Mrs. TATE stated that on one occasion she told O'BRIEN she believed he worked with the underworld, to which he replied that she was right; however, he did not want anyone that he liked to know that he did do so.

On July 2, 1963, O'BRIEN purchased a 1957 pink Buick from Hatcher Chevrolet Co., Athens, Tennessee; however, on September 7 or 8, 1963, he returned stating he had a "lemon" in the Buick and was taking it back to Athens. He returned on the following day with a 1960 Plymouth, white top and black bottom. Although she refused to allow him to stay in her home on this occasion, she did agree to let him use her address for mailing purposes as far as the title to the 1960 Plymouth was concerned. She advised that when the title to this car did come to her home, she mailed it to O'BRIEN in care of General Delivery, Salem, North Carolina. She made note of the title number, 899 8285, Tennessee, and of the vehicle identification number 3301121719.

According to Mrs. TATE, O'BRIEN in his conversations indicated a great like for President KENNEDY. Other than praise President KENNEDY, he did not mention him.

Mrs. TATE further advised that O'BRIEN indicated he had been a member of the Catholic Church but had quit the church as they had been mean to him. Further, he did not believe in God.

Mrs. TATE advised that at the time O'BRIEN purchased the car in Athens, Tennessee, she had purchased some paregoric for him but only on this one occasion. She advised that at times he acted as though he may have some type of narcotic or had been drinking heavily.

Mrs. TATE described O'BRIEN as a white male, 5' 6", 165 to 180 pounds, gray hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, trifocal glasses and well dressed.

SAM ACHELLI, Owner, Highland Avenue Motors, a Chrysler agency, located at 192 Wellington Avenue, Elgin, Illinois, who resides at 65 River Bluff Street, Elgin, Illinois, advised that he has been acquainted with JAMES M. O'BRIEN, who he also knows as MIKE O'BRIEN and J. F. HUGH O'BRIEN, since approximately the summer of 1962. He stated that on August 20, 1962, O'BRIEN purchased a 1955 DeSoto from his company. He stated that O'BRIEN at that time was staying at the Douglas Hotel in Elgin.

ACHELLI related that his records show that O'BRIEN, on December 5, 1962, gave an address of in care of General Delivery, Cleveland, Tennessee. He stated that on October 25, 1962, his records show that Dr. GUY M. FRANCIS of the Earl Campbell Hospital, 525 Callie Avenue, Chattanooga, Tennessee, treated O'BRIEN in Chattanooga. He stated he recalls sending some money to O'BRIEN while he was in the hospital, which O'BRIEN has never repaid. He stated that when O'BRIEN purchased the automobile from him, he gave a reference as J. O'DELL, 1515 Melrose Avenue, Seattle, Washington.

ACHELLI related that O'BRIEN has no relatives in Elgin and O'BRIEN, in conversations with him in the past, told him that he is a professional card player and has no legal residence. He stated that sometime in 1962, to the best of his recollection, O'BRIEN was either arrested by the Sheriff's Office somewhere in Iowa or the State of Wisconsin and was sentenced to three or four months in one of the above two states charged with cheating in a game. ACHELLI stated that he knows nothing additional concerning the background of this arrest, and the only information he obtained concerning this was directly from O'BRIEN.

It was related by ACHELLI that he has not seen O'BRIEN or heard from O'BRIEN since approximately the

summer of 1963, when O'BRIEN passed through Elgin, Illinois, alone and stopped at the Highland Avenue Motors and conversed with him for awhile. He stated he knows nothing concerning any statements made by O'BRIEN concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY, and has no additional information than that set out above concerning O'BRIEN.

AT SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

On June 26, 1964, SA DEAN C. ROLSTON checked the 1500 block of Melrose Avenue, Seattle, and determined that there is no such address as 1550 Melrose Avenue, Seattle, Washington. The 1500 block ends at 1530 Melrose Avenue, and the only residential apartment in an otherwise commercial area of Seattle is the Melrose Apartments, 1320 Melrose Avenue, operated by CHARLES MYER, Manager.

On June 26, 1964, SA DEAN C. ROLSTON contacted CHARLES MYER, Manager of the Melrose Apartments, who advised that he has been manager of these apartments for over a year and that he has never had a tenant by the name of J. O'DELL and knows of no one by that name in that area.

On June 26, 1964, SA DEAN C. ROLSTON checked the Seattle City Directory, Seattle Police Department records, and Seattle Credit Bureau records and was unable to locate any identifiable information concerning a J. O'DELL residing at 1550 Melrose Avenue, Seattle, Washington.

L. E. THORNGREN, General Counsel, Mutual of Omaha, 33rd and Farnam Streets, Omaha, Nebraska, made available his firm's file regarding JOSEPH MIKE O'BRIEN, Bloomington, Illinois, which reflected the following information:

O'BRIEN on September 19, 1962, was issued hospitalization policy number 30HO-492930-62M. On his application, O'BRIEN indicated he was born April 9, 1896, in Kansas and was employed as a salesman.

On October 23, 1962, inquiry was received from the Campbell Clinic, 525 McCallie Avenue, Chattanooga, Tennessee, regarding the hospital benefits afforded O'BRIEN under his hospitalization policy and the clinic indicated that O'BRIEN had been hospitalized there from October 22, 1962, through November 5, 1962. As a result of this inquiry, claim forms under claim number 7-552494 were mailed to O'BRIEN at Bloomington, Illinois, on October 25, 1962, but the letter containing these forms was returned marked "insufficient address."

Additional correspondence was sent to O'BRIEN, in care of General Delivery, Bloomington, Illinois, in November, 1962, and January, 1963, but no answer was received from him. This correspondence requested that O'BRIEN contact the Mutual of Omaha at Springfield, Illinois, in order to clarify information set forth on his original application for insurance on which he failed to indicate any past history of heart trouble or arthritis.

This file contained a hospital bill from the Earl Campbell Clinic Association, Chattanooga, Tennessee, in the amount of \$401.45 and a doctor's bill from Dr. MERRILL F. NELSON, M.D., Earl Campbell Clinic Association, Chattanooga, in the amount of \$70.00. Information from the clinic contained the results of examination of O'BRIEN on his admittance to this clinic on October 22, 1962, and they indicated he suffered from a cerebral concussion, cervical strain, congestive heart failure and arthritis of cervical vertebra.

HARRY HAMMOND, field investigator for Mutual of Omaha, Bloomington, Illinois, made inquiry on May 10, 1963, at Elgin, Illinois, and determined that O'BRIEN had last been in the Douglas Hotel in Elgin on March 28, 1963, and was expected there

again on May 28, 1963.

HAMMOND left word at the hotel for O'BRIEN to contact the Springfield, Illinois, Mutual of Omaha office but there was no indication that O'BRIEN had made any attempt to contact this office.

In June, 1963, a last attempt was made by mail by Mutual of Omaha to contact O'BRIEN with negative results. On August 14, 1963, the file regarding O'BRIEN was closed as incomplete inasmuch as Mutual of Omaha was unable to locate an address for him, no reply having been received as the result of correspondence to O'BRIEN and he had failed to contact Mutual's office in Illinois as requested.

No action has been taken by Mutual of Omaha toward payment of the hospital and doctor bills received from Chattanooga, Tennessee. In addition, no investigation has been conducted in an attempt to locate O'BRIEN since August, 1963. The file regarding O'BRIEN contained no information other than that set forth above which might aid in locating O'BRIEN.

EMERSON VARNER PRICE, JR., 3143 Woodlawn Avenue, Shreveport, Louisiana, furnished the following information freely and voluntarily:

In October, 1963, he moved from Shreveport, Louisiana, to Gladewater, Texas, to live with a relative, after the Shreveport Police had been harassing him constantly because he is a homosexual. In November, 1963, he had to have some dental work done, and although he would have preferred to return to Shreveport for this work, he was afraid the police would again harass him, so he went instead to Dallas, Texas. He has an aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. JAMES HAMILTON PARTILLO, living at 1721 Beverly Parkway, Irving, Texas, and on November 18, 1963, he went to their residence. He made an appointment with a Doctor (FNU) SPIEGAL, a dentist whose office is on the fifth or sixth floor of the Mercantile Bank Building, Dallas, for November 19. On that date he had impressions made in preparation for a partial plate, inasmuch as he had to have six of his upper front teeth pulled. He then made an appointment for 8:30 A.M. on November 20, 1963, to continue the dental work. He returned to Irving, Texas, and spent the night at the home of his aunt and uncle.

On the morning of November 20, 1963, he left the home of his aunt and uncle at about 7:00 A.M. It was raining heavily that morning and he noticed his gas tank was empty. There was only one service station, a Fina station, open in Irving that time of the morning. He had no cash on him, although he had some checks, and was unable to purchase gasoline at that station. In passing the bus stop in Irving where the Continental or the Trailways Bus picks up passengers for Dallas, he noticed a white man standing, waiting for a bus. There were also several Negroes standing nearby. The white man was dressed in a gray plastic raincoat, carrying a black umbrella, and a lunch pail, probably also black. He had something on his head, possibly a newspaper, a hat, or a piece of cellophane to keep the rain off. He stopped and offered to take this man to Dallas for the price of the bus fare to Dallas. The man agreed, and they then went to the Fina Service Station, where they ordered a dollar's worth of gasoline. For some reason the station attendant put in two dollars' worth of gasoline, and the passenger went ahead and paid for it.

Enroute to Dallas from Irving, his passenger, who never gave his name, asked PRICE if he had ever been in a foreign country. PRICE told him no, and asked the man if he had. The man said yes, he had lived in Russia and that his wife was Russian, and that his wife and child lived in Dallas, and that he was boarding in Irving. PRICE asked him if he was separated from his wife, but the man did not explain. Also, while enroute to Dallas, the man asked PRICE how he would like to hire himself and his car out at \$100 per day plus expenses to take this man, his wife and two other men to New Mexico or Mexico (PRICE recalled that he said either New Mexico or Mexico, but he could not remember at this time which he said.) PRICE asked him if the other two men were people the same age as his passenger, and the man said no, they were older men and PRICE believed he also said something to indicate they were kinfolk of his. The man said the money would be paid in advance and that the trip would be between that time and the first of the year. The man did not specify how long the trip would last, or say what the purpose of the trip was, but he did say that PRICE would leave him and his companions at their destination and PRICE would return alone. PRICE was not interested at the time and indicated to the man he did not think he was interested.

PRICE had some recollection also, that during the trip the man made some comment about Communism or Marxism, but he could not recall any specific conversation in this regard. During the trip it continued to rain quite heavily and since his windshield wipers did not work properly, he and his passenger had to continually wipe off the windshield with paper towels they had obtained at the service station.

Upon arriving in Dallas, they passed in the vicinity of what he now knows to be the Texas School Book Depository, and his passenger pointed in the general direction of that building and stated this was where he worked. At the time, PRICE was busy driving, it was raining, and the traffic was heavy, and he did not pay much attention and could not say just which building the man was referring to. They passed that area, and the man asked him to go back and drop him off, but since he did not have much time before his dental appointment and because the traffic made it difficult to maneuver, he told the man he would drop him at the bus station, as they had agreed. He stopped at the Greyhound Bus Station, and got out.

and went into the bus station restroom, telling the man to lock the car door when he got out. When he returned to the car a few minutes later, the man was still in the car and was looking through a notebook of his. PRICE became angry and asked the man what he thought he was doing, that this was his, PRICE's, property. The man apologized, then pointed to a name, address and telephone number he had written on the book and told him he had written his name, his landlady's name, address and telephone number down and for PRICE to think over his proposition and to call him. PRICE did not pay much attention to what was written down at the time, but noticed it was an address in Irving, Texas, and he commented to the man, more to get rid of him than anything else, that it was near his aunt's house and he would go by to see him. PRICE then left him there and did not see him again.

PRICE stated after his dental appointment he returned to his aunt's house in Irving and told her he was through with the dentist and was going home to Gladewater. However, he was not actually through as the dentist still had to pull his teeth and fit the plate, but he had a homosexual friend in Irving he intended to stay with and with whom he did stay on the night of November 20 and 21. On November 21 he did not go back to the dentist. On November 22, he had a 10:30 A.M. appointment with the dentist, but slept late and did not get there until about noon. At that time, Dr. SPIEGAL pulled six upper teeth and fitted the upper plate. On the way to the dentist that day, he passed near the parade route of President KENNEDY and his party while walking toward the Mercantile Bank Building, and he caught a brief glimpse of the President's car. He recognized Mrs. KENNEDY and saw two men in the car but did not recognize them. He heard the news of the President being shot while he was in the dentist's office.

After his dental appointment, he drove back to Shreveport, leaving Dallas at about 1:15 P.M., and got back to Shreveport in about four and a half hours. He recalled that he remained in Shreveport only that night because he had gone to Selber's Department Store that afternoon and had gotten in an argument with a young man who owed him some money and had threatened the young man, and after he got home he feared the young man might report him to the police. He left town on November 23, 1963, and went to visit a friend in Leesville, Louisiana. He returned to Dallas on November 25, 1963, for further dental treatment.

PRICE described the man he had picked up in Irving, Texas, on November 20, as a white male, age about 24, height about 6', or more, lanky build, brown hair, eyes possibly blue. He said the man had a wild look in his eyes.

PRICE stated the car he was driving at that time, which he still has, was a 1955 Chevrolet two door, station wagon, Bel Air, Nomad, two tone green, bearing 1963 Louisiana commercial license 20-598, which was registered to Steel Erectors, Shreveport, the former owners. He had never reregistered it.

PRICE stated he had paid no attention to the name and address the man wrote on his book, and it was not until about December 20 or 21, 1963, that he became aware of who this was. At that time a friend, JIMMY NASH, saw the name on the book and asked PRICE if he knew LEE HARVEY OSWALD. PRICE said no, and NASH asked how he got the name on his book. Upon looking at it, he recalled the man who had written it and then realized this was the man who had reportedly assassinated the President. The name written on the book was LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and it also bore the landlady's name, address and telephone number in Irving, Texas, which he did not now recall. PRICE described the notebook as a red covered spiral "Write Right" composition book, and stated the names and addresses this man had written were on the red cover. He used this book to record names of acquaintances and mileage covered in his automobile.

PRICE stated he does not now have this book. He said it was stolen on July 29, 1964, while he was staying in New Orleans. His car was broken into and some \$1800 worth of belongings were stolen, including the notebook. He determined the person who broke into the car was one ROBERT SPENCER ROGERS a "hustler" who lived on Dumaine Street in the French Quarter, New Orleans. PRICE had notified police of the theft and had taken police to ROGERS' apartment and located some of his belongings. He determined that ROGERS had torn up a lot of his papers and dumped them in the trash, and that the trash had been picked up and burned. He said he noticed; however, when he and the police went to ROGERS' apartment, torn pieces of the notebook on the floor in the apartment, but he never recovered any of the pieces. He stated ROGERS apparently never saw the name LEE HARVEY OSWALD on the book, because he never mentioned it. He said ROGERS was questioned by police but never prosecuted for this theft. He stated ROGERS had previously been on Federal parole from Denver, Colorado,

resulting from a narcotics charge in Dallas. He stated he does not know if ROGERS is still in New Orleans, Louisiana.

PRICE stated JIMMY NASH, the friend who had asked him about the name on the notebook, formerly lived on Iberville Street, New Orleans, with an uncle, JAMES (LNU), on the opposite side of the block from the A & G Cafe. His father, RICHARD A. NASH, Star Route, Provencal, Louisiana, is quite elderly, being in his 80's. NASH is in the National Guard, was stationed at Fort Polk, Louisiana, for six months, released on February 2, 1964; he understands he was scheduled to spend two weeks training at Fort Polk beginning August 1, 1964.

PRICE stated the reason he had not previously furnished this information to police officials is that he has been constantly harassed by the local police in Shreveport and he had decided this would just cause further harassment.

PRICE was informed that it may be necessary to conduct investigation to verify the information he had furnished, including contacting his aunt and uncle in Irving. He said he was reluctant to have this done, because he is estranged from his uncle, although he is still on fairly good terms with his aunt. He said if necessary he would prefer his aunt be contacted rather than his uncle. He also requested that his father, EMERSON VARNER PRICE, SR., who is an official with Cities Service Oil Company in Atlanta, Georgia, and who knows nothing of this, not be contacted. He also requested that his grandfather, W. C. EVANS, age 93, with whom he lives in Shreveport, not be contacted and stated his grandfather knows nothing of this. He refused to name the man with whom he stayed in Irving, Texas, on the nights of November 20 and 21, 1963, stating he feared any disclosure of their relationship would ruin the man's reputation.

The following quoted letter was received at the FBI Headquarters, Washington, D. C., postmarked July 11, 1964, which letter was signed GEORGE D. STEWART, Box 300, Wichita Falls, Texas, Texas State Hospital:

Dear Mr. Hoover:

This just a letter of appeal to join me in starting a clean up. I have lived over 22 years in this state and can truthly say that it is the dirtiest state of 50 states. and I am positive that this Texas state Hospital that I am being held as prisoner since April 18th 1961 is the cruelest and brutulest thing since God! created Adam and Eve.

Now let me tell you who I am.

I George Dewey Stewart was born about 1 A.M. Dec. 7th 1900 in Weogufka alabama. My Grand mother was a decendand of England Mary Jane (Riddle) Stewart. I think her ancestars arrived in america about 1674. My Grandfather's people as you know came from Scotland in 1674. My Grand Mother Grandfather and father Methodis in Religion. Grand-father and father were Masons. They as well as I were and are Blue Blood Yankee americans. Did and don't believe in Slavery. (abe Peoples) I myself am a Bachelor never married. I have an almost spotless record. would like any one to check my records from birth until now. I

"live up to as near as possible my Royal Blue Blood of England and Scotland queen Mary of Scotland Elizabeth of England Sisters Stewarts before marriage my aunts and my Loyal Blue blood of good old U. S. A.

"Now in april 1961 I was a Poll Tax Paid citizen of comanche county comanche county Seat. My mailing address was Dublin Texas RFD #2. I was living on U. S. Government Property. Given Pro-mission by High Ranking Government officials The County Sheriff came out about 8 P.M. April 15th 1961. walked on this Property with out a warrant. Said Ill have to take you in. I asked what charges. He said several Peoples have said that you have a bad case of indigestion. I told him that he couldn't take me in on such charge. I ask him about a warrant. A check of the file of GEORGE STEWART, a patient, at the Wichita Falls State Hospital, Wichita Falls, Texas, reflects that Writ of Commitment for Temporary Hospitalization was issued on April 17, 1961, by the County Clerk, Comanche County, Comanche, Texas, in case number 3351 entitled, "The State of Texas for the best interest and protection of GEORGE STEWART as a Mentally Ill Person." This commitment ordered the commitment of GEORGE STEWART to a State Hospital for observation and treatment for a period not exceeding 90 days and was issued after a trial by jury in County Court, Comanche County, Comanche, Texas, the records reflecting certificates by two doctors who also testified at the trial.

STEWART was admitted to the Wichita Falls State Hospital on April 18, 1961, and, after examination by doctors at the hospital, the diagnosis was "schizophrenic reaction - chronic paranoid type" and the prognosis was "poor."

The file further reflects a Writ of Commitment for Indefinite Commitment dated July 17, 1961, and issued by the County Clerk, Wichita County, Wichita Falls, Texas, after proceedings in County Court, which reflects an attorney was appointed by the court to represent STEWART's interests and the proceedings reflect the affidavit of two doctors reflecting their diagnosis of STEWART as "schizophrenic reaction paranoid." The judgment in the case reflects that STEWART was adjudged mentally ill and required hospitalization in a mental hospital for his own welfare and protection or the protection of others; that STEWART was mentally incompetent and it was ordered, adjudged and decreed that "STEWART be and he is hereby committed for an indefinite period to Wichita Falls State Hospital."

The file further reflects that on many occasions during the past two years, STEWART has been granted a furlough for a day each time to allow his cousin, Mrs. GLADYS SHARP, 1800 Kemp, Wichita Falls, Texas, to take him with her for a day's visit. The file reflects a handwritten letter

addressed to the "United States of America, Supreme Justice Department, Washington, D. C.," which was apparently never mailed and was signed by GEORGE STEWART. In this letter STEWART tells of his royal blue blood of England and complains that he was picked up in Comanche and sent to the state hospital when there was nothing wrong with him. He further complained about having to stay at the hospital and stating some people get more to eat than he does and wanting someone to take action to get him out of the hospital.

The file further reflects that GEORGE STEWART was born December 7, 1900, at Weogufka, Alabama, and grew up on a farm. His father was WILLIAM JACKSON STEWART, a devout Methodist and Mason who died in 1920 at the age of 46. He was a farmer. STEWART's mother is SALLIE LOUISE TEEL STEWART, who was born in Alabama and now lives in Mobile, Alabama.

"Since you killed Mr. Kennedy, we will kill you no later than December 25, 1963. In spite the efforts of the police we will kill you. You will die the most horrible death you have ever seen in your life. So until we meet again I say good by for now.

Mr. FORD stated that the above-described letter was among correspondence in a box containing correspondence of MARINA and LEE HARVEY OSWALD accumulated while she was residing at the residence of JAMES H. MARTIN, her former business manager. Mr. FORD stated that MARINA OSWALD took this box of correspondence with her when she moved from the MARTIN home and that this letter had recently been discovered by MARINA OSWALD and made available to Mr. FORD for referral to the proper authorities. Mr. FORD stated that MARINA OSWALD indicated she did not recall ever seeing this letter before.

addressed to him as District Attorney WADE, Dallas, Texas. The
envelope was postmarked November 30, 1963, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.
The letter is quoted as follows:

"Dear Sir,

"You are digging a grave for Mr. Ruby and
you will fall into the grave.

On December 5, 1963, the facts relating to the receipt of

TIMMINS, Jr., Northern District of Texas. Mr. TIMMINS advised
prosecution under the extortion statute will not be entertained as
the language of the communication does not convey any threat to
injure or kill addressee or any other person. He advised the language
of the communication is capable of more than one meaning and conveys

On December 5, 1963, HENRY M. WADE, Dallas County District Attorney, furnished to Special Agents BOOKHOUT and GEORGE W. H. CARLSON a handwritten letter and envelope received by him which was postmarked 11:45 a.m., November 27, 1963, Liverpool B. and was addressed to him as District Attorney HENRY WADE, Dallas, Texas, U.S.A. The envelope bears a sixpence stamp as well as an airmail sticker. The letter is quoted as follows:

On December 5, 1963, the facts as they relate to the receipt of this letter were presented to Assistant United States Attorney B. H. TIMMINS, Jr., Northern District of Texas, at which time Mr. TIMMINS stated the alleged threat contained in the above letter is conditional and not unequivocal, therefore, same does not constitute a violation of the extortion statute.

On December 5, 1963, Captain J. W. FRITZ, Homicide and Robbery Bureau, Dallas Police Department, and Sheriff J. E. "BILL" DECKER, Dallas County, were advised of the correspondence received by District Attorney HENRY M. WADE as well as the opinion of Assistant United States Attorney B. H. TIMMINS, Jr.

On December 26, 1963, the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory, Washington, D. C., advised as follows:

"It was not determined whether the Q1 and Q2 letter was prepared by the same person or persons who prepared the Q3 and Q4 letter because the writings are not sufficiently comparable for an adequate comparison. It is pointed out that differences in handwriting characteristics were noted which strongly suggest that these two letters originated from different sources."

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent CHARLES T. BROWN at Dallas, Texas:

On March 4, 1964, HENRY M. WADE, Dallas County District Attorney, advised on March 4, 1964, he received an anonymous handwritten letter dated February 17, 1964, at Dallas, Texas. WADE advised the letter was contained in an envelope which bore the handwritten address "Mr. Henry Wade Prosecuting Attorney Dallas Texas," which was postmarked March 2, 1964, at East Chicago, Indiana. Mr. WADE made available the envelope and the letter contained therein which is quoted as follows:

"Dallas, Texas

"Mr. Henry Wade,

"Jack Ruby's trial starts today. Am going on trip. Have friends in Chicago. You dirty bastard don't find him guilty. If you sent him to chair, I'll fill your lungs full of gunshot. Mr. WADE advised he was unable to recognize the handwriting appearing on the envelope and letter and he had no idea as to the identity of the person or persons sending the letter.

On March 4, 1964, Mrs. NORA CROW, Receptionist, District Attorney WADE's office, furnished a handwritten letter prepared by RUBY STOVALL, 3115 Swiss Avenue, Apartment 7, Dallas, Texas, which may contain handwriting similar to the writing in the letter received by District Attorney WADE on March 4, 1964.

On March 10, 1964, the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory, Washington, D. C., advised as follows:

"Q5 Envelope postmarked 'EAST CHICAGO, IND. MARCH 2 1964 AM' bearing handwritten address 'Mr. Henry Wade Prosecuting Attorney Dallas Texas'

The eight-cent airmail stamp thereon was removed from a sheet. The Q6 sheet of white paper measures approximately 7.93 by 5 inches. The thickness varies from .0036 to .0038 inch. Q6 was torn from a tablet."

On March 25, 1964, the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C., advised the letter and envelope received by Mr. WADE postmarked March 16, 1964, East Chicago, Indiana, did not contain any latent prints of value.

On April 30, 1964, HENRY M. WADE, Dallas County District Attorney, advised on April 29, 1964, he received through the mail a letter addressed to him as "Mr. Henry Wade Prosecuting Attorney Dallas, Texas," postmarked East Chicago, Indiana, April 28, 1964. Since September, 1963, HUNTER has been investigating a matter in which postcards bearing obscene remarks have been sent to three people in the Lake Milton, Ohio, area postmarked at Lake Milton, Warren, and Newton Falls, Ohio. Examination of these postcards, which total approximately 45 including two addressed to Judge BROWN and Mr. WADE in Dallas, reveals to even the untrained eye that the writer in the Post Office case and in the Federal Bureau of Investigation case are identical.

HUNTER advised the case is under investigation presently and a conference with the United States Attorney at Cleveland determined the United States Attorney would be willing to prosecute the individual for using obscene language in the cards mailed if and when he is identified.

On May 11, 1964, the facts relating to the receipt of the obscene postcard were discussed with Assistant United States Attorney B. H. TIMMINS, Jr., Northern District of Texas, Dallas, at which time Mr. TIMMINS advised he would defer prosecutive consideration in this matter to the authorities at Youngstown, Ohio, since investigation at Youngstown revealed considerable investigation was already conducted in Ohio regarding this matter, and further since the United States Attorney at Cleveland has indicated a willingness to prosecute this individual for using obscene language in the cards mailed, if and when he is identified.

This BAUCUM has been described as a chronic letter writer. He has been in different mental institutions, and as long ago as 1953 the doctor in charge of the Psychoneurotic Ward of the Veterans Hospital, Sawtelle, California, observed that BAUCUM was mentally ill. This doctor stated that any interview with BAUCUM would merely add to BAUCUM's inclination to write more letters.

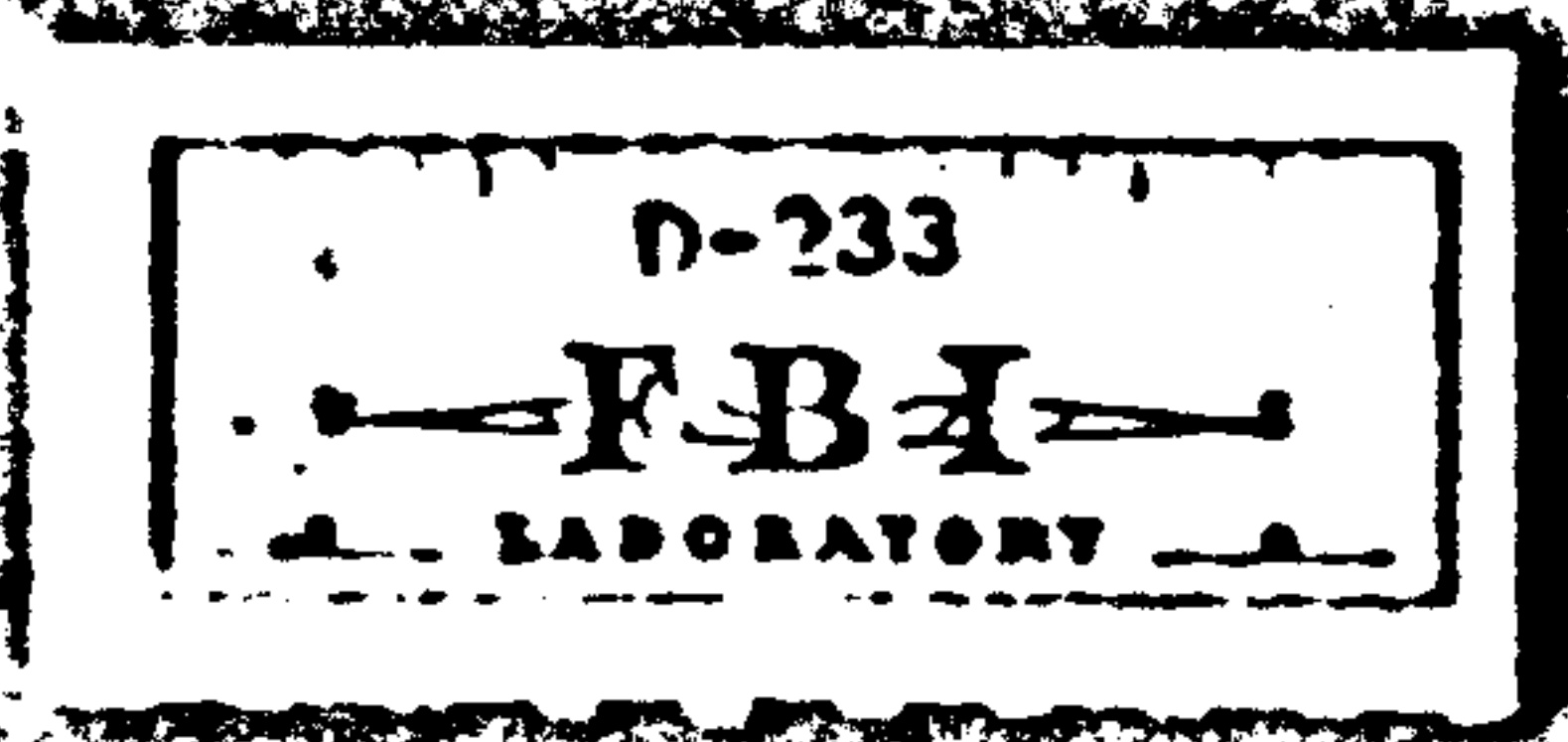

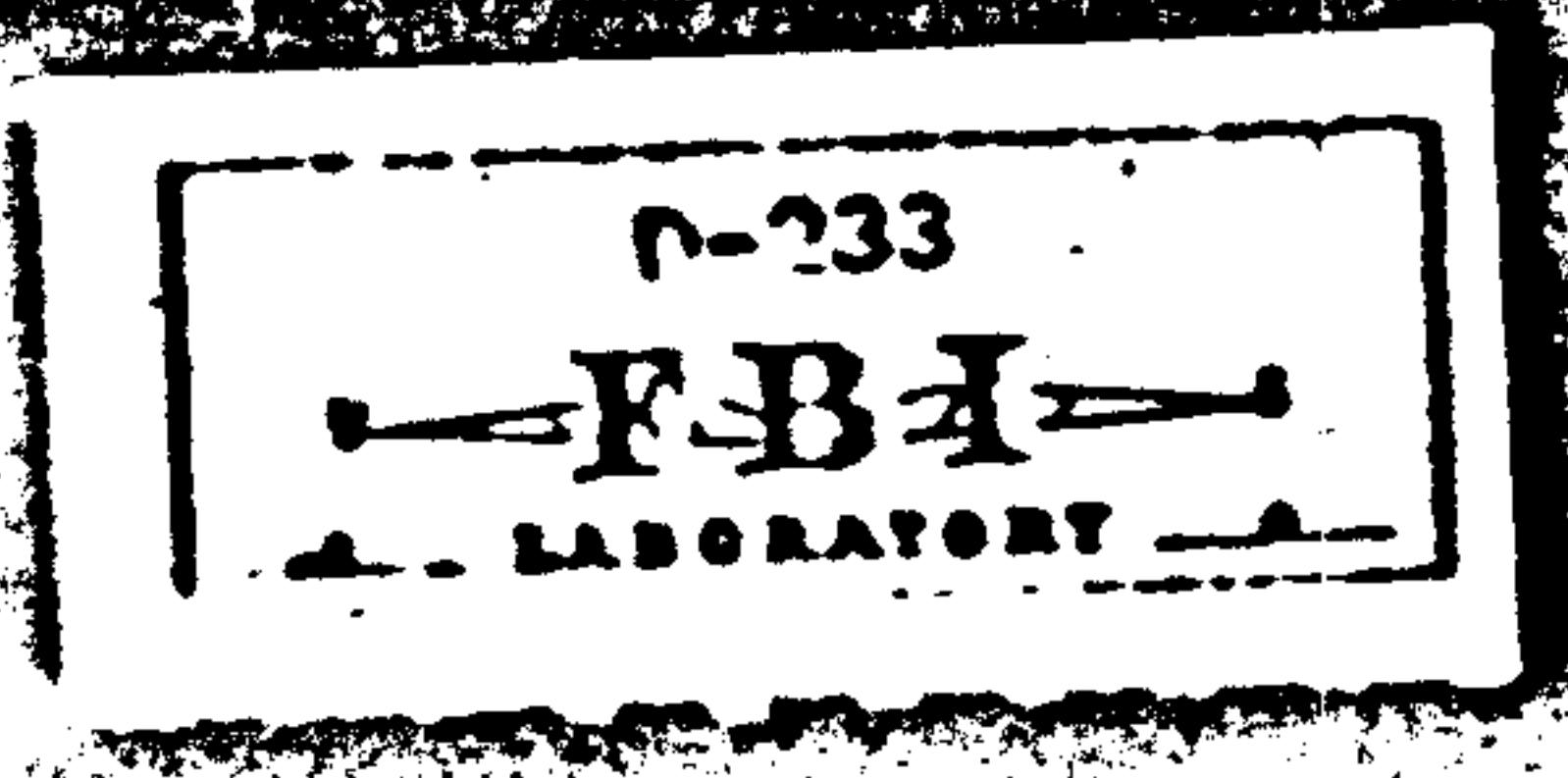
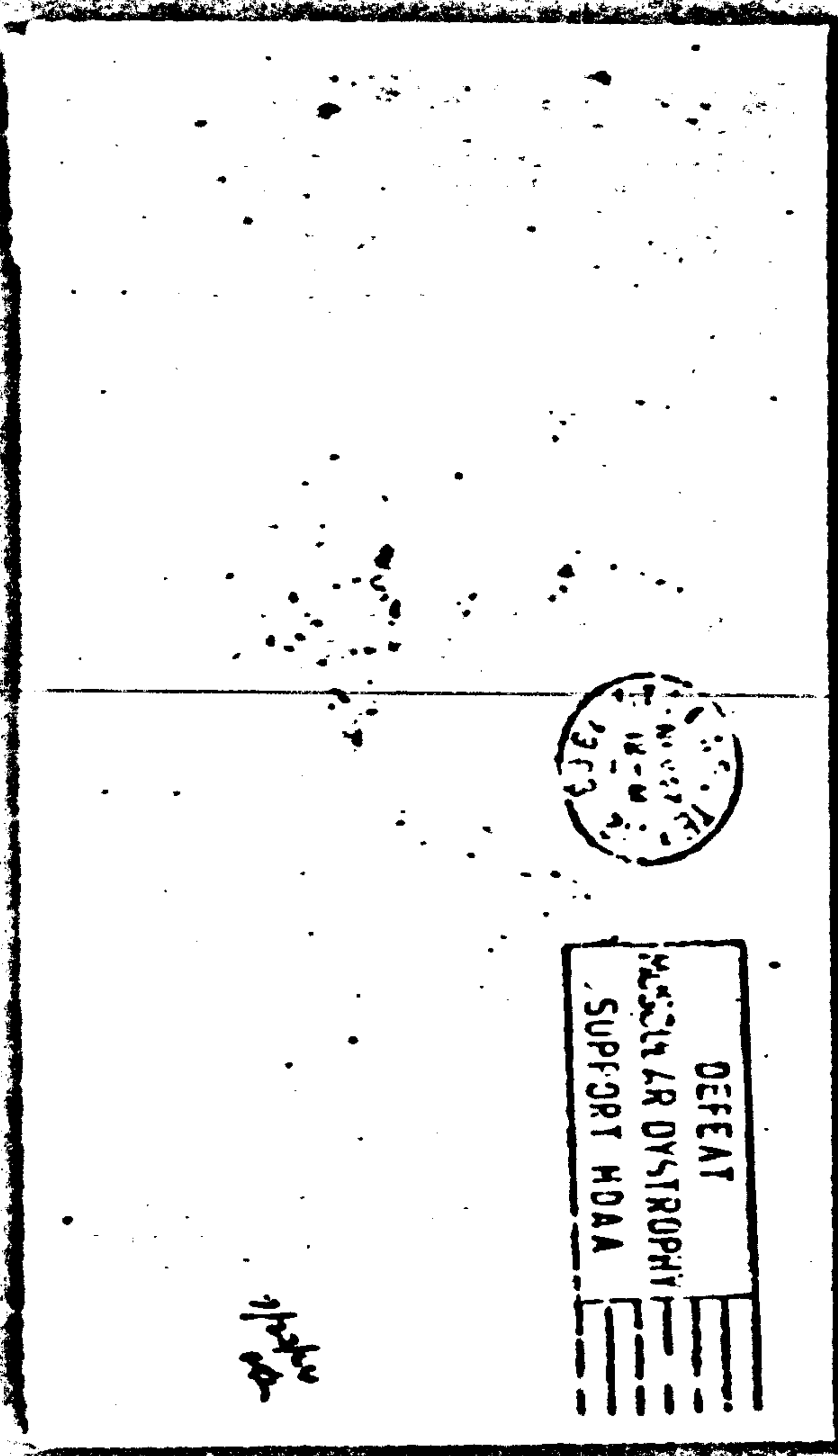
