Mr. Doan stated that although he felt this was without basis, in fact, since it did refer to the Attorney General, he would appreciate being advised of the results of the interview.

The above information was immediately furnished telephonically to Supervisor Oberndorf of the Washington Field Office. Oberndorf stated he recognized the name of McConnon as possibly being identical to [redacted] He is now considered to be very unreliable, however, Oberndorf will see that he is located and thoroughly interviewed in this matter.

ACTION:

At 6:15 P.M., 11-26-63, Mr. Joseph Doan of the Deputy Attorney General's Office called Mr. Doan advised he had just received a call from Mr. Joseph Dougherty of the Bureau of Facilities of the Post Office Department concerning the assassination of the President, according to Dougherty, a friend of Dougherty's, Mr. Joseph McConnon, stated to Dougherty that the assassination of the President was part of an underworld plot which also included the death of the Attorney General. Dougherty stated McConnon gave him no information for such a statement and Doan felt it was some more chatter, however, he felt we would undoubtedly interview McConnon if it had not already been done. McConnon apparently is a manufacturer's representative, according to Dougherty, and is now registered at the Harrington Hotel in Washington. Doan stated there is a good possibility that McConnon has already contacted the Bureau.

No fibers of significance were found in the fingernail scrapings that could be associated with the blanket.

Several limb and pubic hairs were found in the debris removed from the blanket which matched in microscopic characteristics the limb and pubic hairs from Oswald.

The fingernail scrapings and head, limb and pubic hair samples of Lee Harvey Oswald were received from the Dallas Office this morning for comparison with the hairs and fibers previously removed from the blanket recovered from Oswald's garage.

I'm writing to ask that you get a hold of the (AP) photo that appeared in the Chicago Sun-Times, Saturday, November 23, 1963, edition. This picture shows that Gov. Connally may have been shot first. I am a high school student so maybe I don't have a good idea of what's important, but it may be important. For there is the chance that the assassin had the two men mixed up and that he wanted to kill Gov. Connally most because he felt that the Gov. didn't help him in the dishonorable discharge. One last word about the photo, the photo shows the President before his death waving and smiling at the people, but the Gov. is grimacing and clutching at his side, the side in which he was shot, with his good hand. The caption says min. before the shooting but this could be explained through the fact that time can seem like hours in a tragedy. And Gov. Connally may think the President was shot first, because of the esteem he holds the president.

ASAC Sylvestre said New Orleans had been in touch with the District Attorney's Office to find out why these men were booked for the FBI. He said that the Assistant who did this worked all night and had left the office and those on duty had no information. New Orleans is endeavoring to locate the Assistant District Attorney responsible. ASAC Sylvestre stated he anticipated press inquiries.

The New Orleans files contain information to the effect that Ferrite has been tied up with anti-Castro groups. New Orleans has no record for Roland Beaubourg. According to the New Orleans files, on January 24, 1962, one Laton B. Martens, who may be identical with Patrick Martens, came to the New Orleans Office and complained about being arrested by the New Orleans Police Department. He complained he was associated with the Cuban Democratic Revolutionary Front, stating that he thought that he was arrested because Ferrite is also in his group and a homosexual, and the New Orleans Police picked him up based on those circumstances.

ASAC Sylvestre stated that they were arrested yesterday at the home of one David William Ferrite, whom the television commentators have been playing up as a person who might have known Oswald when Oswald was living in New Orleans. ASAC Sylvestre stated that he understands that the District Attorney's Office has put out a wanted notice for Ferrite and surmises that the District Attorney is basing his action on the television stories that Ferrite allegedly knew Oswald. Ferrite allegedly is a homosexual.

ASAC Joseph Sylvestre, New Orleans Office, advised that last night the District Attorney's Office arrested Patrick Martens and Roland Beaubourg. They booked them as being held for the Secret Service and the FBI. ASAC Sylvestre said the New Orleans Office knew nothing about this and neither did John Rice, Special Agent in Charge of the Secret Service.

The remaining examinations are in progress and you will be advised of the results immediately upon their completion.

The examination of these items is now complete. It has been determined that the bullet, a copper coated lead bullet of .38 Special caliber, is so badly mutilated that there are not sufficient marks on its surface to permit identification of the particular weapon from which it was fired. However, it was determined that the suspect's revolver is among those weapons producing rifling impressions of the number, type and size as those presently on the fatal bullet.

My earlier memorandum of today lists the items of evidence received in this matter to date. Among those items was the revolver seized from suspect Lee Harvey Oswald upon his arrest following the killing of Dallas police officer Tippett and the fatal bullet removed from Officer Tippett's body.

I doubt if this information has any significance, but I will pass it on to you just in case you might want an agent in Chicago to follow through.

I teach English in Chicago's William Howard Taft High School. On Friday, November 22, during my fourth period class which takes place from 10:20 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Central Standard Time, a student asked me how many Presidents had been assassinated. I had given no lead for such a subject to come up, and it was not usual for a student to ask me, an English teacher, a question of this nature.

I told him three Presidents had been assassinated. He displayed some surprise. "I thought only two had been," he responded.

When I mentioned Lincoln, Garfield, and McKinley, he expressed some surprise that Garfield had been assassinated. "Never heard of that," or words to that effect, he responded.

As I indicated, there is probably no significance to this information, but since the conversation transpired about two hours before the three shots in Dallas made Presidential assassination a common topic, I thought it might be a good idea to relay the information.
