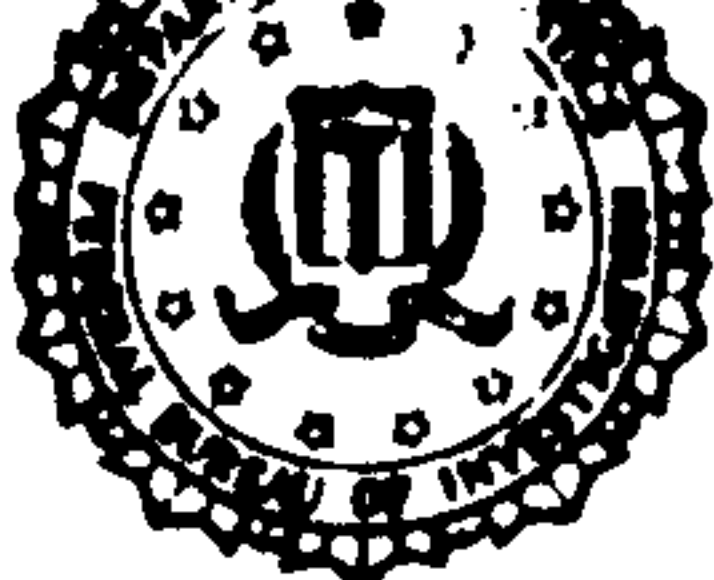

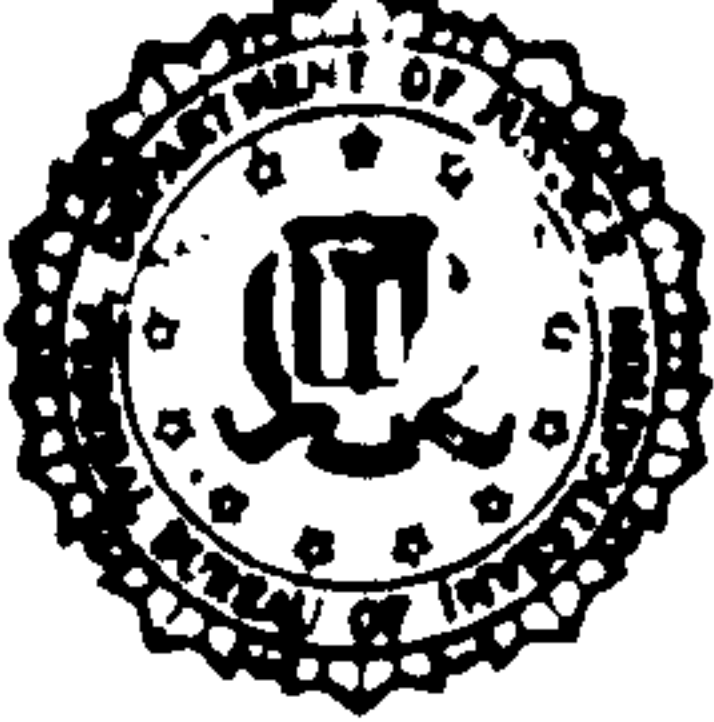

One latent fingerprint and one latent palm print developed on the cardboard box marked "A" from the same room have been identified as the fingerprint and palm print of Oswald..

In addition, eight latent fingerprints and two latent palm prints developed on the personal effects of Oswald were identified as his fingerprints and palm prints.

No latent impressions were identified as the fingerprints of Jack Leon Ruby, FRI #693083E. Additional comparisons of the unidentified latent impressions will be made upon the receipt of the major case prints of Ruby.

The Latent Fingerprint Section will retain, for the present, the piece of cardboard, your item #1, bearing the palm print of Oswald. This piece of cardboard is described as coming from the box on which Oswald sat in the room from which the shots were fired.

The remaining specimens are being returned to the Laboratory which will submit a separate report and which will include the disposition of the remaining items.



The search of the Texas School Book Depository was conducted on 11-23-63, between 9:00 AM and 1:00 PM by SAs Lee and Barrett. All 35 mm shots were taken by SA Lee, while all 4 X 5 shots were taken by SA Barrett.



This is to advise that information has been received from Assistant Attorney General Jack Miller of the Criminal Division and members of the Secret Service in Washington that there is no Federal Statute applicable to prosecuting the killer of President Kennedy and that prosecution, therefore, should it be initiated, would have to be had in Texas State Court.

The Assaulting a Federal Office Statute specifically enumerates those Federal officers coming within the Statute and does not include the President or the Vice President. Assistant Attorney General Miller advised that Federal Law provides for the prosecution of state violations under certain circumstances in Federal Court should the state desire such action.

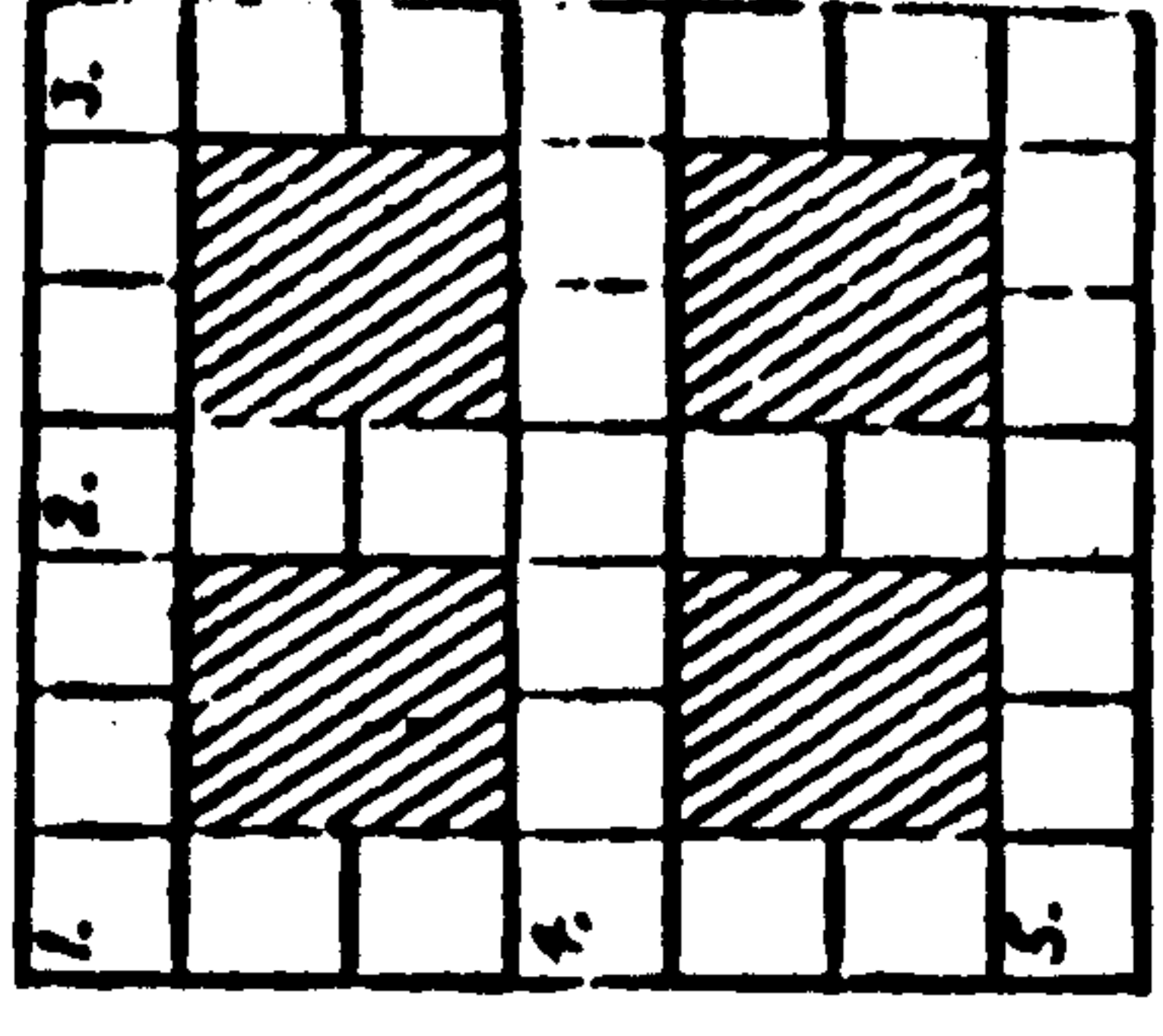

The real "old pros" are so seldom with us any more, I was thinking the other day in Barre, when I watched John Wayne going through the measured, drawly paces on the waterfront, while he was shooting some last scenes from Sam Bronston's "Circus World."

Duke Wayne'll be mid-50, easy but he has taken fair care of himself and he's still big box. He hasn't improved on the technique any more than Gable, or Bogey, or big Comp improved on the snid self-casting that made them great. The "old pros" keep right on doing it right, like Y. A. Tittle throws passes, bald head or not.

There was a lady with me to visit Wayne. Her name is Eva Menley, and her last three efforts as a production manager were "Exodus," "Lawrence of Arabia," and the upcoming "The Cardinal," which everybody's so excited about. Eva doesn't stand knee-high to a jam-jar, and she's quite young despite the gray in her hair, put there by actors and directors. She only goes as far back in films as "King Solomon's Mines," but she's an "old pro," too.

I have received your letter of November 24th regarding the assassination of President Kennedy and can understand the concern prompting your statements.

Although the primary responsibility for the safety of the President and his family is the duty of the Secret Service, the FBI has made all of its facilities available to that agency and the local authorities. In addition, the President has instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibilities in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

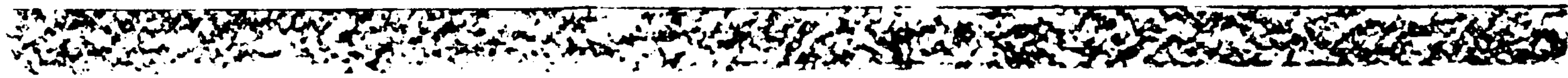

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

On 11/24/63, Special Agent Les Chisholm, Washington Field Office, delivered to the Laboratory a U. S. Postal money order which he had obtained from Secret Service. This money order was made out to Klein's Sporting Goods and bore the name A. Hidell, P. O. Box 2915, Dallas, Texas, and was in the amount of \$21.45.

It was concluded that the handwriting on this money order (#2202130462) was written by Lee Harvey Oswald whose known handwriting specimens are designated in this case as K4 and K5.

With airtel dated 11/23/63, New Orleans submitted five copies of "The American Rifleman" including a June 1963, issue which had an order blank torn from the bottom of page 59. It was requested that this page be compared with the questioned order blank used by Oswald in buying the Italian carbine and that the following page be examined for indented writing.

No indented writing was found on the page opposite page 59. The questioned order blank could not have been taken from this magazine since the magazine is dated June 1963, and the rifle was shipped to Hidell on 3/20/63.

Appropriate photographs have been made. A confirming report will be submitted to the field. The evidence is retained in the Laboratory.

We have received inquiries from "Time" magazine, "Telenews," "The New York Times" and a number of other communications outlets relative to several minutes of 8 millimeter color film which was reportedly taken at the scene of the assassination by one Abraham Zapruber. Zapruber is the owner of a women's wear shop called "Jennifer Juniors" in Dallas. "Time and Life" magazine have allegedly promised Zapruber the sum of \$40,000 if he will turn the film over to them. Zapruber has been quoted as stating "The FBI has this film and will not give it back to me."

Ed Guthman and Jack Rosenthal of the Department have received similar requests from the same news outlets.

I called SAC Shanklin at Dallas to ask him if we had this film. After checking, Shanklin called me back and stated that the Secret Service had first obtained this film from Zapruber. Shanklin stated he believed that Zapruber had later offered a copy of the film to us. He stated he would have to check further regarding the matter; however, he knew that we had this film and was having it processed at the present time at a commercial shop in Dallas. Shanklin stated he did not believe the film would be of any evidentiary value; however, he first had to take a look at the film to determine this factor.

After checking, I called Shanklin back and told him not to pay any attention to any contacts that were made with him by news outlets. I stated he should continue his processing of the film and should then determine whether the film was of any evidentiary value or not. Shanklin stated he had received calls from Movietone News requesting the film. I told him that after he had taken a look at this film, he should get back in touch with us. Shanklin stated that since talking to me the first time, he had ascertained that the film had not been received from Zapruber but to the contrary the Secret Service had obtained the film from Zapruber and had turned it over to us late last night. He stated that to his knowledge the Dallas Agents had not made contact with Zapruber.

There are set forth below the investigative steps which we are urgently taking in Mexico to determine the full details relating to any possible connection between Lee Harvey Oswald and the Cubans, Soviets, and any other individuals who may be implicated in the assassination of the late President, John F. Kennedy:

1. Our Legal Attache (Legat) in Mexico has been instructed to contact all our sources in Mexico who may be able to develop information in this matter.
  2. The Legat is reviewing every bit of material in his files to see if anything currently present will cast some light upon the problem we now face.
  3. The Legat has been instructed to use every available investigative facility to determine all dates on which Oswald may have been in Mexico. (We have already determined that he went to Mexico on 9/26 and returned on 10/3/63. The change has been made that he was in Mexico on 9/18/63, at which time he received \$6,500.00 from the Cuban Consulate. This issue we are now trying expeditiously to resolve.)
  4. We are investigating to ascertain Oswald's addresses and to identify any contacts he may have made while in Mexico.
- We are investigating to determine the means of transportation which he utilized on entering and departing from Mexico, as well as the identity of his traveling companions, if any.

We have obtained one roll of 8 mm. color film furnished by a Dallas resident which shows the southwest corner of Elm and Houston Streets in Dallas where the Texas School Book Depository Building is located. The film clearly shows the Presidential cavalcade proceeding north on Houston Street and turning left on Elm Street directly in front of the building.

On the sixth floor in the room where the rifle and cartridge cases were located one figure can be seen in the window.

Directly below the room in question two indistinct figures can be seen in the window. We have identified and interviewed two individuals who were in this window at the time of the shooting. The photographic laboratory is attempting to blow up pertinent frames of this film in order to portray it in more precise detail.

Numerous inquiries have been received from the press regarding what appear to be two persons in the room where the shots were fired, obviously confusing the fifth and sixth floors. These inquiries have been answered with no comment.
