THE WARREN Commis-
sion named Oswald as the

charged that Shaw conspired

presidential assassination.

Judge Edward A. Haggerty
today ordered the return of
\$30,000 worth of homestead
certificate to accused presi-
dential death plot conspirator
Clay L. Shaw.

Shaw, a 54-year-old retired
New Orleans businessman,
pleaded not guilty during a
preliminary hearing. He was
bound over for trial by three
hearing judges.

The certificates were seized
by Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's
office March 1 after Shaw
was arrested and charged
with complicity in the murder
of President John F. Kennedy.

The nine certificates which
Haggerty ordered returned
comprise deposits in ~~five New~~
Orleans homesteads.

Defense lawyers sought
their return along with five
boxes of personal belongings
and papers taken by a search
team of a dozen DA's offi-
cers who scoured Shaw's
handsome French Quarter
home.

HAGGERTY, IN his order
today, left open the question
of other Shaw belongings
which the defense wants re-
turned.

Among them is an address
book in which Garrison has
told the court he found the
coded, unlisted 1963 Dallas
telephone number of Jack
Ruby.

Ruby, who died of cancer,

COURT RETURNS SHAW PROPERTY

Homestead Certificates Given to Defendant

At least part of numerous articles seized in the apartment of Clay L. Shaw — \$30,000 in homestead certificates — was ordered returned to the murder conspiracy defendant Thursday by Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr.

The certificates were among five boxes of material taken from Shaw's apartment at 1313 Dauphine by District Attorney Jim Garrison's men on March 1, the same day Garrison had the 54-year-old Shaw arrested and booked with conspiring to murder President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw's attorneys had filed motions with Haggerty for the return of the seized property, challenging the district attorney to show their relevance to his case.

Garrison, in answer, told the court he discovered the same Post Office box number in one of Shaw's address books that appears in an address book that belonged to accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

This number when decoded, Garrison contends, yields the 1963 private telephone number of Jack Ruby in Dallas.

Ruby, who subsequently died of cancer, shot Oswald to death in the Dallas court house two days after Kennedy was slain.

Garrison says that Shaw conspired with Oswald, the late David W. Ferrie and others in New Orleans to kill Kennedy.

Shaw was ordered held over for trial by a three-judge preliminary hearing requested by the state and was subsequently indicted by the Orleans Parish Grand Jury on the conspiracy charge.

In summary, the attached 7 page teletype has to do with legal maneuvering between attorneys for Clay L. Shaw and Jim Garrison's office in New Orleans.

Shaw's attorneys have asked for a bill of particulars and have tried to have evidence suppressed. A major point has been that the language in the indictment has been rather non-specific concerning the carrying out of the so-called conspiracy to assassinate Kennedy.

It is interesting to note that Shaw has been accused of conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald to kill John F. Kennedy, yet Garrison has publicly announced that Oswald never fired a shot. According to attached, Garrison now claims that Shaw met and paid money to both Oswald and Jack Ruby. All of the persons with whom Shaw allegedly conspired, according to Garrison's list, are deceased.

Garrison recently issued a ridiculous statement to the effect that three anti-Castro Cubans known to the Central Intelligence Agency actually killed Kennedy.

Since the attached is from news media, it will not be disseminated.

PRE-TRIAL HEARING MONDAY

Shaw Side Asks For 32 Witnesses

Attorneys for accused presidential assassination conspirator Clay L. Shaw today asked Criminal District Court to subpoena 32 witnesses for a Monday hearing in Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's Kennedy death plot investigation.

The hearing will launch pre-trial courtroom skirmishing between Garrison and the Shaw defense.

Today's surprise move found the defense asking the clerk of court to call a wide assortment of witnesses, including Garrison and members of his legal and investigative staff.

Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. called the hearing after the state, replying to earlier defense motions, charged that Shaw met in Baton Rouge with Jack Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald to plot Kennedy's murder.

Ruby, now dead of cancer shot Oswald in the Dallas police station two days after Kennedy's slaying. The Warren Commission placed the sole blame for the President's killing on Oswald.

Among witnesses the defense wants called are three key members of Truth and Consequences, all of the members of the Orleans Jury Com-

mission, the foreman and at least two other members of the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

THE DEFENSE also requested subpoenas for Asst. DA James Alcock, who has been Garrison's chief legal assistant in the case; the DA's chief investigator, Louis Ivon, and two other Garrison investigators.

Truth and Consequences

leaders called by the defense are oilman Joseph M. Rault Jr., automobile executive Wilford E. Robertson and Cecil M. Shilstone.

The trio of businessmen organized the group to help finance Garrison's investigation after the DA complained that public recording of investigative expenses was hampering the probe.

A number of names unfamiliar in the three-and-a-half-month-old investigation appeared on the defense witness list. They are those of:

J. C. Albarado, 3720 Gen. Pershing; Theodore L. Drell, 336 New York; Erwin L. Fleming, 4300 Annette; John H. Kramer III, 2126 Pauline; Oliver J. Meyer Jr., 5378 Chamberlain dr.; Lawrence J. Centola, 1604 Bodenger blvd.; Constant DeJoie, 3400 Annette; Lionel J. Favrat, 37 Lark, and H. R. Friedberg, 3127 Nashville.

GRAND JURY Foreman Albert V. LaBiche and at least two members of the jury which indicted Shaw, Joseph Lyons and Merrick W. Swords Jr., appeared on the requested witness list.

So did the names of all eight judges of Criminal District Court.

The defense offered no explanation for the requests. The Monday hearing opens at 10 a. m., and the principal arguments will bear on a defense motion to quash the indictment which charges Shaw conspired to kill Kennedy.

Meanyfile, an attorney for Gordon Novel today took action in U.S. District Court to block the taking of his client's testimony here in connection with his multimillion-dollar damage suit against Garrison and members of Truth and Consequences.

Steven R. Plotkin, attorney for the 29-year-old fugitive witness, asked Federal Dist. Judge James A. Comiskey to quash a motion by Garrison's lawyer seeking to take Novel's deposition in New Orleans Friday.

GARRISON'S attorney, Malcolm W. Monroe, gave notice last week of his intention to take the deposition from Novel.

As an alternate, Plotkin asked the federal court to order that the deposition be taken in Columbus, Ohio, where Novel is fighting extradition, or at some other designated place.

If Novel is forced to appear in New Orleans, he would be subject to arrest and jailing on criminal charges as well as a material witness in Garrison's Kennedy death plot investigation, Plotkin declared.

Plotkin contends Novel is now under the jurisdiction of the courts of Ohio in connection with extradition proceedings and cannot receive permission to leave that jurisdiction.

Novel's lawyer also claimed it would be burdensome and expensive for him to return here when the defendants in the suit can file written interrogatories in the case.

NOVEL'S final alternative request is that if he is forced to return to New Orleans, he be granted immunity from arrest by the state.

Garrison has said Novel is an important witness in his investigation of Kennedy's assassination. He has filed a material witness warrant, seeking the onetime bar owner's return.

JFK Said Killed For Fighting Reds

President John F. Kennedy's strong anti-Communist stand in Cuba and elsewhere led to his assassination, the national chairman of the Conservative Society of America said today.

The chairman, Kent Courtney of New Orleans, told the Kiwanis Club of Kenner the Communists had several reasons to assassinate Kennedy. "While president, John F. Kennedy tried to stop Communist expansion in Cuba and in fact tried to take military action against Cuba on two occasions, but was thwarted in his plans by the United Nations," he said.

Courtney termed the first two years of the administration of President Lyndon B. Johnson "disastrous for the cause of Americanism."

Novel was arrested April 1 at Cahanna, a suburb of Columbus, under a Garrison warrant charging he conspired to burglarize a munitions dump at Houma in 1961. He is free on \$10,000 bond.

Last week he filed suit against Garrison and the private organization which is helping the DA finance his Kennedy investigation.

The suit seeks \$10 million from Garrison and \$1 million each from the 50 businessmen who comprise the Truth and Consequences organization.

Garrison's lawyer countered by asking the federal court to order Novel here for questioning.

Andrews Seeks Speedy Trial on Perjury Count

Motion Is Presented in District Court

Dean A. Andrews Jr., charged with perjury in assassination investigation testimony, moved for a speedy trial Monday; and criminal district court Judge Frank J. Shea promised to rule on this motion and a previous one Monday, June 12.

If Judge Shea grants the speedy trial motion, the case can come up almost immediately after. The state will have a chance Monday to answer the motion and if necessary to show cause why the speedy trial should not be granted.

The other motion to be ruled on Monday, previously filed by Attorney Sam Monk Zelden, is to quash the indictment. Judge Shea strongly urged Andrews and Zelden to file a memorandum on Articles 123 and 124 of the state's new code of criminal procedure. These sections deal with different aspects of the crime of perjury.

One question has been which

er Andrews should be charged under Article 123, which refers to willful falsehoods, or Article 124, which deals with contradictory statements.

Andrews was indicted by the Orleans parish grand jury after testifying before the body in connection with District Attorney Jim Garrison's probe into an alleged New Orleans plot to assassinate President John F. Kennedy.

Andrews told the Warren commission that he was contacted by a man named Bertrand, who asked him to defend Lee Harvey Oswald after the assassination.

Garrison claims that Bertrand is an alias for Clay L. Shaw, who has been charged with criminal conspiracy to murder President Kennedy.

Andrews told the grand jury he could not say for sure that Bertrand and Shaw are the same person.

RUBY IS NAMED AS PLOT FIGURE

DA Says Shaw Provided Money at Meeting

District Attorney Jim Garrison Monday named Jack Ruby as an alleged co-conspirator of Clay L. Shaw in a presidential murder plot which Garrison claims was based in New Orleans.

Garrison also charged in papers filed in Criminal District Court that Shaw, 54, once delivered money to Ruby, a Dallas night club owner, and to Lee Harvey Oswald in a Baton Rouge hotel in the fall of 1963.

Shaw, former managing director of the International Trade Mart, is charged with conspiring with Oswald, David W. Ferrie and others to kill President John F. Kennedy.

Ruby killed Oswald, accused presidential assassin, in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963, two days after Kennedy's assassination.

Assistant District Attorneys James L. Alcock and Richard Burnes filed the 93-point document in Judge Edward A. Haggerty's section of court in answer to previously filed defense motions which asked, in part, for specification of the supposed other conspirators.

MONEY MENTIONED

Garrison, in answer to a defense motion for a bill of particulars, charged that Shaw conspired with Ruby, since deceased, that he delivered to Ruby and Oswald a sum of money in the Capital House hotel in Baton Rouge.

The document reads in part: "The defendant, Clay L. Shaw, is being prosecuted for the substantive violation of Louisiana Revised Statute, Title 14, Section 26, relative to conspiracy to commit the offense of murder defined in Louisiana Revised Statute, Title 14, Section 30.

"It is the position of the state of Louisiana that the defendant also conspired with Jack Ruby,

formerly of Dallas, Tex., to kill President John F. Kennedy.

ALLEGED ACTS LISTED

"The state denies that it is required to answer in a bill of particulars all of the acts committed by any or all of the conspirators in furtherance of the conspiracy. However, some of the acts committed by the conspirators are:

"A. A meeting of Lee Harvey Oswald, David W. Ferrie, and the defendant, Clay L. Shaw, in the apartment of David W. Ferrie at 3330 Louisiana ave. pkwy. in the city of New Orleans during the month of September, 1963.

"B. Discussion of means and methods of execution of the conspiracy, to wit, the assassination of John F. Kennedy, particularly the selection of the use of high-powered rifles being fired from multiple directions simultaneously to produce a triangulation of crossfire; establishing and selecting means and routes of escape from the assassination scene to a point outside the continental United States; determining of procedures and the places to be used for some of the principals to the conspiracy to establish alibis on the date of the assassination.

TRIP ALLEGED

"Clay L. Shaw traveling from New Orleans to Baton Rouge in the fall of 1963 and there meeting Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby at the Capitol House hotel and delivering to Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby a sum of money.

"D. A trip to the West Coast of the United States by Clay L. Shaw during the month of November, 1963.

"E. A trip by David W. Ferrie from New Orleans, La., to Houston, Tex., on the day of November 22, 1963.

"F. Lee Harvey Oswald taking his rifle from the home of Mrs. Ruth Paine in Irving, Tex., to the Texas School Book Depository in Dallas, Tex., on or before November 22, 1963.

The document also mentioned alleged aliases:

"Leon Oswald is one and the same person as Lee Harvey Oswald named in the indictment and therefore would not be one of the others unnamed.

Clem Bertrand is one and the same as Clay Shaw named in the indictment and therefore would not be one of the others unnamed.

Garrison first tried to connect Oswald, Ruby and Shaw, May 12, in an answer to a defense request for the return of seized property.

An example of the relevance of Shaw's seized property was, according to Garrison, the discovery of the post office box number in one of Shaw's seized address books and in Oswald's address book, printed in the Warren Commission hearings.

The post office box number, when properly decoded, yields the 1963 private Dallas telephone number of Jack Ruby, Garrison said.

Judge Haggerty set Monday for a hearing on defense motions and the state's answers.

Legislature Asks Extradition Speed

BATON ROUGE (AP) — The legislature Monday asked the governors of Ohio, Iowa and Texas to hasten the extradition of the persons New Orleans Dist. Atty. Garrison wants to question in the Kennedy assassination probe.

The Senate unanimously approved three separate resolutions calling for the return of Gordon Navel from Ohio, Sandra Moffett McMair from Iowa, and Sergio Arcache from Texas.

The House had voted approval of the resolution earlier.

Sen. Theodore Hickey, New Orleans, told the Senate the resolutions merely sought to carry out justice and took no position on right or wrong.

"I'm just trying to get people down here to answer some questions," he said.

Andrews Seeks Speedy Trial on Perjury Count

Dean A. Andrews Jr. today moved for a speedy trial on the perjury charges lodged against him in connection with District Attorney Jim Garrison's probe of the slaying of President John F. Kennedy.

Criminal District Court Judge Frank J. Shea took the motion under advisement and promised a ruling next Monday. If he grants it, a trial could come almost immediately.

The state will have a chance Monday to answer the motion and if necessary to show cause why the speedy trial should not be granted.

JUDGE SHEA also strongly urged Andrews and his attorney, Sam Monk Zelden, to file a memorandum on articles 123 and 124 of the state's new code of criminal procedure. The sections relate to different aspects of the crime of perjury.

One point at issue has been whether the alleged perjury by Andrews comes under the heading of Article 123, which refers to willful falsehoods, or Article 124, which deals with contradictory statements.

Judge Shea is also expected to rule Monday on a motion to quash the indictment against Andrews. This was filed previously by Zelden.

THE PERJURY charge against Andrews grew out of his testimony before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury in the investigation of Garrison's charges that President Kennedy's death resulted from a New Orleans-based conspiracy.

Andrews told the Warren Commission that a man named Clay Bertrand contacted him after the assassination and asked him to defend Lee Harvey Oswald.

Garrison contends that Bertrand is an alias for Clay L. Shaw, who is charged with criminal conspiracy to kill Kennedy. Andrews told the grand jury he does not know whether Shaw and Bertrand are the same. His indictment followed his testimony.

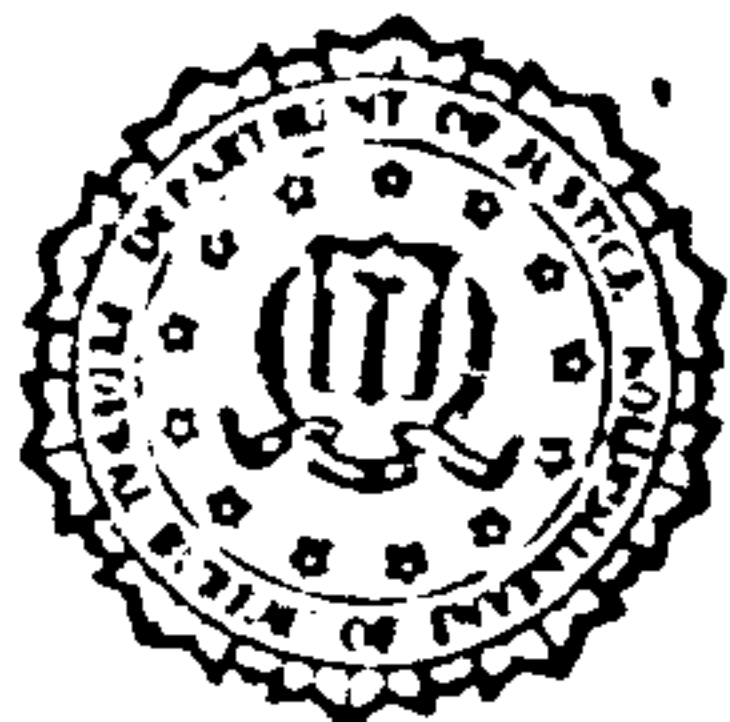

Richard Halstead, Wyoming Highway Patrolman, Wamsutter, Wyoming, telephonically furnished the following information on June 4, 1967, to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation:

At about 10:30 p.m., June 3, 1967, he stopped a 1955 Buick, two door hardtop, dark green over white in color, bearing Nevada license W 68105, on Interstate Highway 80 near Wamsutter, because the car had only one illuminated headlight. A ticket was given to the driver but he is not required to appear in court and is merely required to have the faulty headlight repaired in the next town, Rawlins, Wyoming.

The driver, who was traveling alone, identified himself as Gerald Lee Morrison, and said he was traveling to Washington, D. C., to see Senator Robert Kennedy, since he had information concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Morrison stated that he had talked with Lee Harvey Oswald, and had been questioned by the FBI in Salt Lake City. Morrison's Nevada driver's license, number GM 410528, disclosed he was born May 28, 1941, is a white male, 5 feet 10 inches tall, weight 165 pounds, blond hair and blue eyes. His residence address is 332 Colorado River Boulevard, Reno, Nevada.

A bill of sale revealed he had purchased the 1955 Buick, VIN 4B4019734, on June 11, 1966, from Scott Motor Co., 2401 South Virginia, Reno, Nevada.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Attached reveals Gerald Lee Morrison, was stopped by the Wyoming Highway Patrol at which time Morrison revealed he was en route to Washington, D. C., to see Senator Robert Kennedy as he had information concerning the assassination. Morrison also claimed he had talked with Lee Harvey Oswald and had been questioned by the FBI in Salt Lake City.

The only reference in Bureau files concerning Morrison was a name check request from the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on 11/11/61, which indicated Morrison, along with 13 other individuals, had been admitted to Canada as an immigrant. Since Morrison resided in Reno, Nevada, both Salt Lake City and Las Vegas Offices are checking their files and upon receipt of any information regarding Morrison, this information will be disseminated to U. S. Secret Service and the Department.

Jack Martin is an alcoholic mental case who informed the New Orleans Office immediately after the assassination of President Kennedy that he suspected that David W. Ferrie was involved with Oswald. Extensive investigation of Martin's suspicions proved that such allegations were false.

Martin was also in contact with Garrison and we strongly suspect that Martin's ideas caused Garrison to initiate his investigation. Martin has recently claimed that he is being harassed by Garrison and it now appears that he is on the verge of a complete mental breakdown.

Gordon Novel is a former associate of Jim Garrison, who fled the State of Louisiana after Garrison had him subpoenaed to appear before a local grand jury in connection with Garrison's so-called probe of the Kennedy assassination.

Novel has publicly accused Garrison of being a fraud and he has stated that he has evidence which he intends to release which will show that Garrison's probe is a hoax. Garrison has been unsuccessful in having Novel extradited to Louisiana from Ohio.

After Novel filed a multi-million dollar libel suit against Garrison and his financial backers, Garrison filed a motion requesting a deposition from Novel to be taken in New Orleans. This would of course, give Garrison an opportunity to take Novel into custody.

Attorneys for Clay L. Shaw have previously indicated that they will try to gain access to financial records of Garrison's backers in order to build a proper defense for Shaw.

Attorneys for Clay L. Shaw, who is under indictment in New Orleans for allegedly conspiring to assassinate John F. Kennedy, have tried repeatedly to get a bill of particulars. They have stated that it is impossible to defend their client without knowing exactly the nature of the crime he has committed.

Garrison's only reply to date has been in the form of nebulous accusations of Shaw conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald, Jack Ruby and David W. Ferrie to cause Kennedy's assassination.

The attached would indicate that the attorneys are now endeavoring to gain the desired information for a defense by subpoenaing Garrison and his staff, his financial backers, members of the local grand jury and local judges.

For the information of the Bureau, Cincinnati, Dallas, and New Orleans, U. S. Attorney GILBERT S. MERRITT, Nashville, Tennessee, furnished the following information to SA HENDERSON HILLIN, JR., on 5/22/67. Mr. MERRITT advised that he had previously furnished this information to the Department of Justice and no action was recommended or indicated as far as the government was concerned but that he wanted it to be made a part of FBI records. This information is as follows:

A Mr. CHARLES WALKER, owner of Radio Station WKDA, Nashville, Tennessee, accompanied by DICK BUCKLEY, Program Director, WKDA, and WKDA's attorney, WILLIAM F. CARPENTER, JR., appeared at Mr. MERRITT's office on 5/22/67 and furnished, in the presence of Davidson County District Attorney General's Investigator CHARLES HUNTER, the following information:

GARY EDWARDS, which is the pseudonym for GERALD MUNDY, News Director, of WKDA, is an old friend of GORDON NOVEL. GARY EDWARDS had been employed in the past by Station WNOE in New Orleans, Louisiana, when he came to know NOVEL, also of New Orleans. During the New York World's Fair, EDWARDS took leave of absence to work on the Louisiana exhibit, and at that time renewed his acquaintance with NOVEL. Several months ago NOVEL called GARY EDWARDS and discussed with him NOVEL's relationship to the GARRISON investigation of the assassination of President JOHN KENNEDY and how GARRISON had planned to arrest and extradite NOVEL from Ohio to New Orleans.

NOVEL told EDWARDS thereafter in a conversation with WALKER and BUCKLEY that he had worked sometime prior to January or February, 1967 for District Attorney GARRISON on the KENNEDY assassination as an electronics expert. NOVEL had told them that in the past he (NOVEL) had been getting money from the Governor of Louisiana and the CIA for information obtained regarding GARRISON and the assassination.

As a result of NOVEL and EDWARDS' relationship, on Tuesday, 5/16/67, NOVEL came from Columbus, Ohio, to Nashville, Tennessee, and played for EDWARDS a number of tapes that he had secretly made of conversations which allegedly took place in meetings between GARRISON and his associates in the KENNEDY assassination investigation. Also there were tapes which he had obtained from illegal wire taps from phones in the New Orleans area. GARY EDWARDS had this information in his files and he had overheard and had listened to NOVEL's tapes.

NOVEL and EDWARDS spent Tuesday through Saturday, 5/20/67 going over these tapes at WKDA located in downtown Nashville. EDWARDS called some of the people on these tapes and asked some very pointed questions, which would indicate that he knew of the conversations that NOVEL had taped. EDWARDS also allegedly taped his conversations that he had had with these people.

According to WALKER, an underworld character offered to buy all of NOVEL's tapes but that this character would have to call "the man" (meaning GARRISON) to see what they were worth and allegedly there was some conversation regarding a meeting on a boat.

On Saturday night, 5/20/67, NOVEL and EDWARDS were at Radio Station WKDA and returned to EDWARDS' apartment from the radio station in a panel truck. As they went into the driveway, a bullet went through the front of the cab; both hit the deck and the first shot was followed by a series of shots, some of which went through the cab of the truck. (This information came to WALKER from GARY EDWARDS, who telephoned him at 5:10 a.m., Sunday, 5/21/67, from Bowling Green, Kentucky, and told him what happened.)

Allegedly the shooting occurred shortly after 1:00 a.m. on Sunday, 5/21/67. NOVEL was allegedly shot in the arm but not hurt badly, and EDWARDS was not hurt but did receive some wounds from flying glass.

BUCKLEY went to the scene and did find that some bushes in the area had been tramped down as if someone had been lying there. The panel truck was there and there were indications that it had been shot up. EDWARDS and NOVEL somehow got to Bowling Green, Kentucky, in an automobile, although EDWARDS did not own a car. From somewhere in Kentucky EDWARDS and NOVEL split up; NOVEL returned to Columbus, Ohio; and EDWARDS was allegedly to proceed to Washington, D. C., where he was to appear at a meeting previously scheduled for news editors at a Department of State briefing.

U. S. Attorney MERRITT made available a Xerox copy of a memo found in the files of GARY EDWARDS which relate to alleged tape recordings mentioned above. This is being set out for the information of the Bureau and receiving offices:

Mr. MERRITT stated that he did not know the significance of this information but that he had made it available to the Department of Justice and no action was recommended other than to place it in our files.

Shaw Asks 32 Hearing Witnesses

Attorneys for accused presidential assassination conspirator Clay L. Shaw today asked Criminal District Court to subpoena 32 witnesses for a Monday hearing in Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's Kennedy death plot investigation.

The hearing will launch pre-trial courtroom skirmishing between Garrison and the Shaw defense.

Today's surprise move found the defense asking the clerk of court to call a wide assortment of witnesses, including Garrison and members of his legal and investigative staff.

Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. called the hearing after the state, replying to earlier defense motions, charged that Shaw met in Baton Rouge with Jack Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald to plot Kennedy's murder.

Ruby, now dead of cancer, shot Oswald in the Dallas police station two days after Kennedy's slaying. The Warren Commission placed the sole blame for the President's killing on Oswald.

Among witnesses the defense wants called are three key members of Truth and Consequences, all of the members of the Orleans Jury Commission, the foreman and all members of the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

THE DEFENSE also requested subpoenas for Asst. DA James Alcock, who has been Garrison's chief legal assistant in the case; the DA's chief investigator, Lewis Ivon, and two other Garrison investigators.

Truth and Consequences leaders called by the defense are oilman Joseph M. Rault Jr., automobile executive Willard E. Robertson and Cecil M. Shilstone.

The trio of businessmen organized the group to help finance Garrison's investigation after the DA complained that public recording of investigative expenses was hampering the probe.

Grand Jury Foreman Albert V. LaBiche and the other 11 members of the grand jury which indicted Shaw appeared

on the requested witness list. So did the names of all eight judges of Criminal District Court.

The defense offered no explanation for the requests. The Monday hearing opens at 10 a. m., and the principal arguments will bear on a defense motion to quash the indictment which charges Shaw conspired to kill Kennedy.

Meanwhile, an attorney for Gordon Novel today took action in U.S. District Court to block the taking of his client's testimony here in connection with his multimillion-dollar damage suit against Garrison and members of Truth and Consequences.

Steven R. Plotkin, attorney for the 29-year-old fugitive witness, asked Federal Dist. Judge James A. Comiskey to quash a motion by Garrison's lawyer seeking to take Novel's deposition in New Orleans Friday.

GARRISON'S attorney, Malcolm W. Monroe, gave notice last week of his intention to take the deposition from Novel.

As an alternate, Plotkin asked the federal court to order that the deposition be taken in Columbus, Ohio, where Novel is fighting extradition, or at some other designated place.

If Novel is forced to appear in New Orleans, he would be subject to arrest and jailing on criminal charges as well as a material witness in Garrison's Kennedy death plot investigation, Plotkin declared.

Plotkin contends Novel is now under the jurisdiction of the courts of Ohio in connection with extradition proceedings and cannot receive permission to leave that jurisdiction.

Novel's lawyer also claimed it would be burdensome and expensive for him to return here when the defendants in the suit can file written interrogatories in the case.

NOVEL'S final alternative request is that if he is forced to return to New Orleans, he be granted immunity from arrest by the state.

Garrison has said Novel is an important witness in his investigation of Kennedy's assassination. He has filed a material witness warrant, seeking the onetime bar owner's return.

Novel was arrested April 1 at Gahanna, a suburb of Columbus, under a Garrison warrant charging he conspired to burglarize a munitions dump at Houma in 1961. He is free on \$10,000 bond.

Novel Bids To Remain in Ohio for Suit

Steven Plotkin, attorney for Gordon Novel in Novel's multimillion dollar suit against District Attorney Jim Garrison and members of Truth and Consequences Inc., told a federal judge today that a deposition from his client should be taken outside Louisiana.

Novel, the elusive witness in Garrison's John F. Kennedy murder probe, is suing for damages, claiming a loss of civil rights and character assassination.

Plotkin told Federal District Judge James A. Comiskey that under the law the court has unlimited discretion to take Novel's deposition elsewhere, "namely in Columbus, Ohio," or to proceed by submitting written questions for Novel to answer.

THE ATTORNEY POINTED out that there are criminal charges brought by Garrison pending against Novel.

Plotkin asked Judge Comiskey to consider issuing an order protecting Novel from arrest and incarceration should the court rule that Novel's deposition should be taken here Friday before U.S. Commissioner Fritz Windhorst.

Otherwise, Plotkin said, Garrison will have accomplished in a civil action what he has not been able to do otherwise—get Novel back to New Orleans for questioning as a material witness in the probe.

MALCOLM W. MONROE, representing Garrison, argued that the law already provides Novel protection against arrest and incarceration. He said Novel chose to file his civil action in this district and that, therefore, Novel's deposition should be taken in this district. Monroe said he does not see why the defense should have to bear the expense of traveling elsewhere to take the deposition.

He asked Judge Comiskey to issue an order obligating Novel to pay for expenses incurred by the defense if the court rules the deposition will be taken outside Louisiana.

Waiting to present his argument was Claude W. Duke, attorney for Willard E. Robertson, one of the group of businessmen who are bankrolling Garrison's probe and are now being sued by Novel.

Judge Comiskey said he would rule on the matter this afternoon.

On another front of Garrison's controversial probe, attorneys for Clay L. Shaw have indicated they may call Lee Odom, whose name appears in Shaw's notebook, to testify at a hearing here Monday.

The Monday session before Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. will open what may be a long series of pre-trial battles in Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's Kennedy death plot investigation.

SHAW'S LAWYERS yesterday asked the court to subpoena 32 witnesses, including the DA, seven criminal court judges and the entire Orleans Parish Grand Jury, to appear.

The hearing's main action will revolve around Shaw's plea to quash the indictment which charges him with complicity in the murder of President John F. Kennedy.

Odom is the Irving, Tex., man whose name appears in Shaw's address book above the notation "P.O. Box 19106," which Garrison contends is the enciphered version of Jack Ruby's 1963 unlisted telephone number at Dallas.

The DA said he found identical references to the post office box number in the notebooks of Shaw and accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

Both numbers decode, Garrison has said, to the telephone number of Ruby, who gunned down Oswald in the Dallas police station two days after Kennedy's slaying.

MONDAY, Garrison charged that Shaw met with Ruby and Oswald at Baton Rouge in the fall of 1963 to make further plans for the President's assassination. He said Shaw gave both men money.

Shaw has said the presence of the post office box numbers in the two books is a coincidence. He said Odom is a friend who gave him the box number in 1966. Odom, who said he met Shaw while he was trying to find someone to promote a bull fight, has confirmed the Shaw statement.

Defense Attorney Irvin Dymond would not say definitely whether Odom will be asked to appear Monday.

"If we want him, we're going to have him here," the lawyer added.

May Change T&C Name to 'Price Is Right'

The chairman of "Truth and Consequences" said today the group may change its name to "The Price is Right."

"We're for justice at any price — that's our purpose," said businessman Joseph Rault Jr., who has been heading the T&C group financing the investigation by District Attorney Jim Garrison of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The group has to change its name because a Garrison foe, attorney Dean A. Andrews Jr., moved to register the corporate name "Truth and Consequences Inc.", thus depriving the Garrison group of the right to use it.

"Since Andrews has the name, he can also take over defense of the suit filed by Gordon Novel against Truth and Consequences," said Rault. Novel sued the T&C group on the grounds that Garrison was depriving him of his rights, using T&C money.

Rault said it was "only a coincidence" that the names of his group are similar to television programs. As an alternative, Rault said, they might continue to use the old name by changing it slightly to "Truth and Consequences of New Orleans."
