Dear President Ford:

On November 4, 1975, Robert Metz, representing an organization out of Boston looking into the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy, Senator Robert F. Kennedy, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and the attempted assassination of Governor George Wallace, spoke to an audience of at least 1,500 people, made up of students and townspeople, on the possibilities of a conspiracy and cover-up of the killing of President Kennedy. His presentation of slides and oral expertise left most of the crowd in a state of shock and amazement.

It is in the opinion of the University of Wisconsin-Platteville's Student Senate, from the evidence shown, that the Warren Commission made a rushed judgement, that they were not supplied with truthful evidence given to them by the FBI, that the Commission did not carefully study key witnesses, that the strange number of deaths connected to the assassination seems to lead to some type of cover-up, and that the evidence now known to the American public warrants a new investigation into the killing.

Therefore, it is our wish as representatives of our students and as citizens of this country to want and to demand a better answer to that ugly scene in Dallas twelve years ago. We are concerned, like millions of other fellow Americans, as to whom is running this country--the people, or special interest groups. We await your reply!

Dear Mr. Levi;

After viewing a recent inquiry conducted by a national news agency, I find that there was a lot of material left out, for one reason or another, to help control the facts of the John Kennedy assassination.

Recently, there was a murder in Chicago. Sam Giacani was killed to keep him from talking to anyone about his part involving him with factions of the Castro power structure and any involvement of the C.I.A. with that group. I have a name: [REDACTED] Check this name with arrest records in Oak Park Illinois. SHE was an associate of Giacani and a gun connection for him and other members of organized crime in that area. That name will produce some results that have never been brought out but I might add, don't let the agency that investigates this information be connected with the C.I.A. OR the F.B.I.

I sincerely hope the information will help bring new light to the investigation into the killing of John Kennedy. I also hope that this information has reached hands that can be trusted and not suppressed, as has so much other material. I cannot trust the F.B.I. or the C.I.A. so that is why I have shown you. In this case, criminals are allowed to investigate themselves and the results are obvious.

On referral from the Director's Office, Deputy Assistant Director Homer A. Boynton talked to John J. McCrory on December 3, 1975. McCrory advised that television station KDFW-TV had received from an anonymous contributor an employment application for Lee Harvey Oswald at the Devilbiss Company, Toledo, Ohio. McCrory indicated that there was something significant about this employment application but he declined to discuss details. He stated that Station KDFW-TV was going to announce on its evening news, 12/3/75, that it had this employment application. McCrory stated that the television station felt that the employment application of Oswald was important because its existence was mentioned nowhere in the Warren Commission report, although the FBI had obtained the application a few days after the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in November, 1963.

The Dallas Office was immediately contacted and subsequently advised that the employment application had been obtained by the Bureau and subsequently included in a report which had been furnished to the Warren Commission. McCrory was immediately advised of the foregoing and he stated that in view of the fact that the information had been furnished to the Warren Commission the television station would not go with the story on its evening news. McCrory stated that he would furnish the FBI with the proposed text of their evening news announcement, as well as a copy of the employment application, both of which are attached hereto.

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Eyewitness News has obtained a job application that reveals some activities of Lee Harvey Oswald in the days prior to the assassination of President Kennedy in Dallas. The application had not been made public before.

The application was made with a Dallas company a few weeks before the assassination. It is unique in that it apparently is mentioned nowhere in the Warren Commission Report, although the FBI purportedly picked it up from the company a few days after the assassination.

The signature on the application appears similar to Oswald's signature on documents taken from the Warren Commission Report. Channel 4 Eyewitness News authorized a Dallas handwriting expert to compare the signatures, but he was unable to render a conclusive opinion because of the poor quality of the documents. However, present-day employees of the company in question say it is common knowledge among them that Oswald did make the application a few weeks before the assassination.

Eyewitness News obtained the new document from a source who wishes to remain anonymous. There is no startling new information in it, but there are some unusual things about it.

For one, it fails to mention the two Oswald children. Under the category of dependents, Oswald mentioned only his wife Marina.



Oswald also misrepresents his military service, claiming he was in the service from 1959 to 1962. Actually, the Marines discharged him in 1959, and he was in the Soviet Union until 1962.

Oswald's application is also vague about his previous employers. He does mention two, but he omits his whereabouts during the late spring and early summer of 1963.

It was during that time that he lived and worked in New Orleans, where he campaigned for the "Fair Play for Cuba Committee." He also traveled to Mexico during that period, ostensibly seeking a visa for a trip to Cuba.

Oswald returned to Dallas in October of 1963, went to work at the Texas Schoolbook Depository on October 16th and according to our source, made this newly-discovered employment application about two weeks before the assassination. The application itself is undated. The company is located in an industrial district -- away from downtown Dallas, but relatively close to the Trade Mart where President Kennedy was to speak during his Dallas visit.

Our source says the name Oswald meant nothing at the time the application was made -- only later when he was arrested and named as the assassin. He had been denied the job, the application filed as a matter of



routine and according to our source, forgotten about until after the assassination when FBI agents showed up and asked for the application.

The document apparently was not made public before now and did not turn up in the Warren Commission Report sections on Oswald's biography and employment. The Report does mention several other Oswald attempts to find employment in Dallas, and Marina Oswald's testimony before the Commission was that her husband was looking for another job after he went to work at the Schoolbook Depository.

The Report also contains a Dallas street map taken from Oswald's apartment. A mark had been made on the map in the area of the company in question, and some questions about the mark were put to witnesses before the Commission.

An FBI source says the document was submitted to the Warren Commission during its investigation, but the source says that all documents submitted were not published in the final Warren Commission Report.

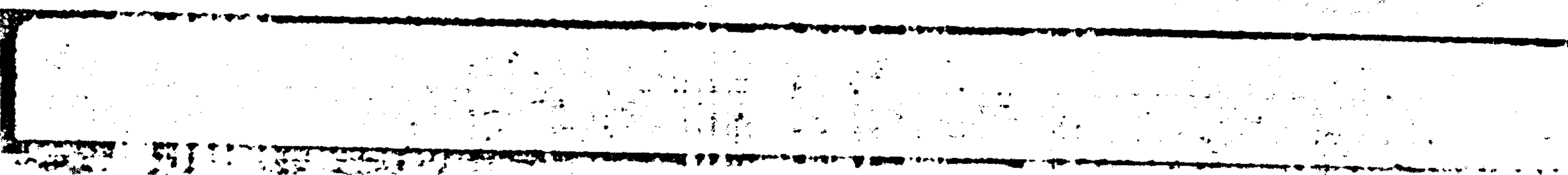

On 11/21/75 retired Bureau official James R. Malley telephonically advised that he had been earlier alerted by Mr. Paul Daly of the Office of Legal Counsel that he, Malley, would be receiving a request by the Senate Select Committee for Intelligence Activities concerning an interview with regard to Malley's involvement in the investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy. (Mr. Malley at the time was Inspector - Number One Man, General Investigative Division, and had the responsibility of liaison between the FBI and the Warren Commission.)

Malley advised that he has now received a telephone call from a Mr. Wallich (phonetic) of the staff of the Senate Select Committee who stated he desired to interview Malley on Tuesday, 11/25/75, and requested that Malley advise Wallich on Monday as to a convenient time for the interview.

Malley stated that Mr. Daly had earlier indicated that the Office of Legal Counsel would desire to talk with him prior to any interview of Malley by the Committee. Malley stated Daly was on leave today and he wanted to insure that the Bureau was aware of this requested interview by the Senate Select Committee. Malley was advised that Inspector Hotis would be in touch with him to make arrangements concerning this matter. Malley indicated that he would be available most any time this coming weekend or on Monday morning, 11/24/75, for consultation.

During my absence from the office on 11/20/75, former Inspector James R. Malley telephonically contacted the office and furnished the following information to I. Gaynelle Eggleston, Administrative Assistant:

Mr. Malley received a telephone call yesterday, 11/19/75, from Supervisor Paul V. Daly of the Legal Counsel Division advising him that he would be receiving a telephone call concerning the Warren Commission. Mr. Malley in contemplating this case advised there is one item he would appreciate knowing before talking to members of the Committee. He stated if his memory is correct, he was called back from Dallas on 12/12/63 and recalls either on 12/13 or 14/63 he and Mr. Belmont were called to the Director's Office and were told in very definite terms that they were to make certain everything they had went to the Warren Commission. Mr. Malley stated he would like to know whether either he or Mr. Belmont put a memorandum in the file to that effect possibly on 12/13 or 14/63, and if there is such a memorandum in the file, he would like to know so he will have some backup material. He stated he does not know how much material has been given by the Bureau to the Committee.

I had Bill Nettles do some research on this. He located the memorandum referred to by Mr. Malley which is a memorandum from Mr. Hoover to Mr. Tolson dated 12/26/63, wherein he instructed

I watch you on television quite often and heard you were investigating the assassination of John F. Kennedy so I have a story to tell you.

I joined the Marine Corps at 16 years of age, Dec. 1947 in Hartford, Conn. I was sentenced in 1948 to 9 years and a Dishonorable Discharge. I was discharged in March 1950 at the Naval Prison in Portsmouth, New Hampshire.

I re-enlisted in July 1950 at Newark, New Jersey. I went to Korea with the 1st Cavalry Division and stayed until April 1951 and was discharged with an Undesirable Discharge.

I re-enlisted again in the Marine Corps in 1951 and wanted to go to Korea and went to Boot Camp and they threw me out at Charleston South Carolina with no discharge.

In 1952, I met [REDACTED] in Springfield Mass. through him, I met Senator Kennedy in the last part of 1952 and 1953. Kennedy and I became good friends and I went to Washington and talked to him about my discharges.

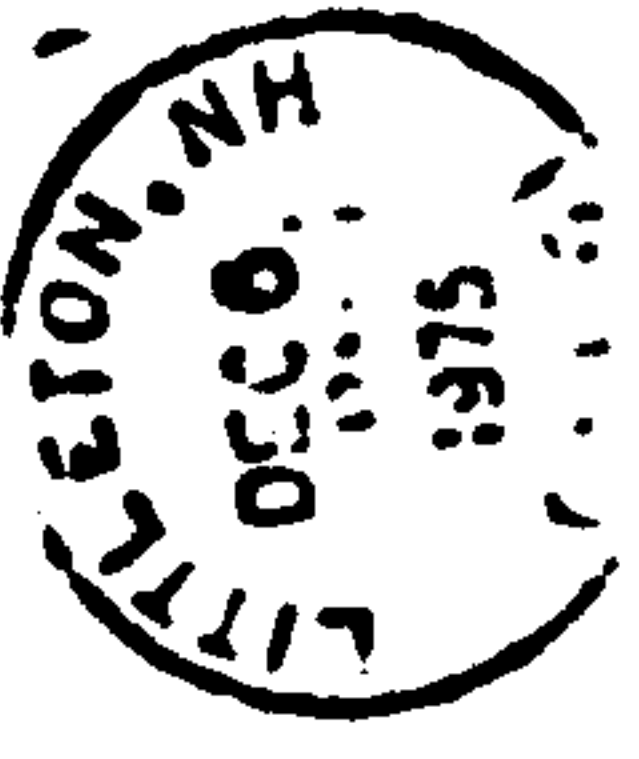
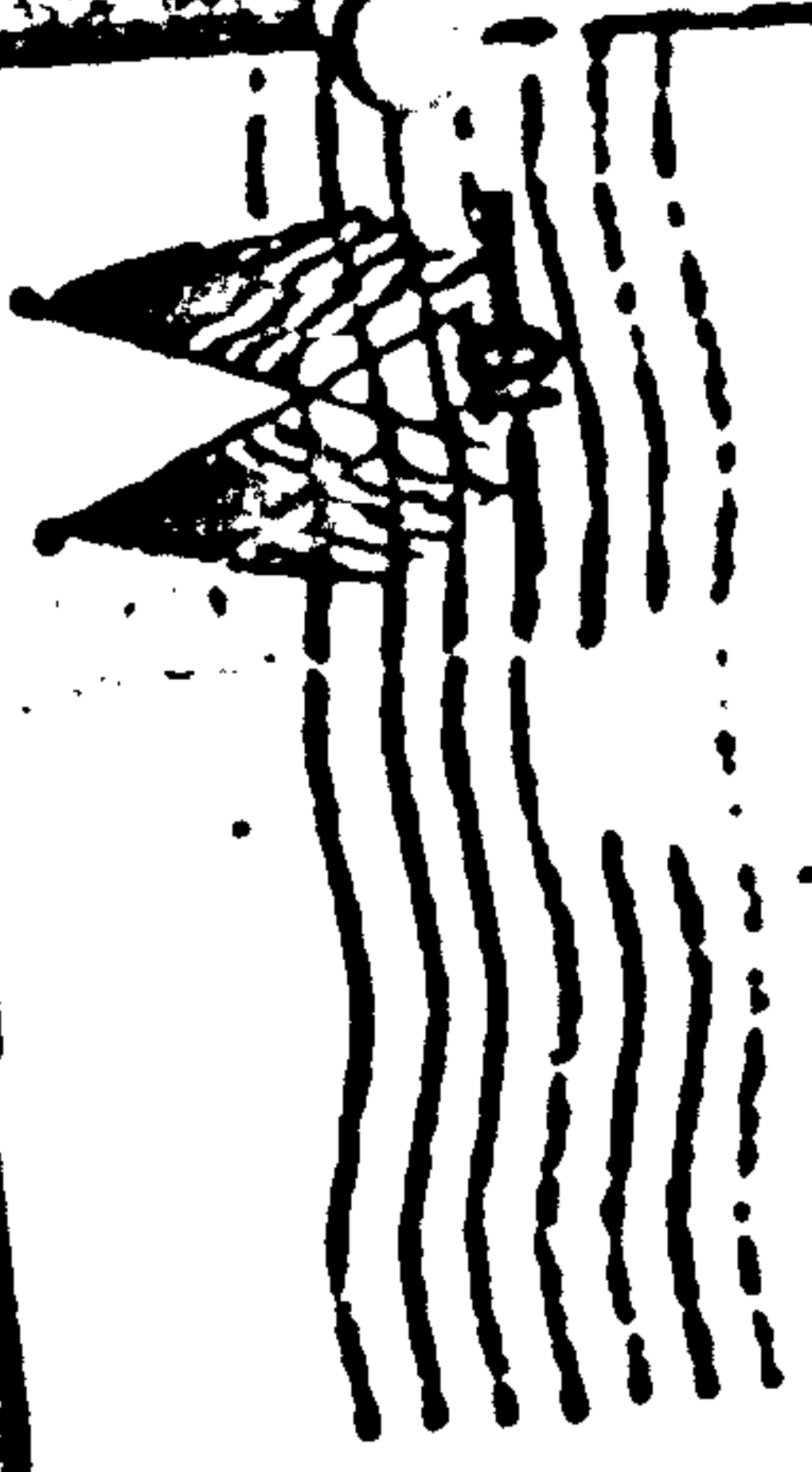



On December 12, 1975, Special Agent [redacted] received a message to call collect, phone #202/225-9751, on the morning of December 15, 1975, for Tim Oliphant (phonetic). This call was returned the morning of December 15, 1975, and the telephone number was for the Select Committee on Intelligence, Washington, D. C. The operator advised the calling party was out of the office and had gone to FBI Headquarters.

[redacted], Chief of Police, Ardmore, Oklahoma, Police Department, advised December 15, 1975, that on December 12, 1975, he received a telephone call from Tim Oliphant, Select Committee on Intelligence, Washington, D. C. Oliphant advised [redacted] that the committee had received information that a former police officer, Daniel Edward McMillan, had stopped a woman at Ardmore, Oklahoma, the night before President John Fitzgerald Kennedy was assassinated. This woman was hysterical and told McMillan that something bad was going to happen to the President in Dallas, Texas, the following day.

McMillan also stated that he made his report on this incident to the Ardmore Police Department. [redacted] advised that a search of his records were negative on such a report.

[redacted] also advised that he, [redacted] was Chief of Detectives at the time the above alleged incident took place, and he does not recall any such incident. Further, other members of the Police Department, who were working at that time, do not recall any such incident.

[redacted] stated that McMillan was employed by the Ardmore Police Department June 17, 1963 to November 16, 1967, at which time he was forced to resign from the Department for [redacted]. He later worked as City Marshal, Cyril, Oklahoma, where he was [redacted] charged with [redacted] and dismissed. Disposition [of charges] is unknown. Lindsay furnished the above information to Oliphant.

T-1 was advised the identity of the interviewing agent and provided the following information:

In early October, 1963, T-1, along with several co-workers of the Johnson Western Gunitite Company (JWGC), stopped at the end of the day after work at a bar which he believed to be called the River Bottom Bar or Salt River Bar located at about 50th Avenue and River Bottom, Phoenix, Arizona. They had been working on a tri-city sewer project. While in the bar having a drink, T-1 observed and heard an individual who was standing at the bar who said, "That son of a bitch, red-headed KENNEDY bastard. We got it fixed. When he gets to Dallas, we got him." T-1 commented to one of the individuals with him, [REDACTED], that such remarks should not be made about the President of the United States. T-1 stated the above remarks were as near as he can now recall and he particularly remembers the "red-headed" portion of the remark because until that time he had not thought of KENNEDY as being red headed.

T-1 thought little more of this incident until the day of the assassination of President KENNEDY when he was working at the County Jail in Phoenix doing construction work with JWGC. After he heard the news of the assassination of President KENNEDY, he commented to [REDACTED] that it appeared the individual at the bar may have had something after all.

T-1 stated he had never seen the individual who made this remark prior to the occasion that the remark was made, and he has never seen him since in person. He believes, however, he has seen him on a number of occasions during the showing on television of the "home movies" which were taken during the time of the assassination. The individual he feels is the same one he heard to make this remark is standing in the crowd in the movies and was dressed as he was when he was in the bar.

T-1 described the individual in the bar as he

observed him in October, 1963, as follows:

Race	White
Sex	Male

Characteristics	Texan, based on speech and dress

T-1 additionally advised he had observed in the parking area of the bar a Lincoln automobile which he assumed to belong to the individual at the bar, but he did not observe him in the automobile. This car had Texas plates.

T-1 advised he recalls with him in the bar were [REDACTED], who was a foreman with JWGC, and also an individual named [REDACTED] who is from California but was in Phoenix working for JWGC. He has not seen [REDACTED] for a number of years and believes he has returned to his home somewhere in California. Another individual who was present was an employee of JWGC named JERRY O'REILLY, who is now deceased. T-1 STATED [REDACTED] heard the individual's remarks and he discussed with him these remarks as indicated above on the day of the shooting. He believes he mentioned to him seeing the individual on television.

He is sure [REDACTED] heard the remarks at the bar and believes he spoke with him about these remarks at the time of the assassination. In addition to these two individuals, he also spoke with [REDACTED], an employee of the First National Bank of Arizona. Other than these individuals, T-1 stated he has not discussed this matter with anyone else.

T-1 advised the reason for not bringing this matter to someone's attention previously was that shortly

after the shooting, LEE HARVEY OSWALD was arrested and he seemed to be the one who had been involved in the assassination. It is only recently since there is talk of re-opening the investigation, that incident has been "working on his mind," and that he feels there may be some substance to this incident.

T-1 stated he is currently self-employed in the mining business and is Secretary-Treasurer of a ranch corporation.



"December 10, 1975 (Wednesday)

"I, T-1, voluntarily provide the following statement to Special Agents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

"In early October, 1963, I, along with 7 or 8 co-workers of the Johnson Western Gunitite Company (JWGC) (then based in Phoenix, now their home office is in Gardena, California) stopped at the end of the day after work at a bar which he believed to be called the River Bottom Bar or Salt River Bar located at about 51st Ave. or 91st Ave. and the Salt River bed, west of Phoenix, Arizona. They had been working on a Tri-city sewer project. While in the bar having a drink, T-1 observed and heard an individual talking to two unrecalled persons at the bar. The individual, who was about 20-25 feet away said in a loud voice, 'That son of a bitch, red-headed KENNEDY bastard. We got it fixed; when he gets to Dallas, we got him.' These words are as close as he can recall and could be slightly varied, but the text is basically the same. T-1 commented to one of his co-workers, [REDACTED], that such remarks should not be made about the President of the United States. He also remarked to another co-worker, [REDACTED] who was a strong supporter of KENNEDY, that the individual was talking bad about KENNEDY and [REDACTED] should punch the individual in the nose. [REDACTED] T-1 commented, said the individual was too big or he would punch him. T-1 particularly remembers the 'red-haired' portion of the remark because until that time he had not thought of KENNEDY as being red-haired.

"T-1 thought little more of this incident until the day of the assassination of President KENNEDY when he was working at the county jail in Phoenix doing construction work with JWGC. After he heard the news of the assassination, he commented to [REDACTED] that it appeared the individual at the bar may have been telling the truth.

"T-1 had never seen the individual who made the remark prior to the occasion at the bar and he has never seen him since in person. He believes, however, he has seen him on a number of occasions during the showing on television of the 'home movies' which were taken during the

time of the assassination. The individual he feels is the same one he heard to make this remark is standing in the crowd in the movies and was dressed as he was when he was in the bar. T-1 said this individual fit the image of the typical tall, stereotype, bully Texan and he is not sure the person seen in the news reels is the same person he saw in the bar in Phoenix, but he generally appeared to be the same person.

"T-1 described the individual in the bar as he observed him in October, 1963, as follows:

"T-1 observed that when he exited the bar parking lot, he observed a Lincoln automobile, light color, possibly cream color, with Texas license, that he assumed belonged to the individual, although he did not see him in the car at any time.

Others with T-1 in the bar who also worked for JWGC were [REDACTED], who was a foreman with JWGC, and [REDACTED] who is from California but was in Phoenix working for JWGC. He has not seen [REDACTED] in years and believes he is back in California. Also present was JERRY O'REILLY, now deceased. T-1 is sure that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both heard the statement of the individual as both discussed the remarks with him, T-1, later at the time of the assassination. In addition to these two persons, he also talked to [REDACTED] now an employee of the First National Bank of Arizona currently Chief Auditor Inspector working in Tucson, Arizona on the merge of the Southern Arizona Bank with First National. He also mentioned the conversation to his first wife, who is now deceased.




"T-1 has not brought this to the FBI's attention previously because LEE HARVEY OSWALD was arrested shortly after the assassination and he seemed to be the only person involved. Only recently since the re-opening of the KENNEDY Assassination Case has he felt there is possible substance to the statement at the bar in 1963. This has 'worked on his mind' for some time and felt it was time he told someone of the incident.

"I have read this statement thoroughly, including this page and 7 others and find the facts to be true to the best of my recollection. I have provided the statement voluntarily and have not been coerced or threatened in any manner whatsoever.

Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed at the First National Bank, Wilmot Branch, 6360 East 22nd Street, Tucson, Arizona. [REDACTED] advised she is a staff officer and senior associate auditor for the First National Bank and that her home office is in [Phoenix]. She has been employed by the bank for 15 years.

She advised that she is the fiancée of [REDACTED] of the same address and has been going with him for five years. She first met [REDACTED] approximately six years ago as a customer of the First National Bank. She stated that [REDACTED] is truthful and honest and has a "fantastic memory" for names of people and places as well as dates. She advised that [REDACTED] is a gunite specialist but because of health problems has not been working lately.

She advised that approximately two years ago [REDACTED] mentioned an incident which occurred in 1963 just prior to the assassination of JOHN F. KENNEDY. He told her that he was at a bar on South Central Avenue in Phoenix when he met a "big Texan" who said something to the effect that if that "red-headed S.O.B." (KENNEDY) ever came to Texas "we will get him." She could not recall any of the details of [REDACTED] conversation with her regarding this matter and he never mentioned it again until several days ago when he mentioned that he had been interviewed by the FBI with respect to this matter.

[REDACTED] advised that she had no recollection of [REDACTED] ever telling her that he had had any subsequent encounter with the individual from the bar. She specifically had no recollection of his mentioning having seen this individual on TV.

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[REDACTED], Phoenix, Arizona, telephone number [REDACTED], was interviewed at a construction site where he is employed by Phoenix Gunitite, Inc., as a supervisor. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and provided the following information:

In 1963, he was employed as a foreman with Johnson Western Gunitite Company, and worked for this company on the construction of a Tri-City sewer project outside of Phoenix. In November, 1963, at the time of the assassination of President KENNEDY, he was working for Johnson Western on a construction project at the Phoenix Jail. Working for him along with others at this time, were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] advised he does not recall having been in the River Bottom Bar with the above-named individuals, but it is possible he may have stopped in this or another bar with them to have a beer.

[REDACTED] stated he recalls at no time hearing anyone comment prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY concerning the likelihood of anything happening to President KENNEDY when he was to go to Dallas or anywhere else. If any such comment were made which he might have heard shortly before the time of the assassination, he is certain he would have recalled it when he heard of the assassination. He stated that he was very shocked when he heard of the shooting of President KENNEDY and reiterated that he would have recalled any comments or discussions preceding this event relating to any actions adverse to the safety of the President.

[REDACTED] stated that neither before, at the time of, nor following the assassination of President KENNEDY does he recall [REDACTED] making any comments to him regarding any prior threats of KENNEDY's life or relating to KENNEDY's safety or stating that he [REDACTED] had heard any such remarks nor that he recognized anyone who had supposedly made any such remarks in any films or reports relating to the assassination.

[REDACTED] stated that a great deal of what [REDACTED] says he would just "let go in one ear and out the other". [REDACTED] is the type of person, [REDACTED] stated, who tends to exaggerate things and to tell wild stories. He always claims to be "the best" at anything he does not matter what it might be. An example of this was when he employed [REDACTED] it was as a mixer (of the gunite concrete used in the gunite processing). [REDACTED] considered himself to be the greatest mixer in the world. [REDACTED] always felt he knew more about everything than anyone else. [REDACTED] stated he would place little credence in what [REDACTED] has to say insofar as his stories go. He is inclined to relate all sorts of wild stories.

The last time he spoke with [REDACTED] was several years ago when [REDACTED] called him at Christmas time to wish him Christmas greetings. [REDACTED] was intoxicated at the time and he could not make much sense out of what [REDACTED] said, but [REDACTED] did advise him that his "wife [REDACTED]" had died.

[REDACTED] advised that JERRY O'REILLY is deceased.

[REDACTED] stated that he has not seen [REDACTED] for many years as [REDACTED] returned to California following completion of the Johnson Western projects in the Phoenix area; however, [REDACTED] called him he believes from Seattle, Washington a few years ago concerning some gunite equipment and it is [REDACTED]'s recollection that [REDACTED] was planning to go into the gunite business with another individual in the Seattle area.

As set up by law, the Archives documents furnished to the Warren Commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy were to be reviewed every five years to determine which of them in possession of Archives could be made public.

During the interim of the review of 1970 and this current year, the amendments to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) have become effective and are interpreted to take precedent in this review.

Archives has referred to the FBI a list of documents in their possession, furnished to the Warren Commission by the FBI which are up for review in 1975. These documents are being reviewed under the purview of the amended FOIA, with the results of this review to be furnished to Archives.

There are approximately 300 documents, consisting of approximately 1,600 pages, which are the subject of this review. In late October, 1975, representatives of the Committee on Government Operations, Government Information and Individual Rights Subcommittee were advised all efforts would be made by the FBI to finish review and processing these documents by 12/15/75, and the results thereof made known to Archives on that date. This informal deadline was agreed upon by the representatives of the Subcommittee.

At the time this date was chosen the complete Project Unit of the FOIPA Section was involved in the Rosenberg, et al., case with a U. S. District Court imposed deadline of 11/15/75 and therefore, 12/15/75 appeared to be a quite reasonable date. However, the personnel committed to the see references review associated with the Rosenberg case simply took more time to complete than was originally contemplated.
