(6) Pages 69 and 71 - Roger Craig, Deputy Sheriff, has furnished information which does not appear to tie in with other developments in this case, particularly with regard to his "positive" identification of Oswald getting into a white van immediately after the shooting. It could appear that some statement as to Craig's reliability would be in order inasmuch as his earlier identification of the driver of this vehicle was "a Negro" and was later changed to a white male. It is necessary he should be interviewed to clarify his statements.

(5) Page 48 - Mr. Charles Hester was interviewed on 11-24-63, and indicated he was close to the Presidential motorcade when the President was shot. If not already done his wife Patricia who accompanied him should also be interviewed.

(4) Page 46 - Mr. Jack Franzen was interviewed on 11-22-63, and indicated he was in close proximity to the Presidential motorcade when the President was shot. It is noted Mr. Franzen's wife was with him at that time, but it does not appear she was interviewed. If not already done, she should be interviewed.

(3) Pages 36 and 37 - Mary Keenan during interview on 11-22-63, indicated she furnished a photograph to Secret Service Agents John Joe Kealey and Bill Patterson on 11-22-63. It is not clear whether this photograph was reviewed by Bureau Agents to determine its pertinency to this case. Advise.

(12) Page 371 - Mr. William H. Sholly during interview states on the morning of 11-22-63, Gerald appeared at work as usual. I know your investigation established that he or any other individual carrying the brief paper bag believed to have contained the radio used in the assassination. Further, you should determine whether there is any set number of signs in by employees and insure that individuals signing in at about the same time as Gerald are appropriately interviewed. It would appear logical that all employees working at the Texas School Book Depository Building on 11-22-63, should be interviewed therefor direct your investigative efforts accordingly.

(14) Pages 362, 363 and 364 - Your attention is directed to the interview of Frank Plazo, FBI Agent and particularly Albert G. Record. As you are aware investigation failed to indicate Gerald had any ability to operate a motor vehicle or that he had a license. The statements attributed to Record indicate the subject was capable of driving at speeds of 45 to 55 miles per hour. It would be in complete disagreement with the known facts. The purpose of these individuals furnishing this information is not known, however, the possibility should not be overlooked that they furnished information to the FBI for some purpose. Information obtained and the signed statement obtained and the possible use of the photograph considered. It is possible a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1001 exists.

(13) Page 336 - Mr. O. V. Campbell during interview on 11-26-63, in part stated that while he did not observe anyone fire any shots from the building there was an individual working a construction-type hat who indicated he had seen an individual fire from the building and that this individual was being interviewed by a police officer who was apparently taking his name. It is not already done efforts should be made to locate and interview this construction worker.

It is very possible that referenced report and other subsequent reports may be disseminated outside of the Bureau and it is, therefore, requested that all copies contained therein be accurate. You should insure that this report is thoroughly reviewed as to content and structure and any changes necessitated promptly handled.

(17) Page 417 - The information furnished by Ralph Leon dates does not appear to be completely truthful. You should consider potential commission of factors, the containing of a signed statement from him and the possibility of a violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1001.

(16) Page 395 - In connection with the information furnished by Mr. Dick Lydell of the Irving Sport Shop you should insure appropriate checks are made to determine if there are any other individuals in the Irving, Texas, Dallas, Texas, area with the last name of "Gould" who could have bought the services of the Irving Sport Shop. If so, they should be interviewed so as to resolve this information.

Pages 21839-21845. Congressman Goodell, (R) New York, spoke concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. He pointed out that it was his hope that Congress would not start running in all directions with various committees investigating this tragic event. Mr. Goodell stated "I hope that we will have a joint committee established at the highest level which can, with prestige and with dignity, explore all the facts, implications, and significance of those dreadful occurrences and report openly to the country and to the world. . . . This is a matter that deserves attention at the very highest level of our Government." Mr. Goodell included several newspaper articles and editorials with his remarks. Included in this material was an article written by Jim G. Lucas entitled "FBI Wants To Know—Where Did Oswald Get Money To Live On?" which was published in the Washington Daily News on November 27, 1963.

# FBI, Secret Service Need Study

There are three Government agencies that are sacrosanct far as congressional in- vention or criticism is con- sidered: the Secret Service and Central Intelligence Agency. In the interest of pro- tecting the life of the President, however, it is my belief that a rigorous search of the first two should be undertaken. Here are some facts that have been spent in doing so.

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The Dallas Police—I was in Dallas on the tragic day President Kennedy was shot. I was not there when his alleged assassin, Lee Oswald, was shot. But newsmen who were on the scene in the basement of the Dallas Police Station inform me that it is inconceivable that the police did not know Jack Ruby was inside.

It's true that there has been long-standing jealousy between the FBI and the Secret Service. Sometimes they act almost as if they don't speak. But they should stop squabbling over jurisdiction and headlines, at least where the life of the President is concerned.

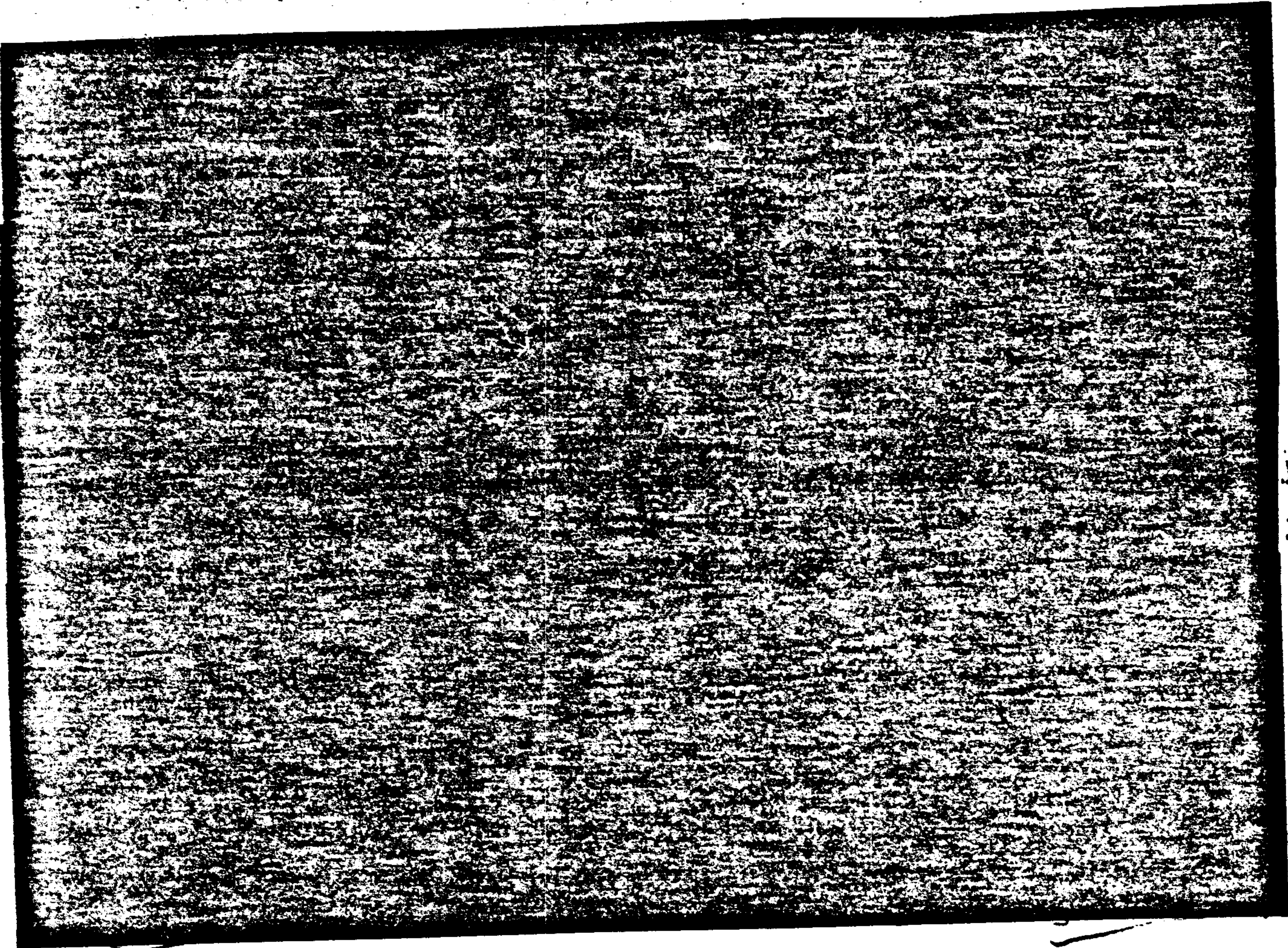

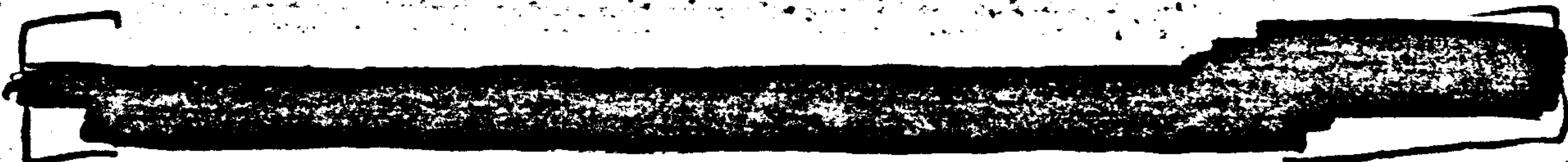

Mr. Cook then advised that Tobin told Cook that he (Tobin) had been called by the FBI in Dallas or somewhere just not to fill up the waters because the FBI was in the process of preparing a report for the President.

I then said I thought we should handle it as Mr. Berlin suggested; that I would get in touch with Mr. Lyman; that we will find out what Montgomery knew; and that we will follow up and see Tobin in a evening.

Mr. Berlin then suggested I not use his name or Montgomery's name; that we just ask him (Tobin) to give our man the story and see if he can develop it.

I indicated I would like to have our Agent in Charge, Mr. Lyman, personally see this Mr. Tobin. Mr. Berlin suggested Mr. Lyman first contact Mr. Montgomery. I then asked if he knew whether Montgomery knows about this job. He did not.
