He wanted to have an appointment made for him with the Director or the President so he could furnish this information. Due to the possible mental condition of [redacted] this information should be incorporated into a LHM for dissemination to U.S. Secret Service and the Department.

THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT THE TIMES-PICAYUNE LEARNED THAT A MAN NAMED EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY WORKED AT THE NEW ORLEANS LAKEFRONT AIRPORT AS A PILOT IN NINETEEN SIXTYTHREE. ACCORDING TO THE ARTICLE, MICHAEL A. O'CONNER, SUPERVISOR AT THE AIRPORT, SAID THAT IN THE FALL OF SIXTYTHREE, HE FOUND A MAN SLEEPING IN THE AIRPORT LOBBY. THE MAN WAS IN NEED OF A SHAVE AND ACCORDING TO O'CONNER WAS "MUCH THINNER" IN APPEARANCE THAN THE PICTURE HE HAD SEEN OF BRADLEY. O'CONNER CLAIMED HE WOKE THE MAN UP AND THE MAN IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS "LES" OR "~~LESLIE~~ BRADLEY". O'CONNER CLAIMED HE TOLD THIS MAN HE DID NOT WANT TO SEE HIM SLEEPING IN THE LOBBY AND TOLD HIM TO GO HOME. THE MAN LEFT AND O'CONNER NEVER SAW HIM AGAIN. O'CONNER CLAIMED THAT OTHER AIRPORT EMPLOYEES WHO WITNESSED THE SCENE TOLD HIM THIS MAN'S NAME WAS EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY AND THAT HE HAD FLOWN FOR SCOTT FLYING SERVICE, A COMPANY NO LONGER IN EXISTENCE.

THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT ORLEANS PARISH CRIMINAL SHERIFF LOUIS HEYD, JR. STATED HE HAD CONTACTED SHERIFF P. J. PRITCHESS OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY AND ADVISED HIM THAT A COPY OF THE ARREST WARRANT FOR BRADLEY HAD BEEN SENT BY MAIL. THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT SHERIFF PRITCHESS STATED HIS OFFICE WOULD TAKE NO ACTION UNTIL THE ARREST WARRANT ARRIVES.

ACCORDING TO THE ARTICLE, BRADLEY IS A NATIVE OF ARKANSAS AND STATED THAT HE WENT TO LOS ANGELES IN NINETEEN THIRTYSIX AFTER SERVING WITH THE U. S. NAVY AND WORKED WITH A MOVING FIRM UNTIL SOME SIX YEARS AGO WHEN HE BEGAN WORK WITH HIS PRESENT EMPLOYER. THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT BRADLEY AND HIS WIFE, CONNIE, A RECEPTIONIST IN LOS ANGELES, HAVE TWO CHILDREN, A SON, NINETEEN, AND A DAUGHTER, TWENTYONE.

BRADLEY FACES CHARGE IN N.O. JFK PLOT CASE

Conspiracy to Murder Is Alleged in Bill

Nearly 10 months after the arrest of Clay L. Shaw on a charge of conspiring to murder President John F. Kennedy the district attorney's office charged a man identified only as "Edgar Eugene Bradley" with the same crime.

The charge, carrying a recommended bond of \$10,000, was filed shortly before 4 p. m. Wednesday in Criminal District Court by Assistant District Attorney James L. Alcock, who was accompanied by Assistant DA Richard V. Burnes.

Asked if he would say whether Bradley is in New Orleans, Alcock replied: "We know where he is. He is not in New Orleans and he is not from New Orleans." Alcock also refused to discuss Bradley's background or to give any further details on the suspect.

When asked if the DA's office expects to arrest Bradley in the near future, Alcock answered, "I guess you can say that."

The charge simply alleges that Bradley "did willfully and unlawfully conspire with others to murder John F. Kennedy" between Aug. 1 and Nov. 22, the day of the assassination.

The charging of Bradley differed from that of Shaw, who was charged by indictment of the Orleans Parish grand jury after he had already been ordered held over for trial by a three-judge panel.

Bradley was charged by a direct bill of information, and may not have been in the state at the time.

Bradley's charge does not name the persons with whom he is alleged to have conspired, merely stating "with others." Shaw's indictment accused him of conspiring with David W. Ferrie and Lee Harvey Oswald and others.

Presumably, Bradley is being charged in connection with the same conspiracy in which District Attorney Jim Garrison accuses Clay Shaw of having participated, but the district attorney's office would not confirm this.

Shaw's case has been continued until early 1968.

Garrison reportedly was out of town Wednesday.

The New York Times Wednesday night identified Bradley as living in North Hollywood, Calif., and as being the West Coast representative for a Dr. Carl McIntire, a right-wing evangelist who lives in New Jersey.

Bradley, reached by telephone at his home in North Hollywood, Calif., by The Associated Press, denied any knowledge of the assassination or of Garrison's investigation.

"This man is either being highly paid to do this or he's off his rocker," Bradley said of Garrison.

The 49-year-old Bradley said he has worked out of his home for five years as West Coast representative of Dr. Carl McIntire, a New Jersey radio broadcaster.

He acknowledged that McIntire "has been described as a right-wing broadcaster." Bradley

he said, "It seems ridiculous that any one person could do it," referring to the murder of Kennedy, adding: "I'm inclined to think others were involved."

But he said, "I'm neither a right-wing extremist or a left-wing extremist, I don't belong to a thing and I don't know anything about Garrison or the Kennedy affair."

"I have never been in New Orleans in my life except when my wife, daughter and I recently visited our son in school last March or April," Bradley said. "We just drove through."

Bradley said he moved to California in 1936 after getting out of the Navy and during World War II had "a special assignment" for the Navy. He declined to elaborate on the assignment.

In a written statement distributed to news media, Garrison said: "Like Clay Shaw, Bradley's name did not come up in the federal investigation of the assassination nor is his name mentioned anywhere in the 26 volumes of the Warren Report inquiry into the case."

William Gurvich, a private investigator who was formerly Garrison's chief aide in the Kennedy death probe, said Wednesday night that he did not remember ever hearing Bradley's name.

"The name doesn't mean a thing; no bells ring. And I made all the photos of everyone he (Garrison) was interested in. I never heard of the guy," said Gurvich.

Gurvich broke with Garrison several months ago, charging that he did so because the DA "has no case."

Garrison said in his written statement that no further information regarding the charge would be made public at this time.

Mark Lane Disputes Findings In Warren Group Report

If Lee Harvey Oswald was in the place the Warren Commission concluded he was at the time of the assassination of President Kennedy, he could not have fired the fatal shot, author Mark Lane told a packed audience at the LSU Union last night.

The author of "Rush to Judgment" opined the assassin's bullet which killed the president "had to come from the front." The Warren Commission's report located Oswald in the Texas Book Depository, and Lane picked out the grassy knoll, fence and clump of trees as the spots where five shots were fired at President Kennedy.

Lane quoted witnesses after witness to support this contention, and castigated with facts and figures the Warren Commission report.

The New York attorney said most of the witnesses available who were at the scene of the assassination in Dallas were never questioned by the Warren Commission. Most of those who were questioned testified the shots came from in front of the presidential motorcade, he said.

Lane did not deny that Oswald could have been a part of the assassination plot, but he maintained that Oswald could not possibly have been a lone assassin and that the fatal shot could not have been fired from high up in the book depository.

He castigated the news media — press, radio and television — for its handling of the Warren report. In effect, he said the entire media, both in its stories and editorials, accepted the commission's first summary and subsequent report as complete and adequate proof that Oswald was the assassin — the only assassin.

Cites Difficulties

Lane told about his troubles in getting his book published after he decided the only thing he could do to get the story told was to tell it himself. He cited extreme pressures which he said were exerted to prevent both his investigations of the as-

Commission report, and his publication of the book on its findings, and left little doubt that he felt it emanated from the White House.

Lane said the FBI and other federal agents put pressure on 15 American publishing firms, causing them to reject his book. He named other authors who faced similar obstacles.

He concluded, "The (Warren) commission had a pre-concept that one man shot the President. He is dead. So the case is closed. Let's forget about it and march ahead with Lyndon Baines Johnson into the Great Society."

Lane said he began his own

investigation even before the Warren Commission was chosen. At first he operated almost as a loner, he said, but he soon formed the Citizens Committee of Inquiry and began to get some support for the investigation.

The attorney said he had accumulated a monumental amount of interviews, pictures and statistics by the time the Warren Commission issued its report — and then he took aim at the report.

Lane now spends all his time working with New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison as an unpaid assistant, except when he lectures. **HENRIBERG** in New Orleans.

Attached teletype reports New Orleans District Attorney Garrison has issued an arrest warrant for Edgar Eugene Bradley in connection with the conspiracy to assassinate President Kennedy.

"Washington Post" for December 21, 1967, carries additional details regarding this matter. Post article identified Bradley as residing in North Hollywood, California and as working for Dr. Carl McIntire, a "right-wing broadcaster."

Bufiles reveal Bradley has corresponded with Bureau in the past. Bradley informed Bureau he was associated with a group who desired to draft J. Edgar Hoover as a presidential candidate. Bradley indicated he planned to have "giant mail" campaign and would hold a mass public rally. At Director's instructions, Los Angeles Office contacted Bradley and informed Bradley Director has absolutely no political aspirations and would appreciate Bradley's group discontinuing dissemination of their material and associating Director's name with political movement.

Our files are being thoroughly reviewed concerning Bradley and dissemination will be made to the White House and Attorney General by separate communication.

The attached contains information in the files of the Los Angeles Office relative to Edgar Eugene Bradley for whom an arrest warrant has been issued by the New Orleans District Attorney in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy.

Bradley was interviewed in early 1967 by the Los Angeles Office in connection with an extortion matter. On 12/21/67 Bradley called the Van Nuys Resident Agency of our Los Angeles Office. He volunteered he knows nothing whatsoever of the assassination and was at "absolute loss as to why he was selected as a target."

The pertinent parts of the information set forth in the attached regarding Bradley's background have been disseminated by memorandum to the White House and the Attorney General. This matter is being followed closely and significant data developed will be disseminated to the recipients mentioned above.

Dear Mr. Lane:

I was present when you spoke in the Union Building at LSU on December 14, 1967 at which time you left the audience with the question, "Who killed President Kennedy?". It seems to me that far more important is the question, "Who was behind the assassination of the President of the United States?" rather than who pulled the trigger.

Any thinking person knows that a group who can control the Warren Commission, the news media, the publishers, the Secret Service, CIA, FBI and eliminate many citizens who knew too much, must be an extraordinarily powerful organization. This is the only logical conclusion and therefore leads to the question, "Who has such power?"

To return to your speech mentioned above, the climax seemed to me to be a smear of J. Edgar Hoover. In my humble opinion he is one of the very few persons in the Federal Government whose integrity I would never question, who, if allowed, would expose many things detrimental to the above mentioned powerful force. Conclusion: Mr. Hoover must be discredited.

The next question is, "Who is Mr. Hoover's superior," the answer being the President of the United States, which leads onward to yet another query, this being, "Who controls the President?" Obvious answer: The Establishment headed by John J. McCloy and Robert Lovett.

I think Mr. Jim Garrison might be wise to keep all this in mind while pursuing his investigation rather than being very subtly side-tracked or re-routed so that at the finish he will not find himself at a "dead-end" street.

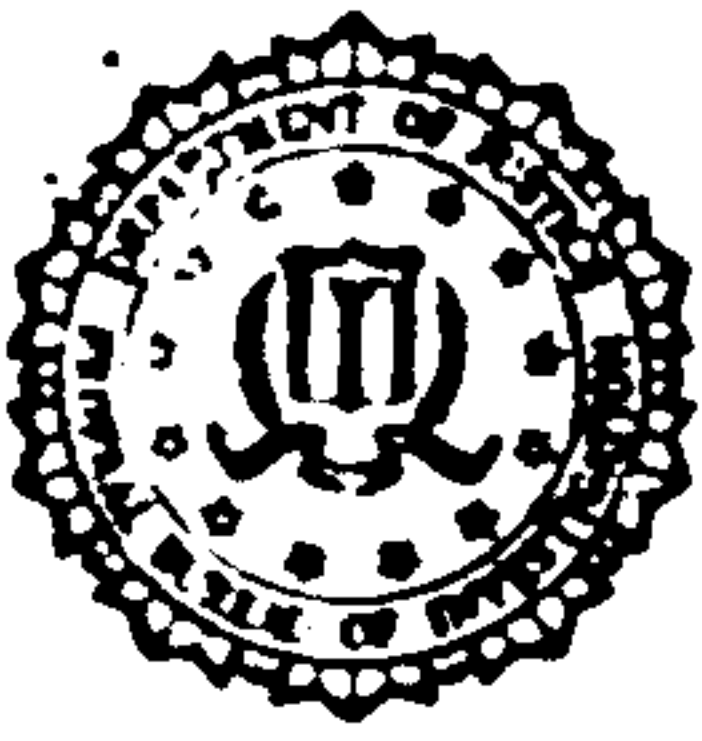

On the evening of December 21, 1967, an individual identifying himself as Mr. Rome Bisio, Salesman, Rice Furniture Company, Modesto, California, home address 8200 Jantzen Road, (trailer park), Space 8, Modesto, California, telephonically furnished information as follows:

Until about two months ago he was employed by Norris Industries, Inc., Riverbank Army Ammunitions Plant, Riverbank, California. While employed at the plant, he worked in an office where a girl named Nancy (Last Name Unknown) was secretary to a Mr. Van Hickman. At least two months ago, in conversation with another employee at the plant; possibly with James Howell or Paul Bowman, who are still employed there, the following statement was made:

This employee had been told by Nancy or had overheard Nancy telling yet another person that she formerly worked for the head of the California Institute of Technology Library Department. Nancy purportedly had overheard this employer in conversation on the telephone make statements to the effect that he was "sick of the situation: and that he was going to Dallas to "take care of it." This conversation purportedly took place two or three days before the assassination of the late President Kennedy. Thereafter, this individual purportedly did go to Dallas, returning sometime after the assassination.

Mr. Bisio stated that he has worried about the above matter for two months and finally called after publicity recently given to New Orleans Attorney James Garrison in recent news releases.

While employed with this firm, she allegedly overheard her employer in a telephone conversation, make statements to the effect that he was "Sick of the situation:" and that he was going to Dallas "to take care it it." Reference is made to my communication dated December 28, 1967, and to the memorandum also dated December 28, 1967, which was enclosed with that communication. The memorandum analyzed allegations made by New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison in a press conference held by him in New Orleans, on December 26, 1967.

Garrison, at the December 26, 1967, press conference, alleged that Loran Hall of California had inside knowledge of the assassination the day it happened. The analysis of this allegation is set forth on pages 3 and 4 of the above-mentioned memorandum. This analysis included pertinent information developed by this Bureau concerning Loran Eugene Hall and Lawrence Howard.

News media on December 29, 1967, reported that Garrison had subpoenaed three men as material witnesses in his investigation. They were reported as Loran A. Hall, of Kernville, California; Lawrence J. Howard, Jr., of Los Angeles; and Thomas Beckham, of Omaha, Nebraska. I thought that you would want to know the pertinent information from the files of this Bureau concerning Thomas Beckham, in addition to that already furnished concerning Hall and Howard.

The name of Thomas Beckham never appeared during our investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy. However, on January 13, 1967, we received information that Garrison had located a witness, Thomas Beckham, who was allegedly associated with Oswald and assisted him in passing out leaflets. Our files contain a reference to a Thomas Edward Beckham of New Orleans who in 1962 was seeking funds for a religious group aiding Cubans. This man allegedly had a record with the New Orleans Police Department for being involved in such activities.



A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on December 6, 1967, that the home owned by District Attorney Jim Garrison at 4600 Owens Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana, was built for Garrison by Frank Occhipinti. The confidential source advised that Frank Occhipinti resides next door to District Attorney Garrison. According to the confidential source, Garrison has some type of armed guard at his residence.

This same confidential source pointed out that Frank Occhipinti is a long time business partner of Carlos Marcello and that Marcello and Occhipinti were associated in numerous business ventures and are still in business in a company known as Southern Tours, Inc., 1125 Airline Highway, New Orleans, Louisiana.

This same confidential source also advised that District Attorney Garrison arranged for an apartment for one Mark Lane and that Lane currently resides in this apartment at 833 Dauphine Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

Current news media are featuring an account of a press conference conducted with New Orleans District Attorney James Garrison on December 26, 1967.

Garrison is reported to have stated that the Federal Bureau of Investigation put out a message on November 17, 1963, to several of its offices advising that on November 22, 1963, an attempt would be made to assassinate President Kennedy at Dallas, Texas. I thought that the President would want to know that this latest charge by District Attorney Garrison is a lie. The Federal Bureau of Investigation received no information from any source that an assassination attempt would be made in Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963.

Garrison is also alleged to have told the press conference that "the indications are very strong that Oswald was informing the Federal Bureau of Investigation that an assassination was contemplated." On May 14, 1964, I testified before the Warren Commission and at that time I emphatically denied that Oswald had ever been engaged by the Bureau or acted as an informant in any capacity. In addition, our entire file relating to Lee Harvey Oswald which was maintained at Federal Bureau of Investigation headquarters covering Oswald's activities as reported to us prior to the assassination was furnished to the Warren Commission for its review in connection with its investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy.
