Proceeding
On Tuesday, December 3, 1963, Mr. Cleve Herman, sportscaster and news commentator on Radio Station K.F.W.B., announced that an F. B. I. report on the assassination of J. F. Kennedy, was to be presented to Atty. General, Robert Kennedy. He stated the report would be a closing report and that it would indicate that Lee Oswald was a "Loner", not part of a conspiracy; but that sufficient evidence existed to establish him in fact, as the assassin of the president.

It is incredible, if true, that such a report could be foisted on the American people as the final chapter in the death of the president.

I for one, would not accept such a report unless it contained also a statement to the effect that Oswald was in the least, a Marxist, and more probably a Communist; and that either political school was the background for his ultimate act. This being true, the report should recommend, that all political groups dedicated to the overthrow of the United States government be outlawed and abolished. Further, that all known members of any such group be imprisoned as enemies of the government and peoples of the United States.

Dear Mr. Weinstock:

Your letter of December 7th, with enclosure, to Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy has been referred to me.

President Johnson instructed the FBI to conduct a complete investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald. All of our resources were used to consider every possible ramification of this matter. The report containing the results of our investigation is based entirely on facts and laboratory examinations and not on speculation. Pursuant to the instructions of President Johnson, our report has been forwarded to the Attorney General and to the Presidential Commission.

The FBI has not made its report public inasmuch as the Presidential Commission has been charged with the responsibility to study all available information and make a finding in these matters.

DIGGING IN DEEP . . . An Italian writer and former member of the Italian counterpart to our FBI has been doing his own investigation of the Kennedy assassination. His views, at variance with published reports, are the following:



MRS. FRANK J. LEWIS

That Jack Ruby knew Lee Harvey Oswald and the Dallas policeman, J. D. Tippit; that Oswald was supposed to have been killed in the warehouse and because he got out unscathed the timetable was upset and he became a threat to the plotters' security.

That Tippit was not assigned to the police beat on which he discovered Oswald, and that Tippit's own beat was actually on the other side of town on Nov. 22; that Oswald had no fear when he was called over to the patrol car but panicked when Tippit got out of his car with a drawn gun, because Oswald then knew he had been double crossed.

That Oswald requested security in transfer from the police lockup to the city jail; that the gun scope was put on the gun at Klein's and sold as a unit; the scope was not put on by a Fort Worth gunsmith as claimed.

That meetings were held in January, February, and March by a militant group from Cuba who posed as dissatisfied exiles; that the rivalry between the FBI and secret service was well known to the Dallas police, and as a consequence they did not give either organization any pre-parade cooperation.

This Italian informant is convinced by his investigation that there was a plot and that the roots are very deep. He plans to cover the trial in February because he is convinced it is going to be mishandled in Ruby's favor.

Interview of Mrs. ROSE HYLTON was conducted at her home, 3472 Hill Street, Huntington Park, California, on 12/11/63 by SA's FREDERICK E. RODERICK and HARRY H. WHIDBEE. Mrs. HYLTON stated that she is in her 70's; that she lives alone and from the outset of the interview stated that during the entire time that CARLOS MARADIAGA and his wife, DORA lived at the residence at the rear of her house that she was extremely afraid of them.

She recalled that on one occasion that she had had a violent argument with CARLOS MARADIAGA and she called the local police to keep the peace at her residence.

It was noted during the interview that Mrs. HYLTON was highly excitable and was given to exaggerating to the point that she was uncertain of details regarding the conversations she had had with Mrs. MARADIAGA as well as to exactly when these took place. She admitted that she had assumed that CARLOS MARADIAGA had come from Cuba but that in fact she did not know anything regarding his origin. Mrs. HYLTON was very opinionated regarding the MARADIAGAS and admitted that when they first moved to her rental house that she thought they were Negroes.

She advised the last known address of the MARADIAGAS in Saugus, California. When pressed for details Mrs. HYLTON apparently was confused with information she first allegedly heard from Mrs. MARADIAGA that her husband's uncle allegedly was involved in the shooting of three men in his native country for which he received a political position and that he would have to kill "the President" to further himself in that country, with a plan to kill the President of the United States.

She could not advise any details regarding any political meetings and was confused as to the dates when Mrs. MARADIAGAS repeated to her that "the President" was to be killed. She stated that the MARADIAGAS moved on 12/1/63, and then that they moved on 12/3/63. When asked what Mrs. MARADIAGAS told her after President JOHN F. KENNEDY was killed she became confused and stated that she had not seen Mrs. MARADIAGAS after Mr. KENNEDY ~~after Mr. KENNEDY~~ was killed.

It was apparent that Mrs. HYLTON is approaching senility, because she talked on at length without any continuity.

The Los Angeles Office indices were negative for names, CARLOS MARADIAGA, DORA MARADIAGA, Mrs. ROSE HYLTON and TONY SCORSONE. The latter is allegedly an uncle of CARLOS MARADIAGA and resides in Compton, California.

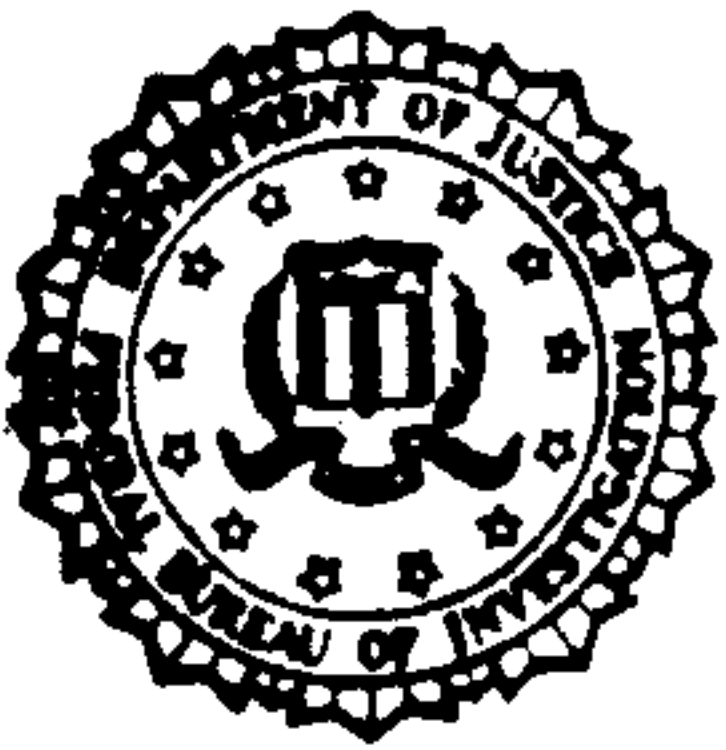

On 12/11/63, Mr. James J. Rowley, Chief, U. S. Secret Service, while discussing other matters with Liaison Agent Bartlett, commented that the 12/10/63, editions of the "New York Times" and the "Washington Evening Star" carried articles to the effect that the FBI had turned over a "risk list" to the Secret Service in Dallas. These articles further stated that the name of Oswald was not on this list. Mr. Rowley indicated that he did not think such a list existed, however, he desired to check to make sure they are not missing something.

After checking on this matter at the Bureau, Bartlett advised Mr. Rowley that the Bureau in Dallas turned over to the Secret Service three items of interest to the Secret Service in connection with the President's visit. These items included the following:

(1) 10/30/63, information concerning Norman Lee Elkins regarding a threat to the President.

(2) A package of leaflets turned over to the Secret Service on 11/21/63, entitled "Wanted for Treason."

(3) 11/21/63, information concerning picketing and signs to be carried by the pickets - a group known as "Indignant White Citizens Council," Grand Prairie, Texas, headed by Bob Joiner.

Mr. Rowley said he appreciated this information and that the Secret Service Headquarters here was familiar with these three items furnished by the Bureau.

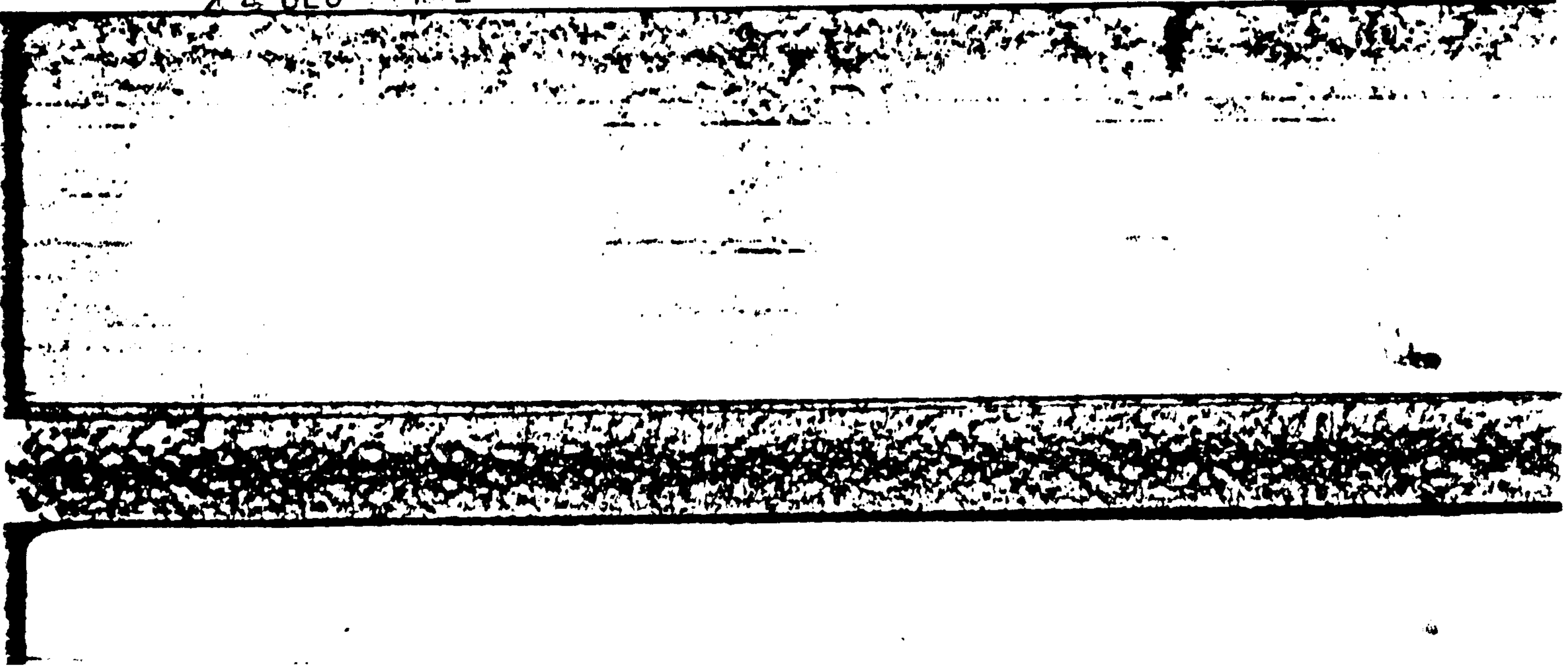

Reference is made to telephone call from Mr. JAMES HANDLEY of the Bureau to ASAC KYLE G. CLARK, Dallas, Texas. Mr. HANDLEY requested that negatives of photographs taken of the crime scene be obtained from the Dallas Police Department and forwarded to the Bureau. On December 2, 1963, Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY, Dallas Police Department, advised that he could not release the original negatives from his department at this time because of an impending court of inquiry by the Attorney General of Texas. Chief CURRY had made up negative copies of all of the photographs in their possession of the crime scene and turned them over to this office on December 3, 1963. All necessary vital information concerning these crimes is already bottled up among members of the Commission. To expect such a commission to reveal any truth is as silly as to expect Joseph Vaché to head a commission to investigate the crimes of "Cosa Nostra".

Kennedy was provided with several "doubles". If Kennedy was killed, it was because these conspirators wanted him dead. If the "double" was killed (as might have been expected if less than criminal inadequate security measures had been established), then we must search out Kennedy and determine his complicity in these crimes. If Kennedy is, in fact, dead, then we must seek the purposes of his killing. This, as I have reported before, was to remove him as a failure on Vatican policies by reason of his vacillation and ineptitudes; to take maximum public relations advantage of his corpse for future Vatican prestige, as manifested in four days of vulgar parading of the dead, and including the lighting of a "perpetual flame" over his grave of corruption (which may burn for as long as a few weeks); and to replace him - after the predicted murder of Lyndon Johnson, with John Mc Cormack, a bitter, ruthless, bigoted Roman Catholic named as Speaker of the House for the purpose, who will be eager to consummate the Vatican conspiracy of a world theocratic dictatorship, prepared to throw the H-bomb; prepared to perish in the rubble of the United States and the world, as Hitler perished in the rubble of Berlin. I warn all nations of the world of their dire peril as this conspiracy unfolds.

But the truth will be revealed nevertheless. Too many know too much for the truth to be concealed. These are the "latter days" - the Indians' "days of the end - the time of purification", when all things hidden shall be revealed. When the full truth of this stupendous conspiracy is exposed, the government of the United States will fall into chaos - an end which I have tried to prevent - followed by the collapse of our entire society.

As I have reminded you before, your allegiance is not to J. Edgar Hoover, nor to the Vatican, nor to Lyndon B. Johnson, but solely to the defense of the Constitution of the United States. Regardless of any position taken by J. Edgar Hoover on this investigation, it is mandatory that you, and all loyal members of the FBI, and all officials of government sworn to defend the Constitution, continue full investigation, using all associates whom you are able to reach, and all facilities and powers of government. I, as a "sovereign citizen" and as one who is, like you, sworn to defend the Constitution, direct that you proceed with this duty. My authority in issuing such a directive is absolute and not to be questioned. Under my announcement of the establishment of the Constitutional Provisional Government of the United States, on January 30, 1961, at the time of the fraudulent inauguration of John F. Kennedy at which time constitutional government disappeared in the United States, and in accordance with my military indoctrination and duty, I "assumed command", in the name of the Constitution and the people of the United States, to restore and defend the Constitution - as you, yourself, and other loyal public servants might have done, but did not.

Not as a threat, but to stiffen your own resolution, I remind you that when the process of "reclassification" of public servants according to their loyalty under their oath of office gets under way, it would be far better for you to be on the outside looking in, than on the inside with these scoundrels, looking out - to what final end has not yet been determined. A nation which expects to survive must find the means of taking into custody, and punishing by due process of law, its enemies who have betrayed it to

Our reports will probably be disseminated to the Commission. We are presently getting together additional copies for dissemination.

In order to preclude questions being raised as to what else will be submitted, it is suggested that we have a preface in each report which clearly indicates the status.

In this connection, it is, therefore, recommended that The Assassination Report contain the following preface:

This report in Part I briefly relates the assassination of the President and the identification of Oswald as his slayer.

Part II sets forth the evidence conclusively showing that Oswald did assassinate the President.

Part III is in two sections, the first setting forth what the FBI knew about Oswald prior to the assassination; and the second section setting forth the results of our investigation of Oswald's background, activities, associates, et cetera, subsequent to the assassination.

Three sets of exhibits accompany this report. The first sets out evidence tying in Oswald with the assassination of the President; the other two set out documents relative to Oswald's contacts with the Soviets, the Communist Party, et cetera.

We are continuing to receive leads concerning Oswald and consequently at the conclusion of the report it is stated this investigation will continue in order to resolve them.

Re: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

The Report of the Killing of Lee Harvey Oswald should have the following prefatory statement:

This report covers the killing of Oswald by Jack Ruby. The information developed concerns Jack Ruby; the interview of Ruby; Ruby's whereabouts from November 23 to November 24, 1963; and the investigation by the FBI under the Civil Rights Statutes to determine whether there was any conspiracy involved in the killing.

Attached to this report are two exhibits, one a photograph of the actual killing and the other a diagram of the police department building basement where the killing occurred.

No records were kept of the police officers or news media representatives in the basement at the time of the killing. We have not been able to identify, locate and interview all persons who were present when Ruby killed Oswald. The report reflects that persons identified to us have been or are being interviewed. We have interviewed 98 Dallas police officers and are attempting to identify any others who were in the basement and interview them. An estimated 150 news media representatives were in the basement. We have been able to identify and interview 51 so far, and leads are set out throughout the country to identify and locate others who may have been present. We have no facts at this time to indicate that the stories of these people, when they are located, will be at variance with the facts developed so far. Every effort is being made to locate them so that all possible questions can be resolved.

You will note the statement at the end of this report that the investigation will continue until every possible source of pertinent information has been exhausted.

RECOMMENDATION

If approved, the above prefatory statements will be included in each report submitted in order to preclude unnecessary questions from being asked while the report is being reviewed by recipients.

In a letter received by the Attorney General recently from Marvin Jones of 1714 Life Building, Dallas, Texas, the following information is furnished:

"(1) I was personally told by a member of the Sheriff's office that on Sunday morning, November 24, 1963, about 5:00 A.M., the Sheriff's office either sent a car to transfer Oswald or requested that the transfer be made at that time, but that Dallas Police Chief Curry refused to transfer him at that time because of press notice, although Ruby was transferred without notice to the press.

"(2) One television report stated that employees and other persons entering the building where Oswald worked were checked by the Dallas police on Friday morning, November 22, 1963, and that Oswald entered carrying a package but it was not checked by the policeman for the reason that Oswald said it contained a window shade.

"(3) Mr. Jack Gay, one of my law partners, learned Friday afternoon, November 22, 1963, from one of his clients that some man had stated that he would give his life to kill President Kennedy. This information was given to Chief Greene of the Police Department of Farmers Branch (a suburb of Dallas) because the person hearing the statement made was a female who resides in Farmers Branch. It is my understanding that Chief Greene has made some investigation of this matter."

As a result of his constant reference to persons "up high" who had control of "charges" up high, as well as his general manner during the interview, he left the impression that he might have possibly been mentally unbalanced.

JENO FARKAS, Room 512, Hilton Hotel, El Paso, Texas, advised he had obtained a copy of an issue of Parade Magazine from the Dallas Times-Herald Building in Dallas, Texas, and had the front of the magazine photostated along with his statement setting out his feelings about the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. FARKAS said he gave copies of his statement to some unnamed "high people" and was unable to coherently explain his actions or thoughts regarding this matter.

DETAILS:AT EL PASO, TEXAS:

The interview with JENO FARKAS, set out hereinafter, was conducted in an effort to determine how he had obtained a copy of the December 1, 1963, uncirculated issue of Parade Magazine, which contained an article referring to JACQUELINE KENNEDY, and to determine why he had had copies of the front of the magazine photostated along with a statement which contained references to President KENNEDY, President JOHNSON, the FBI, Secret Service, etc.

Date December 10, 1963

1 JENO FARKAS, Room 512, Hilton Hotel, El Paso, was interviewed in the presence of Special Agent in Charge GEORGE WEISHEIT, United States Secret Service, El Paso, at which time FARKAS furnished the following information:

He obtained a copy of the Parade Magazine from the Dallas Herald Newspaper Office, exact date not recalled, during a night visit to this newspaper office. He had gone to the newspaper office to speak to the man in charge and was rebuffed by this person and told to leave. Upon leaving the newspaper office he took a copy of the Parade Magazine from an unattended bundle in the newspaper building. He later had the front page of the Parade Magazine along with a written statement photostated on 18 by 24 inch sheets at the Horn Blueprint Company in Dallas, Texas, on December 5, 1963.

When asked to explain the purpose of obtaining the photostats, he claimed that he had them made so that he could distribute copies to certain unnamed "high people" in Dallas. When questioned about the written statement that was included on the photostats, he became defensive and inferred that his writing had been edited by some unnamed individual. He then proceeded in his own handwriting to rewrite what he said was contained on his original statement, and that this represented what he "felt," and which reads as follows:

"John F. Kennedy was shut out from the square mile of Eden in God's Country.

"President Johnson a rancher himself have had been coaching the body-guards on that rainy day when arriving and knowing well that Dallas is not a telephone Co. or the Records Building out not even the old court house, but from that sweeping down hill there the assassin God will thunder out from the lost and the forgotten backs of the Bible and the brightness of his presence will blind the police, the F.B.I., the Secret Service, the storming up political controversay in the

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Democratic Party from Forth Worth and will blind all preporations - in fact.

"President Johnson knows that he can trust that God."

During the interview of FARKAS he was at times rambling and incoherent of thought. He was not fluent in English. He exhibited no animosity toward anyone but became visibly agitated when the subject of the assassination of President KENNEDY was mentioned. He constantly referred to someone or persons "up high" who had control of "charges" but he was unable to satisfactorily explain what he meant by these "charges" or to whom he had reference when he mentioned persons "high up."

FARKAS claimed to have had no military service and that he did not take part in any revolutionary activities in Hungary although he claims to have run away from his parents at the outbreak of the Hungarian Revolution at the age of 16.
