

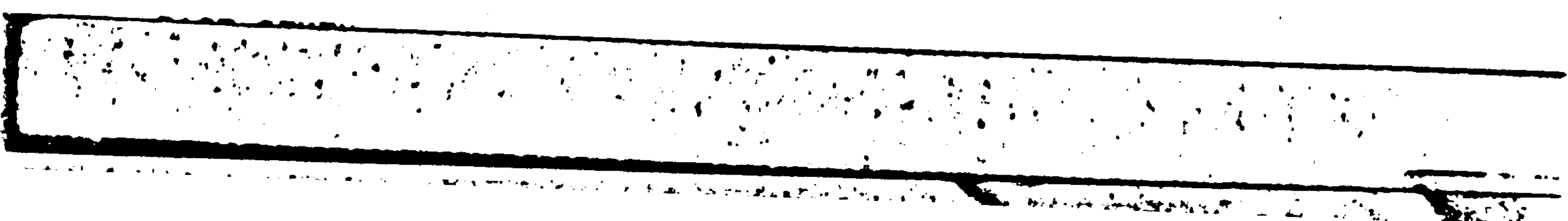
STATES ABOVE V. FIFTEEN OR SIXTEEN THE FINAL DRAFT FOR AD WAS SHOWN TO JOE GRINNAN, DALLAS OIL MAN, WHO HAS OFFICE ON SOUTHERN AVENUE, AND ACCORDING TO BURLEY, IS VOLUNTEER CO-ORDINATOR IN THE JBS AT DALLAS. BURLEY STATES GRINNAN HAS LARGE NUMBER OF CONTACTS AMONG DALLAS BUSINESSMEN AND IT WAS UNDERSTOOD THAT GRINNAN WOULD OBTAIN MONEY TO PAY FOR AD.

ON MONDAY, NOV. EIGHTEEN LAST, BURLEY, WEISSMAN AND SCHMIDT MET IN GRINNAN-S OFFICE, AT WHICH TIME THEY DISCUSSED WHETHER NEWSPAPER WOULD ACCEPT AD. ON AFTERNOON OF NOV. EIGHTEEN LAST WEISSMAN TOOK TYPED COPY TO NEWSPAPER AND ASKED THEM IF THEY WOULD RUN AD. NEWSPAPER AUTHORITYES ADVISED SAW NO REASON WHY THEY COULDN-T RUN AD, BUT WOULD LIKE LEGAL ADVISER TO LOOK AT IT FIRST.

ON TUESDAY, NOV. NINETEEN LAST WEISSMAN AGAIN CONTACTED NEWSPAPER, AT WHICH TIME THEY AGREED TO RUN AD. ON THAT AFTERNOON OR FOLLOWING DAY, NOV. TWENTY LAST, JOE GRINNAN GAVE WEISSMAN ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS WHICH WEISSMAN TOOK TO NEWSPAPER FOR PART PAYMENT OF AD AND AGREED TO PAY REST LATER.

ON NOV. TWENTYONE LAST GRINNAN GAVE WEISSMAN FOUR HUNDRED SIXTYTHREE DOLLARS, REPRESENTING BALANCE TO BE PAID FOR AD, WHICH

WEISSMAN GAVE TO NEWSPAPER THAT DAY.

BURLEY STATED GRINNAN RAISED MONEY FOR PROM BUSINESS ASSOCIATES OR POSSIBLY OTHER MEMBERS OF JBS/ HOWEVER, STATES HE DOES NOT KNOW IDENTITIES OF ANY PERSONS WHO CONTRIBUTED TO COST OF AD. STATES NEITHER HE NOR WEISSMAN CONTRIBUTED MONEY FOR AD AND DOES NOT THINK SCHMIDT CONTRIBUTED.

DURING DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING AD, SCHMIDT STATED HE AND JOE GRINNAN HAD DISCUSSED WHICH NAME SHOULD APPEAR ON AD AND DECIDED TO USE WEISSMAN IN ORDER TO SHOW OTHER CONSERVATIVES THAT JEWISH PEOPLE INTERESTED IN CONSERVATIVE MOVEMENT. ALSO JOE GRINNAN STATED STANLEY MARCUS HAD BOASTED HE HELD JEWISH VOTE IN DALLAS, AND GRINNAN WANTED TO SHOW MARCUS HE DIDN-T HOLD ALL OF IT. GRINNAN TOLD SCHMIDT HE FELT TOO MANY CONSERVATIVES WERE ANTI JEWISH AND WEISSMAN-S SIGNATURE WOULD HELP STEM ANTI JEWISH FELLING.

BURLEY STATES NO SUCH GROUP AS AMERICAN FACT FINDING COMMITTEE/ THAT THIS NAME WAS PICKED BY JOE GRINNAN AND LARRY SCHMIDT.

BURLEY STATES MUCH OF INFORMATION HE POSSESSED FURNISHED HIM BY WEISSMAN SINCE HE DID NOT ATTEND ALL DISCUSSIONS WITH GRINNAN AND SCHMIDT.

BURLEY ADVISED HE NEVER KNEW LEE HARVEY OSWALD OR JACK RUBY,
END PAGE SEVEN

AND NEVER HEARD WEISSMAN, SCHMIDT OR GRINNAN MENTION THESE INDIVIDUALS AT ANY TIME. STATES HE FEELS SURE NONE OF GROUP HE MET AT DALLAS WERE CONNECTED WITH OSWALD OR RUBY AND NONE HAD ANY CONNECTION WITH ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY. REC 13

BURLEY STATES ONLY OTHER PERSON HE KNOWS WHO IS MEMBER OF JBS AT DALLAS, TEXAS, IS ROBERT GRINNAN, BROTHER OF JOE GRINNAN.

STATES ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS WAS INTRODUCED TO GROUPS OF FIVE OR SIX DALLAS BUSINESSMEN LATER IDENTIFIED BY SCHMIDT AS MEMBERS OF JBS/ HOWEVER, HE COULD NOT RECALL NAMES.

BURLEY STATES AFTER ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, GRINNAN, WEISSMAN AND SCHMIDT APPEARED SHOCKED AND REGRETTED ACTION SINCE IT WOULD HURT CONSERVATIVE CAUSE.

BURLEY STATES HE LEFT DALLAS, NOV. TWENTYSEVEN LAST, TRAVELED BY BUS TO DENVER, AND ON SAME DATE WEISSMAN RETURNED TO FATHER, HARRY WEISSMAND, ^{OR WEISSMAN} MT. VERNON, NEW YORK.

BALTIMORE INTERVIEW BURLEY-S WIFE, WINIFRED BURLEY, SEVEN ZERO THREE NINE CONLEY STREET, FOR INFORMATION ACTIVITIES IN BALTIMORE.

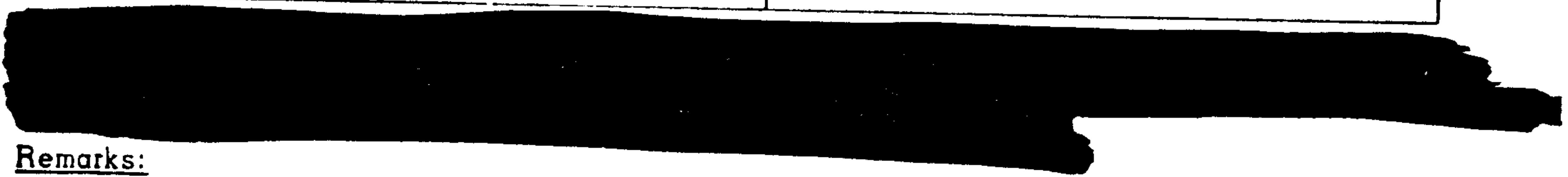

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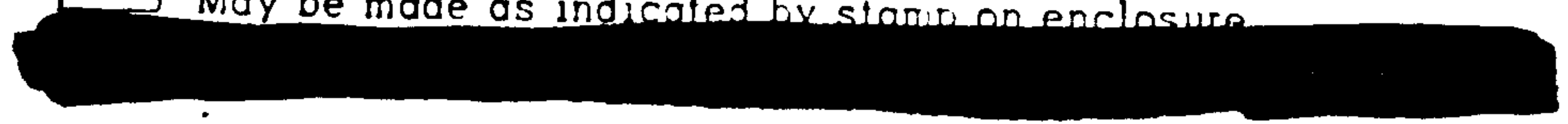

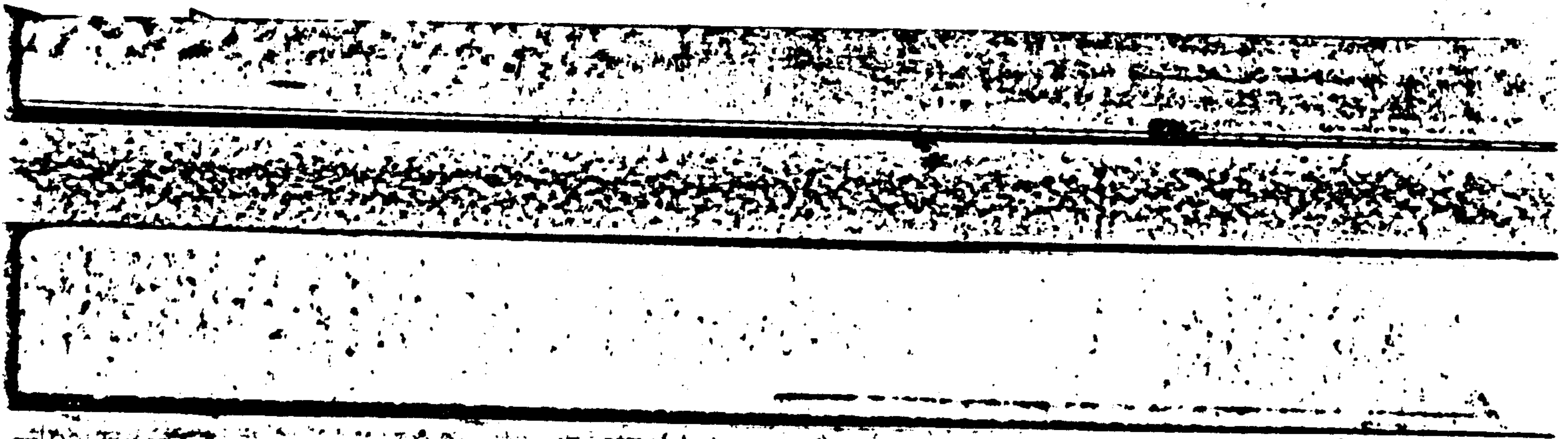

MICHAEL MARCHESE, 3926 Shoshone Street, advised he is employed by the Jacobs-Kerr and Company, truck manufacturers, 1950 31st Street, and resides with his parents at the above address.

MARCHESE stated that he has never used or been known by the name "PIGGY" MARCHESE and has never known anyone using this name at Denver or anywhere else. He advised that he has only been in Dallas, Texas, once in his life and that was on or about November 1, 1963, when he passed through Dallas while delivering a truck for the Jacobs-Kerr Company to Bryan, Texas. He stated that he never knew JACK RUBY or LEE HARVEY OSWALD, has never been in the Carousel lounge in Dallas and does not know NANCY ELAINE PERRIN. He stated that some years ago he knew a RUDY MARCHESE but that this man was no relation of his and he never knew RUDY to use the name "PIGGY" MARCHESE.

MARCHESE stated that he has never used the name "PIGGY" MARCHESE and has never been known by this name in Denver or elsewhere. He said he does not know anyone here or anywhere else named "PIGGY" MARCHESE. MARCHESE advised that he has never been in Dallas, Texas, at any time and that he does not know JACK RUBY or LEE HARVEY OSWALD. MARCHESE stated that he never visited the Carousel Lounge at Dallas, Texas, and does not know NANCY ELAINE PERRIN.

Purpose: To show that more than one assassin was in Dallas, Texas
on November 23, 1963.

Gentlemen:

Most of the information which the FBI has collected seems to indicate it was Oswald alone who did all the shooting. Both my father, Colonel Melvin M. Johnson, Jr., president of Johnson Guns, Inc., and myself feel this is not the case. My father has already contacted the FBI; I write this memo in order to substantiate his views on the subject, in my capacity as photographer, in conjunction with his capacity as a small arms weapons and ammunition expert. Here are some facts already known to the case.

1. It has been reliably substantiated that three shots were fired.
2. The first shot hit President Kennedy in the neck-throat area; the second hit Governor Connally in the body; the third hit President Kennedy in the head.
3. ^{After} ~~Up to~~ the first shot, the other two followed within a five-second period; in order to make the second and third shots both effective, Oswald would have had to take at least 2 1/2 seconds following the first and second shots, respectively, in order to make the second and third shots count. (It was unofficially demonstrated by the president of the National Rifle Association that three shots could be fired in this manner using a bolt-action rifle; however we didn't hear anything about accuracy from this demonstration.)

4. The Italian bolt action rifle with four-power telescopic sight, which apparently was Oswald's weapon, was found in the same area as three spent cartridges from that gun. REC-46 62-107160-1967
5. The bullets, or their remains, were all recovered, and were ascertained by the FBI lab at least as having come from the same type

and model rifle as that which Oswald is presumed to have fired.

There is one other fact, well substantiated by news broadcasts and newspaper reports, particularly the early reports, while events were still fresh in people's minds: "At that moment two loud, sharp reports were heard and then another." (Quoted from LIFE, page 32H, November 29, 1963.)

This means, by common consent, that the time interval between the first and second shot was less than the time interval between the second and third shots. Now the question is, how much less? And just how fast can any man fire a shot, crank in a new cartridge, aim at a moving target 75 odd yards away, and fire? With a bolt action rifle yet?

On pages 24 and 25 of the November 29, 1963 issue of LIFE magazine, there is a series sequence of the shooting. LIFE states that Kennedy's wave "turns into a clutching movement towards his throat" in the seventh picture. It is safe for us to assume, therefore, that he was probably reacting to a hit at about the fourth picture. This is logical, for we notice picture number five is blurred, as if the photographer might have been startled by something like a loud gunshot. The car travels about eight feet between pictures number four and number five. Assuming the car was going at least ten miles an hour, or therefore fifteen feet per second, and assuming the photographer himself was a maximum of 100 yards from Oswald's building (if we assume Oswald fired the first shot), then, considering the speed of sound as 3/8ths of a second, and reaction time of the photographer about 1/8th of a second, we get the following:

1. Speed of car equals 15 ft. per second.
2. Distance between pictures number 4 and number 5 equals 8 feet.
3. Therefore the time equals 1/2 second approximately.
 - (a) Time of sound over 100 yards equals 3/8ths of second.
 - (b) Time of reaction equals 1/8th of a second.
 - (c) Therefore, time for this is also 1/2 second.

This really doesn't prove Oswald fired the first shot; but it does seem reasonable to use picture number 4 as a starting point of action.

Governor Connally is quite obviously hit in the ninth picture; his body movement from number 8 to number 9 is considerable, and his mouth is open as if in pain. Then he slowly begins to slump to the floor.

The question is, how much time has elapsed between pictures number 4 and number 9? Notice the two figures, merged as if one, in the upper

7, 8, and finally number 9, in relation to the car. As the camera pans with the car with reasonable consistency, their position change, angles notwithstanding, amounts to approximately twenty-five feet. Putting it more bluntly, from picture number 4 to picture number 9 the car has travelled 25 feet!

Reports have varied somewhat concerning the actual speed the car was travelling at the time, but most reports concur it was about twelve miles an hour. To be on the safe side, let us be certain by saying the car was doing at least ten miles an hour. Don't forget agent Hill, who had to run forward from the car behind in order to protect President and Mrs. Kennedy; the car couldn't have been going over 15 miles an hour, or he might not have been able to catch it.

As most people know, sixty miles an hour is equal to 88 feet per second. Assuming the car travelled at a minimum of ten miles an hour at the time of the shooting, this means that it travelled at least 14.6, or 15 feet per second. The car travelled, at the most, 25 feet between shots one and two, and it was travelling at least 15 feet per second as an actual velocity.

So, as a result, Oswald fired his first and second shots not more than 1.6 seconds apart! This might be feasible with a semiautomatic rifle but certainly not with any bolt action rifle! From these pictures, it would appear that Oswald quite definitely had some help.

What about the three spent cartridges? It would have been easy for Oswald to deposit a previously fired case, probably used when he practiced for this tragic event. What about the bullets? They were pretty badly messed up, and it would be virtually impossible to determine they were not fired from an identical gun. Rifling marks on the remains of the bullets would be identical in every respect.

The best way to ^{check} ~~obtain~~ these figures would be to obtain the actual movies from LIFE, and do the following:

1. Determine the speed with which these movies were taken. Since they were "home movies," or taken ostensibly for such a purpose, chances are the camera speed was the common 16 frames per second.
2. Determine, as accurately as possible, the actual frames in which President Kennedy and Governor Connally were hit, and mark these.
3. Measure the frames in between, and this will give you a very accurate time interval.
4. As a double check, run the film on a screen, and using a stop watch, start it on the marked Kennedy frame, and stop

— it on the marked Connally frame. Your reaction time will be about the same for both signals on the film. Be sure the projector is consistent with the speed of the camera.

One more thing, the first shot apparently hit President Kennedy in the throat. It is conceivable that he turned to wave at someone just before the first hit, but if it was Oswald, President Kennedy's head would have to be turned almost directly to the rear, and his body would have to be turned almost 90 degrees sideways, looking from Oswald's window. If the bullet went through President Kennedy's throat in the fashion described from the front, the bullet would have to be found in the upper left side of his body if Oswald shot him.

The film study should prove, beyond any doubt, what the pictures in LIFE already seem to show. This would be on the basis that your attitude towards the film is unbiased; do not assume anything until you have studied the film. Both my father in his capacity, and I in mine, feel quite certain that the people concerned will agree with us in what we feel to be the real truth of this sorrowful situation.

Dear Sir:

It is really amazing how different American thinking and behaviour is to that of the rest of the world.

Take as an example the Dallas events. My interpretation, as sent to Latin America for a foundation for judgement acceptable to the Latin American mind is as follows:

- 1) "Newsweek" magazine published in its Dec. 2, 1963, issue, on page 20 an excellent photograph of President Kennedy slumping into his wife's arms as hit by a bullet. Governor Conolly can be seen sitting with his back turned. He hasn't yet started turning, as reported when hit by the second shot. The distance between Pres. Kennedy's head and his wife's arms or the protection of the car's back seat is approximately a foot.
- 2) The rifle used was a vintage 6.5mm Carcano. This rifle like all army rifles of that period, fired a flat trajectory high velocity steel encased bullet, requiring a comparative large powder charge. Hence the recoil was pretty stiff, and the bolt action had to be extra strong, tight fitting and hard. The ejection of spent casing and ramming of fresh bullet can only be accomplished in the Carcano, as in the Mauser Lebel, Lee-Enfield or Manlicher, with the rifle at waist height, tightly held in the left hand and under the right arm. The loading action is very much more complicated than an under lever action as in Remington's or Winchester, or a pump gun action. The distance from shoulder to possible loading position is approx. 18 inches, hence the return trip for proper aim plus loading position takes a distance of about 3 feet as against the 1 foot President Kennedy's head had to travel for head protection.
- 3) According to news reports Pres. Kennedy was hit first, then Gov. Conolly, then again President Kennedy in the head. This would only have been possible if President Kennedy's head had remained stationary and above the car's back seat during the time it would require to reload and take careful aim at 80 to 100 yards for a target of about 12 inch diameter, three consecutive times. Judging by the paragraph in the paragraph this can not have occurred.
- 4) If anyone has any doubts on the accuracy of this statements, it can easily be checked by firing an unloaded rifle at any 12 inch target held by some one at 6 feet high, and then bring down the rifle and go through the unloading and loading bolt action and fire again at the falling target. This can only be done if the second shot is a waist high snap shot, and if the rifleman is trained and very fast. Even then, the second waist high snap shot will be fired when the falling target is about 1 foot from the ground, having covered a 5 feet fall.

fast shooting can only be done if ^{the} falling target is not more than 15 yards away. If the target is over 60 yards, as was the case in Dallas, it is impossible to get in two shot at a 12 inch falling target. From January 1924 to January 23, 1925, when I was discharged, I served as a G.I. in the Argentine Army. I was trained during that period as a "fusilero" (rifleman) and in the use of bayonets, with a 7.65 mm Mauser, very similar to the Carcano, so know what I'm talking about.

6) Oswald, if he killed President Kennedy, was obviously not meaning to kill him. He had been a marine, so it is to be assumed that he knew something about shooting. Hence he would never had shot at his target after it had passed him, present~~ly~~, the small head area only. He would have shot at President Kennedy as he was driving towards him in the open car, presenting the target of all his body in an open car. Anyone capable of handling a rifle, even ineptly, can not possibly miss with a telescopic sight at a human body sitting in a car at 80 to 100 yards. And what is more, someone who can shoot can get in three or four bullets, regardless of whether he slumps down or not, as there no longer is the protection of the car's body. The target is open.

5) On this basis, and assuming Oswald knew something about shooting which would be the case if he hit Pres. Kennedy intentionally, his target was Gov. Conolly and not Pres. Kennedy. As the car was moving away from him Conolly presented his whole back as a target area. While the car was coming toward Oswald (the ideal target position for Pres. Kennedy) Conolly was covered by the men in the front seat, which is why Oswald waited for the car to pass him.

7) Carcano rifles are pretty inaccurate and their shots differ in trajectory. Aside of which the cheap telescopic sight he bought did not assure good aim. It seems probable, and logical in my Latin American way of thinking, that Oswald aimed the first shot at Conolly and hit Pres. Kennedy instead. Then he got in the second shot at Conolly, hitting the target, but in the meantime another shot hit Pres. Kennedy's falling head before it reached the protection of his wife's arms and body of the car.

8) First reports were that the bullets had not been found, either in Pres. Kennedy or the Governor. Now, according to reports, the bullets have been removed from the body and also found in Gov. Conolly. But when radio coverage gave first reports from Dallas, at the time of the incident, it was mentioned that a "fusilade" of shots was being exchanged. That people dropping to the ground for coverage and protection. That a couple was running up an embankment with the police in pursuit. That a negro woman, with a wounded child in her arms, had come to the hospital where both Pres. Kennedy and the Governor had been taken to, and that to some policemen the shots had merely seemed as backfiring cars. In our minds, people do not start running and dropping to the ground merely because of three spaced shots, which could be interpreted as backfire. Hence, as no sound track has been divulged of the events, there is no proof that only a total of three shots were fired. Beside, even if there were, there is no reason why any well trained gunman or rifleman, in U.S. gangster tradition, shouldn't have used a silencer, a logical thing to do once an obvious patsy or fall guy (Oswald) had been induced to shoot at the Governor.

As you are always publishing in the Los Angeles Times reports, opinions and U.S. analysis of Latin American affairs, I trust that this letter will interest you as a way to achieve an insight into the working of our minds.

On 12/9-10/63, files of the U. S. Secret Service relating to the assassination of President Kennedy were reviewed by SA R. D. Rogge through the cooperation of Special Agent in Charge, Robert I. Bouck, of the Protective Research Section. Results of this review are being analysed for possible use in our investigation of Oswald and related matters.

In preliminary discussions with Mr. Bouck, it was quite apparent Secret Service is extremely concerned regarding the recent assassination and the possible implications resulting from same which would reflect unfavorably on their efforts to adequately protect a President. While not specifically saying so, Mr. Bouck indicated his Office is also quite upset over the recent comments attributed to the former Chief of the U. S. Secret Service, Mr. U. E. Baughman, which comments received nationwide publicity. As you will recall, Mr. Baughman raised several critical questions concerning the handling of protection for President Kennedy, before and during his Dallas appearance. It was Mr. Bouck's observation that Mr. Baughman certainly was aware of the problems faced by Secret Service in the coverage of a President, and consequently, he felt Baughman's comments were uncalled for.

Mr. Bouck continued that when you come down to it, most Presidents have always had to decide between "politics and security" and in this particular instance, President Kennedy, according to Bouck, had decided political considerations were more important than security considerations. Bouck stated while normal recommended security procedures might not have prevented the President from being wounded, it might have precluded the assassination, and he likened this situation to a football game wherein the ball carrier elects to run outside of his interference and must therefore take

care of the oncoming tacklers alone. He stated the President refused to use an available plastic "bubble-top" in Texas, and was also quite explicit in refusing to permit Secret Service men to stand on back of the Presidential car which is equipped with a platform for this purpose. In fact, according to Bouck, the President insisted that none of the Secret Service men be even near the car during the motorcade. He stated, however, this is a Secret Service problem, and they must live with it.

Bouck advised as a result of this tragic event, Secret Service will propose three separate stages of action which they hope will minimize the danger to future Presidents, including President Johnson. He stated the implementation of these proposals would of necessity require the expenditure of several millions of dollars of taxpayer's money, which would include items such as bulletproof vehicles, radar detection of projectiles, electronic devices to raise protective shields in the car, and the like. He opined that he rather doubted any President would accede to such plans in view of the expense involved, however, he felt it was the Secret Service's responsibility to at least put forth these proposals and have a higher authority veto them. He stated while this situation has caused Secret Service embarrassment, they were nevertheless looking forward optimistically to the future, and hope a similar tragedy can be prevented.

Mr. Bouck made the above comments in informal conversations with SA Rogge, and it appeared he was endeavoring to unburden himself and in some way explain the circumstances surrounding the assassination of the President. Mr. Bouck appeared to be cooperative and sincere in his desire to have this matter resolved.

On 12/12/63 U. S. Post Office Inspector HARRY HOLMES, Terminal Annex, U. S. Post Office, Dallas, Texas, furnished a Dallas Agent the attached parcel which was located in the "nixie" section of the Irving, Texas Post Office by a Post Office employee. The parcel was made available to Mr. HOLMES by C. G. TWILLEY, Postmaster, Irving, Texas. TWILLEY told HOLMES the parcel was discovered at the Irving Post Office on 12/4/63. There was no indication on the parcel that it had ever been mailed because of the address placed on the parcel which had been placed in the "nixie" section by some unidentified postal employee. This section receives items containing addresses which cannot be located. The parcel when discovered had been half opened at one end. The opening was completed by Inspector HOLMES after he received the package at which time Inspector HOLMES examined the contents. It is to be noted the outer wrapping of the parcel covers a long brown bag open at both ends.

FBI Laboratory is requested to examine the paper contents of both items to determine whether these items may have any connection with or similarity to the paper bag previously submitted to the FBI Laboratory for examination in this case. The paper bag previously submitted to the FBI Laboratory was believed to be the one in which the rifle used to assassinate President KENNEDY was wrapped. Although numerous persons have handled the

In connection with a review of the U. S. Secret Service files on 12-9 and 10-63 relating to the assassination of President Kennedy, the following information of possible value was obtained. This information is in addition to that previously obtained and furnished to responsible Bureau Supervisors.

Set out below is a brief description of the pertinent information including the Secret Service documentation number so that any item can be located at a later date if desired.

Item 59 This is a transcript of a telephone call received by SA Burke of the Washington Field Office of the Secret Service on 11-24-63 at 2:15 P.M., from one Baird Bryant of Limerick, Maine. Bryant stated there is a conspiracy between the States Rights Extremists and members of the FBI who did not inform the Secret Service about Oswald. Bryant alleges "they" could have persuaded Oswald to conspire. In general, Bryant's conversation was derogatory concerning the FBI and the Dallas Police Department, and also made some unintelligible remarks concerning General Walton Walker. This information was obtained from an abstract in Secret Service files and the original document was not available for review.

Item 80 This is information obtained by the New York Office of the Secret Service on 11-25-63 on a confidential basis from the New York Police Department relating to the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. It is presumed our New York Office would be in a position to obtain this same information if we desired.

Item 140 This is a memorandum indicating two fragments of skull which were found on the parkway near the President's assassination site were turned over to Doctor Burkley of the Bethesda Naval Hospital. It is indicated these fragments were being retained at the Naval Hospital.
