

I did not when I left New York to return home realize that he was responsible for the President's death. These suspicions were only realized later on when I again returned to New York. I left because attempts had been made upon my life, and I feared for that of Albert Finney, as I think we became interested in one another when he was on the stage playing in Luther. I came to England to see him, as I wanted this man dealt with. Unfortunately, the whole story has become a drama which is not easy to unravel in a letter. I asked Mrs. Kennedy to have Albert Finney questioned on the matter, as I felt that before this man was dealt with there were many people not safe. Robert Stack is a murderer, and I am unable to prove this on my own. His power and influence over people in the past has proven to work against me before. A former employer of mine, a Mr. Donald June of 360 N. Michigan Avenue, Chicago, did admit to me that Robert Stack had met him and slandered me to him. Another actor, Richard Chamberlain, whom I met in New York tried to help me when I went to California to seek help, but I didn't receive his letters. Albert Finney followed me to California after a short trip to Puerto Rico, before he went on his world tour, meeting my family. My mother was called for, and since I (at the time I only suspected him of trying to harm me and I knew I could not prove this) wanted to sue him and was under much distress advised me to go to a hospital, where I spent three months. Richard Chamberlain upon my request sent a letter to my doctor to verify my story, but again I could not deal with the matter alone.

A matter such as the murder of the President, when his assassins are supposed to be known already, is a big matter for a simple citizen to deal with. The man is homicidal. There have been two deaths in my family since I have been home two years ago, which I hold in high suspect, since they happened to very healthy people. I fear for my family more than I do myself. I beg of you to track this man's path and help me in dealing with him, as anyone who might give suspicion of helping me is unsafe. Without their help I put myself up for suspect of being unwell, but I know of nothing else to do but try to get help for left free, he is a danger to society. I am sure my family and friends will co-operate with someone of high authority now. And if you will please give me a response I will do everything I can to help you.

If you could call me, I shall be in London for the rest of the month. Otherwise I shall try to call you, and if need be I'd be glad to come to New York. Otherwise I shall leave Loddon.

On 10/5/67, victim, attorney for First National Bank, Chicago, appeared Chicago office and advised as follows:

He resides at [REDACTED] Lake Bluff, Illinois. On 10/4/67, at his employment, he received two collect calls from a [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] from St. Louis, Missouri. Inasmuch as he did not recognize these names, he told his secretary he would not accept the calls.

On 10/5/67, at his office, he received the following described postcard:

Postmarked "SAINT LOUIS, MO, 1A 4 OCT 1967" with hand printed address "First National Bank Monroe & Clark Chicago Ill". The reverse of the card had the following hand printed message: [REDACTED], You know you were behind the Spocksman that gave the order to kill President Kenedy in 63 Send 6½ to Southwest Bank as it was understood [REDACTED].

He believed the word "Spocksman" was meant to be "spokesman". He had no knowledge of a [REDACTED] or what the message on the card meant. He noted he was instructed to "send 6½ to Southwest Bank as it was understood" and said this sentence had absolutely no meaning to him. He has never received similar cards. He was

advised that if he desired protection, he should notify the Chicago and Lake Bluff Police Departments of the card and said he would do so. He made the card available to the FBI. He said if he received any other communications from [REDACTED] he would immediately advised the FBI.

On 10/5/67, the above facts were presented to Assistant United States Attorney THOMAS N. TODD by SA JAMES A. POND and Mr. TODD stated the card did not contain a threat within the purview of the Extortion Statute and declined prosecution. He requested he be immediately informed if victim receives similar communications.

In view of AUSA's opinion, no further investigation contemplated. AUSA opinion confirmed separately.

Victim was advised of AUSA opinion 10/5/67. Victim's description maintained in Chicago file.

Hearing on Bid To Delay Shaw Trial Monday

A hearing on a motion to delay the trial of Clay L. Shaw, accused by District Attorney Jim Garrison of participating in a conspiracy to murder the late President Kennedy, was set today for next Monday at 10 a.m.

The hearing was scheduled by Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. following a conference between defense and state attorneys.

JUDGE Haggerty said that both sides agreed to the hearing.

Also to be heard are an alternative motion for a change of venue if the delay is not granted and a supplemental application for a bill of particulars.

The judge Monday will

hear oral arguments only. Shaw's attorneys have asked the court for a six-month delay of the trial, charging that publicity and actions by Garrison and his staff made a fair trial for Shaw impossible here now or in the near future.

If the court denies the delay, the defense asks that the trial be moved to another jurisdiction.

The DA's office has partially acquiesced in the request for a delay, indicating it would go along with a "reasonable delay" but not a six-month delay.

ASSISTANT DA James L. Alcock has said he does not believe the trial can begin until after the Christmas season. The DA's office has not otherwise specified what it means "reasonable delay."

The state is opposing both the change of venue and the request for a supplemental bill of particulars.

Alcock has said that if a fair trial is impossible it is because of actions by Shaw and his attorneys and not because of actions by the state.

SHAW FRIEND'S TRIAL STARTED

Charged with Striking TV News Cameraman

A friend of the man indicted on a charge of criminal conspiracy in the death of President John F. Kennedy, went on trial Wednesday on a charge of assaulting a television cameraman on the night of Clay L. Shaw's March 1 arrest.

Owen Wright, 45, 4919 Canal, Apt. 10, a friend of Shaw, the man awaiting trial on the conspiracy count, was charged with simple battery on the complaint of WVUE-TV newsman Erby Aucoin.

Criminal District Court Judge Bernard J. Bagert took a defense motion for a directed verdict under advisement after testimony by Aucoin and another newsman.

Phil Johnson, of WWL-TV, testified that Wright struck Aucoin after he told Aucoin not to take any pictures of him.

Aucoin said he was sent to Shaw's residence, 1313 Dauphine, because it was expected that investigators from the district attorney's office were going to seize evidence under warrant.

Aucoin said Wright approached a group of newsmen and asked where Shaw was. He said that when the man faced him he began shooting pictures of him.

"He asked me if I was taking his picture. And then he struck me on my shoulder. I tore my shirt," Aucoin said.

The photographer said Wright neither gave him permission for the pictures nor told him not to take them.

However, Wright testified that he told Aucoin not to take his photograph.

Defense attorney Walter Kelly argued that the defendant had a right to protect himself from a forcible invasion of his privacy.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, and who specifically requested that his identity be protected, volunteered the following information to a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on October 10, 1967, while being contacted in connection with another matter.

Source advised that a New Orleans businessman had informed that [redacted] purchased a \$2700 diamond ring from this businessman prior to leaving the New Orleans area. Since [redacted] departure from New Orleans, this businessman has been in contact with [redacted] on a weekly or biweekly basis in an effort to obtain payment for the diamond ring. The source advised that according to this businessman, several weeks ago [redacted] informed that he would not return to the State of Louisiana under any circumstances regardless of what assurance of immunity he received from Louisiana State authorities. [redacted] also said he had received information that he, [redacted] would not live to reach Louisiana.

The source advised that according to this businessman, during recent contact [redacted] advised that he had traveled to Washington and that the people in Washington, not further identified, wanted [redacted] to discredit District Attorney James Garrison and Garrison's assassination probe. [redacted] requested the assistance of this businessman in obtaining information either through official channels or by anonymous means which could be used to discredit Garrison and Garrison's assassination probe.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

The confidential source also informed that this businessman had been contacted by [REDACTED] Volkswagen distributor in the New Orleans area and financial backer of District Attorney Garrison, sometime in the past, exact period not indicated, and that [REDACTED] requested this businessman to file theft charges or fraud charges against [REDACTED] in connection with the \$2700 owed on the purchase of the diamond ring in the event [REDACTED] returned to the State of Louisiana. [REDACTED] reportedly said the purpose was to get [REDACTED] in jail and "under the floor." According to the information available to this source, this businessman did not desire to file charges against [REDACTED] and subsequently informed [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] had paid off the \$2700 owed on the ring to get [REDACTED] off of his back. Hearing on Bid To Delay Shaw Trial Monday

A hearing on a motion to delay the trial of Clay L. Shaw, accused by District Attorney Jim Garrison of participating in a conspiracy to murder the late President Kennedy, was set today for next Monday at 10 a.m.

The hearing was scheduled by Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. following a conference between defense and state attorneys.

JUDGE Haggerty said that both sides agreed to the hearing.

Also to be heard are an alternative motion for a change of venue if the delay is not granted and a supplemental application for a bill of particulars.

The judge Monday will hear oral arguments only.

Shaw's attorneys have asked the court for a six-month delay of the trial

charging that publicity and actions by Garrison and his staff made a fair trial for Shaw impossible here now or in the near future.

If the court denies the delay, the defense asks that the trial be moved to another jurisdiction.

The DA's office has partially acquiesced in the request for a delay, indicating it would go along with a "reasonable delay" but not a six-month delay.

ASSISTANT DA James L. Alcock has said he does not believe the trial can begin until after the Christmas season. The DA's office has not otherwise specified what it means "reasonable delay."

The state is opposing both the change of venue and the request for a supplemental bill of particulars.

Alcock has said that if a fair trial is impossible it is because of actions by Shaw and his attorneys and not because of actions by the state

SHAW HEARING TO BE MONDAY

Motion for Continuance Will Be Argued

Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. has set a hearing on a continuance motion in the conspiracy case of Clay L. Shaw for Monday at 10 a.m.

The date resulted from a conference between attorneys for Shaw, members of the district attorney's office and the judge on a defense motion which requests a six-month delay or a change of venue.

Oral arguments only will be presented on this motion and a supplemental application for a bill of particulars.

Defense attorneys claimed that actions by Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison, who has accused Shaw of conspiring to murder President Kennedy, have made a fair trial impossible.

If a continuance is not granted, then a change of venue should be, they have argued.

The state countered that Shaw himself is responsible if there is any prejudicial atmosphere in New Orleans.

In answers to defense motions Asst. Dist. Atty. James L. Alcock and Richard V. Burnes said they would be agreeable to a "reasonable" delay of less than six months. However, they argued that if this is granted, it precludes the possibility of a change of venue, which would move the trial to another jurisdiction.

Alcock, one of the participants of the conference, which took place Monday, said later he does not believe a trial can begin until after the Christmas season.

THE BILDERBERG MEETINGS

Mr. JAVITS. Mr. President, the 13th in a series of Bilderberg meetings on international affairs, in which I participated, was held in Williamsburg, Va., on March 20, 21, and 22. These meetings are designed to bring together leading figures in the United States, Canada, and Western Europe for informal round-table discussions of international problems, particularly those affecting the Atlantic community. In keeping with the basic objectives of increasing mutual understanding on both sides of the Atlantic through a free and relaxed exchange of ideas, the meetings do not attempt to reach formal conclusions or adopt resolutions. Representatives of governments as well as authorities in the fields under discussion attend in a personal capacity, not official. The meetings are private and off the record, and attendance is confined to those who are actually participating.

I ask unanimous consent to have printed in the RECORD a background paper entitled "The Bilderberg Meetings," explaining the origin and purpose of the Bilderberg meetings, a list of the persons who attended the Williamsburg series, and a list of the 12 meetings which had preceded this one.

There being no objection, the material was ordered to be printed in the RECORD, as follows:

THE BILDERBERG MEETINGS

The idea of the Bilderberg meetings originated in the early fifties. Changes had taken place on the international political and economic scene after World War II. The countries of the Western World felt the need for closer collaboration to protect their moral and ethical values, their democratic institutions, and their independence against the growing Communist threat. The Marshall plan and NATO were examples of collective efforts of Western countries to join hands in economic and military matters after World War II.

In the early 1950's a number of people on both sides of the Atlantic sought a means of bringing together leading citizens, not necessarily connected with government, for informal discussions of problems facing the Atlantic community. Such meetings, they felt, would create a better understanding of the forces and trends affecting Western nations; in particular, they believed that direct exchanges could help to clear up differences and misunderstandings that might weaken the West.

One of the men who saw the need for such discussions was the late Joseph Retinger. In 1952 he approached H.R.H. Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands with the suggestion of informal and unofficial meetings to discuss the problems facing the Atlantic community. Others in Europe wholeheartedly supported the idea, and proposals were submitted to American friends to join in the undertaking. A number of Americans, including C. D. Jackson, the late General Walter Bedell Smith, and the late John Coleman, agreed to cooperate.

The first meeting that brought Americans and Europeans together took place under the chairmanship of Prince Bernhard at the Bilderberg Hotel in Oosterbeek, Holland, from May 29 to May 31, 1954. Ever since, the

meetings have been called Bilderberg meet-

NO STRICT RULES OF PROCEDURE

From the outset it was the intention of the Bilderberg founders and participants that no strict rules of procedure govern the meetings. Every effort was made to create a relaxed, informal atmosphere conducive to free and frank discussions.

Bilderberg is in no sense a policymaking body. No conclusions are reached. There is no voting and no resolutions are passed.

The meetings are off the record. Only the participants themselves may attend the meetings.

PARTICIPANTS

It was obvious from the first that the success of the meetings would depend primarily on the level of the participants. Leading figures from many fields—industry, labor, education, government, etc.—are invited, who, through their special knowledge or experience, can help to further Bilderberg objectives. Representatives of government attend in a personal and not an official capacity. An attempt is made to include participants representing many political parties and points of view. American participation has included Members of Congress of both parties.

Over the years, Bilderberg participants have come from the NATO countries, Switzerland, Sweden, Austria, and Finland, and have included prominent individuals such as Dean Rusk, Christian A. Herter, Maurice Faure, Franz-Josef Strauss, Amintore Fanfani, Panayotis Pipinellis, Reginald Maudling, the late Hugh Gaitskell, Omer Becu, Guy Mollet, the late Michael Ross, Herman Abs, C. L. Sulzberger, Joseph Harsch, and T. M. Terkelsen. Individuals with international responsibilities have also participated, among them being Gen. Alfred Gruenther, Lord Ismay, Eugene Black, Gen. Lyman Lemnitzer, Paul-Henri Spaak, and the late Per Jacobsson.

THE MEETINGS

Bilderberg meetings are held at irregular intervals but have taken place once or twice a year since 1954. All the early conferences were held in Europe, but a meeting is now held on this side of the Atlantic every few years to provide a convenient opportunity for American and Canadian participants to attend.

The Bilderberg meeting at Williamsburg, Va., on March 20, 21, and 22, is the 13th to take place since 1954. The 12 preceding meetings were held at:

Dear Sir:

It has come to my attention that while you investigated the assassination of President Kennedy for the Warren Commission, you failed to perform a series of echo experiments in the Dealey Plaza where the assassination took place.

It is a well known fact that two-thirds of the witnesses present at the assassination said that the shots were thought to have come from a grassy knoll located to the right and front of the motocade, while only one-third of those present stated that the shots came from the area near the Book Depository or the Dal-Tex Building. Thus, neglecting the majority of the people, you and the Warren Commission, for whom you were working, reported that all the shots fired came from the Texas School Book Depository. It strikes me very hard that an organization as complex as yours could over-look what effect a reverberating echo of the gunshots could have had on the witnesses ability to judge where the shots came from.

My question is: Why did you fail to perform the tests necessary to clear up the matter of where the gunshots originated from, and thus silence many of the critics of the Warren report.

Your letters of October 9th have been received.

With respect to your inquiry concerning the date when plans were made for President Kennedy's trip to Dallas, you may desire to contact the Director of the United States Secret Service, Washington, D. C. 20220, for any assistance he may be able to render regarding this question.

Insofar as this Bureau's investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy is concerned, the FBI conducted a prompt, intensive, objective and thorough investigation of this matter. As you have been advised previously, the results of our investigation were turned over to the Warren Commission for its consideration, and this Bureau has no authority to independently release any information in these reports. However, the Warren Commission concluded that the shots which killed President Kennedy and wounded Governor Connally were fired from the Texas School Book Depository Building.

Herewith are the particulars of the assault to Lou Reisig, presently resident at the Mayo Hotel, Room 27.

Mr. Reisig as you may recall from the Vancouver Sun story Aug. 5 accompanied a Donald P. Horton to New Orleans in mid July where Horton was questioned by officers of Attorney Jim Garrison regarding links between Clay Shaw, Lee Harvey Oswald and David Ferrie. Reisig acted as Horton's bodyguard on this trip. On Sept. 20, 1967, Mr. Reisig related to me the following story regarding an assault.

"I was returning from the city police taxi detail, where I was exchanging my chauffer's class B licence, ~~of the B.C. Police Department~~ and where I went to the B.C. Royal Cafe on Pender to have coffee. I returned coming back up Pender on the south side and went through the parking lot--the Allright Parking Lot on Pender just down from Main behind the banks of commerce--heading toward Keefer,

"As I was walking through the parking lot, three men stepped out of a car on the right-hand side of the parking lot, and one of them grabbed me and hit me in the stomach threw me up against the wall and all three began beating me, striking blows to the abdomen. During the beating, one of the men--the tallest of the three--said keep your nose out of anything that concerns the United States. Continued for about three or four minutes beating me and I almost passed out. I left the cafe about 2:45 and went through the parking lot only one or two minutes later. The beating occurred in broad daylight and there were three or four Chinese men standing and watching it. I fell to the ground and the three men got in the car and took off. As they left I heard them say the name Horton. I could identify the men if I saw them. One was wearing a dark maroon suit of a shiny material, the other two were wearing tweedy sports jackets, one brownish and one grayish. All had white shirts and ties. The big one was about 32, and the other two of average height, but husky, and one was about 38 and the other about 30.



I believe, deputy Fisk, that Reising's story has substance. If what he says is founded, then it is a case of a Canadian citizen being assaulted either by Americans or by others on the pay of the American government.

I trust you will use discretion in handling this information. As I mentioned in our conversation, the provincial attorney-general's department knows of this incident and suggested to me that I report it to the local authorities.

Re: Kennedy assassination

This may be a good time to reenact the murder of the previous President to see if anything can be learned that will explain more about it.

There is a Catholic assembly meeting in Rome; there is considerable public tension about the Vietnam war; pickets at hotels and auditoriums when VIPs speak; dissension in Vietnam over the government officials. The San Francisco lawyer, Mr. Belli, who represented Ruby may be a lead to that killer's attitude; and hipsters here include dope addicts and psycho tendencies, with police attempting to control them. Politicians are anxious for power; with Birchers determined to save the country, I suspect, by getting a man of their choice for 1968 election. The attack upon the brother of a Philippine official Monday could represent the murder of the two S. Vietnam officials that preceded Pres. Kennedy's death. This city is about the size of Dallas, and seems rather tense at this time of unrest and hate: perhaps this is a good setting for the reenactment, and that you will recall is the time of year.

This office is in receipt of a name check request on captioned individual from the 112th MI Group (MIG), New Orleans, La.

The 112th MI Group has advised that LEWALLEN now has a confidential clearance in connection with his employment at the Michoud Plant, NASA, and a secret clearance has been requested on him which is the reason for the name check request by MIG. MIG also advised that an allegation has been made that LEWALLEN is now or was a roommate of a homosexual.

The files of this office reveal that LEWALLEN is a former roommate of DAVID FERRIE, a central figure in District Attorney JIM GARRISON's probe into the assassination of Pres. JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, Dallas, Texas, 11/22/63. In addition, LEWALLEN has been involved in the District Attorney's assassination probe. In view of this, the name check request has not been answered by this office and the Bureau is requested to instruct New Orleans as to whether the information concerning LEWALLEN appearing in the files of this office should be disseminated to MIG in response to this name check request.

For the information of the Bureau, JAMES LEWALLEN was the complainant in two instances in which he reported picking up individuals as a cab driver whom he suspected of possible law violations. Both of these complaints were vague and non-specific and no investigation resulted from the information he furnished.

The files further show that on page 14 in the report of SA WARREN C. DE BRUEYS, dated 12/2/63, in the case entitled, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka.; IS-R-CUBA," JAMES R. LEWALLEN, Apt. 9, 1309 Dauphine St., New Orleans, La., was interviewed. LEWALLEN informed that he had known DAVID FERRIE since the end of 1947, having met FERRIE in Cleveland, Ohio, when he was a member of the Civil Air Patrol where FERRIE served as an instructor. LEWALLEN advised that he served on active duty during the Korean War from 1950 until his discharge from service on 5/28/52; and during this period he did not see FERRIE, however, he again saw DAVID FERRIE during the Christmas Holidays in 1952 when FERRIE visited his mother in Cleveland, Ohio.

LEWALLEN said that in May, 1953, he telephonically contacted FERRIE inquiring about the possibilities of getting a job in New Orleans and thereafter he moved to Kenner, La., where he roomed with DAVID FERRIE from May, 1953, to May, 1955. LEWALLEN said he re-entered the Air Corps in May, 1955, and did not see FERRIE until he returned to New Orleans to live about the end of August, 1955. LEWALLEN said that he had seen DAVID FERRIE from time to time and on occasions had visited in FERRIE's home. He stated that he saw DAVID FERRIE at his residence, 3330 Louisiana Avenue Parkway on 11/20/63, but did not see him or have any contact with him on 11/21 & 22/63, and did not see him again until the evening of 11/26/63.

LEWALLEN further advised that he had never seen anyone by the name of LEE HARVEY OSWALD in FERRIE's company; had never been introduced to anyone by that name and had never heard FERRIE mention anyone by that name. LEWALLEN observed a photograph of OSWALD and advised that he does not know OSWALD.

The files further show that in New Orleans teletype to the Bureau, 3/1/67, in the case entitled, "ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS, 11/22/63; MISC - INFO CONCERNING," an Assistant District Attorney of GARRISON's office announced on 2/28/67, that a subpoena had been issued for JAMES LEWALLEN to appear in the District Attorney's Office at 11:00 AM, Wednesday, 3/1/67. No further information was given concerning LEWALLEN.

The New Orleans "Times Picayune," a daily New Orleans newspaper, of 3/1/67, reported that a subpoena had been filed by Criminal District Court Judge BERNARD J. BAGERT for JAMES LEWALLEN ordering him to appear in the District Attorney's Office at 11:00 AM on Wednesday.

The New Orleans "States-Item," New Orleans daily newspaper, in its issue of 3/1/67, reported that JAMES LEWALLEN was subpoenaed to appear on that date in connection with the preliminary hearing for CLAY L. SHAW on a conspiracy charge in connection with the assassination of Pres. JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY. This article reported LEWALLEN was 38 years of age and resided at 4106 Paris Avenue and had roomed with DAVID FERRIE in Kenner, La.

The files further reflect that in New Orleans teletype to the Bureau dated 3/16/67, in the case entitled "ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS, 11/22/63; MISC - INFO CONCERNING," a WDSU-TV report at 5:00 PM on that date reported that prior to the conclusion of the hearing for CLAY L. SHAW, attorneys for the prosecution identified a witness for the next day's hearing as JAMES R. LEWALLEN, an employee of the Michoud Plant and a former roommate of FERRIE.
