Supervisor Jack Danahy, New York Office, telephonically advised at 12:50 PM, that the "New York Journal American" just came out with banner headlines concerning a preassassination report story written by Dorothy Kilgallen.

Danahy stated this article parallels the misinformation, and maliciously calculated half-truths put out by Mark Lane, the New York attorney who reportedly is associated with Communist-dominated organizations.

In the article Kilgallen claims to be quoting from confidential testimony. However, it appears these are tape recordings Lane has previously used in his vilification of the Director and the FBI.

ACTION:

Danahy was instructed to immediately furnish the Bureau with the full article and to be alert for similar articles.

ATTENTION SAC: Mrs. Hudson is mentioned in your file 29-43. The contents of her communication should be made available to a contact at the appropriate local police department.

NOTE: Bufiles reflect Mrs. Hudson forwarded a letter to the Cincinnati Office furnishing information regarding an individual whom she suspected of following President Kennedy in order to assassinate him. This letter was dated July 21, 1964. She was interviewed on 7-30-64 and furnished information regarding an individual she met at a tent revival meeting in Atlanta. She stated among other things that she was hypnotized and also had a "laying on of hands" experience.

PURPOSE

That the attached teletype instructing San Antonio to obtain copies of the State of Texas' report relating to the assassination be obtained and forwarded to the Bureau for the completion of our files, be sent.

BACKGROUND

According to an article in the "New York Journal American" captioned "Texas Report Next Week" under date-line of Austin, Texas, September 25, 1964, revealed that a report pertaining to the Texas role in the investigation of President Kennedy's assassination would be ready next week. This information was released by Texas Attorney General Waggoner Carr.

The article states this is a brief report and Mr. Carr was said to have commented several months ago he had planned to "put on record the story of how Texas joined forces with the Warren Commission in making the investigation." This article indicated the report would go to Governor John Connally.

ACTION

To enable the Bureau to fully review this report and for the further completion of our files, -if approved, the attached teletype to San Antonio be forwarded with instructions that copies be obtained through their appropriate liaison with the Attorney General's Office.

By letter dated September 21, 1964, Mr. David L. Wolper, President, Wolper Productions, Incorporated, furnished the script for the first one hour and forty-five minutes of a two hour and ten minute motion picture "Four Days in November" which is to be released on October 6, 1964, in Washington, D. C., and then afforded nation-wide distribution.

According to the letter the remainder of the script relates to President Kennedy's funeral. Mr. Wolper requested our comments as to the accuracy of the script and our opinion of it.

Supervisors in the General Investigative Division and Domestic Intelligence Division familiar with the Oswald and related investigations have reviewed the script and the following inaccuracies of possible pertinence were noted:

On page four, item six, it is indicated Dallas papers published the President's probable route on November 16, 1963, six days before his visit.

The route was not published until November 19, 1963, as the final commitment was not agreed upon until November 18, 1963.

On page five, item eight, it is indicated that the Dallas Police Department in cooperation with the Secret Service and "other Government agencies" assisted in the security measures prior to the President's visit.

This would imply that "other Government agencies" were responsible for physical security arrangements whereas this is the responsibility of the Secret Service.

On page thirty, item seventy-nine, in dramatizing the actions taken immediately after the assassination, it is stated that Oswald was reported missing from the Texas School Book Depository and that "Instantly the call goes out --- pick up Lee Harvey Oswald."

Memorandum to Mr. Tolson
RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

This is erroneous as Oswald was not missed until about 12:45 pm and the police had not started to check on his whereabouts until after he was arrested for the shooting of Tippit. Since the assassination occurred at 12:30 pm and Tippit's shooting was reported at 1:18 pm, the above statement would imply that Oswald's identity was known much sooner than actually known.

On page thirty-six, item ninety-eight, it is stated at 1:25 pm the police were hunting Oswald. The same objection set out above applies here as the Dallas Police Department did not commence looking for Oswald until later, only to realize he had already been arrested.

On page thirty-seven, item one hundred, it is indicated Officer J. D. Tippit was shot three times.

Four slugs were removed from Tippit's body.

On page thirty-seven, item one hundred and two, it is indicated that shoe salesman John Brewer was alerted by a radio description and followed Oswald to the Texas theater (where he was later arrested).

John Brewer followed Oswald because he acted suspicious and he saw Oswald with a gun and not because of any description of Oswald as none was available at that time.

On page fifty-three, item one hundred and forty, it is stated that the paraffin test was one of the links connecting Oswald with the assassination weapon.

This is erroneous as these tests were essentially negative and our Laboratory experts have so testified before the President's Commission. In addition highly technical examinations made by the Atomic Energy Commission and our Laboratory on the paraffin casts could not connect Oswald with the rifle.

On page fifty-four, item one hundred and forty-one, it is indicated that certain maps found at Oswald's residence were incriminating.

This is completely inaccurate. They were not incriminating.

On page sixty, item one hundred and fifty-nine, it is indicated Oswald at five years of age had already spent two years in a boarding institution.

Memorandum to Mr. Tolson
RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

Oswald only spent thirteen months in a boarding institution at five years of age.

On page sixty-nine, item one hundred and eighty-five, it is indicated that on Sunday (November 24, 1963) Jack Ruby took a dip in his apartment house swimming pool.

Our investigation has failed to disclose any such swim, however, he did go to the apartment house "washateria" for a short period in the morning.

RECOMMENDATION

That the above inaccuracies be brought to the attention of Mr. Wolper by the Crime Records Division.

RADIO AND TELEVISION COVERAGE

Coverage of the release of the Warren Commission Report, scheduled for 6:30 p. m., 9-27-64, began at 5:00 p. m. over the Columbia Broadcasting System, heard locally over WTOP - TV, with a review of the conflicting questions surrounding the assassination and interviews of many of the persons who testified before the Commission. At 6:30 p. m., the Report itself was reviewed and the high lights presented: that Lee Harvey Oswald killed President Kennedy, that he appeared to have acted alone, and that he was not apparently involved in any kind of conspiracy with Jack Ruby or other persons.

REFERENCES TO FBI:

*Assassination of President Kennedy
John F. Kennedy*

The narrator pointed out that neither the Secret Service nor the Dallas Police Department "was warned" by the FBI concerning Oswald. He said that one of the "three great flaws" emphasized in the Report was the "insufficient liaison between the Secret Service and other government agencies" and the "unduly restrictive role played by the FBI."

"Newsnight," a 30-minute regular news program heard at 7:00 p. m. over WTOP - TV, cited the general conclusions of the Report and noted the fact that "government agencies were criticized" for their handling of the President's security safeguards. The commentator said that in this regard, "WTOP contacted the Secret Service and the FBI and was given a 'no comment.'"

Pearson is heard each week on "Newsnight." He recalled that on 12-1-63, he had broadcast that Secret Service Agents were "out drinking" the night before the assassination. He noted that later Secret Service denied that these Agents were the ones assigned to guard the President. Pearson said he had also reported that "the FBI and the Secret Service had failed to spot Oswald." He claimed that the Commission Report had confirmed the matters raised in his broadcast of December 1st and he wanted to go on record now as predicting that there would be "tough discipline for any FBI Agent who fails to give full information to the Secret Service and for any Secret Service Agent who is found drinking on the job."

the early conflicts regarding the assassination and summarized the conclusions of the Commission. Frank McGee of NBC was careful to point out that the Commission had stated it admittedly was using "hindsight" regarding its criticism of the FBI and that the FBI had followed all procedures which had been set up at the time regarding its liaison with Secret Service.

REMAINING COVERAGE:

All news broadcasts on local radio and television stations were monitored Sunday night and early Monday morning. The Commission Report, of course, was the lead item. For the most part, these broadcasts reviewed the Commission's findings and mention of the FBI was usually limited to the fact that the Commission had criticized the Secret Service and the FBI because of ineffective liaison.

There is enclosed herewith a copyrighted article by DOROTHY KILGALLEN, which appeared in "NEW YORK JOURNAL AMERICAN", 9/25/64, concerning captioned matter.

The essence of this article is as follows:

1. An unidentified woman who witnessed the killing of Officer J. D. TIPPITT was warned by the police that her life would be in danger if she talked about the case to anyone. She allegedly gave a description of the killer, which does not fit that of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

2. Another eye witness to TIPPITT's slaying, Mrs. HELEN MARKHAM, allegedly identified OSWALD in the line-up but states she has been told not to talk by several Dallas detectives, FBI Agents and Secret Service Agents. Mrs. MARKHAM subsequently gave a taped interview with Attorney MARK LANE which is reportedly set forth verbatim in an additional article in this issue.

3. A Dallas police officer SEYMOUR WEITZMAN taken the day after the slaying, reportedly indicated that the rifle, which he found was a 7.65 Mauser.

4. An affidavit was taken from a cab driver, WILLIAM WAYNE WHALEY, who reportedly identified OSWALD as a fare on 11/22/63. However, District Attorney HENRY WADE, subsequently told the press conference that the cab driver utilized by OSWALD was one DARRYL CLICK.

5. An allegation that an affidavit was taken from MICHAEL RALPH PAINE, estranged husband of Mrs. RUTH PAINE, that he knew that LEE HARVEY OSWALD worked in the Texas Book Depository Building, and thought of calling the FBI when he heard the President had been shot, but did not because he felt the FBI was aware of his presence there. Further, that Mrs. PAINE stated that she notified the FBI after she obtained OSWALD his employment in the book depository but believed he was working in an annex.

Reported excerpts from each of the aforementioned affidavits are set forth in an adjoining article in this issue of the "JOURNAL AMERICAN".

Exclusive Q. & A. And Affidavits In JFK Tragedy

Here are extracts from the actual documentation — interviews, affidavits and special reports — that presumably appear in the Warren Commission report:

1. Interrogation of a woman (name withheld) who witnessed the slaying of Ptl. J. D. Tippit, gave a description differing from eLe Harvey Oswald's, and later told of being warned by police that her life was in danger if she talked.

Q. Was he a short, kind of heavy-set man?

A. Yes, he was short. Heavy.

Q. He was kind of heavy.

A. Yeah, he was kind of stocky-built. Stocky build — whatever you call it.

Q. You wouldn't say he was kind of thin? (Oswald was thin.)

A. No, I wouldn't . . .

(Later, the woman talks about a visit by a policeman. "Some kind of policeman talked to me. You know, I don't know one from another.")

Q. Was it a plainclothesman?

A. No, he wasn't plainclothes.

Q. He had a police officer's uniform?

A. Had blue-looking clothes on.

Q. Cap?

A. Yes.

Q. Had a star—badge?

A. And I'm not supposed to be talking to anybody, because he said if I talked to anybody I might have to go to Washington.

Q. So, the police said you'd get a lot of publicity and you'd better not do it?

A. Yeah, I'd better not. Might get killed on the way to work.

Q. Is that what the policeman said?

A. Yes. See they'll kill people that know something about that. There's liable to be a whole lot of them.

A. Who?

Q. There might be a whole lot of Oswalds and things. You know, you don't know who you talk to, you just don't know. You have to be careful. You get killed.

Q. That's what the police said too?

A. Sure. They told me that I had to be careful.

2. A telephone conversation between Mrs. Helen Markham, another witness to the shooting, and New York attorney Mark Lane, who was retained by Oswald's mother, Mrs. Marguerite Oswald:

Lane: Would you say he (the killer of Ptl. Tippit) was stocky?

Mrs. Markham: He was short.

Lane: He was short. And was he a little bit on the heavy side?

Mrs. Markham: Not too heavy.

Lane: He wasn't too heavy. And would you say that he had rather bushy kind of hair?

Mrs. Markham: Yeah, just a little bushy, uh huh.

Lane (Later): Did you ever have a chance to see Mr. Oswald when he was alive? I mean after he was arrested. Did they bring you down to look at him?

Mrs. Markham: I saw him in the line-up.

Lane: Yes. And did he look anything like the man who shot the officer?

Mrs. Markham: I identified him.

Lane: You identified him as the man who did shoot? Did anyone point him out to you at that time as the man?

Mrs. Markham: No, they did not. (And later.) They didn't tell me one thing.

Lane (Still later): Did FBI agents tell you it's best not to discuss the case?

Mrs. Markham: Yes.

Lane: They did? And did Secret Service agents tell you it's best not to discuss the case?

Mrs. Markham: Yes sir.

3. The affidavit of Ptl. Seymour Weltzman of Dallas Police, who found the alleged rifle with which President Kennedy was assassinated:

... working with Deputy S. Boone of the Sher-

iff's Department and helping in the search (for a weapon or the assassin). We were in the northwest corner of the sixth floor (of the Texas School Book Depository Building) when Deputy Boone and myself spotted the rifle about the same time.

"This rifle was a 7.65 Mauser bolt action equipped with a 4-13 scope, a thick leather brownish-black sling on it. The rifle was between some boxes near the stairway. The time the rifle was found was 1:22 p.m.

"Capt. Fritz took charge of the rifle and ejected one live round from the chamber."

(But the assassination weapon is now officially designated as an Italian 6.5 Carcano Carbine. Oswald owned a Carcano, which he had bought from a Chicago mail order house.)

4. The day after President Kennedy was assassinated, taxicab driver William Wayne Whaley signed an affidavit swearing that he picked up Oswald a few minutes after the President was killed:

Mr. Whaley said he picked up Oswald at the Greyhound Bus Station and drove him to the 500 block of North Peckley st.

"This boy was small, five feet eight inches, slender, had on a dark shirt with white spots of something on it. He had a bracelet on his left wrist. He looked like he was 25 or 26 years old.

"At approximately 2:15 p.m. this afternoon, I viewed a line-up of four men in this (Dallas) City Hall. The number three man, who I now know as Lee Harvey Oswald, was the man who I carried from the Greyhound Bus Station to the 500 block of North Peckley."

But the next day, Dallas County Dist. Atty. Henry Wade said in a press conference:

"The next we hear of him (Oswald), is . . . where he got on a bus at Lamar st. (near the bus station). He told a lady—all this was verified by statements—told the lady on the bus that the President had been shot.

"He then . . . he asked the bus driver to stop, got off at a stop, caught a taxicab, driver, Darryl Click—I don't know the exact place—and went to his home in Oak Cliff, changed his clothes hurriedly, and left."

Police thus apparently tossed out taxicab driver Whaley's affidavit.

5. An affidavit from Michael Ralph Paine, husband of Mrs. Ruth Paine, at whose home Lee Oswald and his wife was living in Irving:

"Once, when I was at my wife's house, I saw a heavy pipe-like object wrapped in a rough blanket, tied with a string. This was in the garage. I picked this object up to get it out of the way of my power saw and thought it was tenting equipment.

"I was at work when I heard the President was shot from the Texas School Book Depository Building. I knew that Lee Oswald worked there, and I immediately thought of him and wondered if he might have shot the President, and wondered if I should call the FBI.

"I thought it unlikely that he shot the President, and that the FBI was fully aware of his presence there, and I did not want to contribute to his harassment which would be likely to occur due to his known Marxist views."

But the FBI apparently gave no thought to Oswald's presence in the School Book building.

6. The 23-page police report submitted to Dallas Chief of Police J. E. Curry by Asst. Chief Charles Batchelor, Deputy Chief George L. Lumpkin and Deputy Chief M. W. Stevenson, giving a detailed account of how the police tried to protect the President, and what happened on the fateful day of Nov. 22, 1963.

After the shooting the School Book Depository was sealed off, as were surrounding parking lots.

The report of the slaying of Ptl. J. D. Tippit came in, and Oswald was taken into custody.

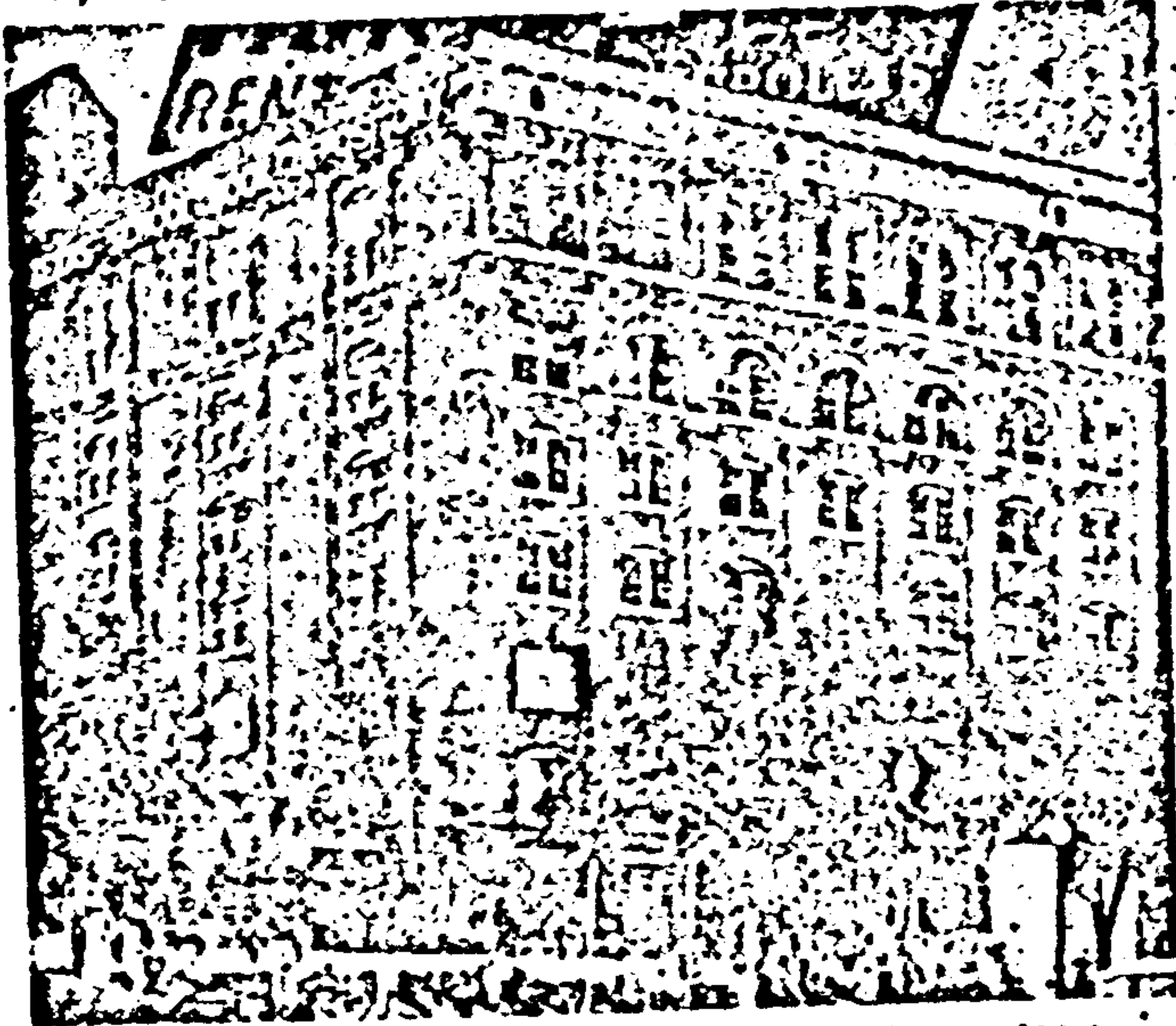
"When they (Batchelor and Stevenson) arrived at the City Hall, Stevenson went directly to the Homicide Bureau where he was advised that the suspect arrested in the slaying of Officer Tippit had been definitely identified as the one who had shot Officer Tippit, and from evidence being accumulated, it appeared he was possibly the suspect who had slain the President."

"Shortly before midnight, Stevenson was advised by Homicide officers that sufficient evidence had been gathered that it was determined that Oswald was also responsible for the slaying of President Kennedy, that the evidence had been reviewed by Dist. Atty. Henry Wade and Asst. Dist. Atty. Bill Alexander and charges were being preferred against Oswald in the death of President Kennedy.

Witness Warned, Q & A, Affidavits

While the nation and the world waits for the report of the Warren Commission—the full story of the greatest tragedy this nation has suffered in a century—new and significant disclosures of events surrounding the assassination of President John F. Kennedy have been obtained exclusively by this newspaper.

They are statements and affidavits. Presumably they will be incorporated in the voluminous report which President Johnson is now studying, and which peoples everywhere will receive in moods varying from curiosity to cynicism to anticipated relief that this dreadful chapter in history can be closed with a sigh.

Chief Justice Earl Warren and his distinguished seven-man committee have taken exactly 10 months to complete their difficult task. They have questioned a host of confused and confusing witnesses.

'I'm Not Allowed to Talk'

The important new points:

1—A woman who witnessed the killing of Officer J.D. Tippit was warned by police that her life would be in danger if she talked about the case to anyone. She gave what seemed to be a vivid description of the slayer—a description which did not fit Lee Harvey Oswald—but she made her statement after being promised that her name would not be revealed. She said:

"I'm not allowed to talk to anybody . . . Might get killed on the way to work . . . See, they'll kill people that know something about that."

2—Another eyewitness to the shooting of Officer

Tippl—Mrs. Helen Markham, who identified Oswald in a police lineup—also said she had been told not to talk by "several" persons whom she identified as FBI and Secret Service men, and four or five Dallas detectives.

Mrs. Markham signed an affidavit for the Dallas police, and one for the Secret Service. She also talked on the telephone to Mark Lane, New York attorney retained early in the case by Oswald's mother, Mrs. Marguerite Oswald. Mr. Lane taped her statement to him, and at first was accused by the Warren Commission of refusing to give them a copy of the tape, but he furnished the Commission with the tape more than two months ago and received an acknowledgement from J. Lee Rankin, general counsel to the Commission.

3—On Nov. 23, the day after the assassination, the Dallas police obviously were rounding up as many witnesses as possible and getting them to make statements and sign affidavits while the events were still clear in their minds.

Mystery of the Mauser

One of these was Seymour Wetzman, a Dallas policeman, who was one of two searchers to discover the alleged assassination rifle in the Texas Book Depository Building from which the shots were fired. He swore under oath:

"This rifle was a 7.65 Mauser bolt action equipped with a 4/13 scope, a thick black leather sling on it."

The Mauser seems to have been erased mysteriously from the case. The assassination weapon is now officially an Italian Carcano of another calibre. Lee Harvey Oswald owned a Carcano.

4—On Nov. 23, a cab driver named William Wayne Whaley signed an affidavit saying he had picked up a fare "who I now know to be Lee Harvey Oswald" a few minutes after the assassination and drove him a short distance—95 cents on the meter.

Yet on Nov. 24, District Attorney Henry Wade of Dallas County held a press conference in which he told reporters:

... he asked the bus driver to stop, got off at a stop, caught a taxicab driver, Darryl Click—I don't have the exact place—and went to his home in Oak Cliff, changed clothes hurriedly, and left."

A Name Is Changed

William Wayne Whaley became Darryl Click almost as casually and rapidly as the Mauser became a Carcano.

5—Also on Nov. 23, the police diligently obtained an affidavit from Michael Ralph Palne, although his connection with the case was somewhat remote. He was the estranged husband of Mrs. Ruth Palne, with whom Oswald and his wife and two children lived in Irving, a suburb of Dallas. Mr. Palne lived in an apartment in Grand Prairie, Texas.

He told the police he had been at work when he heard that President Kennedy had been shot from the Texas Book Depository Building, volunteering:

"I knew that Lee Oswald worked there, and I immediately thought of him and wondered if I should call the FBI. I thought it unlikely that he shot the President, and that the FBI was fully aware of his presence there, and I did not want to contribute to his harassment which would be likely to occur due to his known Marxist views."

Quite obviously, Oswald's "known Marxist views" did not attract the attention of the FBI on that fatal day.

Mrs. Palne has been quoted as saying she notified the FBI after she got Oswald his job in the Book Depository, but she believed he was working in the annex, not in the building along President Kennedy's parade route.

You have previously been advised of the fact that the USIA, with the conser. of the White House and with the cooperation of the Warren Commission, is preparing a motion picture of 30 minutes duration for showing overseas which will be based on the Commission report. Since last August, the USIA has been in contact with the Bureau and has asked our cooperation in the filming of certain scenes which are set out below. We have not moved on this project until we have a specific green light from the Commission to do so.

Reference is made to memo Rosen to Belmont dated 8/11/64 wherein Inspector Malley contacted Rankin on this matter and where he advised that the President's Commission does not desire the Bureau to furnish any specific information at that time and that they should contact the Commission and discuss the matter in detail.

On 9/21/64, Mr. Rankin called Kemper and stated that it would be perfectly satisfactory for the Bureau to cooperate with USIA and further that they had read and approved the script.

The producer of the show is Mr. Marvin Lipman, and he visited the Bureau on 9/22/64 after getting the "go ahead" from Rankin. He said that they would like the following:

1. A brief scene which would show 4 or 5 Agents walking into the front door (exterior) of the Commission offices. This would be carried over narration indicating that the Commission had full support of all law enforcement offices, including the FBI.
2. They would like to have the actual Agent from the Laboratory who testified before the Commission in connection with firearms identification. This would be SA Robert A. Frazier. He would give a very brief resume of his findings. (What he would say would be prepared by USIA and approved by us and by the Commission.)

3. Same situation as to the Document examiner who would be SA James C. Cadigan. It was his examinations which tied Oswald to the order for the gun, the order for the Post Office box and the money order. (Arrangements for text would be same as above.)
4. They desire the same thing in connection with the fingerprint examiner, who would be Sebastian F. Latona. (Text would be the same as stipulated above.)

Mr. Lipman in addition asked for numerous exhibits, documents, make-ups, etc. Kemper advised him that these were in the possession of the Commission and they would have to secure them through the Commission.

Mr. Lipman said that the script is still in the process of being prepared and the minute it is prepared we would have an opportunity to review it.

RECOMMENDATION:

This, of course, is merely a status memorandum to bring this matter up to date. If there are no objections, we will proceed to work cautiously with USIA and follow this project very, very closely. Anything to be done will first be cleared with the Director and with the Commission.
