SEATTLE FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

On April 20, 1961, a source advised that as of this date, no formal adult chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) had been organized in Seattle, Washington; however, in early 1961, the Seattle Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP) formed a temporary committee of the FPCC in Seattle which was headed by an active member of the Seattle SWP and was for the purpose of promoting the appearance in Seattle of a speaker on behalf of the National FPCC.

On September 25, 1961, this same source advised that an official active adult chapter of the FPCC had recently been organized in Seattle which is dominated and controlled by the Seattle Branch, SWP. As of this date, according to the source, the Seattle FPCC, an affiliate of the National FPCC, had no office headquarters and did not have a large membership.

This same source, on May 24, 1963, reported that the Seattle FPCC continues to operate in the Seattle area as an active organization. It has no office headquarters, but uses the mailing address of Box 743, 507 Third Avenue, Seattle, Washington, which is the address of a mailing service.

The Socialist Workers Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

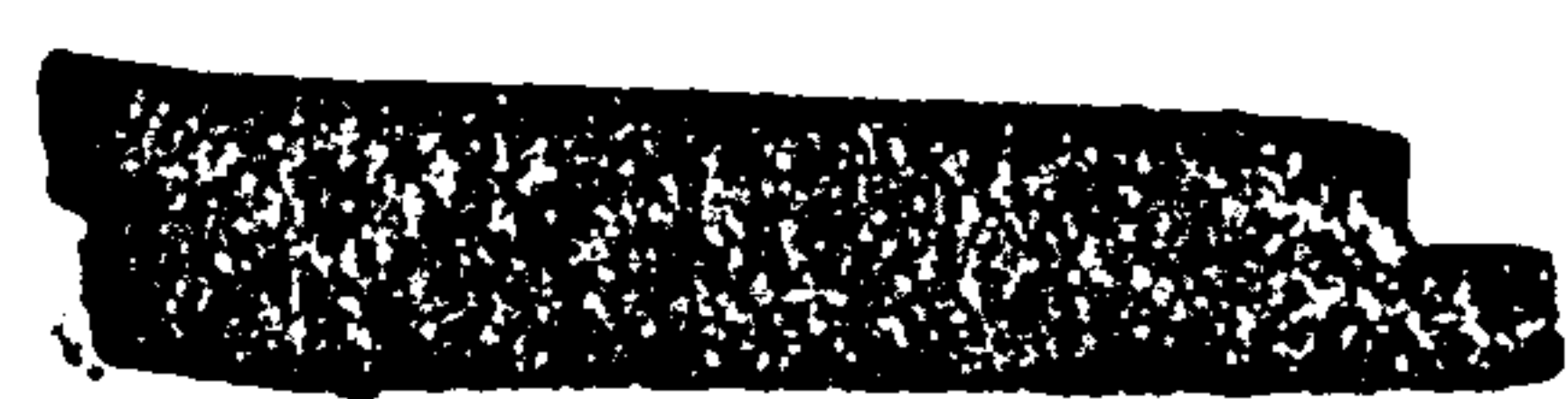
STUDENT CHAPTER, FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE, aka
Seattle Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba Committee

On December 29, 1960, a source advised that youth of the Seattle Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP) had recently officially launched the Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba Committee (SC, FPCC) near the campus of the University of Washington at Seattle, Washington.

On July 31, 1961, another source advised that the SC, FPCC, Seattle, Washington, which operates from the homes of various council leaders, is a present active affiliate of the National SC, FPCC, following the aims and principles of the national organization. According to the source, the Seattle Council is dominated and controlled by youth members of the Seattle Branch, SWP.

The first source advised on July 3, 1963, that the Seattle Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba Committee, is currently known as the Student Chapter, Fair Play for Cuba Committee. It continues to function and is officially recognized as a student campus organization at the University of Washington. It is dominated and controlled by youth members of the Seattle Branch, SWP.

The Socialist Workers Party (SWP) has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

STUDENT COUNCIL
FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The initial publication of this organization, "Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba," Volume 1, Number 1, dated November 4, 1960, states that "this bi-monthly publication will be used to publish accurate information about Cuba, analysis of current events in Cuba and Cuban-U.S. relations, and for reports of the progress and activities of the newly-organized Student Council chapters."

A confidential source advised on January 17, 1962, that RICHARD GIBSON, then National Executive Secretary, Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC), advised on January 16, 1962, that a combined edition of the FPCC publications, "Fair Play" and "Student Council," published on October 28, 1961, was the last publication issued by the FPCC.

On January 15, 1961, a second source advised that TIM WOHLFORTH, National Chairman of the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) had commented that the YSA had been singularly successful in assisting in the formation of the FPCC Student Councils throughout the country and active within those councils.

A third source advised on May 11, 1960, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City, by youth of various left Socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

STUDENT COUNCIL
FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (CONT'D)

On April 17, 1963, a fourth source advised that V. T. LEE (VINCENT THEODORE LEE), Director, National Office, FPCC, at a joint board meeting of the Seattle FPCC, Adult and Student Chapters, held on April 14, 1963, stated that the Student Council, Fair Play for Cuba Committee (SC, FPCC) was never actually formulated; that at present they are not considered full members and have no vote.

LEE stated that the difficulty with the Student Councils is that they are not permanent organizations. He said there were then approximately 30 Adult Chapters and 40 Student Councils.

On February 13, 1963, and May 20, 1963, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, by means of a suitable pretext, interviewed TED LEE, Director, National Office, FPCC, Room 329, 799 Broadway, New York, New York, and information was received disclosing that there is no current, acting head of the SC, FPCC.

LEE advised that the various SC, FPCC Chapters and educational institutions are autonomous organizations which more or less act independently from each other and, except for literature, receive little assistance or cooperation from the National Office, FPCC.

APPENDIX

YOUNG POLITICAL EXPLORERS LEAGUE (YPEL)

A source advised that REE ANN HALONEN, daughter of OIVA HALONEN, who was then the Chairman of the Communist Party's Industrial Section at Seattle, had stated on July 29, 1957, that the youth group in Seattle was considering adoption of the name Young Political Explorers.

A second source advised that a meeting of the Communist Party Downtown Club in Seattle was held on October 30, 1958. WANDA HUBBARD, a Communist Party member, stated that she was the youth director of the Young Political Explorers. She stated there were two groups in Washington and the Seattle group had fifteen active members. The age limits were from twelve to twenty years of age. The purpose of the group was to examine all political ideas, including socialism.

A third source also reported on the CP Downtown Club meeting on October 30, 1958. WANDA HUBBARD stated that the youths had chosen the name of Young Political Explorers, which is a statewide Communist Party organization and was formerly known as the Labor Youth League. HUBBARD stated it is directly supported and directed by the Communist Party.

The Labor Youth League has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The second source advised on December 23, 1960, that the Young Political Explorers League was the teenage group of the youth organization in Seattle.

A fourth source advised that MARY SUTHERLAND, Youth Director of the Northwest District of the Communist Party, stated on May 17, 1961, that she was handling two youth groups, one of which was the teenage youth group.

A fifth source advised on July 2, 1963, that the Young Political Explorers League continues in existence in the Seattle area and is under the guidance and leadership of MARY SUTHERLAND.

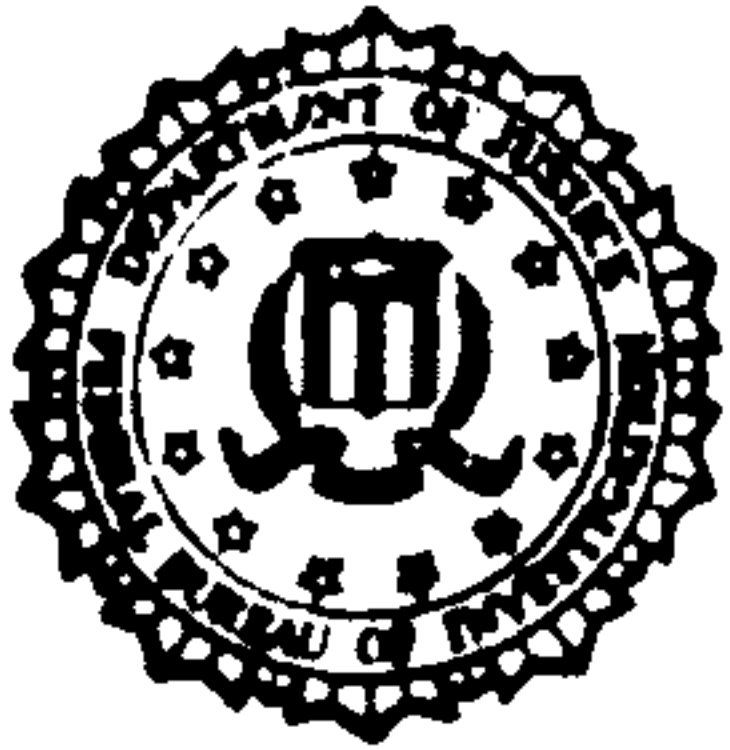

[PAT KIRKWOOD, JR.]

[Captain ROBERT ALLEN,] Vice Squad, San Antonio, Texas, Police Department, advised that [PAT KIRKWOOD, JR.] opened the "Cellar" on December 7, 1962 at San Antonio, Texas, and ceased operation on [April 4, 1963]. [The Cellar] was located at [202 1/2 East Houston Street] and was considered by [Captain ALLEN] as a hang-out for some local hoodlums and accordingly frequent checks were made at this establishment and a number of arrests of individuals visiting this establishment were made during the period that it was open.

The records of the Vice Squad of the San Antonio Police Department reflect that [PAT KIRKWOOD, JR.] gave his address as [3220 Cortez Street, Fort Worth, Texas], and the following individuals assisted [KIRKWOOD] in the opening of this establishment which was considered a "Beatnick joint":

Other individuals who also assisted in the opening of this establishment but whose addresses were not listed and the home addresses not known, were:

JAMES HARRELL

[Captain ALLEN] stated that the father of [KIRKWOOD, PAT KIRKWOOD, SR.], allegedly resides in [Fort Worth, Texas], and is a gambler. [Captain ALLEN] had no information as to the identity of any of these individuals who may have been acquainted with OSWALD, the assassinator of President KENNEDY.

A highly confidential source ascertained letter is from one HANSJERGEN STEIN, 5473 Bruckenstrasse 3, Kruft, West Zone, Germany. The letter is dated 11/27/63. In the letter STEIN is advising he has extra-sensory powers, and he requests that an FBI man meet him at a small town near Coblenz, Germany, where STEIN will make his extra-sensory ability available to FBI in solving assassination of the late President KENNEDY.

This letter is being forwarded to the Bureau for Bureau consideration as to whether acknowledgment is necessary.

After extensive investigation, LON MORRIS BONNER was located in Apartment 2, 1814 Pine Avenue, Long Beach, California. BONNER is employed as a lineman with the A. S. Schulman Electric Company, at the port of Long Beach, at the Edison Sub-Station. His permanent address is 1100 Industrial Avenue F 14, Chula Vista, California.

Approximately four weeks ago while at the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local #11, 2317 West Seventh Street, Los Angeles, California, he was in conversation with another member, TOMMY THOMPSON. THOMPSON is a male, white, 55 to 60 years, 5'10", 160 pounds, gray hair, who lives in Rosemead, California. Further address and job location of THOMPSON can be obtained through Local # 11.

While sitting around at the Local waiting for a job, they talked of many topics and politics entered the conversation. BONNER claimed that he did not vote for President KENNEDY which was known to THOMPSON, whom he described as a Republican. BONNER related that he had no information that THOMPSON belonged to any subversive organizations and neither had he ever heard THOMPSON express indifference to the United States form of Government.

BONNER related that he was unable to recall how the conversation came about, but said it was probably due to the fact that they were out of work and blamed the Democratic Administration for the lack of work in their particular field. During the conversation BONNER recalled THOMPSON remarked that "there were four slated to be knocked off". He further claimed that this would occur during the Democratic Convention next year. BONNER asked THOMPSON what he meant and THOMPSON replied that President KENNEDY, Governor BROWN, Chief Justice WARREN, and Attorney General KENNEDY were the ones he was talking about. BONNER then asked THOMPSON where he obtained the information and THOMPSON replied "never mind". BONNER said the conversation was dropped at this time and he has not talked to THOMPSON since the death of the President.

BONNER said that following the death of the President he wondered about the remark made by THOMPSON and claimed that in conversation with others in Chula Vista, he probably mentioned to individuals about the remarks made by THOMPSON without stating THOMPSON's name. BONNER said that he and THOMPSON were the only two in the conversation at the time of the above remark. BONNER had no further information to report regarding this incident.

Thompson allegedly made statement during the early part of November, 1963, that "four" were slated to be knocked off." In clarification he indicated the four he had in mind were President Kennedy, Governor Brown, Chief Justice Warren and Attorney General Kennedy. Los Angeles is currently endeavoring to locate Thompson for interview concerning any knowledge he has relating to the assassination of President Kennedy.

A review of the indices of the Richmond Office revealed that in Richmond file 72-4 captioned "CHARLES EVANS HUGHES, OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE" the report of SA W. HERSHEL CAVER, Richmond, dated 5/10/51, reflects that on 1/2/51 Deputy USMs, EDVA, went to the General Store, then operated by HUGHES at Providence Forge, Va., to execute a Writ of Attachment on personal property of HUGHES based on a civil judgment against HUGHES returned in USDC, Richmond, 11/8/50 in the amount of \$2,600.00.

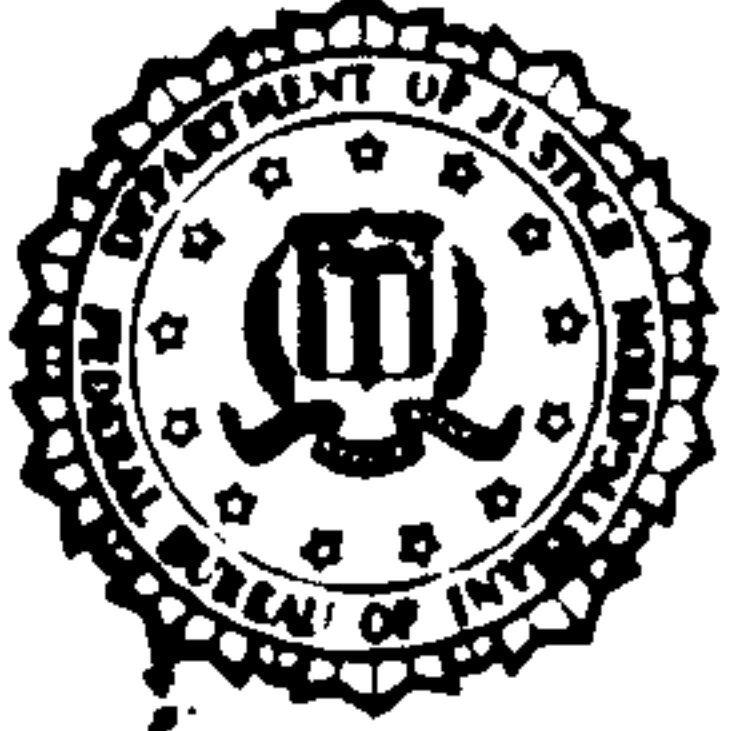

While the USMs were executing the writ, [HUGHES] was observed taking a large stack of money from a cash register. A deputy USM took hold of the money still being held by [HUGHES] and [HUGHES] broke the deputy's hold with his free hand and put the money in his pocket. Prosecution in this matter was declined by the USA, Richmond.

Richmond file 9-905 indicates that HUGHES was the subject of an extortion case in November, 1961, concerning an estate at Providence Forge, Va. In this case HUGHES wrote a letter to RICHARD C. RICHARDSON and AG ROBERT KENNEDY and others, urging the Attorney General to make an early settlement of his claim for five hundred million dollars against RICHARDSON's interest in the estate. Prosecution was declined in this matter by the AUSA, Richmond, Va.

On December 3, 1963, (CHARLES EVANS HUGHES,
Capitol Hotel,) Richmond, Virginia, advised that he has
been communicating with officials of the United States
Government, frequently since the inauguration of the late
President John F. Kennedy.

(Hughes) claimed to have written letters weekly
or more often to Attorney General Robert Kennedy concerning
various matters including recovery of property and goods
valued at five hundred million dollars which he claims
were wrongfully taken from him.

(Hughes) stated that he has been strongly partial
to the Kennedy Administration and has furnished information
to Attorney General Kennedy concerning persons making
derogatory remarks about the President or making threats
against the President.

(Hughes) claimed to have furnished to Attorney
General Kennedy information alleging that truck drivers
from North Carolina who were associated with James R.
Hoffa made remarks against President Kennedy. Hughes
alleged that in September or October, 1963, he was talking
to some truck drivers in the lobby of the Capitol Hotel,
during which conversation (Hughes) was commenting favorably
concerning President Kennedy. On this occasion a young

man approached him and stated that (Hughes) had better keep his mouth shut and further that if Hughes continued to make favorable remarks about the President, he, Hughes, would possibly be "knocked off." (Hughes) stated that he had never seen this man before nor since and did not know him to be a guest of the Capitol Hotel; however, after seeing news photographs of Lee Harvey Oswald, he noted that Oswald closely resembled the young man who approached him.

(Hughes) exhibited a copy of a typed letter which he claimed to have mailed November 26, 1963 to the following individuals:

Honorable Robert Kennedy, Senator Edward Kennedy, Senator Mike Mansfield, Senator Everett Dirksen, Senator Charles A. Halleck of Indiana, Senator Carl D. Albert, Congressman Pat Jennings, and Chief Justice Earl Warren.

The letter sought aid in recovery of property which he claimed was wrongfully taken from him and in stating that he had sought the help of the FBI, commented that "they had been bought."

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Reurairtel and enclosed letterhead memorandum captioned "Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, 11-22-63, AFO."

Referenced communication indicates that Hughes has corresponded with the Attorney General and numerous other individuals of importance in the Federal Government, presumably in connection with a civil judgment returned against him in U. S. District Court on 11-8-50.

Neither referenced airtel or letterhead memorandum indicate specifically the nature of the complaint. By return airtel advise full details and what steps are being taken by Hughes to retract his false allegations against the Bureau.

Information furnished by Hughes relative to the assassination of the late President should be reported in accordance with instructions previously set forth under caption "Lee Harvey Oswald, IS - R" and not by letterhead memorandum.

It is pointed out in referenced airtel [redacted]

[redacted], has proven himself to be emotionally unstable and completely lacking in reliability. Richmond is strongly of opinion that person [redacted] referred to in his statement while in Greensville County Jail, Emporia, Va., on 11/22/63 is [redacted] ANP member and subject of Richmond file [redacted] who made the statement on 7/28/63, according to [redacted], that if he were to be convinced that the cause of the ANP and Commander ROCKWELL were lost in the United States he would make an effort to assassinate the President of the U. S., Chief Justice EARL WARREN of the U. S. Supreme Court, and any other members of the Supreme Court who are Jewish. The information furnished by [redacted] concerning statement by [redacted] was furnished to Bureau in LHM captioned "March on Washington, 8/28/63" by cover airtel same date bearing same caption with character "Racial Matters". This information was subsequently disseminated by Bureau and a Special Agent of Secret Service conducted some investigation concerning [redacted], extent of which unknown to Richmond.

On afternoon of 12/7/63, Confidential Source [redacted] advised SA I. E. NICKOLS that he was of opinion the person [redacted] had in mind when he made statement at Emporia, Va.

11/22/63 was [REDACTED] since source had no knowledge concerning similar statement by any other persons associating with [REDACTED]

On 12/9/63, [REDACTED] Clerk, Arlington County Court, advised that on 11/29/63, an order had been entered in the Circuit Court, Arlington County, Va., committing [REDACTED] to Western State Hospital (a mental institution), Staunton, Va., for an indefinite period to determine if he is eligible "from a mental standpoint to be returned to society in a probationary status". This order was entered pursuant to charges which had been brought against [REDACTED] on 8/4/63, for the unauthorized use of an automobile at Arlington, Va., and to which charge he had entered a plea of guilty prior to above court order. Here it may be noted that [REDACTED] on 11/22/63, was in custody of the Greensville County Jail, Emporia, Va., held to await transportation back to Arlington County. He had been transported to Greensville County to stand trial on a charge of "unlawfully and feloniously conspiring with another to incite the white population of the State (Virginia) to acts of violence and war against the Negro population", incident to his arrest at Emporia, Va. on 7/22/63, along with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was found not guilty of these charges in Greensville County Circuit Court on 11/21/63.

In view of the complete lack of reliability on the part of [REDACTED] and his current incarceration in a mental institution, it is now opinion of Richmond that it would be undesirable to reinterview [REDACTED] and that there is no necessity for the incorporation of above information in a LHM since the substance has already been disseminated. It would appear that in view of the positive identification of LEE HARVEY OSWALD as the assassin of President KENNEDY, no good purpose would be served in further dissemination of this information at the present time. Therefore, UACB, this phase of the matter is being considered completed.

Enclosed herewith is a seven-page pencilled, handwritten resume concerning background of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. The seven-page resume is written on lined notebook paper.

The above described was found by Dallas Police Officers [J. P. ADAMCIK, R. S. STOVALL, G. F. ROSE] and H. M. MOORE during search of the property of LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the garage of Mrs. RUTH PAINE, 2515 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, on November 23, 1963. The document bears the initials of the above officers who conducted the search, and also the date.

Previous Laboratory report D-436846 AX dated 12/2/63, addressed to your office with copies for San Antonio advised that no conclusion could be reached with respect to the warrants in Qc68 dated 8/9, 8/26, 9/3, 9/13, 9/23, and 10/1 (all in 1963) as they were too indistinct for an adequate examination. Based on the clear photographs submitted and designated as item I, it was possible to positively identify OSWALD, K4 and K5, as the writer of the questioned endorsements on these warrants.

Also, the same Laboratory report advised that LA Forms 1 B-2 in Qc69 dated 8/27/63, and 9/6/63, were too indistinct for an adequate examination. On the basis of the original forms contained in item II, it was possible to positively identify OSWALD, K4 and K5, as the writer of the questioned signatures on the forms.

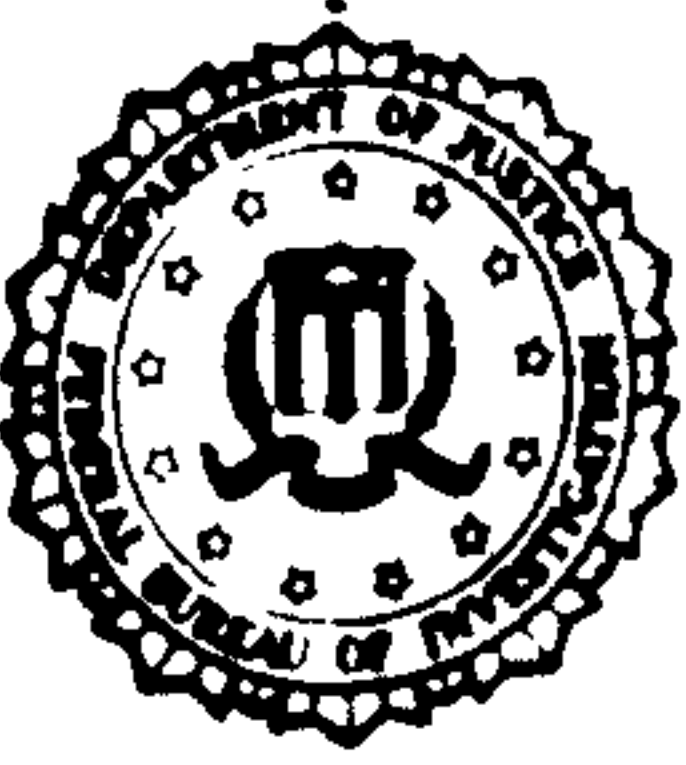

The "New York Times" newspaper on November 20, 1960, carried an article captioned "Pro-Castro Body Reports U.S. Gain," which reported that the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) had 5,000 paid-up members in the United States. The article declared that the FPCC had headquarters at 799 Broadway, New York City, New York, and had chapters in other cities, including one in San Francisco. U

A source advised in March, 1961, that the Bay Area Chapter of the FPCC (BAFPCC) began to be formed in San Francisco in November, 1960, under the direct guidance and leadership of ASHER HARER, who the source identified as a member of the San Francisco Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and a member of the National Committee of the SWP. U

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. U

A source advised in May, 1963, that the BAFPCC is currently active in the San Francisco area and includes members in San Francisco and surrounding counties. He advised that the BAFPCC has no headquarters but received mail through Post Office Box 2615, San Francisco 26, California, which is a box maintained by ASHER HARER. He stated that the announced aims and purposes of the BAFPCC are to "spread the truth about Cuba and to prevent U.S. intervention in Cuba." U

A source advised in March, 1963, that in the recent elections of the BAFPCC, the SWP continued its influence by having SWP members elected to the Executive Committee. U

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APPENDIX

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FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FPCC)

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned, "What Is Really Happening In Cuba?," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press. U

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch identified himself and Robert Taber as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and Taber obtained funds from the Cuban Government, which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement. U

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between the Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible. U

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962, and was filled by Vincent "Ted" Lee, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed Lee has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations, including the CP and the SWP, when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, Lee has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. Lee feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Cuban revolution per se. U

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450. U

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**SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY - SAN
FRANCISCO DIVISION**

A source advised on August 1, 1960, that the San Francisco Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was formed approximately in the early part of 1938 and the Oakland Branch of the SWP was formed in the latter part of 1938. U

A second source advised on October 26, 1959, that the name of the Oakland Branch of the SWP was changed to the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP. U

A third source advised on April 30, 1963, that the San Francisco Branch and the Oakland-Berkeley Branch of the SWP follow the policies and directives of the National SWP with which they are affiliated. U

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. U
