Atlanta by airtel 2-2-65 advised

Atlanta, furnished information relating to the assassination on 2-1-65, which he received from an unidentified ADL employee in Miami, Florida. This employee obtained the data on 1-18-65 during a conversation with Dick Gregory, the rabble-rousing Negro comedian. stated the charges made by Gregory were so ridiculous [he] was amazed the ADL employee even considered sending the material to him; however, he furnished it so the Bureau would be aware of Gregory's activities. [Harris] requested that no one outside the Bureau be advised (he) had furnished this information.

In the letter to it was reported Gregory stated that the assassination of President Kennedy was master minded by J. Edgar Hoover and H. L. Hunt. Gregory allegedly tried to substantiate these charges by dis-3 playing photostatic copies of affidavits and fallacious and misleading press releases and public statements. The ADL employee noted Gregory did not display any concrete facts to support his charges. according to employee.

Gregory claimed the Warren Commission had two reports on the assassination and knew of the Director's and Hunt's participation; however; did not release the true facts as "chaos" would result. Gregory alleged the Director was one of the plotters due to a falling out with the Kennedys and the former Attorney General had been appointed to "watch over him" and slowly "ease him out" of the FBI. Gregory claimed to have positive proof H. L. Hunt financed the Black Muslims but such proof was "confidential." Gregory also alleges the FBI has him under constant surveillance and will some day in the near future but an end to his life. Further, that prior to the assassination President Johnson was aware of the plot but was powerless to stop it because to do so would admit, the FBI and the "Intelligence hierarchy" controlled the country.

Gregory reportedly stated there was a document written regarding the true facts of the assassination and that one man in Miami had been killed for having the document in his possession. Gregory refused to furn a copy of the document to the ADL employee saying it was too dangerous; however, he did furnish three pages of a document depicting what will be written in the year 2505 A.D. about the assassination, which according to the ADL employee, Gregory reluctantly admitted was written by his wife.

Other remarks allegedly made by Gregory include the statement that Mr. Hunt finances the "Minute Men" and most Agents who leave the FBI are engaged in radical right or extreme conservative movements.

GREGORY'S BACKGROUND

Bureau files indicate Gregory has in the past supported the Black Muslims, injected himself into the racial movement and espoused causes and individuals closely associated with the communist movement (100-440423-16).

ENCLOSED DOCUMENT

The three pages reportedly written by Gregory's wife appear to be part of a larger document as the pages are numbered 72, 73 and 74. These pages contain monstrous fabrications even more absurd than the trash put on by the infamous Mark Lane, reported communist sympathizer, and former New York assemblyman. The alleged facts of Oswald's participation and flight are so fantastic it does not seem possible that anyone even with a limited knowledge of the assassination could believe the story.





The reasons the "Young Turks" (socialists and Communists) gave for ousting the capable Malleck were vague. Not to say that Ford isn't just as capable. 



GABRIEL LOPEZ GUERRERO advised that he was physically well and knew what he was saying and understood the questions asked of him. He spoke fluently in both English and Spanish but preferred to speak in English.

He admitted having been drunk the previous day, and while he felt a bit of a hang-over, he again maintained that he was physically well.

LOPEZ GUERRERO advised that he had been arrested for being drunk and assaulting a woman at a local Saltillo hotel. He did not remember the name of the hotel or where it was located. He stated that from 7:00 a.m. on the morning of February 3, 1965, he had consumed a bottle of whisky and two cases of beer, and he could not recall exactly the circumstances of his activities until he found himself in jail that evening.

LOPEZ GUERREKO appeared startled when asked to explain his statements wherein he allegedly had something to do with the death of President KENNEDY and had threatened to kill the Governor of Coahuila. LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that he did not recall making such statements. He denied that he had anything to do with the death of President ÆMNEDY and said he would most certainly not kill the Governor of Coahuila. . He was asked if he knew the Governor of Coahuila, and he replied that he did, but he could not recall his name. He was asked to identify the Governor's photograph from a series of photographs hanging in the office in which he was being interviewed. He selected a photograph of former President of Mexico, ADOLFO LOPEZ MATEOS, and stated the photograph was that of the Governor of Ccahuila. He stated that the name, BRAULIO FERNANDEZ AGUIRRE, meant nothing to him, and this is the name of the Governor of Coahuila.

LOPEZ GUERRERO advised that he did not personally known the late President JOHN F. KENNEDY and that he had never actually seen the President. He stated that he held no anomosity or hatred for President KENNEDY or any other official of any government. He advised that he did not know LEE HARVEY OGWALD personally. He stated that he knew who OGWALD was from reading the press and knew he was the individual accused of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

LOPEZ GUERRERO viewed a number of photographs, including two of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and without hesitation he

selected a photograph of ONWALD and identified him correctly.

LOPEZ GUERRERO advised that he recalled being in Dallas, Texas, only on two occasions, both times only to change buses. The first time occurred in 1947 and the last early in 1963. He stated he did not stay overnight in Dallas.

LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that he had been to New Orleans on a number of occasions during his tour of duty in the Air Force but then only for short visits. He could not recall any contact with anyone during this time, which was between 1949 and 1951, approximately.

Regarding his location on November 22, 1963, LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that he was in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico, working for the Benjamin Franklin Library and a Mr. HYMAN SERGIO, 1401 Pedro Moreno Street. He stated that he was acquainted with Attorney LOPEZ MORENO, who knew that he was in Guadalajara at that time. LOPEZ MORENO has offices on Morelos Street in Guadalajara. LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that with Mr. SERGIO, he worked with retarded children. He stated the children had mental problems and described their problems as encephalitis. LOPEZ GUERRERO was asked to describe encephalitis and he stated that it was a mental condition, a "brain mass," and insisted that it was not a disease.

LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that he served in the United States Air Force from 1949 to 1352 and repeated his Air Force serial number twice, rapidly, as 5741055.

He advised that he had been given a medical discharge in 1952 from the Air Force, after having spent a number of weeks in the Air Force general hospital at Mobile, Alabama, he did not recall the exact name, where he was recovering from a nervous breakdown. He advised that he receives a pension for this disability amounting to \$250.00 a month. He said the checks are sent to his mother's home at 1104 Victoria Street, Beaumont, Texas, and identified his mother as LOLA PONDOJA.

LOPEZ GUERRERO stated that he had been arrested on a number of occasions for being drunk and fighting but could not recall the dates or places. The only serious crime with which he was charged was an attempted burglary, which he thought occurred in 1943. He stated, however, that no indictment was returned against him and he was released. CONFIDENTIAL

advised that he held no anomosity toward anyone, that he did not think he had enough nerve to kill anyone, and that he did not care for firearms or any other type of weapon. He could not think of what made him make such statements and repeated that he knew nothing about the assassination of President MEINEDY.

in Puerto Rico, the pro-Independence Movement of Puerto Rico is mentioned thusly:

"Electoral Farce: The pro-Independence Movement (MPI), which is made up of the more valiant Puerto Rican patriots, announced that the elections which gave the victory to the Popular Democratic Party were an example of an electoral farce. This announcement has been confirmed, in part, by the national committee of the gited party, which has begun a survey to find out why more than 200,000 Puerto Ricans did not register or vote in the elections.

Title: "United States: Who Killed Kennedy?"

The famous Warren report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, instead of clarifying the facts, it has hung a smoky weil over them. Such is the opinion of one of the more renown European historians, the Englishman, Hugh Trevor-Roper, Professor of Modern History at Oxford University.

of the report and is writing a book which refutes the assertions which are contained therein, pointing out the incongruities, contradictions and lack of investigative logic.

The English historian has exposed some of his ideas in the "London Sunday Times." These ideas have caused a sensation throughout Europe, even though the American press has given them very little space. According to Trevor-Roper, there are two outstanding points. The first thing is the manner in which they proceeded to arrest.

Lee Marvey Oswald, the accused Kennedy assassin, and second, the death of the policeman, D. D. Tippit (sic). The police gave Oswald's description and the order to arrest him, by radio, almost immediately after the President had been killed, without having any proof at all. To explain this anomaly, the Warren report says that a witness, Howard Brennan, saw them (sic) shoot from the window of the Texas School Book Depository Building and he told the police "a few minutes later." Trevor-Roper considers this to be improbable and suspects that the police had other proofs which they did not give to the Warren Commission.

Osvald and Captain Fritz questioned him for 12 hours, without even writing down one line of the questioning, taking shorthand notes or recording anything on tape. This seems impossible; nevertheless, the report claims that it is so. The FBI - Federal Bureau of Investigation could not have committed the grave error of not recording the questioning process, especially when it concerned the assassination of the President of the United States. Rither the record was destroyed, or the FBI is guilty of complete indifference - the Farren Commission has not bothered to find out.

In the first report issued by the doctors who attended Kennedy and made the autopsy, it says that Kennedy was hit from the front, and all of the police investigations were based on this assertion. It was supposed that the President was wounded when he approached the building or when he turned his bead toward it. However, the police, not being able to coordinate that which the doctors had said with their affirmations concerning Oswald's supposed responsibility, maintained that Kennedy was shot from behind. The doctors re-examined their opinion and agreed with what the police wanted. The doctors did not save their notes. In spite of all this, the Warren Commission considers everything that happened to be all right. "The police evidence concerning Oswald's arrest and the doctors notes were destroyed," says Trevor-Roper, "and the Warren Commission did not consider these anomalies 1 important."

At the place from where the shots were fired,
the police found a paper sack in which - they say - Oswald
put the fatal weapon. The sack was too small to hold the
weapon; nevertheless, the police analyzed and later
destroyed it, however, not without substituting a new sack,
see as to provide an instrumental proof. The police

explained to the Commission that they destroyed the paper sack because it was discolored and rumpled. The Commission conforms with this explanation, since the replica of the sack was the same as the original.

"After having completely destroyed all of the proof, says Trevor-Roper, sarcastically, "the police destroyed the supreme proof; Lee Harvey Oswald, the most important witness." How could Jack Ruby, Oswald's killer, enter the place where Oswald was in custody - even to the point of being held by two policeman - and kill him with one well-aimed shot from a revolver? He could have only gotten in the basement of the building with the consent or connivance of the police. Nevertheless, he did enter, and this is what the Warren Commission has not been able to clarify. In his initial declarations, Ruby refused to say how he had entered the place where Oswald was held. There appeared three policemen who declared that Ruby could have slipped-in to the place. Ruby then said that what the police reported was true.
