The following are answers and action taken by this office to resolve the items listed in referenced Bureau airtel which have not been furnished to the Bureau previously. For clarity the items are dealt with by number as follows:

Item #3

*TEXAS*

On 12/12/63 Special Agent ELMER MOORE, U. S. Secret Service, Dallas, exhibited the following photographs which are in the possession of the Secret Service having been taken by Mrs. MARY ANN MOORMAN, 2832 Ripplewood, Dallas, on 11/22/63. Both photographs were taken with a Polaroid camera.

The first photograph is of poor quality, being extremely light and depicts the lower corner of the Texas School Book Depository. The view is shown in the photograph of the upper floors of the building and particularly the windows on the 6th floor from which the fatal shots were fired.

The 2nd photograph taken by Mrs. MOORMAN was sold to the Associated Press by Mrs. MOORMAN. This photograph,

copy of which was exhibited by SA MOORE, was the automobile occupied by President KENNEDY, which photograph was apparently made shortly after President KENNEDY was struck by a bullet fired by the assassin. The ISBD Building does not appear in this photograph at all, the entire photograph being filled with the President's automobile. The photograph shows President KENNEDY leaning slightly forward to the left with Mrs. KENNEDY in a sitting position in the car. This photograph appeared in many newspapers throughout the United States and a copy exhibited by SA MOORE carried a Dallas Times date-line of 11/23/63. Information appearing under the photograph reflects the photograph depicts "KENNEDY hit by assassin's bullet...photograph made by Mrs. MARY ANN MOORMAN, wife of Dallas plumber with Polaroid camera."

Item #10

Investigation to date has identified a number of persons who attended social functions at Dallas, Texas, with those persons having been interviewed and/or investigation is in progress to locate others and they will be interviewed. Regarding OSWALD's address book, all leads suggested in that address book, which writings appeared in English as well as Russian, are being pursued and results will be reported to the Bureau in reports as the investigation is completed. It is noted that the majority of persons who had been indicated to attend social functions with the OSWALDs had already been interviewed before the receipt of referenced Bureau airtel by the Dallas Office.

Item #13

It is noted in an earlier report in this matter, Mr. O. V. CAMPBELL, Vice President and Secretary, Texas School Book Depository (TSBD), Elm and Houston Streets, Dallas, Texas, advised on November 26, 1963, that while he had not observed anyone fire any shots from his building on November 22, 1963, he had observed an individual wearing a construction-type hat who was talking about seeing an individual fire from the window of the TSBD Building, and he noted that a police officer had taken this individual's name.

On December 17, 1963, Mr. CAMPBELL advised SA KENNETH B. JACKSON that as best he could recall this individual was wearing a white helmet and work clothes with possibly red lettering on the helmet. He described the man as white, about 5'9" or 5'10", possibly 165 pounds and possibly around 35 years of age. He said that this man was talking with a Dallas Police Department officer.

A review of information in this matter indicated that the individual observed by Mr. CAMPBELL may possibly have been identical to HOWARD LESLIE BRENNAN who has been previously interviewed in this matter.

TEXAS

On December 17, 1963, BRENNAN advised SA KENNETH B. JACKSON he was employed with Wallace-Beard Construction Company as a steam fitter, and he was doing prefabrication work at a location to the rear of the TSBD Building on November 22, 1963. He is still employed with this company but is now working at the construction site of the Republic National Bank Building, Dallas. He stated he continues to reside at 6814 Woodard, Dallas.

On December 17, 1963, BRENNAN was introduced to Mr. O. V. CAMPBELL by SA KENNETH B. JACKSON, and neither individual showed recognition of the other at first. Mr. CAMPBELL was of the opinion that BRENNAN was very likely the person he had referred to as having conversed with the Dallas police officer immediately after the shooting of President KENNEDY on November 22, 1963. He indicated that possibly his recollection of a white construction-type helmet on the individual he had observed could possibly have been a gray helmet which, according to BRENNAN, was what he, BRENNAN, wore on November 22, 1963, with the name of his company, Wallace-Beard, stenciled in black letters on the

front of the helmet and at that time a small black name sticker bearing BRENNAN's name. Mr. CAMPBELL observed a round white badge bearing a number, 130, with the words Wallace-Beard Republic Bank Tower and indicated that possibly his recollection of red letters on white background could have been from observing this badge which badge, according to BRENNAN, was worn by him on November 22, 1963, as at the present. The entire badge was not in red lettering, but the large digits 130 in the center were in red, the word Wallace was in blue letters, the word Beard was in red letters and the words Republic Bank Tower were in blue letters. BRENNAN furnished his own description as white male, 5'7½", 155 to 160 pounds and age 44. As CAMPBELL and BRENNAN talked Mr. CAMPBELL stated he became a little more sure that BRENNAN was the individual he had seen conversing with the Dallas police officer on November 22, 1963. Mr. BRENNAN stated that he was unable to recall CAMPBELL at all but remarked that he himself had talked to a Dallas police officer at that time and that CAMPBELL could have observed his conversation with the police officer without his own knowledge. BRENNAN did state, however, that he felt reasonably sure that the person referred to by CAMPBELL would have been himself.

Mr. R. S. TRULY, Superintendent, TSBD, stated that he was in company with Mr. CAMPBELL on November 22, 1963, at the time the motorcade of President KENNEDY passed in front of the TSBD. He stated that immediately after the shooting at that time he and Mr. CAMPBELL apparently became separated by the surging crowd, and, therefore, he would not be able to comment regarding any persons observed by Mr. CAMPBELL at the time. Mr. TRULY furnished this information to SA KENNETH B. JACKSON on December 17, 1963.

# Dallas Ad Placer Explains

## Its Source

MOUNT VERNON, N.Y., Dec. 7 (AP)—A man who played a major role in placing an advertisement critical of President Kennedy in Dallas newspapers which appeared hours before Mr. Kennedy was assassinated there said tonight the cost was paid through donations from "people of conservative persuasion."

Bernard Weissman, whose name appeared on the full-page ad, said the money was collected by a small group he headed known as the American Fact-Finding Committee.

The ad appeared in the Dallas Morning News and asked President Kennedy such questions as "Why have you ordered or permitted your

brother Bobby, the Attorney General, to go soft on Communists . . . ?"

Weissman said in a telephone interview from the home of his father here that he was in Dallas at the time the President was assassinated, but was attending a sales meeting and failed to see the presidential motorcade. He said he telephoned the

FBI the same day and offered to appear for questioning "because of the attention that had been focused on my group due to its announced aims along conservative lines." "They knew more about me than I knew about myself," he said of the FBI. "I left a few days later because I couldn't earn a living with the threats and pressures."

...brought to bear against me there by local liberal groups," he explained.

He said he never knew Lee Harvey Oswald, accused assassin of the President, or Jack Ruby, the strip club operator who killed Oswald two days after the President's death.

"As far as Oswald is concerned, I think he was a despicable Communist nut," Weissman said. "One of exactly the type people the conservative movement is fighting."

#### Sees Ad 'Regrettable'

He said he felt it was regrettable that the ad had appeared in light of what befell the President, but justified its being placed as a retort to "the attacks made by local liberal groups there against conservatives."

Weissman said he adopted a conservative political philosophy while serving as a military policeman in the Army in Germany.

"A bunch of us got together and found out that we thought alike," he recalled. "We all thought the United States was acting like a weak sister and we decided to do something about it when we got out of the Army."

Weissman, who said he was separated from his wife, expects to begin work Monday with a new firm.

"I was truly shocked at the President's death," he said. "It was a terrible thing."

"But I was even more shocked by the fact that many people kept blaming the conservatives even when it had been established that a Communist was the assassin," he added.

Oswald had described himself as a Marxist.

From Dallas, a special correspondent to The Washington Post, Ronnie Dugger, earlier reported from Dallas on Weissman's activity there:

Weissman, 26, and an associate, William Burley, 28, had worked at a Dallas firm since Nov. 10.

#### Give Dallas Reference

Both men named a Dallas man as a reference. He is Larry Schmidt, an insurance salesman whose telephone number Weissman gave the Dallas News advertising director as a number through which he could be reached. Schmidt was not immediately available for comment.

When an inquirer telephoned the number Weissman had given the News last week, the man who answered acknowledged that he knew Weissman, had tried to sell him some insurance and had had him in his home for coffee. He asked that his name not be used.

The sources speaking for the employer of Weissman and Burley in Dallas say the employer's telephone records establish that a Larry Schmidt telephoned Weissman daily during his employment here from Nov. 10 through Nov. 21.

#### Caller for Weissman

On the morning of Nov. 22, these sources say, a person the telephone operator identified as Larry Jones called for Weissman, who was in a sales conference. The message left for Weissman was that he should meet Jones in the same place where the brothers met for lunch. The reference to "the brothers" was not clear.

The employer is not sure whether Weissman returned to work that afternoon, the day of the President's assassination, but on Monday, the sources say, Weissman telephoned to say he was quitting.

Weissman and Burley had checked into an apartment house in Dallas on Nov. 5 and checked out on Nov. 27, as has been previously reported. They worked as rug salesmen for the Dallas firm from Nov. 10 through Nov. 23 only. When they left here, they said they were going back to New York.

A highly critical full page ad costing \$1463 appeared in the "Dallas Morning News" on the morning of 11-22-63 entitled "Welcome, Mr. Kennedy to Dallas" which was signed by the "American Fact Finding Committee, Bernard Weissman, Chairman, P. O. Box 1792, Dallas 21, Texas." This article brought great public indignation and prompted several newspaper articles as well as an inquiry from Congressman Bernard F. Grabowski (D-Conn) who described it as vicious, cruel and one which employed the type of verbiage which tends to incite fanatics. This article was in the form of a public questionnaire to President Kennedy listing 12 questions concerning principally foreign policy matters.

Investigation has revealed this article was prepared by Larrig Henry Schmidt, a Dallas, Texas, insurance salesman, and by Joseph P. Grinnan, a Dallas independent oil man, who are both members of the John Birch Society (JBS). The money for the ad, according to Schmidt, was solicited by Grinnan from a half dozen prominent Dallas businessmen. Bernard Weissman, the signer of the ad, is a friend of Schmidt whom he met while in the U.S. Army and it was decided to use Weissman's name on the ad for purpose of counteracting anti-Semitism charges which had been directed against the conservatives. The American Fact Finding Committee was simply a name selected by Schmidt for use in the ad and there is no such organization. Schmidt, who is described as a "conservative," felt no demonstration should be given to a President, but he felt some type of activity should indicate disapproval of President Kennedy's policies. Schmidt referred to the "Dallas Times Herald" article of 10-27-63 which referred to a demonstration at Dallas when United Nations Ambassador Stevenson was in Dallas recently. The article identified Schmidt as the leader of 14 college students who were demonstrating opposition to Stevenson and the United Nations. Schmidt has been identified as a close friend of Warren Carroll, a writer for "Life Line," an enterprise controlled by H. L. Hunt, a wealthy Dallas oil man. Hunt very possibly is one of the contributors to the funds needed for the ad. Schmidt denied any organization backed this ad.

A newspaper article appearing in the "Washington Post and Times Herald" dated 12/3/63, entitled "Dallas Ad Illager Explains Its Source," reveals a telephone interview with Bernard Weissman whose name appears as a signer of the full-page highly critical ad concerning President Kennedy's foreign policies in the "Dallas Morning News" on the morning of 11/25/63. Weissman stated the money for the ad, \$1,433, was collected by a small group he headed known as the "American Fact Finding Committee." He added he was in Dallas when the President was assassinated and telephoned the FBI the same day and volunteered to appear for questioning "because of the attention that had been focused on my group due to its announced aims along conservative lines." He further added "they (the FBI) knew more about me than I knew about myself." He stated he left Dallas a few days later because he could not earn a living with the threats and pressure being brought to bear against him by local liberal groups.

The Director commented on the above portion of the article "Is this story accurate?"

Either Weissman has been misquoted or he is lying to attempt to create an impression he is of some importance. My memorandum dated 12/6/63, which is attached, sets forth the facts concerning the preparation of the ad, those responsible and those from whom the funds were solicited. Weissman, who arrived in Dallas only 19 days before the assassination, permitted his name to be used for the purpose of counteracting charges of anti-Semitism which had been directed against the conservatives.

advised there is no record in the Dallas Office of Bernard Weissman having called that office. Shanklin said a similar article had been brought to his attention and at a conference with Agents of the Dallas Office he inquired whether any of them had received such a call and was advised no one had taken a call from Bernard Weissman.

Weissman exaggerates his importance when he states that threats and pressure brought on by local liberal groups caused him to leave town 11-27-63 when actually probably no more than a dozen people knew him by sight or name and only a few knew he was the signer of the article. His remark concerning the fact that when he called the FBI they knew more about him than he did about himself is another distortion because on 11-22-63 he was a complete nonentity to us. However, by 12-5-63 when he was interviewed (three days before this article) we knew considerable data about him. He has taken the liberty to construe and report that the data later known about him was known on 11-22-63 when he allegedly called the Dallas Office.

Bernard Weissman, born 11-1-37, and William Milton Burley, born 7-17-35, were former Army associates of Larrie Schmidt, born 7-6-35, and had been advised by Schmidt that a large conservative group of American businessmen who opposed the liberal element in U.S. Government were located in Dallas. Schmidt urged Weissman and Burley to contact him at Dallas. Both were recently separated from the U. S. Army and arrived in Dallas 11-3-63 taking employment locally. Approximately 10 days after their arrival, Schmidt recruited them as members of the JES. Both Weissman and Burley were interviewed 12-5-63 and substantiated above facts as related by Schmidt. On 11-27-63 Weissman and Burley left Dallas, and Weissman went to his father's home in Mt. Vernon, New York, and Burley joined his girl friend in Denver, Colorado. Burley reiterated purpose of using Weissman's name was to show other conservatives that Jews were interested in conservative movement, as Grinnan felt too many conservatives were anti-Jewish and Weissman's signature would help stem anti-Jewish feeling.

Our investigation fails to show any relationship concerning the placement of the above ad to Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby. A review of Bufiles fails to reveal any identifiable security data relating to Larrie Schmidt, Joseph Grinnan, Bernard Weissman or William Milton Burley.

RECOMMENDATION:

Investigation conducted shows that Weissman and Burley were merely tools. This ad was written by Schmidt and Grinnan both JES members. Funds for the enterprise came from an unidentified group of well-to-do Dallas businessmen. No known connection with the placing of this ad and Lee Harvey Oswald or Jack Ruby was developed. In view of the findings, there is no need to pursue the investigation of this matter further.

Attached is a teletype to Dallas, El Paso, Denver, New York, Cleveland, Tampa and Charlotte advising these offices to discontinue further inquiries concerning this particular matter.

The following copy of a X-ray negative was received from Parkland Hospital this date. This is being forwarded to the Bureau for the information of the Laboratory.

The following was received from Dr. JACK REYNOLDS of the Parkland Hospital staff.

"SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT DESCRIBING IN DETAIL THE APPEARANCE AND LOCATION OF A SMALL METALLIC DENSITY SUPERIMPOSED ON THE SOFT TISSUE SHADOWS OF THE MEDIAL ASPECT OF THE LEFT THIGH OF GOVERNOR JOHN G. CONNALLY ON FILMS DATED 11/22/63.

"AP and lateral films of the distal portion of the left thigh were obtained and include the distal portion of the shaft and the region of the knee. One film is in the AP projection and the other the lateral projection with the direction of the beam from medial to lateral and the film lying adjacent to the lateral aspect of the thigh.

"No fractures are seen. A few punctate and linear densities are seen on the film but these are inconstant, and appear on one and not the other and therefore are interpreted as artifacts.

"There is, however, one density which remains constant on both films and appears to lie beneath the skin in the region of the subcutaneous fat in the medial aspect of the thigh. By measurements on these films, without correction for target film distance and object film distance, this small density lies 15.2 cms. above the distal end of the medial femoral condyle on the AP film and, on this film, lies 8 mms beneath the external surface of the skin. It is 6.25 cms medial to the femoral shaft. On the lateral film, the center of this small metallic density lies 15 cms above the distal end of the medial femoral condyle. It lies 4.9 cms posterior to the skin of the anterior surface of the thigh and it is superimposed on the shaft of the femur. In relation to the femur, the density is superimposed on a point 1.5 cms posterior to the exterior of the anterior cortex.

"The shape of this density is irregular but is roughly oval. Precise measurements are difficult but it is estimated that the greatest length in the AP projection is about 3.5 mms and the greatest width about 1.3 mms.

"Measurements of the density in the lateral projection reveal the greatest length to be about 2 mms, and the greatest width to be about 1.5 mms. The long axis of the metallic object is oriented generally along the axis of the femur."

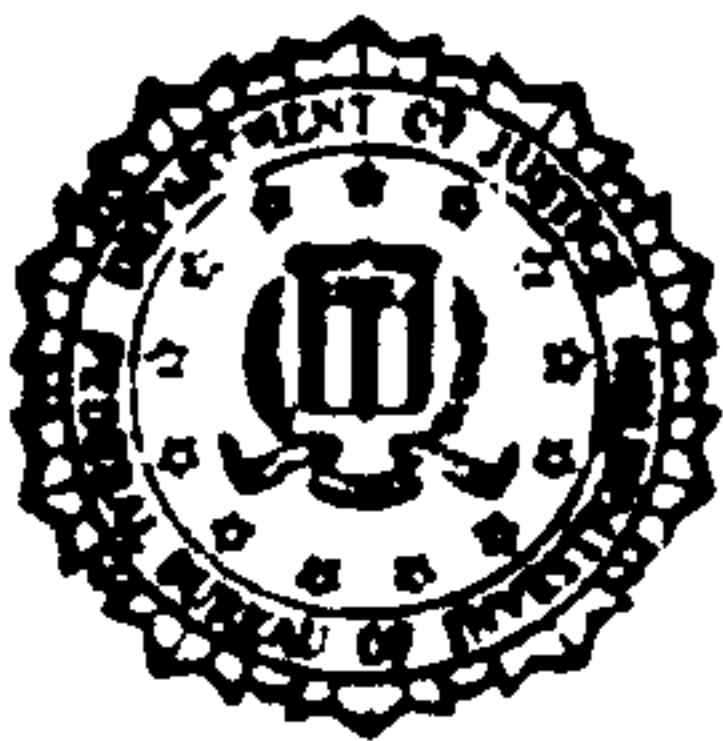

Assassination of President Kennedy

On December 11, 1963, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that a meeting of the National Board and invited guests of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP USA) was held in Communist Party (CP) Headquarters, New York City, on that date. Among those in attendance were:

There was discussion concerning a report to be published by the CP USA, probably shortly after the National Executive Committee (NEC) meeting scheduled to be held in New York City, December 19-22, 1963.

Gus Hall read the first section prepared by him. He characterized it as "just a rough draft". In essence it was an attack on the Ultra Right and those who choose to ignore the Ultra Right while attacking the Left. With reference to Lee Oswald, the alleged assassin of President Kennedy, the statement is made "Needless to say, Oswald never was a Communist or a Marxist. He wrote a letter to the Party asking for literature and information like thousands of others from all walks of life... He stated that it was like being released from prison when he returned from the Soviet Union. We have turned over the letters and copies of the answers to the Presidential fact finding commission. We will have to continue to expose all efforts by the reactionary forces to twist or manufacture facts in order to use the situation for their anti-Communist, Ultra Right threats".

The report accuses law enforcement agencies, in particular the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) of "living by the big lie" of anti-Communism. It speaks of "political witch-hunts, indictments, convictions, harassment by the FBI, fifteen years of inquisition under Mc Carthyism" all based on "a deliberately manufactured lie". It states that "this false claim against the Communist Party" is known to be a fact by everyone concerned with public life and "the head of the government law enforcement agency has made a lifetime profession of promoting and manufacturing, and daily expanding, this lie".

The report alleges that most of the mass media for days after President Kennedy's assassination "spread the unadulterated lie that the assassin was supposed to have admitted Communism", and nine-tenths of all the newspapers, radio and television commentators refused to say anything about "the cover or no" official statements by the Communist Party despite these allegations.

According to the report, most Americans do not agree with the Communist viewpoint, "but they also have a general idea that we are not anarchists, we are not terrorists".

Hall mentioned other points which he felt should be included in the report, such as electoral matters, unemployment, the Cuban question, and developments in Venezuela.

Irving Potas suggested there be greater emphasis in the report on "Hoover and the role of the FBI". He alleged that the FBI serves the Ultra Right and it should be pointed out that "Hoover represents the Ultra Right in a vital position of power in the government" and the entire role of the FBI in this crisis (assassination of President Kennedy) highlights "this threat to our democratic rights". Potas commented "I think it can be said that no investigation of the assassination and the sordid events surrounding it can be satisfactory without including a thorough examination of the role of the FBI".

Arnold Johnson recommended that the text of the Oswald letters be released at the same time "as the press release" (apparently referring to the aforementioned report).

There was discussion concerning the advisability of calling a press conference to release the text of the Oswald letters, with Bill Green recommending such a course of action and Irving Potas and Ben Davis opposed. Davis commented "We have done the most important thing. They have been delivered to the proper authorities". No conclusion was reached and it was agreed there should be further discussion on this point at later meetings.

With regard to Mr. DeLoach's memorandum dated 12-16-63 captioned "Warren Commission; Assassination of the President," the Director instructed that we assemble the background reports on which our summary which was sent to the Commission was based.

We have begun assembling this material and it has been determined that there have been 152 reports in captioned cases submitted by 52 field offices, totaling approximately 6,200 pages. Four of these reports were submitted by the Dallas Office in the Oswald case which totaled 2,500 pages and three in the Ruby case, totaling approximately 1,575 pages.

The summary which we prepared and delivered to the Department 12-5-63 and which ultimately went to the Commission, was based primarily upon the contents of the four reports from Dallas in the Oswald case and one report in the Ruby case, totaling 833 pages. These reports and all other reports prepared by other offices dated prior to 12-5-63 are being assembled and will be sent to the Commission on 12-18-63.

We are also assembling for subsequent delivery to the Commission the reports which are dated 12-5-63 and subsequent thereto.

This summarizes attachment. At a meeting of the National Board and invited guests, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), 12-11-63, a discussion was held concerning a report to be published by the Party shortly after the National Executive Committee (NEC) meeting 12-19/22-63. Gus Hall went over a rough draft of a report by him which is an attack on the ultra right. Hall said Lee Harvey Oswald was never a communist or a Marxist and that letters which had been written by Oswald to the Party had been turned over to the "Presidential Fact-Finding Commission." (John Abt, a CP attorney, made these letters available to our New York Office and they were included in a report on Oswald which was furnished to Department for transmittal to commission appointed by President Johnson to investigate assassination of President Kennedy.) Hall then made his usual attack on the FBI and the Director. Irving Potash, Labor Secretary, CPUSA, suggested the report have greater emphasis on "Hoover and the role of the FBI," claiming that the Director represents the ultra right and that investigation of the assassination cannot be satisfactory without including thorough examination of the role of the FBI.

New York has been instructed to afford coverage to the NEC meeting and appropriate dissemination be made of information received. Attached being disseminated to the Department.

The original sack found on the sixth floor of this building on November 22, 1963, and believed to be the sack in which OSWALD carried the rifle into the building on November 22, 1963, was in possession of SAs ODUM and MC NEELY at that time and the replica sack was made to approximately the same size and as nearly as possible in the same manner as the original sack.

This replica sack has been shown to witnesses primarily to convey the true color of the original sack, its color being changed by chemical processes during treatment to develop latent fingerprints.

It is requested that you make a comparison between the replica sack and the original sack to determine if they are made with the same weight and type of paper and gum tape, and if the paper and tape is the same color as, that used in the original sack.

Please return the replica sack to the Dallas Office when your examination is complete.

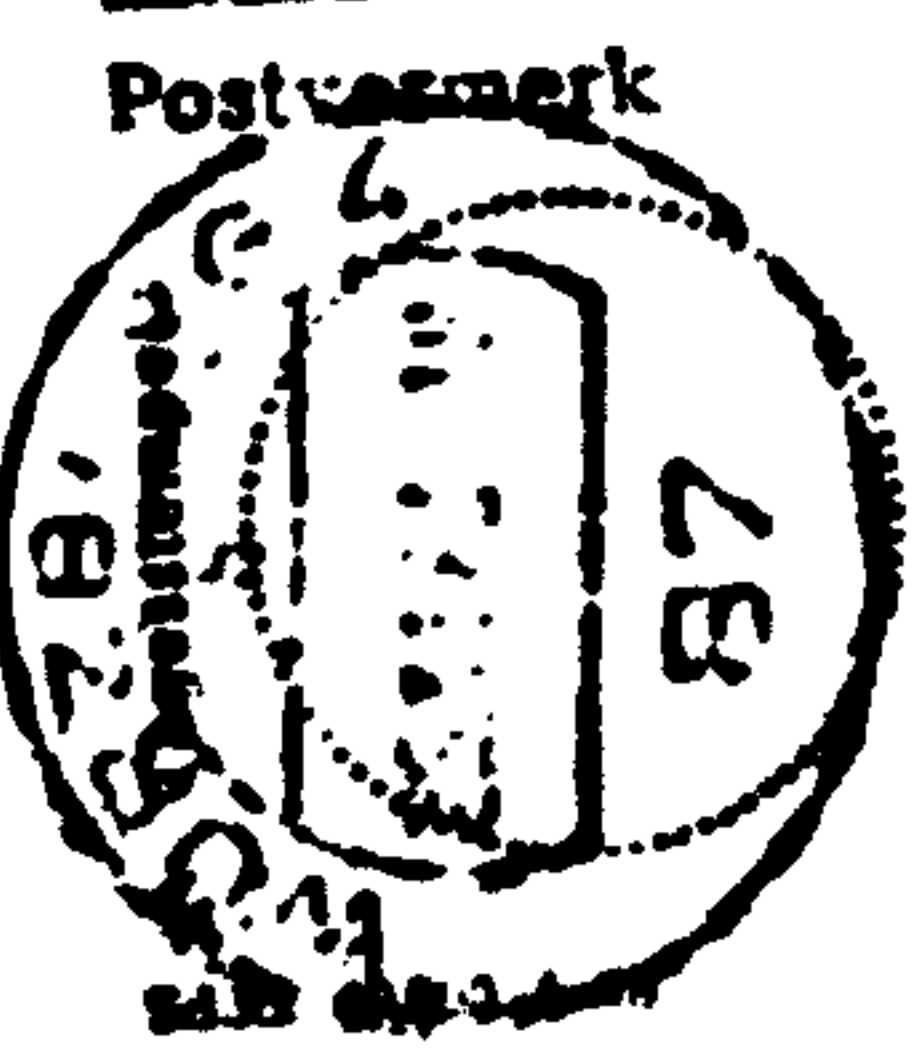

On 11/30/63, Mr. WILLIAM J. SCHOCK, 823 Westwood Pl., Falls Church, Va., advised SA ROBERT F. UTZ he did not know anyone named W. C. SCHOCK or C. W. SCHOCK. He advised that he has not contacted the FBI regarding any matter.

On 11/30/63, Mr. CARLYLE W. SCHOCK, Apt. 2, 200 George Mason Drive, Arlington, Va., was contacted at his apartment by SA ROBERT F. UTZ and he was thereafter interviewed inside the Agent's automobile, at the request of SCHOCK. SCHOCK advised that he had no specific information of any kind concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY; however, he had a theory which he felt the FBI should consider. He felt that some type of world-wide conspiracy was behind the shooting of the President, and that the key to the entire matter was with the woman at the theatre in Dallas, Texas, who had advised the local police that OSWALD was in the theater. It was SCHOCK's opinion that this woman taking tickets at this theatre had to know that OSWALD was coming to this theatre. Further, SCHOCK advised that he felt it very strange that President KENNEDY should have been killed by a rifle, when in the past, ERNEST HEMMINGWAY was mysteriously killed by a rifle blast, and also the Editor of the Washington Post had recently committed suicide with a rifle. He felt that HEMMINGWAY's interest in Cuba must have been the reason for his death.

SCHOCK at times became very excited when furnishing this information and at times was on the verge of crying. He appeared fairly intelligent but at times rambled on and on. He appeared to be a person who had a mental problem. He further went on to state that most of the important political figures in politics today, in the United States, had taken advice from him concerning their political futures. He also suggested that he felt he should personally be appointed by President JOHNSON to be on the recently appointed committee headed by Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the U. S., EARL R. WARREN, concerning the investigation of the death of President KENNEDY, and he felt he should be allowed to handle all public relations and correspondence for this committee.

At times SCHOCK appeared irrational and it was impossible to follow any logic in his theory or thinking.

He thanked the Agent for listening to him and stated that he would be catching a bus for New York City the following morning. When asked what work he was doing, he replied, that he works for himself in the business of National Security, at which time he terminated the conversation.

In view of the apparent mental condition of this individual, no further inquiry is being made as it appears that SCHOCK does not have any information of value relative to this matter.

Mr. J. Lee Rankin was contacted yesterday at his office at 4:00 p. m., at which time he was furnished five complete sets of reports and exhibits prepared by the Bureau. Mr. Rankin was most appreciative of receiving these copies and stated that for the time being this would be a sufficient number and if he desired more, he would so advise.

During the contact with Rankin he advised that the Commission had met the previous day and that a number of items had come to light wherein clarification was needed. These items are set forth hereinafter.

Rankin requested information as to whether or not the Bureau had obtained the medical reports concerning the shooting of the President from Parkland Hospital in Dallas as well as the report from U. S. Naval Hospital, Bethesda. This is one of the items which Rankin mentioned on the telephone on 12/17/63 when he contacted the Bureau. It was again pointed out to Mr. Rankin that our investigative report would cover in detail the results of the medical examination at the Parkland Hospital. Rankin was advised that the family of the President had requested the report from the U. S. Naval Hospital at Bethesda be kept as confidential as possible and for this reason the Bureau did not obtain the medical report for inclusion in the investigative report prepared by the Bureau. He was also told that this report was in the possession of the Secret Service. Rankin stated that it would not be necessary to do anything on this and that in the event Secret Service did not supply the medical report with material to be furnished by Secret Service, the Commission would request the medical report from Secret Service.

Mr. Rankin indicated the Commission desired that income tax returns dating back to 1955 be obtained relative to Lee Harvey Oswald, Jack Ruby, his brother Earl Ruby, Mr. Michael Paine and Mrs. Ruth Paine (the Paine residence is the one in Irving, Texas, where Mrs. Oswald and her children were residing.) Rankin indicated the Commission was interested in the tax returns so that determination could be made of any collaboration of any kind between Oswald and Ruby as well as the Paine family and that they were desirous of having all negative information as well as positive.

Mr. Rankin was advised that the Bureau was making a complete financial check of both Oswald and Ruby and that full details concerning income tax returns as well as the financial check would be included in the investigative report.

The Commission was also desirous that Western Union and Post Office money orders be checked, all localities where Oswald had resided, and also be checked concerning Jack Ruby. Mr. Rankin was advised that this was being done and would be included in the investigative report.

Mr. Rankin asked whether or not all other Government agencies have been contacted for information that they might possess in their files concerning Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack Ruby. Mr. Rankin was advised that considerable information had been obtained from the files of other Government agencies and that our investigative report would definitely show the information obtained from all agencies of the Government. In this connection, a canvass of the other Government agencies is being made to make certain that we have received any information available on Oswald and Ruby.

Rankin is interested in knowing whether any of the intelligence organizations of the military had taken any action relative to Lee Harvey Oswald before he went to Russia or since his return. Rankin was advised that the U. S. Marine Corps' file on Oswald had been obtained, had been reviewed and summarized in our investigative report. He was told that a check would be made, if it had not already been completed, to ascertain whether any action had been taken by any of the military intelligence services. A check has been instituted to obtain this information if any such action was ever taken.

Mr. Rankin stated the Commission was very desirous of obtaining typewritten copies of information that had been included in our exhibits as handwriting of Oswald. He stated the Commission had experienced difficulty in reading his writing and would therefore appreciate typewritten copies. These copies have been prepared and will be made available to Mr. Rankin.

Mr. Rankin stated that for purposes of handling this investigation, the Commission had decided to handle it all on a top secret basis and that probably within the next few days they would have the names of some individuals concerning whom they would desire a check made. Mr. Rankin was advised that in the event he desired a name check on these individuals it could be handled in very short order but that if he had in mind a full investigation it would take considerable time. Rankin advised that no definite decision had been made on this at the present and he would be in touch with the Bureau later concerning this matter.

Mr. Rankin inquired whether information would be available covering investigation that had been conducted in Mexico concerning Oswald's activities and whether or not there was any necessity for the Commission attempting to obtain any information from the Mexican Government. Mr. Rankin was advised that this matter would be checked into and he would be advised as soon as possible.

Concerning films, Mr. Rankin mentioned that Mr. Larson of Life-Time Corporation had offered to make available to the President's Commission the film in possession of Life relative to the shooting of the President. Mr. Rankin desired to know whether the Bureau had copies of this film, and if it could be made available to the President's Commission. Mr. Rankin was advised that the Bureau did have this particular film along with other film relating to the assassination of the President and that he would be advised later as to what film was actually available.

Mr. Rankin stated that he did not know if it would be possible for the Bureau to arrange for a type of re-enactment of the assassination of the President but that he felt that it would be of invaluable aid to the Commission if, through photographs, diagrams or other arrangements, the Commission would be able to sit down and be briefed as to what actually occurred in a more or less chronological story of the events which took place and then to have made available the more important items of evidence that had been discovered. Mr. Rankin was advised that his request was thoroughly understood and that this matter would be looked into and he would be advised later as to what action could be taken. In this connection aerial photographs have been made depicting the scene where the President was assassinated as well as other important points of activity in Dallas. It is also noted that the Bureau's Exhibits Section is at the present time in the process of making three-dimensional exhibits which would completely portray the activities which occurred in Dallas. It is believed that when these exhibits are completed that they would be most helpful in assisting the Commission to see exactly the events that transpired in Dallas relative to the assassination of the President. Mr. Rankin indicated that he presumed it would be better for members of the Commission to come to the Bureau for such a briefing if this could be arranged and that he would not hesitate to ask the members of the Commission to come to the Bureau for this briefing rather than have Bureau personnel come up to headquarters of the Commission.

During the interview, Mr. Rankin was asked whether or not the Commission intended to hire investigators. It was pointed out to Mr. Rankin that the Bureau was desirous of being of any assistance that it could possibly render and that it would be glad to conduct further inquiries concerning any matters that the Commission desired. Mr. Rankin stated that he was most appreciative of this offer on the part of the Bureau and that he personally felt that the Bureau would be only too glad to cooperate on any request the Commission might have.

Rankin advised that while he did not share the views of some members of the Commission, there were some who had the feeling that it might be best to have investigators assigned to the Commission inasmuch as it might develop that the Commission would desire some checks on one or more of the Government agencies involved in the over-all matter. Mr. Rankin stated that he personally felt that the responsible Government agencies involved would be able to handle their own phases of this matter and that he sincerely hoped that it would not be necessary to hire investigators for the Commission.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) It is recommended that Mr. Rankin be advised that the results of the investigation conducted in Mexico relative to Oswald are being received and that this information will be submitted to the Commission at an early date. (Our material from Legat, Mexico, is ready. We are clearing CIA material with CIA). *Rankin advised CIA will furnish this info when requested.*

Is it really so simple to locate a man as laborately guarded as the President of the United States? Can one simply pick a convenient window along his route, wait comfortably eating fried chicken and coke until the President arrives, daintily wipe one's fingers from one's mouth with a paper napkin, take careful note of the President's movements, and shoot the President dead in the head? - and then escape? It is not.

If it were really as simple as all this, the President would live more than a few weeks.

But then how can the Secret Service, FBI and local police guard the President against such snipers? As the chief of the Secret Service has truly said, it is impossible to search every building and guard everyone of the tens of thousands of windows along the route.

But it is not necessary to police each building and window to protect a President from snipers.

Here's why.

There are damned few people in any nation who would actually attempt to murder the President in the face of the tremendous security precautions surrounding such a figure. There are millions of Americans, to be sure, who roundly hate Mr. Kennedy and all the un-American things he stood for. I am one of these.

But I am not so foolish as to believe I could change the disastrous course of U. S. history by shooting Kennedy. (I am not afraid or ashamed to admit that if I sincerely believed I could stop all race-mixing and put an end to Communism by shooting Kennedy or any other single figure I would not hesitate a moment, regardless of cost.)

(But, as it is, I am 100% convinced that we cannot save the American Constitution and Republic and the White Race by force and violence any more than Hitler was able to save Germany at the Feldherrnhalle. Our counter-revolution must be scrupulously, rigorously legal.)

In my case, it is cold reason which prevents, and will prevent me, from taking up arms to save ourselves. But there are tens of thousands of others in America who fanatically hate the way our Constitution and White Race are being destroyed. Perhaps some of them refrain from force and violence because of reason--the belief, which I hold, that force and violence is the quickest way to suicide for our tiny forces. But the vast majority of those who might think of assassinating a President are deterred, not by reason, but by FEAR.

Even more important, from the standpoint of the security of the President, is the fact that any person likely to hate the President enough to risk almost certain death to shoot him does not develop such a passionate hatred overnight.

Anyone angry enough and courageous enough to play the part of an assassin, will inevitably spend at least a few weeks burning with hatred which is utterly impossible to hide completely.

St. Elizabeth and Springfield mad houses in Washington and Missouri have entire wings filled with would-be presidential assassins betrayed into the hands of the authorities by their unconcealable hatred of the President.

There is no need whatsoever to fear 9,999,999 Americans out of 10,000,000 would ever seriously consider assassinating a President. Such a monstrous deed requires a very special kind of personality.

Thus, those charged with the safety of the President, who cannot possibly watch all Americans during presidential appearances nor all buildings and windows along presidential routes, very rightly devote their major attention to minute surveillance of all those individuals in the area who have ever displayed any indications that they are (1) filled with sufficient hatred of the President and, (2) psychologically capable of the enormous act of assassination of a President.

In Dallas, a few weeks before the President arrived, right-wingers had bashed Adlai Stevenson with a picket sign and otherwise given plenty of evidence that there was a lot of right-wing hatred of the President in the area. So security officials actually boasted, before the assassination, that they had taken even more extreme precautions than usual to protect the President's appearance in Dallas.

And here, Kennedy's own "generals" fell victim of the very lies and propaganda which Kennedy himself was spreading on his Texas tour. There are few things more dangerous to a general than believing his own propaganda. But this is precisely what the security forces and local police did.

While the real danger to our nation and race lies in COMMUNISM and its vicious adherents, Kennedy and his ADA super left-wing, soft-on-Communism left-wing administration, kept pooch-pooching the danger of Communism in America and pretending there is some great "danger" to America from the right wing, which seeks only to preserve the White Race and the Constitution, as we do.

Kennedy and his gang did their best to promote the illusion that all danger to America comes from the "ultra-conservative", the "reactionaries", "supremacists", "the racists, White supremacists, States Righters, etc.

Us "terrible truth" are supposed to be too stupid to even to talk about.

With this lying propaganda emanating from the President himself, and being beaten into the ears of Americans 24 hours a day by every Jew dominated media of public information, the mental sickness of right-baiting penetrated the very ranks of Kennedy's own security forces.
