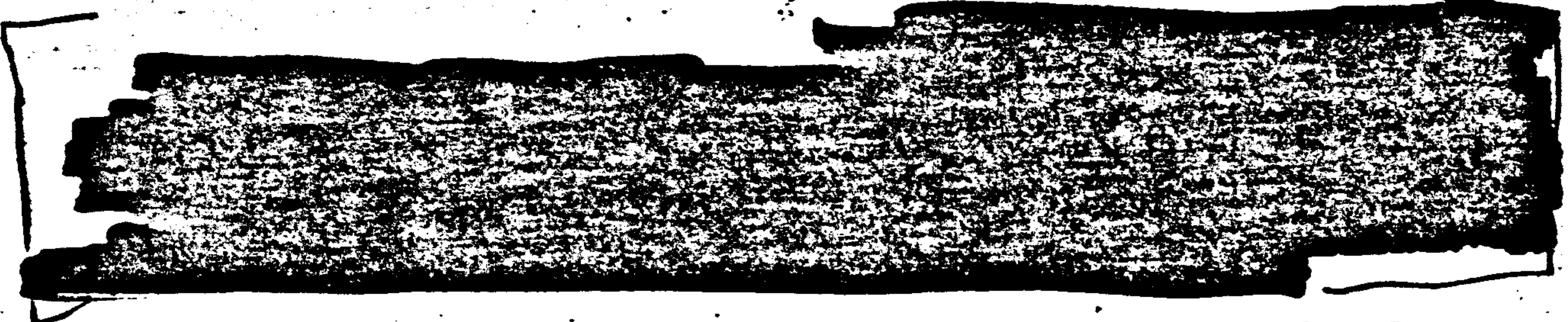


No further investigation being conducted WFO UACB.

It is to be noted that there is no information WFO indicative of any association of GRIFFITHS with LEE HARVEY OSWALD. The description of GRIFFITHS a Negro, DOB 2/28/10, New York City, is set forth in detail in the above enclosures.



The above results of the interview were telephonically communicated to SAC, HARRY W. GEIGLEIN, U. S. Secret Service, Washington, D. C., on 11/29/63.

On 11/29/63, [redacted] was immediately interviewed by Bureau Agents FLETCHER and MILLER. [redacted] related that GRIFFITHS had told [redacted] that he (GRIFFITHS) was going to take a trip to Mexico, Ghana, and other countries unnamed. [redacted] advised that GRIFFITHS did not express any details, did not make any reference to the assassination and that he had no further discussion with GRIFFITHS. [redacted] stated that he recalled reading something about LEE OSWALD having been to Mexico and decided that the conversation with GRIFFITHS above should be reported.

MOORE stated that he telephoned U. S. Secret Service, and was advised that an FBI representative would contact him.

At the Dallas, Texas, Hospital immediately after the President was taken there on 11/22/63, Presidential Assistant P. Kenneth O'Donnell told the Secret Service "You are not at fault. You can't mix security and politics. We chose politics." A few weeks ago at Cape Canaveral (now Cape Kennedy), the President and Vice President both viewed the launching of a missile. Just prior to leaving the airfield to continue their trip, President Kennedy told Mr. Johnson "Get in my plane."

Examples of Security Problems:

Much of the public has the mistaken impression that the Chief Executive takes orders from the Secret Service as far as security is concerned. The biggest problem facing the U.S. Secret Service is getting the President to accept security safeguards. It is a calculated risk every time the Chief Executive travels outside the White House. Riding in open cars and shaking hands with people in crowds as Presidents have done in the past presents a serious threat to security. The White House detail of the U.S. Secret Service is a small group of dedicated men who would gladly give their lives to spare the Chief Executive. The action of special agent Rufus Youngblood is an example of this. As he sensed that the President had been hit by a sniper, he threw the then Vice President Johnson to the floor of the car and then covered him with his own body.

To obtain background material so that our suggestions would not be made in areas already covered Liaison Agent Bartlett discussed this matter with Mr. James J. Rowley, Chief, U.S. Secret Service. He indicated his pleasure at being consulted by the Bureau. He called in his top aides for a conference on Saturday, 11/30/63, and the problems attendant upon the protection of the President were discussed in great detail. The Director requested a memorandum setting forth suggestions to improve the security of the President. The memorandum is enclosed.

In Florida and on Cape Cod, Mr. Kennedy often jumped behind the wheel of an automobile and drove off. He has been characterized by the Secret Service as a notoriously poor driver who drove through red lights and took many unnecessary chances.

On the morning of the assassination, the President was in Fort Worth, Texas. It rained there as well as in Dallas. The Presidential "bubbletop" car was waiting him in Dallas at the airport. Approximately 30 minutes before the President was to arrive in Dallas, Presidential Assistant O'Donnell ordered that the plastic top be removed from the President's car in view of the fact that it had stopped raining.

As soon as President Kennedy was elected, Gerald A. Behn, who later succeeded Rowley as Special Agent in Charge of the White House detail, immediately flew to Mr. Kennedy's side and briefed him on security problems. At that time Behn mentioned that the President always rides in the right rear seat. Mr. Kennedy quipped "Maybe we will change that."

Recently President Kennedy was in New York City. As he left downtown New York to return to the airport he dismissed the police escort and his car stopped at red lights the same as other traffic. During this ride President Kennedy asked the Secret Service how the Police Commissioner liked the lack of escort. The President was told that the Police Commissioner was very disturbed by this action.

On Sunday, 11/24/63, President and Mrs. Johnson were headed toward the White House from their home with a motorcycle escort. Mrs. Johnson asked the Secret Service man accompanying them, "How long do we have to have this motorcycle escort?"

They (meaning the Secret Service) won't care." The Secret Service immediately questioned President Kennedy on this and pleaded with him to have Vice President Johnson ride in a separate aircraft. General Thomas White, U.S. Air Force, overheard these comments and told President Kennedy that he did not allow astronauts to ride in the same aircraft. The President jokingly remarked "Don't you fellows want McCormack as President?"

OBSERVATIONS:

The Secret Service feels that security at the White House and at the Johnson ranch in Texas is well in hand. At the present time a new alarm system is being attached to the fence surrounding the White House to alert the police if an attempt is made to climb over the fence. The Secret Service utilizes closed television channels at the White House as an additional precaution and new gates are being designed. Concerning the "LBJ" ranch at Johnson City, Texas, the Secret Service has a detail there for security precautions. This includes guards at the gates and full perimeter control when the President is there. In flying to the ranch, the President will land at the Bergstrom Air Force Base at Austin, Texas, and fly the 60 miles to the ranch by helicopter. Smaller planes can land at the ranch on the 6,000 foot runway which is only about 500 yards from the main house.

With respect to the questions raised in Mr. Belmont's attached memorandum, 11/29/63, there were two Secret Service men on the front seat of the President's car, one of whom was the driver. It is possible that Mrs. Kennedy looked to the rear for assistance because Texas Governor Connally and his wife were seated on the "jump seats" between the Kennedys and the front of the car. In addition Secret Service agent Clinton Hill, in charge of the First Lady's detail, was immediately to the rear of the President's car. Secret Service men were not riding on rear corners of the car as President Kennedy had indicated some time ago that he did not desire this.

Concerning the route of the motorcade in Dallas, Texas, it was determined that the distance from the airport to the Trade Mart where the President was to speak was four miles. The actual route selected by the political advance man was a distance of 10 miles so that more persons could see the President. This route was announced several days in advance and was given detailed publicity in Dallas, including route maps in the newspapers. The Secret Service agent making the advance arrangements was in Dallas throughout the 10 days preceding the President's visit. The actual trip to Dallas was announced publicly on September 26, 1963.

ACTION:

Enclosed is a memorandum embodying suggestions for improvement for the protection of the President as requested by the Director. This memorandum consists of all the suggestions made by the Bureau plus those made by Mr. J. J. Rowley and his Secret Service aides.

On November 28, 1963, Starr County Deputy Sheriff ROBERT PENN, Rio Grande City, Texas, advised that GLEN D. WEAL and MARY BROCKMAN, both of Dallas, had attempted to enter Mexico at Ciudad Miguel Aleman, Tamaulipas, Mexico, but had been refused entrance by Mexican Immigration authorities who ordered them to return to the United States. Mexican Immigration authorities advised U. S. Immigration authorities who in turn contacted Deputy Pena and suggested that the couple be detained for interrogation.

BORJORQUES furnished this information in the event it might have some connection with the assassination of President KENNEDY.

There was no record of these individuals having returned to the United States as of November 26, 1963, however, it was pointed out that tourists occasionally fail to turn in their Mexican tourist permits when they leave Mexico.

YARBROUGH was accompanied by ROBBY SUE WINBORN, female, age 23, single, no occupation, given, 3429 Johnson Drive, Dallas, Texas.

According to Mexican Immigration records at Nuevo Guerrero, on September 1, 1963, JACK LEE YARBROUGH, age 23, single, occupation, instructor, 3545 Centenary, Dallas, Texas, entered Mexico at Nuevo Guerrero.

At 8:45 p.m., November 26, 1963, U. S. Customs Agent JOHN SMITH, Falcon Dam, Falcon Heights, Texas, telephonically advised that NARCIS BORJORQUES, Nuevo Guerrero, Tamaulipas, Mexico, had furnished the following information with the request that it be delivered to a Special Agent of the FBI.

GLEN L. NEAL was interviewed at Rio Grande City, Texas, at which time he was identified as a Patrolman with his identification card. His identification card was signed by Chief of Police J. E. CURRY and his Police Department badge each bore #1320.

Patrolman NEAL advised that he and HARRY BROCKMAN obtained Mexican Tourist permits from the Office of the Mexican Consul in Dallas, Texas, on November 21, 1963, and that they had planned a trip to Monterrey, Mexico.

They traveled to Laredo, Texas, where they spent the night of November 27, 1963, and where they were advised that the highway from Laredo, Texas, to Monterrey, Mexico, was in poor condition and it was suggested to them that they come to Kora, Texas, where they could cross into Mexico at Ciudad Higuera, Aleman, and from there travel to Monterrey.

NEAL continued that when they presented their Mexican tourist permits at the Mexican Immigration Office in Ciudad Higuera, Aleman, it was determined that the official Mexican seal had not been affixed thereto by the Mexican Consul in Dallas. Mexican Immigration officials became suspicious, refused to let them pass and they ordered them to return to the United States.

Patrolman NEAL advised that his friend ~~MARK~~ BROCKMAN, age 39, resides at 3819 Inwood, Apartment 205, Dallas, Texas, was an Area Representative for the Helene Curtis Corporation, a cosmetics manufacturing company.

Patrolman NEAL advised that he had been on vacation from his position with the Dallas Police Department since November 21, 1963.

He stated he has been a member of the Dallas Police Department since May 30, 1956, and that he was born on October 26, 1934.

Patrolman NEAL advised that he and Miss BROCKMAN would return to Dallas, Texas, on November 29, 1963.

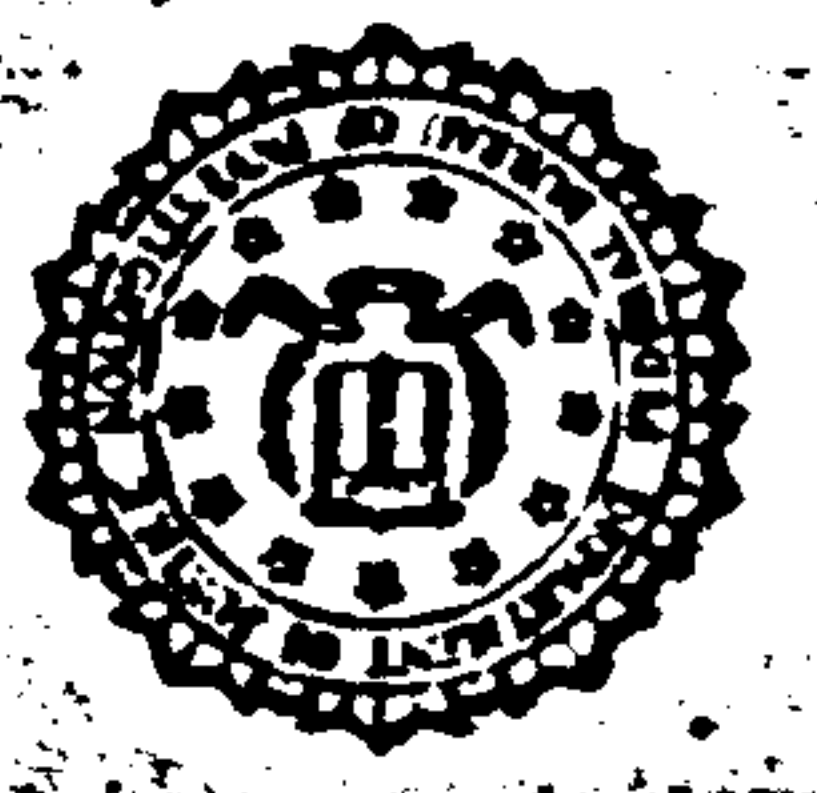

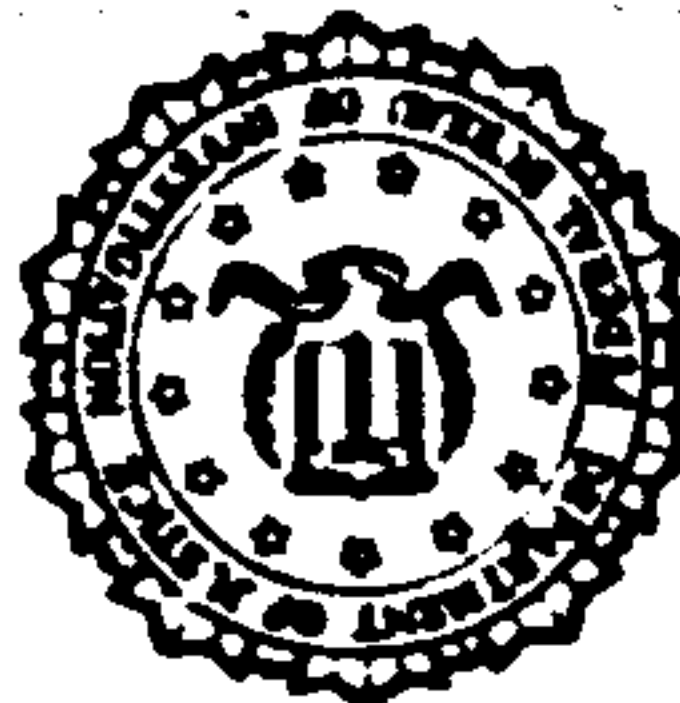

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past on November 27, 1963, advised that [redacted]

a white male with grey hair, weighing 160 pounds, [redacted] at Pauline, South Carolina, is presently a patient at [redacted] State Hospital, a mental institution. [redacted] is more commonly known as [redacted] in fact, very few people know his real name as he, [redacted] refers to himself all the time as [redacted]

was first admitted to the South Carolina State Hospital on May 29, 1925, and has been an intermittent patient since then. The last time he was admitted was on March 13, 1954, and he has been a patient since that time. He has been diagnosed as a schizoprenia-paranoid type. [redacted] is very delusional and blames the Communists for everything that happens to him and this country. He is always talking about his associations with people of royalty and high officials in the United States Government.

According to the source, [redacted] has access to public telephones. Source stated that [redacted] mental condition precluded an interview with him.

On November 27, 1963, R. E. Camp, Special Agent, Secret Service, Columbia, South Carolina, was advised of the above information.

On November 28, 1963, HARDIN read a newspaper account relating to a statement by a radio operator at McAllen, Texas, indicating OSWALD had applied for a position October 4, 1963, at which time he was driving a 1953 Ford. Mention of this form recalled to mind of HARDIN that on October 3, 1963, he was en route from Durant, Oklahoma, to Bryan, Texas, driving a 1947 dark blue Pontiac, with Arkansas license which he owned. This car broke down at Wortham, Texas, and he sold it to a service station attendant on the left side of the road going south. The attendant lives directly across the street from this service station and garage. This was approximately 10:15 to 10:30 in the morning. He hitchhiked a ride to Richland, Texas, and there caught a ride on Highway 75 toward Dallas, Texas, with an individual whom he believed to be OSWALD. This person was driving a 1953 Ford, light green or blue, and he specifically recalls the hood would not close completely on this car. The owner of this car, whom he believed to be OSWALD, stated that he was tired since he had been on the road for approximately the last three weeks. He indicated that he had an argument with his wife about three weeks prior at Oklahoma City and that he left her and drove to Houston and from Houston to New Orleans, then to Chicago, Illinois, and out to the West Coast and back. He was then on his way from Houston to

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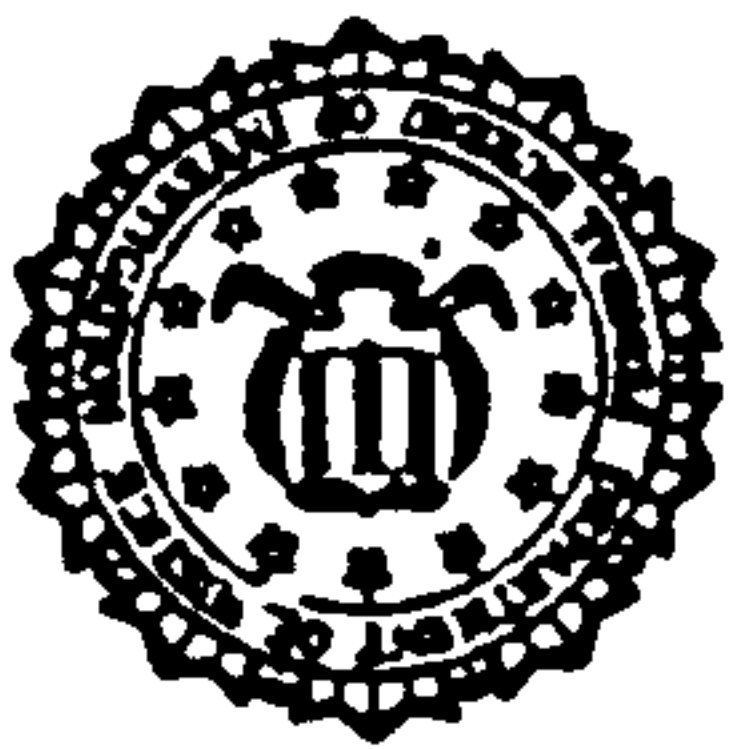

Dallas and indicated that he planned to sell his car in Dallas and to find a place to stay and to work. He claimed to be a painter by occupation and was at that time unemployed. He was alone in the car, but his exact manner of dress was not recalled. He made no mention of having been in Mexico. Since this owner of the car indicated he was tired, HARDIN drove the car to Dallas and stopped at radio and TV station WFA-TV, where HARDIN's sister, MAE MURPHY, worked in order that he could borrow money to buy another car. That same date he drove to Durant, Oklahoma, and purchased a car. In this regard he was able to set the exact date as being October 3, 1963. He stated at the time he stopped at the TV station in Dallas the owner of the car waited across the street at a hamburger stand and that when he came out they conversed for a few minutes but he did not recall whether this individual drove him to the bus station or he walked there since neither one of them knew exactly where the station was, but it was in the immediate vicinity. HARDIN took a bus to Durant, Oklahoma, where he bought his car. He did not see this individual again.

EDWARD HELTON, a resident in the neighborhood, has a reputation for being a braggart and a "pop-off." He is a loner and has no close friends or associates. He was in Hoppies Gardens from approximately 7:30 to 8:30 PM, December 1, 1963, at which time Mr. NEWMAN overheard him announce that he would bet \$50 that President JOHNSON would not complete his term.

WALTER NEWMAN was interviewed on December 2, 1963, and he furnished the following information:

[redacted] advised that HELTON was sitting 3.2% beer while in the bar and was in the bar [redacted]

[redacted] said that he and LONG ignored HELTON who then returned to his end of the bar and announced that he would bet \$50 that "Johnson" would not finish his term. WALTER NEWMAN, bartender, who overheard this, threw \$50 on the bar in front of HELTON and said, "Put you money where your mouth is." HELTON replied that he did not really want to bet.

[redacted] joined LESTER LONG, JR., further down the bar. HELTON walked over to them and said that it would take four million dollars to get rid of "Johnson."

[redacted] stated, "I contributed \$100 of the 1 1/2 million." HELTON no comment and prepared to move to another part of the bar when [redacted] made no conversation with him. HELTON commented to [redacted] "We spent 1 1/2 million dollars getting rid of KENNEDY."

[redacted] did not know HELTON and [redacted] made no conversation with him. HELTON commented to [redacted] "We spent 1 1/2 million dollars getting rid of KENNEDY."

[redacted] was seated toward the end of the bar and standing at the extreme end was EDWARD HELTON. [redacted] Hamilton, [redacted] did not know HELTON and [redacted] made no conversation with him. HELTON commented to [redacted] "We spent 1 1/2 million dollars getting rid of KENNEDY."

The only other individuals present in the bar at the time were the owner, WALTER NEWMAN, who was tending bar; LESTER LONG, JR., 911 Greenwood Avenue; and EDWARD HELTON, 920 Vine Street. Mr. NEWMAN said he immediately covered the bet and Mr. HELTON backed down.

Mr. HELTON had been drinking and had a total of three beers while at the bar. Mr. NEWMAN stated he heard no other comment made by HELTON and he stated HELTON left shortly thereafter.

Mr. NEWMAN states he did not consider statements

made by HELTON to be responsible. He stated HELTON has been in no trouble to his knowledge; holds membership in the Monkeys Mutual Aid Society of Hamilton, which is a social fraternal organization which provides an insurance benefit. He stated there is no question as to the loyalty of the members of this organization and he has never had reason to suspect the loyalty of HELTON.

EDWARD RICHARD HELTON was interviewed at his residence, 920 Vine Street, Hamilton, Ohio. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing agents. He was advised he did not have to furnish any information, that any information he did furnish could be used against him in a court of law, and that he had the right to the services of an attorney. No threats or promises were made to induce him to make any statement.

He stated on December 1, 1963, he spent the entire day at the Monkeys Mutual Aid Society at 303 Third Street, Hamilton, Ohio. He was alone during the entire day and he consumed one quart of whiskey while there. From this location he went to Hoppies Gardens for approximately 30 minutes to one hour around 7:30 PM. He advised he may have made statements to the effect that it cost 1 1/2 million dollars to get rid of President KENNEDY, that he contributed \$100 of this amount, that it would take four million to get rid of President JOHNSON, and that he would bet \$50 that President JOHNSON would not finish his term. He stated he does not recall having made such statements, had no prerogative to make such statements, and he stated that he frequently makes comments while drunk without knowing what he says.

He stated he is not a member of any organization other than Monkeys Mutual Aid Society. He advised he considers himself a completely loyal patriotic American citizen and has the greatest respect for the President of the United States and other government authorities.

He stated that if comments as suggested above were made by him they would be without meaning. He advised he frequently attempts to upset WALTER NEWMAN while in Hoppies Gardens and may have remarked as above for this purpose. He has never had \$100 to contribute to any cause nor has he had \$50 with which to bet on anything.

Mr. HELTON advised he is employed at General Electric Corporation at Evendale, Ohio, as a millwright in the Maintenance Department where they do general machinery repair work and fence

Our mutual friend, Mr. Daniel A. Busch, has mentioned to you a theory which I advanced to him by way of explanation of the actions of President Kennedy's assassin. Since you were interested to some extent, I am sending you a writeup of the idea. I believe that the possibility that the assassin acted through a post-hypnotic suggestion should be considered by the Bureau.

The above is admitted entirely as a speculation which can explain many of the aspects of the assassination, including the alleged man's denial of implication.

speculations: Brainwashing is an accepted weapon in the cold war. Could not this also include hypnotism?

speculation: The simplest plot to assassinate would involve the above use of hypnotism. The suggestion may be implanted in the patient's mind at a distance and at a time long preceding the execution of the compulsive act. Further, very little danger of implication exists for the true perpetrator. Either the assassin is killed, or at worst he claims at a trial that he acted as a person under hypnosis, an unlikely event. Even so, it would be regarded as a device to displace a sane responsibility for the act.

Fact: The above use of hypnotism is not without examples. The standard fictional works on hypnotism make use of the device. An actual example occurred in Tulsa, Oklahoma some twenty years ago through the operations of a "hex" woman who had several young women under her control.

speculation: Hypnotism is a very potent, insidious, dangerous weapon. It is ideally adapted to plots in which the mission of a group must be entrusted to single agents. The agent of the mission may be an agent without his own knowledge or even consent. This use of hypnotism is quite rightly played down by those who are well versed in its use.

Fact: The assassin was not entirely a lone wolf. He was a member of a Pro-Castro group, and he had been to Russia and had applied for citizenship there.

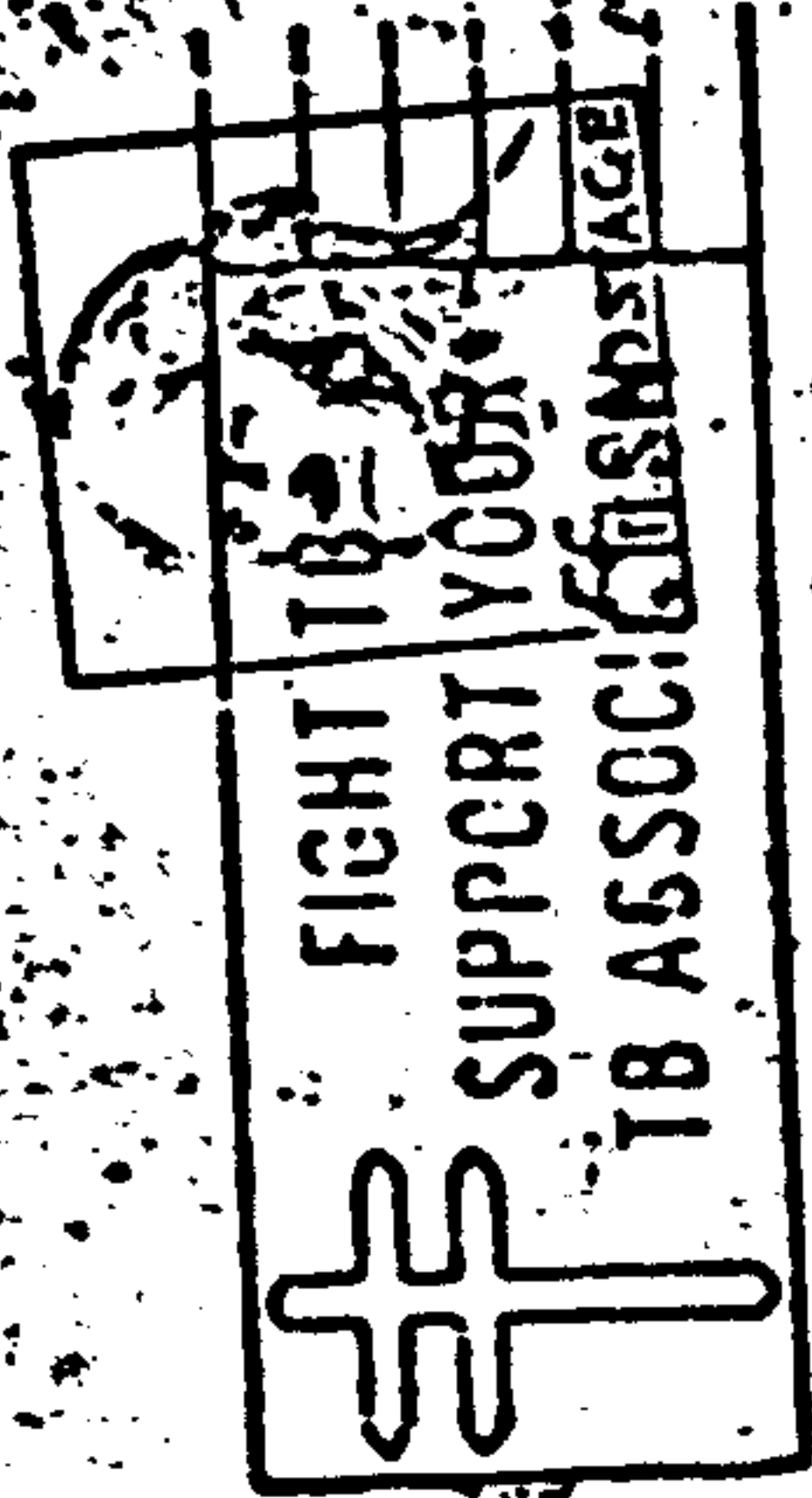
speculation: Hypnotists are able to suggest that a patient perform certain acts after the trance to which he has been subjected is ended. Such an act is performed compulsively and without remembrance of instructions received during the trance. The only restriction on the magnitude of such an act is that such an act must not violate the conscience of the patient. If a person is capable of murder under normal operation of his mind, he will perform murder under post-hypnotic suggestion.

Fact: Accounts of Lee Oswald, the assassin, indicate that he operated alone, without a conspiracy, as a single agent.

The assassination of President John F. Kennedy on November 22, 1963 may be explained as the work of a man obeying a compulsion or post-hypnotic suggestion.

MIZELL related that on November 22, 1963, he and Specialist DONALD LESTER HUMMER spent the entire morning, from approximately 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., preparing a ration request for battalion rations and at about 9:30 a.m. left their Service Battery unit for the Class 1 First Armored Division ration breakdown to turn in a head count and pick up the ration request for the 73rd Artillery, First Battalion. He stated they thereafter returned to the Service Battery mess hall at about 11:00 a.m. to eat the noon meal. He continued that at approximately 11:30 a.m. both he and HUMMER completed their noon meal, and HUMMER then departed for his barracks while MIZELL went to the dayroom of the Service Battery until approximately 12:20 p.m. when the unit gathered for the afternoon formation. Specialist E-4 MIZELL stated that immediately after the formation, First Sergeant NOVENCIDO of Service Battery, First Battalion, 73rd Artillery, First Armored Division, advised Specialist HUMMER that he was to report to the First Armored Division Finance Office to obtain his travel allowance to Fort Sheridan, Illinois, in connection with his discharge. Specialist MIZELL stated that he then accompanied HUMMER to the First Armored Division Finance Office, arriving there at approximately 12:45 p.m. on November 22, 1963, and waited for HUMMER in the

unit vehicle while HUMMER processed through the Finance Office and obtained his advanced travel allowance. MIZELL stated that HUMMER returned to the vehicle at approximately 1:15 p.m. and that HUMMER and he then drove to the First Armored Division batteries "A" and "D" consolidated messes to deliver rations to those units.

MIZELL advised that it was at this time that he learned from one of the mess sergeants of the "A" and "D" Consolidated Mess that President JOHN F. KENNEDY was dead as a result of an assassin's rifle wounds. MIZELL stated that HUMMER then remarked that he had forgotten to mention that he had heard on the radio while in the Finance Office that KENNEDY had been shot; however, he had not known how serious the wounds were that KENNEDY had sustained.

MIZELL related that after delivering rations to the "A" and "D" Batteries, he and HUMMER then went to the "S" and "C" Batteries messes to deliver rations, having completed their run of deliveries for the rations some time between 2:30 and 3:00 p.m.

Specialist E-4 MIZELL advised that he knew nothing specific of DONALD LESTER HUMMER's personal or social life nor of his political beliefs or feelings toward the Kennedy Administration and the policies carried out by that administration, but he did recall that in the discussion of KENNEDY's assassination, HUMMER did remark that the only thing he had against KENNEDY was that KENNEDY was responsible for his (HUMMER's) being drafted into the Army.

Major RICHARD J. PREUSS, 079035, Finance Officer, First Armored Division Finance Office, Fort Hood, Texas, advised on December 2, 1963, that Specialist E-4 DONALD L. HUMMER, US 55709285, was paid \$67.38 advanced travel allowance to Fort Sheridan, Illinois, under Voucher No. 600567.

Major PREUSS informed that the voucher authorizing the advanced travel allowance was dated November 14, 1963, and was certified by the Personnel Officer, JOE L. DIAL, a Chief Warrant Officer (W-4), but that the allowance of \$67.38 was paid to HUMMER on November 22, 1963. Major PREUSS stated that it was definite as to the date that Specialist HUMMER was paid
