Mr. Tolson, Department Attorney General Katznenbach stated at 1:30 p.m.
that said in his opinion in the department of Justice had been to see
former Solicitor General Miller and he had informed him
of his position on the subject of the President's Commission. He
also know what thought of it. I told him that the Secret Service
General Miller had called and asked that the Commissioner
be checking files and will furnish the results to him later.

Mr. Tolson said that Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy had
looked at our report and were satisfied with the Secret Service
is coming over to look at it. Thereafter, he will call me so that
we can have the benefit of any observations he has. I told him
he ready to come over at any time.

Mr. Tolson said he has been in touch with Sorrells and
White House with the thought in mind that rather than have
the Commission go over to the President, the President could instruct the
Department of Justice or it is the President's Commission. It is
best to keep it outside the White House until the Commission has
done its work. I may be incorrect as to this but did tell him earlier that
it was my understanding from the Department of Justice that
other than the fact it has transmitted the report to the President.

Rosenbach said that the other thing he had in
mind was to get it relative to the allegations made by the
Dallas Police that the man who was shot at the time of the
assassination and was held as a suspect in the killing
was wearing a different spec on this gun. I told
Rosenbach that my recollection was that the Dallas Police had the
slug bullet identification of the sniper and did not have Oswald
as a suspect. I am checking this out to be sure.

Rosenbach asked if we would have additional copies of the
report for the Commission. I told him we would have additional
copies of the report but would wait until the Commission asked
for them.

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
