I talked with SAC Shanklin, at Dallas, this a.m., and advised him that Assistant AG Miller had received word that the local police wanted to turn over evidence in the Oswald case to our Dallas office. We have considered this and feel that we should accept it; therefore, Shanklin should contact Miller and find out who made the offer and follow through on this.

Shanklin called back at 1:15 p.m. to advise that District Attorney Wade had called, and the police had called, and wanted to turn this evidence over to our office. I told him to go ahead and accept it.

Shanklin said that there was voluminous material which our agents had gone through at the police department, although not completely, including boxes of personal possessions, correspondence, camera, etc. It also included material that the police had picked up from Mrs. Paine, the landlady where Mrs. Oswald lived. In view of the amount of material Shanklin said it would be very tedious and a long draw-out job to attempt to itemize each item in these boxes, such as correspondence, etc.

I told Shanklin that the agents should take a look at the material the police picked up from Mrs. Paine, the landlady, and in the absence of anything pertinent it should be left with the police to return to her.

Relative to the effects of Oswald and his wife, these should be accepted, and the important items of evidence, such as the rifle, paper with the palmprint on it, and any items of monetary value, should be individually inventoried. The rest, such as boxes of correspondence, etc., can be described generally, it acceptable to the police. I also told Mr. Shanklin to be sure that agents had personally gone through the room where Oswald used to live, and the place where his wife stayed in the suburbs. I pointed out that it is imperative that we be sure we have picked up any information that will be of assistance in establishing Oswald's associations, his contacts with the Soviet Embassy, the Communist Party, or any other groups of interest, and any indication of his motive for the assassination.

ACTION:

This matter has been closely followed by Liaison and State's answer is still not forthcoming. On the evening of 11/27/63, Liaison at State. Mr. Scott advised that as soon as the Petrucci question was raised by the Bureau on 11/25/63 he immediately discussed the matter in question with the following State Department officials: Ambassador Llewellyn E. Thompson and Director of Intelligence Thomas Hughes. Mr. Scott further advised that based on this talk, a memorandum was prepared concerning the Petrucci matter and is now in the office of the Legal Adviser in view of the fact that there are legal questions involved in the case. Mr. Scott said that he is hopeful to have the final memorandum within the next day or two and will immediately advise the Bureau as soon as he has the details.

Reference is made to the memorandum from Mr. Rosen to Mr. Belmont dated 11/23/63, in the above-captioned matter. This memorandum recorded a telephone call received at the Bureau from Adam Yarmolinsky, Department of Defense. He indicated that in connection with Oswald, another individual comes to mind, namely, Nicholas Petrucci, a Korean War defector. Bureau files show Petrucci renounced his U.S. citizenship while in Moscow as a tourist on 9/3/59 and returned to the U.S. on 9/22/63. The Director asked if it is accepted practice by State Department to allow individuals who have renounced their citizenship to return to U.S.

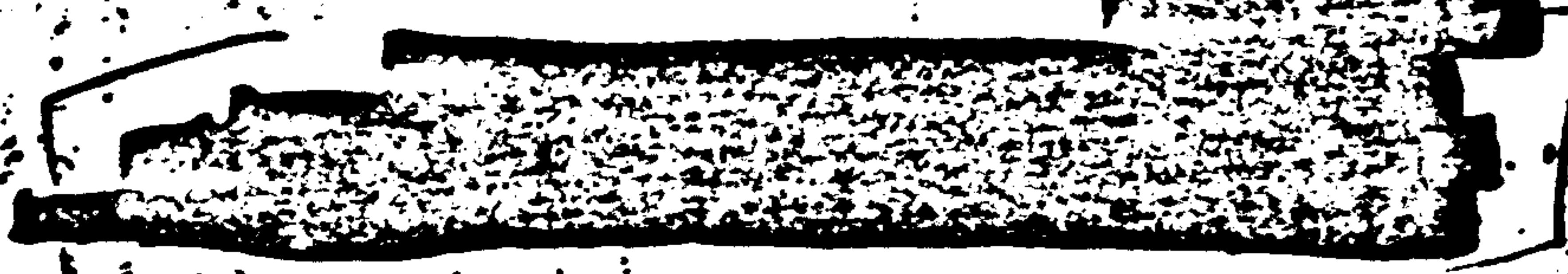

With reference to the attached airtel requesting the Bureau to develop certain exposed film which was made at the Dallas Police Department 11-24 and 25-63 of papers and property of Lee Harvey Oswald and possibly his wife and possibly material belonging to Mrs. Ruth Paine, I talked to SAC Shanklin, Dallas, 11-29-63.

I called to SAC Shanklin's attention the fact that the Dallas Office was furnished the original material which was seized by the Dallas Police Department under search warrants executed 11-22 and 23-63 and pointed out that the original material had been photographed here at the Bureau. I inquired to know whether Dallas still desired to have the Bureau develop the exposed film according to their request. SAC Shanklin stated that Dallas had promised to give a copy of the photographs to both the Dallas Police Department and the Secret Service. In view of this commitment, SAC Shanklin stated that they still need three copies of the photographs of the material in Dallas although it did not matter whether these photographs were made from the exposed film submitted by Dallas or the original photographs made at the Seat of Government.

ACTION:

Refer to the Mechanical Section. In line with the above, Dallas should be furnished three copies of photographs of the evidence which was seized under search warrants.

There were conflicting reports on whether Oswald was a good shot.

There were conflicting reports on the capture of Oswald.

There had been three different reports on the gun with varying details on such matters as the caliber, the place where the gun was found, and whether the gun could be fired 3 times in 5 seconds.

It was not possible to be sure whether Lee H. Oswald was the person who shot the President because Oswald never admitted the shooting and conflicting evidence had been cited to prove he was the assassin.

Lustig had a small file of newspaper clippings on which he based his analysis of the assassination. Lustig made the following observations and conclusions:

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on December 3, 1963, that James Lustig, Chairman of the Communist Party of New Jersey (NJCP), assisted the assassination of President John F. Kennedy for a group of club organizers of the NJCP on December 2, 1963. This source furnished the following information:

The assassin was a "right wing" plot. If Oswald committed the assassination, he was a dupe of the "right wing". Oswald was a "nut". Oswald had twice joined anti-Castro groups, and was certainly not a Marxist. He was writing an anti-Soviet book.)

Oswald was earning \$50 per week and had been unemployed only two weeks before yet \$150 was found in his apartment, so obviously someone was paying him)

-A picture of the shooting of Oswald showed a "sheriff" looking the other way, so Oswald was led to a slaughter in order to silence him.)

"The Worker" had called upon President Johnson for an investigation of the assassination. President Johnson had created a commission for this purpose. This indicated a "new climate" in that the bourgeoisie were now with the "left" forces and not the "right". President Johnson, by setting up the commission, inferred that he lacked confidence in the FBI.)

There was collusion between the FBI, the State of Texas and Dallas police.)

Things look better than ever before for the COMMUNIST PARTY. The people recognize the assassination as a badly handled "right wing" plot. One Congressman had resigned from the John Birch Society because of the assassination and a student in Kentucky had resigned from an organization named "YOUNG AMERICANS FOR FREEDOM".)

Now is the time for the COMMUNIST PARTY to step out.

One CP member present questioned Lusting's logic in concluding that the "right wing" was weaker and the "left wing" was stronger, but others present appeared to agree with Lusting.)

ACTION:

Mr. Scott said he realized that the Petrucci case was requested specifically by Liatson; however, Undersecretary Bail instructed that this matter be included in the over-all State Department report. He indicated that the report is for the Bureau but will be transmitted from the Secretary of State to the Attorney General as dictated by protocol. He further advised that if there is any delay in our obtaining the report he will make the Petrucci information available separately.

This matter has been followed daily by Liatson. My memorandum to you dated November 29, 1963, reports the details of this. On December 2, 1963, Liatson determined from Mr. Joseph W. Scott, Deputy Director, Bureau of Intelligence and Security, State, that the Petrucci matter, as well as other detectors in the same category have been studied at great length at State and the details concerning these cases, including the legal ramifications, are being reported in State's over-all report which will go to the Attorney General in the Oswald case. According to Mr. Scott, this report should be in the hands of the Attorney General before the end of the current week.

Since we do not disclose developments in connection with our investigations, I will not be able to answer your questions.

Immediately following the assassination the full resources of the FBI were made available to the Secret Service and local law enforcement agencies. The President has instructed the FBI to conduct a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. I can assure you that this Bureau will discharge its responsibilities in this regard with the same thoroughness and dispatch that have characterized our investigations in the past.

I have received your letter of November 28th and understand your concern over the brutal assassination of President Kennedy.

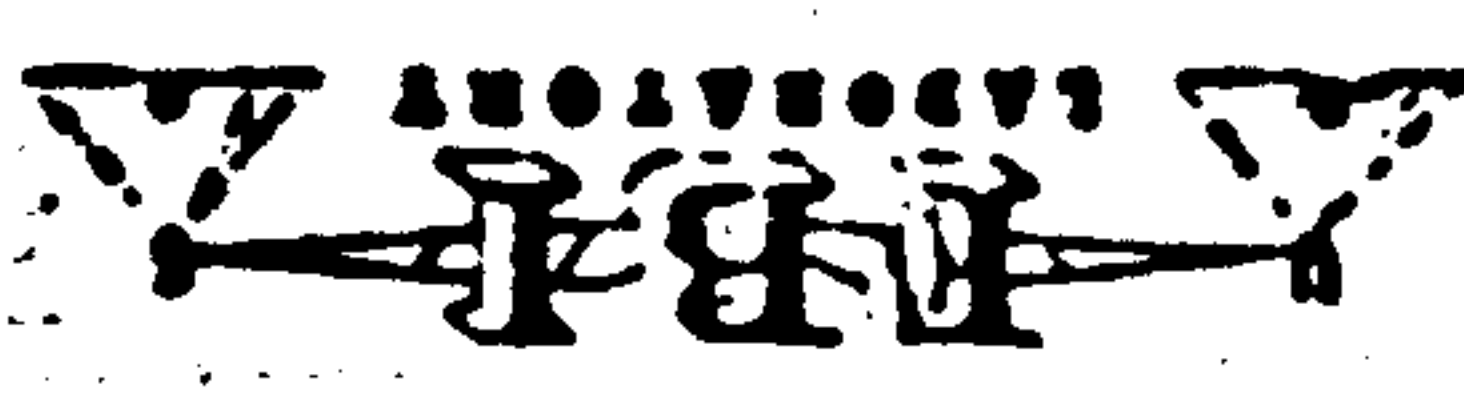

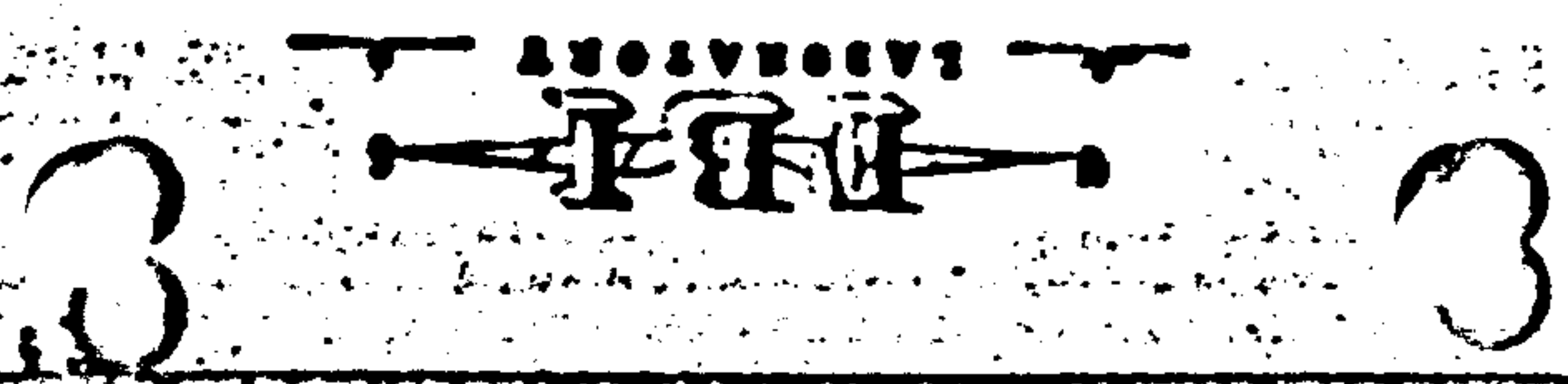

Due to the difficulty of properly examining the handwriting characteristics in a non-Latin alphabet language, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether the letters written in Russian and signed M. Oswald or Marina Oswald in Q176 were written by MARINA OSWALD, whose purported known writings appear in K44.

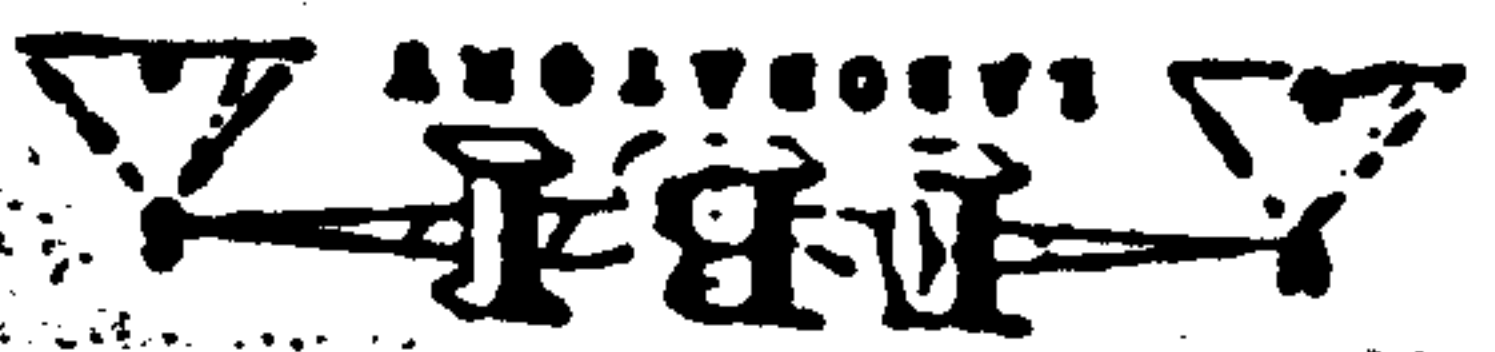

On Oct. 4, 1963 I was in the Carousal Club in Dallas, Texas, and while there I heard Jack Ruby talking to a man using the name of H.L. Lee. These men were talking about plans to kill the Governor of Texas. This information was passed on to the Texas Department of Public Safety on Oct. 5, 1963 by telephone. On Sunday Nov. 24, 1963 I definitely realized that the picture in the Nov. 23, 1963 Dallas Times Herald of Lee Harvey Oswald was a picture of the man using the name of H.L. Lee whose conversation with Jack Ruby I had overheard back on Oct. 4, 1963. I thereafter attempted to recall as much of the Oct. 4, 1963 conversation with as much accuracy as possible, and to reduce it to writing. The enclosed original and two copies of this report are true to the best of my own personal knowledge and belief, and this report is sent to you for whatever use it may be in assisting the F.B.I. in your current investigation. If and when you see it, I have no objection to the copies of this report being sent by you to the District Attorney of Dallas County and to the Attorney General of Texas, and to any other officials to whom you may see fit to disclose this information. My only request is that my identity remain undisclosed as long as possible.

Having been asked & involved in several ways to inquire into the President's death & in the matter of this ad, can't you take the opportunity to speak in our defense of the facts & evidence would support you? As you can & have attacked crime & Communism certainly you can find the means to make an appeal for reason based upon what you would find. I am sincerely convinced that it is of vital importance to this country's future (that we both love) that you do criticism is not disloyal; opposition is not treason; political interest is

The President's death is being exploited to stifle criticism, persecute those who are trying to save our Republican form of government & to further the Socialist legislation that is taking us on the sure road to Communism. I can speak for the Society but I can still say that in writing you I have full evidence that we can stand investigation, publicity & inquiry & true facts & completely presented bother us not at all. You will remember Alger Hiss that Howard K. Smith was criticized for having him on to discuss Nixon (III) the time of the last election. This man hates the Right who quite properly revolted at this interview. I heard him at the time of Kennedy's funeral & the hate of his critics came out in his hypocritical placing of "blame".

There seems to be ample evidence that Oswald was involved with Communism & not a good citizen. The press & TV now scream at the "radical right"!!!!!! Room here for full documentation but I have the clippings to prove it.

Consider: The AP report describing us as "militant". All of the talk about leftist of both sides yet all attacks & examples refer primarily to us. As that ad, I haven't read it in full but there is nothing improper about any group reminding a President of what they consider mistakes & certainly Cu is a pretty legitimate target. In California a petition is being circulated about a Fair Housing Act & this is described as "inciting race hatred" etc. 3 million people choose to sign this it is then a legal way to proceed. We impeachement of Earl Warren. Many people don't approve of Court action that favored the Reds who would destroy us! action on prayer in schools or in the the FBI in its efforts but, in any case, to seek impeachment is a legal this As to that ad, both unions but in particular the Civil Rights advocates have published & said what could be construed as thinly veiled threats of riot & violence but no loud voice screams for their persecution. (The Society isn't against negroes either). In Los Angeles a public board just rejected appli action to speak at a school by a member of "Fair Play for Cuba" NOT because was a Communist (they have let them speak) but because this Committee is involved with the name Lee Oswald. Mr. Hoover, how myopic can officials be?

Before Kennedy's tragic death but far worse now we are becoming the target of the forces you have fought are out to get the "radical right" which is the target of other conservative groups of course.

Since the FBI is the general investigative agency of the Federal Government and neither makes evaluations nor draws conclusions as to the character or integrity of any organization, publication or individual, I trust you will understand why I am not in a position to comment along the lines you have suggested.

In response to your request, I have commented generally regarding the need for opposing communism rationally and intelligently. Our efforts to deal effectively with this subversive menace are not enhanced by those of the extreme right who tend to alix the communist label without intelligent analysis, or by those of the extreme left who endeavor to minimize the real danger of communism. In speaking of the extreme right, I refer to those individuals who would violate our laws to obtain their objectives. I consider them as lacking in true Americanism as those of the extreme left who would also violate our laws to achieve their own ends.

I have received your letter of November 30th and can understand the concern prompting your communication. I also want to thank you for your generous remarks concerning my administration of the FBI. It is hoped that our future endeavors will continue to merit your support and approval.
