ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT  
JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY,  
NOVEMBER 22, 1963, DALLAS, TEXAS

The President's Commission, by letter dated June 1, 1964, furnished the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Washington, D. C., a telegram dated May 22, 1964, forwarded to the President's Commission by the Department of Justice, which telegram was from FRANK C. AKERS, 4740 Richard, Fort Worth, Texas, which stated, "I wish to testify before Warren Commission."

The files of the Dallas Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation reflect that on November 13, 1963, FRANK AKERS, 4740 Richard, Fort Worth, Texas, appeared at the Fort Worth Resident Agency of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and was interviewed by a Special Agent. On that occasion, AKERS stated that he was employed as a civilian at the Army Reserve Headquarters in Fort Worth from November 1961, to January 1963, at which time he was discharged for inefficiency. He stated that in about December 1962, a fellow employee at the Army Reserve Center gave him a cup of coffee and, that after drinking some of this coffee, he became very weak. He stated he poured the rest of the coffee into a container and he exhibited same to the interviewing Agent at the time of this interview.

AKERS requested that the Federal Bureau of Investigation analyze the contents of the coffee. AKERS was advised that the Federal Bureau of Investigation had nothing to do with employer-employee relationships and that this was a matter that should be discussed with the Civil Service Commission and not the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

AKERS continued that he had held numerous jobs and had been fired from most of them. He stated that on most occasions he had made complaints about fellow employees or the quality of the work being performed by employees, and that the supervisors apparently did not appreciate his efforts.

From personal observation, the following description of AKERS was obtained:

On June 3, 1964, FRANK C. AKERS, 4740 Richard, Fort Worth, Texas, admitted sending a telegram to the Department of Justice in May 1964, stating that he wished to testify before the President's Commission. He stated that now he does not think he should have sent the telegram because he cannot furnish any information concerning the assassination of former President JOHN F. KENNEDY. He does not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY, and cannot furnish any information concerning OSWALD or RUBY.

AKERS stated that he sent the telegram because he wanted to discuss with the President's Commission the security aspects of the United States in general as it applies to both the civilian employees of the Government and military. AKERS said he has nothing specific, but from what he has seen as a former Government employee and the people with whom he has talked, it is his opinion that too many people in the Government are doing as they please and not doing the job they are hired to do.

He mentioned a recent newspaper article where a Houston, Texas, newspaper reporter allegedly purchased Government property stolen by servicemen.

AKERS is a veteran of World War II and was honorably discharged in 1945. [By his own admission, he has been an] alcoholic and member of the Alcoholics Anonymous for the past 13 years. In 1948 he received psychiatric treatment from the Veterans Administration for three or four months, and was diagnosed as a chronic alcoholic. He indicated he has been "dry" for the past 11 years.]

By his own admission, AKERS has a bad reputation in that he has lost several jobs and he admitted that he was at fault a lot of the time because he had a hot temper.

AKERS' last job was with the United States Army Reserve, 300th Aviation Company, Fort Worth, Texas, as a civilian employee. He was discharged approximately January 1, 1963, for not doing his job; specifically, his failure to order parts and inspect parachutes. He appealed his case and has heard nothing more.

AKERS said that another reason that he sent the telegram was because at his former employment with the Army Reserve he felt no attention was paid to security of the premises, such as allowing unauthorized persons to have access to the premises, to come and go as they please.

AKERS advised that he had previously contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation regarding what he believed were certain irregularities at his former employment, the Army Reserve.

On 5/12/64, Mr. J. Lee Rankin, General Counsel of the President's Commission, requested by letter that the cartridge cases C6, C7 and C38 recovered from the Texas School Book Depository be examined for loading, chambering, extraction and/or ejection marks. On 5/15/64, Mr. Melvin Eisenberg, staff member, orally requested that the aforementioned cartridge cases as well as the C8 cartridge found in the assassination weapon (C14) be examined to determine if they had been loaded into and extracted from the C14 rifle more than once. Mr. Eisenberg advised that this type of examination was actually meant in Rankin's letter of 5/12/64. As a result of the examinations conducted on these items in the Laboratory the following results were obtained and are set forth below:

Marks were found on the C6 cartridge case indicating that it has been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least three times. One set of marks was identified as having been made by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle. It is pointed out that the extractor and ejector marks on C6 as well as on C7, C8 and C38 did not possess sufficient characteristics for identifying the weapon which produced them. There are also three sets of marks on the base of this cartridge case which were not found on C7, C8, C38 or any of the numerous tests obtained from the C14 rifle. It was not possible to determine what produced these marks.

Marks were found on the C7 cartridge case indicating that it has been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least twice. One set of marks was identified as having been produced by the chamber of the C14 rifle and one set of marks was identified as having been produced by contact with the bolt of C14; however, it was not possible to determine whether the two sets of marks which were identified were produced by one ~~REC~~ loading operations in the C14 rifle.

Two sets of marks were found on the C8 cartridge (found in the C14 rifle) which were identified as having been produced by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle. Another set of follower marks was found on C8. The fragmentary nature of this set of marks could possibly account for the fact that these marks were not identified with the C14 rifle.

Marks were found on the C38 cartridge case indicating that it had been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least twice. One set of marks was identified as having been produced by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle and one set of marks was identified as having been produced by the chamber of C14; however, it was not possible to determine whether the two sets of marks which were identified were produced by one or two loading operations, in the C14 rifle.

The results of the above examinations do not preclude the possibility that these items could have been loaded into and extracted from a weapon one or more times when insufficient force was used to produce marks. It is pointed out that if two or more cartridges are loaded into the clip of C14, only the bottom cartridge will be marked by the magazine follower.

Dallas is being furnished the results of these examinations.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the attached letter to Mr. J. Lee Rankin be furnished to the Commission.

Mr. Melvin Eisenberg of The President's Commission telephonically advised SA Lyndal L. Shaneyfelt today, 6/5/64, that he would like for Shaneyfelt to obtain the following items for Laboratory comparison:

The above magazine and newspapers and Commission Exhibits all relate to the photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald holding the rifle that has been widely publicized. Mr. Eisenberg requested that SA Shaneyfelt make a comparison of the photograph of Oswald holding the rifle with the reproductions in the publications and be prepared to furnish a deposition at the Commission on Friday, June 14, 1964.

RECOMMENDATION: (1) That SA Shaneyfelt obtain the desired material and make the examination.

(2) That the Commission be advised by letter of the results of the examination.

(3) That SA Shaneyfelt furnish a deposition at the Commission on 6/14/64, as requested.

and published on February 10, 1964. This may be the story which Mark Lane claimed, as reported in the "National Guardian" on May 9, 1964, was planted by the United States Secret Service. (See my letter to you dated May 13, 1964.)

For your further information Inspector Thomas J. Kelley, United States Secret Service, has advised that the report of Special Agent James M. Howard, United States Secret Service, dated February 12, 1964, captioned "Assassination of President Kennedy (Protection of Marguerite Oswald)," number 1161, which was furnished you by the Secret Service, contains some further data about the trip Thayer Waldo made with Special Agent Howard on February 9, 1964.

No further investigation is being made in this matter in the absence of a specific request from you.

NOTE:

Thayer Waldo accompanied the two Howard brothers and Mrs. Marguerite Oswald from Mrs. Oswald's home to the airport in Dallas on 2/9/64. Waldo's presence was at the specific request of Mark Lane and Mrs. Oswald. The two Howard brothers gave him a ride back from the airport after Mrs. Oswald boarded the airplane. On the way back there was some conversation about a Negro who allegedly witnessed Oswald shooting at President Kennedy. According to the Howard brothers, whose interviews are reported in the enclosures, they never indicated that this Negro male had actually been a witness to anyone shooting at the President and the conversation was in a joking and jesting manner. They pointed out that Waldo, who was in the back seat, apparently misunderstood the entire conversation. The next day Waldo wrote a story in the newspaper about a witness being held by authorities who actually saw Oswald shooting. In May, 1964, the "National Guardian" published

an article wherein it was reported that Mark Lane claimed that the Secret Service had deliberately planted a false story in the press to pass further guilt on Oswald. This article named the Howard brothers and Waldo and the story spoken of was apparently written by Waldo. The interesting thing about this situation is that the story which Lane claimed was planted by the Secret Service was the same story written by Waldo, who was Lane's man. The unfortunate thing about the situation was that the two Howard brothers were not more guarded in their conversation in the presence of Waldo. By separate letter we are disseminating our memorandum of 6/5/64 to Secret Service for its information as to Waldo's version of the conversation with the Howard brothers.

Reurairtel 3-23-64, captioned "Assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 11-22-63, Dallas, Texas, Miscellaneous - Information Concerning," (RPG/ds) concerning a question from the President's Commission as to whether elimination prints had been taken of employees of the Texas School Book Depository Building (TSBD).

Enclosed for your assistance is a copy of a self-explanatory letter from the President's Commission dated 6-9-64, and a copy of Bureau letter dated 3-30-64, which is referred to in the current Commission letter.

As you will note, Identification Division records were checked to locate fingerprints, based on descriptive data available at the Bureau, of those employees known to have been at the TSBD on 11-22-63. It was necessary for the Bureau to qualify its reply to the Commission on the 16 identification records located with the statement "who may be identical with employees" of the TSBD.

The only apparent logical method to comply with the Commission's most recent request and to preclude later questions in this matter from the Commission, would be to take major case prints of all employees of the TSBD.

Dallas should immediately endeavor to obtain major case prints of all TSBD employees known to have been in the

building on 11-22-63, and furnish same to the Bureau, Attention: Identification Division.

Extreme care should be exercised to take clear, classifiable prints which will be compared with the 19 identifiable latent fingerprints and 6 identifiable latent palm prints found on cartons near the sixth floor window of the TSBD. It may be necessary to furnish these major case prints or copies thereof to the Commission for its use. Therefore, all necessary identifying and descriptive data should be appropriately executed.

You should also submit an appropriate letterhead memorandum for dissemination to the Commission indicating the identities of the persons printed, as well as indicating the date when each was printed by your office.

This matter should be expedited and every effort made to complete this project and have the major case prints at the Bureau on or before 6-18-64. The results of the Identification Divisions comparison of these prints with the latent palm and fingerprints will be furnished to the Commission and your office.

When the major case prints are received from Dallas it is requested that they be appropriately compared with the latent palm and fingerprints in this matter and the results furnished to the General Investigation Division, Attention: R. D. Rogge.

NOTE: The Commission by letter 3-26-64, initially requested we endeavor to identify the individuals who left latent prints on the afore-mentioned cartons. The Commission requested we undertake this project "without" taking any fingerprints. The most recent request will require the taking of approximately 70 major case prints of employees of the TSBD. This appears to be the most logical method of complying with the Commissions request. This matter will be closely followed and when the results are obtained, the Commission will be appropriately notified.

The above items were examined, as requested, in order to determine whether or not the photographs in the various publications originated from the photograph of Oswald holding the rifle, Commission Exhibit 133. It was not possible to positively associate these photographs since the photographs in the publications are reproductions by a halftone process, normal to such reproductions, and do not contain as much detail as the photographs from which the engraved halftone plates were made. In addition, this loss of detail tends to conceal retouching that is normally placed on photographs for the purpose of intensifying details that would otherwise be lost in the engraving process. However, a comparison of the photograph which is a part of Commission Exhibit 133 with the photographs and reproductions, described above, shows that all of the photographs and reproductions are consistent in all general characteristics, except for some variations that appear to be retouching. Such retouching would have been placed on the photographs for retention of detail in the engraving process. It is noted that no characteristics were found that would suggest that the photographs and reproductions of photographs, described above, originated from other than the photograph that is a part of Commission Exhibit 133 or a duplicate print of that photograph.

As requested in your letter dated June 9, 1964, Special Agent Lyndal L. Shaneyfelt will appear at the Commission on June 12, 1964, at 3:30 P.M. to furnish a deposition relative to the above examination.

You should also submit an appropriate letterhead memorandum for dissemination to the Commission indicating the identities of the persons pressed, as well as indicating the date when each was printed by your office.

This matter should be expedited and every effort made to complete this project and have the major case prints at the Bureau on or before 5-13-64. The results of the Identification Division's comparison of these prints with the latent palm and fingerprints will be furnished to the Commission and your office.

When the major case prints are received from Dallas it is requested that they be appropriately compared with the latent palm and fingerprints in this matter and the results furnished to the General Investigation Division, Attention: R. D. Rogge.

The Commission requested we undertake this project "without" taking any fingerprints. The next recd. request will require the taking of approximately 70 major case prints of employees of the TSN. This appears to be the most logical method of complying with the Commission's request. This matter will be closely followed and when the results are obtained, the Commission will be appropriately notified.

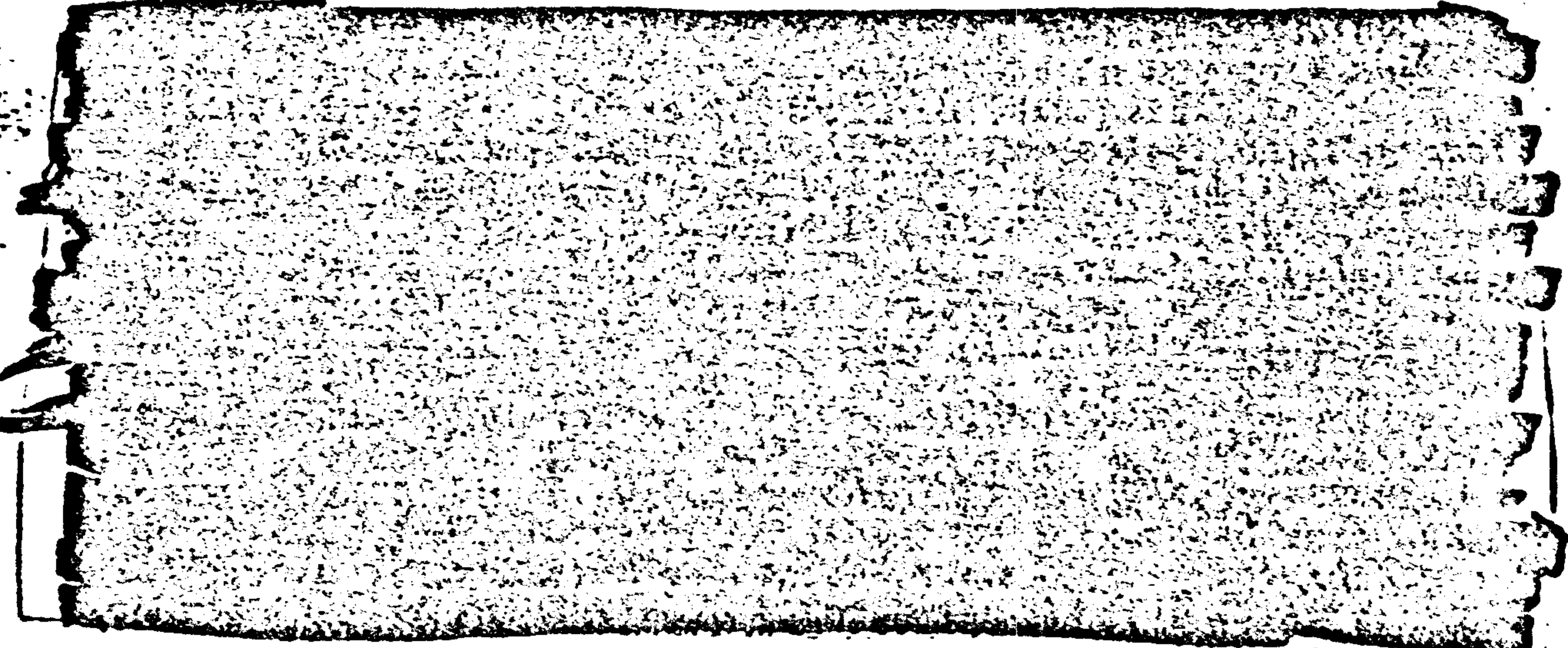

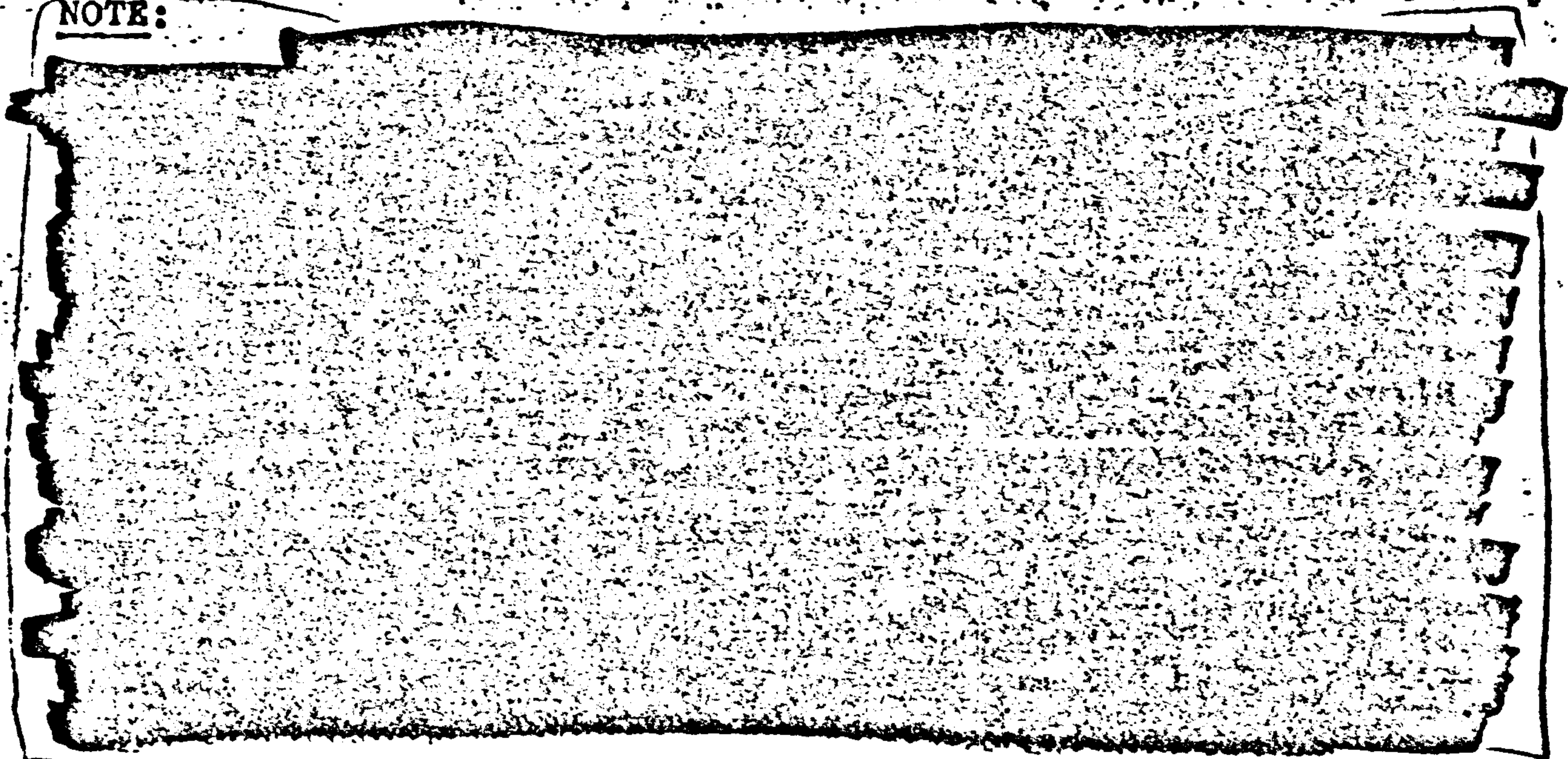

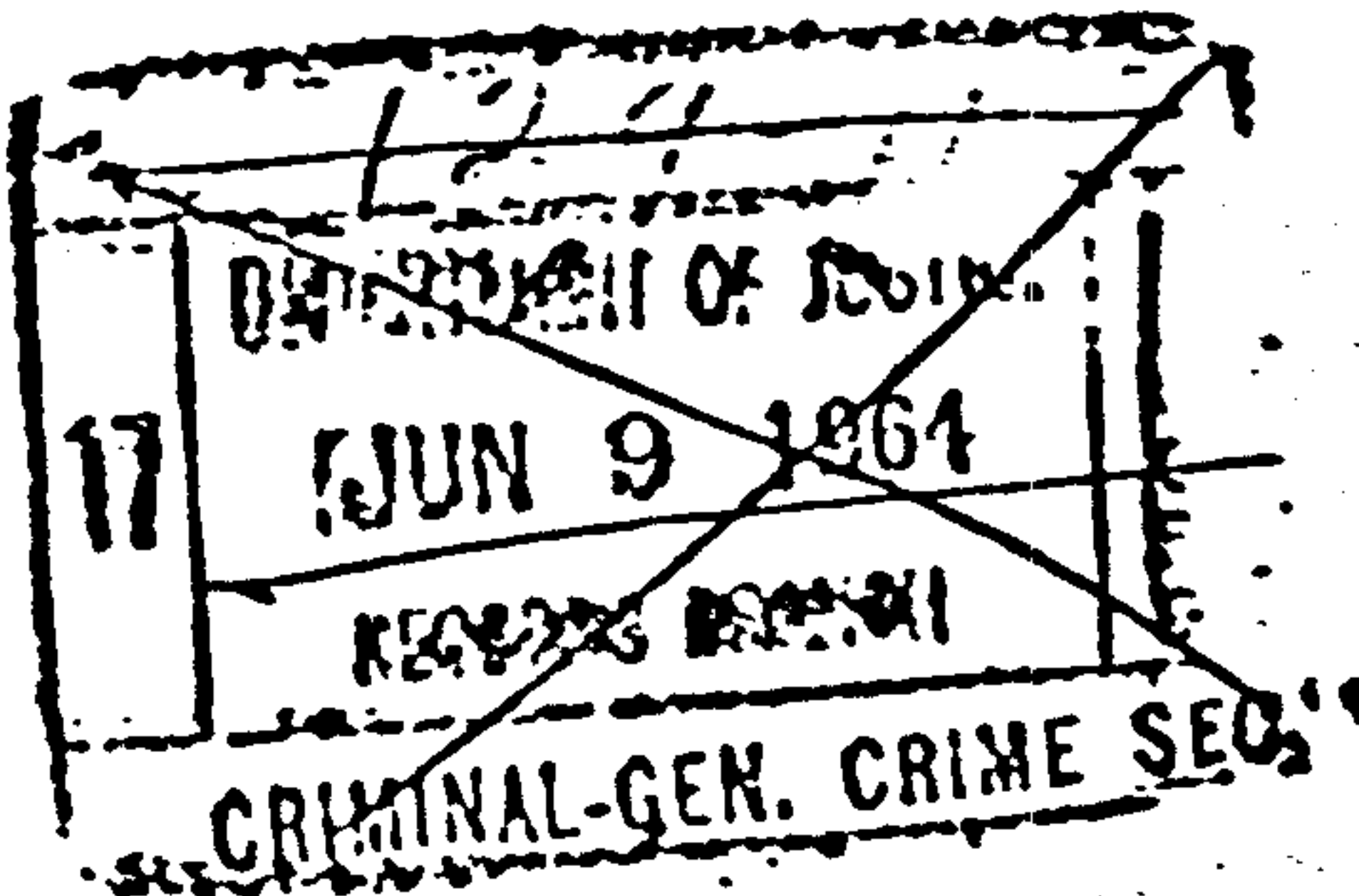

In accordance with instructions of President Johnson, the FBI has conducted an investigation regarding the assassination of President Kennedy and related events. The information developed has been forwarded to the Presidential Commission and it will be the responsibility of the Commission to determine what data should be made public.
