CEDRIC YOUNGER VON ROLDESTON, also known as Arthur Dear Smith, advised that he had information which might be of value in connection with the investigation of HARVEY LEE OSWALD. He stated that he and his twentyfour year old wife, ONEDA RUTH VON ROLDESTON, arrived in Alexandria, Louisiana around 2:00 A.M., on the early morning of October 11, 1963. He registered at the Hotel Bentley and they both went immediately to bed, sleeping most of the same day. Adjacent to the lobby of this hotel was a campaign headquarters for a candidate whom he believed was "GILLIS," and this was a Democratic Headquarters.

Outside of this headquarters and in the lobby, he saw a man talking to three other men. This man was not dressed in a suit, but had on a light colored jacket and a hat. He stated that all he can say about the three men were that they wore normal business suits. He observed this man in conversation for some time, but did not overhear any of the conversation. After the three men left, this same man came over to him and asked him where he was from and where he was going. He felt this was a strange request but then engaged in a brief conversation with this man. During the general conversation, this man said "VERY SOON A LOT OF CATHOLIC LEADERS OR RULERS WILL BE SHOT." He does not remember any further conversation with this man and does not know if he was registered at the hotel or not. He stated that this was the last time that he saw this man, until he later saw a picture of OSWALD.

He stated that the next day, he and his wife were asked to leave by the manager of this hotel. He stated that he does not know why they were asked to leave, since he always pays his bills, and has never been asked to leave any hotel before.

They drove through the southern states and eventually into Washington, D.C., arriving there on October 31, 1963.

He came to Washington, D. C., because he wanted to see Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY to see if he could get a pardon and to see if he could get some help for his seven children. He stated that he wanted to have them raised in a Catholic School. He wanted the pardon, because in 1952, he was convicted for extortion, and he served time for this crime. He stated that he wanted to clear the records for his little children who were coming along. He also wanted to mention to him about the statement about "A lot of Catholic rulers or leaders will be shot."

He was not successful in seeing KENNEDY, and he tried to get in touch with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), but he did not follow this through. He then went to the Soviet Embassy, where he met the Second Secretary of the Embassy of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR), GENNADI N. SEREBRYAKOV. He went to the Embassy because he is a great admirer of Premier KHRUSHCHEV, and he wanted to give KHRUSHCHEV one of his landscape paintings. The painting was accepted and he was informed that it would be sent to KHRUSHCHEV. He told the Secretary that he admired KHRUSHCHEV because "he is the only ruler who would part with virgin gold to feed his own people and the world."

While there, he showed the Secretary some colored photographs of paintings he had done previously. Mixed up with the colored pictures was a postcard from the Hotel Bentley, Alexandria, Louisiana, and he himself, did not know that this postcard was with the pictures. When the Secretary came to the postcard, which was a picture of a dining room in the hotel, he appeared for a moment to show surprise, but said nothing. It was as if he recognized the place or name of the hotel.

He left then, and he and his wife traveled north to New Jersey, New York, and into New England. On the day that the President was shot, they were in New England. He saw the television and the newspapers, and after observing

the many pictures of OSWALD, he is positive that OSWALD is identical to the man he talked to in the lobby of the Hotel Bentley at Alexandria, Louisiana, on October 12, 1963. He stated that he is an artist and he knows facial construction, and that is why he is positive that this man was OSWALD. He stated that he then also recalled the statement about top Catholic rulers or leaders being killed, and here was KENNEDY shot, as well as two top Catholic Rulers in Viet-Nam. He stated that he did not know the names of the two Catholic rulers in Viet-Nam who were shot, but they were brothers and they ran the country. He recalled reading about it in the newspapers. He also then recalled how the Secretary of the USSR Embassy looked when he saw the pictures of the Hotel Bentley dining room.

He then tried to get in touch with ROBERT KENNEDY at Hyannis Port, Massachusetts, but was not successful, so he and his wife then made their way to Washington, D. C., arriving there on December 3, 1963. He again went to see the Soviet Embassy, and the same Secretary talked to him. He asked this man if he recalled their previous conversation. He recalled that on the previous visit to the Soviet Embassy, he had told this man to "trust President KENNEDY and the Catholic People. Don't trust the Baptists and the Protestants in Texas." The man did not recall the conversation, but told him that the picture had been forwarded to KHRUSHCHEV. The man then wanted him to tell him where he was going and where he could be located. He told this man he traveled constantly with his wife and did not have a home. He felt this was a strange request for this man to ask of him.

He then left and again tried to get in touch with ROBERT KENNEDY to tell him of his information. He could not see Mr. KENNEDY. Then he and his wife drove to the Quantico, Virginia, Marine Base, and here he told the Officer in Charge of the Military Police his story and asked him if he would get in touch with the FBI for him. He stated that he is glad that this information is in the right hands and he was advised that the matter would be looked into.

As a matter of background, VON ROLDESTON stated that he came from England as a small boy. He was raised in this country, and is a naturalized citizen, and he does not have any home. He and his wife travel continuously, and he gets work doing landscape work wherever he stops. He stated that he has done landscape work and portrait work all over this country. He specializes in landscape work, and usually contracts for a job doing a mural on a wall of a bowling alley or restaurant. When he first grew up, he stated that he was violently anti-Catholic, but in recent years, he has seen the light and now he is pro-Catholic. He stated he is not a communist.

He once recalled in 1952 of writing a letter to STALIN in which he told STALIN to "blow up Rome" and to go ahead on the development of rockets in space. He stated that he was right about the rockets, and the Russians must have taken his advice and developed them. He then exhibited a letter from T. A. MEADE, a Vice President of the AMP for his suggestion that when KHRUSHCHEV came to this country, he should be shown a bowling alley, so that the people of Russia could also have bowling alleys. He stated that he read in the papers later on his visit KHRUSHCHEV did visit a bowling alley, and this again shows that his suggestions were taken by the Russians. For this reason, on his recent visit with the Soviet Embassy, prior to the death of KENNEDY, he told this Second Secretary to trust President KENNEDY and the Catholic People. He did not want them to do anything to President KENNEDY. He stated that he had the greatest of admiration for President KENNEDY. He exhibited his photograph album which contained letters of recommendation indicating that he was a proficient artist.

He stated that he did not know where he and his wife were going from Fredericksburg, Virginia. He stated that they both just take off and drive.

LONG DISTANCE TELEPHONE CALLS, DALLAS-FORT WORTH, TEXAS AREA, TO AND FROM CUBA

During the course of another investigation, it has come to the attention of the Miami Office that telephone calls made to Cuba from the Dallas-Fort Worth, Texas, area are channeled through facilities of Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Co. (SBT&T), at Miami, Florida. Toll tickets are made at Miami. 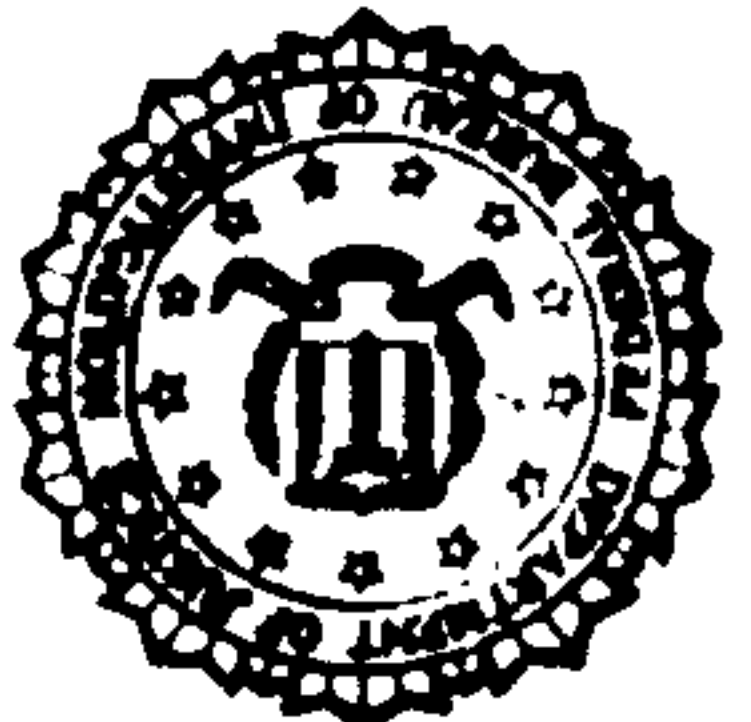

On December 9, 1963, Colonel Benjamin Chopia, Fort Sheridan, Illinois, telephonically advised the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he had received a telephone call from an unknown person who rambled incoherently regarding the President's assassination. This individual stated that two soldiers had planned the President's assassination. Chopia advised that this telephone call was traced to Chicago telephone number [redacted] which is listed to [redacted]

[redacted] was interviewed by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on December 9, 1963, at which time he displayed an irrational, abnormal behavior and his statements were incoherent. These included statements that he was the supreme being and that he knew that Mrs. Kennedy, President Johnson and General Edwin Walker had "set up" the President's assassination. [redacted] knew of no other persons involved in the assassination. The interview terminated when [redacted] became argumentative with his wife.

[redacted] who was present at the time of the interview, advised that her husband has made numerous telephone calls to various agencies concerning the President's assassination. She further stated that he has been committed to the State Mental Institution at Rigin, Illinois, on three separate occasions, and she is considering having him committed again for his irrational behavior.

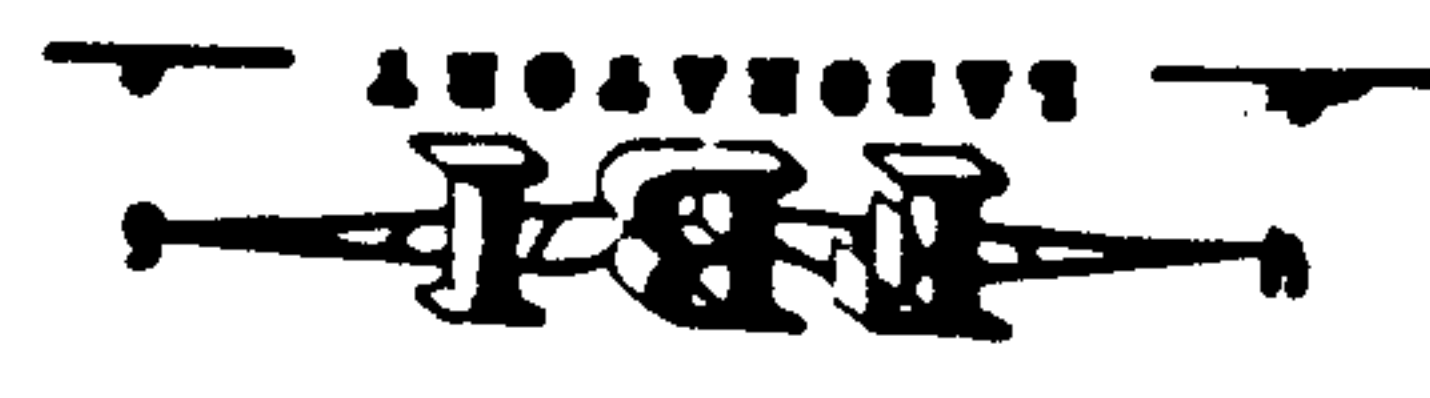

On December 4, 1963, [redacted] Cambridge, Massachusetts came to the Boston Office and said that she had some information which might be pertinent to the President's assassination. [redacted] has been a frequent visitor to the Boston Office of the FBI for a number of years and on these visits has rambled on in somewhat an incoherent manner offering advice and suggestions for the solutions of crimes such as the Brinks robbery.

On the occasion of her visit of December 4, 1963, she had in her possession a one-page type written item which she said she had typed so that she would have all the information in written form. A photostat copy was made of this type written material and is set out as follows:

"Check up on this couple-

Mr. and Mrs. Martin Butler
681 East 7th Street
South Boston, Mass.

"They have in their possession photostat copies of return receipts (registered mail) also certified mail receipts, that had no dates stamped thereon. They claim their letters never left Federal Building Post Office Dept. and never reached the judges in Courthouse and also the Supreme Court.

"They also said, 'If we don't get him now, we'll get him sometime.'"

"I believe they should be taken in for questioning. They might shed a new light on the assassination of President Kennedy."

"While waiting for President John Kennedy to come out of the side door of the Sheraton Plaza, Boston, Mass, the night he spoke at the Armory, Commonwealth Ave, with Ted Kennedy, at the Democratic Rally, -Mr. and Mrs. Butler stated, 'We're gonna get him when he comes out', she repeated the same words. 'We're gonna get him when he comes out'. I thought they meant to speak to him, naturally. I said how are you going to get him? 'With a gun'. We're going to kill him'. I couldn't believe these people were in their right mind. I said, 'Oh you haven't got a gun and laughed it off. Then I decided if there was going to be any shooting goin on, I didn't want to be a part of it, or any accessory to the fact, so I left them both, quickly and when I walked way down the street to the corner I told the policeman just a few feet away and pointed out the couple to him, and he said thanks. Well, more policemen came round the corner and said, 'I'd like to look her up for one night, I thought they meant me, but most likely they meant the woman.'"

"John Powers will have nothing to do with them, don't know whether they are friends of his or not, or whether they threatened his life some years back. The only candidate they like is General Eisenhower, they run everybody else down."

Washington D. C. They said they could never get a chance to see Chief Inspector White since he became Chief Inspector. They stated that something crooked is going on in the Post Office Department. They kept talking about the Riot Act in 1959, in the Newspaper Headlines.

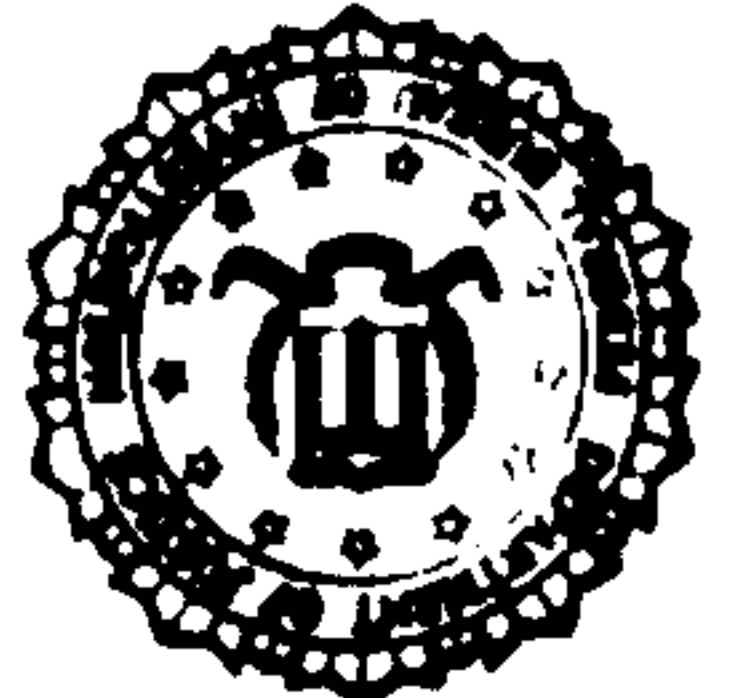

James Harold Smith, 1707 West Wallen Street, Chicago, Illinois, advised on November 29, 1963, that he is employed as a machinist at the Major Wire Company, 3664 North Elston Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

Mr. Smith related that shortly after noon on November 22, 1963, he observed that Adolph Zoner, a machinist at Major Wire Company, went into the shipping room to answer a telephone call. Zoner came back shortly thereafter highly excited, shouting "We got him now." Smith asked Zoner what he had meant and Zoner replied laughing, "We got that communist, Kennedy," and added, "He was no president."

Adolph Zoner, 729 West Roscoe Street, Chicago, Illinois, advised he has been employed as a tool and die maker at Major Wire Company, 3664 North Elston Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, since June, 1963. He stated that he was previously employed by Handy and Harmon, Incorporated, Chicago, Illinois, in the same capacity and left that employment after that firm moved from Chicago.

Zoner advised that he was born on August 20, 1912, at Chicago, Illinois. He has Social Security Number 323-01-2772.

Zoner was questioned concerning his comments made to fellow employees of Major Wire Company following the assassination of President Kennedy on November 22, 1963.

Zoner said that shortly after 12:00 noon on November 22, 1963, he received a personal telephone call from his wife informing him of the assassination of President Kennedy. Zoner claimed that he was unable to recall exactly what he may have said when he returned to his work area at Major Wire Company, but is positive he did not say, "We got him." As best as he could now recall, he was of the opinion that he probably commented to his fellow employees that "Someone beat me to it," in referring to the assassination of President Kennedy.

Zoner considered himself "a 100 per cent American" and has lived by the Constitution and will die by the Constitution. He stated he voted for President Franklin D. Roosevelt, but later was sorry he had done so since in his opinion Roosevelt turned out to be "a lunatic."

Zoner stated that he believed that President Kennedy should have either been "deported or killed," because Kennedy had taken away the rights of the American people. Zoner did not elaborate on this remark.

Zoner stated that he is an avid reader of the Congressional Record and other publications relating to our constitutional form of government and said he bases his opinions on his studies of these writings.

Zoner advised that he has made no attempts to conceal his political beliefs. He stated that he had no knowledge whatsoever concerning the assassination of President Kennedy other than what he has learned from public news media.

Norfolk indices reflect on 3/1/51 [REDACTED] 56th St. and Dawson Rd., Crystal Acres, Virginia Beach, Va., appeared at the Norfolk Office. She furnished numerous rambling details concerning many prominent Norfolk citizens, giving confusing information about being persecuted at Virginia Beach, about being abused by men, about the failure of the Virginia Beach PD to provide services needed, and efforts on the part of authorities to have her leave the Virginia Beach area.

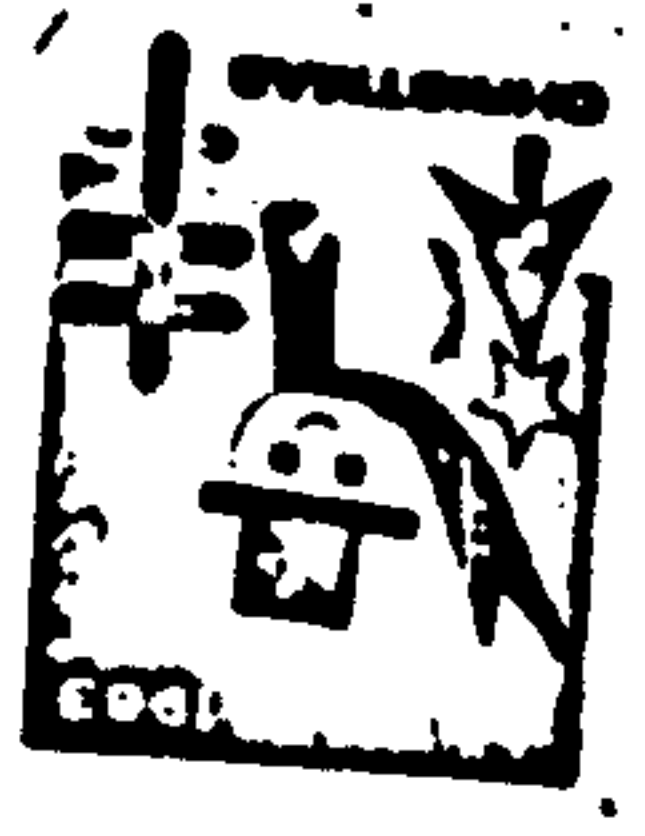

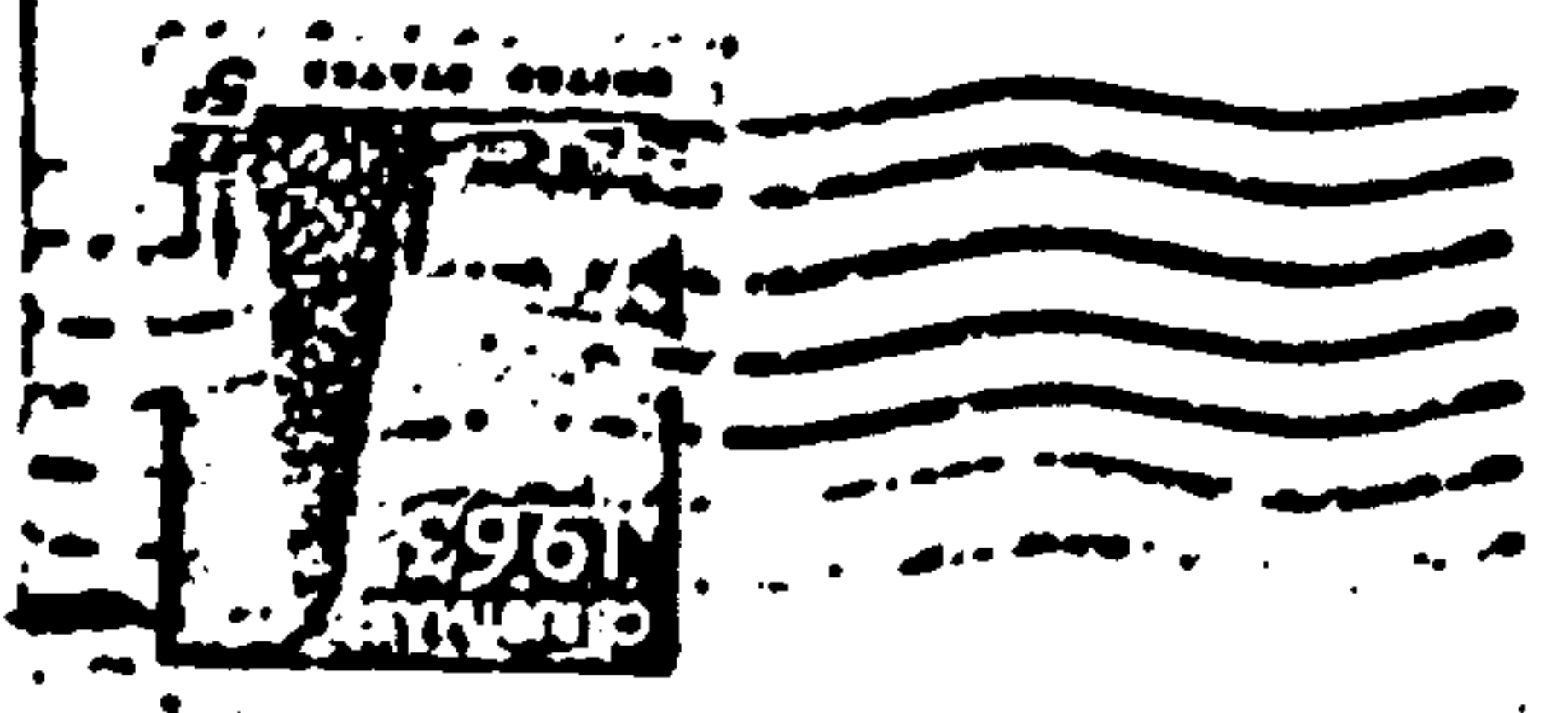

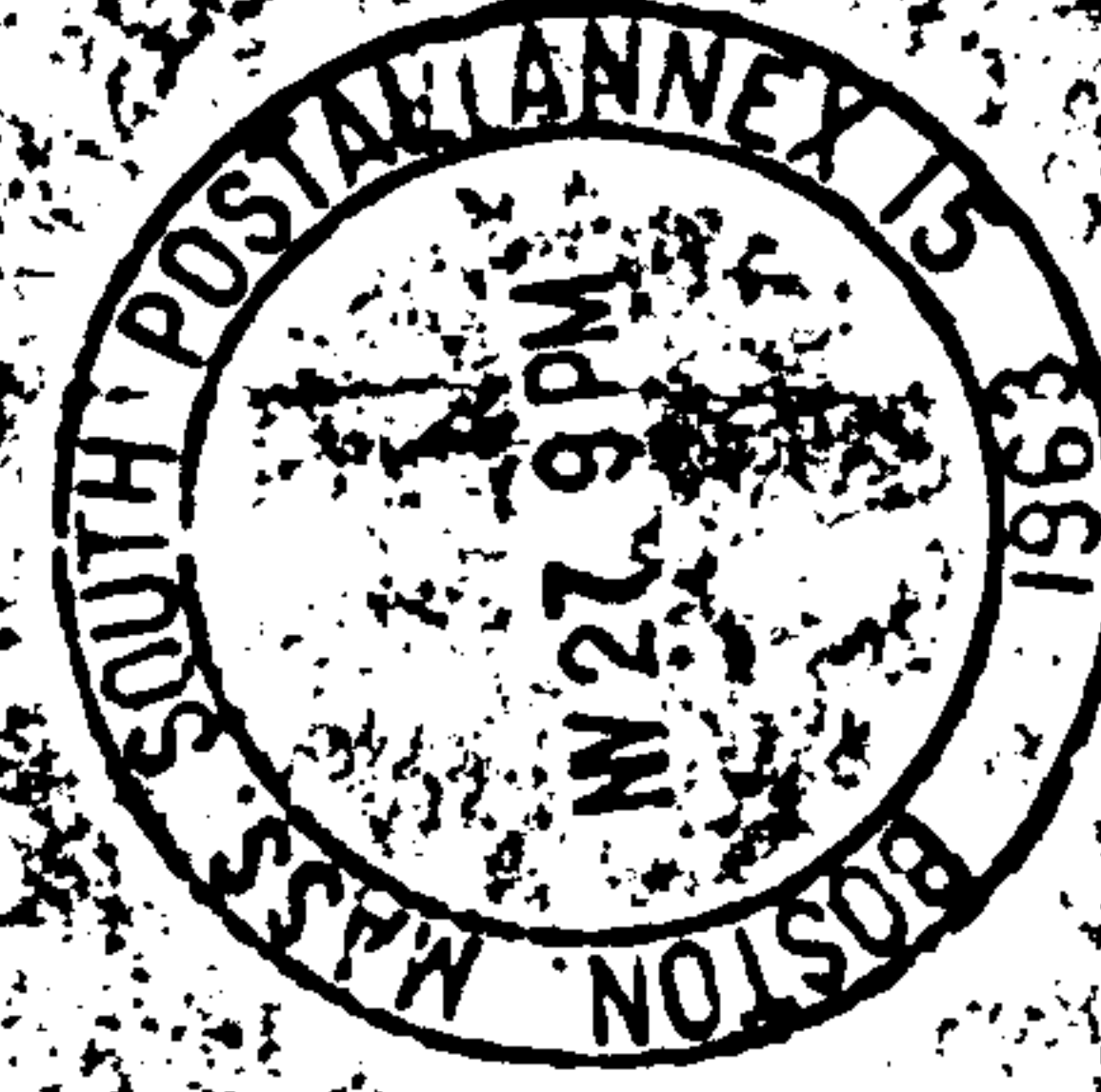
