On 3/18/76, HUGH AYNESWORTH, investigative reporter for the Dallas Times Herald, Dallas, Texas, contacted SAC TED L. GUNDERSON and advised he had received information Congressmen DOWNING (Virginia) and GONZALES (Texas), would speak before the House on this date and request the President KENNEDY assassination investigation be reopened because of receipt of information indicating there was a conspiracy. Congressmen DOWNING and/or GONZALES have pages 66 and 67 of an FBI report in their possession. This report sets forth information furnished 11/26/63, from Confidential Informant Dallas T-4 [redacted]

[redacted] who advised he received information that a male voice was overheard in a telephone conversation between telephone number CR 5-5211, Arlington, Texas, and telephone number BL 3-1628, Irving, Texas, on 11/23/63. Informant

request to the President Kennedy Commission re: Kennedy's Report*

advised exact time of the conversation was not available and he did not know from which of the telephone numbers the call originated. Informant advised the male voice claimed that he felt sure LEE HARVEY OSWALD had killed President KENNEDY, but did not feel OSWALD was responsible and further stated, "we both know who is responsible."

AYNESWORTH stated these Congressmen will claim this information was withheld from the Warren Commission by the FBI. They will also claim the FBI had a wiretap on the PAYNE residence (MARINA OSWALD's residence prior to and until the assassination).

AYNESWORTH stated this reported telephone conversation was between MICHAEL PAYNE and RUTH PAYNE (MARINA OSWALD lived with RUTH PAYNE prior to the assassination).

AYNESWORTH asked if the FBI had a telephone tap on the PAYNE residence immediately following the assassination and he was informed we did not.

It is noted page 67 of the report is the interview with MICHAEL PAYNE, who denied making any such statement.

The above two pages are in report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING at Dallas, dated 1/7/64 (DL 100-10461-2222), entitled, "Changed - LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka Aliksei Oswald, etc., IS-R-CUBA."

Dallas file 100-10461-2630 contains a memorandum from SA JOSEPH J. LOEFFLER dated 1/16/64, entitled, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka; IS - R-CUBA." This memorandum reflects WILLIAM BRANNIGAN, Section Chief, Domestic Intelligence Division, telephonically contacted the Dallas Office that date referring to page 66 of the above report, specifically Confidential Informant Dallas T-4. In this report Confidential Informant Dallas T-4 is [REDACTED]

Department. BRANNIGAN instructed that [redacted] be interviewed and information be placed on an FD-302 if agreeable with him.

The Bureau's attention is directed to Dallas report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated 1/22/64, captioned, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka; IS - R," Dallas file 100-10461-2650, Bufile 105-82555. Pages 85A - 85G deal totally with the above-described telephone call. It is noted when interviewed, [redacted] could not recall his source of this information.

Attention of the Bureau is directed to Dallas report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated 2/11/64, entitled, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka; IS-R-CUBA", Dallas file 100-10461-3200. Pages 100 and 101 make specific reference to the telephone call between MICHAEL PAYNE and RUTH PAYNE. It is noted page 101 lists toll calls made from telephone number BL 3-1628. A call is listed for 11/22/63.

For the additional information of the Bureau, Dallas files were reviewed and there definitely was no telephone tap by the FBI at the PAYNE residence subsequent to the assassination. It is noted, however, immediately following the assassination, MARINA OSWALD left the PAYNE residence and was placed in protective custody in a motel by the U. S. Secret Service. She subsequently moved to 629 Belt Line Road, Richardson, Texas. [redacted]

Dear Senator Rumin:

Your communication of March 23rd enclosing a copy of a letter signed by several of your constituents in Watkinsville, Georgia, was referred to the FBI by the Department of Justice and received here on April 5th.

I understand the interest and concern which prompted them to suggest that the FBI reopen its investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. As I am sure they are aware, this Bureau conducted a prompt, intensive and objective investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy at the request of President Lyndon B. Johnson. Results of our investigation were fully and accurately reported to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy. All available evidence pointed to one conclusion--that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in this crime.

From time to time certain questions have been raised by individuals and organizations concerning certain aspects of this case and they have been thoroughly considered by the FBI. To date, we have received no information to warrant reopening the full investigation of President Kennedy's assassination. Any decision regarding reopening the investigation would be the responsibility of the Attorney General.

I am returning your enclosure in accordance with your request.

Dear Mr. Morris:

In reply to your letter of March 8, 1976, which I received yesterday:

If you now have, or in the future come into possession of, evidence indicating a violation of the federal criminal law in the Western District of Tennessee, it is, and would be your duty to promptly make that evidence available to this office and to the agency responsible for investigating the particular violation of law which that evidence indicates was violated and I assure you that we would welcome receipt of such evidence and that it will be promptly evaluated, correlated with any other evidence we have, or can get, on the subject, and the indictments justified by all the available evidence will be sought. (If the time were ever to come when I could not give such assurances, the Western District of Tennessee will have someone else as its United States Attorney.)

The offenses suggested in your letter, as you doubtless know, fall under the investigative jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and it has an office in the Federal Buildings at Jackson and Memphis.

Let me have the particulars of the evidence referred to in your letter.

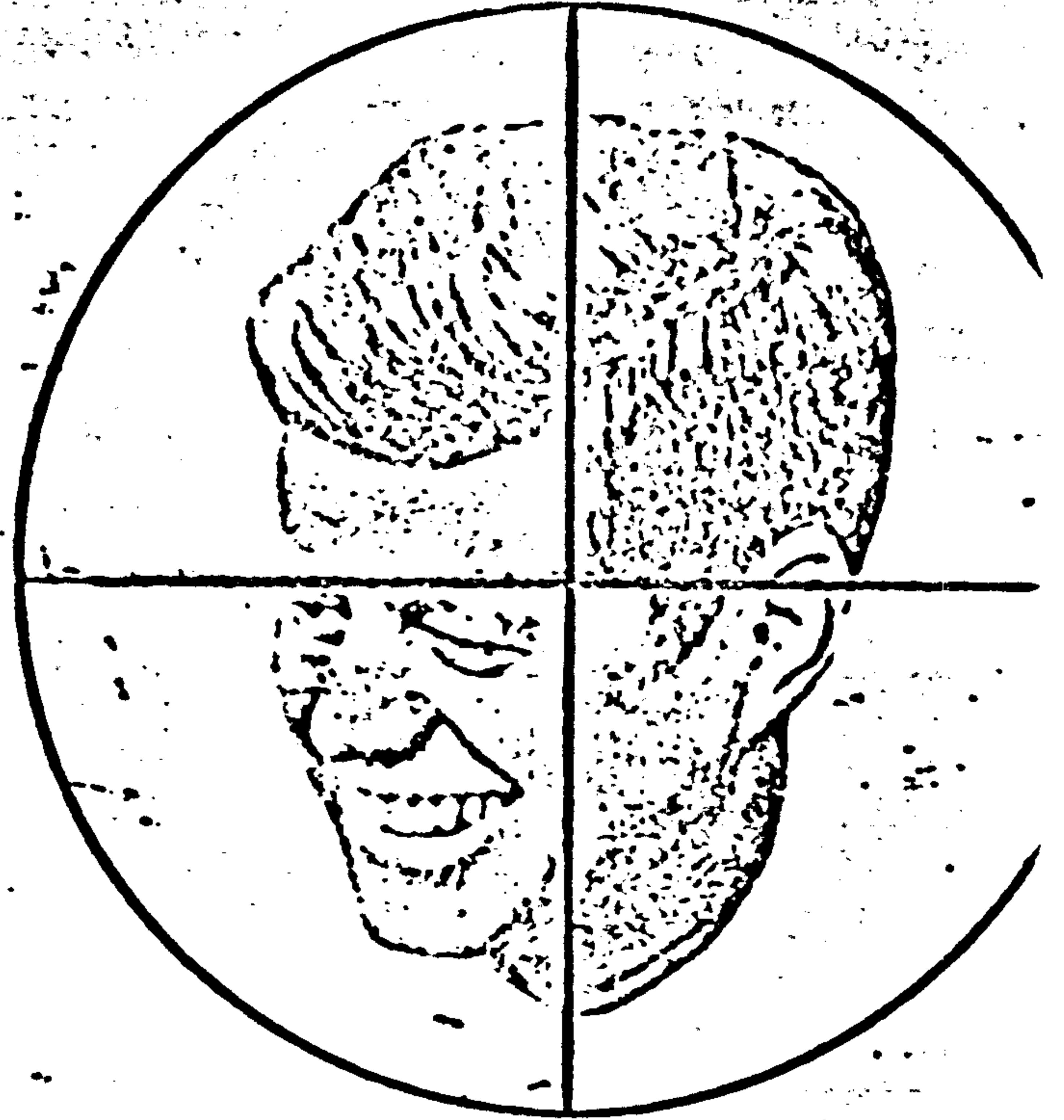

W. R. Morris

W. R. Morris has been investigating the John F. Kennedy murder for a decade. He has interviewed more than 1,000 persons in connection with Kennedy's death probe.

Morris has a contract with Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, Lee Harvey Oswald's mother, to write a book. He is presently working on a full length book regarding Oswald's role in the assassination of President Kennedy.

Morris is the author of "THE TWELFTH OF AUGUST", a biography of Buford Pusser, the real-life "WALKING TALL" movie hero.

He has been in contact for a long time with two former agents of the Central Intelligence Agency and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. One of the ex-agents, Harry Dean of California, has agreed to permit Morris to use his name. Both agents provided Morris with first-hand information about the plot to kill Kennedy.

Morris has traveled all over the United States gathering facts about the John Kennedy murder. He

spent several weeks in New Orleans with former District Attorney Jim Garrison. It was Garrison who first announced that he had evidence which pointed to a conspiracy in the killing of Kennedy.

Morris has had his life threatened various times. He has received several telephone calls advising him to stop "meddling" in the Kennedy case.

Only recently, a stranger walked into Morris' office near Loretto, Tennessee, and asked the secretary if the author was in. When the secretary said he was out of town, the man handed her a copy of a national publication which had a photograph of Morris in it, then walked out of the office. In black ink, a cross-hair of a rifle scope had been drawn across Morris' picture.

Later, Morris was threatened by Eugene Hale Brading, a man he has named publicly as being involved in the Kennedy assassination.

Morris and former agent Dean were flown to New York and interviewed by Tom Snyder of NBC's "Tomorrow" Show. However, the program was so explosive that NBC officials were afraid to air it.

W. R. Morris was born in Reagan, Tennessee, a small community in Henderson County. He spent most of his adult years as a newspaper reporter.

He is an outdoors man, and when he is not writing, he enjoys hunting and fishing.

Morris now makes his home in Loretto, Tenn.

The enclosed book was furnished to FBIHQ by Mr. James Robinson, General Crimes-Section, Criminal Division, Department of Justice, who received it from Mr. William P. Tyson, Jr., Executive Office for United States Attorneys. Robinson also furnished the copy of the letter from United States Attorney Turley, Western District of Tennessee, to Mr. William R. Morris, Post Office Box 81, Loretto, Tennessee, dated 3/12/76. FBIHQ is not aware of the contents of Mr. Morris' letter of 3/8/76 to which Mr. Turley directs his reply.

The book "The Men Behind the Guns" has been reviewed at FBIHQ. It is a magazine-like publication available for \$2 from W. R. Morris Enterprises, Post Office Box 81, Loretto, Tennessee 38469. It contains some 14 short articles and several pages of previously published photographs. Morris attributes much of his information to "two former agents of the Central Intelligence Agency and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. One of the

ex-agents, Harry Dean of California, has agreed to permit Morris to use his name." Both Agents allegedly provided Morris with firsthand information about the plot to kill President Kennedy. Morris alleges that former Congressman John Rousselot of California and former Army General Edwin A. Walker of Dallas ramrodded the assassination and convinced members of the John Birch Society to help finance the plot. Morris further alleges that evidence has been found which substantiates the fact that there were at least four assassins and possibly more. He names Loran Eugene Hall and Eladio del Valle as members of the sniper team who killed the President. According to Morris, Oswald was an Agent for the CIA and FBI and was framed in the assassination by Rousselot, Walker and the other conspirators.

Bureau files reflect a great deal of correspondence with Harry J. Dean who in the early-1960s furnished information to the Chicago Office concerning the FAIA Play for Cuba Committee. He was never an informant and was never encouraged in his activities. After he gratuitously furnished information, a background check was made at which time it was determined he was a former mental patient with a criminal record. He was told in 1961 his assistance was not desired. The Los Angeles Office, since November, 1963, has periodically found it necessary to contact Dean and request that he desist from making claims concerning past relationships with the Bureau.

Memphis should contact United States Attorney Thomas P. Turley, Jr., and determine the content of Morris' original letter to him and the nature of the evidence alleged to be in the possession of Morris. Advise FBIHQ and Dallas of results.

BOOK REGARDING LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY BEING WRITTEN BY EDWARD JAY EPSTEIN RESEARCH (INTERNAL AFFAIRS)

Edward Jay Epstein, who has written about the findings of the Warren Commission in the past, is writing a book for the "Reader's Digest" bearing upon the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The book will be devoted primarily to Lee Harvey Oswald and will attempt to trace all phases of his life.

Epstein visited FBIHQ early this year to discuss his plans to write this book. He was accompanied by Miss Pat Butler, whom the "Reader's Digest" has assigned to assist him on this project. Since that time, FBIHQ has received several requests from Epstein primarily involving public source-type information.

Miss Butler telephoned FBIHQ last week to advise that Epstein hopes to interview former SAC Clark R. Anderson in connection with this book. Through a source unknown to FBIHQ, Epstein is aware that Anderson was Legat at Mexico City at the time of the Kennedy Assassination. (2) that Epstein has advised he hopes to interview Anderson in connection with the book he is writing about Oswald and the Kennedy Assassination; (3) that the FBI has not furnished Anderson's address to Epstein; and (4) that the decision of whether or not he should see Epstein is strictly one for Anderson himself to make. In connection with the last point, he should most tactfully be reminded of his pledge of confidentiality regarding data which came to his attention as a result of his official duties.

Epstein has also requested a list of the names and last-known whereabouts of the other Agents who were assigned in Mexico City during the Fall of 1963 and the early months of 1964. In the interest of protecting the privacy of the employees--past and present--involved, this information has not been given him. He has, however, been told that those Agents involved whose whereabouts are known to us would be informed of Epstein's interest in talking to them.

In addition to Anderson, 11 other such Agents are believed to be still alive. [redacted] of Mexico City is the only such Agent who is currently on the rolls. The others, together with their last known addresses, are the former Agents listed below:

With the exception of Mexico City, each Office receiving a copy of this communication should contact those former Agents identified above whose last known address is in its Field Office territory. These former Agents should be told that Epstein has contacted FBIHQ in connection with the book about Oswald and the Kennedy Assassination which he is writing for "Reader's Digest." It should be pointed out to them that Epstein has requested--and, in the interest of protecting the privacy of those involved, has been refused--a list of the names and last known whereabouts of Agents who were assigned in Mexico City in the Fall of 1963 and the early months of 1964. They should be advised that Epstein can be contacted through Miss Paul Butler of the "Reader's Digest," 200 Park Avenue, New York, New York 10017-- telephone (212) 972-6175. Each of these former Agents should be told that the decision as to whether he desires to contact and/or be interviewed by Epstein is strictly his own to make; however, the FBI hopes that the pledge of confidentiality which he made while an employee will continue to guide his actions and any responses he may make to questions involving official investigations.

If any of these individuals has moved from the address listed for him above, no investigation or other inquiries should be launched to locate him. Furthermore, FBIHQ need not be notified of the results of your efforts to contact these former Agents.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this memorandum is to advise of a request received from Pam Butler of the "Reader's Digest" (who is assisting Edward Jay Epstein in connection with captioned book) for the identities and whereabouts of the Agents who were assigned as Legats in Mexico City in the Fall of 1963 and early 1964 -- and to recommend that, as a matter of policy, such blanket-type information involving personnel not be furnished to authors or to representatives of news media.

SYNOPSIS:

Early this year, Edward Jay Epstein visited FBIHQ in connection with a book concerning the 11/22/63 Kennedy Assassination he is writing for "Reader's Digest." He was accompanied by Pam Butler of "Reader's Digest." Several requests for assistance in connection with this book have since been received, most of which have involved public source information. Miss Butler now has telephoned to advise that Epstein hopes to interview Clark Anderson (now retired) who was Legat at Mexico City in November, 1963, and that Epstein would like the identities and present whereabouts of other Agents who were assigned in Mexico City at the time of the Assassination and/or the investigation that immediately followed. There were 11 Agents in Mexico City in November, 1963, and three additional Agents were sent there early in 1964 on temporary assignment.

POLICY:

Sanford Ungar visited and interviewed Legats during the research for his 1975 book entitled "FBI." However, his interest was not directed at a specific investigation, as is Epstein's; nor did it involve so sweeping an access to present and former Agents of a Legat post as does Epstein's.

In the interest of privacy of the personnel involved, it is felt that requests such as Epstein's for names and present whereabouts of personnel assigned to specific Legat posts should be declined. Where feasible, such as in this instance, it is felt, however, that as a courtesy an effort should be made to advise the present and former employees involved of the request received for their own information and independent decision as to action.



RECOMMENDATIONS:

concerning the 11/22/63 Kennedy Assassination. The book will be devoted primarily to Lee Harvey Oswald and will take issue with many of the rumors and the conjecture that continue to surround the Assassination.

During his January visit, Epstein was accompanied by Pam Butler, who has been assigned by "Reader's Digest" to assist him. Through Miss Butler, Epstein has made several requests for assistance. Most of these have involved public source-type information.

Now, however, Epstein has requested -- through Miss Butler -- to be furnished the names of the FBI Agents who were assigned in Mexico City at the time of the 1963 Assassination and during the period immediately thereafter when the investigation of the Assassination was being pressed. Epstein is aware that [redacted] was Legat at Mexico City during the pertinent period and that he retired last year while SAC of the San Antonio Office. [redacted] was interviewed by the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Activities in February, 1976, regarding the investigation of Oswald's activities in Mexico in 1963.)

In addition to [redacted] (whom Epstein hopes to interview), the other Agents assigned in Mexico City (not elsewhere in Mexico) during the pertinent period included one [redacted] who is still assigned in Mexico City, two [redacted] who are deceased, and the following 10 who are no longer in service -- nine having retired and one [redacted] having resigned:

(Former Agents [REDACTED] were sent to Mexico City early in 1964 on temporary assignment occasioned by Mexican aspects of the Assassination investigation.)

The above-mentioned former employees are still bound by their pledge of confidentiality not to disclose data which came to their attention as a result of their official duties. Furthermore, the FBI has a continuing responsibility not to breach the privacy of employees, past or present.

To flatly turn down Epstein's request for the names and whereabouts of the Agents assigned in Mexico City late in 1963 and early in 1964 could raise questions in his mind. Accordingly, it is felt Epstein should be told that privacy considerations prevent our giving him the names and last-known locations of these Agents, but that the Agents involved will be advised of his interest in talking with them and will be provided the New York address where he can be reached.

WASHINGTON, May 12—The Secret Service had one million names in its index file of potential threats to Presidents at the time President Kennedy was assassinated Nov. 22, 1963, according to documents available today at the National Archives.

The file, which then did not include the name of Lee Harvey Oswald, the assassin, has since been winnowed down to 30,000, George Cosper, a special agent, said at the agency's headquarters.

The Secret Service, in responding to a suit by Mark Lane, director of the Citizen's Commission of Inquiry, has promised to release "in their entirety" all its files on the Kennedy assassination.

Mr. Lane was represented by John H. F. Shattuck, as counsel of the American Civil Liberties Union Foundation, who stressed that the civil liberties group had taken no position on disputed findings in the Kennedy investigation.

Mr. Lane, author of a best-selling book criticizing the Warren Commission's report that held that Mr. Oswald was lone assassin, believes that there was "a conspiracy to kill the President and shots from two directions." He says, "I see no evidence that Oswald shot the President — but I don't know."

Guidelines Cited

After a first look at the first available documents, Mr. Lane contended that they showed that the Secret Service had failed to abide by all its own guidelines. These require inspecting and sealing "sewers and other passages under streets," and "if great danger is suspected, the occupants of buildings facing parade routes would be checked."

The Dec. 18, 1963, report by Chief James J. Rowley said that protective research section's geographical index contained names of potential threats in the Dallas area. But Mr. Lane said that another document referred to a Nov. 25, 1963, Central Intelligence Agency report

on a Cuban refugee there who was opposed to Premier Fidel Castro and had been trying to buy machine guns and bazookas and was "known to be violently anti-President Kennedy."

The million-name index — Chief Rowley said "an unknown number of people on the list were now dead or inactive — consisted of people thought to be threatening or "conducting themselves in a way to arouse suspicion of hostile intentions." It also included names submitted "through established liaison procedures by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, C.I.A. and state and local police departments."

Warren Report Quoted

The Warren report said only that the Secret Service active files at the time of the assassination "contained approximately 50,000 cases accumulated over a 20-year period, some of which included more than one individual."

"I think the only reason Oswald's name was not given to the Secret Service was because he was working for the F.B.I.," Mr. Lane asserted. He cited a Secret Service interview in which Mr. Oswald's New Orleans landlady earlier in 1963 said that an F.B.I. agent had interviewed her about Mr. Oswald "after he had displayed pro-Castro circulars on the porch."

Another interview indicated that Mr. Oswald's wife, Marina, reported that he was interviewed by F.B.I. agents in July or August 1962 while they lived in Fort Worth.

Another Secret Service report related that on Dec. 17, 1963, Alonso H. Hudkins, a reporter for The Houston Post, said that he believed Mr. Oswald was being paid \$200 a month by the F.B.I. "as an informant in connection with their subversive investigations." Mr. Hudkins was quoted as saying that Mr. Oswald had F.B.I. informant number "S172."

The Warren Commission's report, released in September 1964, said that the F.B.I. opened a file on Mr. Oswald in October 1959, when he

showed up in the Soviet Union as a Marine Corps veteran and defector, and investigated him intermittently thereafter.

Senator Frank Church, Democrat of Idaho, who is chairman of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, said in Omaha this week that the C.I.A. and F.B.I. "failed to make a full and complete disclosure" to the Warren Commission. He predicted that a report by his panel later this year would probably cause "an outcry to reopen the investigation."

Interview Published

In an interview published by the Citizens Commission of Inquiry and confirmed by his office, Senator Richard S. Schweiker, Republican of Pennsylvania, cited two areas of concern.

One, he said, is "destruction by the F.B.I. of the note that Oswald presented to the Dallas office." The other, he said, is the way that J. Edgar Hoover, then the F.B.I. director, told the Warren Commission "a search of the files" did not show Mr. Oswald as an informer. Normal affidavits," the Senator said, "say, 'To the best of my knowledge and belief, such and such is true.'"

The House Subcommittee on Civil and Constitutional Rights, headed by Don Edwards, Democrat of California, was told that the note was left by Mr. Oswald between Nov. 6 and 8, 1963, for James P. Hosty Jr., an F.B.I. agent in Dallas.

Mr. Hosty said that the note warned that "if I did not stop talking to his wife, he would take action against the F.B.I." He testified last Dec. 12 that he destroyed the note Nov. 24, 1963, the day Mr. Oswald was killed. He said that he did so on orders from the Dallas F.B.I. chief, J. Gordon Shanklin. Other witnesses confirmed that there had been an Oswald note, but Mr. Shanklin denied ever knowing about it.

Mr. Lane contended that Jack Ruby, who murdered Mr. Oswald, had "worked for the F.B.I." He displayed a letter from Mr. Hoover to the Warren

USA TURLEY was contacted 5/13/76, and advised that his letter to MORRIS was prompted by his receipt of the book "The Men Behind The Guns" which was written by W. R. MORRIS. Mr. TURLEY said this book was sent to him unsolicited and after seeing the contents of the book he felt compelled to write to MORRIS and urge him to turn over any evidence he might have to the Government. He said that MORRIS answered his letter of 3/12/76, by stating that he had decided to turn over any evidence he might have to the Attorney General. Mr. TURLEY again wrote to Mr. MORRIS and suggested that if he had any evidence he should turn it over to either the FBI, the Attorney General, or to the USA's Office and urged MORRIS to "stop playing games."

Inasmuch as MORRIS has not come forth with any new evidence and is unlikely to, it is not felt this matter deserves further effort on our part.

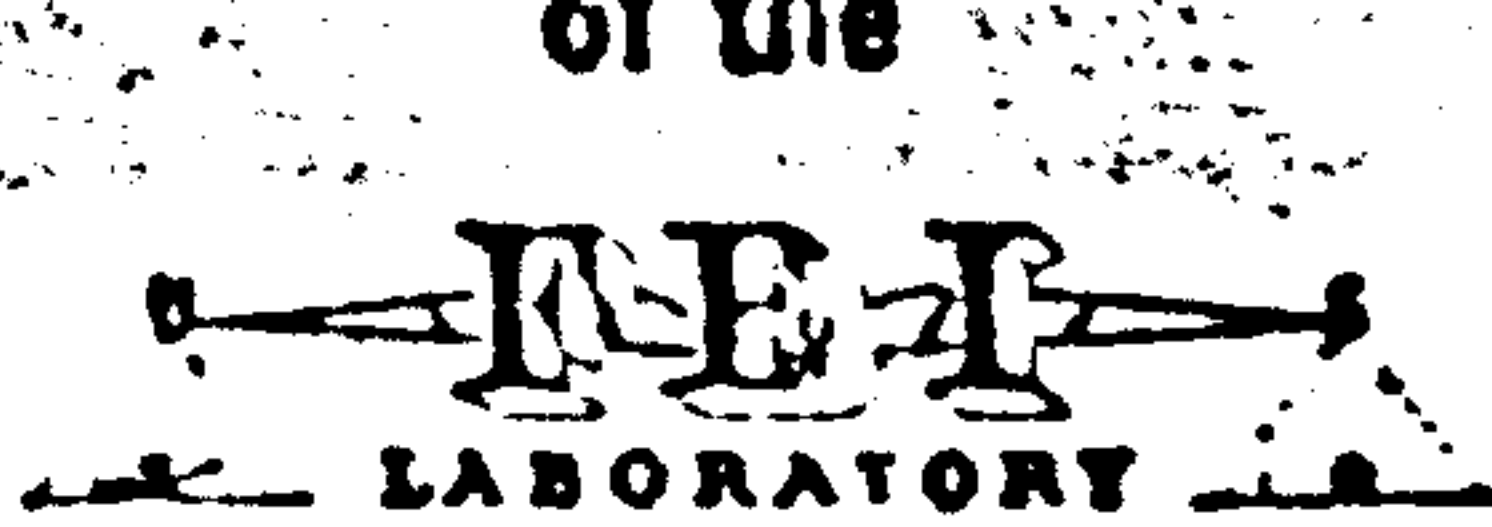

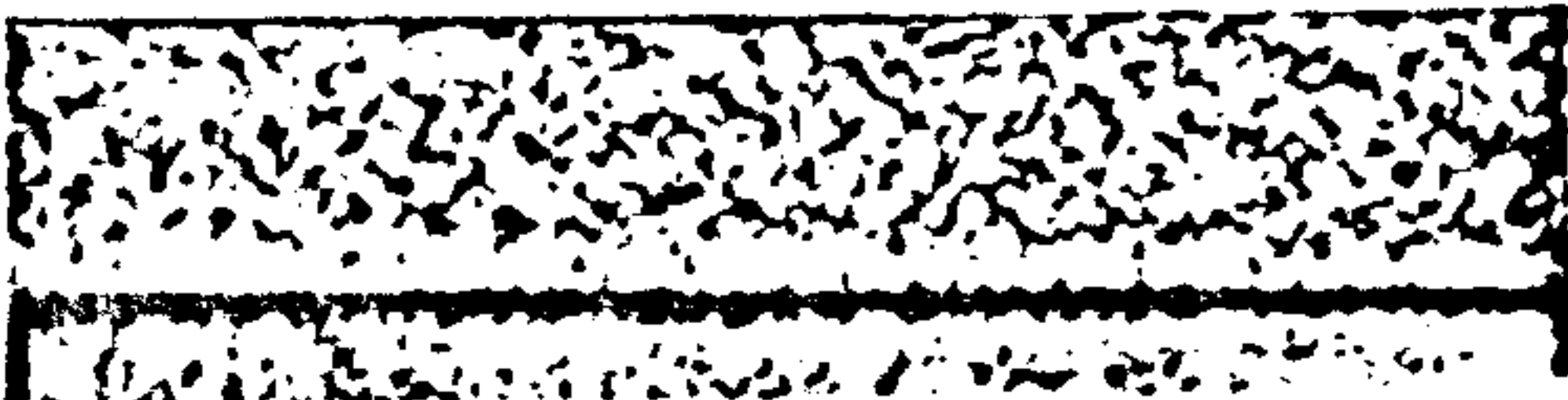

Got your letter of May 7. Robert Morrow may have leveled with you when he acknowledged that he'd used the "Carson" pseudonym by design, however his claim that it was one of Fillmore's aliases "while employed by the CIA" is off base.

As for Congressman "Asshole" Edwards, if he places my two registered letters to him in the same category as those "thousands" of letters received on the topic of the FBI's destruction of Oswald's note, well, uh . . . piss on him, too.

If Edwards and his staff can't find my letter of 11/21/75 (which accompanied the original copy of my affidavit and a certain 42-page memorandum), this should alert him to other possibilities. Along these lines, FBI Director Kelley's carefully worded advisement that no record has ever been found of the receipt of my September 1963 letter to FBI Director Hoover shouldn't have been accepted as the last word on the subject, particularly in view of the record of past cover-ups by that agency. Kelley's reply doesn't mean that the letter wasn't sent anymore than it means that the letter wasn't received.

I have the receipts for almost every letter that I've ever sent by registered mail . . . just as I have duplicates of the letters themselves. You can bet on it. And Kelley, Edwards and all the other liars, cheats and double-crossers had better think about that. The fact that I've never revealed the exact date that my September 1963 letter to Hoover was mailed, or the fact that I've never divulged the full contents of that letter, indicates absolutely zilch. The only remaining thing that I have to say on the subject at this point in time is that my 11/21/75 affidavit, and my stated willingness to undergo a polygraph examination, was the last good-faith gesture that I shall ever make to a representative or official of the United States government. (A xerox copy of my affidavit was also sent to Kelley; I never received a response). Fuck 'em all.

(C) No, I don't.

I think you had best forget about telling any story about me; I don't see how it could be done without having certain matters traced back to me. Besides, who gives a damn?

In a number of my letters to Arthur Gilman Greenstein, I jotted down some cryptic, seemingly silly thoughts under the heading of "cerebrations," which was the only safe way that I could get a portion of what I wanted to say out of prison and on the record, so to speak. Or so I felt. After my release I had cause to believe that I had sent them to the wrong person. Anyway, in looking thru my "Greenstein File" today, I came across one letter containing some of my cerebrations which I feel may be of interest, someday, again, for the record, as the letter was written on 10/13/67. (You'll have to read between the lines, sideways, backward and upside down).

On 5-13-76 at 11:40 p.m. an individual identified himself as _____ telephonically contacted the Jacksonville Division of the FBI and stated as follows:

_____ advised he was calling from the Krispy Kreme Doughnut Shop in Tallahassee, Florida, and desired to furnish information concerning captioned matter. _____ stated he is a Canadian citizen, is a certified psychologist and has lived in Tallahassee for the past year. He advised he came across the information concerning KENNEDY approximately three years ago and since that time it has been a heavy burden on his life.

_____ advised he fears for his life and asked for protection for himself if he furnishes complete details of the information he plans to have; however, he would not furnish much information during this particular telephone call.

During the conversation _____ stated that approximately three years ago there were 10,000 documents (not further described) printed in Belgium which were sent to a fictitious company in Toronto, Canada, and these particular documents had final destination of a junk shop located on Bloor Street in Toronto. _____ stated that these documents contain information pertaining to the assassination of KENNEDY.

[redacted] further advised that a RICK VOGEL, described as a white, female, 5'7" in height, overweight, dark brown hair and who had previously spent approximately six months in the Ottawa County Jail was in some way involved in KENNEDY's assassination. [redacted] was informed that he could call an Agent with the FBI in Tallahassee, Florida; however, [redacted] refused to give his local address or any other descriptive information. [redacted] was furnished with the telephone number of the Resident Agency of the FBI in Tallahassee, Florida, and he stated he would call the Resident Agency at 2:00 p.m. on 5-14-76.

During the telephonic conversation with [redacted] he did not give the impression of being intoxicated and seemed to have control of his faculties.

Jacksonville indices negative on [redacted] and VOGEL.

On 5-14-76 no one contacted the Resident Agency of the FBI concerning captioned matter.

On 5-14-76 observation of the Krispy Kreme Doughnut Company, 1444 West Tennessee Street, Tallahassee, Florida, resulted in the information that there is no public telephone inside the Doughnut Shop; however, there is a pay telephone located some 30 to 40 yards from the Doughnut Shop near the street.

Discreet inquiry at the Krispy Kreme Doughnut Company indicated there is neither an employee nor anyone with any knowledge of a [redacted] or RICK VOGEL.

Perusal of the city directory, public telephone directory and the Florida State University Student and Faculty Directory failed to indicate anyone with the name of [redacted] or RICK VOGEL.

No further investigation being conducted in the Jacksonville Division, UACB.
