As it appears there is some question as to the complainant's mental stability, the complainant should be interviewed thoroughly and in addition, any information regarding instability should be obtained either from your files or other sources. You should conduct all logical investigation to completely resolve this matter. The results of your inquiries are to be incorporated into an insert under the assassination caption and the contents of E. Williams' letter should also be included and furnished to Dallas for inclusion in a report. This report will be disseminated to the President's Commission and Secret Service Headquarters. Therefore, insure that your communications are accurate to preclude revisions or corrections at the Bureau. It is anticipated the Commission is in the process of concluding their investigation regarding the assassination and all leads are to be handled expeditiously.

NOTE:

The letter from the complainant was furnished to us by the Department by routing slip on June 26, 1964. The complainant's letter to the Attorney General states "I am to blame for your thinking I was involved in the assassination of President Kennedy." Complainant makes allegations that James T. Braye is an Agent who was allegedly involved in the assassination along with his wife. The complainant also makes allegations to the effect that she was not romantically involved with President Kennedy. In addition WFO on 6-30-64, received a long distance call from Mrs. James R. (Eugenia) Black nee Williams regarding the same information and from the conversation it appeared the complainant was mentally disturbed. ~~Upon receipt of Mobile investigation, the results will be furnished to Secret Service Headquarters along with a copy of the letter received from the Department. Results will be in report disseminated to President's Commission & Secret Service Headquarters.~~

On 6/30/64, SA HENRY C. HARDY received a long-distance telephone call at WFO from captioned complainant who furnished the following information:

Complainant, who resides at 807 Washington Avenue, Tuskegee Institute, Alabama, telephone number 727-1793, advised that the wife of SA JAMES T. DRAYE, 1701 Patterson Street, Tuskegee Institute, Alabama, had admitted to her in November, 1963, that she, Mrs. DRAYE, had planned the assassination of President KENNEDY and that she had done so to make it appear her brother-in-law, Dr. EDWARD T. DRAYE, also of Tuskegee Institute, had been the assassin. SA DRAYE also admitted this to the complainant but advised her that in order not to lose his wife, he had covered up all the evidence of this plot and had intercepted all of the complainant's letters to the FBI.

Complainant said Mrs. DRAYE was a nurse and worked either at the John Andrew Hospital or the Veterans Administration Hospital, both in Tuskegee Institute.

For information of Dallas and Albany, OLIVE STEVENS, aka Mrs. STEWART STEVENS, recently returned to 2 Park Avenue, NYC, was interviewed by SA J. WILLIAM LOVE on 4/10/64, at which time STEVENS advised she had been previously residing on a temporary basis at Hidden Lake Lodge, located at Marlboro, Vermont, and also with her son, an attorney, JOHN STUART BURGESS, 67 Main Street, Brattleboro, Vermont. STEVENS advised she also maintains a residence at Tucson, Arizona, and from 4/29/64 through 9/64, will be residing at the Lonsdale Hotel, Tunbridge Wells, Kent, England.

STEVENS was found to be very friendly, cooperative, elderly, slightly arthritic, extremely wealthy, alert and indicated that if she had any information of value in her possession, she personally would have contacted the Bureau and furnished same herself. STEVENS stated, in effect, she had no specific details or names and the information was mostly her own opinions based on general conversations she had heard in the Arizona and Texas area prior to the assassination.

For additional information of Dallas, STEVENS advised she had been well acquainted with the KENNEDY family, exhibited a note recently received from JACQUELINE KENNEDY, indicated she had had lunch with the late President on one occasion in Rome, and it appears the official of the British Government agency referred to in the Phoenix teletype, may actually be JOSEPH C. HARSCH, Chief European correspondent for the National Broadcasting Company in London with whom she is personally acquainted and had contacted after the assassination as set forth in the enclosed FD 302. NY will conduct no further investigation regarding this matter.

Date 4/10/64

Mrs. OLIVE STEVENS advised on April 10, 1964 that prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY she had resided in Tuscon, Arizona, where she had many wealthy friends and acquaintances, and was frequently invited and attended social functions, parties and picnics, in the Tuscon, Arizona, and Texas areas, which were also attended by extremely wealthy Texas and Arizona ranchers and businessmen. STEVENS stated many of the above ranchers and businessmen, specific names, dates and locations, too numerous to recall, were fiercely interested in politics in general, and intensely critical of the then KENNEDY Administration. STEVENS stated she often heard such statements as the "US is being ruined by the Kennedy Government", of the "US would be better off if Kennedy were dead," and STEVENS indicated many such conversations were, in her opinion, obviously from men who were members or were speaking the thinking of the extreme rightist organization, the John Birch Society.

STEVENS stated that about the time of the assassination, she telephonically contacted a friend, Dr. A. JAMES FILMORE, in Tuscon, Arizona, who had many wealthy patients and friends, such as herself; to warn or caution him not to become involved with any of the John Birch Society members, since such thinking of the type she had heard while living there was not American or patriotic.

STEVENS stated she attended a special history class at the University of Arizona prior to moving to the New York City area, and has taken short courses or classes in history at many different universities since she thoroughly enjoys the subject, and she does not recall any specific professors, regardless of their field, but she has never met or been acquainted with any British Government investigators.

STEVENS advised that at the time of the assassination, she also telephonically contacted in London, England, JOSEPH C. HARSCH, Chief European Correspondent for the National Broadcasting Company, and they had a lengthy conversation concerning the assassination, the attitudes, and violent type expressions of criticism toward President KENNEDY and the KENNEDY Administration voiced by many of the wealthy Texas and Arizona residents.

STEVENS stated her contact with HARSCH is based on friendship and the fact she, herself, had also worked for short periods of time on one or two occasions as a foreign correspondent.

STEVENS stated she subsequently telephonically contacted and was contacted by HARSCH on one or two occasions concerning the assassination, but the conversations were general in nature, and merely an exchange of thoughts or opinions without any foundation in fact beyond what they had learned from the various news media.

On November 24, 1963 the Phoenix Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) was telephonically contacted by Doctor A. JAMES FILMORE, a physician in that city who advised that he had been in telephonic communication with Miss OLIVE STEVENS, telephone area code 212 #GR-7-5298, who indicated she was calling from Vermont, exact location not given. STEVENS indicated she was residing with her son, an attorney, and FILMORE believed she was living near or at a place called Hidden Lake Lodge.

FILMORE stated STEVENS had indicated she had been in contact with some University Professors of Law who were allegedly in contact with some officials of a "British Government Detective Agency" and STEVENS further indicated that according to her sources, certain politicians in Arizona, associated with the John Birch Society, had very definite connections with the assassination of President KENNEDY.

On April 10, 1964, Mrs. OLIVE STEVENS, 2 Park Avenue, New York City, telephone number GR 7-5298, advised SA J. WILLIAM LOVE she moved to the above address from Tucson, Arizona, during November of 1963, but has been residing temporarily at Hidden Lake Lodge, Marlboro, Vermont, and also with her son, JOHN STUAR<sup>W</sup> BURGESS, 67 Main Street, Brattleboro, Vermont, and only recently returned to New York City. Mrs. STEVENS was thereafter interviewed and furnished the following information.

On 6/26/64 JESSE CANFIELD, 203 Jefferson Street, Villa Grove, Illinois, advised as follows:

About the middle of summer, 1963, CANFIELD's son, MAJOR GEORGE CANFIELD, who is commonly known as GEORGE CANFIELD, age 46, and a retired Sergeant from the United States Air Force, came to Villa Grove, Illinois, for a visit.

from his home in Arizona. Mr. CANFIELD, who appears to be approximately 75 years of age, could not recall where his son had been living in Arizona, but believed it to be either Yuma or Tucson. CANFIELD said that his son told him of having met a mining engineer and prospector who could "do wonders" in locating minerals, oil, and water with electronic gadgets. CANFIELD said during the latter part of the summer his son, GEORGE CANFIELD, bought a new Chevrolet pickup truck at Villa Grove, Illinois, and went to Arizona; and, after being gone approximately two weeks, he returned with this individual, whom he introduced as ARTHUR IMHOFF. CANFIELD said that his son and IMHOFF worked together for several weeks in central Illinois and made two or three trips to the West and back to Villa Grove, during which time they were supposed to be prospecting for oil and other minerals. CANFIELD said that during this time his son accumulated considerable indebtedness, and IMHOFF was unsuccessful in locating any oil in Illinois. CANFIELD said that some time late in the fall of 1963 his son, GEORGE CANFIELD, drove IMHOFF back to Arizona, or somewhere in the West, and returned to Villa Grove in a few days and surrendered the truck to the Chevrolet garage at Villa Grove because he was unable to continue payments.

JESSE CANFIELD was unable to fix the date of IMHOFF's departure from Villa Grove and could recall no association between IMHOFF's presence at Villa Grove and news of the assassination of President KENNEDY. CANFIELD stated that he could not definitely recall where he was on that date or when he heard this news.

CANFIELD stated that his son, GEORGE CANFIELD, is presently working for "PETE" CHAMBERS, who runs the Chevrolet garage in Villa Grove, Illinois, and is living on CHAMBERS' farm somewhere in Arkansas, but he does not know the address. He said that his son is working for CHAMBERS to help pay off his indebtedness in regard to purchase of the truck and that CHAMBERS would be able to remember more details as to the visit of IMHOFF at Villa Grove.

Illinois, and the time of departure, since he had considerable contact with GEORGE CANFIELD and IMHOFF during this time.

On 6/26/64 DARWIN "PETE" CHAMBERS, who owns and operates Chambers Chevrolet Company, Villa Grove, Illinois, advised that GEORGE CANFIELD, whose full name is MAJOR GEORGE CANFIELD, is presently residing on a farm owned by him (CHAMBERS) on R. R. #2, Okalona, Arkansas. CHAMBERS said that this is a 650-acre farm known as the Keys Farm, approximately four miles north of Okalona, Arkansas.

CHAMBERS stated that he became acquainted with ARTHUR IMHOFF when IMHOFF was brought to Villa Grove, Illinois, about the middle of September, 1963, by GEORGE CANFIELD. CHAMBERS said that CANFIELD purchased a three-quarter ton Chevrolet pickup truck on 8/15/63 and drove the truck to Arizona and returned about a month later with IMHOFF. CHAMBERS verified the date of sale of the truck from records and also noted that these records show an address for GEORGE CANFIELD during the time he was gone from Villa Grove as 18 East 14th Street, Tucson, Arizona, telephone number MAIN 4-4034.

CHAMBERS said that GEORGE CANFIELD and IMHOFF made about three trips to the West, presumably to Colorado and Nevada, after they first came to Villa Grove together in about the middle of September, 1963. He said that IMHOFF was reportedly a mining engineer and prospector and had an electronic gadget which he used in attempting to locate oil and underground streams in the vicinity of Villa Grove, Illinois. According to CHAMBERS, IMHOFF was not successful in locating a single underground stream for water wells and apparently located no oil deposits.

CHAMBERS stated that he could not definitely recall when IMHOFF left Villa Grove the last time, but recalls that it was quite cold and probably about the last of November, 1963. He said that when IMHOFF and CANFIELD were unsuccessful in their explorations, CANFIELD

could not make payments on the truck; and, IMHOFF decided to return to either Nevada or Arizona. He said that CANFIELD drove the truck and took IMHOFF West and returned in about 10 days or two weeks and surrendered the truck. He stated that he has no records as to the date the truck was finally surrendered by CANFIELD to him (CHAMBERS) at Villa Grove.

CHAMBERS said that he could not definitely fix the date of IMHOFF's departure from Villa Grove in regard to the date of the assassination of President KENNEDY; however, he feels quite certain that GEORGE CANFIELD was at Villa Grove during this time, because as he recalls CANFIELD watched television in CHAMBERS' apartment on the day of President KENNEDY's funeral.

In regard to the "electronic gadget" which IMHOFF had in his possession, CHAMBERS said that he recalls IMHOFF having made the statement that this gadget had been used in police work and said that he could trace an individual across town by placing a hair, from the head of the individual whom he wanted to trail, in the machine. He said IMHOFF did not perform this experiment in his presence.

The Little Rock Division will attempt to locate GEORGE CANFIELD on the Keys Farm, which is presently owned by "PETE" CHAMBERS, R. R. #2, approximately four miles north of Okalona, Arkansas, and interview CANFIELD for details of his association and trips with IMHOFF during the fall of 1963 and particularly to determine if IMHOFF was at Villa Grove, Illinois, with CANFIELD on the date of the assassination of President KENNEDY. If not, will attempt to fix the exact date when he and IMHOFF left Villa Grove, Illinois, and details of their itinerary which might assist in determining the actual whereabouts of IMHOFF on the date of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

License OPK-662. He stated that at approximately 11:30 A.M.,  
November 22, 1963, he left work at General Dynamics, Fort  
Worth, Texas, to go to lunch with three fellow employees,  
FRED W. MEYER, SUE MINYARD and MIKE QUEEN, and was driving the  
1958 Lincoln. As they left the parking lot at General  
Dynamics, they noticed the Presidential plane taxiing along  
the runway and stopped along the fence for approximately two  
to three minutes to observe the plane and then proceeded to  
lunch.

# Memorandum

Mr. Norman Redlich of the President's Commission telephoned today and advised that he had before him a draft of an article to be published by the "Readers Digest" in the near future which included the use of neutron activation analyses on the paraffin casts taken of Oswald's cheek and hand for gunpowder residues.

He advised that he knew that the FBI Laboratory had sent a letter to the Commission covering the results of work that the Laboratory had done in this matter but he could not find it at that time. I provided him with the date of the letter and read it to him upon his request.

This letter, dated 3/10/64, advised that the paraffin casts from Oswald were examined by neutron activation analyses at the Oak Ridge National Laboratories, Research Reactor Site, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, and that the analyses were made to determine if the casts bore any primer deposits from the rifle cartridge cases found in the Dallas School Book Depository Building following the President's assassination. The letter advised in essence that the deposits found on the paraffin casts of the hand and cheek of Oswald could not be specifically associated with the rifle cartridges since the same elements were found in residues both from the rifle cartridge cases and the revolver cartridge cases which were fired from Oswald's revolver reportedly between the time of the assassination and the time of his apprehension. In view of the fact that the paraffin casts were not made until after the reported firing and handling of the revolver, no significance could be attached to the residues found on the casts other than the conclusion that barium and antimony (the elements found in the residues) are present in amounts greater than would be expected to be found on the hands of an individual who has not recently handled a fired weapon.

As previously reported to the Commission, certain small lead metal fragments uncovered in connection with this matter were analyzed spectrographically to determine whether they could be associated with one or more of the lead bullet fragments and no significant differences were found within the sensitivity of the spectrographic method.

Because of the higher sensitivity of the neutron activation analysis, certain of the small lead fragments were then subjected to neutron activation analyses and comparisons with the larger bullet fragments. The items analyzed included the following: C1 - bullet from stretcher; C2 - fragment from front seat cushion; C4 and C5 - metal fragments from President Kennedy's head; C9 - metal fragment from the arm of Governor Connally; C16 - metal fragments from rear floor board carpet of the car.

While minor variations in composition were found by this method, these were not considered sufficient to permit positively differentiating among the larger bullet fragments and thus positively determining from which of the larger bullet fragments any given small lead fragment may have come.

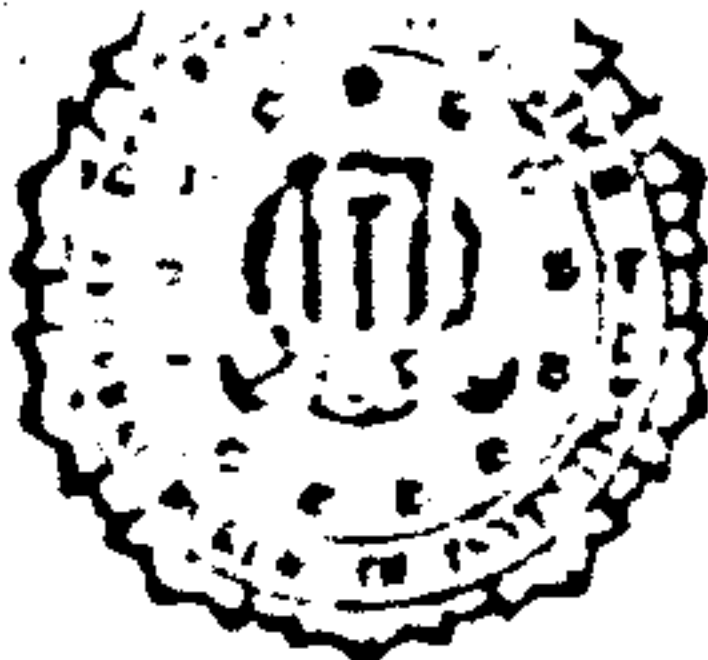

Noe, Dallas, Texas; Pat Malloy, an attorney, Tulsa, Oklahoma; and Albert James Turinsky, Dallas, Texas.

Records of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and examination of records of public source on June 24 and 25, 1964, disclosed the following information concerning Pat M. Malloy, Jr., identified as the Malloy in question, and Albert James Turinsky:

Malloy, Jr., has engaged in private law practice at Tulsa, Oklahoma, for many years. Born on January 6, 1916, at Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Pat Malloy, Sr., and Lenore H. Malloy, Mr. Malloy has pursued the profession which was that of his father, with admission to the Oklahoma State Bar in 1939. Pat Malloy, Sr. was an attorney who had served as Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, U. S. Department of Justice, during the

first administration of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. He had served from June to September, 1933. Mr. Malloy, Sr. died on January 31, 1934, at El Dorado, Arkansas, at the age of 49.

Active in civic and political affairs at Tulsa, Oklahoma, Pat Malloy, Jr., in January, 1962, was appointed to the position of Regional Solicitor, United States Department of Interior, at Tulsa, Oklahoma. Mr. Malloy continued in his private law practice, the appointment being on a part-time basis. On May 13, 1964, he resigned this position in order to campaign for Oklahoma Senator J. Howard Edmondson.

In November, 1963, after the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Malloy was quoted in these newspapers as saying that he felt a great personal loss. He was personally acquainted with President Kennedy, having met him in 1958, when Kennedy visited Tulsa. Malloy then was the Tulsa County Chairman of the Kennedy Presidential Campaign.

On June 24, 1964, [redacted] Credit Bureau of Tulsa, 611 South Detroit, Tulsa, Oklahoma, advised that records of that office pertaining to Pat M. Malloy, Jr., 2632 South Columbia Place, Tulsa, Oklahoma, disclosed a report dated April 2, 1964, prepared for New York City, New York. In this report, Mr. Malloy was shown to have been of record with the credit bureau at Tulsa since March 27, 1940, a practicing attorney since 1942, at Tulsa, Oklahoma. His wife was listed as Coleene Malloy. His accounts were listed as [redacted]
