CONNOR further advised that the man who stated he owned the bar in Dallas asked a bar maid named JO ANN to call the San Antonio Airport and determine when a plane would leave for Dallas. After the bar maid completed the call, unknown individual asked for change and made a call to Dallas supposedly to his wife.

CONNOR stated he has seen photographs of JACK RUBY and neither of these men are identical with him.

CONNOR said after call was made no additional conversation was held regarding KENNEDY's visit to Texas.

JO ANN MORGAN, bar tender, Stardust Lounge, 509 N. St. Marys, advised that she recalls a man known to her as PAT CONNOR being in the lounge and in conversation with two other men about a week ago but did not hear any details of the conversation. She did recall hearing the names "KENNEDY, KHRUSCHEZ and CASTRO" but did not know how they were being used in the conversation. Miss MORGAN said she often makes calls for customers and many of them are to the airport. She could not recall specifically making a call for either of the two men with PAT CONNOR.

He stated he took a bus from Dallas, Texas to San Antonio, Texas, arriving there in the early hours. He stated at approximately 10 a.m., he went to a bar located directly across the street from the bus depot where he had several beers. He advised while in the bar, he struck up a conversation with two or three other individuals, including the owner of the bar. He advised they discussed hunting since the deer season was on. He stated he did not recall the names of the other persons taking part in the conversation since they were all strangers and could not recall anything particular as to their home town or occupation. He advised, however, they did discuss President KENNEDY's forthcoming visit to Texas but did not recall anyone making any comments regarding the possible assassination or killing of the President, the use of any high power rifle or the mention of CASTRO or Cuba. He stated KENNEDY's forthcoming visit to Texas was just casually mentioned with the main discussion being concerned over hunting.

He stated after a short period of time he made a long distance phone call to Dallas, Texas to his wife and advised her he would be back in Dallas that afternoon. He stated he had the barmaid at the lounge call the airport for him for the purpose of making a reservation in determining when he could get a flight from San Antonio back to Dallas, Texas. He stated he left San Antonio at approximately 4:30 p.m. on American Airlines and arrived in Dallas, Texas at approximately 6 p.m. where he went to the Palomino Bar.

Sheriff HENRY A: REID, JR., Calcasieu Parish Sheriff's Office, Lake Charles, Louisiana, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

On November 25, 1963, at approximately 9:00 AM he was personally contacted at his home by Mr. SAM MANCUSO, a former member of the Louisiana State Mineral Board. MANCUSO told him that approximately three or four weeks ago, he met LONNIE MORGAN, a white male, approximately 40, at Billie's Cafe, located on Ryan Street, Lake Charles. MORGAN is a drilling foreman for the Continental Oil Company in Lake Charles, Louisiana and MANCUSO has known MORGAN for approximately six or seven years. At this chance meeting with MANCUSD, MORGAN asked MANCUSO "How about making a contribution to kill the SOB?" MANCUSO asked MORGAN what he was talking about and MORGAN replied, "Kennedy". At this time MORGAN displayed a small piece of paper with names written thereon, wrapped around some currency. MANCUSO advised REID that certain elements in the oil industry have been violently opposed to President KENNEDY's oil depletion policies.

REID advised he told MANCUSO that he would notify the FBI concerning the statement made by MORGAN.

SAM/MANCUSO, 1135 Hodges Street, Lake Charles, Louisiana, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

Approximately one month ago, during the morning hours, he met LONNIE MORGAN, whom he has known for about six years outside of Billie's Cafe, 900 Ryan Street, Lake Charles. He advised he does not now recall whether he had been drinking coffee with MORGAN but after meeting outside the cafe, MORGAN stated "I'm raising some money to get rid of that SOB". He asked MORGAN what he meant and MORGAN replied "Kennedy". MORGAN then displayed a small piece of raper with what appeared to be written names thereon and wrapped some currency with the paper. MANCUSO assumed the currency represented previous contributions. At this point the conversation was terminated by the arrival of one or two men, identities not recalled. MORGAN did not mention the name of any group or organization he might have been representing and MORGAN may have been using this approach to make a personal loan from him. He has had no further discussions in subsequent contacts with MORGAN concerning this matter. He did not believe at that time that MORGAN actually meant the death of the President when he used the phrase "get rid of the 80B" but following the assassination of the President he viewed the statement in a different light and thought the conversation with MORGAN should be reported.

MANCUSO is of the opinion executives of the oil industry as a whole have been strongly opposed to the oil depletion policies of the Administration. He advised he holds no personal animosity toward MORGAN who he considers a close business associate. He advised MORGAN has been with the Continental Oil Company for approximately eight years and believes MORGAN is from the McAllen, Texas area. MORGAN's closest associates in the Lake Charles area are CLINTON "Red" GRIFFITH, Griffith Rental Tool Company; M. G. HILL, District Supervisor, Continental Oil Company; JIM SUDDUTH, local tax consultant. MANCUSO knows of, no associates or relatives of MORGAN in the Dallas, Texas area.

MORGAN is not assigned to his section and he therefore does not know him as well as his direct supervisor, ART GENTRY. La. He does have occasion to see him almost daily at work and recalls seeing MORGAN in the Continental offices on Kirby Street during the morning hours of November 22, 1963, until about 10:00 a.m. At no time during the period he has known MORGAN, has MORGAN ever indicated extreme hatred toward the late President KENNEDY or the administration. At no time to his knowledge has MORGAN ever solicited or sought contributions for a fund to "get rid of KENNEDY". He is not aware of MORGAN's political, racial or other mersonal views and has not heard from any source that MORGAN was raising funds to "get rid of KENNEDY". He is of the opinion he would have certainly heard if MORGAN was seriously conducting such a campaign. He does not know of any organizations or groups to which MORGAN might belong but does recall MORGAN has mentioned the Masonic group in the past.

He is the direct supervisor of LONNIE BEN MORGAN and as such is in contact with MORGAN several times a day in connection with company oil drilling in the Gulf of Mexico. He advised MORGAN has been a drilling foreman for the Continental Oil Company for approximately six years in the Morgan City, Cameron and Gulf area of Louisiana. Two or three years ago, MORGAN was in Mexico on Company drilling operations for a brief period but with that exception has worked in the southwest Louisiana area almost exclusively. During the six year period he has known MORGAN, at no time has MORGAN ever voiced his political opinions concerning President KENNEDY or the present administration. He does recall some discussions where he obtained the opinion MORGAN was a segregationist, but no more so than many southerners and MORGAN's views on the racial problem were not radical or extreme. While he can not be positive, he is quite certain MORGAN has not been seeking contributions for any cause, group or organization among persons engaged in the Oil Industry in the Lake Charles area as sooner or later he would have heard about such activities. At no time has MORGAN approached him about making a contribution "to get rid of, or to kill KENNEDY". He is of the opinion MORGAN's estranged wife may have reported that he did make such a statement as she is very bitter concerning the pending divorce and is known to be an alcoholic.

As the direct supervisor of MORGAN he advised he is personally aware MORGAN has not been in the Dallas, Texas, area on company business or during working hours. If such a trip had been made it would have to have been made almost overnight as he is also in contact with MORGAN on weekends. MORGAN did take a trip to McAllen, Texas, several months ago to visit his parents for a weekend and to the best of his impowledge, this was MORGAN's only trip to Texas in the recent past.

At approximately 10:00 he instructed MORGAN to proceed to Cameron, Louisiana, and then to Continental Oil Rig #192A located in the Gulf of Mexico. He advised the Continental Oil Company has no office as such in Dallas, Texas, to his knowledge and the nearest office to Dallas would be the Fort Worth Office.

He advised he was formerly associated with SAM MANCUSO in the Southwest Barge Terminal, and while in this business he became acquainted with LONNIE MORGAN, drilling foreman for Continental Oil Co. He stated he has known MORGAN for about 5 - 6 years, but actually, MANCUSO was more friendly with MORGAN.

He stated MORGAN never said anything to him about taking up a collection to get rid of President KENNEDY or anyone else. He stated MORGAN definitely is a segregationist, but he has never said anything about hurting President KENNEDY, ROBERT KENNEDY or any other KENNEDY. Mr. SUDDUTH stated he has never known MORGAN to take up a collection for any individual, group or organization.

Mr. SUDDUTH said that MORGAN, just as almost every segregationist in the South has undoubtedly made unkind remarks concerning the Administration's Civil Rights stand, but he has no knowledge that MORGAN has ever said anything about harming President KENNEDY.

He advised that to his knowledge, MORGAN does not belong to any civic or fraternal organizations, and that other than his fellow employees, the only friends of MORGAN that he knows are RED GRIFFITH, Griffith Rental Tool Co., and SAM MANCUSO.

CLINTON "RED" GRIFFITH, 2202 21st Street, Lake Charles, Louisiana, was contacted at his place of business, Griffith Rental Tools, Inc., 230 N. Highway 171, Lake Charles, Louisiana.

He stated he has been acquainted with LONNIE MORGAN, who is employed by Continental Oil Co., Lake Charles, for about six years. He explained he is a customer of MORGAN's, and knows him both through business and socially. He stated they are on the same bowling team.

Mr. GRIFFITH stated MORGAN has never said anything to him about taking up a collection to get rid of President KENNEDY or anyone else. He stated he knows MORGAN does not agree with the policies of the Federal Government concerning racial matters and oil allowables, for example, but he feels sure MORGAN would never entertain the idea of killing the President of the U. S., be it JOHN F. KENNEDY or anyone else. He stated it is very possible that MORGAN, himself, or any Southerner might say something to the effect that KENNEDY was an SOB for pushing integration, or that he was acting foolishly concerning some of his policies as affect the oil industry, but certainly none of this kind of talk was meaningful to the degree that the person saying such would actually wish any harm to President KENNEDY or the Attorney General.

He stated he felt sure that if LONNIE MORGAN ever said he wanted "to get rid of" President KENNEDY, he meant that the way to do it would be to "get rid of" him at the polls, by voting against him.

He stated MORGAN was really a quiet person and just does not have the personality to make friends. He stated MORGAN's friends, as far as he knows are just some of the people who work with him at Continental Oil Co.

Mr. GRIFFITH stated that to his knowledge, MORGAN has never joined any civic or fraternal organization, until recently, when he joined the Masons.

She stated she knows about his Masonic work since she and MORGAN attend the same church. She stated she does not know the identity of any of his friends and does not know of any other organizations he has joined.

It is noted MORGAN lives in an area formerly occupied by Air Force people, and Mrs. JACKSON advised none of the other homes in the block, other than hers and MORGAN's, are occupied.

LONNIE BEN MORGAN, 2912 General Mitchell Street, Lake Charles, Louisiana, was advised that he did not have to make any statement and that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law. He advised he had the right to consult an attorney and no threats or promises of reward could be made to him. The identities of the interviewing Agents were made known to him.

MORGAN furnished the following information:

He has been a political opponent of President KENNEDY and the administration concerning racial and oil depletion matters. However, President KENNEDY was nevertheless the elected President of the United States and he has never, nor would he wish any physical harm to the President of the United States. He would never sanction or be involved in any physical act of violence directed toward the President. He emphatically denied having made any statements concerning any contributions or collections to get rid of or kill the President and denied having made any collections or seeking contributions for any group or organization for any pixpose. He advised the possibility exists he did make a comparable rash statement while in a bar but does not actually recall having done so.

On Friday, November 22, 1963, he was on the job in Lake Charles and Cameron, Louisiana and during the morning hours until approximately 9:00 or 10:00 AM, was at the Continental Oil Company office at 400 Kirby Street, filing drilling reports. At approximately 9:00 or 10:00 AM, he drove to Cameron, Louisiana, accompanied by DOM SMITH, a fellow employee. He took a helicopter to Continental Oil Company rig #192A and spent most of Friday afternoon on the rig or in the Cameron area. He stated he has no friends, relatives or associates in the Dallas, Texas area and believes he last visited that city in 1949 following his second marriage. He has not been in contact with any person in the Dallas, Texas area for several years to the best of his knowledge. He again denied being involved in any conspiracy concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY.

at the WFO, FBI, on the moining of February 13, 1952, and was interviewed there by SA F. B. MC GIVERN. He stated that he wanted either to talk to HOOVER or President TRUMAN. He exhibited an undesirable discharge from the Army on February 12, 1952. He stated that starting in 1945, some international ring began following him and he felt his undesirable discharge from the Army was all part of a plot against him. He wanted the FBI to investigate the matter.

On December 12, 1963, Lieutenant WALTER FOLEY, Connecticut State Police, Bethany Barracks, Bethany, Connecticut, furnished the New Haven Office with a postal card which had been received by the Connecticut State Police. This card appears to have been written by one JOSEPH MOSTECKI, Sheraton Biltmore Hotel, Providence, Rhode Island. The original of this card is enclosed for Boston.

The postal card supplied by Lieutenant WALTER FOLEY is described as follows:

During the conversation O'DOHERTY inquired regarding recent developments in Texas. PAYTON was reported to have stated "It is a good thing they got rid of him before we were implicated". In addition, PAYTON is alleged to have stated "Our next move will be to get behind them so we can overthrow JOHNSON". PAYTON is also alleged to have made the statement during the conversation, "It's a good thing they think of him as an ultra-leftist". PAYTON is also alleged to have asked O'DOHERTY "What about the reaction from Moscow?" In addition, O'DOHERTY reportedly asked PAYTON "What about RUBEN?"

Mr. WALTER WALLENMEYER, father of ELIZABETH
O'DOHERTY, telephonically contacted the Ft. Myers Resident
Agency on November 26, 1963, and requested that an agent
contact him.

WALLENMEYER was contacted on November 26, 1963, at his place of business, Carl's Drug Store, at which time he stated that his daughter, ELIZABETH/O'DOHERTY, had called him and his wife from Columbus, Ohio, on the night of November 25, 1963. He said that his daughter told him that her husband, VINCENT JOSEPH O'DOHERTY and his brother, EUGENE O'DOHERTY, had been picked up by the FBI for questioning concerning their knowledge of JACK RUBY.

WALLENMEYER stated that VINCENT O'DOHERTY came to
Evansville, Ill., from Chicago, Ill., where he met and married
ELIZABETH in 1957. He advised that VINCENT is an Irish alien 70 x 15
who has been in the United States for approximately ten years.
He further advised that both VINCENT and EUGENE were members 10 claimed of the IRA in Ireland. VINCENT has claimed that he was arrested in Ireland for murder, but they could not make the charge stick, and he was released. WALLENMEYER advised that VINCENT has never denied that he was guilty, only that they could not make the charge stick.

WALLENMEYER advised that his daughter has told him and his wife that EUGENE O DOHERTY has claimed he was the executioner for the IRA in Ireland. He said that he, EUGENE, delights in telling the children how he would track down informers, make them confess, and kill them.

WALLENMEYER advised his daughter told him that EUGENE from time to time had talked about the possibility of President KENNEDY's being assassinated. He advised that EUGENE has been living with his daughter and VINCENT since April of this year. He advised his daughter has told him that numerous unsavory men come to her home in Columbus looking for EUGENE. He said she also told him that EUGENE has stated that he has friends in Chicago, Ill., that will kill his brother JOHNO'DOHERTY when he is found. EUGENE is out all hours of the night, supposedly works, but place unknown to WALLENMEYER.

Perry Brobin Suriting, informed that he has known SUCKE for a number of years. He stated that SUCKE is considered an extremist in that he is very outspoken in his criticism of the United States Severement, particularly the Government stand on essauraism. He feels that the U.S. Government should take a stronger stand against combating communism. He. AVERS stated that SUCKE apparently has numerous followers and xeneives contributions from many people for his publication. Erecdom Views, " a weekly newspaper. Her AVERS stated that he (AVERS) does not agree with SUCKE and feels SUCKE is too extreme and inclined to call names without any basis.

District Director, Internal Revenue Service, Lowich Building, informed that he has known SUCKE for several years. He stated apparently SUCKE is a successful insurance man and spends a great deal of time in connection with his anti-communist work. He stated SUCKE is controversial in that SUCHE is northeadly criticizing the United States Government, particularly the present administration. SUCKE feels that the Government should do more in fighting communism. He stated SUCKE has a large following and many are prominent businessmen in Austin, Texas. Mr. PHINNITY stated that he has never heard anyone question SUCKE's the ractor or SUCKE's loyalty to the United States.

On Movember 3, 1982, Colonel HOMER GARRISON. Director, Makes Department of Public Safety, informed that he has known SUCKE for many years. He stated that he feels SUCKE is very sincere in his (SUCKE's) efforts to combat communica although he may be too extreme in his approach. He stated that SUCKE is regarded as a good citizen in Applia and never knew anyone to question SUCKE's character or SUCKE's loyalty to the United States.

On November 9, 1967, Mr. OTIS: CLAR, Intelligence Section, Texas Department of Public Safety, reviewed the

Views" is anti-communist and published by the Austin
Anti-Communism League with JACK H. SUCKE as Editor
and General Chairman.

I'r. CLAR stated that in November, 1961, the Austin Chamber of Commerce, Austin, Texas, protested that SUCKE had used the Chamber of Commerce membership list in promoting a speach by ROBERTHWELCH, Founder of the John Birch Society.

He stated that many prominent people are listed as supporters of the Austin Anti-Communism League. The CLAR stated that the records of the Intelligence Section reflect nothing unfavorable concerning SUCKE's character or his loyalty to the United States.

Killeen, Texas, advised that elephone number MErcury 4-2125 was the business telephone for the Killeen Daily Herald Newspaper and that a check of the telephone call log maintained by their office failed to reflect the record of any call having been received or made to Bellaire, Texas.
