Julivan, 12/19/63, captioned "Warren Commission" in which CIA advised Liaison Agent repich that Francis Adams, Albert Jenner and Ers. Julia Side have been appointed to serve on the Commission. Dureau files reveal the following concerning these individuals: There is attached for your information a complete summary prepared for the Director concerning Francis W. L. Adams dated 9/11/58. In addition, our files reveal that in 1961 the Pepartment requested an investigation be instituted concerning Adams, who was then being considered as a U. S. District Judge in New York. Frior to the completion of the investigation, the Attorney Congral asked that we discontinue of the investigation, the Attorney General asked that we discontinue the investigation as Adams' name had been withdrawn. The Attorney General did not elaborate in this connection. Unly one report was submitted which was by the Chicago Division which revealed no derogatory information. Our files contain no additional pertinent information. Albert S. Jenner, Jr., was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1907, educated at the University of Illinois and admitted to the Illinois Bar in 1939. No investigation has been conducted by the Bureau concerning Jenner; however, our files reveal that during 1952-1953 he was a member of the J. S. Loyalty heview Board and has since 1956 served as a Special Assistant Attorney General of the State of Illinois. he is a member of the U. S. Bureau files also reveal that information was received in fiarch, 1951, that the Illinois Senate sitting as a committee of the whole conducted hearings on Senate Bill 102. This bill provided that persons affiliated with organizations advocating the overthrow of the Government be barred from public office and from teaching positions. At this hearing a statement prepared by Jenner was read to the Senate. This statement set forth that the views expressed were the personal views of Jenner and not of any organization. Jenner in the statement indicated that the proposed legislation would actually defeat the purposes of the sponsors and would create the machinery for the persecution of good citizens. According to the statement, Jenner believed the bill to be unconstitutional and the then present laws to be sufficient. The statement indicated that the bill provides for guilt by accusation and would violate due process of law. Jenner in the statement objected to the fact that there was no guide provided for determining whether or not an organization is subversive.

an informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Albert E. Jenner, Jr., 11 South Laballe Street, Chicago, was in 1940 a member of the National Lawyers Suild, which has been cited as a communist front by the Special Committee on Un-

Dureau files reveal no other pertinent data concerning Jenner.
