MRS. JESSE JAMES GARNER, FOUR NINE ONE ONE ONE MAGAZINE STREET,  
ADVISED THAT OSWALD'S RENT WAS DUE ON THE NINTH OF EACH  
MONTH, HOWEVER, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE MONTH-S RENT WHICH  
HE PAID ON MAY NINTH LAST, HIS RENT PAYMENTS WERE ALWAYS  
PAID ONE OR TWO DAYS AFTER THE NINTH OF THE MONTH BECAUSE HE  
HAD TO BE ASKED FOR HIS RENT MONEY. MRS. GARNER ADVISED THAT  
MRS. BLAINE GREGORY, THE OWNER OF THE APARTMENTS, PREPARES  
THE RENT RECEIPTS FOR ALL THE APARTMENTS AT THE BEGINNING  
OF THE MONTH AND GIVES THEM TO HER. WHEN A TENANT PAYS HIS  
RENT MRS. GARNER GIVES THE TENANT THE RENT RECEIPT.  
MRS. GARNER DOES NOT KEEP ANY RECORD OF ACTUAL DATES PAYMENTS  
MADE AND TURNS MONEY OVER TO MRS. GREGORY SEVERAL TIMES  
DURING THE MONTH. SHE RECALLED DURING PERIOD OSWALD WAS  
WORKING HE USUALLY SPENT WEEKENDS AT HOME. SHE RECALLED  
THAT ONE WEEKEND HE AND HIS WIFE LEFT ON A SATURDAY MORNING  
WITH AN ELDERLY MALE AND THEY RETURNED ON SUNDAY AFTERNOON  
ABOUT FOUR THIRTY PM. FOLLOWING THIS TRIP OSWALD REMARKED TO MRS.  
GARNER THAT HE HAD BEEN IN QUOTE THE MOSQUITO COUNTRY UNQUOTE.  
MRS. GARNER THINKS THAT OSWALD MAY HAVE MENTIONED THE CITY OF  
BATON ROUGE BUT SHE COLD NOT BE CERTAIN.

CONTACT WITH THIS FIRM REFLECTS NO ONE HAS EVER BEEN EMPLOYED THERE BY THE NAME OF OSWALD, O. H. LEE OR THE VARIATIONS IN THE NAME HIDEEL. IT WAS DETERMINED THAT THIS FIRM HAS NO OPENINGS FOR MALE EMPLOYEES AND HAS NOT ACCEPTED ANY APPLICATIONS FROM MALES SINCE JUNE, SIXTYONE. EVANS SAID OSWALD DENIED GIVING UP AMERICAN CITIZENSHIP AND STATED QUOTE I JUST WENT TO RUSSIA UNQUOTE. MRS. EVANS STATED SHE AND OSWALD DID NOT DISCUSS POLITICS.

Pursuant to the Director's question as to whether it is accepted practice of State Department to allow individuals who have renounced their citizenship to return to the United States State Department was consulted on November 25, 1963. (Memorandum from D. J. Brennan to me dated November 25, 1963).

In connection therewith, Mr. Tolson asked 1) "Shouldn't these people who have renounced U. S. citizenship be on the Security Index? 2) Do we investigate all such people?"

With respect to the second question, it is the general practice to conduct a security investigation in cases of defectors who subsequently return to the United States. Investigation is begun on basis of deflection and return and is for the purpose of determining 1) Whether they may have been recruited for Soviet intelligence in this country while abroad, and 2) Whether their activities are such as to indicate that they represent a potential threat to the internal security of the Nation in the event of a national emergency.

All information developed during the course of the investigation, including the fact of deflection on the part of the individual concerned, is taken into consideration in arriving at a decision as to whether the individual's activities are such as to depict him as a dangerous individual who would pose a threat to the internal security in the event of a national emergency and, therefore, should be scheduled for apprehension.

Investigation in some cases has developed information indicating that the act of deflection was for personal reasons and not for ideological reasons. For example, Robert E. Webster went to Russia in 1959 in connection with work for Rand Corporation at the American National Exhibit in Moscow. He was having marital difficulties, was in debt, and had met a Russian girl. He returned to the United States in May, 1962, has been interviewed and has also appeared before a congressional committee and has been cooperative. Libero Ricciardelli, a veteran of the U. S. Air Force, married and the father of three children, was having domestic

problems and went to the USSR in 1959 because, as he subsequently related, his unsupervised reading caused him to feel that living in a socialist state would be helpful. He returned to the United States in June, 1963, has been interviewed and was cooperative.

In the past we have felt that a detector who subsequently returned to this country and indicated by his words and deeds acknowledgment of his initial folly and repentance thereof and concerning whom investigation failed to develop additional facts depicting the individual as a dangerous person, should not be listed in the Security Index and thus scheduled for apprehension and detention in the event of a national emergency. (However, all detectors could be placed on the Security Index on the theory that their defection, their act of renouncement of their citizenship, and their subsequent return would indicate possibility of long-range development as a Soviet agent. In this connection, there is no way to positively establish through investigation that their repentance of their actions are legitimate and, since permission to return must of necessity be granted by the Soviet Union, there does exist a long-range Soviet agent potential.

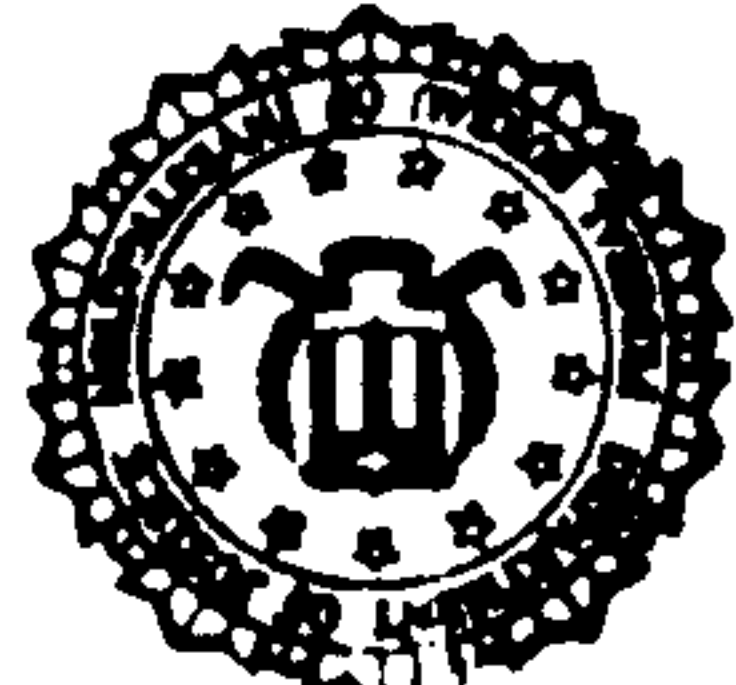

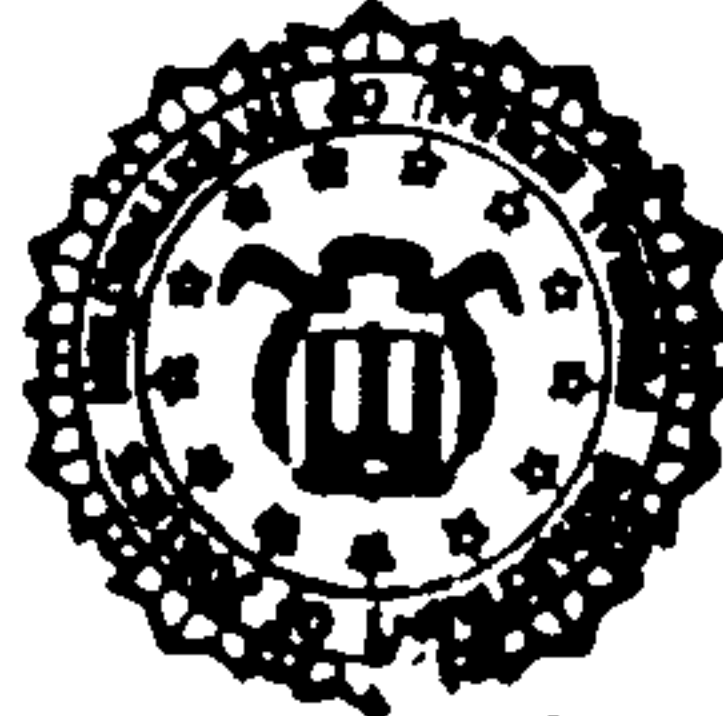

R. W. THOMAS, Salesman, Otation Hearing Aid Service, with offices at 8th and Franklin Streets, Waco, Texas, on November 29, 1963, informed that JOHNNY JOHNSON had been employed as a salesman with that company for approximately three months but had terminated his employment on November 25, 1963. During this employment JOHNSON resided at 315 North 12th Street in Waco where he rented a room.

THOMAS advised that JOHNSON did not appear for work on November 21 and 22, 1963, but on the morning of November 23, 1963, he reported for work and stated that he had been in Dallas. He engaged THOMAS in conversation concerning the death of the President. JOHNSON stated, "I'm sure glad he got killed. That SOB would mow us down if he got a chance." THOMAS advised that he argued with JOHNSON and said to JOHNSON "I hope they hang OSWALD." JOHNSON retorted "OSWALD didn't kill the President." THOMAS stated that when the argument became rather heated he dropped the subject to prevent any incident from being created.

PARKER PINHOLSTER, also an employee of Otation Hearing Aid Service, Waco, Texas, informed on November 29, 1963, that during JOHNSON's employment JOHNSON stated that he had been active in the John Birch Society while he lived at Silsbee, Texas, where he operated a television and radio shop.

The Internal Revenue Service at Waco, Texas, advised that JOHN W. JOHNSON of 315 North 12th Street in Waco had an appointment with an agent concerning delinquent 1962 income taxes on November 22, 1963, but failed to appear. An inquiry was made by the Internal Revenue Service which indicated that JOHNSON had gone to the home of a sister at 1813 Piedmont, Austin, Texas. His former address was listed as P. O. Box 652, Silsbee, Texas.

JOHNSON was not observed by his landlady or an occupant at 315 North 12th Street at Waco on November 21, 1963, and did not occupy his room until late on November 22, 1963. On Saturday morning, November 23, 1963, he was observed by the landlady to leave his room at which time he stated that he was on his way to work at which time he appeared to have been drinking heavily.

On Sunday morning, November 24, 1963, he moved from 315 North 12th Street in Waco and requested his mail be forwarded to JOHN W. JOHNSON, 1813 Piedmont Street, Austin, Texas. JOHNSON's sister, NELL W. HORNER, 1813 Piedmont Street, Austin, Texas, advised on November 29, 1963, she had not seen JOHNSON for about two weeks and it is her opinion he probably went to Silsbee, Texas, where he formerly lived and where his divorced wife, Mrs. CELESTE JOHNSON, presently resides. Mrs. HORNER confirmed the fact that the Internal Revenue Service had had some trouble with her brother.

For the information of the Bureau and WFO, Miami Office advised that on 11/27/63, Detective EVERETT KAY, Intelligence Unit, Miami PD, had advised that on the previous day one ROBERT BRUCE ALLEN had pawned a type writer, tape recorder and an attaché case and a .38 caliber Ivoir Johnson revolver in a downtown Miami pawn shop. Upon examination of the attaché case, it was found to contain ALLEN's passport, two Russian language books, a Russian newspaper, and a Russian dictionary. It appeared that from other material in the case that ALLEN had been employed as a radio commentator in the vicinity of Amarillo, Texas. By playing the tape, it was ascertained that there was a text transcription on the tape. It also appeared that ALLEN was corresponding with someone who spoke Italian and the signature "UDINE" appeared on the letter. A return address for ALLEN was 279 NE 79th Street, Miami, Fla.

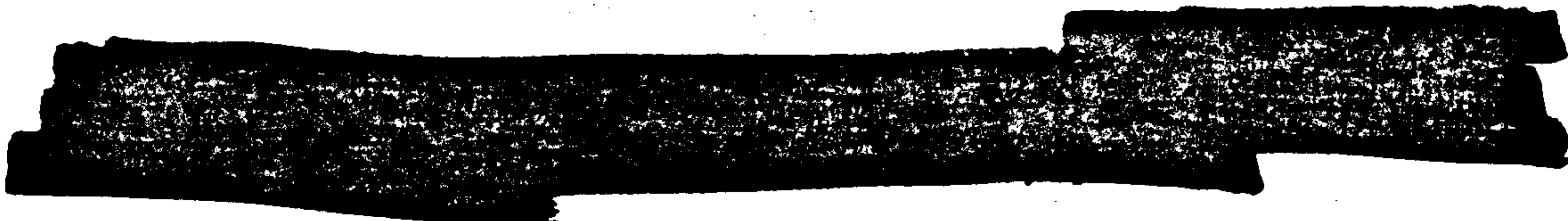

The Bureau and other recipients of this airtel will note that ALLEN appeared to be most sincere and forthright in his comments to interviewing agents. There was no indication that he was evasive in any of his answers and Tampa believes that he has no connection at all in instant case, except it believes that his explanation should be completely checked out so as to resolve the matter beyond doubt.

It will be noted that on 12/3/63, STEVE PORTER, WFLA Radio Station, Tampa, Fla., advised SA LIONEL E. BELANGER and ONNIE K. WALKER that ROBERT BRUCE ALLEN was an employee of the station and was residing at the Tampa Terrace Hotel.

ALLEN had reportedly told the pawn shop proprietor that he was pawning the material in order to secure fare to get him to Tampa.

Also in the above piececase, there was a newspaper clipping from the "Miami News" of November 22, 1963, concerning the assassination of the President and a birth certificate for ALLEN. There was also material indicating that ALLEN had taken a job with Tampa Radio Station WFLA.

Mr. ALLEN stated that although he was residing at the hotel at the present time, he expected to move to 706 Jackson Street, Tampa, Florida in the immediate future. He pointed out that he is presently a news reporter for Radio Station WFLA, a National Broadcasting Company station in Tampa, Florida. He stated that he formerly resided at the 79th Street Hotel, 279 NE 79th Street, up to about November 15, 1963 when he went to visit his brother JAMES ROGERS ALLEN, 2467 Drake Street, Jacksonville, Florida. JAMES ROGERS ALLEN is an employee of Eastern Airlines, Jacksonville, Florida. He stated that he had returned to Miami, Florida around the 25th or 26th of November, 1963, when he learned that he had been offered a job with Radio Station WFLA and he being short of money had decided to pawn some items in order to get some clothing cleaned and ready for his new assignment. He said that he had decided to pawn a .38 caliber Ivor Johnson revolver which he had purchased about two months before at a key shop named Quik Key, which was near the 79th Street Hotel. He said that this weapon had been purchased by him as a matter of interest, and that the pawn shop owner had registered the gun to him with the Miami City Police Department and probably the Metro Agency in Miami. He stated the only ammunition he had for this weapon was five rounds which he had with the gun. He stated that he carried this weapon to the pawn shop in his attache case in which he maintained other private papers and valuable documents. He stated that he did not feel that he could carry the gun through the streets of Miami without it being concealed in some way, and when he got to the pawn shop, he realized that he intended to redeem the gun at some future date, so he asked the proprietor if he could

Mr. ALLEN stated that he was most anxious to cooperate with the FBI as he had nothing to hide.

leave the attache case also so that he could have something to carry the gun in at the time of redemption. He said the proprietor had agreed to this and he had explained to the proprietor that he was going to Tampa to get a job with a radio station and would be back to redeem the gun at a future time. He stated that at this time, he also pawned a typewriter and a tape recorder and Mr. ALLEN displayed a pawn ticket number 70531 from Uncle Sam's Loan and Jewelry Company, Inc., 401 North Miami Avenue, Miami 32, Florida, to ROBERT B. ALLEN, noting that there had been a tape recorder, typewriter and revolver pawned and \$40 was loaned.

Mr. ALLEN stated that at the time he brought the attache case to the pawn shop, there were other documents and valuable mementos in the case and these included his passport, which he had recently obtained in Miami. He said the reason for this passport was that as an employee of Miami Radio Station WIOD, he had in the past had an opportunity to travel to South America to cover a news story; however, because he had not at that time had a passport, this opportunity had been denied him, so he remedied the situation by getting the passport for future use. He stated he had never had occasion since its issuance on November 13, 1963 to use the passport.

Mr. ALLEN also said that in the attache case were several clippings from Miami papers concerning the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. He stated that he had clipped these items from the newspapers as souvenirs as they had such a profound effect on him. He stated that he was truly shocked with the assassination of the President and abhorred the events that led up to this event.

Mr. ALLEN recalled that in the attache case was a letter to a "pen pal" in Italy. He stated that at one time recently, he was studying Italian language and a friend of his had give him the name of his wife's sister as a possible correspondent in Italy. The correspondent's name is LUCIANA GALLIZIA who resides in Udine, Italy. He stated that he did receive a letter from this individual when he corresponded with her, but that her handwriting was so poor, he could not read it, so he gave up this correspondence. He said that the individual who furnished the name of Miss GALLIZIA was WILLIAM DE LA PALME, a resident of Miami.

Mr. ALLEN stated that there were several Russian language texts in his attache case and he said that he acquired these in the following way:

Mr. ALLEN has been interested in languages for some time and as a matter of fact, he speaks Spanish and German quite well. He said that he was always on the alert to practice these languages with other individuals who had the same proficiency and in August or September, 1963, was walking by the Buenos Aires Cafe, located at 33 NE 2nd Avenue, Miami, Florida and noted a sign in the window which said that the owners of the cafe spoke many languages, so he went in and began to converse with the woman who was there. Although this woman spoke some Spanish, her husband soon came out and it was discovered he was the better linguist. This individual identified himself as SERGIO STEPANOVITCH BARSELIANZ, an Argentine immigrant to the United States, but who was born in Russia. During conversation with BARSELIANZ, BARSELIANZ said that he had lived Russia in 1941 and that he spoke no English. They were able to converse because BARSELIANZ did speak German and Spanish and Italian. Their friendship soon ripened to the point where a deal was made whereby Mr. ALLEN would teach BARSELIANZ English and in return BARSELIANZ would teach Mr. ALLEN Russian.

The lessons with BARSELIANZ were on a rather informal basis and continued over the next month or so. Mr. ALLEN had purchased a first year reader in the Russian language and sometime during this conversation with BARSELIANZ, he indicated his desire for a more up-to-date and more advanced reader to read. Mr. BARSELIANZ told him that the best source of Russian text would be the Cultural Minister at the Russian Embassy, Washington, D. C., and accordingly, Mr. ALLEN wrote to the Russian Embassy asking for any literature that might be available in the Russian language. This occurred in about October, 1963. About a week after his request, Mr. ALLEN received a manila envelope containing two magazines in Russian language entitled "Organok" (phonetic) and the September 19, 1963 issue of "Pravda". The envelope containing these publications contained no letter or anything else. Since this contact, Mr. ALLEN has had no further contact whatsoever with the Russian Embassy. Mr. ALLEN soon tired of the Russian lessons and his contacts with BARSELIANZ ceased. However, he did not desire that the Russian texts be lost so he placed them in his attache case and when he



brought the case to the pawn shop, they remained inside.

Mr. ALLEN noted that the BARSZLIANZ family in Miami was anti-Communist and pro-Argentine to the extent that they felt some gratefulness to that nation for accepting them as refugees in 1941. By the same token, according to Mr. ALLEN, BARSZLIANZ is also grateful to the United States for the chance to live here. BARSZLIANZ indicated some love for his mother country, Russia, but was very much anti-Communist.

ACTION:

Salinger asked if we knew whether the President would make this report public. I told him this, of course, would be up to the President. I mentioned that the President might desire to make it public or he might turn it over to the Presidential Commission. I further mentioned that undoubtedly Chief Justice Warren would have some ideas regarding this matter. Salinger stated he would speak to the President about the matter.

Pierre Salinger called from the White House at 3:30 p.m. this afternoon. He stated that his office is receiving considerable pressure from the press as to when the FBI report will be ready to be made public. He wanted to know what I could tell him in this regard. I told Salinger that for his information, the report would undoubtedly be sent to the Attorney General this week; however, we, of course, had no idea as to when the Attorney General would turn the report over to the President.

On December 4, 1963, Raymond L. Sanders, 941 South Lake Street, Los Angeles, California, telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised as follows:

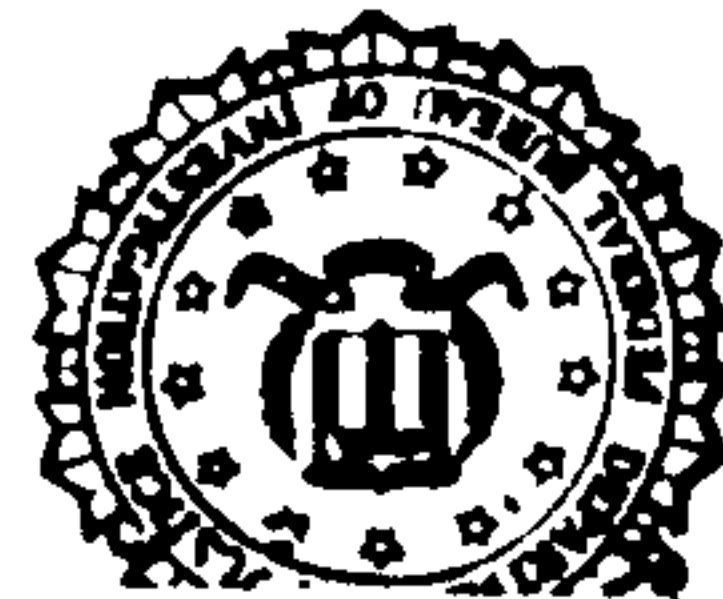
Sanders stated that he had just had breakfast at Bill's Cafe, 7th and Alvarado Streets, Los Angeles, and that he had a conversation with "Jock," the night cook. He stated that "Jock" advised that President John F. Kennedy got just what was coming to him; that they will get Robert Kennedy, Mrs. John F. Kennedy, and the "whole Kennedy clan" plus President Lyndon Johnson and his wife. "Jock" further stated that if he had the chance or anything to do with it, he would do the "job" himself. He contended that "Murder, Incorporated," was behind the assassination of President Kennedy.

DR. WILLIAM MC CALL

On December 2, 1963, Bob Reynolds, Post Office Box 241, La Mirada, California, telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised as follows:

On November 22, 1963, Reynolds took his son to the family doctor, Dr. William McCall, La Palma Street, Anaheim, California. He stated en route to the doctor's office he heard the news on the radio of the President being assassinated. He stated that when he arrived at the doctor's office, he reported the news to Dr. McCall, who replied, "Good; did they kill him?" He said that McCall also made the statement that if he were the attending doctor, "Kennedy wouldn't have a chance." According to Reynolds, McCall stated that the assassination of President Kennedy was the best thing that ever happened to the United States.

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
