VETERS CONTACTED RICHARD BURNS, ASSISTANT DA, ORLEANS PARISH ON EIGHT SEVEN SIXTYSEVEN, WHO WAS THE OFFICIAL INSTITUTING THE SUBPOENA FOR SA REED W. JENSEN TO APPEAR IN COURT AUGUST NINE, NEXT. VETERS EXPLAINED TO MR. BURNS THAT SA JENSEN HAD THE TYPE OF ASSIGNMENTS THAT IF HE RECEIVED UNDUE NEWS PUBLICITY, IT MIGHT JEOPARDIZE HIM IN HIS INVESTIGATIONS. MR. FROM SA JENSEN WOULD RELATE TO HIS ALLEGED KNOWLEDGE THAT A SIGNATURE OF CLAY BERTRAND HAD APPEARED ON SOME TYPE OF DOCUMENT IN MAGNETIC INK. BURNS ALSO COMMENTED TO VETERAS THAT THEY FELT SA JENSEN WAS POSSIBLY KNOWLEDGEABLE CONCERNING SOME RADIOACTIVE PROCESS REGARDING SIGNATURES.

MR. BURNS ADVISED AUSA VETERAS THAT HE WAS ORALLY DISMISSING SA JENSEN FROM THE SUBPOENA AND THAT HE WOULD VERIFY IT LATER IN WRITING.

SA JENSEN ASKED AUSA VETERAS IF MR. BURNS HAD MADE ANY FURTHER CLARIFICATION REGARDING THE MAGNETIC INK OR RADIOACTIVE PROCESS AND MR. VETERAS STATED BURNS HAD NOT ELABORATED FURTHER.

SA JENSEN HAS ADVISED USA LACOUR AND MYSELF THAT HE HAS NO KNOWLEDGE WHATSOEVER CONCERNING ANY CLAY BERTRAND SIGNATURES OF ANY KIND INCLUDING MAGNETIC INK OR ANY KNOWLEDGE CONCERNING "SOME RADIOACTIVE PROCESS REGARDING SIGNATURES".

MR. LACOUR ADVISED SA JENSEN THAT AS FAR AS HE WAS CONCERNED SA JENSEN HAD BEEN EXCUSED FROM TESTIFYING. HOWEVER,

The purpose of this memorandum is to briefly summarize information volunteered to our New Orleans Office by a police official in New Orleans concerning data furnished this official by [redacted]

On 7-27-67 Captain Roy Allemond, New Orleans Harbor Police, contacted New Orleans Office to report information he received from [redacted]

Set forth below is a concise summary of data furnished to Captain Allemond by [redacted]

Garrison first became interested in assassination upon receipt of information from Jack S. Martin, who alleged David Ferrie involved in plot to assassinate President Kennedy. Garrison initiated his assassination probe on basis of Martin's information. (Martin is the mental case in New Orleans who formerly knew Ferrie. We have maintained from the beginning Martin was behind Garrison's probe.) Up until the very last moment when Special Agent (SA) Regis L. Kennedy appeared before the Grand Jury in New Orleans, Garrison intended to indict SA Kennedy on an "accessory after the fact" charge. This action planned because Garrison knew Kennedy interviewed a large number of Cuban exiles of New Orleans area and for no other reason. Garrison planned to make national headlines with the arrest of SA Kennedy and stated few people would read the denials or statements made after SA Kennedy's arrest.

Garrison planned to raid New Orleans FBI with a search warrant [redacted]

Garrison's investigators, Louis Ivon and Lynn Loisel, did make a bribe approach to Alvin Beaubouef, and tape recording concerning this bribe attempt has not been altered and in the very near future will be made public. (Beaubouef is the former friend of David Ferrie whom Ivon and Loisel offered a bribe provided Beaubouef testified he was aware Ferrie, Clay Shaw and Lee Harvey Oswald met in Ferrie's apartment and planned assassination of President Kennedy.)

New Orleans Police Department statements that such Department had cleared Garrison's staff of bribery attempts of Beaubouef not true. Superintendent of police, Joseph I. Giarrusso, [redacted] has aspirations of becoming Mayor of New Orleans and Garrison has committed himself to backing Giarrusso in his bid for city office. Governor McKeithen aware of Garrison's fraud in this investigation but politically afraid of Garrison since McKeithen running for reelection this fall. Garrison is confident he will obtain perjury convictions of New Orleans Attorney Dean Andrews and believes he will be successful in having the charges pending against Clay Shaw dropped on a technicality. Garrison can then obtain favorable publicity and public support in having American people believe he really had the assassination plot resolved but unable to prove same by trial due to legal technicalities. [redacted]

neither Garrison nor Shaw wants a trial, as Garrison [redacted] will be finished politically should all facts come to light [redacted]

[redacted] Dean Andrews and New Orleans bar owner, Gene Davis, planned in advance that Gene Davis would deny he was identical with Clay Bertrand, but that it was another New Orleans homosexual by the name of Schultz, deceased. (We have interviewed Gene Davis, [redacted]

[redacted] mented over using the name Clay Bertrand but stated he had heard a homosexual by the name of Phil Schultz, now deceased, used such name.)

[redacted] claims John Cancler's statements made on National Broadcasting Company (NBC) that he was approached by Garrison's men to plant something in Clay Shaw's residence is true.

[redacted] stated Vernon Bundy's testimony and Perry Raymond Russo's testimony on which Clay Shaw was indicted were both false.

[redacted] Garrison and his staff, the Grand Jury members and Criminal District Judge Bernard Bagert extremely worried over the indictment of Walter Sheridan, investigator for NBC. They are very concerned about the legal talent defending Sheridan and the possible full exposure of Garrison's fraudulent investigation. [redacted]

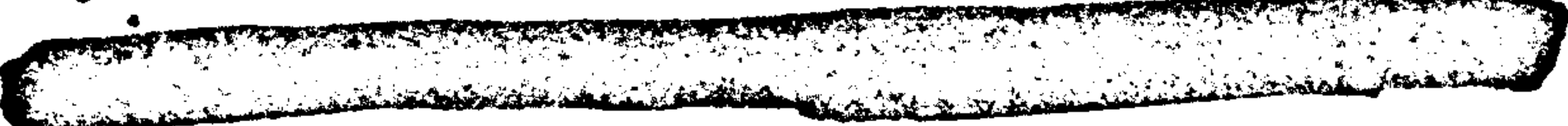



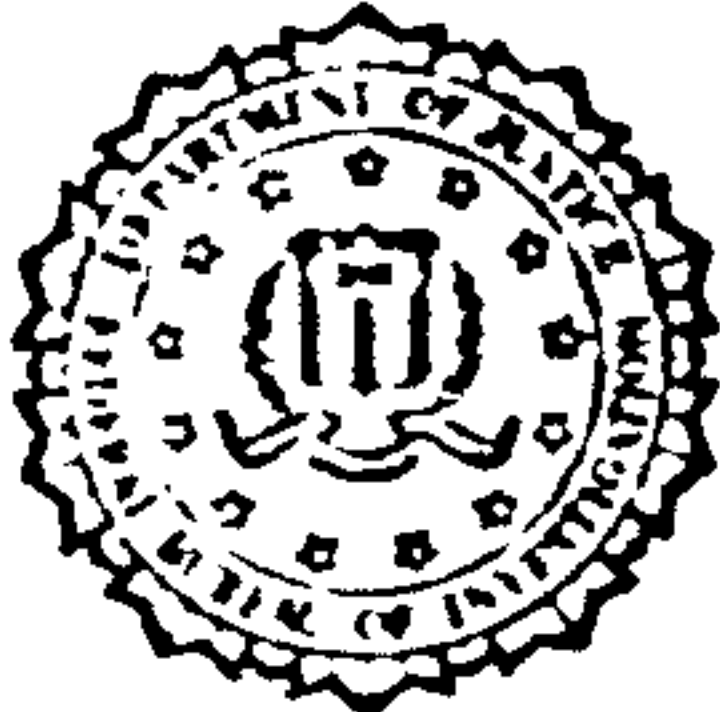

On July 27, 1967, Carlos Quiroga, self-described anti-Castro Cuban exile, voluntarily appeared at the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). LA

Quiroga made reference to the transcript of an interview of Quiroga by Orleans Parish District Attorney James Garrison [redacted] a copy of which had been furnished to the FBI by Carlos Bringuier on July 18, 1967. Quiroga stated he did not tell Garrison that he had ever worked for the FBI. Quiroga stated he has never worked for the FBI, has never been paid by the FBI, and has never told anyone that he worked for the FBI. He said that all of his conversation with Garrison was not included in the transcript and that some of the things he said have been changed or things added in order to give a bad impression of himself.

Quiroga advised that he learned on July 27, 1967, from [redacted] that while Quiroga was in a room before going to Garrison's office for the interview on [redacted] photographers from "Life" magazine took pictures of Quiroga. He stated that while he was sitting in the room, Louis Ivon, investigator for Garrison, put a rifle, on which was attached a telescopic sight, on a table behind where he was sitting. He said that when he looked to his left to look at a map hanging on the wall, Ivon placed the rifle under the map at which he was looking. He stated that, according to [redacted] he was being photographed all that time.

Quiroga advised that sometime in January, 1967, David W. Lewis told Garrison that someone had shot at him. He stated that [redacted] told him that Garrison had ordered Gurvich to arrest Quiroga on a charge of shooting at Lewis and that Gurvich had gone to Quiroga's residence on approximately January 20, 1967, to arrest Quiroga, but Quiroga was not at home. Quiroga said that Lewis later admitted that no one had shot at him and, therefore, he was not arrested on that charge.

Quiroga stated that he also learned from [redacted] that Mr. (first name unknown) Jacobs, who gave him the lie detector test, has not said that Quiroga lied in the test. Quiroga stated that [redacted] had told him the test was not given properly and that Jacobs is willing to testify to that fact. Quiroga said that Garrison had stated Quiroga would be arrested if Quiroga did not take the lie detector test.

Quiroga stated that he has learned through his own investigation that Garrison has lied to the Orleans Parish Grand Jury in that Garrison told the Grand Jury certain things that people had said about Quiroga's associations with other people. He commented that Garrison had "purposely lied" in that regard.

Quiroga advised that he knows the FBI had talked with Richard Davis in Houston, Texas. He stated that he recently talked to Davis via telephone about the camp that was set up across Lake Pontchartrain from New Orleans, and that he made a tape of his conversation with Davis, which Davis did not know was being recorded. He stated that he had recorded the conversation for his own protection because Davis has lied in the past. He said he would be glad to let the FBI listen to the tape if the FBI so desires.

Quiroga stated that Assistant District Attorney James L. Alcock "outright lied" at the hearing of newsman Walter Sheridan on July 27, 1967, in the respect that he stated "everyone was being treated right by the Grand Jury". Quiroga stated that he "was not treated right" and that he had been "thrown out of the Grand Jury" by Garrison. He stated that Garrison told him to "get out".

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# Move to Get Warren Lawyer In N.O. for Andrews Trial

The District Attorney's office took steps today to have a Warren Commission attorney brought to New Orleans to testify next week at the perjury trial of attorney Dean A. Andrews Jr.

Andrews told commission attorney Wesley J. Liebler when questioned under oath in 1964 that a man named Clay Bertrand had called him after the assassination of President Kennedy and asked him to defend accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

District Attorney Jim Garrison, in his probe of the assassination, has charged retired New Orleans businessman Clay L. Shaw with using

the alias Clay Bertrand and participating in a conspiracy to murder the President.

ANDREWS, WHO WAS indicted for perjury by the Orleans Parish Grand Jury, claims that Shaw and Bertrand are not the same man.

Liebeler was asked to come to New Orleans voluntarily and testify Aug. 9 and Aug. 10, and he refused.

Today, assistant DA James L. Alcock filed a request for attendance by Liebler with Criminal District Judge Frank J. Shea, who will preside at the trial of Andrews. Judge Shea signed an order for Liebler's return and an order for funds to cover Liebler's travel expenses.

The order is being forwarded to the courts in Wyndham County, Va. Liebler is now living in Newfane, Va., which is in Wyndham County.

IN REQUESTING Liebler's return to New Orleans, Alcock said that he is necessary as a material witness in the state's case against Andrews.

He said that testimony here by Liebler was necessary to show the materiality and relevance of the grand jury's questioning of Andrews and to show prior inconsistent statements.

ANDREWS WAS questioned here by Liebler July 21, 1964, while the Warren Commission was conducting its investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

Andrews gave commission investigators conflicting descriptions of the man he said he knew as Clay Bertrand.

He first told the local grand jury when asked if Clay Shaw were Clay Bertrand, "I can't say he is and I can't say he ain't." Later, Andrews said that the man he knew as Clay Bertrand was French Quarter bar-owner Eugene Davis. Davis ~~has~~ denied using the name.

# Garrison Tactics Rapped

By HARRY MOSKOS

HONOLULU (AP) — Three prominent lawyers say the law profession should put its own house in order to preserve its prestige.

W. O. Shafer of Odessa, Tex., immediate past president of the Texas State Bar, mentioned tactics used by New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

"Garrison has flooded the news media with a number of accusations but has produced a rather limited quantum of proof, and much of it of a doubtful nature," Shafer said yesterday during a panel discussion on criminal trial publicity and public relations during an American Bar Assn. session.

"HE (GARRISON) had managed to provoke a national television show to question his motives and the veracity of his case.

"I do not make a judgment of whether he is right or wrong. I do make a comment that he has not done a great deal for public relations in the legal profession up to this time."

Another speaker, John J. Stamos, states attorney for Cook County, Ill., said, "We have an obligation to put our own house in order—prosecution, defense and court."

THE THIRD member of the panel, attorney Morris A. Shenker of St. Louis, Mo., said, "We cannot breed contempt for our orderly system by resorting to tactics unworthy of the standards set by the bar and expect public respect."

Shenker said "capable, intelligent lawyers shy away from handling the unpopular cases for fear that their names will be linked through guilt by association in the mirror of public opinion."

"It is indeed ironical," Shenker added, "that part of the fault rests with attorneys themselves."

IN THE TRIAL of a sensational case, Shenker said, almost inevitably either the

do whatever else is necessary to have his case viewed favorably by the community.

"When this occurs, the other side, of necessity, goes to the press in order to prevent the barrage of unfavorable comment induced," he said. "The end result can only mean that our orderly courtroom procedure will be reduced to a shamble."

"The case ceases to be tried by a jury of 12, but rather is tried by an arena of gaping, gaffawing and unsavory spectators."

SHENKER ADDED that he

believes "until prosecutors and defense attorneys learn to say only two words—no comment—the plight in which we find ourselves will continue."

Stamos said his office has had its differences with the news media and noted "this is proper."

"If both our office and the news media existed without occasional collision it would mean neither our office nor the representatives of the news media were performing their duties."

He said a "cozy relationship" between news media and a public officer or office "breeds an evil and dangerous climate."

# Governor, Probe Jury Subpenaed

Thirty-nine defense witnesses have been subpenaed for Dean A. Andrews Jr., scheduled to go on trial Wednesday on a perjury charge. The list includes Gov. John J. McKeithen.

Andrews also subpenaed the 12-man Orleans Parish Grand Jury, District Attorney Jim Garrison, and six of his aides. Andrews' charges grew out of Alberto Fowler, city director of international relations, who said he had become an investigator shortly after Garrison's investigation became public.

# WARREN REPORT LAWYER SOUGHT

## Testimony of Andrews Interviewer, DA's Aim

The district attorney's office began an attempt Thursday to have a Warren Commission attorney who took testimony from Dean A. Andrews Jr. brought to New Orleans for Andrews' perjury trial next week.

Assistant Dist. Atty. James L. Alcock filed a request for attendance at the trial by Wesley J. Liebeler with Criminal District Court Judge Frank J. Shea, who will preside at Andrews' trial.

Andrews testified before Liebeler in New Orleans in 1964 that a man named Clay Bertrand had called him after the assassination of President John F. Kennedy and asked him to defend accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

Andrews testified this year before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury that he could not say whether or not Bertrand and conspiracy defendant Clay L. Shaw are the same person. Andrews was indicted for perjury on that session of testimony, and will be tried on that indictment next week.

Andrews later claimed that the man he knew as Bertrand was French Quarter bar owner Eugene C. Davis, and testified again before the grand jury. The district attorney's office sued a direct bill of information charging him with perjury in the subsequent testimony. Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison has claimed that "Clay Bertrand" was an alias used by Shaw.

Judge Shea signed an order for Liebeler's return to New Orleans and an order for funds to cover Liebeler's travel expenses.

The order is being forwarded to courts in Wyndham County, Va., where Liebeler resides.

Alcock, in requesting Liebeler's return, said his testimony is necessary to show the materiality and relevance of the grand jury's questioning of Andrews and to show prior inconsistent statements.

## ACLU Wants Investigation

The American Civil Liberties Union announced Thursday that it called upon U.S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark to order an immediate investigation to determine whether New Orleans District Attorney Jim Garrison is misusing powers of his office in an attempt to intimidate those who disagree with his theory that President John F. Kennedy's death was brought about by a conspiracy planned in New Orleans.

In a letter sent to the attorney general, Lawrence Speiser, director of the ACLU Washington Office, charged that "actions by Garrison indicate a gross misuse of his public office in infringing on constitutional rights. District attorneys must, of necessity, have wide discretion in utilizing their offices for law enforcement and prosecution purposes." Speiser continued: "Nevertheless, it seems apparent that Mr. Garrison is indiscriminately using his power to bring criminal charges in order to intimidate those who disagree with him. Such activities do not appear to be an effort to arrive at the truth, but, instead, to silence critics."

Speiser urged that if an investigation of Garrison and his associates indicates that there have been violations of the United States Code the matter

be presented to a grand jury for indictments.

## Know 2 Gunmen in Case—Russo

BATON ROUGE, La.—Perry Russo, star witness in New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's Kennedy assassination probe, said Thursday he knows and has seen two gunmen in the case.

But Russo told the East Baton Rouge Lion's Club here that the district attorney could not touch the gunmen because the assassination did not take place in Orleans Parish.

Russo, a local insurance salesman, answered questions from the audience about the case.

There were certain elements of the case that he could not discuss, he said, but he had been briefed on guidelines a judge issued concerning the case and knew what to talk about.

He called a National Broadcasting Co. broadcast critical of the Garrison probe the most sensational, and most funny thing that had happened to him.

NBC and Saturday Evening Post have been working with the defense for Clay Shaw, New Orleans businessman accused of conspiracy in the murder of the late President Kennedy, Russo charged.

Russo has pointed out Shaw as a conspirator.

He said he thought Shaw would go on trial in September or October, and he believed 90 per cent of New Orleans people already had made up their minds one way or another on Garrison's case.

## Jury, Six Garrison Aides Also Subpenaed

Dean A. Andrews Jr., scheduled to be tried for perjury in Criminal District Court, subpenaed 39 defense witnesses Friday, including Gov. John J. McKeithen.

Andrews, who will be tried on a charge of perjury before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury in testimony concerning District Attorney Jim Garrison's presidential assassination probe, also subpenaed the 12-man jury, Garrison, and six of his assistants.

The trial is scheduled for Wednesday in the court of Judge J. Shea. A list of defense witnesses follows:

Now that your requested bonds of \$80,000 have been reduced by law to recognizance and in the sincere interest of justice, I hereby make you my final offer to testify before your New Orleans grand jury on all matters pertinent or impertinent to your office and your current investigation into your alleged John F. As indicated in the Bureau's two memoranda of August 2, 1967, Special Agents Regis L. Kennedy and Reed W. Jensen have been subpoenaed to testify in the trial of Dean A. Andrews for perjury in the Parish of Orleans, New Orleans, Louisiana, which is scheduled to begin August 9, 1967. Attached is a copy of a letter dated July 31, 1967, to the U.S. Attorney from Richard V. Burnes, Executive Assistant to District Attorney Garrison, which relates to this matter. It is indicated in this letter that the prosecution is concerned with Dean A. Andrews' statements to these agents relative to his having received a telephone call from a person identified as Clay Bertrand regarding Andrews' representation of Lee Harvey Oswald and the surrounding facts of Andrews' association with Clay Bertrand as revealed by Dean Andrews to these two Special Agents. As to those matters, the Department has no objection to the agent testifying since the reports of interview are now public record. Attached is a copy of a telegram which we propose to send to Special Agent Kennedy.

It is not deemed necessary that Special Agent Jensen appear as a witness and the U.S. Attorney will be instructed to move to quash the subpoena served on Agent Jensen on the basis that Agent Jensen's testimony would be cumulative of the testimony given by Agent Kennedy.
