Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Surgeon being flown in from Galveston
to Dallas Love Field. Looking for
someone stand by and escort him to
Parkland. He should be by in about
30 minutes.

550/2 (Sergeant GERALD L.
HILL)

A witness reports that he last was
seen in the Abundant Life Temple
about the 400 block. We are fixing
to go in and shake it down.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Is that the one that was involved in
the shooting of the officer?

550/2 (Sergeant GERALD L.
HILL)

Yes.

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Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

They already have him.

550/2 (Sergeant GERALD L.
HILL)

No, that wasn't the right one. (1:44
p.m.)

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Anybody at Elm and Houston?

297 (Three-wheel motorcycle,
operator unknown)

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

287 (Patrolman C. E. WHITMAN), con-
tact 9 (Inspector J. H. SAWYER) and
notify him they are holding up a
north-bound freight train there in
the yard and they want to shake it
down before they let it go. Do you
want to send some officers over there
to shake it down?

297 (Three-wheel motorcycle,
operator unknown)

551 (Sergeant H. H. STRINGER)

The jacket the suspect was wearing
over here on Jefferson bears a laundry
tag with the letter B 9738. See if
there is any way you can check this
laundry tag.

Parkland Hospital, Code 3 (Emergency.
Red lights and sirens).

5 (Deputy Chief GEORGE L. LUMPKIN) All right.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

39 (A half. One occupant
in this unit at this time)

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

210 (Sergeant J. M. YOUNG)

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Conversation

Advise someone to get in the alley
and behind that building at the fire
escape.

5 (Deputy Chief GEORGE L. LUMPKIN),
an aide to the Vice President by the
name of Manesport will arrive at
Southwest Airmotive at 2:05 and will
you also advise Secret Service.

39 A half. (One occupant in this unit
at this time).

Go ahead.

39 is in front of me stationed right
across the airstrip from me right in

have you got? (garbled)

We need an escort there at Southwest
Airmotive at 2:05 p.m. 1:50 p.m.

Has anybody made arrangements or picked
TIPPIT's wife up?

I am not sure, 210 (Sergeant J. M.

210 (Sergeant J. M. YOUNG)

If you give me the address, I will go up there and pick her up.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Yes, you go pick her up. I do not have anybody to send right now.

210 (Sergeant J. M. YOUNG)

I'll call 505 (telephone extension at Dallas Police Department which has the home addresses for Dallas police officers) for the address.

39 (Other half. One occupant in this unit at this time)

I am going back to the Southwest Air-motive. 39 has the State unit.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

10-4, 39. : 1:51 p.m.

410 (Captain O. A. JONES)

Ask 15/2 (Captain J. M. SOUTER) if he has any extra officers there to help hold back the crowd on the south side of Parkland Hospital.

1 (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY)

What are the circumstances of J. D. TIPPIT?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

We do not have it all clear yet, I (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY). He was involved in a shooting and was DOA (Dead On Arrival) at Methodist and I am sorry that is all I have right now.

1 (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY)

Did they get the suspects?

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Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

We believe we have him in the Texas Theater now.

1 (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY)

10-4.

39 (A half. One occupant in this unit at this time)

Is he to arrive at 2:05?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Yes.

39 (A half. One occupant in this unit at this time)

I'll stand by.

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

The latest information is they are supposed to stop them over in the vicinity where we are now. (Garbled) Would you check with the tower and see if this is correct?

39 (A half. One occupant in this unit at this time)

I'm in the sergeant's car and 39 has the tower radio.

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

Well, where is he?

39 (In Sergeant's car)

He has gone with the State unit to pick up the governor's wife.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

We have apprehended a suspect in the shooting at the Texas Theater.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Repeat, 1 (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY).

1 (Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY)

I'm at Love Field (1:54 p.m.)

11 (Inspector CHRISTOPHER KOCKAS)

You say the officer is DOA (Dead On Arrival)?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Yes, 11 (Inspector CHRISTOPHER KOCKAS).

11 (Inspector CHRISTOPHER KOCKAS)

10-4.

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

We need a squad standing by on Mockingbird at the end of runway 13. Also need one at the north end of that same runway at Shorecrest there.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

10-4. I'll see if I can find you one.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Is there any officer near Love Field?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

161 (Patrolman B. J. DALE), we need you on Mockingbird at the end of Runway 13, Love Field, between Air-drome and Cedar Springs.

161 (Patrolman B. J. DALE)

On or off the field? (Garbled)

Unknown

Off the field, 161 (Patrolman B. J. DALE).

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Conversation

210 (Sergeant J. M. YOUNG)

I'm downtown, J. D. TIPPIT lives
7500 So. Beckley. I'm running
Code 2 (Urgent. Red lights and
sirens as needed at intersections)
to his wife's house.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Yes, go ahead, 1:56 p.m.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER), I've
got 32 (Patrolmen J. T. SMITH and
W. L. HACKNEY) going down on Shorecrest.
What do you want him to do?

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

I want them to stand by at the end of
that runway and be sure that everyone
moved out.

550 (Captain W. R. WESTBROOK)

You probably know that they are en
route from the Texas Theater with that
suspect. They are bringing him straight
to City Hall.

39 (In Sergeant's car)

See if you can get the Regular 39 car
and have them ask the tower the place
the aide is coming in.

2:00 p.m. KKB 364 Dallas.

253 (Patrolman W. M. HUGGINS)

I've got back to my car at Cedar Springs and Mockingbird - which way you want me to go?

Dispatcher. (HENSLEE)

Parkland Hospital, Code 2 (Urgent. Red lights and sirens as needed at intersections).

253 (Patrolman W. M. HUGGINS)

En route.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

2:01 p.m.

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Conversation

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Go down to Elm and Houston. Contact
Capt. FRITZ. Tell him to contact his
office.

Unknown

Captain FRITZ just left: about a minute
ago. He's in his car.

(Garbled)

85 (Patrolman R. W. WALKER)

Any report on condition on the
President or Governor?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

I understand the President is DOA
(Dead On Arrival). I don't know about
him (the governor).

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER), do you
know where Air Force 1 is?

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

Yes, it's out here at the air cargo
entrance on the field.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

10-4.

4 (Deputy Chief N. T. FISHER)

If you can contact 39 out at South-
west Airmotive, that the airplane
is going to be taxied to this area,
not there.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

39, did you receive?

Yes, I haven't seen the governor's aide.
I'll take the Presidential aide. We're
heading for Gate 26 where the plane is
supposed to come in.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

39, did you receive information on Air
Force 1?

1, it's parked over there by air cargo
freight entrance.

550 (Captain W. R.

Notify my office, I'm en route, will you?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

10-4. 2:03 p.m.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

Command Post at Parkland?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

170 (Sergeant R. SMART), how many offi-
cers do you have now, do you know?

170 (Sergeant R. SMART)

I'm at the entrance here on Hines. I'm
not at the Command Post in the rear.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

10-4. What's your traffic situation
there?

170 (Sergeant R. SMART)

Heavy.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

170 (Sergeant R. SMART), I can't raise
anyone back there. I'm sending 2 dog
officers, Code 2 (Urgent. Red lights and
sirens as needed at intersections), just
in case they're needed.

The word I have right now is everyone
that is on duty now will remain on duty

at the Trade Mart and will be unable to

to put the detail to work from Central
Station and also is 4 (Deputy Chief

(Garbled) I can leave Parkland right
now. I'm afraid I'd better make it
about 3:00 p.m.

talk to you, but I have some informatio
I need to give to you right now. A
Mr. BILL MOYERS is on his way in to
swear in Mr. JOHNSON as President and h
will need an escort, but we don't know
when he is going to get there.

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4 (Deputy Chief N.T. FISHER) All right. We'll be standing by here.

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

15/2 (Captain J. M. SOUTER), can you read 4 (Deputy Chief N.T. FISHER)?

4 (Deputy Chief N.T. FISHER) Stand by. There is a train going by.

107 (Patrolman C.F. GOODSON) Any better location on that deal down here at Cobb Stadium?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)

No, that's all we had on it.

107 (Patrolman C.F. GOODSON)

(Garbled) 10-4. There're about 15 or 20 officers out here covering this. Nobody can find anything.

18 (Sergeant R.E. DUGGER)

4 (Deputy Chief N.T. FISHER) 2 blue handbags and 2 hanging bags?

No, 2 blue hanging bags and 2 handbags
with his initials on them.

Would you have them double check it?

Dispatcher (HENSLEE)
