**ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY,
11/22/63, DALLAS, TEXAS**

[redacted] an employee of [redacted], Detroit, Mich., furnished the following information 12/3/63, and asked that his identity be kept confidential.

[redacted] reported [redacted] DELLA (Mrs. EARL) LIVELY who is employed as a secretary by Norsworthy-Mercer, Inc., Dallas, Texas. EARL LIVELY is described by [redacted] as a member of the John Birch Society, a friend of DAN SMOOT and General WALKER. [redacted] said LIVELY was a news commentator for a small Dallas radio station, a writer for the "American Mercury" magazine, a Major of the Air National Guard, a jet pilot and had attended the Army Staff Command College at Fort Benning, Ga. [redacted] said LIVELY had written a book or an account of the events at the University of Mississippi for a New York publishing house whose identity was unknown but the book had been withdrawn by the unknown publisher, who gave as an excuse that it appeared too long after the Mississippi events. According to [redacted] LIVELY has been asked by the unknown publisher to "Go behind the scenes and write the true story of the events in Dallas leading up to and including the assassination of the President which would be contrary to the story published by the FBI."

[redacted] said he was convinced both Mr. and Mrs. LIVELY are loyal American citizens, but that they are [redacted]

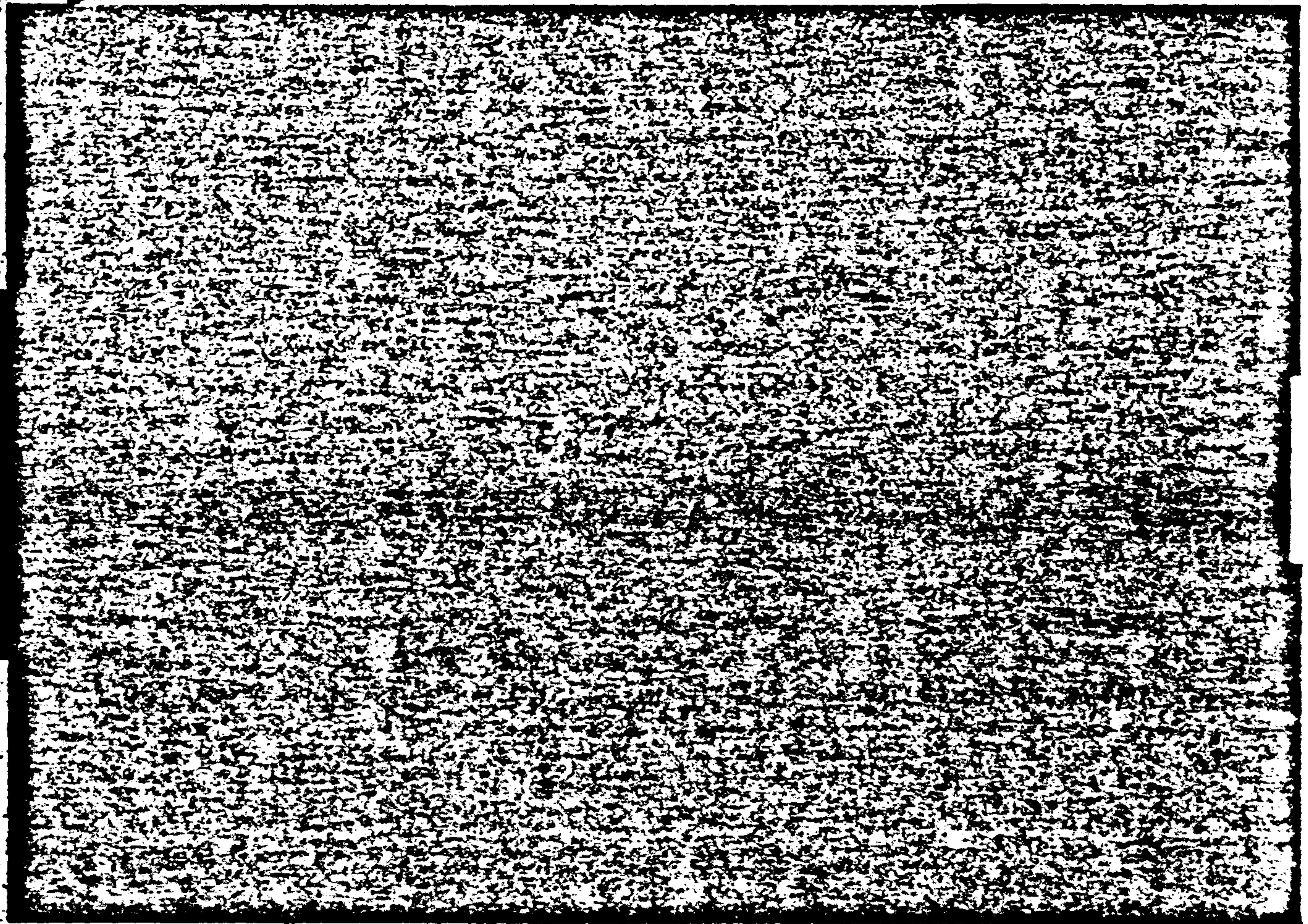

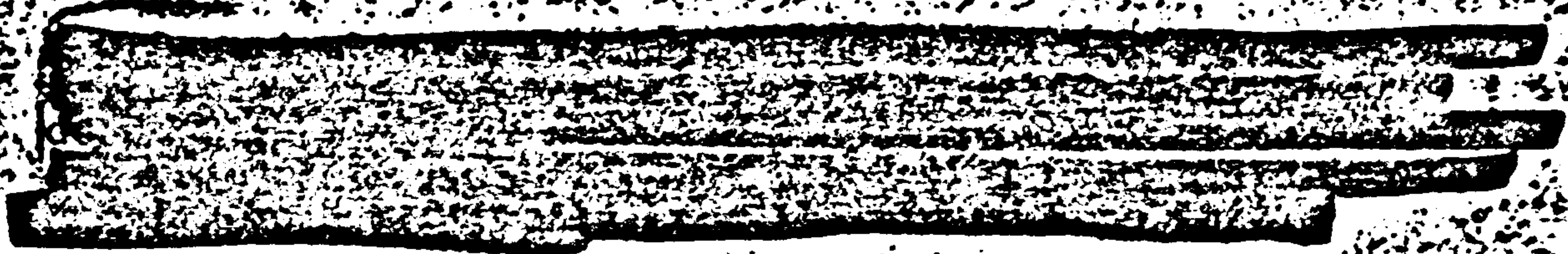

[redacted] mentioned a full page advertisement which had appeared in the "Dallas News" on 11/22/63, which had welcomed President KENNEDY to Dallas and has asked many questions of him which were bitter criticisms of the KENNEDY policy. [redacted] speculated that this ad could possibly have been written in the offices of Kersworthy-Kerker, Inc., Dallas, Texas. [redacted] gave no reason for this opinion. He characterized it as a "hunch." This ad was reported to have been placed by a BERNARD WEISSMAN and said to have cost \$1,464.00. Information concerning the ad was contained in an article appearing in the "Detroit News" dated 12/2/63, written by JAMES E. CLAYTON, Los Angeles Times - Washington Post News Service.

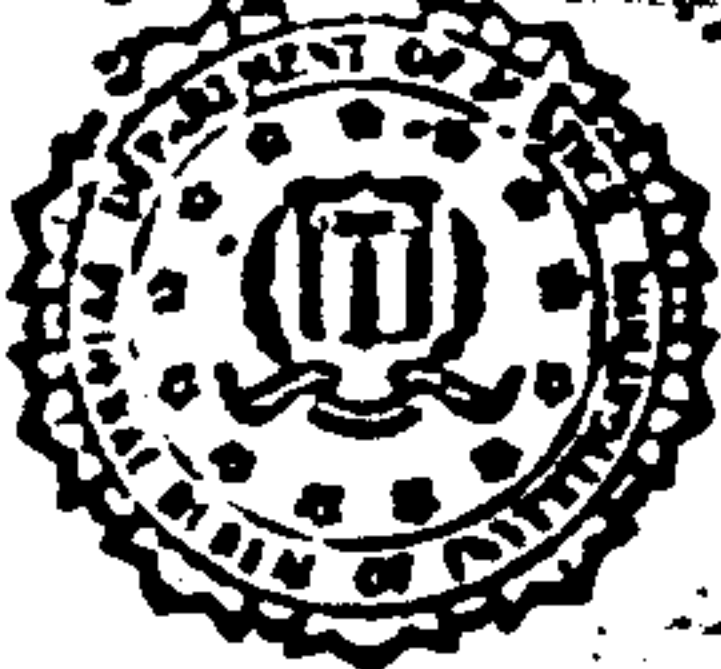

On December 2, 1963, [REDACTED] Hamilton, Ohio, advised that while at Hoppies Garden, 902 Greenwood Avenue, Hamilton, between 7:30 and 8:15 P.M., on December 1, 1963, he was at the bar with the owner and bartender, Walter Newman, Lester Long, Jr., 911 Greenwood Avenue, and captioned individual, who resides at 920 Vine Street, Hamilton.

[REDACTED] was seated towards the end of the bar while Edward Helton was standing at the extreme end of the bar.

[REDACTED] Hamilton, did not know Helton and made no conversation with him, but Helton commented [REDACTED], "They spent one and a half million dollars to get rid of Kennedy". [REDACTED] made no comment and prepared to go to another part of the bar when Helton stated, "I contributed \$100.00 of the one and a half million". [REDACTED] joined Lester Long, Jr. farther down the bar. Helton walked over to them and said it would take four million to get rid of "Johnson". [REDACTED] said that he and Long ignored Helton, who then returned to his end of the bar and announced that he would bet \$50.00 that "Johnson" would not finish his term. Walter Newman who overheard this remark, threw \$50.00 on the bar in front of Helton and said, "Put your money where your mouth is". Helton replied that he did not really want to bet.

[REDACTED] stated that Helton was sipping 3.2 per cent beer and was still there when he, [REDACTED] left.

On December 2, 1963, Walter Newman advised that Helton, a neighborhood resident, has a reputation for being a braggard and a "pop off". He is a loner and has no close

friends or associates. He was in Hoppies Garden from 7:30 to 8:30 P.M., December 1, 1963, at which time Newman overheard Helton announce that he would bet \$50.00 that President Johnson would not complete his term. Newman stated he immediately covered the bet and Helton backed down. Newman advised that Helton had a total of three beers while at the bar, but Newman heard no other comment by Helton who left shortly thereafter.

Mr. Newman stated he would not consider statements by Helton to be responsible, that Helton has been in no trouble to his knowledge, holds membership in the Monkeys Mutual Aid Society of Hamilton, which is a social fraternal organization that provides insurance benefits. He further stated that there is no question as to the loyalty of the members of this organization and that he has never had reason to suspect the loyalty of Helton.

On December 2, 1963, Edward Richard Helton was interviewed at his residence, 920 Vine Street, Hamilton, Ohio, and furnished the following information:

On December 1, 1963, he spent the entire day at the Monkeys Mutual Aid Society, 303 Third Street, Hamilton, Ohio. He advised he was alone and consumed one quart of whiskey while there. From this location he went to Hoppies Garden around 7:30 P.M. and was there for 30 to 60 minutes. He stated he may have made statements to the effect that it cost one and a half million dollars to get rid of President Kennedy, that he had contributed \$100.00 of this amount, that it would take four million to get rid of President Johnson, and that he would bet \$50.00 that President Johnson did not finish his term. He said he does not recall having made such statements, had no prerogative to make such statements and that he frequently makes comments while drunk without knowing what he says.

He does not belong to any organization other than Monkeys Mutual Aid Society. He said he considers himself a completely loyal, patriotic, American citizen and has the greatest respect for the President of the United States and other Government authorities.

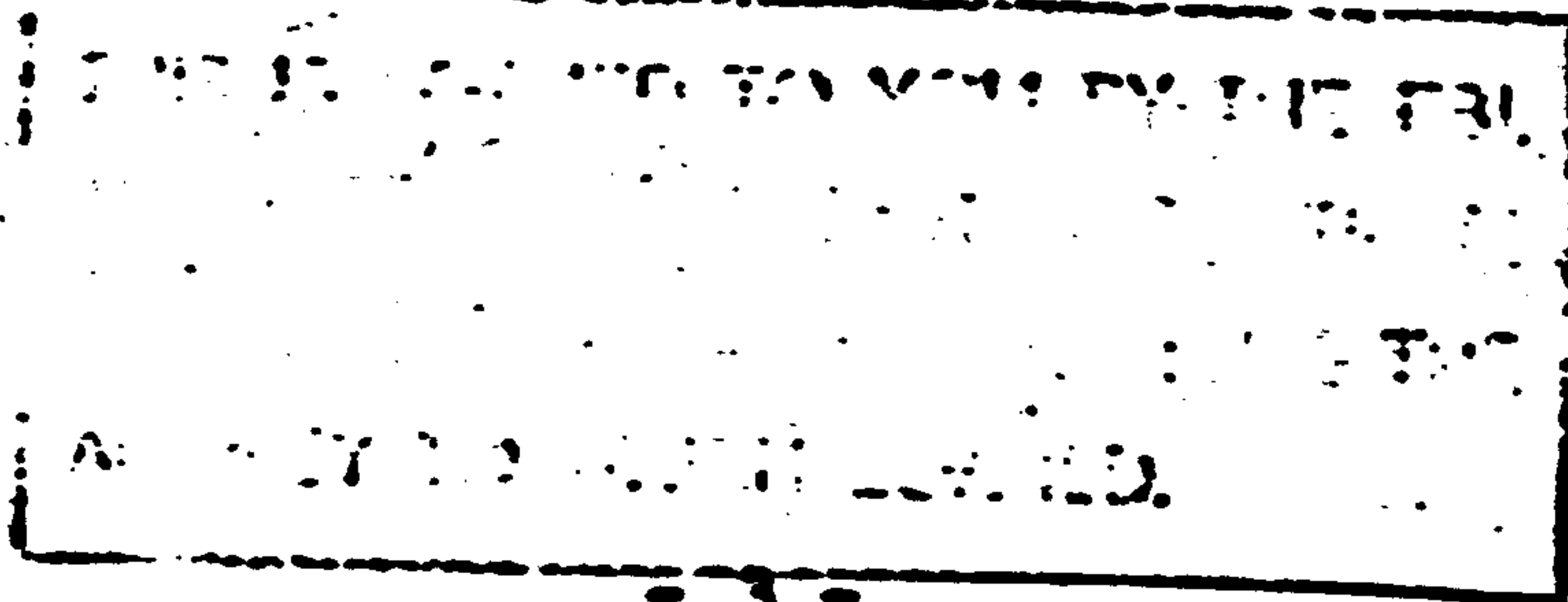
He stated that if comments were made by him that it would be without meaning, that he frequently attempts to upset Walter Newman while in Hoppies Garden and may have remarked as above for this purpose. He has never had \$100.00 to contribute to any cause nor has he had \$50.00 to bet on anything. He said he is employed at General Electric Corporation, Evendale, Ohio, as a millwright in the Maintenance Department where they do general machinery repair work and fence building. He is employed in Building 700 and has identification card number 6993. He works on the 7:00 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. shift, and has been with General Electric since 1951.

Helton could furnish no information concerning former President John F. Kennedy's assassination, Lee Harvey Oswald, or Jack Rubenstein, and stated he does not know and is not acquainted with either Oswald or Rubenstein.

He stated that the Legat, Mexico, advised the bus lists for these dates had been sent from the Mexico City Office of that company to their headquarters in Piedras Negras, Mexico.

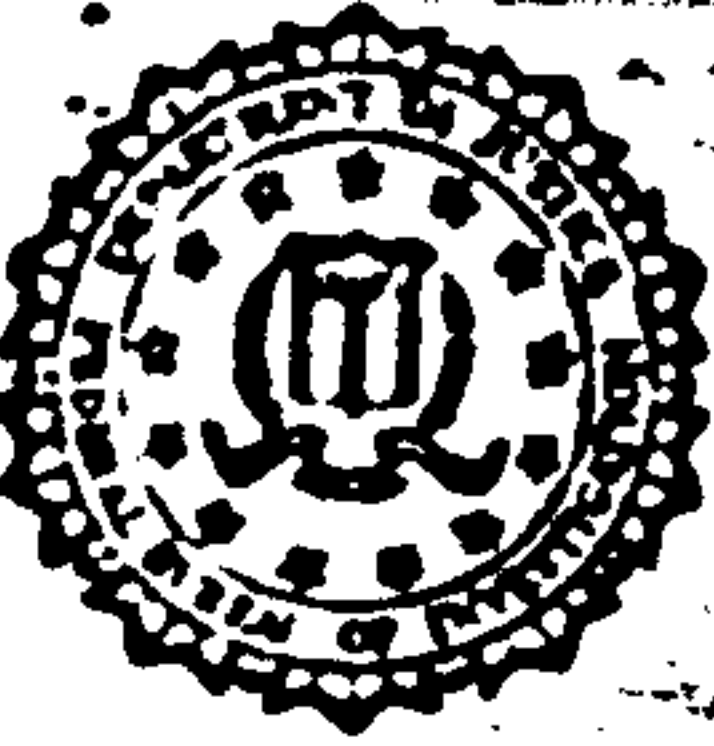

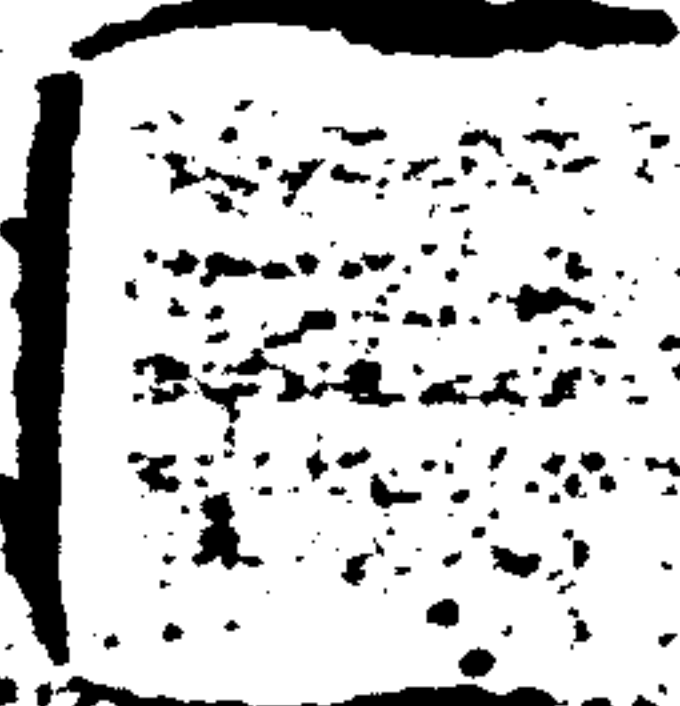

On November 29, 1963, [redacted]

[redacted] Austin, Texas, home address [redacted] Austin, Texas, telephonically advised SA H. T. BURK, that he had heard a rumor to the effect that Dr. JAMES W. LASSITER, M.C., 2901 Red River Street, Austin, Texas, home address 4708 Highland Terrace, had been making remarks concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY.

According to [redacted] LASSITER was making the general statement substantially as follows, that there was nothing wrong about the assassination of President KENNEDY due to the fact that Capital Punishment was legal in the state of Texas and that President KENNEDY had been guilty of treason and therefore he saw no reason why the assassination should be considered anything other than "legal execution."

Supposedly LASSITER had also referred to the assassination as "organized public execution."

[redacted] advised that he did not hear LASSITER make these remarks but to the best source he could ascertain he felt that a Dr. JEROME RAVEL had supposedly heard LASSITER make such remarks in the St. Davis Hospital sometime in the past two or three days.

Records of the U. S. Consulate, Piedras
Negras, Mexico, reflect that SAMUEL CURTIS, a white
male, born April 24, 1901, at New York City, received
assistance as an American citizen after he had been
detained by the Mexican Customs November 9, 1963,
for attempting to take into Mexico a number of
items which appeared to be not for his personal
use. He furnished his address as 17 Lakeview,
Long Branch, New Jersey, and was traveling with his
wife, EDNA, in a 1961 Chevrolet station wagon,
with 1963 New Jersey license BCV 819. The U. S.
Consulate was requested to furnish assistance by
the Mexican Consul at Eagle Pass, Texas, who stated
he had been requested to assist by the Mexican
Consul General of New York City, EUGENIO V. PESQUEIRA.

Chas. T. ... Curtis - XU!
A tourist representative in Piedras Negras,
HECTOR CHARLES, had intervened in the matter, and
possibly it was through his efforts that the Mexican
Consul was called in the matter since the Mexican
Customs at one point in the investigation had planned
to file formal charges against CURTIS for attempting
to smuggle. Among the items which appeared prohibited
were seven new telephones, a new electric oven, several
new blankets, dolls, and three used rifles, Russian-
made of a military type. After Consular intervention
CURTIS and his wife were permitted to continue their
trip to Mexico November 12, 1963, but were prohibited
from taking the goods which appeared not to be for
their personal use, including blankets, dolls, the
new oven, and the telephones and rifles.

Some of the items were left with the Chamber
of Commerce in Eagle Pass, Texas.

Review of the Mexican Customs records, November 27, 1963, reflected that all of the items had been turned back to CURTIS and receipted for by him. However, HECTOR CHARLES advised that during the period of time that he was assisting CURTIS with the Mexican Customs, he determined that the three rifles, although turned back to CURTIS, were not actually taken by him but given by him to the Mexican Customs officers. This was also true of seven new telephones which he had since CURTIS indicated he did not want to return these items to Eagle Pass, Texas.

CHARLES, on November 27, 1963, obtained one of the Russian-made rifles which he stated had belonged to CURTIS. He stated that CURTIS, in discussing the rifles, stated he had bought them for approximately \$7.00 each, and intended to give them to the sons of some friends of his at Tasco, Mexico. All of the three rifles were similar in appearance and of the same make. It was noted that they had the hammer and sickle of the Russians stamped on the breech but there was no brand name on the rifle. There was a date stamp, 1936, and CHARLES stated that he recalled all of the rifles had this date stamped on them. The stock appeared to be refinished, and the rifle was of an old-type military rifle, apparently rebuilt since the barrel had Serial Number 195748, the bolt had Serial Number 19285, and the magazine had Serial Number 158825. CHARLES stated that CURTIS and his wife planned to return to Long Branch, New Jersey, where CURTIS had been employed for approximately forty years by the Bell Telephone Company and had to be at work on December 1, 1963. He planned to return through Eagle Pass, Texas, and pick up the items which he had left with the Chamber of Commerce. He stated that he had been taking a vacation in Mexico for the past eighteen years and that was the purpose of the trip at the time that he had difficulty with Mexican Customs.

A search of the FBI National Stolen Property file relating to the above-listed serial numbers on this rifle met with negative results.

[REDACTED] advised that the records of the Identification Division revealed that GLADYS CORSER of 2103 Kenwood, Austin, Texas, does not have any criminal record in their files but the files do contain a record of GLADYS CORSER having been fingerprinted as a City applicant and [REDACTED] knows GLADYS CORSER to be presently employed as a Secretary in the office of the Fire Marshal, City of Austin, which office is located immediately to the rear of the Identification Division. [REDACTED] likewise pointed out that CORSER when fingerprinted as a City applicant had her fingerprints sent to Texas Department of Public Safety, Austin, and to the FBI, Washington, D.C., and the reply from these two agencies both came back indicating that GLADYS CORSER had no prior fingerprint record with either of these agencies.

On December 3, 1963, [REDACTED] furnished information from the files of the Retail Merchants Association indicating the following information concerning the individuals listed below:

GEORGE H. P. SHOWALTER, JR., 11402 Hilltop, had a satisfactory credit record and was shown to be employed by the Firm Foundation Company of Austin, Texas.

JOHN C. MACEY, 810 West 30 1/2 Street, was shown to have a satisfactory credit record and is employed by the U. S. Government in the Department of Agriculture.

JACK H. SUCKE, 2350 West 9 1/2 Street, has a satisfactory credit record and is employed as an insurance agent for the All American Life Casualty Company.

FORREST PORCH, 6114 Riverside Drive, has a satisfactory credit record and is employed as a crain operator having been known to Retail Merchants Association since March of 1961.

JIM HAWLEY, 1401 Enfield Road, has a satisfactory credit record and is employed as an Assistant Cashier at the Austin National Bank, Austin, Texas. He is also known as JAMES HAWLEY.

DAVIS DUSENBERY who has a satisfactory credit record and is shown to be a student at the University of Texas.

L. R. RANDERSON, 3108 Pecan Springs Road, has a satisfactory credit record and is shown to be a retired employee of the U. S. Postal Service.

has a satisfactory credit record and was employed by
the Federal Aviation Agency until January of 1962 and
is presently employed by the A. E. Beddow Real Estate
Agency as a salesman.

GLADYS CORSER, 2103 Kenwood, was shown
a satisfactory credit record and was shown to be
presently employed in the office of the Fire
Marshal, City of Austin.

Nothing of an unfavorable nature concerning
either of the individuals mentioned above was contained
in the files of the Retail Merchants Association.

It is to be noted that on November 9, 1962,
~~_____~~ Aust.
~~_____~~ informed an agent of the FBI that he has known
SUCKE for a number of years. He stated that SUCKE is
considered an extremist in that he is very outspoken in
criticism of the United States Government, particularly the
Government's stand on communism. He feels that the U. S.
Government should take a stronger stand against combating
communism. ~~_____~~ stated that SUCKE apparently has
numerous followers and receives contributions from many
people for his publication "Freedom Views," a weekly
newspaper. ~~_____~~ stated that he ~~_____~~ does not
agree with SUCKE and feels SUCKE is too extreme and inclined
to call names without any basis.

On November 9, 1962, Mr. ~~_____~~
~~_____~~ informed that he has known SUCKE for several
years. He stated apparently SUCKE is a successful
insurance man and spends a great deal of time in connection
with his anti-communist work. He stated SUCKE is contro-
versial in that SUCKE is continually criticizing the United
States Government, particularly the present administration.

SUCKE feels that the Government should do more in fighting communism. He stated SUCH has a large following and many are prominent businessmen in Austin, Texas. Mr. ~~XXXXXX~~ stated that he has never heard anyone question SUCKE's character or SUCKE's loyalty to the United States.

On November 9, 1962, [Colonel HOMER GARRISON] Director, Texas Department of Public Safety, informed he has known SUCKE for many years. He stated that he feels SUCKE is very sincere in his (SUCKE's) efforts to combat communism although he may be too extreme in his approach. He stated that SUCKE is regarded as a good citizen in Austin and never knew anyone to question SUCKE's character or SUCKE's loyalty to the United States.

On November 9, 1962, [Mr. OTIS CLAR] Intelligence Section, Texas Department of Public Safety, reviewed the files of the Intelligence Section which reflected that SUCKE is general chairman, Austin Anti-Communism League, Box 983, Austin, Texas. The file reflects that SUCKE announced JOHN DRAKEFORD as an outstanding speaker on communism in Austin, Texas, in January, 1962. DRAKEFORD was sponsored by the Austin Anti-Communism League.

[Mr. CLAR] stated that SUCKE publishes "Freedom Views," a four-page weekly pamphlet which has the statement on it "dedicated to preserving our American Heritage." [Mr. CLAR] stated that "Freedom Views" is anti-communist and published by the Austin Anti-Communism League with JACK H. SUCKE as Editor and General Chairman.

[Mr. CLAR] stated that in November 1961, the Austin Chamber of Commerce, Austin, Texas, protested that SUCKE had used the Chamber of Commerce membership list in promoting a speech by ROBERT WELCH, Founder of the John Birch Society.

[Mr. CLAR] stated that apparently SUCKE is overzealous on occasion but apparently his intentions are good. He stated that many prominent people are listed as supporters of the Austin Anti-Communism League. [Mr. CLAR] stated that the records of the Intelligence Section reflect nothing unfavorable concerning SUCKE's character or his loyalty to the United States.

On November 9, 1967, [REDACTED] *NO INDEX*
Retail Merchants Association, Capital National Bank Building, informed that SUCKE has been known in the Merchants Association files since January, 1935. She stated that his file was brought up to date of 1962. SUCKE is listed as being in the insurance business since 1938 with offices at the present time at 104 Perry Brooks Building, Austin, Texas. The record reflects that SUCKE has one past-due account in 1955 in the amount of \$165.00. All other accounts are very satisfactory. The records fail to reflect that SUCKE has ever had a judgment or a court action filed against him in Travis County, Austin, Texas.

On November 9, 1967, Mr. HAROLD HOFMEISTER, Identification Division, Austin Police Department, informed that there is no arrest record in the files of the Identification Division identifiable with SUCKE or his wife.
