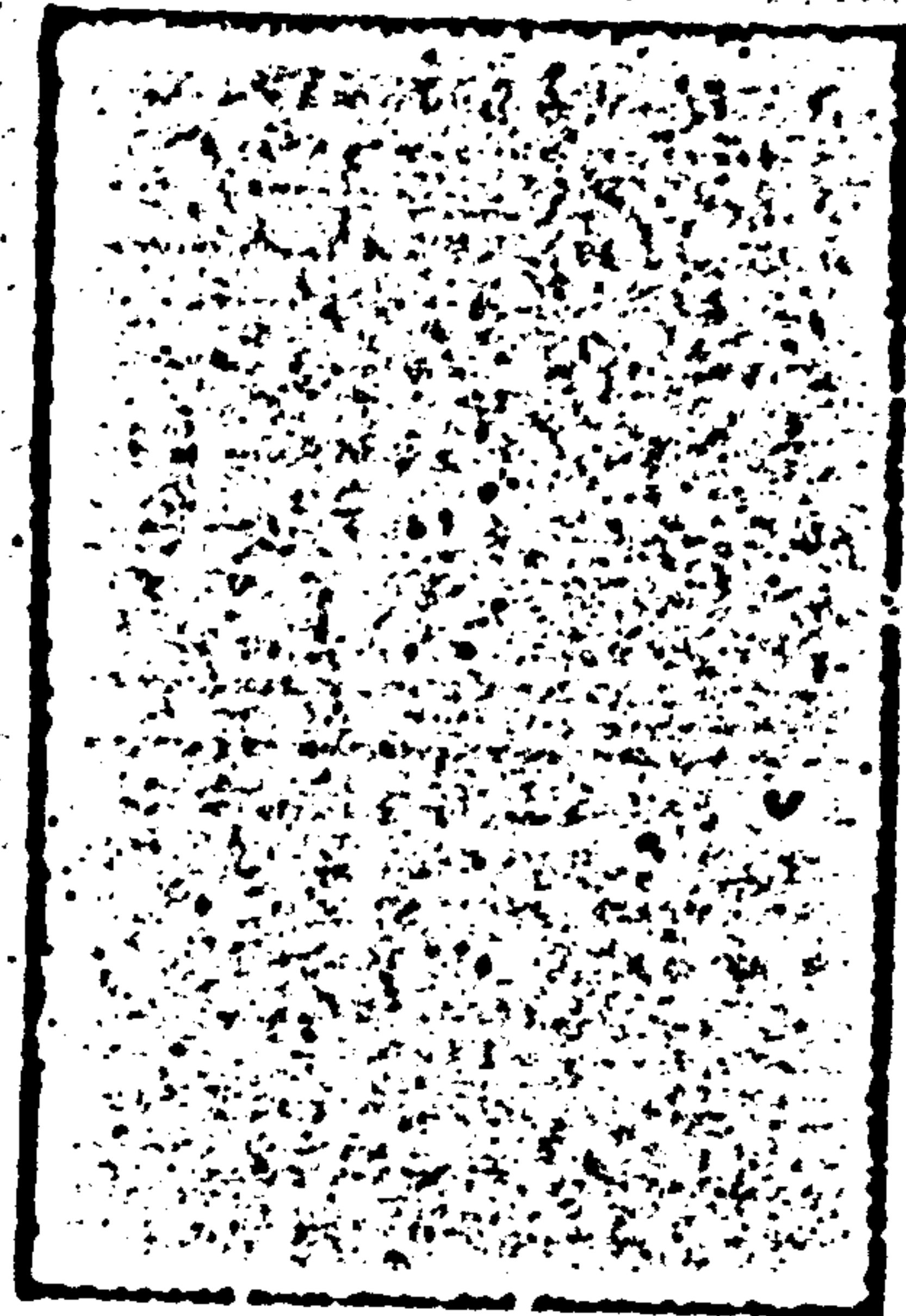

The enclosed and attached records were gathered by Private Investigator J. S. (Jack) Martin, for several private clients during a period through 1959-1966. Martin was assisted by one D. W. Ferrie in this case during 1959-1960-1961, because of Ferrie's wide knowledge of Theology, Latin, and the Clergy. At this time Ferrie also made purchases from this subject (Stanley), of numerous "Religious" papers and documents.

Martin paid \$250.00 each for the papers and documents issued by this subject (Stanley). 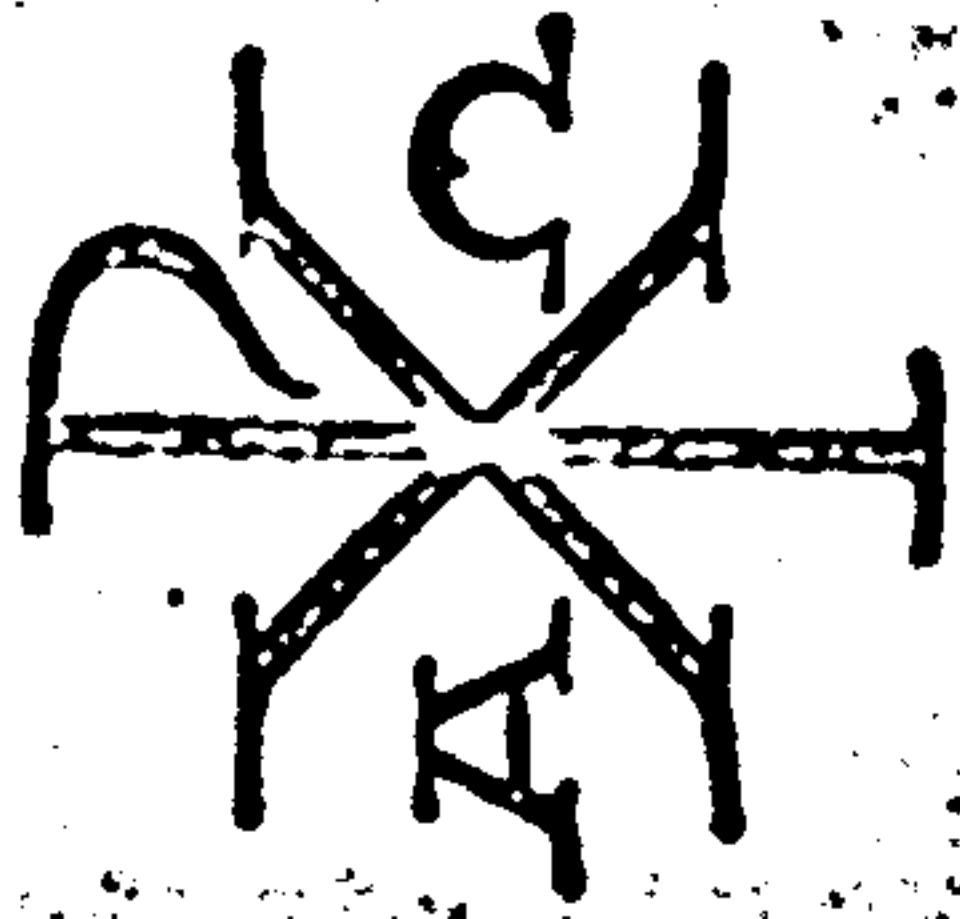

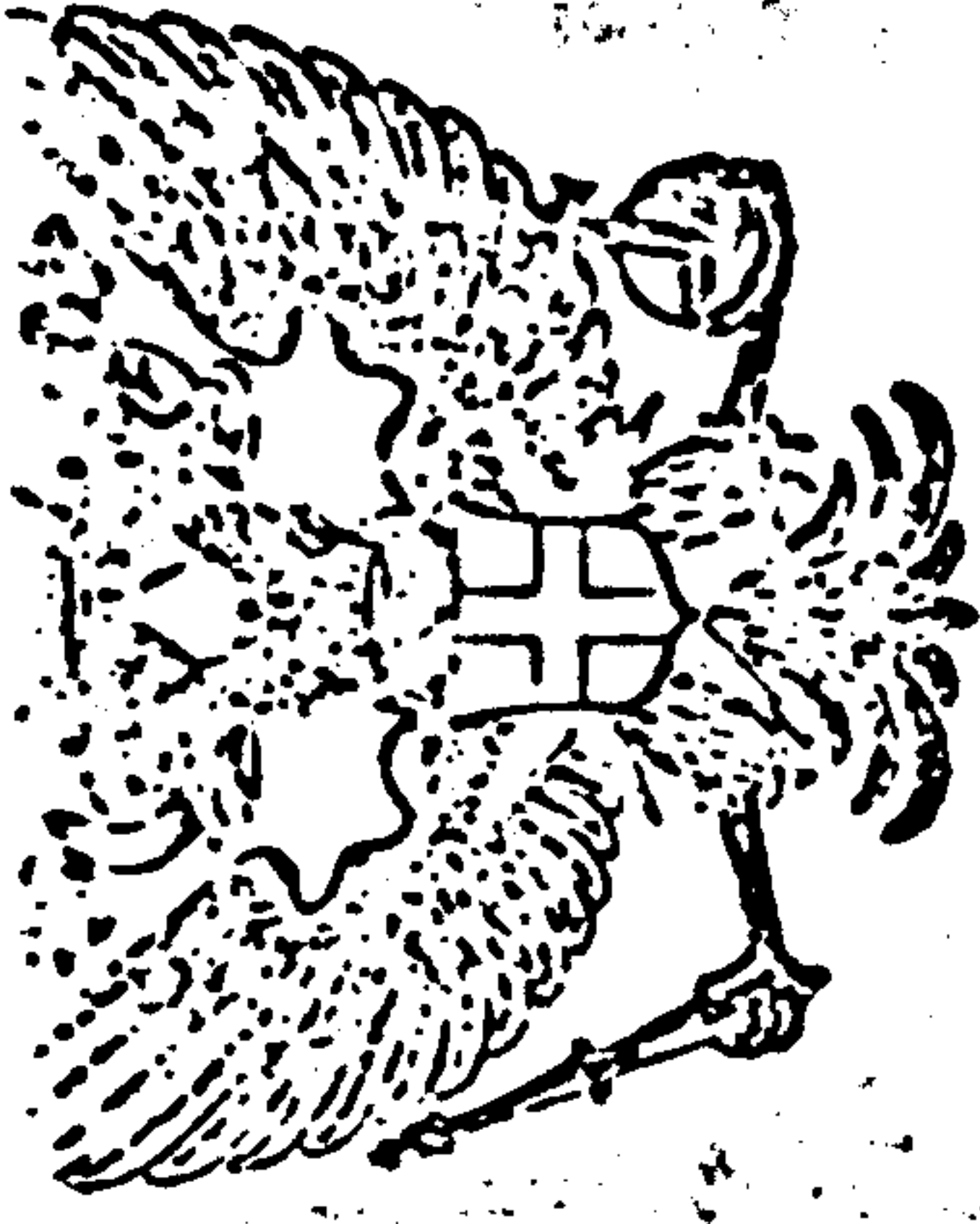

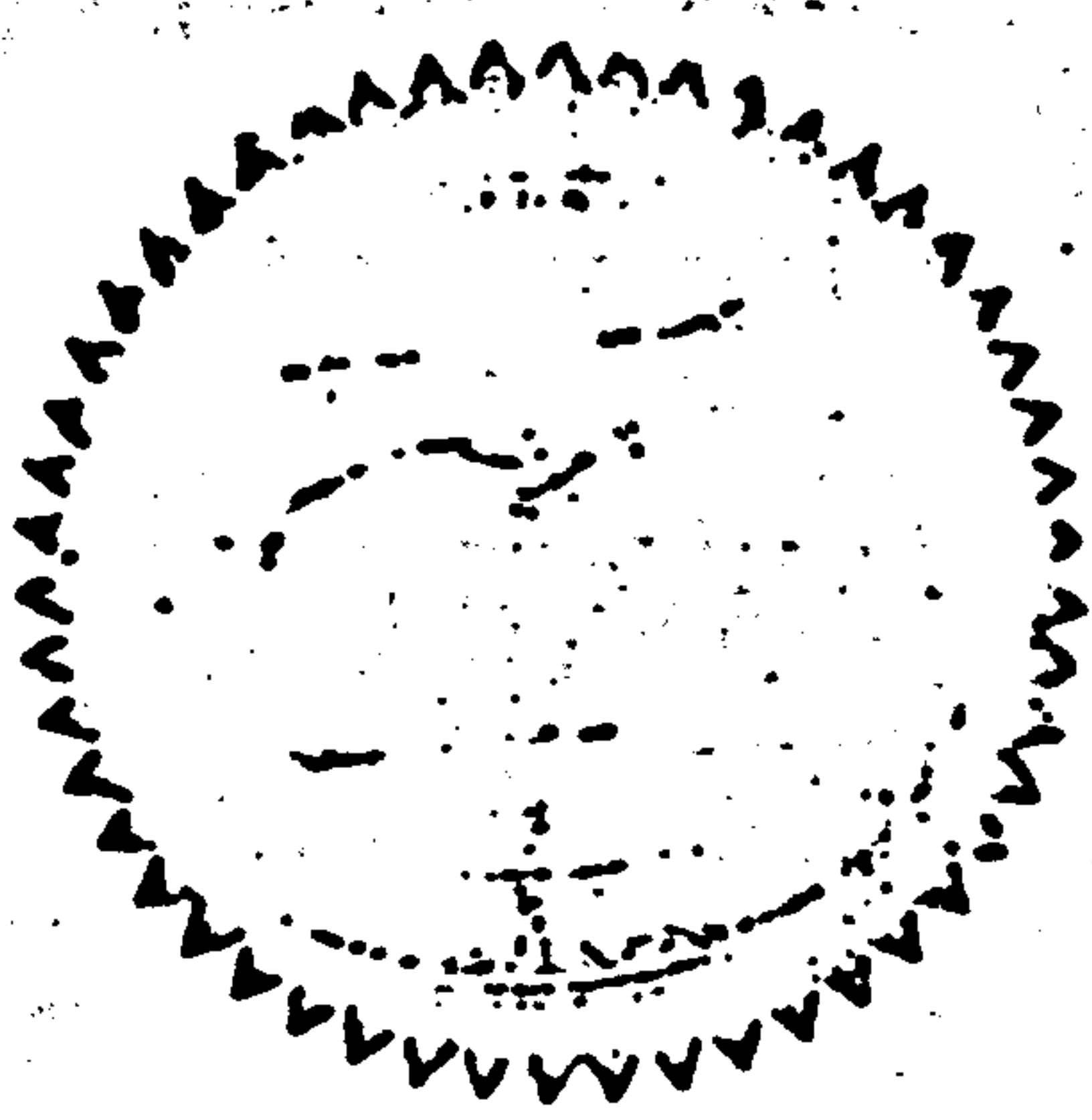

By letter dated 5-1-67 Congressman Hale Boggs of Louisiana transmitted to the Bureau information he had received from J. S. Martin. Mr. Boggs' letter was acknowledged and the Domestic Intelligence Division was instructed to analyze the material furnished by Martin to Congressman Boggs.

Jack S. Martin is the self-proclaimed investigator in New Orleans who has been reported by several sources as being the individual who initially furnished information to New Orleans District Attorney Garrison which touched off Garrison's investigation. Martin has been reported by a number of individuals as mentally ill and he was hospitalized several years ago for mental illness.

The information furnished by Martin to Congressman Boggs appears to be almost identical to the data which was previously made available to this Bureau by [redacted]. The data was analyzed and summarized in a memorandum Mr. Branigan to Mr. Sullivan dated 4-24-67. A copy of the material was also disseminated to the Department and to the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Briefly, the material furnished by Martin consists of a long rambling series of statements summarizing his contacts with Bureau Agents and Secret Service agents immediately following the assassination of President Kennedy. Martin is now attempting to claim that press reports of his statements made immediately following the assassination are incorrect. Martin also claims that magazine articles prepared by George Lardner, Jr., a "Washington Post" reporter, and Merriman Smith, senior White House reporter, are false and misleading.

Much of the data furnished by Martin is an attack upon Carl J. Stanley. Stanley was a confidence man who claimed to be a religious leader in Louisville, Kentucky. He formerly was closely associated with Martin in so-called church activities, but later had a falling-out with Martin and bad blood developed between the two men. Stanley died of a heart attack 3-8-67.

There is nothing new in the material furnished by Martin to Congressman Boggs that was not already furnished to us.

Attached for your information is a list of communications which set forth results of investigation conducted by Special Agent Regis L. Kennedy of our New Orleans Office. This list sets forth in chronological order by Commission Document Number, the communications which are available to the public at the National Archives and those communications which are excluded from public disclosure under the guidelines approved by Mr. McGeorge Bundy when Mr. Bundy was Special Assistant to the President.

In connection with the pages set forth regarding Commission Document Number 75 which are excluded from the public, please refer to my letter to the Attorney General dated February 24, 1967, entitled "Public Disclosure of Warren Commission Records." You will note that copies of the excluded pages of current interest were furnished to you as enclosures to my letter of February 24, 1967. You were also informed at that time that this Bureau had no objection to public disclosure of these pages in view of the public interest concerning these particular pages.

You will also note that the information reported on this page is available only through issuance of a subpoena duces tecum directed to J. B. Wadsworth, District Manager, Western Union, Carondelet Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

In addition to the information set forth above, please be advised that Special Agent Kennedy has investigated both pro-Castro and anti-Castro activity in the New Orleans area for several years. Results of such investigation, unless related to inquiries regarding the assassination of President Kennedy, were not furnished to the Warren Commission nor is such data contained in the files of the National Archives.

Also, since December, 1966, Special Agent Kennedy has received information volunteered to him by a number of individuals concerning the investigation of the assassination being conducted by New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison. Included among these individuals are Jack S. Martin, Dr. Carlos Bringuier, Bob Guzman and several established sources of our New Orleans Office. All pertinent data furnished by these individuals has been furnished to the Department. It, of course, is not contained in Warren Commission records at the National Archives nor is it available to the public.

NOTE: By letter dated 5/8/67 we informed the Attorney General that Special Agent Regis L. 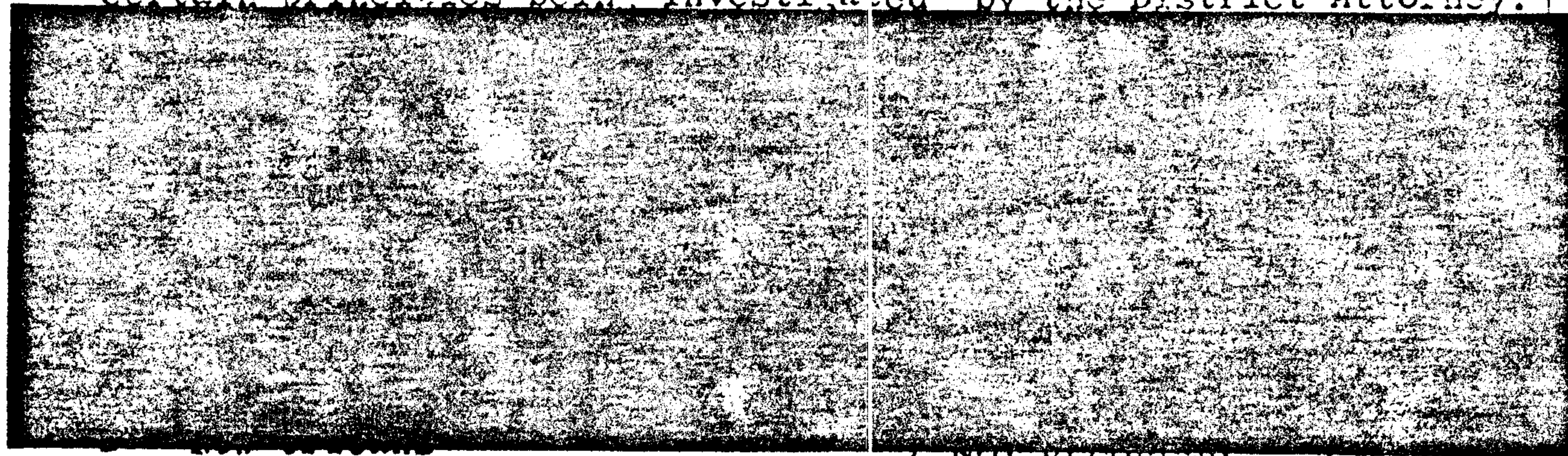

On May 5, 1967, Grand Jury subpoenas were issued by the office of District Attorney JIM GARRISON for SAs REGIS L. KENNEDY and WARREN C. DE BRUEYS for appearance before an Orleans Parish Grand Jury on May 10, 1967.

The Times Picayune, a leading New Orleans newspaper, in an article carried in the May 6, 1967, issue reported that sources close to GARRISON's probe have indicated that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was in fact not a communist, but a U.S. anti-Castro undercover agent. The article reflected that this trend in the investigation stems from indications of the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency's involvement as related to certain principles being investigated by the District Attorney.

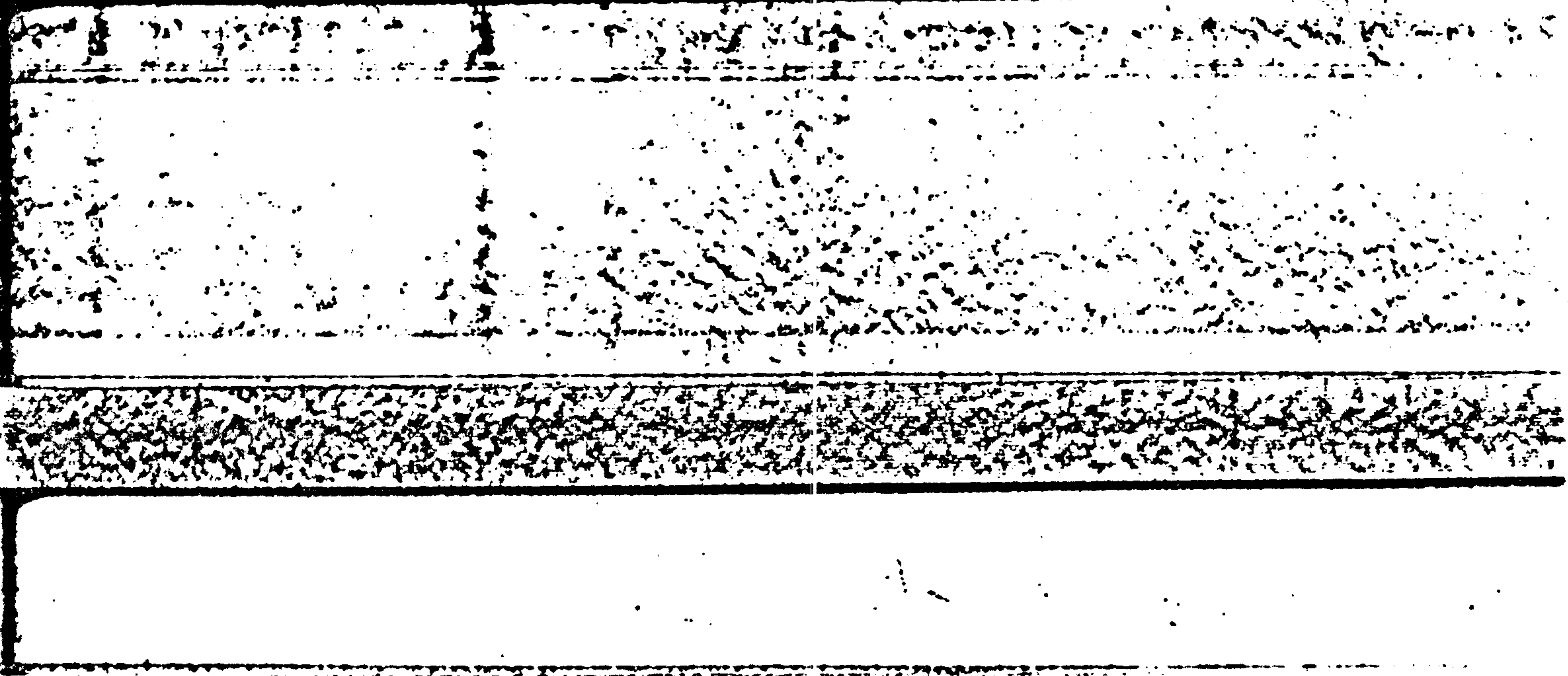

Dear Mrs. Markham,

You will probably wonder why I am writing to you from a faraway country, from Poland. I have chosen you because I have your address. I am sure you will help me. Well, I live in Poland at the above-mentioned address. I have a request of you.

Do you know any wealthy Polish-Jewish family which would be willing to help me with clothing from time to time. I am in bad circumstances. My husband has cancer, and I am the sole breadwinner in my family. We have two children of school age -- a boy, age 16, and a girl, age 9. I make a modest living, but I don't have enough for clothing and the children, husband and I are practically naked. I would be grateful to you if you would find a few Polish-Jewish families willing to send me once in a while a parcel of secondhand clothing, if not for all of us, then at least for the children. My son is 175 cm. (5'10") tall, and my daughter is 140 cm. (5') tall. I am as tall as my son and on the fat side. I would be indebted to you for the rest of my life if you could manage to send me some clothing. I would also appreciate it if you would drop me a line to say that this could be done. I won't delude myself with hope but I believe you won't refuse me. Best regards to you and your family.

Carlos Quiroga, referred to in attached, is an anti-Castro Cuban national who visited the home of Lee Harvey Oswald in August, 1963 after Oswald distributed Fair Play for Cuba literature on the streets of New Orleans.

Quiroga subsequently explained that he was interested in determining Oswald's extent of participation in the Fair Play for Cuba group and learned that that Oswald was a dedicated pro-Castro worker. He reported this to the New Orleans police at the time and offered to act as an informant but the police were not interested.

Quiroga has advised that he has told Garrison of his visit to Oswald's home and how he learned that Oswald was working for the pro-Castro Cuban cause. However, Garrison apparently ignored the explanation Quiroga gave him about Oswald's pro-Castro activity and chose to believe that inasmuch as Quiroga is and was an anti-Castro Cuban worker, Oswald too was an anti-Castro worker. Garrison has apparently attempted to force Quiroga to testify that Oswald was working with anti-Castro forces.

At their request we contacted Mr. Nathaniel Kossack and Carl W. Belcher, both of the Criminal Division of the Department, with respect to the subpoena which had been served by District Attorney Garrison on Special Agent Regis Kennedy of our New Orleans Office.

They inquired to know whether all of the information developed by Special Agent Kennedy would be incorporated in reports which had been delivered to Archives by the Warren Commission. They were advised that this was so. It was pointed out to them that Special Agent Kennedy has conducted numerous investigations involving pro-Cuban and anti-Cuban subjects in the New Orleans area; that reports or communications covering these investigations would have been disseminated to the Department but since they did not necessarily relate to the investigation of the assassination or of Lee Harvey Oswald they would not have been sent to Archives. It was further pointed out that Special Agent Kennedy could have conducted numerous interviews and other investigations, the results of which he would have incorporated in an FD-302 which in turn would have been made a part of an investigative report. The identification of the FD-302's prepared by Special Agent Kennedy would involve considerable research.

The attached contains a rehash of old allegations by Jim Garrison that Lee Harvey Oswald, rather than being a communist was in reality an undercover agent trained and operated by the Central Intelligence Agency. These allegations are not new. It has been obvious from the outset that Garrison was attempting to link Oswald to the anti-Castro Cuban effort. These same allegations arose during the early stages of our investigation in the Kennedy assassination and were proved to be false.

Central Intelligence Agency has previously stated unconditionally and unequivocally that Oswald was never connected with that agency in any fashion whatsoever.

News reports on 5/5/67 indicated that attorneys for Clay L. Shaw asked for dismissal of the indictment against Shaw due to manipulated testimony on the part of Garrison's star witness, whom the attorneys stated had been subjected to post-hypnotic suggestion by Garrison's men.

Since the attached is news media material, it will not be disseminated.

On April 28, 1967, a source in the New Orleans Office who has provided reliable information in the past advised that [redacted] an individual who has homosexual tendencies had provided to this source the following information:

Approximately seven years ago the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office, raided the Yuga Carnival Ball and arrested approximately one hundred homosexuals who were in attendance at this ball. District Attorney Jim Garrison has obtained the names of these individuals and is currently interviewing them in an effort to determine if there is a homosexual in the New Orleans area who looks like Clay Shaw. Clay Shaw has been indicted on a conspiracy charge alleging that he entered into a conspiracy to kill President Kennedy.

The source volunteered an opinion that apparently Garrison is in difficulty with his investigation and is possibly "looking for an out." The source indicated that apparently Clay Shaw is giving Garrison such a tough fight that he may come up with information that there was a wrong identification of Shaw.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

As a result of his request to be contacted by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, John George Appel was interviewed at the Salt Lake County Jail, Salt Lake City, Utah, on May 5, 1967, by Special Agents Charles J. Shepherd and William J. Geiermann. *B 11-17-3*

Appel said he is serving one year in the County Jail on a narcotics charge. He said he was very upset and nervous due to the recent death of his father and because of his current effort to withdraw from heroin addiction. He claimed he had not slept for three days.

Appel said he has served several sentences on narcotics charges. He was released from the Louisiana State Prison during October, 1963. About a week after his release, which would be the last week in October or the first week in November, 1963, he went to Thompson's Restaurant in New Orleans, Louisiana, to make a contact to get narcotics. He said Thompson's is a known hangout for narcotics addicts. While there Appel was contacted by a girl named Shirley, last name unknown, who was previously unknown to him. Shirley was an addict and introduced him to two other addicts named Lee and Larry, who were also in the restaurant. They both spoke Spanish and were "sinister" looking. Appel showed Shirley how to forge a prescription, and she left for about half an hour. During this time Appel conversed briefly with Lee and Larry. He said he had never seen these individuals before but that Lee claimed to know him. When Shirley returned, she had three bottles containing narcotics. She gave one

each to Lee and Larry, and he and Shirley took the third bottle and left the restaurant. They went in Shirley's car to a place near the waterfront in New Orleans, where they each took a shot. Later in the day when they parted company, Shirley indicated she wanted to meet Appel again; however, they never did get together.

At the time of the assassination of President Kennedy several weeks later, Appel realized the photographs in the newspapers of Lee Harvey Oswald were identical with the Lee he had met in Thompson's Restaurant. He insisted there is no question in his mind about this.

Appel said that during the time they were in Thompson's Restaurant, he, Lee, Larry and Shirley were all under the influence of narcotics.

Subsequently Appel was again arrested on narcotics charges and served time in jail. Thereafter he went to California for a few days and came to Salt Lake City in February, 1966. He has been in Salt Lake City since that time but declined to discuss his activities.

In December, 1966, Appel was with his girl friend, whom he identified only as Mary Jane. When they came back to Appel's apartment, there was a note on the door indicating something to the effect that "What are you doing with this square chick? (Signed) Someone who loves you very much." He did not know at that time who had written the note; however, later in the day as he was writing a prescription, it dawned on him that the handwriting on the note was the same as the handwriting on the prescription filled out by Shirley in New Orleans over three years before.

The following day Appel and Mary Jane were eating in a restaurant when a woman, identified by Appel as Shirley, came in, sat down nearby and stared at Appel. Appel and Mary Jane left immediately. Later that same day Appel was arrested and has been in custody since that time.

Shortly after his arrest, Appel spent thirty to forty days in the Utah State Hospital at Provo, Utah. During that time he read an article in a magazine written by someone named Epstein, in which there was some indication that there was more than one assassin of President Kennedy. Appel immediately "felt in his bones" that Larry, whom he had seen with Oswald in New Orleans a month before the President's death, was also an assassin. Appel said he had no further evidence in support of this contention but that the feeling was so strong he felt compelled to tell someone about it.

Appel stated that about two weeks ago he was taken into court for another appearance, and as he left the courtroom, he observed Shirley and Larry in the corridor. They made no sign of recognizing him. He said it is his feeling, however, they have followed him to Salt Lake City, because he observed Larry with Lee Harvey Oswald a month before the assassination.

Appel stated he is well known in New Orleans to police and to narcotics addicts. He said he is also acquainted with District Attorney James Garrison and that it is his intention to contact Garrison in the near future and relate the above information to him.

HARRY DEAN mentioned in JOHN S. ARVIDSON's letter of 3/21/67 is HARRY DEAN, aka HARRY J. DEAN, concerning whom there has been previous correspondence among the Bureau, Chicago and Los Angeles. The Bureau's attention is invited to correspondence captioned "HARRY DEAN, La Puente, California, Research (Correspondence and Tours)" in 1963; "HARRY DEAN, IS - Cuba," in 1964; "HARRY DEAN, La Puente, California, Research (Crime Records)" in 1964 and 1965 (Bufile 62-109217); "BILL CAPPS, Staff Writer, 'Valley Journal,' P. O. Box N, La Puente, California, Research (Correspondence and Tours)" in 1965 (Bufile 62-109068); and most recently the Director's reply dated 10/18/66 to Senator GEORGE MURPHY's communication dated 10/14/66 concerning HARRY J. DEAN, Box 254, La Puente, California.

Background information concerning DEAN was furnished the Bureau in a letterhead memorandum dated 3/6/64 at Los Angeles, and subsequent communications under the above-listed captions. He is also the subject of FBI identification record #4657880. He was residing with his wife and children at 2013 South 7th Street, Alhambra, California, as of 12/6/66. He is in effect employed by his wife, who operates "Millie's Cleaning and Janitorial Service" from their residence.

Enclosed herewith is one photograph of HARRY DEAN believed to be taken in 1960 and furnished to the Indianapolis Office by [redacted] Whiting, Indiana Police Department on March 6, 1961.

DEAN first called the Chicago Office in August, 1960, to report that he had been elected Recording Secretary, Chicago Chapter, Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). He did not divulge his name and address at this time. Later in the same month he called this office, stating his name and advising he was residing at 1540 Central Avenue, Whiting, Indiana, and that he owned his own business, the Whiting Plastering Company. He told of his connections with the FPCC, furnished information concerning the leadership of this organization, and said that he would be amenable to an interview with an agent of the FBI.

The Indianapolis Office conducted an inquiry in Whiting, Indiana, in September, 1960. [redacted] Whiting, Indiana, Police Department, advised that DEAN, whose real name he believed to be GORDON HUNT and who had used the name GEORGE R. BAKER, had skipped town and the Whiting Police Department had a warrant for his arrest on bad check charges. [redacted] said DEAN was a self-employed plasterer. The Whiting, Indiana Police Department procured an identification record from the Detroit, Michigan, Police Department under FBI #4657880. This record revealed that DEAN had been [redacted] and was sentenced at Chatam, Ontario, for breaking and entering to "one year indefinite."

In December, 1960, DEAN again called this office to report that he had been residing in Detroit for the past two months. At that time he said he was living in Chicago but he refused to divulge his local address. He continued to telephonically contact this office on several occasions until June, 1961. He furnished information concerning Cuban nationals connected with the 26th of July Movement and on local persons connected with the FPCC.

He was last contacted by two agents of the Chicago Office on June 7, 1961, at which time he was told that this office did not desire his assistance.

Former [REDACTED] advised in August, 1960, that DEAN was a white male, age about 25 (in 1960), stocky build, and black hair.

While DEAN voluntarily furnished information to the Chicago Office over a period of nearly a year, he was never considered a PSI or informant by this office.

On December 7, 1960, HARRY DEAN telephonically contacted this office. He advised that he had been in contact with a ED SWABECK, 1716 St. Michaels, Chicago, Illinois, telephone number Wh 4-6445. He stated that he had originally met SWABECK in Cuba this past summer. He said that SWABECK invited him to a meeting in his home on the evening of December 7, 1960 at 7 p.m. DEAN stated that this is a meeting of a Fair Play For Cuba Committee (FPCC) group and that he intended to attend. He said that from the way SWABECK talked it is his belief that this group is trying to out due other groups re the FPCC and thus cause a split in the group. He also said that SWABECK made mention of a letter that he received from TABER which stated that EDDIE SHAW of Detroit had been moved into a position similar to that of a regional director of the FPFCC.

DEAN said that he had been in contact with the Cuban Consulate in Chicago. He said that he had talked to the Cuban Representative, GRACIELA LNU and had learned that the Cubans are intending to move the Consulate to another location in Chicago in the near future. He said that he would probably help them move and would advise this office of such a move. He gave the telephone number of the Consulate as Li 9-7763. He also said that he is a friend of JAUQUIN FREIRE, former Cuban Consulate representative in Chicago, but since returned to Cuba. He said that FREIRE furnished him a passport to visit Cuba during the past summer.

The complainant stated that while in Cuba he met a FRANK VEGA who identified himself as being a representative of ANIT, a Cuban Travel Bureau and also a member of G-2. He said that he also met Dr. JUAN A. ORTA, the Secretary to Prime Minister CASTRO, while in Cuba. And that he also met WILLIAM MORGEN formerly of Toledo, Ohio, while there.

On September 12, 1960, [REDACTED] Whiting Police Department, advised SA CHARLES W. GRUBB that the subject, whose real name is believed to be GORDON HUNT, has skipped town and they have warrants for his arrest on bad check charges.

[REDACTED] said the subject is a self-employed plasterer. The Whiting Police Department procured an identification record of the Detroit Police Department under FBI #4657880. He had been [REDACTED] and then sentenced at Chatham, Ontario, for Breaking and Entering, to one year indefinite. [REDACTED]

DEAN has also used the name of GEORGE R. BAKER. The Whiting Police Department advised he has been in the area about two years and it is believed he did not use the name DEAN until coming to Whiting. He is believed to have come from Chicago, Illinois.

On December 20, 1960, [REDACTED] advised SA RAYMOND E. MOONEY of a meeting of a group of persons interested in forming a North Side Branch of the Chicago Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee which meeting was held on December 7, 1960 at the home of EDWARD SWABECK, 1716 St. Michael's Street, Chicago.

This group decided that an organizational meeting should be held on January 6, 1961, at the home of MIMI HARRIS. BARNETT was selected to be in charge of the program, ED SWABECK was assigned the duty to have the announcements printed by DICK CRILEY and mailed, and HARRY DEAN was to call ANGUS SUMNER and JOHN ROSSEN to obtain reading material that can either be sold or passed out free of charge. Temporary Branch Officers, i.e., Chairman, Secretary and Educational Director are to be elected and MARCIA STARR will collect dues from new members.

During this meeting, HARRY DEAN was overheard to state that just before he left Whiting, Indiana, he had been beaten, a rock had been thrown through his window and he was given a "hard time" by the townspeople. He said that he is presently a sheet metal worker in Chicago. DEAN also stated that he was in Cuba in June, 1960, and while en route met ED SWABECK on the plane. He and SWABECK were in Cuba at the same time and were together in Cuba at least part of the time. DEAN said his first contact with the Cubans was when he donated money to the Cuban cause on two occasions when they held parades on State Street in 1958. At that time, he mentioned that he was working for the Curtis Publishing Company. DEAN said he then went to the Cuban Consulate, Chicago, and met Dr. FERRIER, a Consulate official. DEAN expressed his sympathies toward the CASTRO revolution to Dr. FERRIER. He said that Dr. FERRIER knew of and worked with the 26th of July Movement in Chicago, and he also knew of the formation of the FPCC. According to DEAN, Dr. FERRIER

introduced him to RICHARD CRILEY, JUAN del ROSARIO and a Dr. VALDEZ with the idea that DEAN may be interested in the FPCC. DEAN claims that Drs. FERRIER and VALDEZ and RICHARD CRILEY are "big shots" in the Cuban movement in Chicago. DEAN also stated that he had been to the home of JUAN del ROSARIO the evening of December 3, 1960, where he saw RICHARD CRILEY, as well as others whom he did not know.

Reference is made to a Chicago letter to the Director, dated November 26, 1963, captioned, "HARRY DEAN, LA PUENTE, CALIFORNIA RESEARCH (CORRESPONDENCE AND TOURS)" which set forth information concerning DEAN's contacts with the Chicago Division following a request made in a Bureau airtel dated November 22, 1963. For further information under the same caption also reported to the Bureau by Los Angeles in an airtel dated December 10, 1963. By letter dated January 28, 1964, the Los Angeles Division furnished information concerning additional contacts with HARRY DEAN under the caption "HARRY DEAN INFORMATION CONCERNING" (Los Angeles file 105-12933).

By airtel dated December 18, 1964, captioned "HARRY DEAN LA PUENTE, CALIFORNIA RESEARCH (CORRESPONDENCE AND TOURS)", the Los Angeles Division furnished information concerning the proposed appearance of DEAN on the Joe Pyne TV program in Los Angeles.

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
