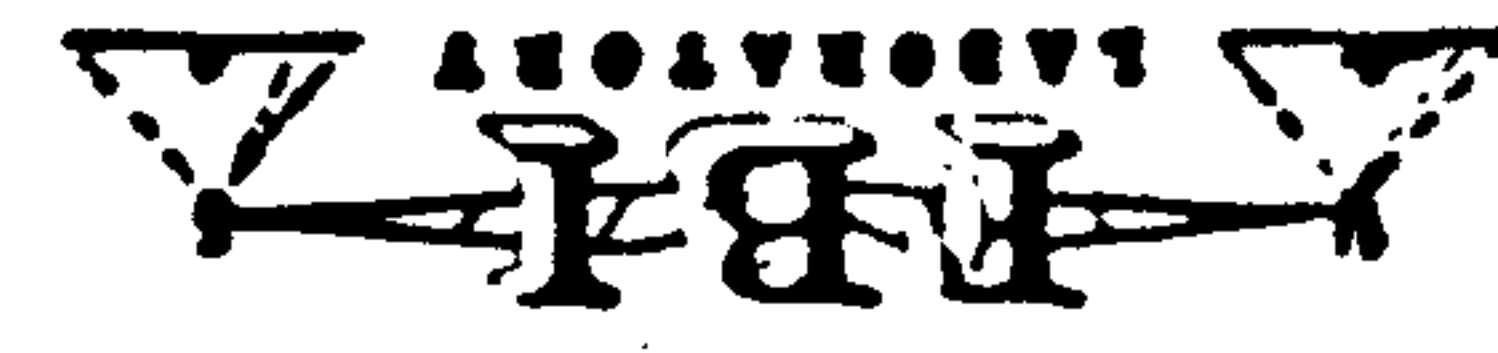

Reference is made to the memorandum from Mr. Rosen to Mr. Belmont dated 11/23/63, in the above-captioned matter. This memorandum recorded a telephone call received at the Bureau from Adam Vermojinsky, Department of Defense. He indicated that in connection with Oswald, another individual comes to mind, namely, Nicholas Petruili, a Korean War defector.

Bureau files show Petruili renounced his U. S. citizenship while in Moscow as a tourist on 9/3/59 and returned to the U. S. on 9/22/63. The Director asked if it is accepted practice by State Department to allow individuals who have renounced their citizenship to return to U. S.

On 11/25/63, instant matter was discussed by Liaison Agent Bartlett with Mr. Joseph W. Scott, Deputy Director, Bureau of Intelligence and Research, State. Mr. Scott said that he would immediately check into this matter and would advise as soon as he obtained the facts.

In view of recent developments it is believed that subject's condition has caused him to increase his calls to the Philadelphia Office and that the assassination of President KENNEDY may possibly upset his mental stability. SA EDWARD A. SMITH advised SA GEORGE MESSAROS of Secret Service Detail in Philadelphia on 11/25/63, and one copy of letterhead memo is being disseminated to Secret Service, Philadelphia.

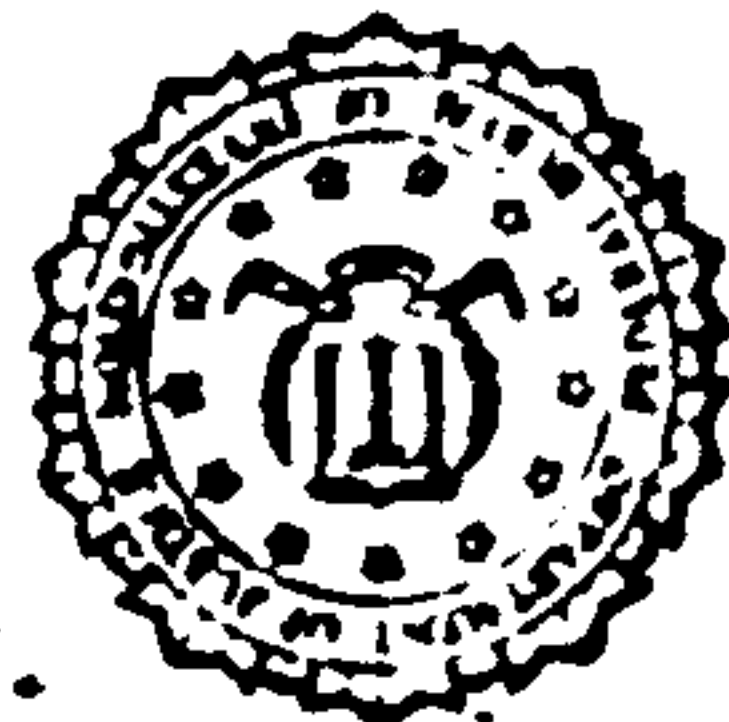

DOMINIC DI PERZIO

On November 23, 1963, DOMINIC DI PERZIO telephonically contacted the Philadelphia Office of the FBI and advised inconspicuously about the location of his money.

On November 25, 1963, DOMINIC DI PERZIO telephonically contacted the Philadelphia Office at least twice times in a one hour period between 7 p.m. and 8 p.m., and demanded that his name be taken off the records that pertained to his case; that he be assured of his civil rights. On several occasions he screamed "I'm going to..." and mumbled incoherently. DI PERZIO ranted and raved in a high voice on all of his calls.

On November 25, 1963, a Special Agent of the Secret Service was furnished the above information.

DOMINIC DI PERZIO, 2921 North Van Ness Street, Philadelphia, Pa., was committed to the Philadelphia General Hospital for psychiatric treatment after making numerous calls to the Philadelphia office of the Secret Service. On February 17, 1958, Dr. DAVID W. WYCOFF, Chief, Psychiatric Division, Philadelphia General Hospital, advised that it was his professional opinion that the subject was of the paranoid psychiatric type who was chronically ill and incapable of giving a coherent story.

On March 30, 1963, a Special Agent of the FBI received a call from DI PERZIO who stated "You're not going to put me away again." He indicated he had been released

From a central institution. Since this time he has made repeated calls to the FBI regarding about the FBI, the Soviet Service and the police.

Based on the comparison of Qc31 with other photographs of the murder rifle, it has been determined that the rifle shown in Qc31 is similar in all respects and possibly depicts the same rifle. There is a rather long cut mark on the stock of the murder weapon just above the trigger guard; and by the use of highlighting, a mark was located on the rifle in the photograph Qc31, which supports the possibility that they are one and the same.

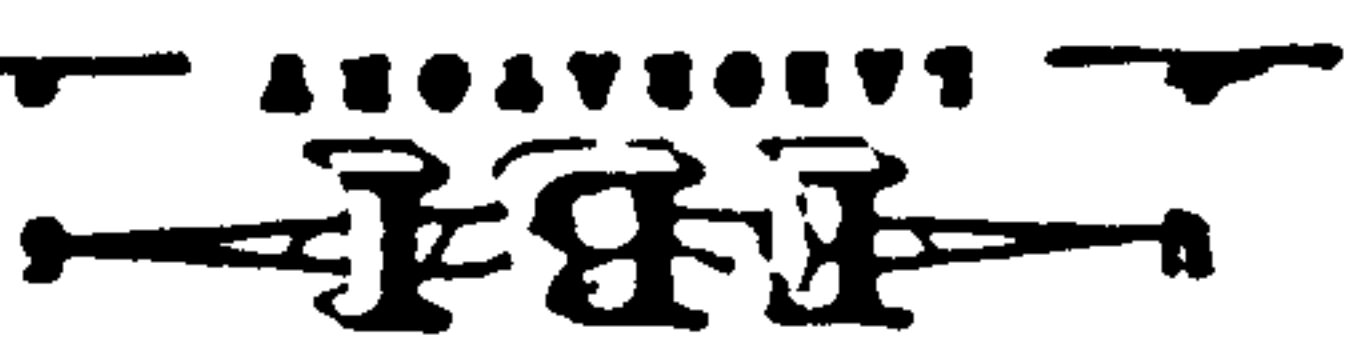

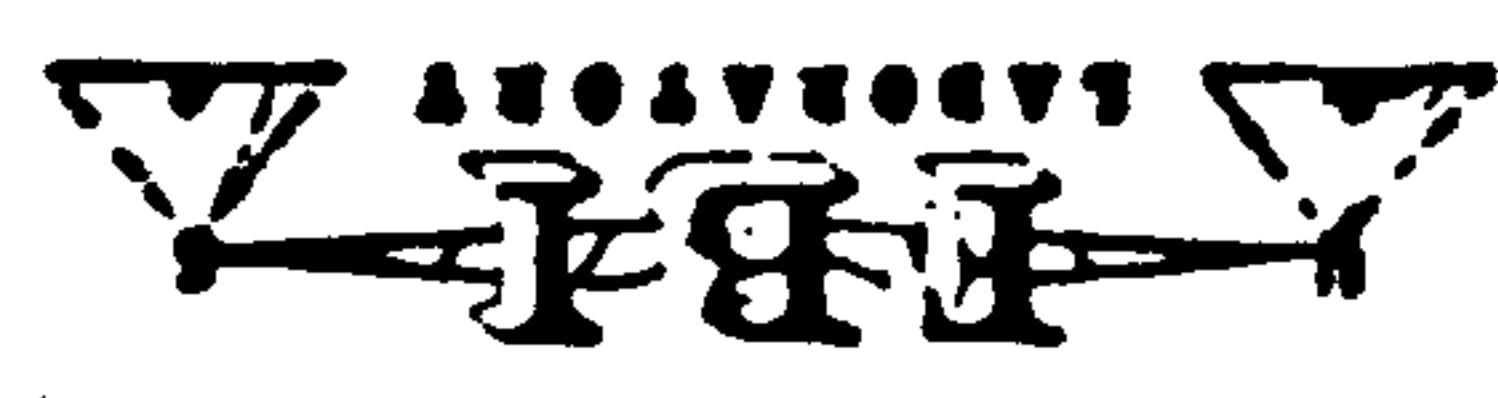

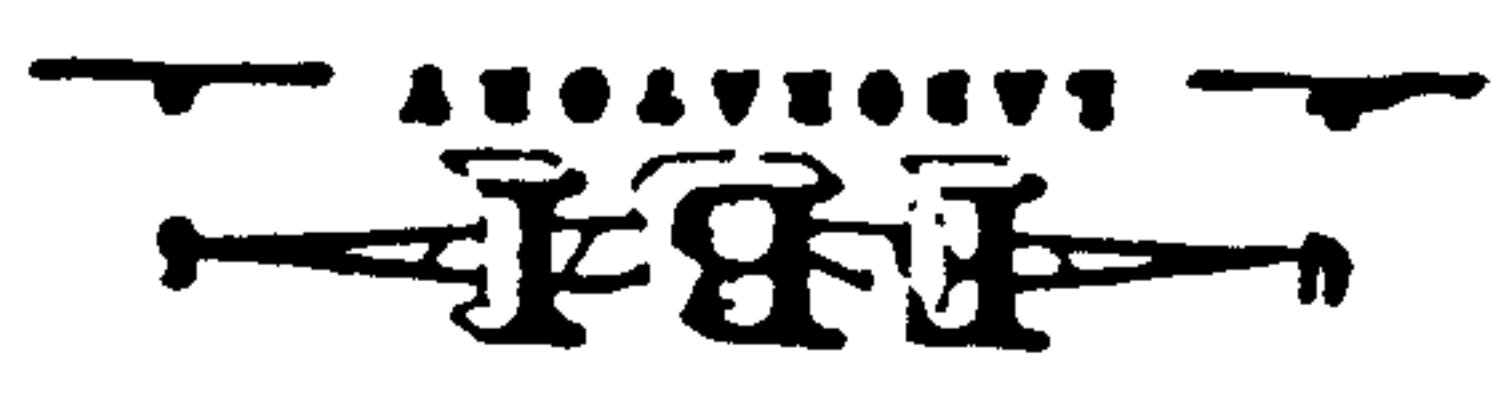

Your letter of November 22nd has been received, and I want you to know all of us in the FBI certainly share your concern over the brutal assassination of President Kennedy. The President has instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibilities in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

I would like to point out that your statements regarding certain organizations pertain to a legislative matter. I have always refrained from injecting the FBI or myself into such questions; therefore, I will not be able to comment on your remarks. Within the Department of Justice, it is the function of the Attorney General to comment on the advisability of legislation.

Inasmuch as both of the Secret Service Agents advised that they had to be on duty at 6:00 a. m. on the following morning and it was then after 11:30 at night, it was decided to obtain clearance through Mr. Rowley on the following morning. SA Orrin Bartlett was contacted and he in turn contacted Mr. Rowley who acquiesced to this request immediately. Arrangements were made whereby these Agents of the Baltimore Territory Resident Agency, Hyattsville, would interview both of the Secret Service Agents at the Secret Service Office at the White House at 2:15 p. m. today. SAC Tully was advised of this appointment and

Subsequently, the Resident Agency in Hyattsville telephonically advised that they had contacted Kellerman and while he had no objection to talking to them he would have to get clearance from his superior. Greer advised the same. After contacting superiors, it was further advised that such interviews would have to be cleared through Chief of the Secret Service, Mr. Rowley.

After a discussion with Assistant to the Director Belmont regarding this matter, it was agreed that it might be well to interview these men merely to plug up any holes. Subsequent to the conversation with Mr. Belmont, ASAC Hall of the Baltimore Office was contacted and was advised to have the Agents try to interview Secret Service Agents Kellerman and Greer.

SAC Ed Tully of the Baltimore Office called and inquired as to whether or not an interview with the two Secret Service Agents who were in the car with the President when he was killed was desired. Mr. Tully advised that two Agents spent many hours with the two Secret Service men at the Bethesda Hospital while the autopsy of the President was being performed. He advised that while the Agents talked to these Secret Service Agents generally it could not be considered a specific interview as to what had happened.

ACTION:

The Agent politely advised Brown that the Bureau could not furnish any such guidance and that we were very definitely in no position to predict the exact behavior of any U. S. citizens reacting to the assassination of the President.

He stated that ten Soviet scientists are currently visiting the U. S. and are touring AEC installations. Their visit is related to a reciprocal agreement made approximately one year ago between the U. S. and Russia. AEC is somewhat concerned about the safety of these visitors in the event that there is a wave of public indignation against Soviet Russia assuming it is established that Lee Oswald assassinated the President. Brown referred to newspaper reports indicating that Oswald had defected to Russia. Brown wanted to know if the Bureau could give AEC any guidance relative to the protection of the visiting Soviets.

On 11/23/63, Howard Brown of the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) (attached to Seaborg's Office), telephonically advised Agent Pappich as follows:

Enclosed for the Bureau are two copies and for Dallas 25 copies of an FD 302 reflecting interview with PEKAR.

Bureau and Dallas will note that teletype of 11/26/63 advised PEKAR desired his identity protected. On 11/26/63 on recontact, PEKAR withdrew this request, stating he did not mind having his identity disclosed. Accordingly, his identity is appropriately set forth in the FD 302.

In the absence of information from Dallas that the wife and mother of OSWALD could have been in Fairfield, Conn., approximately two weeks ago, no additional investigation will be conducted concerning the information furnished by PEKAR.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

November 26, 1963

On November 25, 1963, GEORGE WILLIAM PEKAR, 37 Benton Street, Fairfield, Connecticut, telephone number 366-2140, advised as follows:

He has been employed as a commercial artist for the past eleven or twelve years by the Rosner - Lewis Agency, an advertising agency at 2440 Reservoir Avenue, Trumbull, Connecticut. Also located in the same building at the Reservoir Avenue address are the International Electronics Company, Limited, the International Electronics Company of Puerto Rico, and the American Merchandising Corporation. All of these corporations are owned by LOU LEWIS whose true name is LOUIS ISLOWITZ. LEWIS formerly lived in Newtown, Connecticut but now lives at 2440 Reservoir Avenue, Trumbull, Connecticut.

LEWIS is a very secretive person and is reputed to frequent nightclubs. His brother, LEO LEWIS, also known as LEO ISLOWITZ, is reported to have operated a nightclub in Miami, Florida at one time.

LEWIS formed the International Electronics Company, Limited and the International Electronics Company of Puerto Rico several months ago. About two months ago International Electronics Company, Limited, hired seven or eight workers to set up a pilot assembly line for the production of electronic control switches, intending to mass produce these units at the Jarardo, Puerto Rico plant of International Electronics of Puerto Rico. The workers were laid off after a short time when International Electronics Company, Limited was unable to get parts. The basic unit of these switches was purchased from Hunt Electronics, Dallas, Texas. Some representatives of an electronics company in Texas have visited at the Trumbull plant of International Electronics Company, Limited, but PEKAR had no information on what company they represented.

About two or three weeks ago LEWIS went to Dallas, Texas but PEKAR had no information on his contacts or activities there, or if he had made any other trips to that city.

Approximately three weeks ago after LEWIS returned from his trip to Dallas, Texas, PEKAR overheard Mrs. MARY SHEARER (phonetic), LEWIS' secretary, speaking to someone and mentioning the Carousel, Vegas, and RUBY.

PEKAR could not recall hearing LEWIS say anything about the Carousel, Vegas or RUBY.

About two weeks ago while at work, PEKAR saw through the front window of the plant a woman who resembled the picture of Mrs. LEE HARVEY OSWALD that appeared in the November 24, 1963 issue of the Bridgeport Sunday Post, a local paper published weekly at Bridgeport, Connecticut. The woman was standing outside the plant and seemed hesitant to enter the building. A car with New York license plates was in the parking lot and PEKAR concluded that the woman came to the plant in that car.

As PEKAR was walking through the office to go downstairs he saw a stocky woman who resembled the photograph of the mother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD which appeared in the above issue of the Bridgeport Sunday Post. The stocky woman had a baby in her arms and had just arrived on the second floor of the plant when PEKAR saw her. The woman who resembled OSWALD's mother looked around and then went to Mrs. SHEARER at her desk.

PEKAR went downstairs and saw nothing more of either woman. PEKAR thought nothing more of the two women until after he saw the pictures of OSWALD's wife and mother in the Bridgeport Post for November 24, 1963. When after looking at the picture for some time he concluded that the two women he had seen at the Trumbull plant were possibly identical with the wife and mother of OSWALD.

PEKAR was unable to furnish any description of the woman whom he feels resembles OSWALD's wife, other than that she appeared to be similar to the picture and had light brown hair. He said the woman who resembled OSWALD's mother appeared to be in her late 40's, with light brown hair, heavy build and a big head.

PEKAR furnished the following description of LEWIS:

At no time has PEKAR ever heard any information of a plot to assassinate the President of the United States or anything against the best interest of the United States Government discussed at his place of employment.

At the time the radio broadcasted the news of President KENNEDY's assassination, PEKAR noticed nothing unusual in the shop.

PEKAR explained that LEWIS' secretary, Mrs. MARY SHEARER (phonetic) lives in Monroe, Connecticut; is separated from her husband; and is a very close friend of LEWIS. The only other employee in the office, Mrs. BOBBY ADAM, Monroe, Connecticut, who is the typist and file clerk, is also very friendly with Mrs. SCHEARER and LEWIS.

The only other two people in the plant who might have
seen the two women are RUDY PIRHALA (phonetic), another
commercial artist who works with PEKAR, and TOM
FITZPATRICK, an accountant employed by LEWIS, who has an
office on the second floor.
