HATEMONGERS HI'S BY FBI DIRECTOR

Rights Leaders Warned On Red Infiltration Efforts

gar Hoover cautioned civil rights leaders today to beware of Communist attempts to infiltrate the rights movement.

And the FBI director—omitting any direct reference to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy—delivered a scathing attack on political extremists, hatemongers and the general state of American morality today.

To suggest that Negro aspirations for equal rights are Communist-inspired, Hoover said, is absurd.

Must Remain Alert

But "some individuals and groups exploit the tension for purposes not confined to the equality of human rights under the Constitution of the United States," Hoover cautioned. "The crusade should not become a vehicle for political radicalism or violence. Devotion to race should not supersede devotion to established institutions."

The FBI director said legitimate civil rights groups must "remain constantly alert to attempts by the Communists to influence their actions, take over their programs and corrupt their ranks."

Hoover's remarks were made at a testimonial dinner of the Broth-

erhood of the Washington Hebrew Congregation, which presented the FBI chief its Brotherhood Award.

While not mentioning Mr. Kennedy's murder in his speech, Hoover said:

"The cause of communism is well served by the hatemongers, the lunatic fringe and other rebels who preach a doctrine of malice and intolerance toward their fellow man."

He added, "These venomous fanatics, whether they are extremists of the left or right, are carriers of a highly infectious disease... they have brought forth the bombs and ignited the flames that have killed decent Americans and even innocent children... they are a national disgrace."

Invariably, Hoover said, "These merchants of hate attempt to drape themselves in a cloak of patriotism. But their real objective is to profiteer and capitalize upon ignorance, prejudice and bigotry while destroying the very ideals which they claim to uphold."

Moral Lethargy

Communism, he said, cannot be defeated "by hysteria and name calling, but it can be defeated by education and living proof that our way of life is best."

However, "moral lethargy, self-indulgence, neglect of duty—these lethal forces are undermining many facets of business, labor, industry and government," Hoover added.

Their influence has been felt. he said, "in the repulsive attitude of half-way Americans to whom life in this country is the enjoyment of rights and privileges devoid of responsibilities."

Another barometer of declining American morality, Hoover said, is a sharply rising crime rate.

"Disrespect for law and order," he said, "is a tragic moral sickness which attacks and destroys the American traditions of honesty, integrity and fair play."

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I cannot believe that the innuendo contained in the two marked sentences in this morning's Sun, editorializing the news report of your speech in a different context, correctly represents your views. These sentences plainly, by negative implication, seem to me to suggest that you agree with the chorus of those who blame the opponents of the Civil Rights Bill for the tragic assassination of the late President by a Communist. Many newspapers, Chief Justice Warren and others, are constantly trying to put the blame on the Southerners directly, and indirectly on all of us who, for constitutional and other reasons, oppose the present Civil Rights Bill. As shown by the shift in a quarter of a million votes in Philadelphia, opposition reflects the views of many people.

This tragic assasination was by a Communist, with no known connections with any right wing organization. Even if there had been a connection with some radical group addicted to violence, this would have constituted no ground for the attack on all of those who are labeled as bigots and rightists. As Burke said, you cannot indict all of the people, nor indeed a part. REC-56

Of course, I agree with you that one of the most difficult problems of anti-Communists comes from the fanatics on our own side - the type that suggests the Negro aspirations are communist inspired. But it is just as true that those of us who oppose the Civil Rights Bill cannot be blamed for the act of a Communist. As to this question, I certainly agree with the current "Life" editorial, my classmate Dave Lawrence's editorial in the current "U.S. News" and the quotation contained therein from the Wall Street Journal. As I wrote Glenn

Beall, a communist bullet cannot change the Constitution or the obligations of Congress to weigh legislation on the merits.

If, as I hope, you have made any public statement correcting the enclosed comments on your speech, I would appreciate it if you would get your secretary to send me a copy. If not, I hope you will let me know, as one of your admirers who has worked in a modest, and I believe moderate, way in the same field (Maryland law, A.B.A. Journal articles, etc.) whether the editorializing was justified.

Dear Mr. Hoovers

Thank you very much for your kindly acknowledgement of my letter-I cannot find words to express how deeply appreciative. I am for not only your unanticipated reply, but, that a-man as important and busy as you, should reply to such a meager item, as I forwarded, makes me humbly harpy-

Please, Sir, I do not want to make a pest of myself to you, or, your wonderful organization. I just did not expect to be thanked for sending something, which may have been to your expert eye, of no value.

I still feel cold chills when I think of the eerie similarity between the senseless killing of the girl and President Kennedy - but you cannot base cases on human feelings.

Though I cannot explain, why or what makes that article go through me so sharply, I do know I sent it to you for selfish reasons, which I owe to you to explain. They may make this letter longer, than it should be - but plant of the should be - but plan bear with me. I will keep them down within reason.

The death of President Kennedy, and the sorrowful lonely road down w Mrs. Kennedy is left to travel alone with their two children - and - that Officer Tippit was also killed on that day - opened wounds which had been't patched over many times - but - never as deeply reopened as on that fataling day, in our own immediate family.

You see, Sir, my father is also dead, but his death was not caused by bullets, nor as mercifully quick as President Kennedy's, Officer Tippit. REC-56 62-1090601841 or even Oswald's.

He was an officer in the Buffalo Police Department and in December 1935. during his trick of duty assignment for the day, directing traffic at the intersection of Broadway and Fillmore Avenue, when a trolley car jumped an open switch. Before he attempted to save himself, he made sure, that the crowd of about 40 people, men, women and children waiting to board that trolley car in the safety island in the center of the street, were all safely out of the way, and so, then and only then, did he make a move to get out of the way - but, too late. The trucks of the trolley car caught his legs and knocked him backwards under the street car. His injuries were a fractured skull and internal, which he suffered for 11 months, prior to the doctors' decision, he should undergo exploratory surgery and find the cause of his failure to recover. He consented, and the operation revealed his appendix intertwined 14 inches across the stomach with the large intestines. But, his recuperative powers had been so badly drained by the length of his He was 3d years of age, when he passed away candalogs mother also 38 // years of age with three small children; Dennis W. born Nov 18, 1930, who

would have become 6 years old. Mary Ellen, born July 18, 1932 was 4, and me. Kathleen F., born February 17, 1934, would have been 3.

So the deaths of President Kennedy, a policeman hit too close to home, and believe me, our hearts ride with Mrs. Kennedy, Officer Tippit's wife, for the road they must now travel is the one, we knew only too well - especially so, with Mrs. Kennedy, as Caroline and John, Jr., were so closely the same age as my brother and I, and being Roman Catholic and Irish, makes it even more keenly an awareness to the sorrow and heartache Mrs. Kennedy bears.

Then, what ever happened to Ruby that he was so successful in breaching the tight security measures of the Dullas Police Department, I don't know, but, it did gain the law enforcement agencies every where an added "black eye" and before my father and mother were married, he also risked his life to bring a law breaker, for which he received, and we still have his Conners Medal for Bravery awarded by the Buffalo Courter Express Morning paper. So, selfishly, I tried to do something, which I hoped somehow would make amends for the damage Ruby did, and honor what my father risked his life to uphold - the "love of law and justice".

I hope this makes sense to you, and may I add one more thing before I clc *? Thank you, Sir, and all the fine men in your magnificient organization for daily risking your lives to help, assure and maintain these laws, and the hopes that justice do remain secure for us - while we take them being the at all for granted. Thank you, and may God bless, guide, protect, and kes safe, you and all the fine men under you.

Major ALVIN HYLTON, U. S. Army, Fort Detrick, Maryland, advised as follows:

His mother, Mrs. ROSE HYLTON, who resides at 3472 had hill Street Huntington Park, California, owns a lot on which are located two houses one of which she herself resides in and the other which she rents to tenants. Major HYLTON described his mother as 70 years of age and added that she resides alone, that she may be approaching senility, although she is rational, that she sometimes exaggerates greatly and makes things up which she herself believes to be true. Major HYLTON said that she is not well educated.

He said that he received a letter from her dated November 10, 1963, which contained information regarding tenants who had recently moved out of her house because the tenants' work had changed to Saugus, California, where they intended to buy a house. In this letter she also stated as follows concerned former tenant and his wife, not further identified:

"Al, I want to tell you something, he is a Cuba rebel and mean as hell when he wants to be, she has been telling me for a long time ever since, they were here about, his uncle in Cuba and how they planned to kill Kennedy soon as they can so sometime back she said he was coming here, so he is here got here day before yesterday and they are having political meetings here at Compton, thats at Carlos, other uncle's home here and I think I have add at least they are cooking up trouble. This uncle just arrived here is being the new presedent in Cuba soon as he goes back with what he wants here he's a bad one and of course, there is a groop or party of them and this place is full of them and they come here for something important."

The rest of the letter, dated November 10, 1963, refers to personal matters not relating to her former tenants.

He also advised that he received another letter from his mother dated Thanksgiving evening in which she again

discussed personal, family business, however, she also wrote as follows:

"My wasn't that awfull about our president poor fellow. - he won the Hearts of all people, your right they sure should get a clean out of those Texas nuts and (Al) what I wrote you about, my tenant, I think she knew a lot and she confided in me a lot and that happened right after he got hereand she said 'that was what he was coming for.'"

Major HYLTON said that the above reference in the excerpt from his mother's letter to "those Texas nuts" was probably occasioned by a statement he jokingly made in a letter to his mother that all Texas residents were nuts. Major HYLTON said that he has received nothing further from his mother concerning her former tenants or statements made by them and he did not bring this information to anyone's attention prior to this time because of his mother's habit of exaggerating and making things up. However, after thinking about the assassine and hearing of OSWALD's possible connection with Cuba he felt that there could be a reason to place credence in his mother's statements.

The degree of security that with I is thered the President of the United States is demandate to a considerable that usen the degree of contact with the general public usuired by the President. Absolute security is neither practical ner pessible. In approach to complete security would require the President to eperate in a sort of vacuum, isolated from the general public and behind impregnable barriers. His travel would be in secret; his public appearances would be behind bulletyroof glass.

A more practical appreach necessitates compromise. Amy travel, any contact with the general public, involves a calculated rick on the part of the President and the men responsible for his protection. Such risks can be lessened when the Fresident recegnizes the security preblem, has confidence in the dedicated Secret Service men who are read to lay down their lives for him and accepts the necessary security precautions which they recommend. Many Presidents have been understandably impatient with the security precautions which many years of emperience dictate because these precautions reduce the President's grivacy and the access to him of the people of the country. Reverticless, the procedures and advice should be accepted if the President wishes to have any security.

In addition to the measures now in force, consideration might be given to the following suggestions designed to implove the security of the President.

4. Avoid setting a specific pattern of travel or other activity, such as visiting the same church at the same time each Sunday.

Public Appearances:

- 1. Use maximum feasible screening of persons in attendance, including use of detection devices sensitive to the amount of metal required in a firearm or grounds.
- 2. Use a bulletproof shield in front of the entire rostrum in public appearances such as the swearing in ceremony at the Capitol, the Presidential reviewing stand in front of the White House on Inauguration Days, and on the rear of trairs.
- 3. Keep to a minimum the President's movements within crowds. Remain on the rostrum after public addresses rather than mingling with the audience.
- 4. In appearances at public sporting events, such as football games, remain in one place rather than changing sides during the halftime ceremonies.
- 5. Limit public appearances by use of television whenever possible.
- 6. Avoid walking in public except when absolutely necessary.

Legislation:

- 1. Add the President and the Vice President to the list of Federal Officers set out in Section 1114, Title 18, United States Code, assaults upon whom are punishable under Federal law.
- 2. Furnish the Socret Service improved authority to request assistance and cooperation from other United States agencies, including the military, particularly in connection with foreign travel.

- 3. Improve control of t's sale of firearms, requiring, as a minimum, registra a of every firearm sold, together with adequate identification of the purchaser.
- 4. Ean picketing in the vicinity of the White House as is now done at the United States Capital and Supreme Court.



Daniel James, Executive Secretary, Citizens Committee for a Free Cuba, 1426 G Street, Northwest, Washington, D. C., advised on November 23, 1963, that he was in contact on November 22, 1963, with Andrew St. George, a photographer for "Life" Magazine. James stated that Andrew St. George informed him that Jose Pardo Llada, Cali, Colombia, South America, a newspaper reporter and writer, knows of a plan of Fidel Castro to kill United States Ambassadors in various countries. James stated that St. George received this information personally from [Pardo] whom he had seen in Colombia. James stated that this information apparently had been received by Andrew St. George several months ago when he was in Colombia for some time.

Andrew St. George, "Life" photographer, on December 3, 1963, advised that he had been to Washington, D. C. on November 22-23, 1963. St. George stated that on November 22, 1963, he had spoken with Paul Bethel, an associate of Daniel James, Executive Secretary of the Citizens Committee for a Free Cuba. St. George stated that Bethel is the former Press Attache at the American Embassy in Havana, Cuba, and in all probability told James about the details of his conversation of November 22, 1963.

St. George advised that in June, 1962, he had made a trip to Chile in order to do a story on the Peace Corps and had then traveled to Peru on an assignment and then proceeded to Cali, Colombia, where he had an assignment to do photographic work for an international food exhibit. While in Cali, Colombia, Andrew St. George stated that he spoke with Jose Pardo Llada, former leading television-radio commentator and newspaperman in Cubalwho had been very close to the government of Fidel Castro prior to his defection which took place in February, 1961 St. George

During interview with ANDREW ST. GEORGE, he stated that JOSE PARDO LLADA had informed him that he had been interviewed on numerous occasions by CIA after his defection in February, 1961] [PANDO LLADA] stated that he had given CIA detailed information concerning the Cuban situation and had also furnished the CIA with the contents of the enclosed letterhead memorandum relative to the plan of FIDEL CASTRO to have U.S. Ambassadors assassinated in the event of a U.S. invasion of Cuba.

Re: Fidel Castro Ruz

advised that during one of his conversations with [Pardo Llada,] [Pardo Llada] told him the following story:

Pardo Llada stated that one day during the latter part of 1960, he had been to the Presidential Palace in Havana where he met a friend who had just come out of a meeting with Prime Minister Fidel Castro prior to assuming his post as Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia. [Pardo Llada] said that he congratulated his friend whom he stated was a former student leader during the Cuban revolution, and his friend was very discouraged and downhearted as a result of his interview with Fidel Castro. [Pardo Llada] stated that the new Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia left the office of Fidel Castro carrying a package and later after they had left the Presidential Palace, the new Cuban Ambassador showed [Pardo Llada] a machinegun which had been given to him by Fidel Castro, and was in the package which he carried out of the Prime Minister's office.

Pardo Llada stated that in conversation with the new Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia, he, the new Ambassador, said that Fidel Castro told him of his plan to assassinate United States Ambassadors in 11 neutral countries in the event that the United States invaded Cuba. The new Cuban Ambassador told Pardo Llada that Fidel Castro was crazy, and that Castro was doing many things that he could not understand, and this was the reason why he was depressed and downhearted as a result of his interview with Castro. The new Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia told Pardo Llada that Castro had told him that he was selecting as Ambassadors to 11 neutral countries young revolutionaries who were dedicated to the ideals of the Cuban revolution, and that in the event the United States invaded Cuba, these 11 Cuban Ambassadors were to have a trusted staff member of the Cuban Embassy immediately seek out the United States Ambassador in that country and assassinate him.

Andrew St. George stated that in his conversation with Pardo Llada] he asked Pardo Llada] whether or not he thought this story was true, and Pardo Llada] said that from his past knowledge of, and association with, Fidel Castro, he had implicit trust in what the new Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia had told him, and he said that Castro was crazy enough to carry out such a plan.

Andrew St. George also advised on December 3, 1963, that at the time of his interview with Pardo Llada which took place in July, 1962, Pardo Llada had given him the name of the Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia, but he did not recall his name exactly, but remembered it only as sounding like Cartano (phonetic). St. George stated that this individual, Cartano, apparently had assumed his post as Ambassador to Tunisia during late 1960 or early 1961, and he was described by Pardo Llada as being a man in his middle thirties, who had been friendly with Pardo Llada for many years in Cuba and particularly at the University of Havana.

Andrew St. George stated that during his conversation with Pardo Lladal relative to this plot of Castro to assassinate United States Ambassadors in the event of a United States invasion of Cuba, Pardo Lladal said that there were no specific individuals mentioned, but the only specific statement made by the Cuban Ambassador to Tunisia was that Castro had indicated his plan as being directed against United States Ambassadors assigned to 11 neutral countries, without naming these neutral countries.

Andrew St. George further stated on December 3, 1963, that while in Washington, D. C. during the period of November 22-23, 1963, he had prepared a memorandum in which he detailed his personal feelings about the possibility of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy being in someway caused by Cuban propaganda. St. George stated that his idea was to write a story for "Life" Magazine setting forth his thinking that the assassination of President John F. Kennedy could have been triggered by someone of the lunatic fringe who had been influenced by the constant Cuban propaganda directed against the United States and President John F. Kennedy by Prime Minister Fidel Castro. St. George stated that this theory was not accepted by his superiors, and in Washington, D.-C. he noted that the American press was directing the opinion that the assassination of President John F. Kennedy had been brought about by someone connected with the evine political right.

Andrew St. George also advised on December 3, 1963, that the only national magazine which has, in any way, indicated the possibility of Cuban involvement in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy was the current issue of "US News and World Report" dated December 9, 1963. This article appears on pages 90 and 91, and it is captioned, "What Are the Odds Against Castro Now". This article sets forth the thinking that Fidel Castro is everywhere stirring up trouble and violence and, specifically, states that pro-Castro terrorists are creating problems in Venezuela and other countries of this hemisphere.

The editorial stated "Now a series of inquiries is beginning. One is by the FBI and the Justice Department into both the assassination and the murder of the accused assassin. Another study will be conducted in Congress in connection with legislation to make a murderous attack on the President and Vice President a Federal crime wherever committed. The State of Texas will conduct a special expost facto inquiry. - - But one simple fact should not be ignored. The accused, and likely, murderer was a proudly professed Marxist; he never boasted of being a segregationist or a far-righter."



The El Paso Office sent an issue of the Indiana Herald for November 27 - December 6, 1963. The front page is entitled "Was F. B. I. At Fault In Kennedy Assassination." The front page editorial indicates that the FBI was not responsible for the President's safety since this is the job of the Secret Service. The editorial states, however, that the FBI did not advise the Secret Service of what it knew about Oswald and implies that the FBI had deliberately refused to inform Secret Service because of jealousy. The editorial states that the FBI let the President get killed "as

An editorial on page two by O. L. Tandy carries the theme against the FBI further. The general nature of this publication can be seen from the many seminude women depicted throughout the publication. It professes great sorrow over the death of the President and in the same issue, in what must be undoubtedly the worst possible taste, carries a picture of a belly dancer who is alleged to resemble Jackie Kennedy (page 8).

Bufiles indicate we have had limited correspondence with Tandy in connection with several publications he allegedly ran. Our dealings with him have been cautious. The Indianapolis Office advised in 1957 that Opal Tandy had been publisher of the defunct "Indianapolis Record" and at that time was starting the "Hoosier News." Tandy was closely allied with a well known Indianapolis gambler and was reportedly a shakedown artist who obtained payoffs from this individual's rivals by threatening to print stories about their gambling activities. His newspaper, and the fact that this is obviously a successor of a number of such newspapers, indicates he is a fly-by-night operator. His entire pitch seems to be criticism of the FBI rather than any sincere sorrowful feeling about the death of the President.
