he was attended by a psychiatrist at Columbia University, which he formerly attended, and has also had "18 sessions" with a psychiatrist at a psychiatric center in Jamaica, New York.

When questioned regarding his motivation for writing to the Director, said that it was his understanding that pressure was being put on him in various ways by his doctor and dentist, who are being paid by him but who are not properly treating him. He also said that pressure, by indirect means, is brought on him by CIA and the NSA. He believes that both CIA and NSA have a "stake-out" on the street behind his residence and that other patients whom he sees in his doctor's offices are there at the direction of the CIA.

Said that he has never been contacted by representatives of CIA or NSA but feels he has met people whom he believes to be connected with these organizations.

's father, explained that as a high school student his son was very brilliant, and upon graduation won several national scholarships. He attended Columbia University on a General Motors Corporation scholarship for \$1,650.00 per year. He explained that his son believed that the outstanding students throughout the country would be "tailed" by the CIA and other security organizations. The father, after reading the letter which his son sent to the Director, and which he had not previously read, considered it to be very "low" and commented to his son that he could not understand his motivation in so doing. He inquired of his son what he expected by writing the letter. The son answered him by stating that he expected nothing one way or the other. Mr. also explained that his son is obsessed with the fact that the CIA is exerting pressure on him and he even considers his psychiatrist to be a CIA representative. Mr. commented that he has had five years of college but his son has read more in his short lifetime than he has in his 63 years. He also explained that his son was more interested in research work at the college than he was in/graduate courses and that he is attempting to "encompass all knowledge" and is impatient with the time element involved.

has received a letter from a Mr. LAWRENCE SCHILLER, Alskog,
deted 2/15/67 in which Mr. SCHILLER Inc., Los Angeles, dated 3/15/67, in which Mr. SCHILLER acknowledged receipt of a Bureau letter dated 1/21/67. SCHILLER, on 1/16/67, submitted to the Bureau a letter enclosing a transcript of a taped recording between JACK RUBY and his attorneys five days before RUBY'S death. SCHILLER has advised her is in possession of the name and location of MARK LANE'S informant who allegedly furnished LANE information he was supposedly present and overheard an alleged meeting between JACK RUBY, Dallas Police Officer J. D. TIPPIT, and BERNARD WEISSMAN, on 11/14/63. SCHILLER is willing to furnish this information to the Bureau. For further information, reier to the Commission's Report, .Page 297.

SCHILLER interviewed by Los Angeles, 3/22/67, and indicated that MARK LANE'S confidential informant is PAUL BRIDEWELL aka Phil Burns, and that BRIDEWELL currently . located somewhere in Oregon, possibly Portland or Ranier. Exact location of BRIDEWILL is probably known to one JOHN SUTTON, who formerly was in radio business in Dallas. SUTTON allegedly now residing somewhere in Pennsylvania, in location phonetically furnished to SCHILLER as Wilshire, but SCHILLER unable to locate this town from maps or postal

According to SCHILLER, MARK LANE learned of identity of BRIDEWELL and information in possession of BRIDEWELL from THEODORE (THAYER) WALDO, formerly associated with Pt. Worth, Texas, newspaper, "Sun Telegraph". Efforts to locate BRIDEWELL by SCHILLER unsuccessful.

THAYER WALDO located and interviewed, Mexico City, 4/3/67, and advised that at the time of the assassination, he was a feature editor of the Pt. Worth "Star Telegram," and was acquainted with a JOHN SUTTON, white male, about 37, born Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania. WALDO believes SUTTON was a radio announcer employed by WFAA radio, Dallas, and he met SUTTON in 1956 when SUTTON was Information Officer "Herald Post". Texas, and WALDO was working at the El Paso.

WALDO indicates that about a week after assassination, SUTTON asked to meet him at the Dallas Press Club and at that time SUTTON indicated he knew a man who witnessed a meeting in the Carousel Club between RUBY, Officer J. D. TIPPIT, and a BERNARD WEISSMAN, but who was reluctant to come forward with this information

> WALDO indicates that on or about 12/7/63, he met SUTTON at the Dallas Press Club and was introduced to PHIL BURNS, white male, age late 30's, 5'8", 145 pounds, chestnut hair, wore glasses, and employed by some advertising firm on account of one of SUTTON'S sponsors. After many assurances that identity would be protected. BURNS related that he was acquainted with RUBY.

knew Officer Tippit, since he mad seen nim in uniform at the club which apparently was on his beat. BURNS indicated he passed a table and RUBY greeted him saying, "You know J. D. here," and RUBY then introduced the other individual as BERNARD WEISSMAN from the East. Burns described WEISSMAN as white male, 35 years, black hair, over 6' tall. BURNS allegedly returned to his table and RUBY sent him a complimentary drink.

WALDO indicated that he discussed the above tter with editors BUTLER and HITCH, but agreed not to pullish this information since informant insisted on re-mailing anonymous. However, about a week later he met MARK MNE at a press conference in Dallas and confided this impormation to LANE, who was extremely anxious to contact mformant. WALDO agreed to consult with SUTTON, but SUTTON upon contact refused to cooperate: further and WALDO acvised that he determined by calling an advertising arency that BURNS was actually PAUL BRIDEWELL.

WALDO stated he has had no further contact with SUTTON or BRIDEWELL) and has no idea as to their whereabouts, except BRIDEWELL reportedly returned to his home in Oregon in 1964 and SUTTON also left; about this time.

Referenced Buleau airtel to Dallas, 5/22/67, instructs that this matter is to receive continuous investigative attention until it is logically resolved. It is also noted that the Bureau in its teletypes of 3/24/67 and 4/4/67, instructed Dallas and other offices that every effort be made to locate and interview JOHN SUTTON, as well as PAUL BRIDEWELL, aka Phil Burns regarding above information. AT PORTLAND, OREGON. Will through sources in advertising and radio media, attempt to locate and interview PAUL BRIDEWELL, aka Phil Burns. Will also conduct same investigation with Credit Bureau, PD, License Bureaus and any other logical sources, noting that BRIDEWELL (according to THAYER WALDO), left Dallas sometime in early 1964, allegedly to return to his home in Oregon. (BRIDEWELL) is described by WALDO as a white male, age now approximately 40, chestnut hair, thinning from the temples, wore glasses with metal rims but with shell earpieces, brown or hazel eyes, medium complexion, slightly cleft chin, thin mouth, quite large and prominent/ ears, which stood out from his head. BRIDEWELL was well and conservatively dressed, usually in a dark suit, wore a class or fraternal ring on the third finger of his left hand over his wedding band. His height was about 5'8", with weight about 145 pounds. He was well spoken, with no particular accent noted. He usually drank rum collins, and had quite deep lines on the sides of his mouth, and appeared to be quite tense and uneasy. JOHN SUTTON was described by WALDO as a white male, now about 37 years old, height about 5'92", weight probably 160 pounds, stocky build, glasses (believed to be full shell rims), dark brown hair, brown eyes.
