My staff and I certainly share your concern over the brutal assassination of President Kennedy, and we want to assure you that the full forces of the FBI were immediately deployed to assist the Secret Service and local authorities. In addition, the President has instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibilities in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

Your letter of November 26th has been received, and I want to thank you for giving me the benefit of your observations and comments.

I am a concerned housewife in Dallas County. The word shocked can't even describe how my family and I feel, not only over the brutal slaying of Dr. Kennedy but also over the possibility of twisted justice in the city of Dallas.

I watched the newscasts consistently and throughout the entire time there were constant happenings that to me just do not sound logical. I sincerely hope that there is an answer to them but I think they should be investigated if we are to have a city free of guilt. Below I have listed some of them:

(7) Why was Ruby or anyone allowed near when they were transferring the prisoner especially when they were warned an attempt was to be made on Oswald's life.

(8) Why did Police Chief Curry make such an effort to tell everyone several times when Oswald was to be transferred knowing the condition of minds of the people in Dallas. This makes you wonder if a person accused of an act would have the chance of a fair trial in Dallas.

(9) I am sorry to say that there are hate organizations in Dallas. To name a few: The Righteous Indignation, General Walker who flew the flag of the United States upside-down and the Confederate flag right-side up, and how about the group that Bruce Alger led a few months back against Lyndon Johnson. To me these groups are nothing but mobs and do not represent freedom but are hiding behind freedom of speech but are not giving it to other people.

I believe that Ruby thinks the people of Dallas in their time of grief will think that he did them a favor and help get him free. I believe that there are doubts among some citizens here in Dallas. It would be ironic if the men really guilty of President Kennedy's death would get away when the American people loved him so much.

A copy of the photograph of Oswald referred to above is attached.

By letter 11/24/63, Dallas furnished an enlarged copy of a photograph of suspect Oswald holding a rifle and wearing a pistol strapped to his hip. This enlargement was furnished by Dallas Police Department, the original photograph having been found in the residence of Mrs. Michael R. (Ruth) Paine in Irving, Texas, where suspect's wife has been living. Because the photograph of Oswald shows very little detail, a comparison between the rifle in the picture and the photographs made by us of the murder rifle does not permit definite determination that the gun held by Oswald is the murder weapon. However, based on this comparison it has been determined that the gun shown in the photographs is similar in all respects and possibly depicts the same gun. There is a rather long cut mark on the stock of the murder weapon just above the trigger guard and by use of highlighting we have located a mark on the gun in the photograph of Oswald holding the gun which supports the "possibility" that they are one and the same.

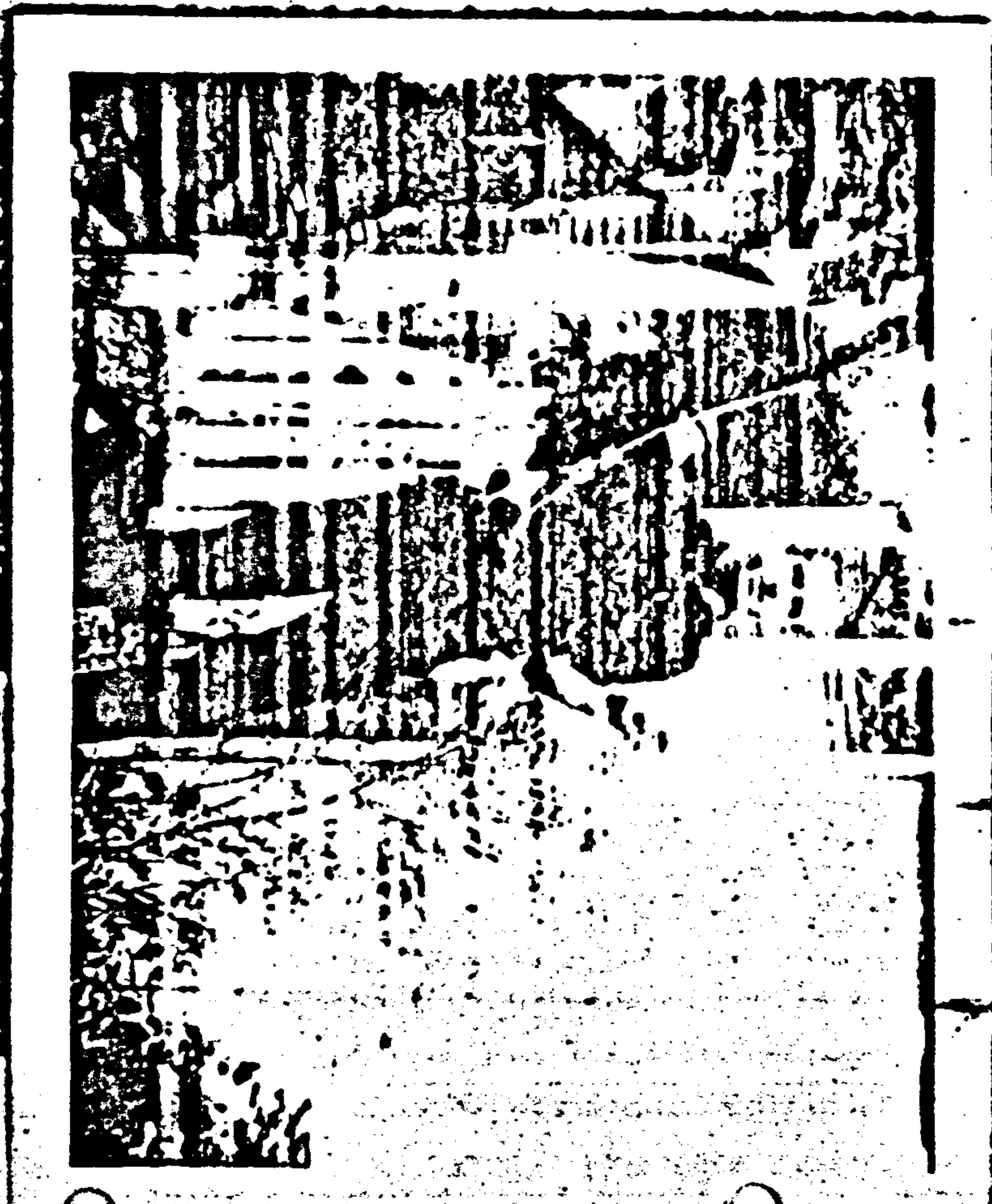

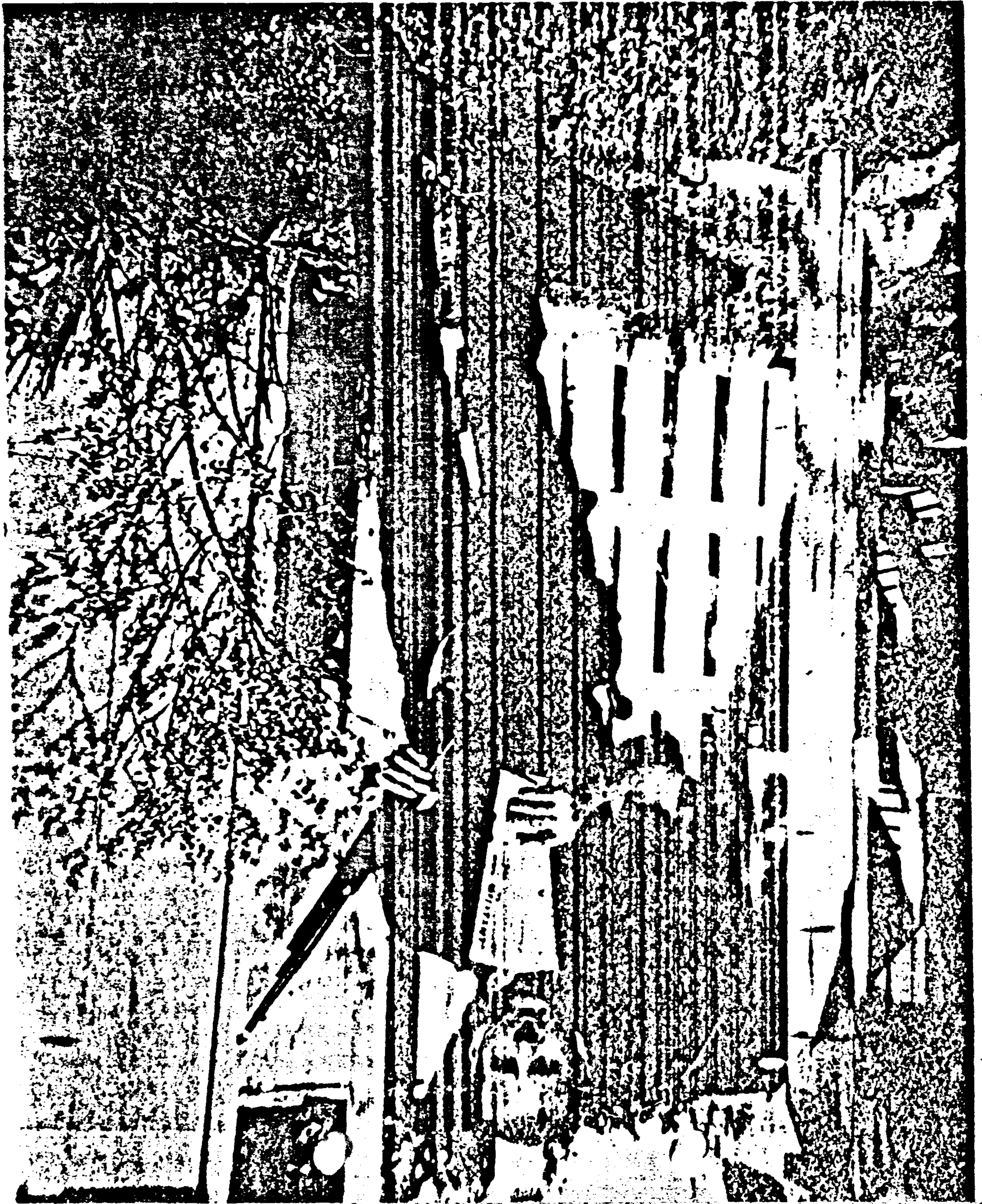

Interview and background information developed strongly suggests that Ferrie, a former Eastern Airlines pilot, is a "crackpot," a description used by acquaintances to describe Ferrie. A preliminary Bureau investigation under a possible Neutrality Act character failed to indicate the existence of any neutrality matter violation by Ferrie.

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach called with reference to the report which is to be submitted by the FBI in relation to the circumstances surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy.

He noted that a tremendous responsibility had been placed on the FBI in this instance by President Johnson because this report, which is to be publicized, is for the purpose of assuring the American public and the world as to what the facts are in Kennedy's assassination and setting to rest the many, many rumors that have been circulating and speculation both in the United States and abroad.

Katzenbach noted in this regard that we are being called upon to, in many instances, prove the negative. For example, he observed that there has been considerable speculation in the press in the United States and in Europe that the assassination was part of a communist or Castro conspiracy. There have also been allegations that Oswald and Ruby were known to each other and were part of a conspiracy. It has been further alleged that Oswald was killed to silence him.

Katzenbach noted that it is, of course, more difficult to prove that something did not occur than to prove what actually happened. As a consequence, it is his belief there might have to be some so-called editorial interpretation. He noted that the report will be subjected to the closest scrutiny by the world-wide press and foreign governmental representatives, as well as by the American people. He knew that we were keeping this in mind in preparation of the report.

As Katzenbach understands it, the report is to be reviewed by the Justice Department and transmitted to the White House. In this regard, he feels it is his responsibility to do this personally for the Department. To this end, he said it would be helpful he would be glad to review and discuss any preliminary drafts, since time is of the essence.

ACTION BEING TAKEN:

From the facts disclosed in our investigation, there is no question but that we can submit in our report convincing evidence beyond any doubt showing Oswald was the man who killed President Kennedy. The problem is to show motive and this, of course, is a condition of Oswald's mind and can be, at best, a speculative conclusion predicated upon circumstantial evidence. Oswald has admitted he was an avowed Marxist. The facts are not clear cut as to his relationship with organized communism, either the Communist Party or the pro-Castro organizations. The Domestic Intelligence Division has been reviewing this very matter so that our report may reflect the factual information we have in this regard. While neither the White House nor the Department should be able to contend that our report does not meet the required purpose, we must be factual and recognize that a matter of this magnitude cannot be fully investigated in a week's time.

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach telephoned and said he had been thinking about questions which might be raised in connection with the report which is to be submitted to the President.

The specific item he had in mind was whether there would be anything in the report as to what the Secret Service did in the way of protective action to fulfill its responsibilities to the President. It was Katzenbach's feeling that this is one question which is bound to arise in the public mind. He recognized that there were security procedures which the Secret Service had which could not be disclosed and that under the circumstances perhaps the Secret Service should be asked to prepare a statement as to their action in this regard which could be incorporated in the report.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It would appear that we would be going far afield from the basic issues involved if tangential matters such as this are to be incorporated in the report. Obviously, you can't throw in everything including the 'kitchen sink.' The Secret Service have already announced publicly they are reappraising their own operation and they should put out directly any information in this regard which warrants publication.

If you approve, Katzenbach will be informed that the question as to what the Secret Service did from a protection point of view to fulfill its responsibilities is not being covered in our report, but it is felt this is properly a matter for the Secret Service to handle.

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach telephoned at 10:50 a. m.

He said he had just completed talking on the telephone with Alexis Johnson, Deputy Under Secretary of State. Johnson told Katzenbach that insofar as the investigation of this matter in Mexico is concerned, the State Department felt this should be coordinated and directed by the FBI. State took the position that the President's directive to the FBI extended to any activity outside of the United States, as well as within the country. Insofar as the Ambassador in Mexico is concerned, Johnson believed he should be kept informed of any pertinent developments but that the Ambassador should not be running the investigation.

As to current developments, Katzenbach said that the last thing he would want would be for the FBI to take Agents away from their investigative duties to prepare reports. He requested, however, that if there were any pertinent developments, he be orally briefed.

With further reference to his conversation with Alexis Johnson, Katzenbach said he had been asked whether the State Department should make a formal inquiry of the Soviet Government for information concerning Oswald and his wife, particularly as to their activities in Russia. He asked that this question be considered by the Director, as Katzenbach felt his views most important.

In thinking about the matter himself, Katzenbach noted if we did not ask the Soviets for information there would be no answer should the question of Oswald's stay in Russia be raised, other than to admit we had made no inquiry. On the other hand, he observed that we could not place any reliance on anything the Soviets said.

Following recommendations are submitted with reference to the points raised by Mr. Katzenbach:

1. Insofar as making a formal approach to the Soviet Government, we believe this undesirable. Such a formal request from the United States will enable the Russians to put out an official statement entirely favorable to them. The United States will have to accept this, since it is in response to our formal request, and we won't be in a position to disprove it. The State Department has responsibility here and we should not dictate the position they are to take, but our views should be stated.

2. In connection with the investigation in Mexico, it is recommended Katzenbach be informed that the State Department and Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) have jurisdiction in dealing with foreign governments and in getting investigative results and intelligence coverage abroad; that while we are cooperating fully with State and CIA in Mexico, the responsibility in this matter should rest with State and CIA.

If approved, Katzenbach will be so advised.

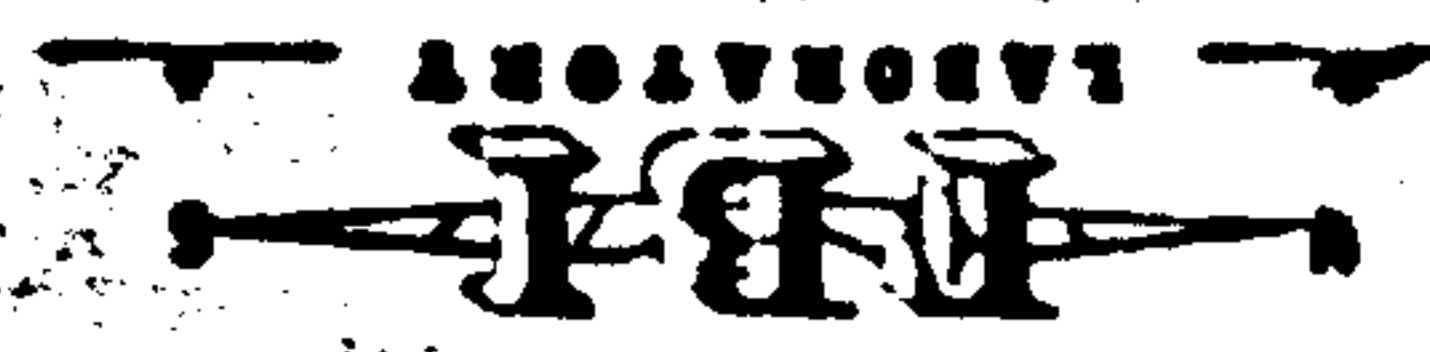

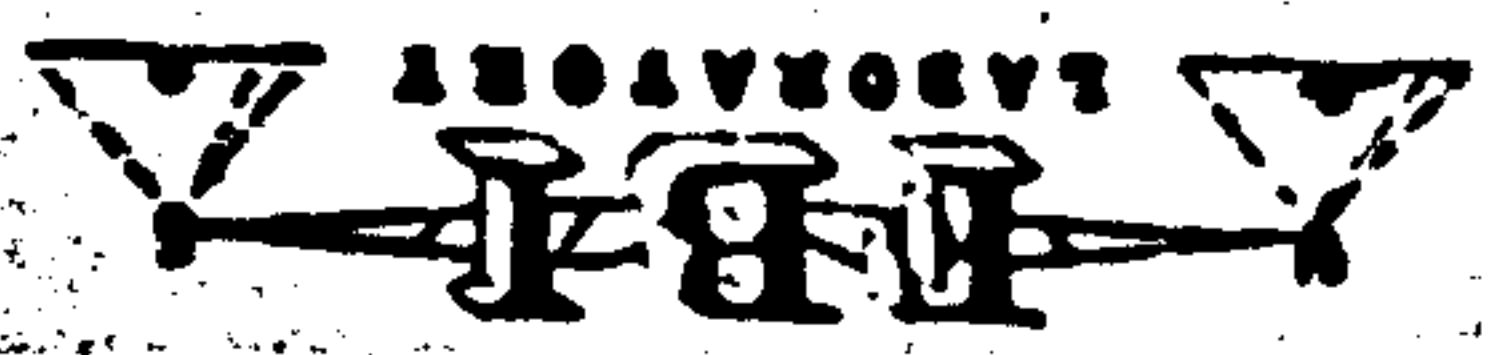

Sergeant PIC lives at 7306 Westville, San Antonio, Texas, with his wife and three small children.

Sergeant PIC stated his father was EDWARD JOHN PIC, but that he does not know where or when his father was born nor whether he is living or not. He stated he does not remember his father at all, it having been his understanding from his mother that they were separated when Sergeant PIC was an infant. He also believed his mother had mentioned that his father was a stevedore.

Although the armored truck could have been placed one full truck length down the ramp toward the point where OSWALD was led out of the jail office, BATCHELOR stated that the decision to park the truck where they did park it was due to the fact that the engine was not operating satisfactorily, and also because the driver, BERT HALL, felt it desirable to hold the front wheels of the truck on a more level grade just outside the entrance rather than take the chance of the brakes not holding this piece of heavy equipment on a steep ramp. Chief BATCHELOR stated that had the brakes not held or had the engine stalled, it would have materially interfered with the scheduled operation of the Police Department to move the prisoner at a most critical moment. He further indicated the route used to move OSWALD after he had reached the basement floor on the prisoner elevator through the jail office space and on to the vehicle ramp, where OSWALD was fatally wounded. OSWALD's killer, JACK RUBY, according to BATCHELOR, gained entrance to the garage by walking down the ramp from Main Street. The outgoing ramp to Commerce Street was blocked by the armored truck and the two police cars.

Mr. BERT HALL, Dallas Manager, Armored Service Co., 800 Leonard Street, Dallas, who was the driver of the armored car hired by the Dallas Police to stand by to move OSWALD, made photographing and detailing for size. Assistant Chief BATCHELOR indicated the exact location of this truck on the outgoing ramp. The body of the truck was inside the building on the ramp, with the front of the truck and driver compartment outside the building. This method of parking permitted the door of the driver's compartment to be fully open at any time. Three officers were stationed at both sides of the truck with instructions to deny admittance to any unauthorized individuals. Assistant Chief BATCHELOR stated that the truck in this position narrowed the entrance considerably and assisted his police officers in keeping maximum guard at this point. He further stated that it was the intention of the police that in the event the van was used (some thought was also given to using a squad car as a decoy), OSWALD would enter the armored compartment from a door located in the rear of the truck. A side door to this truck permits entrance to a center compartment. The driver compartment is completely separated from the two rear compartments.

3-Dimensional Exhibits

A considerable amount of technical data is being gathered which will permit the construction of a very accurate and detailed model of the assassination site and the area in the police garage where OSWALD was killed. The police department has been very cooperative in furnishing aerial photographs, construction plans, etc., which will be most valuable to the Bureau in reconstructing the facts around these two incidents.

Assistant Chief BATCHELOR realizes that the Bureau

is doing a very thorough job in connection with the investigation of the killing of OSWALD and the Department would appreciate very much if a copy of the diagrams that are being prepared by the FBI can be made available to them when possible.

The following comments are made with reference to what appear to be pencil or pen markings as shown on a Photostat of the original map, assisted by the recollections of the Special Agent who did see the original map before it was sent to the Bureau.

Point 3. The markings north of Love Field and north of Loop 12 and above Bachman Lake apparently indicate the route of a Dallas city bus which proceeds north on Denton Road to Lombardy Lane thence east along Lombardy Lane to Webb Chapel Road, along Webb Chapel Road for approximately one block to Community Drive, then southwest to Denton Road and south of Denton Road toward downtown Dallas. This is the terminus of this bus and is known as the Letot bus and the point at Lombardy Lane and Denton Road is the closest point to which a bus goes to Solid State Electronics, 2647 Myrtle Springs, located at the corner of Myrtle Springs and Sparkman Drive, where Oswald was referred to an employer by the Texas Employment Commission on October 8, 1963, the day after the map was given to him.

Point 4. The mark near Farrington Street and Irving Boulevard, which is also designated as Highway 356, appears to indicate the terminus of the Dallas city bus line which extends toward Irving, Texas, along Irving Boulevard. Oswald's wife was living in Irving at that time.

Points 5 and 6. Manpower, Incorporated, an employment agency, is located at 710 Olive Street, Dallas. Don Thibodaux, manager, advised that Oswald has never received a job with this firm, but may have been in the office, in answer to an advertisement which is maintained by Manpower, Incorporated, in both Sunday Dallas newspapers on a continuing basis. He advised that anyone who asks directions to the agency when calling on the telephone is told by him to get on Harwood Street in downtown Dallas and go to the intersection of Harwood and San Jacinto Streets and then go over one block to the corner of Olive and San Jacinto Streets. He does not give them a more specific direction, since the last location is one-half block from the agency. I would like to point out that I have consistently opposed any suggestion for a national police force. One of the results would be that the authority of every peace officer in every community would be reduced, if not eventually broken, in favor of a dominating figure or group at the distant state or national level. A subordinate status for the community peace officer is the exact opposite of what we now require for better law enforcement. Our paramount need at this time is to give the local officers an opportunity to fairly and honestly exercise the authority which they now have by stripping off the spatious public attitude and corrupt political control with which some of them are shackled. If these fetters are removed, the overwhelming majority of our officers will lack neither the ability nor the desire to enforce the law properly in the areas which they serve. The way to break these bonds is by citizen action in the polling places and other public opinion forums available to every community, not by subordinating the sheriff or policeman to some higher authority whose decisions are just as likely to be a reflection of public morals, good or bad, as those of the local officer.

For your information the President has instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibilities in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

The most compelling argument against any move toward a centralization of police power is the danger which it represents to democratic self government. We should not be misled by urbane representations that the power is limited and will be sparingly used. While this may well be the honest intention of those who first advance the proposal, we have good reason to fear a different result. Experience teaches that power once granted to a sovereign authority is seldom relinquished, increased to the limit and extended in scope. It may be a tool of great value when used only for the public good but it can become a vicious weapon in the hands of one who is corrupt. The judgment of history is on the side of those who take the skeptical view.

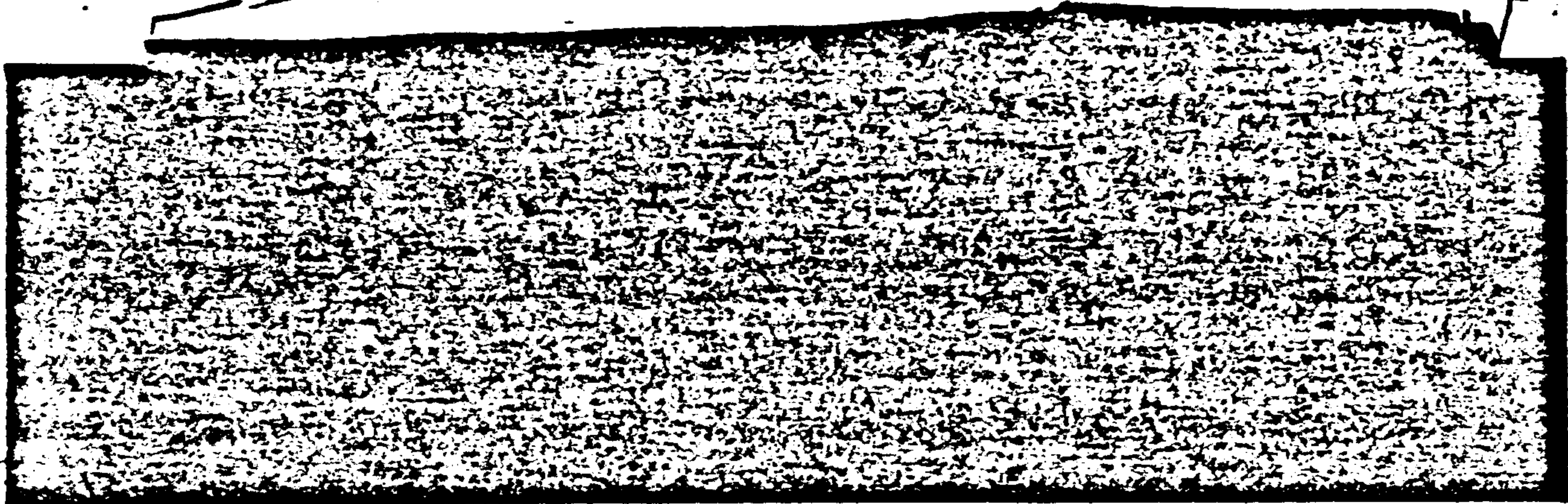

Anderson said the Naval Attache can fly one of our Agents up to Dallas tonight so that the Dallas Office would have the benefit of this. I told him to go ahead and have this done.

I then notified SAC Shanklin in Dallas that SA Ridd would be coming in to Dallas about 1:00 AM in this Navy plane and that Dallas Office should go over the information to see if it would be of assistance.

I also advised SAC Shanklin that one of the bullets that hit President Kennedy had been picked up by Secret Service from the stretcher and we were arranging to get it here in Washington. I also told him that he should continue to make efforts to get any bullets that struck Governor Connolly. I told him that we had made arrangements with Secret Service here to inform Secret Service at Dallas to turn the rifle over to us for ballistics comparison and Dallas should fly the rifle via Agent to Washington at once.
