Agents participate in the interview at Dallas Police Department Headquarters of the individual who had shot Oswald. (At this point Mr. Hoover was apprised of the identity of this individual, Jack Leon Ruby, and what background was then available concerning him. He was advised that we were reviewing Bureau files for all available information on Ruby. It had already been determined that records of the Dallas Police Department 12/5/54 when Ruby was arrested on a local liquor violation. The Director was also advised that the Dallas Office was considering the possibility of a dying declaration being obtained from Oswald. He agreed that this should be done.) Mr. Hoover referred to the fact that our Dallas Office had warned local authorities concerning the anonymous call received at the Dallas Office 11/24/63. This was the call that threatened the shooting of Oswald when he would be transferred from the City to the County Jail 11/24/63. He said Dallas Chief of Police Curry had not properly handled the situation, as evidenced by the fact that Oswald was, in fact, critically wounded.

At 1:00 p.m., today, the Director telephoned Mr. Rosen's Office from his residence and advised he had just spoken with President Johnson concerning the shooting in Dallas, Texas, of Lee Harvey Oswald. The President was greatly disturbed about this incident and desired that the FBI conduct whatever investigation possible into this matter. Mr. Hoover said it had occurred to him that we might have jurisdiction from a possible civil rights standpoint. Mr. Hoover had talked with Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach concerning this possibility, and Katzenbach is presently in the process of having research performed to determine under what Federal jurisdiction we might proceed.

Memorandum to Mr. Belmont
Re: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

Mr. Hoover reiterated that the President wants us to vigorously pursue this matter from whatever angle possible and, if necessary, without complete regard for technicalities.

The Director advised he wanted Agents standing by at the Parkland Hospital in Dallas in order that we may know on a current basis the physical condition of Oswald. Mr. Hoover was advised that as of the time of this call, we had learned from Dallas that Oswald had not yet regained consciousness. He said he wanted to be kept advised telephonically at his residence concerning developments in this matter.

ACTION:

At 1:18 p. m., SAC Shanklin of the Dallas Office was furnished the above information and instructions. Shanklin advised that Agents were taking part in the interview of Ruby and that an Agent was also standing by at Parkland Hospital.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to examine the rubber stamp printing of the handwriting on this certificate and determine whether or not the rubber stamps are the same and whether or not the signature of Dr. HIDEEL was possibly forged by OSWALD.

Observation of this vaccination certificate indicates that the name LEE OSWALD and the name of the doctor are both put on the certificate with a rubber stamp and possibly the same rubber stamp. The signature of Dr. HIDEEL written across the rubber stamp, resembles the handwriting and the signature of OSWALD.

"DR. A. J. HIDEEL, P. O. Box 30016, New Orleans, La. This certificate bears a rubber stamped impression

of vaccination against Smallpox in the name LEE OSWALD. There is being enclosed herewith for the FBI Laboratory, a photocopy of an International Certificate

For your investigative assistance, a few handwritten similarities were noted common to the questioned signature "A. J. Hilde" and the available known writings of OSWALD.

For your investigative assistance, it was noted that the rubber stamp wording "New Orleans, La." on Q52 matches closely the present rubber stamp setting on K39 and could have come from K39. The other rubber stamp impressions on Q52 are of the same size and style as the rubber type on K39.

You will be advised separately regarding the latent fingerprint examination of K39. K39 was among the items personally delivered to the Laboratory on 11/27/63, by Agents of your office.

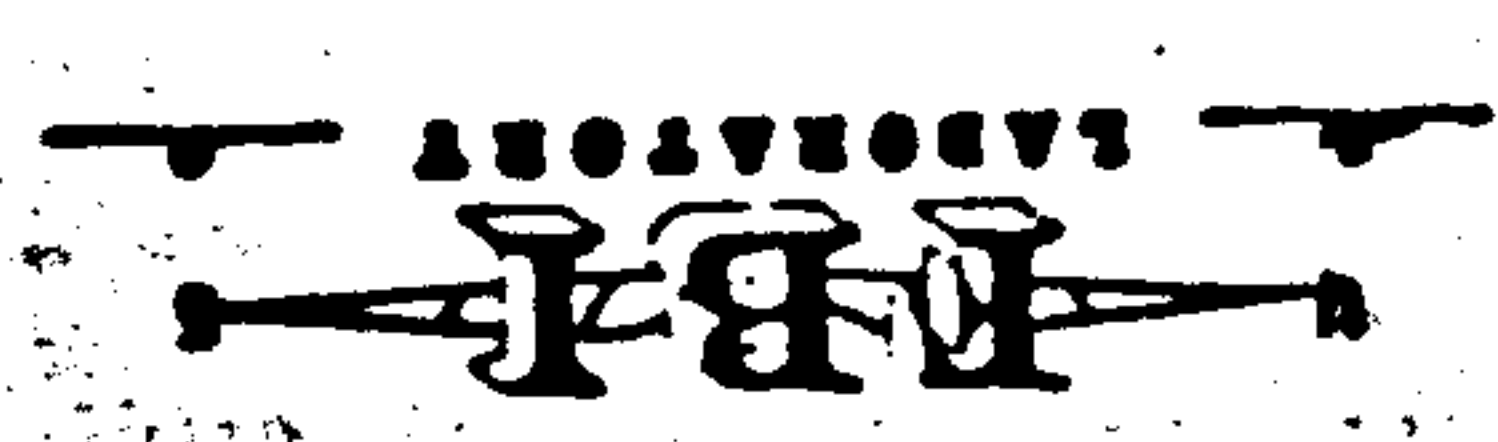

The submitted evidence is retained.

It was concluded that the hand printing and the Oswald signature on Q52 were written by LEE HARVEY OSWALD, K4 and K5 in this case. The signature "A. J. Hildee" on Q52 is distorted and not sufficiently comparable with the available known writings of OSWALD to warrant a definite conclusion.

Q52 is a Xerox copy of the original vaccination certificate and is not sufficiently clear for a rubber stamp comparison.

It was concluded that K39 was used to prepare the entire rubber stamp impression on the handbill, Q44, previously submitted and the rubber stamp wording "New Orleans, La." on Q43 and Q45.

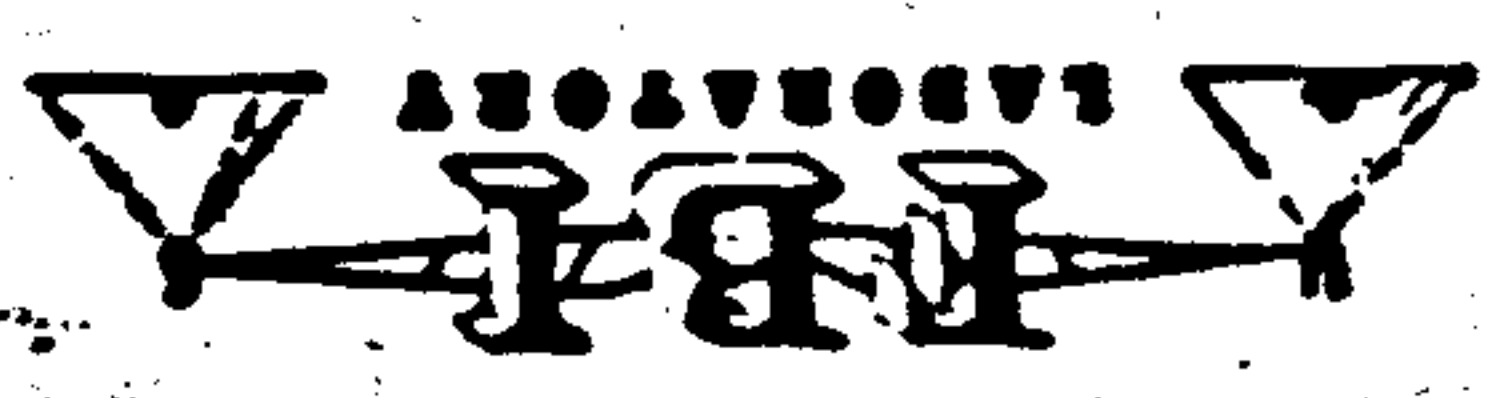

Division Six will continue to handle the portion of the report dealing with the assassination attempt and the evidence gathered to show that Oswald is responsible. This means that we will have to carefully check the evidence and Oswald's possessions that the police are now turning over to us, to see if additional information should go into the report from this. *105060*

At such time as the report is finished, Mr. Katzenbach will go over it, and will furnish it to other officials of the government, such as McCono of CIA, the Secretaries of Navy, Defense, and State, so that they can look it over and make sure they agree and do not have any objections.

In other words, this report is to settle the dust, in so far as Oswald and his activities are concerned, both from the standpoint that he is the man who assassinated the President, and relative to Oswald himself and his activities and background, et cetera.

This report will have to contain anything of relevance to the case. We should get from the Defense Department Oswald's record and going down to Mexico City, and his contacts down there. We should cover the angle of Oswald disciplinary action and discharge.

The Director advised that he had talked to Katzenbach, who had been talking to the White House relative to the report we are to render in the Oswald case. It is Katzenbach's feeling that this report should include everything which may raise a question in the mind of the public or the press regarding this matter, including such things as the return of the passport to Oswald in Moscow, and the furnishing of money to him by the State Department for the purpose of returning to the U.S. If the State Department regulations or law required State to do these things, we should get a copy of the law.

O'CONNELL on 11/26/63 that Mrs. Telephone Co. operator [Redacted] Oshkosh, Wis., had advised her chief operator that on Friday, 11/15/63, she answered a signal perhaps from a pay station and recorded a credit card number for LEE HARVEY OSWALD, Dallas, Tex. The operator was quite sure of the name because she and the calling party repeated it since it was made up of three common first names. The called party said, "This is the Johnson residence," and the calling party said, "That is what I want. Oswald is staying there." The operator then cut out at this point.

At the end of the call, the caller flashed the operator and placed another call, again person to person. The first name the operator reports was something on the order of VICTORIA but could possibly have been AUGUSTA, and the second name was definitely MARINA and the last was something like SOMVITSCHKA. During interview of [redacted] he expressed the personal opinion that the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY could have resulted in connection with a plot between Cuba and the United States, the purpose of which would be to effect severance of the United States' present relationship to Soviet Russia. He explained that President KENNEDY's progressive leadership had seemed to be developing a closer relationship with Russia. He said that China would very likely conceive as a gain or beneficial to its ends, a United States administration in which President KENNEDY'S successor would be more strongly reactionary toward Russia thereby tending to extend the division separating the United States and Russia.

Interview of the subject was conducted by SAs LOUIS BRUNE, JR, and THOMAS H. SULLIVAN.

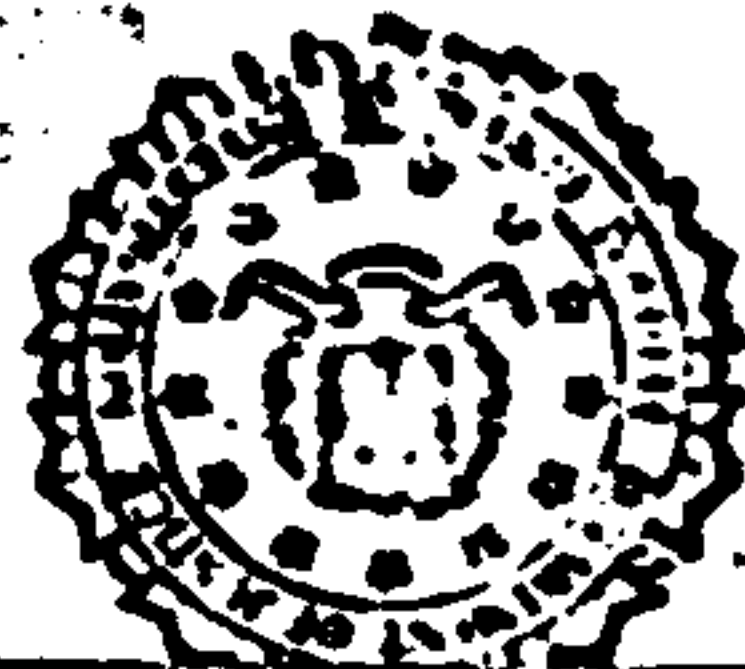

An interview of [redacted] was conducted on

November 29, 1963, at his temporary place of residence, [redacted]

[redacted] Astoria, Queens New York, based on information

received from the Orange County Sheriff's Office, California,

which, in turn, was predicated on an anonymous telephone call.

This anonymous caller, who spoke in a well-educated manner, advised

that work had been received from relatives in Ireland that the

Irish Republican Army (IRA) would attempt to get a company of its

members into the United States by air linings, and if this is

unsuccessful, they would proceed to the United States one by one,

with the intention of going to Dallas, Texas, to commit mayhem.

The caller emphasized this was not a practical joke and reported

his brother as a member of the IRA.

[redacted] advised that as one of the leaders of the IRA,

he is cognizant of the policies, plans and official pronouncements

of the IRA. He has no knowledge of an IRA plan to send a group

of members into the United States with the intent to commit

violence in Dallas, Texas, in retaliation for the assassination

of President John F. Kennedy. He said any such plan would be

ridiculous, and he feels that the IRA would not have the right

to consider or take such action. He remarked that the IRA,

furthermore, does not have the funds with which to accomplish

such an action, to even send two people to the United States for

any planned action of this nature would be beyond the IRA's means.

The IRA, he said, is actually concerned with one country, Ireland,

and its unification and, incidentally, with Great Britain's

relationship to Ireland. It has no other international interests

He stated that happenings in other countries are not the IRA's

business.

Complainant has no evidence of connection between JOHNSON and SMIT, however, SMIT displayed an immediate and unusual interest in JOHNSON's residence until he, SMIT, determined the residence had been remodeled. Complainant advised the SMITs travel regularly on weekends, and Mrs. SMIT always carries a "satchel" approximately 4" x 15".

SMIT's exact employment is unknown, but he is believed to be a warehouseman, and further he is believed to live much above his known source of income.

SMIT and his wife were absent from home 11/22-26/63, when they returned at approximately 3:00 PM, after which SMIT immediately proceeded with yard work.

On Wednesday, 11/20/63, it appeared that the SMITs were moving, and a newspaper boy subsequently advised the complainant the SMITs were leaving for Switzerland. Complainant is of the opinion the move has as yet not been completed.

According to MOORE, [redacted] related that he had in-formation that ARTURO GRIFFITHS was preparing to leave or had left on a trip which included Mexico and other countries. MOORE stated that [redacted] told him that he wondered whether such a trip by GRIFFITHS had any bearing on the assassination of the late President and that [redacted] wished the matter be reported to proper authorities.

On 11/29/63, U. S. Marshal LUKE MOORE, Washington, D. C., advised SAs GEORGE R. FLETCHER and ALBERT B. MILLER that he had been contacted this date by [redacted] Washington, D. C.

On 11/29/63, HARRY W. GEIGLIN, SAC, U. S. Secret Service, Washington, D. C., telephonically advised that a telephone call had been received from LUKE MOORE, U. S. Marshal, Washington, D. C., in which MOORE stated that [redacted] had some information to report regarding ARTHUR JENNINGS GRIFFITHS, aka ARTURO J. GRIFFITHS. Such call being reported by reason of the assassination of the late president, JOHN F. KENNEDY, and remarks of violence to have been made by GRIFFITHS in July, 1963, that the Negroes should attempt to do to KENNEDY what the Puerto Ricans had attempted to do to ex-President TRUMAN.
