[REDACTED] ADVISED THAT IT WAS HIS "PERSONAL OPINION" THAT "CIA, FBI AND SECRET SERVICE AT A HIGH LEVEL WERE INVOLVED IN" THE ASSASSINATION.

WHEN [REDACTED] WAS ASKED FOR SPECIFICS AS TO THIS "OPINION" HE DECLINED TO FURNISH SUCH INFORMATION. THROUGHOUT INTERVIEW HE STATED THAT HE HAD INFORMATION CONCERNING ASSASSINATION OF KENNEDY THAT WOULD "EMBARRASS FBI".

INITIALLY [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT HE WOULD BE WILLING TO TESTIFY BEFORE THE HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS, HEADED BY MISTER SPRAGUE, CONCERNING THE "CONCRETE" INFORMATION HE HAD REGARDING KENNEDY ASSASSINATION. [REDACTED] CONDITION FOR THIS TESTIMONY WAS FOR HIS STATE CONVICTION ON BOMBING CHARGES TO BE DISMISSED BY FBI OR GOVERNMENT INTERVENTION ON HIS BEHALF WITH FLORIDA AUTHORITIES.

[REDACTED] WAS INFORMED FBI COULD NOT ENTER INTO SUCH AGREEMENT.

DURING LATER PART OF INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED] HE RELATED THAT IF THIS CONDITION FOR HIS INFORMATION WAS NOT MET BY END OF THIS WEEK, HE WOULD THEN RELEASE INFORMATION TO MEDIA ON LIMITED BASIS CONCERNING KENNEDY ASSASSINATION AND

IN TURN PROVIDED SIMILAR BUT MORE DETAILED INFORMATION TO HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS. HE ALSO CLAIMED THAT AT SAME TIME HE WOULD FURNISH OTHER INFORMATION RELATING TO CUBAN ACTIVITIES IN SOUTH FLORIDA AND SOUTH AMERICA, WHICH HE ALLEGED WOULD BE OF EMBARRASSMENT TO FBI.

AFTER THE CONTRADICTION IN HIS STATED INTENTIONS IN THIS MATTER WERE DISCUSSED WITH [REDACTED] IT WAS DETERMINED THAT HE INITIALLY MEANT TO ADVISE THAT HE WOULD BE WILLING TO WITHHOLD INFORMATION HE CLAIMED TO HAVE CONCERNING THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION, IN VIEW OF ITS ALLEGED EMBARRASSMENT TO BUREAU, IF FBI WOULD INTERVENE WITH STATE AUTHORITIES CONCERNING THE STATE CHARGE, RESULTING IN THE DISMISSAL OF THE STATE CHARGE AGAINST HIM, OTHERWISE HE WOULD PROVIDE THE INFORMATION HE HAD IN HIS POSSESSION TO BOTH MEDIA AND HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS.

AT THIS POINT, [REDACTED] WITH HIS ATTORNEYS PRESENT, WAS SPECIFICALLY AND UNequivOCALLY ADVISED THAT FBI WANTED HIM TO FURNISH ANY AND ALL INFORMATION HE MIGHT HAVE RELATING TO KENNEDY ASSASSINATION AND OR OTHER MATTERS TO

HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON ASSASSINATIONS, AS WAS HIS
STATED "DESIRE", AND THAT FBI WOULD HAVE NO PART IN HIS
WITHHOLDING SUCH INFORMATION.

AFTER THIS POINT WAS MADE CLEAR TO [REDACTED] HE
ADVISED THAT IN VIEW OF THIS HE WOULD BE WILLING TO
TESTIFY BEFORE THE HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE WITHOUT
CONDITION CONCERNING INFORMATION RELATING TO KENNEDY
ASSASSINATION, THE SPECIFICS OF WHICH HE DECLINED TO
FURNISH FBI.

AT CONCLUSION OF INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED] HE AND HIS
ATTORNEYS WERE INFORMED THAT [REDACTED] STATED DESIRE TO
TESTIFY BEFORE HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE WOULD BE FURNISHED
BY FBI TO APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES.

Dear Vice-President Mondale,

The assassination of President Kennedy plunged this country into a nightmare of twelve years from which we are now only emerging. As the investigation deepens, more strange coincidences, unexplained occurrences, and intelligence lapses come to light. I have not made an in depth study of the Warren Commission Report, but I have read the shortened version. One fact that always stood out in my mind was Nixon's visit to Dallas just prior to the assassination. I direct your attention to page 176 of the Report of the Warren Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy by the McGraw-Hill Book Company. "Mr. Nixon advised the Commission that the only time he was in Dallas in 1963 was on November 20-21, 1963." WHAT WAS NIXON DOING THERE? From my previous letter, you already know my opinion of Nixon. He was the evilest, most vile person this country has produced. Believe me, that man is capable of anything. This problem deserves your most urgent attention.

[REDACTED], also known as [REDACTED]
[REDACTED], Midland, Texas, was interviewed on
March 15, 1977, by Special Agents of the FBI.

[REDACTED] advised he had written a letter to President Carter on February 2, 1977, because he wanted to bring to President Carter's attention some of his thoughts about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, and also to advise President Carter of some recent incidents which had happened to him, and which he considered to be of a suspicious or unusual nature.

He stated he had nothing additional to report since he wrote the letter, nor had there been any further unusual or suspicious occurrences happen to him since that time.

He clarified certain items which he mentioned in his letter to President Carter.

The house which he referred to in his letter as having been broken into was his residence in Katsura, a suburb of Kyoto, Japan. He occupied this residence during the time he was teaching in Japan. This incident occurred in September, 1976, but he did not report it to the Japanese authorities.

After he returned to Midland, Texas, in August, 1976, he went to work for the [REDACTED] which is published in Midland, Texas. He is presently employed with that newspaper in the Photo - Composition Department and his primary duties are proofreading the news and classified sections of the newspaper.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Shortly after returning to Midland, he received telephone calls from representatives of Readers Digest magazine. They were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. They identified themselves as assistants to another Readers Digest official named [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] is apparently in charge or supervising a biography of Lee Harvey Oswald, which Readers Digest plans to publish.

[REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as a critic of anyone who criticizes the Warren Commission report concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Because of the posture [REDACTED] takes, [REDACTED] suspects he may be an agent for, or otherwise connected with, the CIA.

[REDACTED] stated he declined to be interviewed by either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] concerning his prior acquaintance with Lee Harvey Oswald. Shortly after the first of the year, 1977, [REDACTED] was in Midland, Texas, and contacted [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had lunch with [REDACTED] on two separate occasions, and on both occasions, [REDACTED] wanted to interview him regarding Lee Harvey Oswald, but he, [REDACTED], declined to be interviewed. After the occasion of the second luncheon, [REDACTED] told him that he had contacted a Mr. Jim Beamis, (phonetic), who was supposedly the Chairman of the Republican Party in Virginia. [REDACTED] told him the reason he contacted Mr. Beamis was to find out from Beamis if he, (Beamis), knew anyone who might be able to encourage [REDACTED] to talk to him. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that Beamis gave him the name of Jim Allison, who owns the [REDACTED], as well as the name of George Bush, Jr., who is supposed to reside in the Midland, Texas area, and is allegedly the son of George Bush, who was Director of the CIA at that time.

[REDACTED] advised he is not acquainted with either George Bush, Sr. or George Bush, Jr., and he never met Mr. Allison. He stated he has not been contacted by any of these individuals trying to encourage him to consent to an interview with Readers Digest, nor has he been contacted by them for any reason.

[REDACTED] advised that around the same time he started to get telephone calls from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] he also received a call from a [REDACTED] of the "National Enquirer", who also wanted to interview him regarding his association or knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald. [REDACTED] stated he also refused the interview with Mr. Potter.

"[REDACTED] stated he had testified before the Warren Commission in June, 1964, regarding his association with Lee Harvey Oswald during a two-week ocean voyage from New Orleans to Europe in 1959, and told the Commission everything he knew about Oswald, and at that time, his memory regarding that period was more accurate than it would be now, 13 years later. He stated he was at a loss to understand why the Readers Digest was so insistent on interviewing him, as his testimony before the Warren Commission has probably been published in the official Commission report.

[REDACTED] stated that in the latter part of 1976, his mother advertised her house for sale and advertised the sale in the Midland newspaper. He could not recall if his mother's telephone number was listed in the advertisement. Shortly after the ad was placed, two men came to look at the house and after they heard his mother's name was Lela, one of the men mentioned to the other that Lela was a "Persian" name. From that comment, he assumed these two men were Iranians. He stated they both spoke English well, had no discernible accent, and if they did have an accent, it was one that could not be identified. He stated he wanted to bring this matter to President Carter's attention in view of recent published statements that Iranian agents were active in the United States.

In regard to the comments in [REDACTED] letter concerning the information that his mother's telephone had been tampered with, he stated this information had occurred shortly after his last meeting with [REDACTED]. He stated he did not find any signs of forced entry into his mother's house, and was advised that the incident was

not a violation of Federal law and should be reported to the Midland Police Department. He stated he did call the Midland police to report the fact his mother's phone had been tampered with, but the person he talked to told him to call the FBI, but he did not do so. [REDACTED] stated he has had no threats made against him, but was advised that if he had any fear for his personal safety, he should contact the Midland Police Department.
