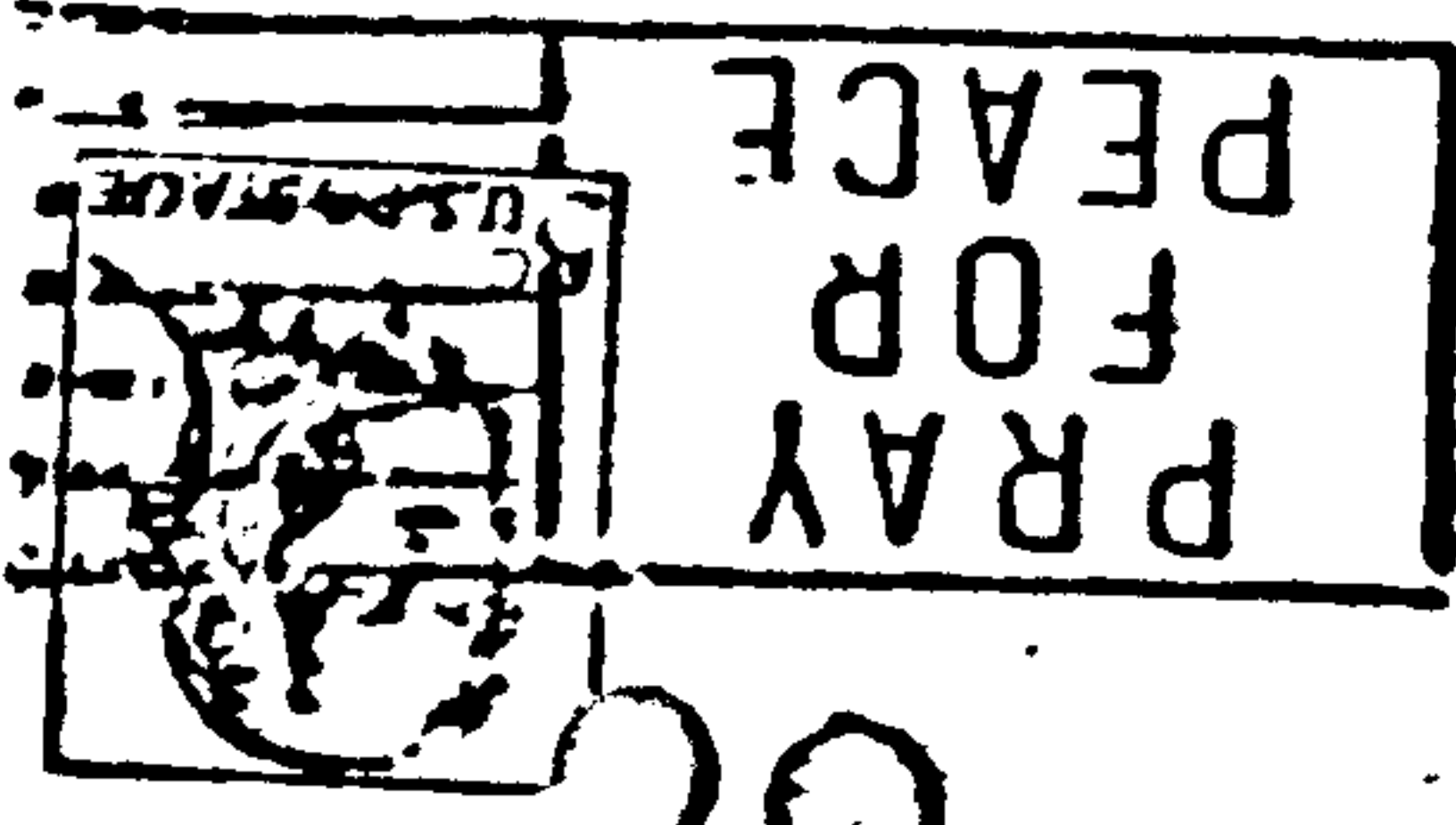

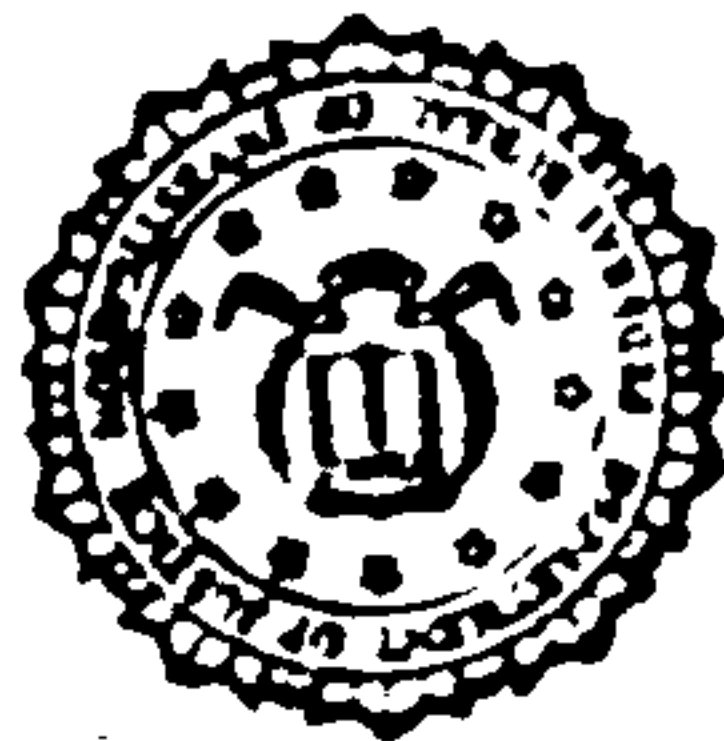
On November 26, 1963, Mrs. RAYMOND SMITH, 35 Melville Street, Stratford, Connecticut, telephone number 378-7413, advised as follows:

Early in September, 1963, a man contacted her while she was in the driveway of her home seeking information about renting a house, rooms or apartment on Melville Street. Mrs. SMITH stated she knew of no such place for rent. The man returned to a station wagon with a Texas registration which Mrs. SMITH believed was 2995. There was a woman, a small child and baggage of some kind in the station wagon. The car remained in the vicinity for about a half hour and then left.

Mrs. SMITH stated that after having seen the photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD that appeared in the local press, she believed that it looked somewhat like the individual whom she had seen early in September, 1963, driving the above station wagon. She described the man as about 5'7", 130 pounds, dark hair, clean shaven, fair complexion, and a Texas drawl.
