Enclosed are six copies of a self-explanatory LHM dated 6-23-67, setting forth information received from Mr. Edward J. Joyce, Cultural Attaché in the Embassy, on 6-19-67. Also enclosed is the original of Fleissman's letter translated in the LHM, the pertinent page from the June 2, 1967 issue of "Echo" referred to therein, as well as page 4 from the May 19, 1967 issue containing an article on Vietnam which was also attached to Fleissman's letter.

Mr. Joyce said that Fleissman wanted to give the information to the FBI and thought that it might get more attention if he passed it through someone like Mr. Joyce. As pointed out in the LHM, Joyce does not know Fleissman, but he said he outwardly appeared to be a stable person. "Echo" is regarded by the Nuernberg office of USIS as tending to be inaccurate, a bit sensational, rightist, and having a small circulation. Its articles on the United States have been generally favorable. It attributes progress on civil rights to President Kennedy rather than to President Johnson.

Fleissman marked his letter "Top Secret," but the matter does not appear to warrant security classification on the LHM.

No action is being taken here in this matter UACB. It is my suggestion that if a reply to Fleissman's letter is deemed appropriate, either directly from the Bureau or from here, it be

along the lines suggesting he furnish any information he has to appropriate German police authorities because of the Bureau's lack of jurisdiction in foreign countries.

Fleissman's motives appear to be such that I believe contact with him, if any, should be most guarded and through established police sources.

Mr. Edward J. Joyce, Cultural Attaché at the American Embassy, Bonn/Bad Godesberg, Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), advised that on June 15, 1967, Mr. Georg Fleissman called on him in his office and turned over to him a letter written by Mr. Fleissman addressed to the Headquarters of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington, D.C. Fleissman asked Mr. Joyce to arrange to see that the letter is forwarded. Mr. Fleissman is the editor of the weekly newspaper, "Echo," published at Nuernberg, FRG, by the Echo-Verlag GmbH and Company, 20 Kriemhildstrasse, Nuernberg, FRG. The letter is on the letterhead of that firm and carries the following notation at the top: "Streng Geheim/Top Secret." The letter, which is written in German, may be translated as follows:

"Enclosed you will find a copy of the June 2, 1967 issue of our weekly newspaper, "Echo," on page 4 of which there appears an article summarizing the background of

of the murder in Dallas. We believe that you are interested in the definite clarification of this affair, as well as in revelations regarding the actions of Mr. Garrison in New Orleans.

"We are prepared to work with you provided you declare yourself ready to support our work in this matter which must be of not insignificant interest to the people of North America - and to be of help to us in the acquisition of information."

"The undersigned is about to establish here a special news bureau (NBI - News Bureau International) whose purpose will be to carry out all inquiries and gather together necessary material for publication."

"At the moment we are interested in three questions that pertain to District Attorney Garrison: When and where was he discharged from the U.S. Army? What was the basis of this discharge? (Allegedly because of 'feeble-mindedness'??)

"Was Garrison in Europe during or after World War II?

"Is it correct that Garrison was formerly an FBI Agent? (He claims this)

"The undersigned would be thankful if you could give him information soon."

"We ask that this contact be held top secret in order to protect the security of the undersigned and his associates."

News paper "Echo"

The article on page 4 of the "Echo" enclosed with the letter is the third article in the series entitled "America Heute" (America Today). The article begins with a general summary of the previous two articles in the series. It then sets forth a rather brief statement regarding the assassination and the circumstances surrounding the investigation by District Attorney Garrison. It states that the paper has carried out inquiries in the matter "not only in America but also in Europe where the murder of Kennedy was planned." It is well established today that: (a) the murderer of Dallas was no American, (b) the persons accused in New Orleans by Jim Garrison are innocent, (c) there were two "Oswalds," Lee Oswald covered the escape of the real murderer. He never fired a shot from the carbine found in his home.

Mr. Joyce stated that he does not know Fleissman, having met him only briefly on one occasion during a public reception about two years ago. Fleissman's paper has a circulation of about 157,000. During the visit he told Mr. Joyce that he had recently been in New Orleans to visit the grave of his daughter who had been killed in an automobile accident not long ago while on her honeymoon following her marriage to an American soldier. While in New Orleans, Fleissman said he concluded that Mr. Garrison is a humbug. He claimed to have come upon a "hot tip" in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy. He said to Mr. Joyce that Oswald was simply used as a front and did not in fact kill the President, but that a foreigner from an unnamed country did it. He said that he picked up some more information in this unnamed country. From Fleissman's remarks Mr. Joyce concluded that he meant France. He said that the government of the unnamed country probably knew nothing of the plot, but that it would strain already strained relations if the story came out. He stressed that the country in question is a West European country. He spoke of large sums of money having been passed around, the total being about 1.6 million dollars in connection with payments for the death of the President.

Legat, Bonn, is instructed to have Fleissman contacted through established police sources so that he may be advised that his letter has been received at Bureau Headquarters but that the Bureau is unable to cooperate with him in this matter. It should be suggested to Fleissman that in the future he furnish to appropriate German police authorities information which he believes of possible interest to U. S. law enforcement and which he desires should be transmitted to the Bureau.

PURPOSE:

This recommends we authorize New Orleans to recontact telephone company security manager to obtain from him identity of subscriber to unlisted telephone number allegedly in the name of Bertrand.

BACKGROUND:

Layton Martens, who was at one time a roommate of David Ferrie, deceased, and who has been indicted for perjury in New Orleans in connection with District Attorney Garrison's investigation, furnished the New Orleans Office and the telephone company, New Orleans, his belief the telephone at the home of his father was being tapped because he detected sounds on the line.

Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, New Orleans, Louisiana, voluntarily advised the New Orleans Office of the allegations made by Martens and indicated that one of the telephones at the home of Martens' father had been checked without locating a tap and the other telephone at the residence had not been checked by the telephone company because no one was available at the residence.

At the same time that [REDACTED] furnished this information, [REDACTED] voluntarily advised that [REDACTED] had learned that members of Garrison's staff had determined, by calling information service of the telephone company, that there was an unlisted, unpublished telephone number listed in the name of Bertrand. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] did not know whether the first name of this individual was "Clay" or "Clem" or any variation of that name.

New Orleans recommended recontacting [redacted] to identify subscriber. New Orleans advised [redacted] has been cooperative in the past and is in an excellent position to obtain this information.

OBSERVATIONS:

[redacted] volunteered this piece of information and [redacted] has been cooperative with the New Orleans Office in the past. [redacted] is in a position to obtain the information concerning Bertrand. The name Clay Bertrand came up right after the assassination as a person associated with Lee Harvey Oswald. This individual was never located, and Garrison claims Bertrand is a name used by Clay Shaw, the man Garrison has charged with conspiracy. We should pursue the information volunteered by [redacted] by going back to [redacted] and asking [redacted] for full details concerning the Bertrand who had the unlisted telephone number.

ACTION:

Attached for approval is teletype to New Orleans instructing it to recontact [redacted] for further information about the subscriber to the unlisted telephone number.
