Results of examination:

A chemical examination was made of specimens Q196 through Q198 and nothing of significance was noted concerning any of these items. Specimen Q198 contains five sulfa preparations, four antibiotics, two laxatives, five antipyretics and analgesics, two vitamin preparations, one antacid, an oral contraceptive, medicated skin cream, nasal decongestant, and a small vial of ammonia. No cavities or secreted material was found in any of the items in Q196.

An examination of specimens Q209 and Q210 revealed no cavities or secreted material.

The evidence is being retained in the Laboratory.

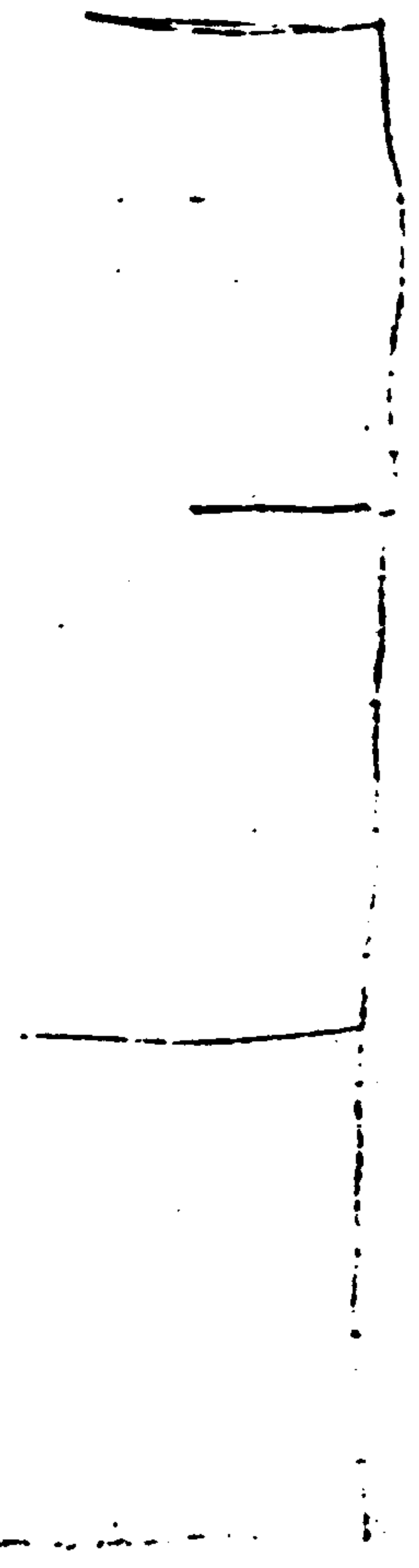

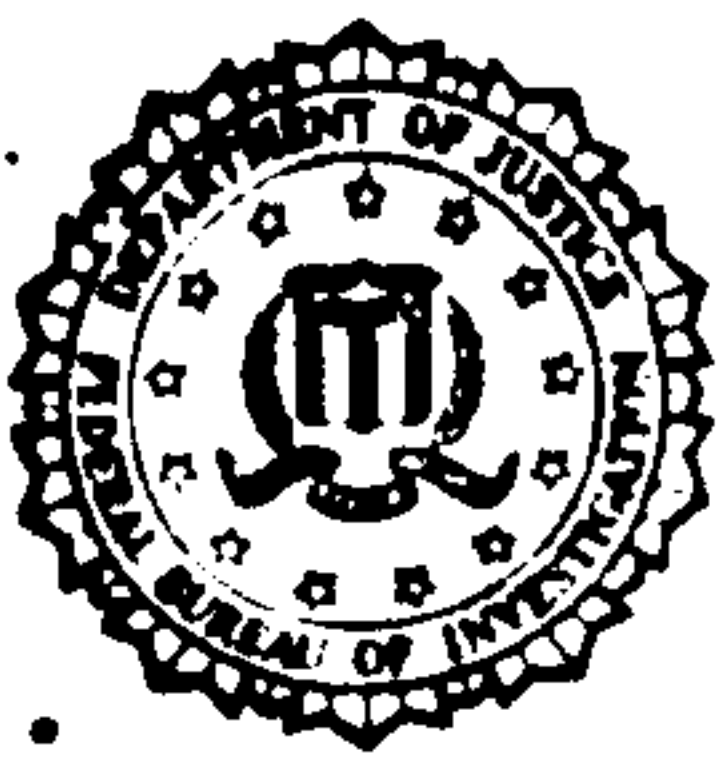

On December 2, 1963, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Brentwood Trailer Park, 1100 Industrial Boulevard,
Chula Vista, California, furnished the following information
to a Special Agent of the FBI at San Diego, California.

He is employed as the [REDACTED] at
this trailer park. In August, 1963, he had a conversation
with a resident of the trailer park who resides in Trailer
Space F-14, one "Lon Bonner". Bonner is a white male, age
approximately 38, who resides here with his widowed mother.
Bonner is employed in the Los Angeles, California area.

[REDACTED] does not recall many specific comments
made during this August, 1963 conversation, but does
remember that the gist of it was Bonner said he had been
told by someone that President Kennedy, Attorney General
Robert Kennedy, California Governor Edmund Brown and U. S.
Supreme Court Chief Justice Earl Warren "would be wiped out
within a year". [REDACTED] asked Bonner who told him this,
but Bonner did not say. Bonner's source of this information
is not known to [REDACTED] but he, [REDACTED] somehow got
the impression the person who had said this to Bonner may
have been a fellow employee.

After President Kennedy's assassination, [REDACTED]
spoke with Bonner and referred to their August, 1963
conversation. Again Bonner's source was not identified but
Bonner did repeat the identity of the same four individuals
mentioned in August, 1963, that is President Kennedy, Attorney
General Kennedy, Governor Brown and Chief Justice Warren.

Bonner resides at this trailer park on week ends,
but works in the general Los Angeles area during the week.

He is a member of Local [11] of some Electrical Workers Union in Los Angeles and his occupation is that of an [electrical lineman.] Currently, he stays at the [Ho Hum Motel, 103 East Coast Highway, Long Beach, California,] and is on the payroll of the [R. S. Schulman Co. of Imperial Street,] Los Angeles. This company is a contractor to the [Edison Electric Company and Bonner] is employed at the [Edison Rio Hondo Substation, Long Beach,] California.

After extensive investigation, [Lon Morris Bonner] was located in Apartment 2, 1814 Pine Avenue, Long Beach, California. [Bonner] is employed as a [lineman] with the [A. S. Schulman Electric Company,] at the port of Long Beach, at the Edison Substation. [His permanent address is 1100 Industrial Avenue F-14, Chula Vista, California.] He advised as follows:

Approximately four weeks ago while at the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local #11, [2317 West Seventh Street, Los Angeles,] California, he was in conversation with another member, [Tommy Thompson]. Thompson is a white male, 55 to 60 years of age, 5'10", 160 pounds, gray hair, who lives in Rosemead, California. Further address and job location of Thompson can be obtained through Local #11.

While sitting around at the Local waiting for a job, they talked of many topics and politics entered the conversation. [Bonner] claimed that he did not vote for President Kennedy, which was known to [Thompson], whom he described as a Republican. [Bonner] related that he had no information that [Thompson] belonged to any subversive organizations and neither had he ever heard [Thompson] express indifference to the United States form of Government.

[Bonner] related that he was unable to recall how the conversation came about, but said it was probably due to the fact that they were out of work and blamed the Democratic Administration for the lack of work in their particular field. During the conversation, [Bonner] recalled [Thompson] remarked that, "there were four slated to be

knocked off". He further claimed that this would occur during the Democratic Convention next year. (Bonner) asked (Thompson) what he meant and (Thompson) replied that President Kennedy, Governor Brown, Chief Justice Warren, and Attorney General Kennedy were the ones he was talking about. (Bonner) then asked (Thompson) where he obtained the information and (Thompson) replied "never mind". Bonner said the conversation was dropped at this time and he has not talked to (Thompson) since the death of the President.

(Bonner) said that following the death of the President he wondered about the remark made by (Thompson) and claimed that in conversation with others in Chula Vista, he probably mentioned to individuals about the remarks made by (Thompson) without stating (Thompson's) name. (Bonner) said that he and (Thompson) were the only two in the conversation at the time of the above remark. (Bonner) had no further information to report regarding this incident.

(James L. Thompson, 3919 North Rosemead Boulevard, Rosemead, California, Telephone No. 288-4037, advised on December 5, 1963 that he is employed by the A. S. Schulman Electric Company, and that he is a member of the Electrical Workers Local #11, 2316 West 7th Street, Los Angeles, California. Thompson remarked that he was born June 7, 1900 in Georgia.) He said that he is called both (Jimmy and Tommy).

He stated that he is very frank and outspoken in his political discussions and that he rants and raves about politics. (Thompson) could not recall any conversation that would create the idea that he knew anything about four men being "knocked off" at the Democratic Convention next year. He said that he has never made any statement to that effect and that if he knew anything whatsoever about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, he would gladly come forward and assist the Government in its investigation. (Thompson) said he could not remember his specific conversation with (Lon Bonner.)

(Thompson) remarked that he has frequently voiced his

disapproval of the policies of President John F. Kennedy, Governor Brown, Chief Justice Warren and Attorney General Robert Kennedy. He stated he has "cussed" Warren since he was the governor of California. He advised he voted for Kennedy since he was the least of two evils and came to the conclusion that Kennedy was unable to make a definite decision. He said Robert Kennedy has gone "overboard on the civil rights deal". Further, he has never agreed with Governor Brown and in his opinion Chief Justice Warren was wrong in his interpretation of the separation of the church and state and causing schools to eliminate the opening of school with a prayer.

He advised that some people may think he is an extreme rightist because he thinks that this country is going the wrong way. He advised he has made the remark that if he had the power of Hitler or Stalin for six months he would round up all the men that had ever been politicians and that "running all of them into the ocean would be too good for them". It would be his job to shoot them. Thompson explained that sometimes he talks "strong" to people and that he frequently used the above remarks during political discussions. He commented that of course he did not actually mean what he said and he recalled that he had told his insurance agent that "all of them should be rounded up and shot so we can have a little peace". He said his insurance agent then joked back and remarked that all electrical workers should be rounded up and shot. He said neither one of them actually meant what they said.

Thompson reiterated that he could not figure out how Bonner got his ideas. He said he may have made some comment that he did not know how Warren got down to Georgia and back without getting "bumped off". He said that since the assassination he has made the remark that "It is too bad that it was not Robert Kennedy" because he disagrees with Robert's civil rights program.

He concluded by saying that his discussion with Lon Bonner was nothing more than a political discussion and

that he has no information regarding the shooting of President Kennedy.

The rubber stamp impression "A. J. Hidell P. O. Box 30016, New Orleans" on Q219 was prepared from the rubber stamp kit, K39, previously submitted. K39 was previously identified as having been used in the preparation of Q43 through Q45.

Evidence was found on Q218 and Q219 indicating these specimens were prepared from a paper or parchment plate which had at least two images thereon. Due to the limited number of significant typewriting characteristics present, no conclusion could be reached whether Q218 and Q219 were prepared from the same typewriter. No characteristics were noted on Q218 and Q219 which would indicate whether they did or did not come from the same offset printing lot.

Q217 does not contain a sufficient number of significant printing characteristics to determine whether it came from the same printing source as Q67, previously submitted and the 159 cards previously submitted and designated as Item 115.

RE: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN F. KENNEDY

The following contains information relative to the reaction to President KENNEDY's death by various subversive groups in the Seattle area:

Northwest District, Communist Party, USA (NWDCP)

On November 26, 1963, a first source advised that following the death of the President, it was learned that BURT GALE NELSON, who is known to the source as the District Chairman of the NWDCP, was somewhat apprehensive and did not desire to be contacted by anyone. NELSON's apprehension stemmed from the fact that he considered the situation as "tense" in view of the publicity surrounding the President's assassin.

On November 26, 1963, a second source advised that at a CP club meeting held on November 25, 1963, in Seattle, THORUN ROBEL, who is known to the source as a section officer of the South Central CP Section, asked what should be done by the CP in view of the assassination of the President. ROBEL asked those present as to how they could fight the "ultra-right" in this matter. ROBEL suggested that they call for a diluge of letters to President JOHNSON requesting that he continue with the programs started by President KENNEDY. ROBEL continued that the Young Political Explorers League's function scheduled for the evening of November 23, 1963, in Seattle was cancelled not because of the death of President KENNEDY but because it was to have featured a skit which was derogatory of President KENNEDY and therefore, it was felt that it should not be presented at this time.

ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

ROBEL surmised that the publicity concerning LEE HARVEY OSWALD and his Marxist characterization has hurt the Communist Party and she stated that the Communist Party is going to deny any connection with OSWALD. ROBEL referred to the "far-right" as hate groups and she stated that in view of the developments of the President's death the CP should publicize the actions taken in the South in recent weeks by Civil Rights groups and hate groups, implying that such publicity would tend to take the CP out of the publicity spotlight.

"People's World" (PW)

PW is a West coast Communist newspaper published weekly in San Francisco, California.

On November 26, 1963, a third source advised that local Seattle PW officers are urging that the next issue of the PW be spread throughout the area in much larger numbers since the Communist Party is going to deny any connection with the President's assassin and that it is necessary to spread this view point around to as many people as possible.

Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba Committee (SC, FPCC)

SC, FPCC is in a latter part of this document.

On November 26, 1963, a fourth source advised on that same date CLARA FRASER, Chairman of the Adult Chapter of the FPCC in Seattle, mentioned that it is possible that the SC, FPCC at the University of Washington, Seattle, would be discontinued, although there may be a few members who might still be willing to have their names on a membership list of the group, in accordance with rules of that university. FRASER indicated that the Adult Chapter, FPCC, would continue in the Seattle area.

On the following page is a newspaper article which appeared in the November 24, 1963, issue of the "Seattle Post-Intelligencer", a local Seattle, Washington daily newspaper. This article concerns a statement regarding the FPCC in Seattle by CLARA KAYE, which is an alias used by CLARA FRASER, who according to a fifth source is a current chairman of the Seattle Branch of the Socialist Workers Party.

No Link With Kennedy's Slaying:

'Fair Play' Groups Here Protest

The Fair Play for Cuba Committee, of which the man accused of slaying President Kennedy is reportedly a member, has two chapters active in Seattle.

They are the Seattle Chapter and the Student Chapter, the latter a recognized student organization at the University of Washington.

REPRESENTATIVES of both organizations here yesterday protested "the attempt to link our committee" with the assassination.

Mrs. Claire Kaye, chairman of the Seattle Chapter, said the committee's prime objectives are to restore United States trade with Cuba, to remove the travel ban to Cuba and to grant diplomatic recognition to the Castro government.

Among public demonstrations in which the local groups have participated was a march protesting U.S. Cuban policy in front of Seattle's Federal Office Building on April 29, 1961. About 50 placard-carrying pickets demonstrated against the April 17, 1961, Cuban invasion.

A similar demonstration was conducted at that time in front of the U.S. Court House here.

The Fair Play for Cuba Committees were also among groups which picketed at the University of Washington when President Kennedy delivered a convocation address there in November, 1961.

Mrs. Kaye said the committee was organized nationally by two television network newsmen after their dispatches from Cuba "were suppressed."

In December, 1960, the Fair Play for Cuba Committee was reported to have sponsored a visit to Cuba by

300 Americans, to rally support for the Castro program.

Both Seattle chapters yesterday released the following statement:

"The Seattle Chapter and Student Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee are outraged by the vicious murder of President Kennedy and we strongly protest the attempt to link our committee with this unspeakable crime.

"The FPCC does not advocate or condone acts of violence or terrorism anywhere in the world. We seek to educate and publicize issues through peaceful persuasion and objective discussion. We are an educational and study organization composed of people of varying political beliefs.

"The national horror over the murder could be deliberately provoked into a lynch spirit. Our committee hopes that the American people will not give way to hysteria and a further outrage against freedom of speech.

"The President's death was a blow against democracy. Let it not be used as the pretext for persecuting innocent people."

MRS. KAYE SAID she was unable to estimate the number of FPCC members here because members do not pay dues. She said monthly meetings are conducted in different homes.

"We're a small group," she said. "When we hold public meetings an average of about 100 attend—we're sort of a hooking agency."

Both Mrs. Kaye and Barbara Tomlinson, program chairman for the University group, said the committees here had no knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald, the assassination suspect.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening In Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch identified himself and Robert Taber as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and Taber obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the afore-mentioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962 and was filled by Vincent "Ted" Lee, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed Lee has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the CP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, Lee has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. Lee feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Cuban revolution per se.

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.
