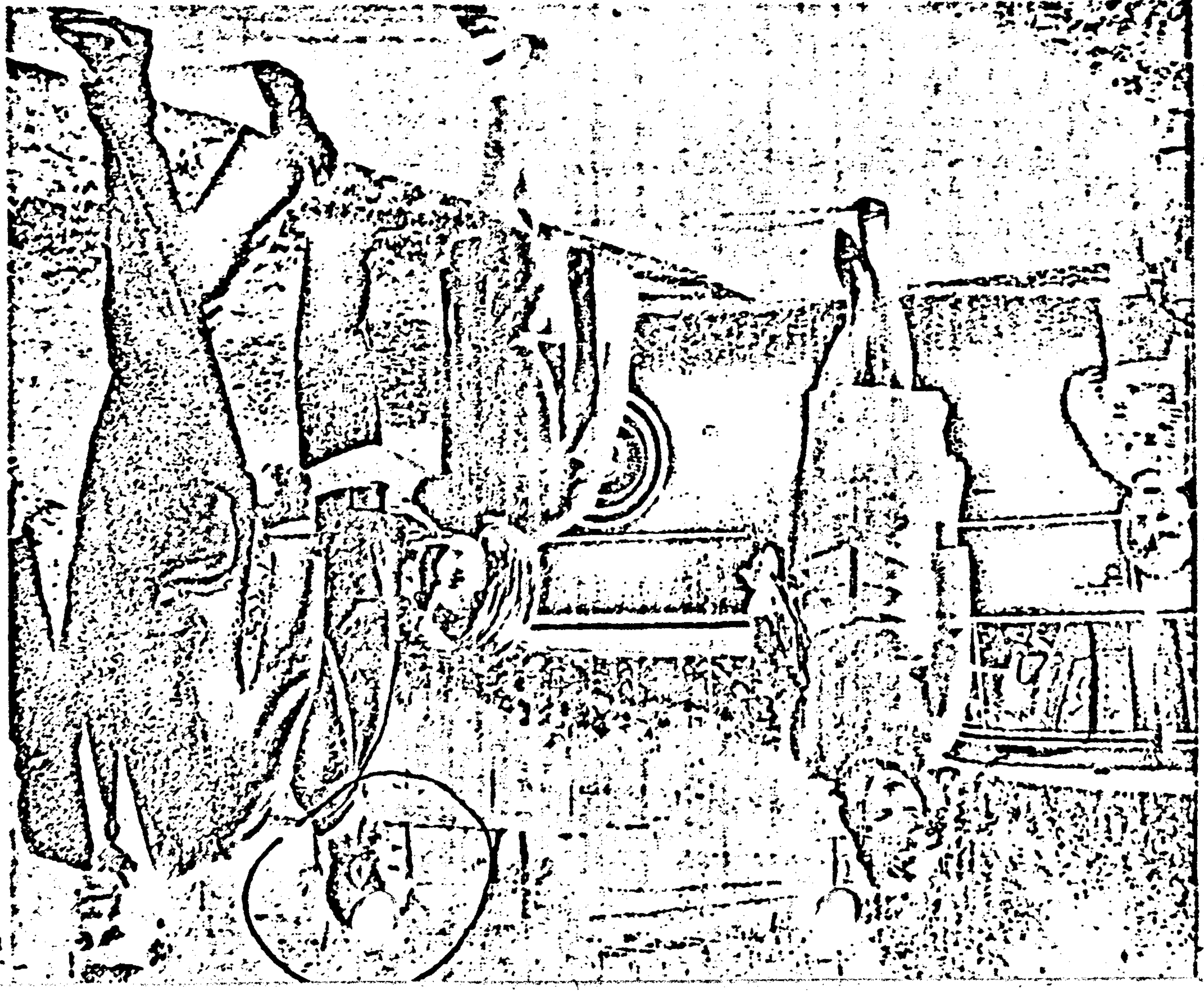

Three-Star Extra, 6:45 p. m., 12-2-63, in an editorial note reported that the FBI will submit its report this week to President Johnson on the assassination of President Kennedy. It was indicated that this report will outline step by step all available facts concerning the assassination and the subsequent murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, that the report will be in narrative form without comment and will give background information concerning persons involved. The program stated that because the Director is in charge of this report, it will be given great credibility as the Director has great prestige and the public will be confident that the facts set out over his name will be accurate. It was noted that no disposition for this report has as yet been indicated by President Johnson but that it may be referred to the Presidential Committee of Inquiry which is to look into the assassination.

[Sykora] did not hear a parking lot attendant at the Adolphus parking lot make any remark to [Shenkner] to the effect that President Kennedy and Texas Governor Connally were going to be shot. [Shenkner] never related to him or anyone else in the party to his knowledge that the attendant had made such remarks to him.

[Sykora] did not take his personal car with him to Dallas and cannot recall having been on the parking lot at the Adolphus Hotel.

[Sykora] spent the nights of November 19 and 20, 1963, with [National Bank Examiners Charles Shenkner, James McKay, and Robert Van Dyke] at the Adolphus Hotel, Dallas, Texas.

On November 30, 1963, [Mr. David Sykora, National Bank Examiner, 115 North College, Tulsa, Oklahoma] advised SA [L. H. Williams] as follows concerning [Sykora's] knowledge of the above alleged incident at the parking lot at the Adolphus Hotel in downtown Dallas, Texas, the evening of November 20, 1963:

On the evening of November 22, 1963, Mr. Charles J. Shenkner, 817 East Lindsay, Norman, Oklahoma, a bank examiner employed by the Treasury Department, telephonically advised he was in Dallas, Texas, on Wednesday, November 20, 1963, and on the evening of that date at a parking lot of the Adolphus Hotel in downtown Dallas, a parking attendant there told him he knew "some guy" who was going to kill the President and Governor Connally. The parking attendant said this person had been to Russia. No further description of him was given.

With reference to the Director's inquiry regarding our having any contacts in New York who could cut the red tape in aiding us to obtain copies of alleged Western Union money orders received by Lee Harvey Oswald, as set forth in a United Press International (UPI) release dated 11-30-63, the following is submitted.

Our New York Office was unable to be of assistance as Western Union is divided on a regional basis; however, they did furnish the identity of a vice-president in the Dallas area who might be of assistance to our Dallas Office in developing the required information.

Our Dallas Office has always had good relations with the Western Union Office in its Division; however, in view of a long standing Western Union rule that prior to divulging information from its files that a court order be obtained and the resulting nation-wide prominence of this particular case we have been temporarily unable to obtain this information. Dallas is presently endeavoring to contact the vice-president recommended by the New York Office who was en route to Denver, Colorado. This vice-president should be in a position to authorize our Agents to review all incoming and outgoing telegrams which would include the money orders.

With reference to the Director's inquiry concerning the same UPI release stating the FBI had re-enacted the assassination, running a motorcade past the Texas School Book Depository Building, and the allegation Secret Service re-staged a re-enactment of Wednesday, 11-27-63, the following is submitted.

Our Dallas Office did not re-enact the assassination and did not check the route taken by the motorcade as stated in the UPI release and it is not known by our Dallas Office whether Secret Service has made any effort to check the entire route taken by the President's motorcade on 11-22-63.

2. Dallas has not initiated a re-enactment of the assassination and there appears to be no reason from an investigative standpoint to do so. Unless such action is called for, no re-enactment will be initiated by Dallas.

1. The tracing of the Western Union money orders allegedly received by Oswald is being followed and when it is resolved you will be promptly advised.

ACTION

The FBI in Dallas on 11-28-63, did make a complete check of the activities of Oswald in an effort to trace in detail his movements from the Texas School Book Depository Building to the location where officer J. D. Tippett was murdered. Secret Service from 11-27-63, to 11-29-63, was checking at the Depository building for the trajectory of the bullets from the sixth floor of the building to the spot where the President's car was when he was assassinated. No Bureau Agents were present during the Secret Service check.

He advised that he was in receipt of an airmail letter, postmarked 9:30 PM. 11/26/63 at Valdosta, Georgia, and containing a notice captioned, "Wake Up - Christians", and signed "International Underground". [redacted] made available this notice on 12/1/63 and it was returned to him on 12/2/63 in order that he might turn it over to the Miami Police Department. The contents of this notice are set forth in the enclosed letterhead memorandum.

Regarding his visit to Columbia, South Carolina, stated he met BELTON MIMS about noon on 11/28/63. MIMS telephonically contacted A. O. BOLLEN of the ASCK and arranged a meeting. MIMS instructed [redacted] not to say anything while in the automobile or office for security reasons.

[redacted] related that MIMS drove 7 or 8 miles south of Columbia, South Carolina, where they met A. O. BOLLEN. They left their cars parked at the side of the road and standing several yards away discussed the assassination of President KENNEDY, Constitutional American Parties of the United States (CAP), J. A. MILTER and BARBOMB.

MIMS and BOLLEN said they regretted the assassination of President KENNEDY and then proceeded to question [redacted] as to whether MILTER could have been involved. MIMS indicated that he was very concerned in view of the statement made by MILTER that the "right wing" has nothing to worry about. In addition, MIMS questioned [redacted] as to the relationship between MILTER, JACK BROWN of Chattanooga, Tennessee, KENNETH ADAMS of Anniston, Alabama, and BOB SHELDON of Tuscaloosa, Alabama. According to [redacted] MIMS was primarily concerned as to whether MILTER had actually formed an underground group unknown to the Klan.

Regarding the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, MILTER and BOLLEN stated they agreed to join with MILTER in a campaign to blame the President's death on the "Jews." They also indicated they would assist MILTER in forming the CAP.

[redacted] related that in conversation with MIMS, BOLLEN, as well as many citizens who have no connection with the Klan, are saying the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and MARTIN LUTHER KING are responsible for the assassination of President KENNEDY. [redacted] noted this is strictly his opinion and future meetings of the NAACP and meetings conducted by MARTIN LUTHER KING could possibly result in violence.

Regarding the recent bombings in Birmingham, Alabama, MIMS informed [redacted] as follows:

He stated that during a meeting of the National KKK in Biloxi, Mississippi, which took place several months ago, a sum of money was donated by the various Klan Organizations. (This was not on an individual basis). The money collected was turned over to a delegate at the Biloxi meeting, who was instructed to give this money to JACK BROWN of Chattanooga, Tennessee. According to MIMS, the money was donated by the various Klans for the defense of Birmingham, Alabama, to stop integration in that city. MIMS did not state that BROWN was responsible for the Birmingham bombings, however, he noted that various Klans looked to BROWN to engineer violence, if and when necessary.

Regarding the above meeting at Biloxi, Mississippi, reference is made to Savannah's airtel and letterhead memorandum dated 4/12/63, regarding the National KKK meeting at Biloxi, Mississippi 4/6/63 and 4/7/63, Bureau file 157-168, Savannah file 157-310, Birmingham file 105-469.

It should be noted by the Bureau that [redacted] was not aware of the meeting in Biloxi, Mississippi, and would have been unable to refer to this meeting had it been furnished to him by MIMS.

In order that all offices will be fully aware of the background concerning J. A. MILTER, the following is set forth, based on Atlanta's teletype to the Director dated 11/26/63, captioned, "ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, NOVEMBER 22, 1963".

" J. A. MILTER resides Qutman, Ga. Investigation has indicated MILTER was in Qutman on Nov. 21, 1963. MILTER is regarded by local authorities Qutman, Ga., as being very eccentric. He has no close associates and very few people have anything to do with him. He is 'Against everything' and is regarded as being an agitator. MILTER resides with a known prostitute in Valdosta, Ga., in addition to his residence in Qutman.

" MILTEER attended the Convention of the Constitution Party of the U.S. in Indiana on Oct. 18 through 20, 1963. In a closed session of the national committee of the Constitution Party on Oct. 20, 1963, MILTEER was advised that he was not entitled to use the designation as the regional director of the Southeastern States of the Constitution Party of the U. S. as such a title does not exist in the party.

" MILTEER described as follows. Name

JOSEPH ADAMS MILTEER. Born Feb. 26, 1902, Quitman, Ga., white male, five feet four, one hundred sixty lbs., blue eyes, ruddy complexion, hair partially thinning and gray, wears glasses with metal frame, heavy waisted, small round shouldered, nearly always unshaven, short gray stubble with about two days growth, shabby dresser, wears old fashioned clothes, hunting type cap, tan in color, is short legged, most of height from waist upwards. Graduate of Quitman High School, no known relatives, drives sixty two Volvo, bearing sixty three Ga. tag 61-D-226, gray or tan in color. Also drives unknown year Volkswagen, bearing sixty three Ga. tag 11D2762, believed property of Mrs. C. C. CORFIELD, 212 South Troupe St., Valdosta prostitute with whom MILTEER lives part of time. Subject arrested in fifty five

Valdosta, Ga., for suspicion of burglary and released. Valdosta PD has fingerprint card which undoubtedly never sent to Bureau. This card being sent under separate cover to Identification Div., and should be returned to Valdosta, PD.

" Only photo of MILTEER obtained taken Christmas forty three. Is good likeness of facial characteristics but hair is much grayer and thin. Photo being forwarded Birmingham and Dallas under separate cover."

On December 1, 1963, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past and in addition, has furnished some information that could not be verified or corroborated, stated as follows:

On November 27, 1963, BELTON MIMS and A. O. BOLLEN of the Association of South Carolina Klans (ASCK) stated that they would assist J. A. MILTKER, Valdosta, Georgia, to promote the formation of the Constitutional American Parties of the United States (CAP).

A characterization of the ASCK is attached hereto and sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

MIMS and BOLLEN said they will assist MILTKER in circulating the following notice, which was prepared by MILTKER at Valdosta, Georgia:

"MAKE UP - - CHRISTIANS"

"The Jews had Jesus killed nearly 2000 years ago. They have not changed in all this time. They, the Zionist Jews, Communists, had President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY killed in Dallas, Texas, by LEE OSWALD, November 22, 1963. LEE OSWALD, in turn, was killed by JACK RUBINSTEIN. All violence committed by left wing groups.

"It now becomes the solemn duty of every true, red-blooded American to seek, find, expel, drive out from our country every traitor be he a Zionist Jew, Communist, or what have you.

AGK has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

This third source said that ASCK, using the name Majority Citizens League of South Carolina, published a monthly newspaper, "Southland Standard," from August through December, 1961, and dropped it due to lack of financial support.

A third source advised on April 16, 1962, that ASCK continues to operate for the purpose of promoting white supremacy and combating integration by peaceful means by public speaking and propaganda.

A second source advised on September 2, 1950, that ASCK was composed of groups formerly members of the Association of Georgia Klans (AGK) and although AGK severed all connections with AGK on November 14, 1949, the ideals, purposes and policies of the two organizations remained identical. AGK became defunct after conviction and imprisonment of its highest official and other members in 1952.

A source advised on September 24, 1956, that the Association of South Carolina Klans (ASCK) was organized in the fall of 1955 and is patterned after the Association of Carolina Klans (ACK). This source said ASCK is a new organization and not a rebirth of ACK, although all high-ranking officials of ASCK had been members of ACK. The source stated announced purposes of this organization are to promote white supremacy and combat integration of the races; however, the use of violence is disavowed.

Thomas Harris, Allerton Hotel (temporary),
Chicago, Illinois, legal residence, 1900 Monomonee River
Parkway, Wauwatosa, Wisconsin, contacted the Chicago Office
of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on December 4, 1963,
and advised he formerly resided at 10443 Crown Road, Apartment
6, Franklin Park, Illinois. He stated that on the evening
of November 26, 1963, or the early morning of November 27,
1963, he overheard the couple in Apartment 7, which is next
to his, having an argument. The husband seemed distressed
over their marriage and after several minutes of argument,
stated, "Maybe I ought to shoot the President and the cops
will take care of me."

Harris stated he did not know the name of the
couple across from his apartment and could not furnish any
further information regarding the situation. He stated that
in view of the recent happenings he could not, in good
conscience, withhold this information any longer.

Harris advised his lease expired November 30

1963, and he has since moved to the Allerton Hotel; however,
he will be moving to his mother's home at the Wauwatosa,
Wisconsin address.

SAC Shanklin, Dallas Office, was telephonically advised that an immediate check should be made to determine whether or not the bullet or bullets had been removed from Governor Connally in order that same could be obtained for necessary examination and evidentiary purposes. He was advised that appropriate arrangements had been made for the same check and obtaining of bullets from the President's body after arriving in Washington if they had not been previously removed in Texas. Shanklin advised that there was some question as to whether or not the bullets had actually lodged in either body and there was a rumor in Dallas that some Secret Service Agent had allegedly picked up one of the bullets in question.

Shanklin was advised that in the event the bullets had gone through the body of the President and/or Governor Connally for every effort must be expended to try and locate these bullets for evidentiary purposes. Shanklin was also advised that an immediate check would be made with Secret Service in Washington in an effort to ascertain whether any Agent of Secret Service had picked up one of the bullets and he, Shanklin, would be advised.

Shanklin subsequently advised information had been received that a Secret Service Agent had searched the car in which the President was riding and had found the bullet which allegedly killed the President. Shanklin also advised that the rifle which allegedly had been used to assassinate the President was now in the possession of a Mr. Sorrells who is in charge of Secret Service

It was suggested to Shanklin that if it had not been done that the room from which the bullets were fired be thoroughly processed for fingerprints. Shanklin was told that if it were feasible to obtain prints under the conditions that existed he should not hesitate to ask the Bureau for an expert fingerprintman to be sent from Washington to Dallas.

In Dallas who was extremely cooperative but was holding the rifle on instructions and would do so until he was authorized by headquarters to release same. Arrangements are being made for this to be taken up with Secret Service here in Washington and to determine if they do not desire the Bureau to handle the ballistics examination.
