On November 27, 1963, U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service Officer in Charge and WILLIAM CHAMBERS advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that approximately 2:00 p.m., November 22, 1963, he received a telephone call from a man indicating he was in Fort Worth, Texas, who inquired as to whether or not the International Bridge between Del Rio, Texas, and Mexico was still open in view of the assassination of the President. The person making the inquiry indicated he was in Fort Worth and did not want to make a four-hundred-mile trip in vain.

On November 23, 1963, Mr. CHAMBERS advised that the long distance telephone call was originally accepted by his secretary who stated to him that the man when he called was already on the telephone and there was no long distance operator involved. The man inquired as to whether the International Bridge was still open, and in view of this, his secretary referred the call to Mr. CHAMBERS. The man did not identify himself, but stated that he was in Fort Worth and did not want to make a four-hundred-mile trip in vain. Some discussion was made of the assassination of the President, and the caller inquired in view of that, if the bridge were open. He was advised that the bridge was then open. No telephone number was furnished by the caller. In discussing the matter with his secretary, they concluded the call was made between 2:00 and 3:00 p.m., November 22, 1963.

Records of the General Telephone Company, Del Rio, Texas, contained no information relating to the above call.

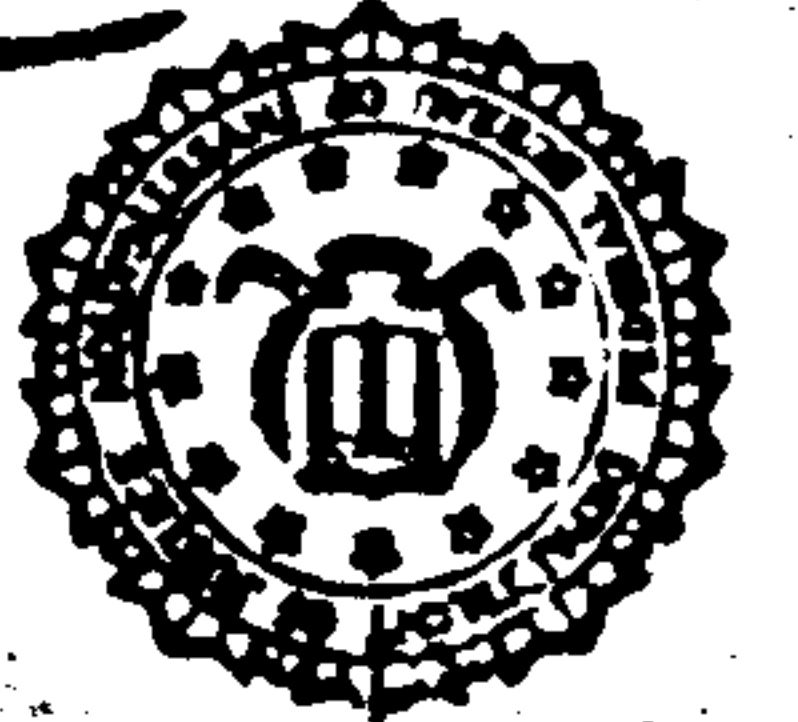

On November 27, 1963, ETHEL CATTANAU, 1431 West Hermosa Street, San Antonio, Texas, telephonically advised the San Antonio Federal Bureau of Investigation Office that she is a nurse at the home of E. H. BARBER, 327 Beverly Drive, San Antonio. She stated that she works with a woman named CATHERINE POLK, who is employed as a charwoman, and POLK said that she heard from a friend that LEE HARVEY OSWALD stayed at the Holiday Inn located on the Pan American Expressway in San Antonio on the evening of November 21, 1963.

CATHERINE POLK was interviewed on November 29, 1963, and advised that while she was going to a funeral someone in the car had mentioned the fact that OSWALD stayed at the Holiday Inn the day that President KENNEDY visited San Antonio. She had no idea who this person was, nor could she find out from anyone.

On November 29, 1963, HARLEY PITTS, Manager, Holiday Inn, 3855 Pan American Expressway, made available to Agents the room revenue balance sheets for November 19-21, 1963, and they were reviewed with negative results for the name LEE HARVEY OSWALD and known aliases. Mr. FITTS stated that none of his employees ever mentioned anything regarding OSWALD staying at the motel.

Mrs. L. STECK, Desk Clerk, Holiday Inn, 3855 Pan American Expressway, advised that she worked on November 21, 1963, but does not recall anyone resembling OSWALD entering or staying at the motel.

Mr. TREVOR STEVENS, Night Manager, Holiday Inn, 3855 Pan American Expressway, advised that he worked on November 20, 1963, and he is sure that OSWALD did not register or come into the motel.

The President of the United States and a valiant Dallas policeman have died violently by the hand of a member of the international Communist conspiracy. This is the same kind of violent death being meted out to officials and citizens of South America, Viet Nam and other countries all over the world by that same communist conspiracy. And it is the same type of violent death planned for every American who chooses to resist slavery and the continued subversion of this country by the communists unless immediate and effective action is taken by the federal government to outlaw, defeat and destroy the communist conspiracy.

If this sacrifice of the life of the President and a law officer is not to have been in vain, and if it is not to be repeated with increasing frequency and violence, stern, fearless and effective measures will be demanded of you by every American who has watched with deep apprehension and misgivings the Kennedy Administration's strange and incredibly unrealistic attitude toward our deadly enemy -- communism. Conservatives and dedicated American spokesmen and citizens everywhere have warned your administration repeatedly and continuously of the imminent danger of internal communism -- but so far without avail.

Lee Harvey Oswald was formally charged with the murders and overwhelming evidence supports those charges in spite of insidious efforts of the communists and their despicable liberal sympathizers and apologists in the United States to accuse the officer of the fair play for Cuba Committee -- a communist front. In short, Oswald was a typical, deadly internal communist, and a skilled practitioner of the communist trade -- violence, deceit, murder, confusion and hatred. It is now reported that his bias toward communism and his predilection for murder as a means to communist goals developed from his study of communist tracts -- communist propaganda in the United States.

UPI news indicated that Joseph Rodriguez Molina had been brought in by the Dallas Police Department and was a possible suspect in connection with the assassination of the President. The Dallas Office subsequently advised that Joseph Rodriguez Molina had worked in the same building with Lee Oswald and the police had interviewed Molina last night and searched his home with Molina's permission. They advised that the reason the police were interested in Molina was due to the fact that going back to 1955 he was alleged to have some leftist leanings.

Molina voluntarily came to the Dallas Police Department today and they were interviewing Molina. He has not been arrested and according to the police they have nothing to arrest him on at this time. Dallas is following this matter closely.
