The following investigation was conducted by  
SAs THOMAS J. FAY and DAVID A. MARTIN at Fort Sam Houston,  
Texas:

On April 29, 1965, Investigator JIM MC CLENDON,  
Det. D, Fourth MP Gp., (CI), advised, that on April 28, 1965,  
Lieutenant Colonel (Retired) [REDACTED] turned over  
a wallet to the Fort Sam Houston MPs which he stated he  
found on the Brackenridge Golf Course at San Antonio,  
Texas. The wallet contained identification of [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] Warren, Michigan, and also  
contained the following identifying data:

Social Security Number 370-44-6681; [REDACTED]

Date of Birth May 3, 1946 - Detroit, Michigan;

Passport Number D673131.

Also [REDACTED] furnished photostatic copies of  
a letter addressed to [REDACTED] Warren,  
Michigan, bearing a pre-printed return address of JORGE C.  
"The 30th, 12th of October No. 87 1/2, Mexico 18, D. F., and  
contained a handwritten return address on rear of envelope  
as FIE L. A. H., MANUEL N. FONCE 304, Guadalupe Inn,  
Mexico 20, D. F.

The letter, signed (IL"EP", concluded by stating  
in postscript "I want to make you a question. Do you know  
the true about KENNEDY's death?"



Miss D. F. 20th of May 1964

Dear Dad:

I was studying but as I can not concentrate myself I decided to write you. I hadn't done it because I am now lonely, yes my friend, I am in love and hadn't been before. She is a 15 year old girl, the most beautiful girl I have ever met who has me crazy, and this is the time when I need to tell it to a very good friend, I do not know if she loves me but I have to make her to get in love, last Sunday I gave her a present and I spent all my savings, today I tried to see her I couldn't. You know how these things are here in Mexico. I would like that you be sure and go to get drunk, my Aunt Juana's don't understand me, they think I am a stupid; anyway well see what happen.

Changing the conversation I'll tell you that there is raining all day and night all time I feel wet. I am in ~~the~~ <sup>camping</sup> present outside of the city with the



scouts, he is chief of his group, I went  
with him this morning to the river -  
from where there are 500 scouts from  
4 states and all that place is wet  
and cold, you have to be crazy to go  
that, you know him.

Good news for me on that I'll go  
to take english and french, I am

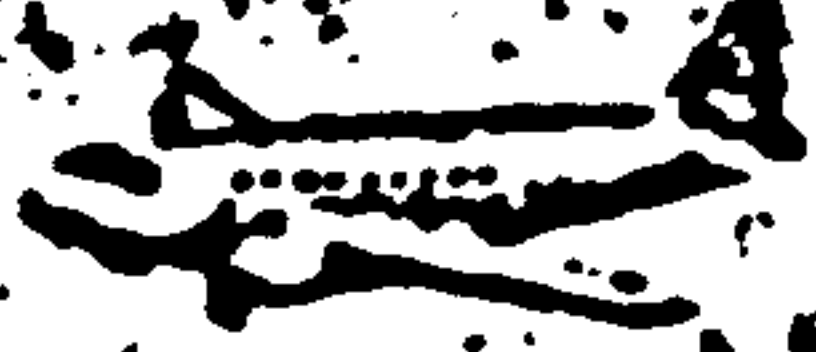

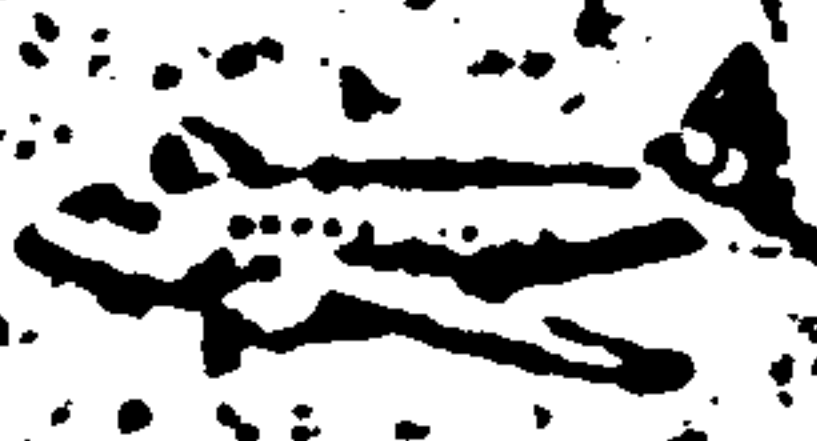

Michigan, furnished the following information:

He is acquainted with LOUIS HEREDIA ANCONA, who is the son of JORGE C. HEREDIA, and who resides at Manuel N. Ponce 304, Guadalupe Inn, Mexico 20, D. F. LOUIS ANCONA has a nickname of CHAVETA, which is what his family commonly calls him and he is a nineteen year old student at the University of Mexico, Mexico City.

[REDACTED] advised that he had first met ANCONA in June, 1963, at the International Institute, Detroit, Michigan, while ANCONA was in Detroit accompanied by a cousin who had formerly been an exchange student here. Later in the summer of 1963, ANCONA had visited for two weeks in [REDACTED] home.

[REDACTED] said that since that time he had corresponded with ANCONA an average of about once or twice a month. He said that in April, 1965, he had visited ANCONA in his residence at the above address in Mexico.

[REDACTED] said that on his return from Mexico, he had stopped in San Antonio, Texas, and while there he had lost his wallet. He said he believed he had lost his wallet in Brackenridge Park, San Antonio. [REDACTED] said that he was in San Antonio awaiting the receipt of some money to enable him to continue his trip home. He advised he was broke at the time and his wallet had no money in it although it did have some of his personal papers.

[REDACTED] said that his wallet also contained a letter from LOUIS HEREDIA ANCONA which had been signed with his nickname CHAVETA. He said this letter had been in an envelope which contained the return of ANCONA's father on the address side although the reverse side of the envelope contained the initials (L.A.H.) of ANCONA and his home address.

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██████████ said he recalled that in this letter ANCONA had added a postscript which stated "I want to make you a question. do you know the true about Kennedy's death?"

██████████ explained that subsequent to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY in November, 1963, this matter had been discussed in letters between him and ANCONA. He said ANCONA did not believe that such a crime could have possibly been perpetrated by a single individual acting alone and without any assistance. He said that ANCONA, at that time, believed that there was undoubtedly some type of conspiracy and probably a large organization behind the assassination. He said that even in April, 1965, when he last saw ANCONA, ANCONA still expressed some doubt that all of the facts surrounding the assassination had been made public.

██████████ said it was in this context of doubt that a single individual could commit the assassination that ANCONA had added the postscript to the letter. He said that ANCONA merely wanted his, ██████████ opinion as to whether or not others besides LEE HARVEY OSWALD were involved in the assassination.

██████████ advised that he had no first hand information concerning the assassination beyond what he had read and is positive that ANCONA has no information concerning it.

The following investigation was conducted by

AT LAKE LAND, FLA.

[REDACTED] New Dade City Highway,  
Lakeland, Florida, on May 26, 1965, volunteered the following  
information: *Received Jan 17 1969*

\* Shortly after President JOHN F. KENNEDY was killed,  
she had received a telephone call from a friend, [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] of Lakeland. [REDACTED] expressed  
her conviction that President KENNEDY had been killed upon  
instructions of the communists. She based this opinion on  
the speech of NIKITA KHRUSHCHEV, wherein he allegedly  
stated "I'll bury you". [REDACTED] said she heard  
this statement in Russian on television and the word trans-  
lated, "bury" was the Russian word "grub", which is a common  
term used by Russian peasants, properly translated as "kill",  
rather than "bury". [REDACTED] said this meant  
KHRUSHCHEV intended to kill the head of the U. S. Government,  
JOHN F. KENNEDY.

[REDACTED] said she was with [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] on one occasion when scenes of the questioning of Mrs.  
OSWALD were shown on television. [REDACTED] stated  
at that time, Mrs. OSWALD was giving only the information  
she wanted to give, not the truth.

[REDACTED] said American people are too  
naive. She expressed the belief both OSWALD and his wife  
were trained in Russia and sent to the United States for  
the specific purpose of killing President KENNEDY.

[REDACTED] advised that Mrs. GREBENSTCHIKOFF  
died in January, 1964.

[REDACTED] added that she had intended to  
report the above information to the FBI previously, but did  
not do so because she felt she was just being an alarmist.

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[REDACTED] Michigan Probation Officer,  
Port Huron, Michigan, furnished the following information:

Shortly after the murder of LEE HARVEY OSWALD by JACK RUBY, he had received a long distance telephone call from one [REDACTED] Cleveland, Ohio, at approximately two o'clock in the morning. He advised that [REDACTED] was very drunk and through some error she had gotten him, apparently thinking that he was the [REDACTED] who was on the Dallas Texas police force. [REDACTED] advised that just how [REDACTED] had happened to call Port Huron was never understood by him.

[REDACTED] said, however, that [REDACTED] rambled on and on in an almost incoherent manner and made little sense in her conversation. He stated that the only thing he was able to determine from [REDACTED] conversation was that she claimed to have worked for JACK RUBY as a "stripper" in Chicago, Illinois, and she suggested that she had lived with RUBY at one time.

[REDACTED] related that shortly after the published account of the remarriage of MARINA OSWALD, wife of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, in Texas, he had received a telegram from [REDACTED]. The telegram received by FOSTER states as follows:

[REDACTED] CARE POLICE DEPT.  
PORT HURON MICH

I HOPE YOUR NIGHTS ARE HAUNTING YOU NOW  
LIKE THEY ARE ME. YOU KNOW YOU COULD HAVE  
HELPED HER IF YOU WOULD. WHY DIDNT YOU HELP  
HER WHEN YOU COULD--

[REDACTED] CLEVELAND OHIO--"

[REDACTED] advised that none of the foregoing information makes any sense to him whatsoever and he has no idea what [REDACTED] was referring to, either in her telephone

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call or telegram to him. He said that he could only conclude this woman had initially contacted him in error and that she apparently drinks to excess and when so doing acts irrational.

[REDACTED] advised he did not know [REDACTED] MARINA OSWALD, LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY.



## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date August 4, 1965

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[REDACTED] Miller's Trailer Park, 8400 Russell Lane, Cleveland, Ohio, advised that she recalls telephoning [REDACTED] at Port Huron, Michigan shortly after the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. She stated she had also recently sent [REDACTED] a telegram.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was formerly an Undersheriff at Port Huron, Michigan. She stated that [REDACTED] was the Undersheriff at Port Huron when her sister, [REDACTED] was killed by her husband [REDACTED] in 1950. She stated that prior to her sister's being killed her sister had gone to [REDACTED] and asked for protection because she thought her husband was going to kill her as he had threatened to do so and he was armed with a gun. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] and the other officers at Port Huron did not take any action in the matter until [REDACTED] had killed her sister, [REDACTED]. She stated that her sister was well-known to [REDACTED] as at one time her sister had worked as a cook in the jail at Port Huron. *initial*

[REDACTED] stated that her sister's death bothers her and at times she does irrational things especially when she has been drinking alcoholic beverages. [REDACTED] stated that the times she has contacted [REDACTED] she had been drinking to excess.

After reading the telegram which states "I hope your nights are haunting you now like they are me you know you could have helped her if you would why didn't you help her when you could", [REDACTED] advised that this is the telegram she sent to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that she believes [REDACTED] and the other officers at Port Huron could have prevented her sister's death if they had taken the proper action at the time her sister complained to them regarding threats made by her husband.

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On 8/2/65 at Cleveland, Ohio File # Cleveland 62-1848

by SAs J. T. ARNETT & JOHN D. O'LOUGHLIN, JR./eds Date dictated 8/4/65

[redacted] advised that she does not know JACK RUBY and has never worked for him as a stripper in Chicago, Illinois, or any other place. She stated that she does recall carrying on a conversation with [redacted] regarding JACK RUBY but she did not state that she had worked for him as a stripper.

[redacted] advised that in the early 1940's she had worked as a stripper in several night clubs in Phoenix City, Alabama and after seeing JACK RUBY's picture she first thought that JACK RUBY was one of the men she had formerly worked for in Phoenix City, Alabama. [redacted] stated that after seeing several pictures of JACK RUBY she is positive that she does not know JACK RUBY and has never worked for him. She advised that [redacted] probably did not recall her because at the time she knew [redacted] she was married to [redacted]. [redacted] advised that she did not have any information concerning JACK RUBY or the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. She also stated that she did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD or MARINA OSWALD. She stated that the telegram she sent to [redacted] referred to the death of her sister and did not refer to MARINA OSWALD.

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By letter dated June 10, 1965, the Criminal Division of the U. S. Department of Justice furnished the FBI, Washington, D. C., a letter addressed to the President of the United States, bearing the signature [REDACTED], General Delivery, Spiro, Oklahoma." The envelope in which it was transmitted and also a letter bearing the name [REDACTED] Inmate [REDACTED]

These letters are quoted as follows:

"Spiro, Oklahoma  
May 26, 1965

"Mr. President,

"I have no idea to whom this should be sent. I also have no idea if it's true or not. This man is my husband and this is the first time I have ever know him to show much concern about another person, so I'm not taking any chances and throwing this in the waste basket!

"As we have seven children, please do not use our name if this is of any value to you. None of the children know I got this letter from their father.

"Dearest Honey & children:

"hope this finds each of you feeling good. boy it is hot down here. I got a letter from [REDACTED] and was glad to get it. I forgot to send the pictures you wanted back in my last letter so will put them in this letter. I am proud of the ones you gave me and thanks for sending the other ones for me to see. I wrote the Major here a letter asking him to take me out of the field on account of my health. I hope you can write Mr. Bets

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"soon. Our Warden here was a Major over the new building at the Wynne Farm, his name is Lanier. Oh yes I will try to get that correct address in La. Honey you know when I went to Kansas City the day before I got in jail I met three men that knew that President Kennedy was going to be killed. I was going to my apartment one evening about 4 PM and on my way there was a car parked and a man ask me for a match which I had as I had bought three boxes as the pilot light wouldn't work on the stove. I gave the man the box of matches. there was three men in the car. they offered the matches back. I told them to keep them. they ask me if I lived there. I told them my home was in Okla that I was looking for work. in return I ask them if they live there. One of the men in the back seat said him and the man beside him live there and called the man Roy in the front seat. said Roy and Al lived in Dallas. then the man in the front seat said it was about time Oswald was getting back. one of the men in the back seat said yes his wife was expecting him home then. there was a Rifle laying up against the back seat and I said that look like a nice gun and one of the men said that was a present of their President. I just figured they were giving the President of some company a present. One of the men offered me a drank and I told them I didn't drink. so I went on home and when I got to the (illegible) Prison and when the President was killed and they said what the Kiiler name was I knew I had heard that name Oswald in the last few days. Well it came to me where I had heard it. I never mention it to a living soul in Kansas. one reason I didn't think they would believe me and another reason I knew my life wouldn't be worth much in prison if the men found out that I had told than. so when I got to the Diagnostic Center I told the Warden there and told him I would take a lie test to prove I was telling the truth. I want you to write President Johnson and tell him or send him this letter and tell him I will take a lie test on this. I have seen these men a thousand times in my mind since then. I will know them all if I should see them again. Any way there are three men walking the street that knew or had a part in the killing of President Kennedy. I realize what my life will be worth when these men find out who can point them out. they will be looking to get shed of me but I am willing to take that chance. I want the President to know this and I know you will write him.

[redacted] Texas Department of Corrections  
[redacted] Inmate, Ransey Unit # 1, furnished the following  
information:

He was in Kansas City, Kansas, on about October  
16, 1963, seeking employment.

He advised upon his arrival in Kansas City he had  
rented an apartment, street unrecalled, and one evening  
about 3:30 P.M. while returning to his apartment after  
seeking employment, he started past a car which was parked  
parallel to the curb in a residential area about five blocks  
from the Young Men's Christian Association.

He said as he was walking past this car, an indi-  
vidual seated in the rear seat called to him and asked  
if he had a match. He stated he walked to the car noting  
that it contained three people, one in the front seat under  
the wheel and two in the rear seat. He stated he had three  
boxes of matches in his possession which he had bought be-  
cause the pilot light on the stove in the apartment he rented  
did not work. He said he stepped down off the curb to give  
a box of matches to the individual who had called to him  
saying that all three occupants of the car had cigars in  
their mouths

[redacted] said after each of the individuals had  
lit their cigar, they started to hand the matches back  
to him at which time he told them to keep them and told  
them why he had the extra matches. He said when he told  
them about his pilot light not working they asked him if



his home was in Kansas City. He said he replied that it was not and that he was in the city looking for work but his home was in Oklahoma. He said he asked them if Kansas City was their home and one of the individuals in the rear seat, "a big Indian looking guy," said the fellow next to him lived in Kansas City but ROY, pointing to the fellow in the front seat and AL lived in Dallas. He stated he only saw three people and assumed they were waiting for another person. He said when the big Indian, looking guy mentioned ROY and AL lived in Dallas, ROY spoke up and said "it's about time OSWALD was getting back." He said the Indian thereupon spoke up and said "yeah, my wife is expecting at home now."

██████████ stated while talking to these individuals, he noticed a rifle, make unknown, leaning against the back seat of the car and remarked that it was a nice looking gun. He said the Indian laid his hand on the gun and said "this is a present of our president." He said he assumed they were talking about the president of a company. He said when the Indian said that, the other fellow in the back seat picked up a bottle of whiskey and offered him a drink. He said he told them he did not drink whereupon they passed the bottle around among themselves.

██████████ stated when he started to leave, they all wished him good luck in looking for a job.

██████████ advised he does not know the make or model of the car the aforementioned individuals were in; however, he recalled it was two tone with a light blue bottom and a light green top. He said he does not recall the license tags which were on the car and does not know whether it was a two door or four door; however, presumes it was a four door. He said he does not recall any dents, scratches, or other distinguishing marks on the car.

[redacted] further advised he was standing on the passenger side of the car talking to the aforementioned individuals and he observed the individual who he assumes to have been named ROY had his legs up on the front seat and noticed the shoe on his left foot was built up quite a bit. He said this individual was in his thirties, was wearing a dark jacket, dark colored pants, and a hat. He stated he had a short build, was dark complexioned and had a round face.

He said the fellow sitting behind ROY, the big, fat, looking guy, was forty to fifty years of age, looked to weigh over 200 pounds, had dark hair, dark eyes, and was dark complexioned. He said he was dressed in a dark suit and was bare headed. He said he "looked like a mopped dog", that he could not look you in the eye and talk to you.

He advised the other individual in the rear seat was light complexioned, had a mole in his right cheek, sandy haired, had a slim build, and he believes he was wearing short sleeves and wearing khaki pants.

[redacted] advised while in jail in Kansas upon learning of the death of President KENNEDY and learning the name of the person accused of killing President KENNEDY, he came on him where he had heard that name before and immediately thought about telling the warden of the Lansing Prison, Lansing, Kansas, about the foregoing but could not get in to see the warden.

[redacted] advised when he learned that he was being moved from the Texas authorities he made up his mind that he would write the Governor of Texas and to the President of the United States about his conversation with the aforementioned individuals.

COMMENTS OF [REDACTED]  
PHARR, TEXAS, CONCERNING THE . . . . .  
ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

The following investigation was conducted by  
SA CHRISTOPHER C. ISBELL, JR.:

On July 6, 1965, [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] Pharr, Texas, advised he was in Dovie's Tavern,  
107 East Park Street, Pharr, Texas, on the afternoon of  
July 6, 1965, and was seated near the following described  
persons:

1. A white male American who was between 55 and 60 ..  
years of age, 66 inches tall, weighing 138 pounds, ..  
thin build, dark complexion, and with gray whiskers.  
This man had on an old gray hat and was wearing  
shabby khaki clothing.
2. A white female American of Latin-American extraction,  
about 50 years of age, 65 inches tall, and weighing  
160 pounds. She had a medium complexion, gray hair,  
and was wearing a yellow dress.

[REDACTED] said the above male was talking rather loudly  
and constantly and during the course of his conversation with  
the above female discussed the assassination of President  
JOHN F. KENNEDY. This unknown male made the statement that  
he was sure that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was not alone in the slaying  
of President KENNEDY but was working with a group or in  
an association in the matter. This individual talked with  
assurance and his manner of speech indicated that he possibly  
had firsthand knowledge of some of the facts. He was not  
intoxicated at the time. [REDACTED] said he was not aware of  
the true facts of the assassination but felt it his duty  
to bring the above to the attention of the FBI for appropriate  
handling.

[REDACTED] Dovie's Tavern, on  
July 6, 1965, said the above described persons were in  
the place on the afternoon of July 6, 1965, and that she  
overheard the unknown male discussing the assassination of  
President KENNEDY but that she did not remember any of the  
exact conversation. She stated both people are local residents  
and come to the bar frequently but that she did not know  
their names or place of residence.

Investigation and interview with [REDACTED] Pharr, Texas, on July 6, 1965, disclosed the above male was [REDACTED] and the female was [REDACTED] both of Pharr, Texas. Neither was at home on the evening of July 6, 1965.

On July 7, 1965, [REDACTED] Pharr, Texas Police Department, said he had ascertained that [REDACTED] was mentally disturbed, an alcoholic, and a pathological liar. [REDACTED] was the type of person who had a solution or explanation for many solved and unsolved "police" cases over the United States and his information could not be relied upon.

On July 7, 1965, [REDACTED] Pharr, Texas, stated she was present with [REDACTED] at Dovie's Tavern, Pharr, Texas, on the afternoon of July 6, 1965. She was wearing a yellow dress at the time. She said that she does not speak or understand English and, therefore, had no information regarding what [REDACTED] might have said on July 6, 1965. She pointed out that she merely says "Yes" once in a while and that [REDACTED] just keeps talking when she is out with him.

On July 7, 1965, [REDACTED] Pharr, Texas, stated he was drinking beer with [REDACTED] in Dovie's Tavern, Pharr, Texas, during the afternoon of July 6, 1965. He said he talked about the assassination of President KENNEDY and expressed the opinion that OSWALD was not alone in the killing of the President and must have had some help from some group or association or gang. He declared that this was merely his thought or opinion and that he had no facts or information to back it up and that he had no personal information or knowledge of the assassination of Mr. KENNEDY.

[REDACTED] furnished the following descriptive data concerning himself:

[REDACTED] Memphis, Tennessee, was interviewed at the Memphis Office of the FBI, at which time he furnished the following information:

He stated that he is employed as a truck driver by the Southern Forwarding Truck Lines, Memphis, Tennessee. He stated that on May 11, 1965, at approximately 12:45 p.m., he was talking with a truck driver who is employed by the Herrin Truck Lines, Memphis, and who is known to him as [REDACTED]

He advised that [REDACTED] advised him that he [REDACTED] knows an individual who is presently employed with the Memphis Air Control, Municipal Airport, Memphis, who was formerly employed with a radio station in Dallas at the time of the assassination of JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] told him that this individual knew that the route for the motorcade carrying President KENNEDY into Dallas had been changed and that he was aware of this change 20 minutes before it took place. He stated further that this individual reportedly told [REDACTED] that he knew that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been in the building where the rifle shots had been fired at President KENNEDY since 7:00 a.m. on the day of the assassination.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] also stated that this individual had information that Chief Justice EARL WARREN, who had been appointed by President JOHNSON to investigate the assassination of former President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, had received payoffs to close the investigation and that President LYNDON B. JOHNSON was responsible for KENNEDY's assassination.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] indicated that this individual who had furnished him this information seemed to know what he was talking about and was afraid to report it to proper authorities. [REDACTED] advised that he asked [REDACTED] what the name of this individual was and [REDACTED] did not answer him. He advised that he does not know whether or not this information will be of any value and is reporting it to the FBI for their consideration.

**[REDACTED]** Memphis, Tennessee, was interviewed at the Freeman Truck Lines parking lot, East Street, Memphis, at which time he furnished the following information:

He stated that he is a truck driver for the Herrin Transportation Company, Memphis. He advised that in March, 1965, he was driving a truck through Georgia. He stated that he stopped at a coffee shop in Columbus, Georgia, and met a truck driver whose name is unknown to him. He stated that this individual was driving a citrus truck and he could furnish no additional information concerning his identity.

He advised that while at the coffee shop, he and this individual had conversations concerning the Negroes in the South and the present situations in Alabama and Mississippi in connection with the Negro Civil Rights Movement. He advised that during this conversation he and this truck driver began discussing the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY. He advised that this individual told him that he knew an individual who had worked for a radio station in Dallas at the time of KENNEDY's assassination. **[REDACTED]** stated that this individual advised him that his friend who was employed by the radio station in Dallas was believed to have moved to Memphis, Tennessee, in connection with his membership in either the Tennessee National Guard or the U. S. Army Reserves.

**[REDACTED]** advised that during his conversation with this individual, the truck driver, he expressed his opinions on what he thought was involved in the assassination of President KENNEDY. He advised that this truck driver's only mention of his friend who had worked at a radio station in Dallas was that his friend knew that President KENNEDY's motorcade route was to be changed. **[REDACTED]** advised that this individual stated that he wondered why they sent EARL WARREN to investigate the assassination of President KENNEDY since he (WARREN) is supposed to have been associated with the Communist cause. He advised that this individual also stated that he believed President JOHNSON was probably responsible for the assassination of President KENNEDY.

██████████ stated that these comments were the opinion of the truck driver he had met at a coffee shop in Columbus, Georgia, and were not those of anyone else. He advised that this individual seemed to be a talker. He advised that this individual never stated that he knew any of the above comments were factual or that he could substantiate any of the allegations. He advised that this was the first and last occasion that he had ever seen this individual. He further advised that the coffee shop at which he stopped in Columbus, Georgia, was located on Highway 280 and he believes that this individual mentioned delivering citrus fruits in West Virginia. He stated that he never mentioned that the man who was employed with a radio station in Dallas was working for the Air Traffic Control at the Municipal Airport in Memphis but did state that this individual might be in the National Guard which has headquarters near the Memphis Airport. He advised that in his conversation with the truck driver at Columbus, Georgia, there was no definite statement that he knew that this individual was in the National Guard or Reserves and had only made a passing comment in this regard.

LEROY WILLIAMS, SR. - INFORMATION  
REGARDING ASSASSINATION

BASIS

By letter dated May 15, 1965, [REDACTED], 3 North 11th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, advised the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that he had information relative to the assassination of President KENNEDY. Within the following approximate two-week period, he wrote two other letters to the Director of the FBI, one undated and with postmark illegible. He gave personal data about himself, such as Social Security Number, driver's license, and photograph. The other letter, undated, but with postmark, Minneapolis, Minnesota, May 28, 1965, spoke of his letter of May 26, 1965.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent RAYMOND H. WILLIAMS:

On June 2, 1965, [REDACTED] Hennepin Hotel, 3 North 11th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, stated he furnished full information in his possession regarding the assassination of President KENNEDY in a second letter sent to the Director of the FBI approximately one week following his letter to the Director which was dated May 15, 1965. [REDACTED] said he could not recall the contents of the second letter and stated he does not remember any information he may have had regarding the assassination of President KENNEDY. He appeared cooperative and said he would try to answer any questions which may arise from information which he set forth in his letters. He appeared to have considerable difficulty with his memory and gave the appearance of being mentally slow.

On June 21, 1965, [REDACTED] Hennepin Hotel, 3 North 11th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, stated
