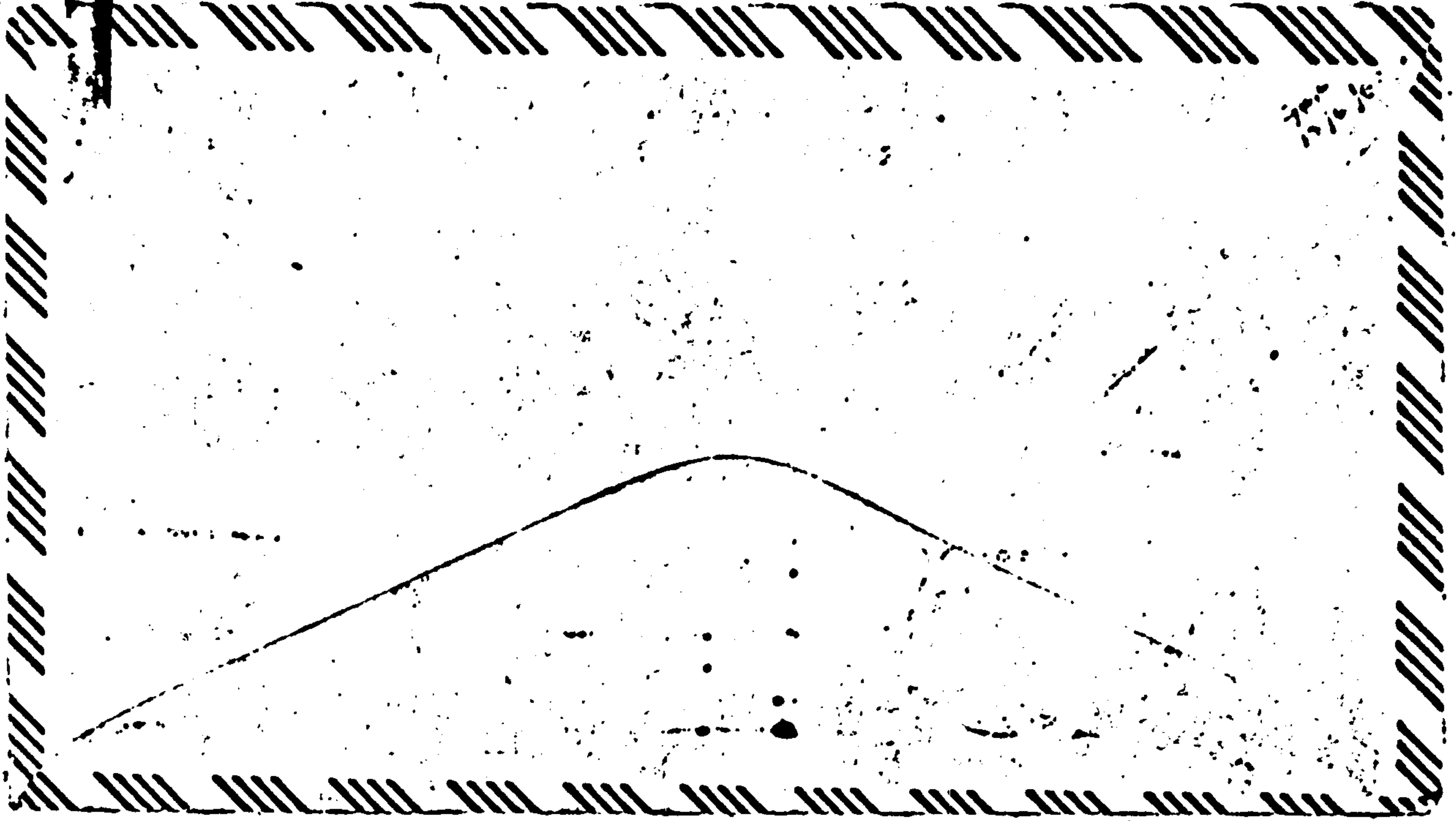

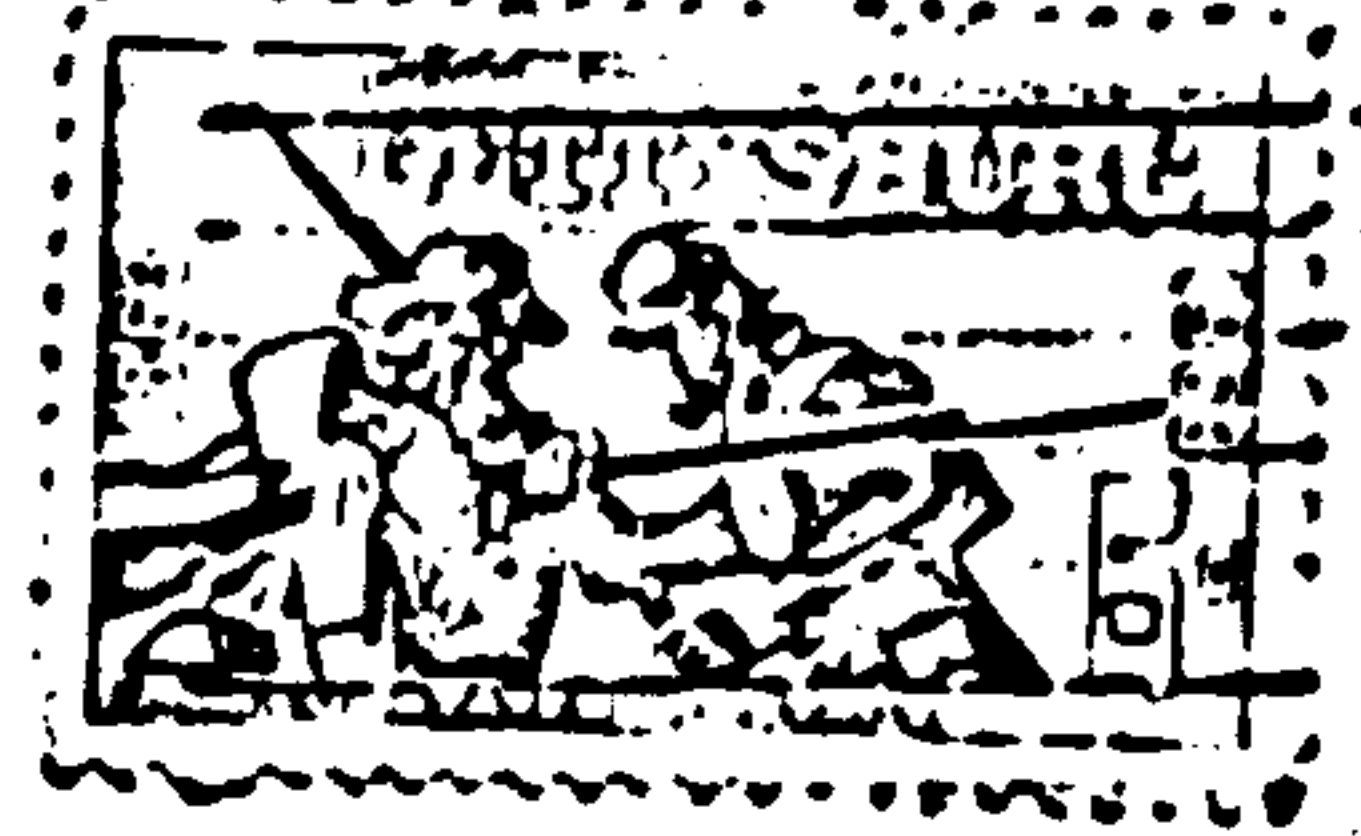

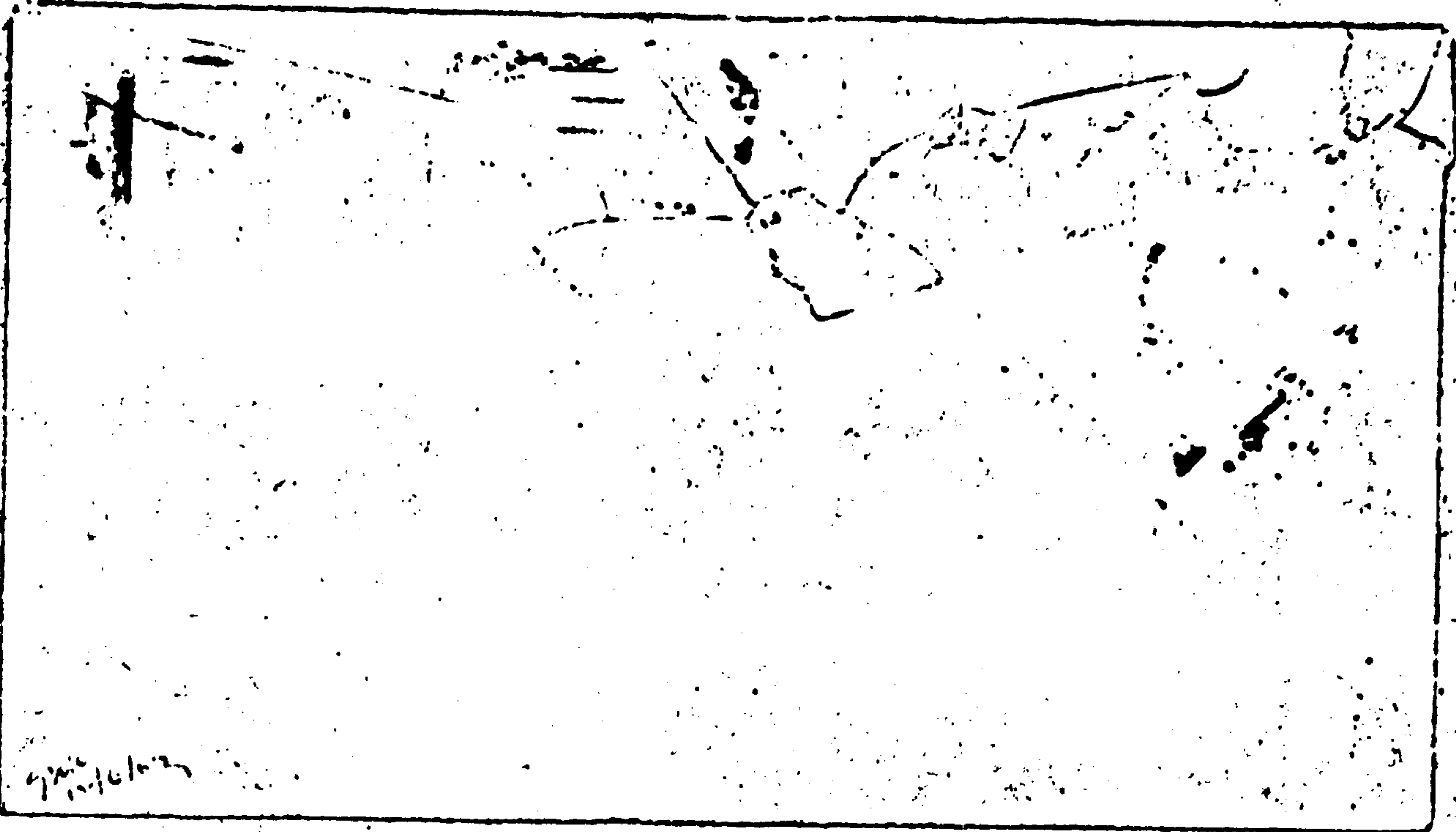

Lee Oswald, 23, 1907 Magazine, Monday was sentenced to pay a fine of \$10 or serve 10 days in jail on a charge of disturbing the peace by creating a scene.

Oswald was arrested by First District police at 4:15 p. m. Friday in the 700 block of Canal while he was reportedly distributing pamphlets asking for a "Fair Play for Cuba."

Police were called to the scene when three Cubans reportedly sought to stop Oswald. Municipal charges against the Cubans for disturbing the peace were dropped by the court.

At 2:33 a.m. Midnight Supervisor William E. Assmus received a telephone call from [redacted] Stratford Hotel, Washington, D. C., regarding the President's assassination.

[redacted] stammered, his speech was disorganized and he gave every indication of being mentally deranged. He insisted that President Kennedy was not dead and that the whole affair had been staged to force him, [redacted] into the Armed Services.

[redacted] indicated that he had received orders to report for induction and that he did not realize he was such an important person until this whole affair was staged for his benefit.

Conversation with [redacted] was terminated upon the receipt of another telephone call by SA Assmus.

The only reference to a [redacted] in Bureau indices is a [redacted] Bufile 52-0-3405, which reflects that [redacted]

[redacted] It would not appear that this [redacted] is identical with instant caller in view of the age difference, [redacted] being 38 years of age.

INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA

Memorandum Wannall to Sullivan 11-25-63 captioned, "Assassination of President John F. Kennedy, 11-22-63," sets forth information indicating that Andrew St. George, "Life" magazine photographer, had learned of Castro plan to kill U. S. Ambassadors in various countries from [Jose Pardo Llada, newspaperman in South America] and that press in September, 1963, carried items indicating Castro stated U. S. leaders would be killed if they planned or engaged in aggression against Cuba. Memorandum noted field was interviewing St. George and obtaining the press items. The Director indicated we should disseminate when we received corroboration.

St. George, upon interview, advised that in July, 1962, he had been in contact with [Pardo, former Castro newspaperman] who broke with Castro in 1961, in Colombia, South America. [Pardo] stated that while in Cuba in 1960 he met Cuban diplomat who told him Castro had planned to assassinate U. S. Ambassadors in eleven neutral countries if U. S. invaded Cuba. Reportedly, Castro stated he was selecting as Ambassadors to the eleven neutral countries young dedicated revolutionists who would have trusted members of Cuban Embassies in these countries assassinate U. S. Ambassadors there in the event U. S. invaded Cuba. [Pardo] told St. George he had been interviewed on several occasions by Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) after his defection and that he had previously furnished this information to CIA.

Review of press items by Miami Office indicates that Castro in September, 1963, reportedly stated that U. S. leaders would be in danger if they helped in any attempt to do away with Cuban leaders.

Dear Mr. Chief Justice:

At the direction of President Johnson, I am transmitting herewith to you and to the other members of the Commission copies of the report of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on the assassination of President Kennedy and on the subsequent shooting of Lee Harvey Oswald. You will note that in some aspects the investigation is continuing and further information will be made available to the Commission as it develops. The Secret Service and the Department of State have also prepared reports with respect to the preparations made to guard the President and certain background information in the hands of the State Department with respect to Oswald. You will have these promptly.

This report is not a classified document since it does not contain defense information. However, we have been treating it as a highly classified document and I trust that you and the other members of the Commission will do likewise until such time as you determine to release matters contained within it. Within the Government it is being read by a very limited number of people on a "need to know" basis.

You will recall that at the time of announcing the Federal Bureau of Investigation investigation, and prior to the appointment of the Commission, President Johnson announced that the FBI report would be made public. I have,

however, informed him of your request that this report not be released until the Commission has had time to review all of the facts and evaluate them. At the same time I am sure you are aware that there is much public speculation and rumor in this connection which would be desirable to allay as quickly as possible. For example, the latest Gallup poll shows that over half the American people believe that Oswald acted as part of a conspiracy in shooting President Kennedy, and there is considerable rumor in this country and abroad to the effect that Ruby acted as part of the same or a related conspiracy.


I think, therefore, the Commission should consider releasing--or allowing the Department of Justice to release--a short press statement which would briefly make the following points:

(1) The FBI report through scientific examination of evidence, testimony and intensive investigation, establishes beyond a reasonable doubt that Lee Harvey Oswald shot President Kennedy on November 22, 1963. The evidence includes ballistic tests, fingerprints and palm prints, clothing fibers and other technical data which place Oswald at the scene of the crime and establish that he fired the shots which killed President Kennedy and wounded Governor Connally of Texas.

(2) The FBI has made an exhaustive investigation into whether Oswald may have conspired with or been assisted by any organization, group or person, foreign or domestic, in carrying out this heinous act. In this regard, the FBI has questioned hundreds of persons and checked out numerous rumors and reports. To date this aspect of the investigation has been negative. No evidence has been uncovered indicating that any organization, group or person, including Dallas night club owner, Jack Ruby, was involved with Oswald in the assassination of President Kennedy, or that the subsequent shooting of Oswald was part of a conspiracy.

I would be happy to discuss any of the matters contained in this letter or in the report with you or other members of the Commission at any time you should desire. I am, of course, always at your service.

SUBJECT: The Congressional Record

Pages 22639-22640. The Senate passed without amendment S. J. Res. 137, authorizing the Commission established to report upon the assassination of President John F. Kennedy to compel the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production of evidence.

Pages 22763-22764. Congressman Snyder, (R) Kentucky, spoke concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. He placed in the Record the text of a telegram sent by Associated Industries of Kentucky to the Kennedy family and an editorial entitled "The Bitter Fruit of Apathy" which was published in the newspaper, Action In Kentucky. The editorial stated "They have told us there is no danger from the radical left—that it is small and inconsequential. Only idiots, neurotics, and right-wing extremists worry about it. - - - It is a case of bitter irony indeed that the late President's brother, Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy, declared there was practically no danger from the left. To the dismay of thoughtful and knowing conservatives, he ordered a major curtailment of FBI activities in the very area of our national shame that ultimately produced his brother's death. - - - The only thing extreme about those who have been sounding the clarion call about the Marxist apparatus is that they have been, and remain today, extremely right."

PAGES A1704-A1747Z. Congressman Boggs, (D) Louisiana, extended his remarks to include a number of articles regarding the assassination of President Kennedy. This material included an article entitled "Sociologists Doubt Dallas Killings Indicate National Moral Slump—But They Warn That Economic Tension, Family Trouble Stir Increase in Violence by a Few" which appeared in the Wall Street Journal on November 26th. This article stated "Federal Bureau of Investigation figures confirm the recent increase in violent crime. Ironically, murders last year declined 2 percent from the 1958-60 average. But all reported crimes rose four times as fast as population in the past 5 years. - - - Cities vary greatly in their crime rates, suggesting that the quality of police action has considerable importance. - - - Dallas ranks well down the list of per capita crime rates among the 20 largest U. S. cities. It is sixteenth in robberies and eleventh in assaults, according to FBI figures."

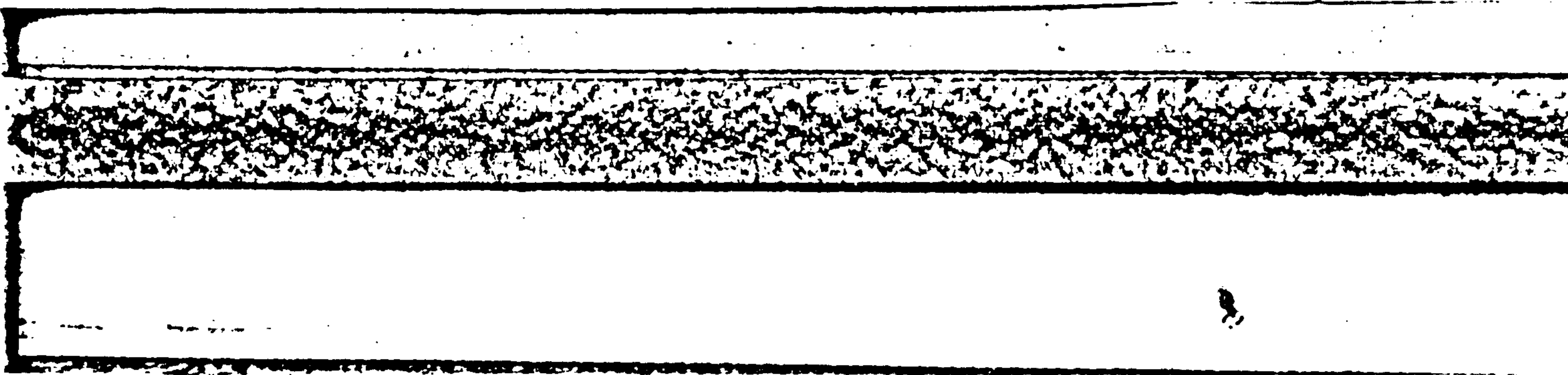
