Investigation in this matter was predicated on advice from ROBERT OLIVER, Chief of Police, McAlester, Oklahoma, who advised SA HENRY B. LOWREY on December 19, 1963, concerning a letter received by Governor JOHN CONNALLY of Texas, postmarked at McAlester, Oklahoma.

At McAlester, Oklahoma

On December 19, 1963, ROBERT OLIVER, Chief of Police, McAlester, Oklahoma, advised SA HENRY B. LOWREY he had received a telephone call from one OTIS KLAR of the Department of Public Safety, Austin, Texas, informing OLIVER the Texas Department of Public Safety had information a letter had been received in Texas threatening the life of the Texas Governor, JOHN CONNALLY, and the letter was postmarked at McAlester, Oklahoma, signed B. J. JAMES, General Delivery, McAlester, Oklahoma. OLIVER advised Mr. KLAR had requested investigation by the McAlester Police Department to determine the identity of B. J. JAMES.

On December 19, 1963, SA HENRY B. LOWREY established through a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, that one B. J. JAMES was known to have received mail in care of General Delivery, McAlester, Oklahoma, although the last several letters had been returned to the sender as unclaimed.

On December 19, 1963, an examination of the records of the Credit Bureau, Police Department, Sheriff's Office, and utility companies, as well as a review of city and telephone directories, McAlester, Oklahoma, failed to disclose the names of B. J. JAMES or ELDRIDGE SOLOMON PRICE. PRICE was reported as an individual who had used the name B. J. JAMES in the past.

Concerning ELDRIDGE SOLOMON PRICE, FBI No. 451137, on December 19, 1963, SAC LEE O. TEAGUE called the San Antonio FBI Office during which conversation he was advised by SAC JAMES COLE of the use of the name B. J. JAMES by PRICE, who was described as a white male between the ages of 61 and 74. The records at San Antonio did not

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indicate however that PRICE ever had been in the area of McAlester, Oklahoma.

Investigation by SA HENRY B. LOWREY on December 19, 1963, identified one BILLY RAY JAMES at Hartshorn, Oklahoma. BILLY RAY JAMES, male, aged 18, a service station employee, advised SA HENRY B. LOWREY he had never maintained a mailing address in care of General Delivery, McAlester, Oklahoma, and he denied authorship of the letter.

O. NEWT HUMPHREYS, Chief, Internal Security Division, Texas Department of Public Safety, Austin, Texas, made available a typewritten letter dated December 12, 1963, addressed to JOHN CONNALLY, Governor of Texas, Austin, Texas, postmarked McAlester, Oklahoma, December 16, 1963, 4:00 p.m. unsigned but bearing typewritten initials "BRJ".

The envelope bore a typed return address, "B.J. JAMES, General Delivery, McAlester, Oklahoma."

HUMPHREYS advised that the above letter was turned over to his office as a "crank letter" by the Governor's Office and inquiry through Chief of Police, McAlester, Oklahoma, failed to identify B. J. JAMES or B. R. JAMES and Texas Department of Public Safety was unable to identify same from available information. The letter reads as follows:

"December 12, 1963, Honorable JOHN CONNALLY, Governor, State of Texas, Austin, Texas.
Dear Governor CONNALLY, LYNDON JOHNSON was desperate to be President of the United States and Major EDWIN A. WALKER is desperate to be Governor of the State of Texas. What were these men's chances to achieve their ambition with JOHN F. KENNEDY and JOHN CONNALLY alive --- So they began early in 1963 to plan the assassination of YOU and President KENNEDY. It was understood that Mr. JOHNSON would immediately take over the duties as President of the U.S. and be in a position to direct all investigations into the assassinations; as has been the case thus far. Following a closeout of investigations Mr. JOHNSON was to begin using his influence as President to aid Major WALKER's bid for Governor of Texas during the next election in Texas.

"Trace all LEADS - Major WALKER had his house fired into early in the year. Mr. JOHNSON had a private

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Interview filmed of himself in which he stated how happy he was as Vice President. At the same time it had been hinted that Mr. JOHNSON might be dropped from the Democratic ticket as President KENNEDY's running mate in 1964. Mr. JOHNSON remembered what happened to JACK GARNER and HENRY WALLACE. Hence they began the plans for the double assassination.

"You will note that Major WALKER has been a frequent visitor to New Orleans, the place where OSWALD has lived until it was announced that President KENNEDY was coming to Texas. (Who arranged this Texas trip for the President?) Who secured this job for OSWALD in this PARTICULAR building? Whose STATION wagon from Texas had transported OSWALD to and from New Orleans? Who arranged the parade in Dallas? Who designated this particular STREET at this PARTICULAR hour? Why was Mr. JOHNSON's car arranged so far from the President's car? Why the Governor, President and Vice President were not riding together in the same car and their wives in another. Why did Major WALKER leave town at the time of the President's visit? Why the Police of Dallas didn't offer you, the President and OSWALD any more protection than a BOY SCOUT PATROL of three boys with hand axes? Why was the LADY judge so handy for swearing Mr. JOHNSON in as President? Pen her in for information. Why was she so well prepared to go on the plane? Whose Bible was used? Why nothing has been said about her since? Why Mr. JOHNSON didn't let Mr. HOOVER and the FBI complete the investigation? Why bring Justice WARREN into the picture? Mr. JOHNSON knows that Justice WARREN is not going into the South to gather information about President KENNEDY's assassination. Mr. JOHNSON knows that Judge WARREN is not well favored by the leading politicians of the South. Mr. JOHNSON knows that the people in authority in the South are not going to give Judge WARREN much information about the assassination of President KENNEDY.

"Why is Mr. JOHNSON shielding his girls with so much protection? (He is afraid someone will get information from them about the assassination).

Mr. OLIVER advised he has handwriting samples by JAMES which would be made available if needed for identification purposes. JAMES, he said, is now retired, and frequents the many domino parlors in McAlester. He has been known to make some illegal whisky.

CARL F. ZARTER, Administrative Assistant, United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, on January 6, 1964, advised IC LEONARD L. AYRES as follows:

ELDRIDGE S. PRICE was first committed to the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, under No. 51622, on September 21, 1937, and conditionally released on September 2, 1938. PRICE was serving a 13 month sentence from the Northern District of Texas, Dallas, Texas, for "Customs Act - Evading Income Tax."

ELDRIDGE SOLOMON PRICE was again committed to the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, under No. 77362-L, on January 24, 1960, to serve a seven-year sentence from the Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta, imposed November 22, 1957, for "PO: Mail Fraud."

ZARTER advised that PRICE and the United States Penitentiary file pertaining to PRICE were transferred to the Federal Correctional Institution at Seagoville, Texas, on November 12, 1962.

On January 6, 1964, the records of the FBI Identification Division, Washington, D. C., indicate ELDRIDGE SOLOMON PRICE, FBI No. 451137, was received at the Federal Penitentiary, Leavenworth, on January 24, 1960, to commence serving a seven year sentence. These records further indicate he was transferred to the Federal Correctional Institution, Seagoville, Texas, on November 13, 1962. Identification records do not indicate if PRICE is still incarcerated.

On November 22, 1957, PRICE was sentenced to seven years in the custody of the Attorney General by U. S. District Judge FRANK A. HOOPER in Georgia.

On January 22, 1960, PRICE was removed from the El Paso County Jail, El Paso, Texas, by the U. S. Marshal en route to the Federal Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas.

A review of the files did not reveal whether or not PRICE was in custody. PRICE is known from available information to have threatened people on several occasions.

ELDRIDGE SOLOMON PRICE was located at the Federal Correctional Institution, Seagoville, Texas. PRICE was advised by Special Agent WILL HAYDEN GRIFFIN that he did not have to make any statement and that any statement he made could be used against him in a court of law. PRICE was advised he had the right to an attorney before making any statement and no threats or promises were made to PRICE. PRICE advised he was serving a sentence at the Federal Correctional Institution.

PRICE was asked if he had any information or had written a letter dated December 12, 1963, addressed to the Honorable JOHN CONNALLY, Governor of Texas, Austin, Texas, which was postmarked McAlester, Oklahoma, December 16, 1963. The letter was unsigned but had the initials "BRJ." PRICE denied sending the letter and denied any knowledge of who could have written the letter.

PRICE also advised he had never heard of JACK RUBY or LEE HARVEY OSWALD until the publicity regarding both was on radio, television and in the newspapers. PRICE also advised he had never written a letter by typewriter.

PRICE stated he was transferred to Seagoville on November 13, 1962, and his tentative release date is December 21, 1966.

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JOSEPH RAY JAMES, 407 1/2 South "A" Street, McAlester, Oklahoma, was advised by SA HENRY B. LOWREY that he had a right to an attorney before making any statement and any statement he might make could be used against him in a court of law. No threats or promises were made in an effort to get him to make a statement.

After being advised of the above JAMES stated he had never written any type of threatening letter to anyone; that this was his first information in regard to a threatening letter of any type being written to Governor CONNALLY of Texas. He said he had no knowledge of the letter, and, further he could offer no information which might be of value in identification of the person using the name of JAMES who did write the letter. He added he has only an eighth grade education; that he cannot use a typewriter; that he does not have access to a typewriter; that he has no close friends who own or operate a typewriter.

JAMES stated he is a retired railroad switchman, resides alone in the one room apartment at 407 1/2 South "A" Street in McAlester, Oklahoma, and has no close associates or relatives.

He stated his only interest in the assassination of President KENNEDY and the shooting of Governor CONNALLY was the same as of any law abiding citizen, that he listened to all news concerning the incident but at no time did he ever consider involving himself in any matter.

On June 19, 1964, an individual identifying himself as J. A. MC CLAIN, 4606 Parry Avenue, Dallas, Texas, telephone Taylor 3-8740, telephonically advised IC JOE A. PEARCE that he had observed a photograph in the "Dallas Times-Herald" newspaper of November 21, 1963, depicting two men engaged in a conversation. This individual was very evasive when questioned as to further information about such picture and as to what the picture had reference. He merely commented, "You know what happened the next day," and requested that he be contacted by an FBI Agent.

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McClain
JOHN A. McClain, 4606 Parry Avenue, advised that he is 87 years of age and retired.

He said he spends most of his time watching television and reading various newspapers. McClain exhibited the "Dallas Times Herald" final edition of November 21, 1963. He pointed out a picture on the front page, upper left-hand corner, of former Vice President RICHARD M. NIXON talking with DON KENDALL, President of Pepsi Cola Bottling Company. The picture was taken when NIXON was in Dallas on November 21, 1963, on a business trip for his law firm which represents the Pepsi Cola Bottling Company. The caption appearing under the picture is "Nixon Today....JFK Tomorrow." T...

McClain said he never did trust the former Vice President particularly since he has made several trips to Europe and gone behind the Iron Curtain. He said in his opinion the "communists" were just seeing if they could trust NIXON. Further, McClain stated NIXON must be "part of a conspiracy" which arranged the assassination of President KENNEDY and stated NIXON must have come to Dallas on November 21, 1963, to assure the "plan was ready to go." He said by the "plan" he meant the assassination of President KENNEDY.

McClain advised he has no information to support his views and stated he arrived at the conclusion that NIXON must have been part of a conspiracy to assassinate KENNEDY by the articles he has read in the newspapers and by watching television.

McClain stated he does not know and he has never had any contact with either LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY. He also stated that other than the above he had no information which might assist in the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Contained in an envelope, postmarked December 24, 1963, at 3:30 PM, at Panama City, Florida, bearing a rubber-stamped return address, "WALTER McNEIL, 1602 Wilmont, Panama City, Florida," was the following letter addressed to "JACK RUBY (dirty murderer of Lee OSWALD), Dallas Jail, Dallas, Texas:"

"I hope you get the electric chair for shooting Lee Oswald, the brave soul whom rid the world of a heinous brutal tyrant; namely, John F. Kennedy the late President of these supposeable U.S.A.

"Oswald's noble feat was a deed truly praiseworthy. But your's Ruby, was a craven act of sheer evil'. Thus, I hope very greatly that you burn but I almost know that you will, either go free or only receive a very light sentence! You yellow dog!

"Sincerely
"/s/ Walter McNeil"

The above letter bears a handwritten return address of "Walter McNeil, 1602 Wilmont Ave., St. Andrew Sta., Panama City, Fla." It bears the salutation Jack Ruby (murderer), Dallas Jail, Texas. It bears the additional salutation "Dear Nigger-Lover:"

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The following investigation was conducted by SA TULLIS D. EASTERLING:

On December 14, 1963, NANCY ENOCKS, ^{11.} Clerk, Panama City Credit Bureau, advised that her files contain no information concerning WALTER McNEIL.

On December 24, 1963, DUELL PITTS, ^{71.} Veteran Detective of the Panama City Police Department, advised that WALTER McNEIL, who resides at 1602 Wilmont Avenue, Panama City, Florida, is well known to the Police Department and to him personally. He said that Mr. McNEIL is a white male, approximately 55 years of age, who is a recluse. He seldom ever leaves his home and makes his living apparently from a plumbing business operated by relatives next door to his home. He is a habitual letter writer and writes letters to newspaper editors on issues which come up of a controversial nature in the City, County, State, and Federal Government. His letters are always long, rambling, and often times without meaning. Most of the time newspapers and magazines refuse to print his letters but some have been printed in the local newspaper at Panama City in years past, but McNEIL is well known in the Panama City area and his influence is negative. McNEIL has never been known to resort to violence and contents himself with expressing his views by writing letters to news media. PITTS stated that he does not believe that McNEIL would resort to violence because he never gets away from home.

On December 10, 1963, E. G. McKAY, Postal Inspector in Charge, Post Office Department, Atlanta, Georgia, furnished a letter which that agency received from the "Atlantic Monthly," 8 Arlington Street, Boston, Massachusetts. The envelope was postmarked November 26, 1963, at Panama City, Florida, bearing a rubber stamp addressed WALTER McNEIL, 1602 Wilmont Panama City, Florida. The letter is as follows:

"Note! The following comments are my own personal feelings and beleifs! I am a poet!

"The Doom of a (or Tyrant) Tyrant!

By
Walter McNeil

"No person on Earth is more jubilant over the recent death of the former president of these imputed United States of America than I, for the simple reason that John Fitzgerald Kennedy, was in life a monstrous tyrant!

"He literally received not one whit more than he truly deserved!

"A marble monument ought to be erected in meritorious honor of Lee Oswald, the noble assassain of the president, in every city, community and hamlet throughout this nation.

"On that Friday afternoon as soon as I heard the report of someone having shot to death president Kennedy, I leaped for joy ecstatically elated with the heavenly knowledge that justice; true and certain, had struck down the chief executive; whom, along with his brother Robert, the attorney general, had fomented racial strife, injury and death in many American cities and municipalities.

"I laughed and laughed with the gratifying awareness of retribution having so-rightly prevailed over the heinous despot; whom by dictatorial command, ruthlessly employed army troops and federal marshalls to force many, many thousands of whites to mix with negroes which eventually always results in inter-marriage and interbreeding; both legitimately (supposedly) and illegimately of the latter!

"I rejoiced in the beautiful truth of good having overcome evil, so banefully embodied in the form and character of the late president while alive!

"For many days to dawn and pass, I shall continue to exult in the glorious thrill pervading my being, at the cognition of cruel oppressor, having really and truly departed from the ranks of the living, for the ultimate good of all deserving Americans; even though for a time, his death may touch off much injustice and persecution! But nevertheless, good predominated for one split instant when that rifle bullet shot by the valiant Lee Oswald, in Dallas, Texas, snuffed out the villainous life of John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

"Oh! How I so truly admire the courage and nobility of Lee Oswald, shown by his gracious deed of stamping out a heartless and damnable existence; to wit, the life of president Kennedy himself!

"Although Oswald was slain soon after he shot the president (on Sun. following the Friday when Kennedy died) I do hope that some national publication will print this for the reason that I wish very much to obtain the address of his bereaved mother, in order to write her my condolences... my deepest heartfelt sympathy; and grant her my strong feelings of vast respect for her noble son, Lee Oswald, and his entire family.

"His honorable feat of virtuous magnitude stands almost unparalleled in the heroic annals of this country's existences.

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RE: JACK HADNETT MILLER

Officer JOE BROYLES, El Paso, Texas, Police Department, furnished the El Paso Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation a letter he had received from one JACK H. MILLER who gave the return address of 1200 East Washington Street, Mount Pleasant, Iowa. This letter was furnished on January 14, 1964 and read as follows:

"Dear Joe,

"As a friend of mine I seek your help in 1960 I was in a Dallas Bar and I heard them talking about they were going to assassinate a man named Kennedy. I told my mother of this and she said I was crazy and put me in the state mental hospital. I have been given a thing called electric shock treatment and this is to make you forget they were also talking Communist talk. I tried to get to people and tell them about it and they say I'm crazy. Joe you & I went to school together. You were a very clean man and I tried to be outside of having a little fun. I was on a vacation & intended to go back to El Paso and work on my Masters degree but for some reason my mother came up to Iowa where I ran out of money. I had received a \$600⁰⁰ settlement for a crushed foot and left her \$400⁰⁰ of it she was to send it to me or a portion of it. If I am given shock treatment again I will forget what I saw in the Dallas Bar get this to FBI in El Paso. Please for gods sake. I know there is a certain Communist element in Dallas and we can all go to work and clean out the place if you do not hear from me again each week you will know they have given me some kind of Electric Shock treatment to tare up my mind so I can not remember about what I over heard in the Dallas nite clubs & remember the boys on the nite force who are such fine fellows

"Just remember some element is trying to keep me from remembering the faces of those dirty Communists in Dallas I found talking in the Dallas nite club that they were going to assassinate to president & I told my mother & she said I was crazy.

Officer JOE BROYLES stated that he became acquainted with MILLER at Texas Western College, El Paso, Texas, in about 1956, and last had contact with MILLER when MILLER passed through El Paso around 1962.

Dr. THOMAS W. MURPHY, Staff Psychiatrist, Mental Health Institute, Mount Pleasant, Iowa, advised SA FRANK J. CASPER on January 20, 1964, that JACK H. MILLER was admitted to the Institute on January 3, 1964 as a State Case on the recommendation of his mother who is a registered nurse. Dr. MURPHY said MILLER is a schizophrenic, paranoid type, which manifests itself in ideas of grandiosity and disconnected ~~thought~~ association. This condition is also exemplified by the fact that MILLER feels he is being persecuted by his mother.

Dr. MURPHY stated he has stopped three letters written by MILLER from being mailed. One was addressed to someone in Phoenix, Arizona, and the other two to El Paso. All three, according to Dr. MURPHY, dealt with an incident in a Dallas bar where MILLER got the impression some men were planning to assassinate President KENNEDY.

JACK HADNETT/MILLER, Inmate, Mental Health Institute, 1200 East Washington Street, advised that in the latter part of 1959, while he was in the United States Army at Fort Hood, Texas, he went on leave to Dallas, Texas. He stated he was interested in the 1960 Presidential campaign and favored JOHN F. KENNEDY and LYNDON B. JOHNSON. He wrote KENNEDY's name on a piece of paper and pinned it to his coat for lack of a campaign button. He entered a bar, name and address unrecalled, and drank a few beers. He walked over to a table where four men in their 30's were seated and engaged them in conversation concerning the upcoming election.

MILLER told them he was interested in "that young senator from New England" to become the new President and one or more of the four men answered him by stating "if he's that young bastard I think you mean, we'll kill him and you too." They then told him to get out of the bar.

MILLER continued and said that as soon as he left the bar he heard a shot and thought it might have been the four men trying to kill him. He ran behind a lamp post, but did not see anything out of the ordinary. He said he then walked down the street, encountered a man, and queried him about his knowledge of communists in the area of the bar.

MILLER then acquired a pair of sunglasses and a hat and went back to the same bar an hour later. This time he walked slowly past where the four men were sitting and heard them talking. He said he thought they used the word assassinate or assassination and felt they meant they were going to assassinate KENNEDY. MILLER said he had never seen the four men before or since that time. One of the men was wearing a suit, one a sport coat, one a sport shirt with his jacket over his chair, and the other was wearing a car coat. He never saw them standing up.

MILLER said he is originally from Dallas, Texas, but was born on November 19, 1934, in Hardy, Arkansas. He said he was honorably discharged from the Army in March, 1959. He said he is divorced from his wife, DOROTHY, who now lives somewhere in El Paso, Texas. His mother, BERTA MILLER, Muscatine, Iowa, has committed him to various mental institutions for his "nervousness." MILLER blames the shock treatments he has

KENNEDY at some future date; that MILTEER suggested one JACK BROWN of Chattanooga, Tennessee, as the man who could do the job and that he (MILTEER) would be willing to help. MILTEER reportedly said that he was familiar with Washington and that the job could be done from an office or hotel in the vicinity of the White House using a high-powered rifle.

On November 23, 1963, J. A. MILTEER was in the Union Train Station, Jacksonville, Florida, and at about 4:25 p.m. on that date stated he was very jubilant over the death of President KENNEDY. MILTEER stated, "Everything ran true to form. I guess you thought I was kidding you when I said he would be killed from a window with a high-powered rifle." When questioned as to whether he was guessing when he originally made the threat regarding President KENNEDY, MILTEER is quoted as saying, "I don't do any guessing." GA

On the evening of November 23, 1963, MILTEER departed Jacksonville, Florida, by automobile en route to Columbia, South Carolina. During this trip, MILTEER stated that he had been in Houston, Ft. Worth, and Dallas, Texas, as well as New Orleans, Louisiana, Biloxi and Jackson, Mississippi, and Tuscaloosa, Alabama. MILTEER said he was acquainted with one R. E. DAVIS of Dallas, Texas, whom he described as a "good man," but did not indicate he was personally acquainted with DAVIS. MILTEER did not indicate on what dates he was in the above cities, except for Tuscaloosa, Alabama. DC

MILTEER related that he was in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and contacted ROBERT SHELTON of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (United Klans), on the evening prior to the bombing of the

16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, which occurred on September 15, 1963. Regarding SHELTON, MILTEER said SHELTON was against violence and could not be depended upon.

A characterization of the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (United Klans), follows. Sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

MILTEER related that MARTIN LUTHER KING and Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY are now unimportant. He stated their next move would be against the "Big Jew" noting that there is a communist conspiracy by the Jews to overthrow the United States government.

MILTEER arrived in Columbia, South Carolina, about midnight and registered at the Wade Hampton Hotel, Columbia, South Carolina. On the morning of November 24, 1963, MILTEER advised that they did not have to worry about LEE HARVEY OSWALD getting caught because he "doesn't know anything" and that the "right wing" is in the clear. MILTEER further related that, "The patriots have outsmarted the communists and had infiltrated the communist group in order that they (communists) could carry out the plan without the right wingers becoming involved."

Later, on the morning of November 24, 1963, four individuals arrived at the Wade Hampton Hotel and conferred with MILTEER. These individuals included BELTON MIMS and A. O. BOLEN, members of the Association of South Carolina Klans; JACK HENDRICKS described as a white male, 35, 5' 7", from Denmark, South Carolina, and WILL ULMER, from Orangeburg, South Carolina. ULMER was described as a white male, 35, 155 pounds, yellow complexion, large eyes.

A characterization of the Association of South Carolina Klans follows. Sources therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

After their arrival, MILTEER stated that there was no point in discussing President KENNEDY, and again stated, "We must now concentrate on the Jews." MILTEER advised that he was preparing a pamphlet which he wanted to disseminate throughout the country. Prior to concluding their discussion, information was received that JACK RUBY had killed LEE HARVEY OSWALD. In view of this, MILTEER said he would have to alter the information he was setting out in his pamphlet.

The source advised that based on his contact with MILTEER, he could not definitely state whether MILTEER was acquainted with either RUBY or OSWALD.

J. A. MILTEER is also known as JOSEPH ADAMS MILTEER. He was born February 26, 1902, at Quitman, Georgia, and lives at Quitman and Valdosta, Georgia. He reportedly is a wealthy bachelor who inherited an estimated \$200,000 from his father. He is reported to have no family, no employment and to spend a great deal of time traveling throughout the Southeastern United States. He has been unsuccessful in city politics in Quitman and publishes a weekly pamphlet criticizing the operation of the Quitman City Government. MILTEER has associated himself with the Constitution Party of the United States and attended a convention of this party held at Indianapolis, Indiana, during October, 1963. He was reprimanded by this party for describing himself as being the party regional chairman for the Southeastern states. MILTEER reportedly became disillusioned with the Constitution Party of the United States and has attempted to form a party known as the Constitutional American Parties of the United States. MILTEER allegedly intends to use the Constitutional American Parties of the United States as a front to form a hard core underground for possible violence in combatting integration.

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC.,
KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, The Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed by Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On August 14, 1961, the second source advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The second source said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Convocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, a majority of the Klaverns, of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

ASSOCIATION OF SOUTH CAROLINA KLANS
MEMBERS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (ASCK)

A source advised on September 24, 1956, that the Association of South Carolina Klans (ASCK) was organized in the fall of 1955 and is patterned after the Association of Carolina Klans (ACK). This source said ASCK is a new organization and not a rebirth of ACK, although all high-ranking officials of ASCK had been members of ACK. The source stated announced purposes of this organization are to promote white supremacy and combat integration of the races; however, the use of violence is disavowed.

A second source advised on September 2, 1950, that ACK was composed of groups formerly members of the Association of Georgia Klans (AGK) and although ACK severed all connections with AGK on November 14, 1949, the purposes and policies of the two organizations remained identical. ACK became defunct after conviction and imprisonment of its highest official and other members in 1952.

A third source advised on April 16, 1962, that ASCK continues to operate for the purpose of promoting white supremacy and combating integration by peaceful means by public speaking and propaganda.

This third source said that ASCK, using the name Majority Citizens League of South Carolina, published a monthly newspaper, "Southland Standard," from August through December, 1961, and dropped it due to lack of financial support.

ACK has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

He stated that on April 8, 1964, he found a 9 x 11 3/4 inch manila file folder in the center of the altar at St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church. He said it was placed on top of the Bible and had a crucifix resting on it. At the top of this folder appears some Greek writing which Father ROYSTER translated as "By: Savior Christ." The rest of this writing appearing on this folder is as follows:

Father ROYSTER said this manila file folder had contained his sermon for the "3rd SUNDAY GREAT FAST" and he had removed it from the file cabinet in the church office on the Saturday preceding April 5, 1964. Father ROYSTER said he had placed this folder in a chair next to the altar on Tuesday, April 7, 1964.

He said he did not know the significance of the writing thereon but stated it was obviously prepared by someone who was familiar with numerology.

Father ROYSTER advised that no church member is permitted near the altar and he is the only one allowed to touch the altar and the things thereon.

Father ROYSTER stated he, GEORGE ALLMAN, a church worker, and WALTER HEWELL, the church treasurer, are the only three people who have keys to the church. Father ROYSTER said upon comparing the writing appearing on this manila file folder that it appears very similar to the writing of WALTER HEWELL. He also stated it appears HEWELL attempted to disguise his handwriting. He said he knows of no reason why HEWELL or anyone else would have done this.

Father ROYSTER also advised that Mrs. OLGA DAY HANNA is frequently around the church but doubts that she had anything to do with the manila folder since she suggested to him that he call the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Father ROYSTER advised he is acquainted with MARINA OSWALD, the widow of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He said he baptized the first OSWALD baby secretly one year before the assassination and baptized the second OSWALD child on April 9, 1964. He said he had no information that would assist in the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. OLGA DAY HANNA, 4425 Edmondson, advised she has telephone No. Lakeside 1-3461. She said about a week ago Father DMITRI ROYSTER, Pastor, St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church, exhibited to her a manila file folder which by a series of numbers and letters showed the death of JOHN F. KENNEDY to be November 22, 1963.

Mrs. HANNA said that Father ROYSTER considered this to be some type of a joke but she felt it might be a threat to Father ROYSTER and suggested to him that he call the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mrs. HANNA advised she did not recognize the writing appearing on this manila file folder and stated she would have no idea who might have done this.

ALLMAN stated he is a member of St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church, 4203 Newton Street, has a key to the church, and is a general handy man at the church. ALLMAN advised he is well aware that Father ROYSTER had found a manila file folder on the altar at St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church sometime in early April, 1964. He said Father ROYSTER showed this folder to him and stated he did not want to "point the finger at anyone," stating the writing appears very similar to that of WALTER HEWELL, the church treasurer. He stated he knows of no reason why HEWELL or anyone else would have done such a thing.

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WALTER R. HEWELL was advised of the identities of interviewing Agents as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was advised he did not have to make any statement, and that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law. He was advised that he could consult an attorney prior to making any statement.

HEWELL stated he was born January 9, 1907, at Whitesboro, Texas. HEWELL advised he is a Certified Public Accountant and has his office in his residence at 6256 Richmond Street, Dallas, Texas. He said he is also Treasurer of St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church, 4203 Newton, Dallas, Texas.

HEWELL was exhibited a manila file folder bearing a series of letters and numbers which indicated the death of JOHN F. KENNEDY would be November 22, 1963. He was informed that this manila file folder was found by Father DMITRI ROYSTER, Pastor of St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church, on the center of the altar on April 8, 1964. After viewing this folder, HEWELL stated the writing thereon was not his and that this was the first time he had seen the folder. Further, HEWELL stated no one is permitted to touch the altar or anything thereon at St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church.

HEWELL stated one of his hobbies is that of numerology and exhibited a book entitled "Numerology for Everybody." The book was written by "Montrose" and published by Blue Ribbon Books, New York, New York, however, he advised he wanted to state emphatically that he did not prepare the numerology data appearing on the manila file folder found by Father ROYSTER.

HEWELL was questioned as to whether he had any possible suspects in connection with the numerology data on the manila file folder, and he advised that although he had no suspects the following may be possibilities:

He said he spent the day at Bogart Sportswear Manufacturing Company, Incorporated, Fort Worth, Texas, which is an account of his. He advised he had lunch on November 22, 1963, a little before 1:00 p.m. with Mr. SEALS, Comptroller of Bogart Sportswear Manufacturing Company, Incorporated, and with Mr. and Mrs. BOGART, the owners of Bogart Sportswear Manufacturing Company, Incorporated.

HEWELL advised he does not know and has never had any contact with either JACK RUBY or LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated, however, that he saw MARINA OSWALD when she secretly had her first baby baptized in the Summer of 1962 at St. Seraphim Eastern Orthodox Church.

HEWELL voluntarily furnished samples of his handwriting. While in the process of furnishing samples of his handwriting, HEWELL inquired if anyone could "get into trouble for furnishing false information." He was advised of the provisions of Section 1001, Title 18, U. S. Code. He said he was not asking for himself because he absolutely did not prepare the numerology data appearing on the manila file folder found by Father ROYSTER. Further, he stated he was happy to furnish samples of his handwriting and happy to cooperate in any manner with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Oswald was killed or murdered after he assassinated president Kennedy by a mad Texan. Jack E.
