Bayside, Queens, New York (NY), a Professor at [REDACTED] College in NY, advised that while he was doing research at the University of Virginia on a book called [REDACTED], which has since been published by [REDACTED] Publishing, he and his wife, who was also assisting him, ran across a letter in the papers of Senator HARRY BYRD of Virginia addressed to BYRD from H. L. HUNT, 1704 Main Street, Dallas 1, Texas. This letter was dated July 11, 1963.

He said that in view of recent allegations in the newspapers, that H. L. HUNT may have been in some way involved in a plot to assassinate President JOHN F. KENNEDY on November 22, 1963, the content of this letter immediately came to his recollection, particularly the portion which was underlined in the letter and he contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to bring it to official attention. [REDACTED] furnished a copy of this letter with the portion underlined and it was noted that this underlined portion read "Dr. Edward [REDACTED] recently told me, and he is probably right, there is no chance to get the Kennedy's out unless they are defeated in 1964". [REDACTED] conceded that everything that was written prior to this statement and subsequent to this statement was strictly in a political context and the entire letter bore on the removal of KENNEDY through the electoral process and he conceded that the entire letter was strictly political in content. He further stated that this letter could only be part of a circumstantial case to show motivation if, in fact, the original allegations against HUNT were correct. He did agree that the letter in and of itself was not solid evidence of any wrongdoing on the part of HUNT. He further advised that he found nothing prior to or subsequent to this letter in BYRD's papers pertaining to the specific plan outlined by HUNT to BYRD in this letter.

Dear Senator Byrd:

These are unusual times and I believe that party loyalty should be set aside in hopes of saving our freedom. The South can no longer depend on a coalition to safeguard against bad legislation. It is often said you cannot beat someone with no one and at present the polls indicate Kennedy will still be a formidable candidate.

The Republicans must nominate a candidate as strong or stronger than Goldwater. I think that Dirksen would be powerful and acceptable to the South. If it becomes apparent that the Republicans will nominate an acceptable candidate, there should be an agreement between constructive Democratic leaders in the Southern states and the Republican party machinery in each Southern state whereby they agree to support the same slate of Presidential electors.

The fact that there could be many non-Kennedy members of the Electoral College elected in the South might not at all result in the defeat of Kennedy, but if it became apparent that many Republican electors could win in Southern states, it would add great strength to the Republican ticket in certain Northern states which Republicans might not otherwise carry. If this situation develops, the Republicans would not have to carry nearly as many Southern States as would otherwise be required for Kennedy to be defeated. The chances for the Republicans to carry Wisconsin, Michigan, and Illinois will be vastly improved if they can safely depend on 75 or more electoral votes from the South.

The state is the entire future of the Nation. Dr. Edward Teller recently told me, and he is probably right, there is no chance to get the Kennedy's out unless they are defeated in 1964.

Democratic Governors and Members of Congress would be justified in picking a critical time and announcing a change of party, just as other elected officials have changed their party affiliation in the past. If only a few Southern statesmen would announce that they hereafter were Republicans it would start a landslide and elect a Republican President. The move would force such Republicans as Senator Case of New Jersey out of the Republican party and it would become the highly constructive party the nation needs.

I do not wish a reply to this letter. I am writing some other outstanding Democrats and would prefer that my name not be mentioned as you discuss the best moves to save the nation with other prominent Democrats of the South.

On March 2, 1977, [redacted] author and historian, [redacted] Bayside, New York, telephonically contacted the Washington Field Office of the FBI, Washington, D.C. and stated that in the process of researching material for his book "[redacted]" he went over the Byrd papers of Senator Harry Byrd of Virginia. In those letters are several letters from H. L. Hunt. One of the letters from Hunt to Senator Byrd relates to the disposal of Kennedy "in 1964". [redacted] stated this letter and others may have some connection with the assassination.

[redacted] advised the letters of Senator Byrd are now at the University of Virginia at Charlottesville. The library number of the letter in question is Box 270. The letter is quoted in [redacted] book, "[redacted]", on Page 217.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Mrs. [REDACTED], [REDACTED]
Jackson Heights, New York furnished the following infor-
mation.

Mrs. [REDACTED] advised that she has
in her possession a New York Times article dated
November 23, 1975, concerning the President John F.
Kennedy assassination. Accompanying the article is one
photograph of John F. Kennedy and Mrs. Kennedy, and
Governor John Connally and Mrs. Connally taken in San
Antonio, Texas, the day before the assassination. Mrs.
[REDACTED] pointed out that in the photograph there is an
individual whom she identifies as resembling her ex-
husband, [REDACTED], and also an individual whom
she described as resembling Lee Harvey Oswald. Mrs.
[REDACTED] advised that she married [REDACTED] on
March 29, 1969, at Henderson, Nevada, by the Justice of
the Peace. She further advised that she divorced [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] approximately one year later, March 28, 1970.

Mrs. [REDACTED] further stated that her ex-husband, [REDACTED], admitted to her as being in San Antonio, Texas, at the time of the assassination, but never made any mention of an acquaintance with Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby. Mrs. [REDACTED] then stated that her husband always spoke discouragingly against John F. Kennedy and many times stated, "JFK, he got what he deserved."

Mrs. [REDACTED] described her ex-husband as a pathological liar and an alcoholic, and an extremely unstable person, who is an extreme right winger, and who also spoke very highly of the KKK, but never openly admitted to being a member of the Klan.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that her ex-husband had no friends so to speak of and could not provide any names which might be helpful in this matter.

Mrs. [REDACTED] further stated that her ex-husband lived in Del Rio, Texas, at the time of the assassination, and was married to a [REDACTED]. She also stated that her ex-husband admitted to her of having intelligence background but would not say anything more about that. He also admitted to her making numerous hunting trips to a Mexican town about 100 miles southwest of Del Rio, Texas, but would not divulge any more information concerning it; but she implied that it is possible that they were connected with his intelligence background.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated her last known contact was in April or May, 1970, and the purpose of this contact was to have him sign their tax returns for the previous years.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that her ex-husband's family still lives in Ohio, but doubts sincerely that they would

know his whereabouts because he openly admitted to her that he hated his family and has never spoken to them in recent years.

Mrs. [REDACTED] advised she was not out for any revenge because of her divorce with Mr. [REDACTED], but just wanted to clear her conscience concerning the photographs.

Dear friend;

Will again write you. Now I wrote you Feb. 6, 1977 and Feb. 19, 1977. I am the one who wrote you about the shooting death of pres. John F. Kennedy or sent you the information in regard to the shooting. Now I was looking through my carbon copy of the letter that I wrote you to make clear a few things. For a rundown of my last letter I wrote that Frank Venable was the trigger man who fired the three shots and Joseph Rhoads was a Ft. Worth policeman who was also with Frank Venable. Now Rhoads was with the Radar unit or department at one time was a policeman at the time of the shooting but for the last

year or two he has been seen
more out of uniform than in
also in his own car and not
a police car. So at the present
time I am not sure if he is
still with the police department
I am sure you would be able to
find this out. Now for more
information Frank Venable's
father was also involved.
He was a detective. He at one
time worked with the Shepherd
agency. I'm not sure if I spelled
Shepherd the way they might
have it listed but it is
called Shepherd agency it
was located on Grand ave.
in Ft. Worth. This man later
left this agency and went
into a detective on his own.
For example Stanley Venable is
one of the names that he
has used but I have heard
him being called by a lot of
other names. A friend of mine
owned or managed a cafe on

33rd Street and N. Main it was called the Courtown Drive in since then the drive in has been renamed. Now these people who managed this cafe hired Frank Venable's father as a detective to do some work for them in running down so people. This is how I knew that this man was badged.

These Venables use to live about six houses or seven houses from my house at 3317 N. W. 28th St in Ft. Worth. However through other people I didn't run around with any of them just knew them and spoke to them. Now I gave you a list of car tag

C.W.M-81. Now the reason that I sent these tag numbers to their car is that these people go by so many different names. There are other people with these people who also was involved their names are or they use different names one person knows it

then by one name then another person knows these same people by still a different name. Now my step mother use to run around with these people but still they gave her another name.

My step mother's name is ~~_____~~ she

and my father has been divorced since 1952 but she left El Paso, Texas before the divorce papers could be served on her. She left El Paso, Texas with some of the people.

I also lived in El Paso a few months but I left El Paso a few years before my father. My family and I came from the State of Maine but I came to live in Ft. Worth my first time in 1951 and through my ex step mother is how these people found me. I have had a few to come to see me. This is also how I found out about the shooting. Also have seen pictures of the shooting. Now to make you understand something I do not like these people. My ex step mother told them that I was her daughter instead of step daughter. These people have acted something awful around me and I do not like it. Any way they thought that they had to get buff. You see Mary Ruth told them that my father had owned a large

track of land in the State
of Maine they have been
after me for this track of
land. In the first place
my father's uncle was the
one who had the land, we
also live this until me,
came down here. Now to
get back to the shooting about
two days before the shooting
these people went over to
Dallas and went through
a run through of the shooting
This was done so everyone
would know what their parts
of action was and where
and what to do. These people
also took pictures of this like
wise. Some of these people
four were women they went
right into the Parkland
Hospital to see that the job
was done, they were to call
some of the members who
were left at home to let them
know that the pris. John

F. Kennedy was dead. I
also told you in my last
letter that these people
were of the Satanic order.
This is also one of the reasons
that Kennedy was shot.
Now I have been trying to
get the information through
since 1975. Every time I
report anything or went
to any legal office one of these
people would take and
get Mr. Verable or use his
badge and go to the same
places and tell them that
they will handle it what the
matter was. This was done
to keep you from picking them
self's. I myself do not take
dope nor have I been in
trouble this you may look
into if you care to. Now as I
also told you in my last
letter these people have
moved to 2800 N. W. 19th and
2802 N. W. 19th St in Ft. Worth

In my last letter I also told
you about a hook up that
these people had or has.
Also these people has had
one good laugh after an
other on how they got away
all of these years and have
never been picked up for
what they have done. Every
time Lee Harvey Oswald's
name or the James Ray names
hits the paper these people
throw them self a party and
get drunked up, boy! Frank
Venable doesn't live with these
people one of his daughters does
or did. He has been seen visiting
this address that I gave you.
He means Frank Venable.
None of these people are any way
related to me only the Mary Ruth
Crocker that was one time
married to my father Raymond
A. Crocker. The Mary Ruth
Crocker also doesn't live with
these people she can be found

through Social Security. She
would be getting her checks as
she is about 67 or 68 yrs old.
I haven't seen her in some
time now. She lived with
these people at one time. She
also had a son by the name
of James Roy Dill who also lived
with these people. John
Connelly ^{Connelly} as well as Sen. Edward
Kennedy have been watched
by these people with their
hook up. These people might
be reading every line I write but
anyway it is my duty to inform
you. I have been short at
three times by these people
so far. Now to save time I'm
going to mail this letter to
your office in Washington.
The last two letters were
mailed to the U. S. Court house
in Ft. Worth, Texas to the
Federal Bureau of Investigation
If for further information contact
them. Now on the back side if you

like to do a run down on me
I'll give you the information
as you may do so. I also
live at Lake Worth Mobile Home
Park. Trailer #30. Now.

On April 14, 1977, [REDACTED],
[REDACTED], Fort Worth, Texas,
advised as follows:

[REDACTED] a white female, born on
December 4, 1932, in Alna, Maine, has been employed
by Tandy Communications, 701 North Hampton, Fort Worth,
in assembly line work since March 9, 1976. Her
husband, [REDACTED] is employed by American Manufacturing
Company, Fort Worth, and her daughter,
Anthony, sixteen years of age, lives at [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Fort Worth, with her father, [REDACTED]

On the day of the assassination of President
John F. Kennedy in Dallas, Texas, she watched, in shock,
scenes of the assassination being replayed over television.
She recalled that an announcer stated, "There are two
men up there on the railroad trestle that did the
shooting". She observed that one of these men was
wearing glasses and the other man, who was short
and dark complected, wore black pants and shirt. Three
shots were fired from a left front direction at the
approaching presidential automobile, after it had
gone by the railroad trestle. The president was not
shot near the Texas Book Depository Building. She did not
get a good look at the two men on the railroad trestle,
therefore she could not identify the men.

In 1965, she, the [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] lived in a one-family private residence at
[REDACTED] in Fort Worth. Two white
male individuals, later identified as Frank Venable and
James Brown, who then resided down the street from her at
[REDACTED], were observed by her
to climb a telephone pole in back of her house each
night at separate times, usually from 11:30 p.m.
to 1:00 a.m., and from 4:30 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. This
went on nightly, then weekly, and finally monthly.
They were not telephone repairmen and they had no tools,
but they had flashlights. They seemed to jiggle and
push a round "jigger" back and forth. She called the
telephone company; however they reported nothing
was wrong with the telephone pole or her telephone. She
nevertheless hired [REDACTED] Investigations and
Security, [REDACTED] Building, Fort Worth, to check
her house for telephone taps. Baily located no taps
on her telephone, but reported that there must be an "AM

frequency" running through her house, but she knew she had no AM or FM radio.

[redacted] advised that, without a doubt, a wire going from a "power jack table" to the telephone power box, allowed "them", at 3406 Northwest 28th Street, to tune into her house by just dialing her telephone number. "They" called her house several times and told her personal and private information concerning her, like the exact amount of money she had in her bank account, and persons she had talked to during the course of the day. From their "power jack table", they hot-wired a line to their radar sending unit and transmitted, by "radar and somascope", beams that "burn the fool out of you". She said that the "somascope", according to a medical book, uses a thin stream of ultra-high sound waves which probe and picture on a TV screen, the internal soft organs of the human body. "They" have transmitted these beams against her for years and are continuing to this day, to transmit these burning beams against her.

[redacted] advised that these individuals are "Satanics", in that they are against the Christian religion. They are attempting to get land and money to colonize their own kind into a commune where they can practice their sadistic ways and use narcotics. They are always "drunk and doped up". They must believe that she, [redacted], has some property in Maine, her native state; however, she has no property or anything of a monetary value in Maine. She advised that her father, [redacted], married [redacted] on November 27, 1947, in Maine; however, they were divorced in 1952, and her father now resides in a small house behind a larger house at [redacted] Fort Worth. Mary Ruth, now about 69 years of age, got acquainted with these people and she falsely told "them" that she, Mrs. Cisneros, owned a large tract of land in Maine. "They" shot at her three times, in 1968, 1974, and 1975, hoping to scare her, hoping she would "renounce her Lord", and hoping to get her land in Maine, which she does not have. She advised, "The Satanics beam their 'radar and somascope' rays against your private areas."

"They" also had an air compressor generator in their house which they used to shoot out gushes of hot burning air, through her home air conditioning system. She still gets these hot burning air gushes through her air conditioning unit, that they send to her. She sealed the windows of her current home, a house trailer, with aluminum foil and she stuffed the cracks with rags, however she still gets the burning rays and the bombarding rays beamed on her metal trailer which sound like the tapping sounds of constant rain. She believes the laser beams are directed to her television antennae and metal house trailer. These beams have caused her sudden and severe illness, pulsating pains all over her body, and short periods of complete blindness.

[REDACTED] advised that, from her former residence, [REDACTED] t, she was able to observe, through her highpowered field glasses, inside the house at 3406 Northwest 28th Street, where "they" lived or visited. She was able to observe "all this stuff" in their house which they used to transmit the "radar and somascope" rays and beams on her. Two years ago, she attempted to tape some of their telephone calls to her house, but their beams burned out the batteries to her recorder. Her walkie talkie that she had tuned in to their house, was also burned out by their beams, their beams acting like a geiger counter. At times, when she placed her walkie talkie on the floor by her bed and placed her shoes over her walkie talkie, "they" could not see her walkie talkie, and therefore their beams did not burn out her batteries and she could hear what was going on inside their house. She believes she heard some of their conversation in their house from her house over her walkie talkie, through a combination of laser beams and radar coming from their house. She was unable to explain how this, technically, could be accomplished. Nevertheless, in the Spring of 1975, she heard "them" talking over her walkie talkie, exclusively, not through any personal contacts with them or through any secondhand information, about their "dry run" before the assassination of President Kennedy. Her walkie talkie had picked up their conversation, over a block away, in their house from her house. She heard "them" talk about what their plans had been, that after the shooting of Kennedy, one picked up the rifle, another covered the rifle and took it from the scene,

and another remained with the running get-away automobile, and drove them from the scene. She also heard some voices which sounded like female voices, which she believed said something like they went to Parkland Hospital in Dallas, where Jackie Kennedy was after the shooting, to see if Kennedy was dead. She believed that these women were "readers or psychics" by the way they talked.

Further, over her walkie talkie, from her house to "their" house, it sounded like, from their conversations, that Frank Venable, wearing khakis and a white dress shirt, while lying on the ground, fired the shots at the Kennedy automobile. Joseph Rhoades, a former radar officer with the Fort Worth Police Department, with black hair slicked back, wearing black pants and a white dress shirt, was lying alongside Venable when Venable fired the shots. Venable used Rhoades's rifle, a "Rhoades" rifle, and Rhoades did not fire any shots. Rhoades was Venable's backup man if Venable had "chickened out". Horrace Stanley Venable, father of Frank Venable, wearing khaki pants, white dress shirt, a brown fedora hat and wire rimmed glasses, was standing behind Frank Venable and Rhoades. She did not see the Venables or Rhoades on the day of the assassination, and she could not say how they were dressed on that day.

[redacted] described Frank Venable as a white male, born December 6, 1934, 6'2", medium build, dark brown hair, hazel eyes, dark-rimmed glasses, wide spaced front teeth, divorced, father of three daughters, a truckdriver, employed in 1965 by Four Stop Auto Supply in River Oaks, Texas. Reportedly, Frank Venable is incarcerated in some prison on a narcotics charge.

[redacted] described James Brown as a white male, age in late twenties, 5'11", medium build, brown eyes and straight brown hair. Frank Venable has a brother, Donald Venable, age in twenties, 6', curly hair and a truckdriver.

The Venables, or some of "them", now reside in two houses at 2800 and 2802 Northwest 19th Street, Fort Worth.

They have a lot of automobiles around their houses, and during the past year, she had driven by these houses, and copied license numbers of automobiles parked in the area of these addresses. These license numbers were set out in her letter of March 12, 1977.

[REDACTED] advised that she had expended a sizeable amount of money in hiring other detective agencies to investigate "them", however they had not given her any satisfaction. She advised that several weeks ago, she telephonically called Washington, D.C., to speak to someone on the Congressional Committee Investigating Assassinations. She spoke with some unidentified female and she told her about what she had observed over television about Kennedy's assassination, and about the "Venable bunch". The lady advised that she would refer the information to the committee. On Wednesday, before Easter, 1977, she received a call from an individual, who stated that he was an attorney in Dallas, Texas. He said that he had received a call from Washington, requesting that he call her concerning some information she had previously furnished. She gave the attorney a complete run-down on all the information she had concerning the Kennedy assassination and the "Venable bunch". The attorney told her that she should be interviewed; however, she had not been further contacted concerning this matter. She advised that, due to the lapse of time since the attorney called her, she doubted that she would be personally contacted concerning her information.
