John F. Pages 22972 - 22993. Senator Ervin, (D) North Carolina, paid tribute to the late President Kennedy. On page 22987 he placed in the Record an article from the November 28, 1963, issue of the Caswell Messenger, Yanceyville, North Carolina, entitled "Confidentially," written by Erwin B. Stephens. The article states "The President's death at the hands of an assassin brings into sharp focus one phase of American life which should be the concern of every rational citizen: The increase in crime and the growing trend toward violations of the laws of our land. Time and again ministers, leaders, and law enforcement officers have pointed out this trend and have sought to arouse the public to its dangers. J. Edgar Hoover, boss of the FBI constantly sends out bulletins warning of the inherent dangers of increasing violations of the law."

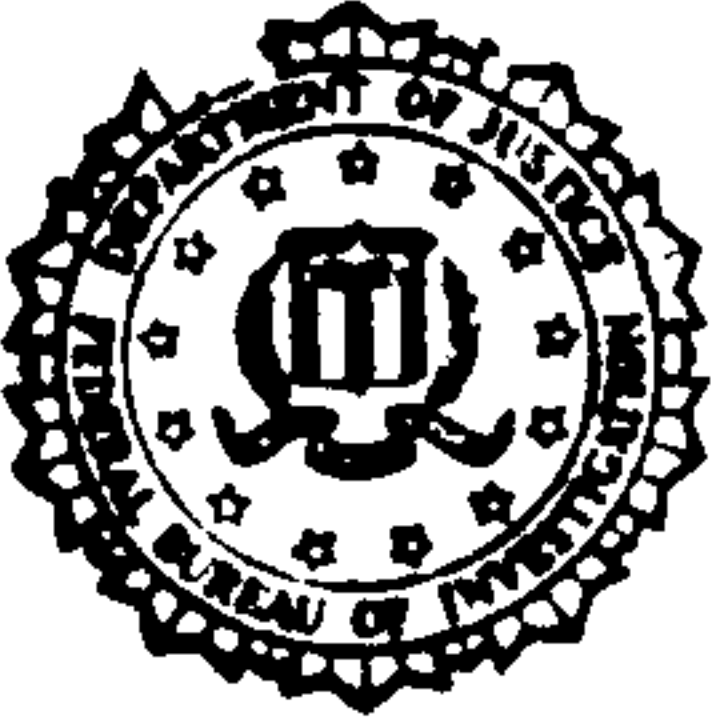

On December 11, 1963, information was received at Houston, Texas, to the effect that one HARRY L. WASHBURN, inmate, Texas Prison System, Ramsey Prison Farm, Otey, Texas, possibly had information regarding the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

On December 12, 1963, Washburn upon interview at Ramsey Prison Farm, advised that during the latter part of September, 1963, he was transported from "Ramsey" to the main prison at Huntsville, Texas for the purpose of having a physical examination. While exercising in the yard at "Huntsville", he overheard a conversation between two convicts (unidentified) to the effect that a "bar owner friend" from Dallas, Texas (unidentified), had contacted one of the convicts with a proposition to find a person to "wipe out" (kill) a high government official (unidentified). For this "service", said convict would receive \$25,000.00. The fee would be paid by Texas State Senator, Dorsey Hardeman.

Washburn said that the reason that he paid particular attention to the conversation between these two convicts was because he heard the name Hardeman mentioned. He pointed out that Hardeman, who is a "slick crook", was the person who prosecuted him for the crime for which he is currently serving two to ninety-nine years.

Washburn was hesitant to discuss this matter, advising that he knew that the interview room (the office of the Assistant Warden) was "bugged", and that he did not want the Warden (Sidney Lanier) to hear the conversation.

Yet, it was to Lanier that Washburn conveyed his desire to speak to an FBI Agent regarding the assassination.

Washburn concluded the interview with a statement to the effect that "Communists" get a "good break in here," specifically mentioning "one from Dallas," who was only made to work in the "fields" for a few months, before getting an easy job, while he had to work in the "fields for a year or so."

Warden Lanier upon interview advised that [Washburn] was confined in the Texas Prison System after conviction for the crime of Murder with Malice, regarding the placing of an explosive in the auto of his mother-in-law, which was detonated when she engaged the starter of the vehicle. Prison records reflect that he (Washburn) has an unstable personality, and may have difficulty in adjusting to prison life. Warden Lanier described Washburn as being a "prison politician", who, though not being a disciplinary problem, is a prolific letter writer, and has communicated with almost every person of prominence in an effort to bring attention to himself in the hope of getting a new trial. [Washburn] proclaims complete innocence of the crime for which he was convicted, advising that he was "framed", and that "high officials" were "paid off" to "railroad" him to prison. He included Jack Heard, Assistant Manager of Detention, Texas Prison System, as being one of the "paid off" officials.

~~[REDACTED] stated that he is of the firm belief that Washburn has lost contact with reality, and that before long he will become a "mental case", that will necessitate his (Washburn's) transfer to the hospital unit of the Texas Prison System.~~

I also advised the Attorney General that with regard to Oswald that we have 500,000 nuts, Communists and hate-mongers in our files and unless there is some indication of violence or mental instability we don't advise of the names; that in New York City we have 25,000 who are on index who are hate-mongers and that unless we have been given some indication of their being unstable we don't furnish the names to the Secret Service; that we have to use some discretion; that if we gave names the first thing the Secret Service would do is to have them arrested and that one could imagine what would happen if these were arrested and turned loose as having their names given by the FBI; that we would have the reputation for being a secret police. I stated that any positive information we have is given to the Secret Service.

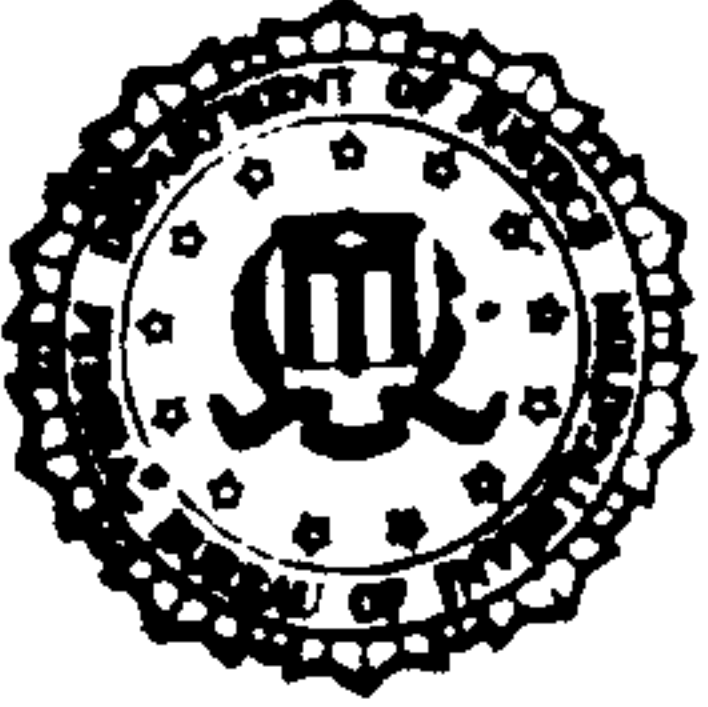

The Dallas Police Department, Dallas, Texas received on December 6, 1963 a letter addressed to "Dallas Police Chief, Dallas, Texas U.S.A." bearing the post marked believed to be "Chapala, Jal." (Mexico). The postmark in Mexico is not completely legible.

This letter states as follows:

"Police Chief - in Dallas. Check a Pennsylvanian leaving: "New Bloomfield": today - a buisness man, who visits frequently in Dallas - has buisness contacts there and has a great hatred for our late President. - the name Clark Makibban, the wife a school teacher - they are travelling in a late model - blue Mercedes B. He says everything the U. States makes is inferior. May amount to nothing but should be checked well - this man left New Bloomfield the 3rd and will stop in Dallas."

This letter was unsigned.

PAVIA INTERVIEWED BY BUAGENTS AT NEWARK OFFICE.

HE ADMITS BEING THE PASSENGER IN INSTANT CAB, BUT CLAIMED ANY STATEMENTS MADE WERE IN GENERAL CONVERSATION AND HE WAS ONLY JOKING WITH CAB DRIVER. PAVIA COULD NOT RECALL HIS EXACT WORDS BUT DID RECALL HE STATED KENNEDYS ASSASSINATION COULD HAVE HAPPENED ANYWHERE LIKE HOUSTON OR ANY OTHER PLACE. FURTHER, RECALLED STATING HE HEARD ON THE RADIO OR SOME OTHER PLACE THAT PRESIDENT JOHNSON-S LIFE HAD BEEN THREATENED AND JOHNSON WAS BEING HEAVILY GUARDED. PAVIA CLAIMED MEANT NO HARM TO PRESIDENT JOHNSON AND HAD NO KNOWLEDGE DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY OF ANYTHING SURROUNDING THE ASSASSINATION. HE DEFINITELY STATES THAT HE DID NOT REMARK THAT KENNEDY WAS TO HAVE BEEN KILLED IN HOUSTON, TEXAS OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT.

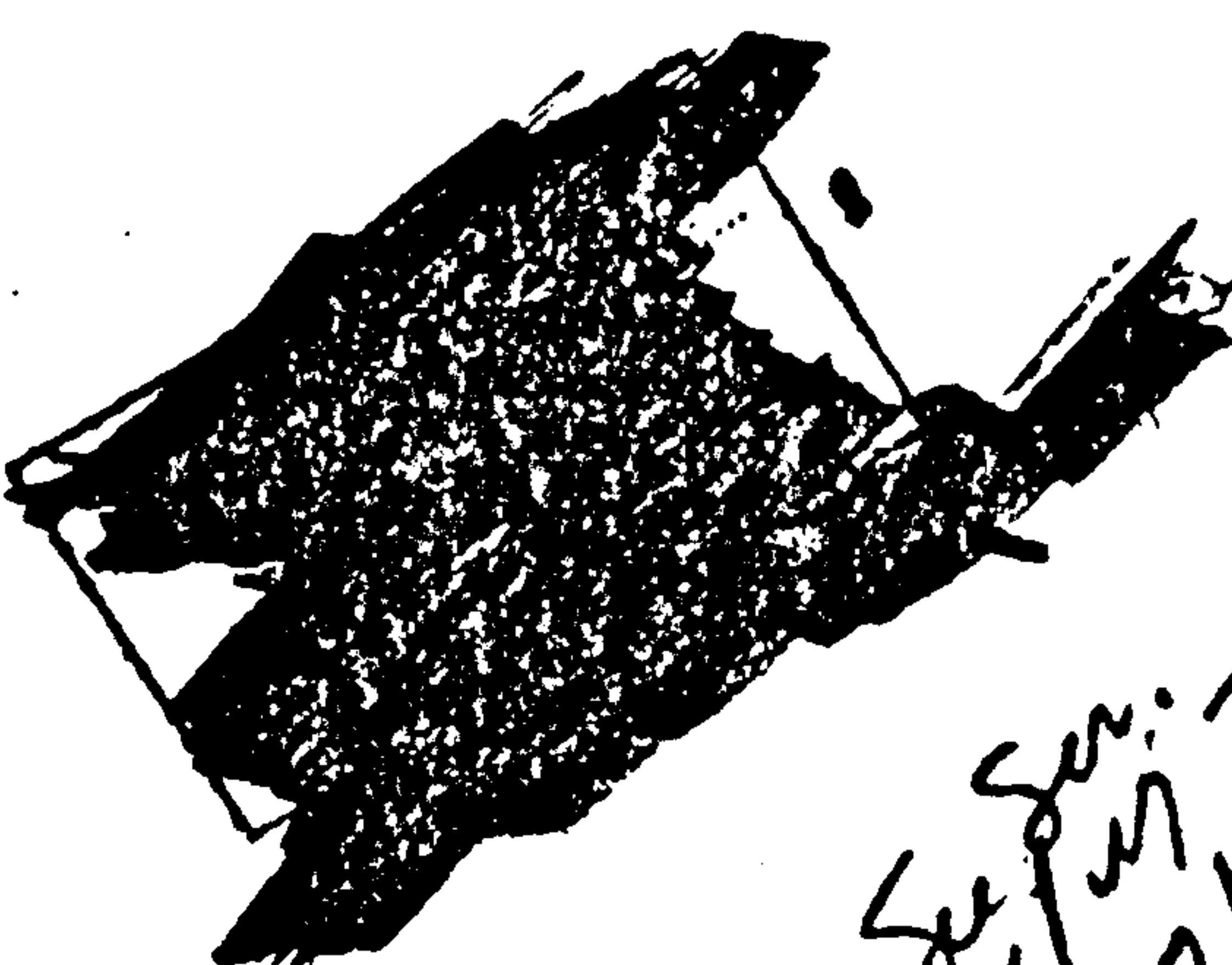

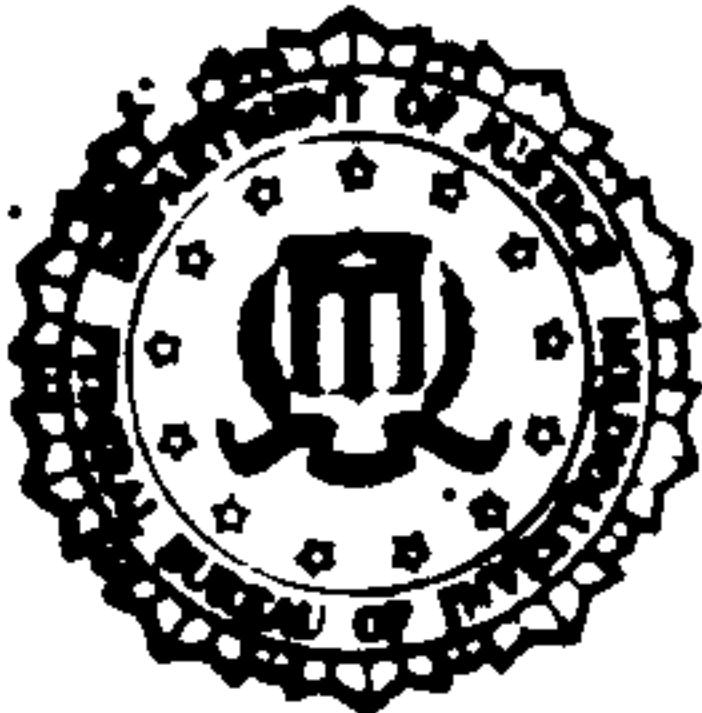

On December 9, 1963, ~~W. A. Priest~~ W. J. Auction, Clovis, New Mexico, advised that three or four months prior to the President's assassination he was at Lubbock, Texas, with a cousin, Dallas Vaughn, a cotton farmer from O'Donnell, Texas, discussing the Kennedy-Johnson administration.

Priest asked Vaughn how Texas took to Kennedy and Vaughn in an offhanded manner stated something to the effect that "I believe they'd be killed if they came to Texas now". Priest said that Vaughn merely was expressing a political dislike for the administration practices and meant nothing by this remark.

On December 12, 1963, Homer Dallas Vaughn, Box 602, O'Donnell, Texas, was interviewed by an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was advised he did not have to make a statement and any statement he made could be used against him in a court of law. He was advised of his right to consult an attorney before making a statement.

Vaughn advised that W. A. Priest, Clovis, New Mexico, is his cousin and about 10 weeks ago he met Priest in Lubbock, Texas, while he (Vaughn) was in Lubbock to sell some cattle and Priest was purchasing furniture. He advised during their conversation he (Vaughn) discussed the policies of the Kennedy administration and openly expressed his dislike of these policies. He advised he did not vote for Kennedy and has disagreed with his domestic policies since Kennedy took office. He stated he definitely did not make any statement, "I believe they'd be killed if they came to Texas now", and to his knowledge, President Johnson's name was not even mentioned. No discussion was had about the possibility of Kennedy and Johnson visiting Texas, as no publicity had been given, at that time, about their trip to Texas. He stated although he disliked Kennedy's policies, he deplores the assassination of President Kennedy and certainly has never made any remark about his assassination as he still finds it hard to believe he was assassinated in Texas.

Nick Katzenbach, the Deputy Attorney General, called me at 11:00 A.M., this morning, and asked that I come around to his office.

Upon seeing Katzenbach, he made reference to the proposed press release which the White House had originally planned to issue over the weekend in connection with the captioned matter. (The Director instructed we advise Katzenbach that we strongly felt that only the first paragraph of this release should be issued, or the first three paragraphs of the revised release which Mr. Belmont read to the Director on Saturday.) Katzenbach told me that there was a stalemate at the White House in connection with this release. Abe Fortas strongly felt that the entire release should be given to the press. Ted Sorenson agreed with us that only the first three paragraphs of the revised release prepared Saturday should be given out. Fortas believed that speculation, rumors and gossip should be dispelled right now. He claimed it made no difference that the Presidential Commission would present findings to the President and the general public. He felt rumors concerning collusion between Ruby and Oswald, also those concerning international conspiracy, should be hit hard now.

As a result of the disagreement between Fortas and Sorenson, there will be no press release from the White House. To get his point across, however, Katzenbach has prepared a letter to Chief Justice Warren and each Commission member transmitting a copy of the report. The report will be delivered today. In his letter, Katzenbach states that the report is being delivered at the instructions of the President. He also calls upon the Commission to quickly issue a statement concerning its findings so that rumors, gossip and speculation can be eliminated. He goes on to point out that investigation thus far has nailed down the point that Oswald assassinated the President and had no assistance. He further mentions that Ruby operated strictly as an individual and had no assistance. He points out there is no evidence of collusion or international intrigue.

Katzenbach asked me if the FBI could deliver these reports. I told him we could not, that it was our position that the reports are now out of our hands and delivery

He then stated that he had no way in which to deliver the report to John J. McCloy, the Commission member in New York. He wondered if the FBI could handle this for him. He added that each report would, of course, have his letter transmitting the report as an attachment to the package; therefore, the package actually would be coming from him and not the FBI. I told him I would check on this angle and let him know.

Katzenbach has requested 11 copies of the report from us. Seven of these copies will go to Presidential Commission members, as he promised last Friday, 12/6/63. One copy of the report will go to the Chief Counsel of the Commission, presumably Lee Rankin. The Department desires two copies and Katzenbach wants to give Secret Service one copy, making a total of 11 copies needed.

# Oswald Described As 'Expert' Sniper

DALLAS—UPI—A heating engineer who said he saw Lee Harvey Oswald practice rifle shooting at a gun range said Monday that Oswald "was an expert . . . a sniper from way back."

Oswald, 24, was accused of assassinating President Kennedy, grievously wounding Gov. John Connally of Texas and killing policeman J. D. Tippit, who stopped him for questioning.

"He wasn't a fair shot; he was an expert," heating engineer Garland G.

Slack, 59, said. "You could say he was sniper from way back. He shot rapid fire and he hit those targets."

BOTH SLACK and Howard Price, 24, a machinist who lives in the Dallas suburb of Grand



Oswald

Prairie, reported seeing Oswald at the Sportsdrome gun range near Grand Prairie on Nov. 9 or 10 and on Nov. 17.

Neither had any doubt that the man they saw practicing was Oswald. Both Slack and Price said Oswald came to the range with another person.

Price said the FBI showed him pictures of Oswald and a rifle. He identified Oswald, but not the rifle. "If it was the rifle that killed Mr. Kennedy," Price said. "The stock had been changed."

But on the other hand, Slack said three different guns, including one "wrapped in rags or something," were passed over the fence to Oswald by his companion.
