The following information is submitted for justification of continuance of payment of this informant in accordance with Section 107 N of Manual of Instructions.

1. Recommendation

I recommend that authority be granted to continue payments to the above informant up to \$50.00 per week for services, plus up to \$15.00 per week for expenses actually incurred, for a period of four months, effective September 27, 1960.

In connection with informant's employment, it is noted that on August 4, 1960, the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) ended hearings in Miami, Florida, in which attorneys for the NLRB won an agreement from fifteen Miami electrical contractors to break their ties with United Southern Employees Association (USEA), accused of operating for employers' benefit. The agreement also included a provision that USEA in Miami will be disbanded. The above agreements, which have not been approved to date, are subject to approval by the NLRB and the United States Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals.

3. Current Membership in Subversive Organizations

He is a member of the Northern League, National States Rights Party, and an honorary member of the Association of South Carolina Klans. He is also temporary National Adjutant of the National Ku Klux Klan.

4. Summary of Information Furnished and/or Services Rendered During Pertinent Period

Since the submission of Miami letter of May 12, 1960, informant has continued to be in close association and contact with the segregation and Klan leaders in Miami and South Florida. His close associates include

Informant has reported on the activities of all of these individuals and secured literature distributed by them. In addition, through informant's association with [REDACTED] informant has attended three meetings of all Klan leaders in southeastern United States. These meetings were held in Atlanta, Georgia, on May 22, 1960, in Orlando, Florida, on July 17, 1960, and in Stone Mountain, Georgia, on September 3 and 4, 1960. Informant

has been able to report in detail on the activities of these meetings, wherein the Klan has established a national Ku Klux Klan group which has been meeting every two or three months. Informant is temporary National Adjutant of this organization and has been invited to attend their next meeting, scheduled for October 23, 1960, in Savannah, Georgia.

5. Amount Paid for Services and Expenses by Month.

The following is a breakdown of payments to this informant, showing amount paid for services, amount paid for expenses, amount paid for three special trips, (with Bureau authorization) from May 3, 1960, to September 7, 1960:

The informant has advised that since the amounts were negligible, he did not wish to be reimbursed for this additional expense, above that authorized by the Bureau.

6. Type and Number of Meetings Attended and Other Activity

In addition to the activity and the meetings referred to, informant attends weekly, every Monday night, meetings of the Florida States Rights, Inc., a group dedicated to oppose integration. During this period, the informant has attended meetings with the following individuals:

7. Number of Written and Oral Reports Submitted

Informant furnishes oral information almost daily, either by telephone or personal contact with an Agent. Proper security precautions are taken in each contact.

8. Information Furnished of Unusual Value

Informant secured detailed information on the efforts of the various Klan leaders to consolidate under

a national Ku Klux Klan, in the meetings mentioned hereinbefore in Atlanta, Orlando and Stone Mountain. He provided coverage at some of these meetings at the request of other offices, where their coverage was deemed inadequate. He is now a member of this organization and firmly entrenched with the Klan leadership.

9. Approximate Number of Persons on Whom Informant Furnished Coverage and Their Importance

See 4, supra, for this information.

10. Informant's Potential for Advancement

Informant's potential is very good. He has a strong position in the new National Ku Klux Klan, which has strengthened his effectiveness in Florida. As a result of the informant's strength within the Klan and using his position with the USEA, he is in a position to go to any one of several southeastern states and obtain pertinent and confidential information of value to the Bureau.

11. Stability and Reliability

He has not demonstrated or displayed any personal weaknesses, emotional instability, untrustworthiness or unreliability. He has no domestic or personal problems that would cause embarrassment to the Bureau.

12. Indoctrination Against Disclosure

Every opportunity has been taken to properly indoctrinate this informant against making any disclosure of the relationship between him and the Bureau through any media. He is well aware of this.

13. All Necessary Action Taken on Information Furnished

Information furnished by this informant is given prompt and necessary action and dissemination by the Miami Office.

14. Miscellaneous

Informant also picks up occasional bits of criminal information. This is incidental to his work in racial field.

Based on your recommendation, authority is hereby granted to pay captioned informant up to \$50 per week for services plus up to \$15 per week for expenses actually incurred for a period of four months, effective 9/27/60. A review of captioned informant's file discloses that despite prior expressions of disapproval by the Bureau as to paying the informant the full amount authorized each week you continue to regularly pay him \$50 weekly for services rendered. As you know, payments to informants are to be made on a strict C.O.D. or expense basis and are to be commensurate with the worth of the information furnished or service rendered by the informant. It does not seem logical that an informant will furnish information or render services week in and week out which can be regularly valued at an equal amount.

You are reminded that it is your responsibility as SAC to make certain the Bureau receives full value for all monies paid to this informant and that his payments have not become a mere habitual rendering of \$50 each week without due regard to the value of his activities in our behalf.

The Bureau observes that item number seven of your payment letters, the paragraph relating to the number of reports submitted by the informant, does not set forth the information called for. The statement that the informant furnishes oral information almost daily is not responsive and the Bureau desires to know the actual number of reports submitted by him during the period.

In the future submit only the first page of the third copy of correspondence relating to payments in accordance with the FBI Handbook, Part I, page 20c.

NOTE: [REDACTED] is William Somerset who is a member of the Northern League; the National States Rights Party; an honorary member of the Association of South Carolina Klans and temporary national Adjutant of a newly organized federation of various Klan groups throughout the South. During the past period he attended approximately 28 meetings of various types dealing with segregation and has been in frequent contact with segregation and Klan leaders in southern Florida. Effective 5/31/60, and for four additional months Bureau authorized up to \$50 per week for services plus up to \$15 per week for expenses. For the period 5/3/60, through 9/7/60, informant was paid a total of \$900 for services and \$517.54 for expenses. Latter includes three special trips for which separate expense authorizations were granted. By letter 1/27/60, Bureau cautioned Miami against making regular service payments in the full amount authorized. By letter 5/26/60, Bureau cautioned Miami to be certain apparent high expense payments to informant for special trips taken by him were justified and could be supported by appropriate expense statements.

[redacted] have both advised CI that they have been to Tennessee and South Carolina on request from the Dixie Klan to make speeches and participate in "car caravans." CI stated that it is his understanding [redacted] were formerly connected with the U.S. Klan in Georgia.

CI related that during the last meeting of the National Ku Klux Klan held at Stone Mountain, Ga., on Labor Day week-end,

The Miami Office is presently attempting to develop Racial Informants in the areas of Fort Pierce, Okeechobee and Stuart, Fla., where there is some Klan activity known to exist. Sources in the areas have furnished information on a fringe basis concerning the activities of the Klan; however, the intermost working of the Klan has not been developed since it has been difficult to get informant coverage due to the limited population and the fact that most of the individuals known to be in the Klan areas, radical, irrational, unstable individuals with a lack of responsibility.

On 7/17/60, [REDACTED], while attending the National Ku Klux Klan meeting in Orlando, Fla., was invited by [REDACTED] to come to Fort Pierce and to assist in further developing the Klan. In addition, [REDACTED] Fla. Knights in the Ku Klux Klan, New Smyrna Beach, Fla., has also requested [REDACTED] to attend some Klan meetings in the Fort Pierce and Okeechobee areas and that he will meet with CI and introduce him to the various leaders.

CI stated that when he contacted [REDACTED] on 9/19/60, [REDACTED] stated that he probably would not be in a position to go to Miss. with CI. [REDACTED] also did not elaborate on this meeting, but did say that any future attempts by the CONGRESS OF RACIAL EQUALITY (CORE) to force integration in Miss. and La. would result in serious injury to those participating.

CI was again questioned concerning his previous contact with [REDACTED] in Jackson, Miss. during the latter part of 1959. 

Informant advised that he knew of no units of the KKK operating in New Orleans, La., although he knew [REDACTED] as a leader of the KKK of Miss. who attended an Atlanta convention, and he also advised there was a klan group operating in the vicinity of Shreveport whom he did not know.

Informant advised that [REDACTED] was in New Orleans according to information received from [REDACTED]. Informant advised that he personally knew [REDACTED] as well as [REDACTED] and a man named [REDACTED] who were bombing suspects in Atlanta, and if they were in New Orleans, he believed he could locate them.

On 11/17/60 informant sent a telegram to [REDACTED] and received an air mail special delivery letter containing a copy of the Thunderbolt and instructions to contact [REDACTED].

Informant advised that he talked to [REDACTED] the Southern Knights of the KKK in Clearwater, Fla., 11/13/60 before leaving Fla. and his organization was standing by for instructions to come to New Orleans. Informant advised that [REDACTED] is a big talker and may have been talking for his benefit and informant did not put much stock in his comments.

Informant departed New Orleans, La., 11/28/60 at 5 p.m.; and he advised that to his knowledge he received no information to indicate that the KKK had sent representatives to New Orleans. Informant advised that he will be in contact with the members of the KKK and in the event there is future indication that they are sending representatives to the New Orleans area he will immediately furnish this information to SA [REDACTED] or to the nearest FBI office.

NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY

Informant was instructed on 11/15/60 to develop all information possible regarding the activities of [redacted] the National States Rights Party and determine if he was in New Orleans, La. On 11/17/60 he wired [redacted] and on 11/18/60 a letter was received which informant believes came from [redacted] personally as the letter was signed by [redacted] although informant advised he does not recognize [redacted] handwriting. Informant kept handwritten note as a means of introduction to [redacted] but made available the New Orleans edition of the Thunderbolt and the envelope addressed to informant postmarked Birmingham, Ala., 11/18/60. NEW ORLEANS, LA.

Informant on night of 11/19/60 contacted [redacted]

New Orleans.

Informant advised that he learned from [redacted] that [redacted]

[redacted] the States Rights Party, New Orleans, and gives orders to [redacted]. Informant advised that [redacted] has not personally met [redacted] although he has corresponded with him and spoken to him on the phone. Informant advised that [redacted] told him that [redacted] did not come to New Orleans but only to Denham Springs. Informant advised that [redacted] claimed to be working with the kids of this area and was giving instructions to kids selected to be the leaders. Informant indicated [redacted] claimed he was working with a man from St. Bernard Parish. Informant was not able to identify this man but said it was his impression that it was the Deputy Sheriff of St. Bernard that was arrested by the New Orleans PD. Informant also advised that [redacted] told him that he was working most of

the day of 11/19/60 assisting in the organization of private schools and [redacted] said that the man who was interviewed on television regarding the organization of private schools was a friend of his. While with [redacted] on 11/19/60, [redacted] told him that the KKK was marching that night and that the whole South was behind New Orleans in this integration fight. He said that the integration fight will not be lost in New Orleans and that if it is the whole South is gone. Informant also advised that [redacted] told him that there was to be a meeting with President-Elect KENNEDY by a committee of the La. State Legislature in Palm Beach to obtain KENNEDY's opinion on the Federal Court's taking over the states and if President-Elect KENNEDY is unco-operative with the states then the South will start a drive to obtain a delegate switch to throw the election into the House of Representatives. Informant advised that [redacted] obtained this information from [redacted]

Informant advised that [redacted] was not advocating violence and wanted to avoid any trouble with the U. S. Marshals. He advised that [redacted] indicated he had no intentions at this time to take any action except to pitch in and help any movement that is being organized. Informant advised that [redacted] claimed that he had signed up 45 men in the National States Rights Party and sent in \$5 for each man. Informant advised that [redacted] told him there was to be a meeting of the Citizens Council at Monroe, 11/22. He advised that [redacted] said the Citizens Council collected \$42,200 at the Citizens Council Rally held at New Orleans Municipal Auditorium, 11/15/60. Informant advised that [redacted] told him that the National States Rights Party would have a strategy meeting at Chattanooga, Tenn., 11/25/60.

On 11/24/60 informant advised that he went with [redacted] to Denham Springs to contact [redacted] [redacted] was out of the city.

Informant advised that [redacted] received a letter inviting him to the meeting at Chattanooga and there learned that the meeting was to be conducted in the hall owned by the Dixie Klan and one of the Dixie Klan leaders was to act as chairman of the meeting.

He advised that [redacted] was very much concerned that the National States Rights Party and the Dixie Klan were so closely identified particularly after informant told him that the Dixie Klan had been suspected to be involved in a series of bombings in Tenn. Informant advised that both [redacted] are very much concerned that they will be drawn into some illegal activities and were also very much concerned over the type of literature being published [redacted] the Thunderbolt, particularly some of the attacks against the FBI.

On 11/28/60 informant advised he met again with [redacted] on 11/27 and was introduced by [redacted] to a [redacted] the Consolidated Independent Democrats of New Orleans, La., 3801 Magazine Street, telephone No. Twinbrook 1-8257 which is a States Rights Segregation Group. Informant advised that in talking with [redacted] this is apparently a local group who believes in segregation; however, he did not obtain any literature or additional information regarding their aim.

NEW ORLEANS, LA.

CITIZENS COUNCIL, NEW ORLEANS, LA.

Informant on 11/16/60 advised that he attended the Citizens Council meeting at the auditorium on the night of 11/15/60. He advised that at the rally he met and talked with [redacted]. He advised that he talked with him off and on for a two-hour period and [redacted] in his conversation recommended that the schools be boycotted. He stated that "they" were not going to allow schools to be integrated and "they" were going to boycott the schools. Informant advised that [redacted] stated that "they" intended to use every legal means to keep the schools open and segregated and if they fail then--"the works." Informant advised that "they" was the Citizens Council and he assumed that [redacted] meant by "the works" that violence might be resorted to. [redacted] told the informant that "they" had the backing of every patriotic organization in the country and that [redacted] could have 500,000 people to help in the battle. [redacted] remarked that they would have to go down fighting in New Orleans or the Communist Party and the Negroes would take over. Informant advised that "they" were going to use the teenagers and mothers to disrupt the community. Informant advised that during the period of time that he was there at the meeting he

saw [redacted] talking to a group of teenagers and a speaker from the stand was encouraging the teenagers to organize and demonstrate. Informant advised that [redacted] said his "old man" would keep the deputy sheriff that was arrested by the New Orleans Police on the job even though the Sheriff of St. Bernard Parish was very angry because he was arrested.

Informant advised that [redacted] remarked that "they" had the Governor behind them and if they got in trouble they would be tried by a local jury who would not convict them and even though convicted of the crime the Governor would be available to pardon them. He said that [redacted] remarked that under no circumstances should a federal officer be interfered with as that would bring them within the scope of the federal courts.

Informant advised that he met [redacted] who spoke to him briefly and was told by [redacted] that he, [redacted] would be in Baton Rouge on 11/15/50 but planned to inspect the school area before going to Baton Rouge. He advised that [redacted] remarked that "they" had to go all the way and no stone should be left unturned. Informant advised that as an introduction to [redacted] he mentioned that he was a friend of [redacted] Fort Lauderdale, Fla. [redacted] the White Sentinel. Informant advised that [redacted] stated that he had heard from [redacted] last week. Informant advised that [redacted] said that "they" had the backing of Miss., Tex., Fla., and S. C. Informant advised that [redacted] in his speech was advocating violence. He advised that there was so much noise in the auditorium that he could not actually, completely hear what [redacted] was saying but tenor of the speech was encouraging violence. Informant advised that a number of young teenagers were welcomed on the stage and [redacted] went off with these teenagers. He heard some of these teenagers remark that "tomorrow we'll give them hell. We'll take the schools and take [redacted]"

While at the auditorium, informant advised that he heard talk from people in the group, whose identity he does not know, to the effect that the

Governor might by use of troops take the operation of the city away from the Mayor and put the operation of the Police Department and Sheriff's Office under the Adjutant General. Informant advised that this was talked at the meeting and could not attribute a source for it.

On 11/28/60 informant advised that he contacted [REDACTED] at the office of the Citizens Council of Greater New Orleans, 323 Balter Building, New Orleans, and [REDACTED] identified himself as [REDACTED] of this organization. Informant advised that the Citizens Council of Greater New Orleans does not have letterhead paper but put a stamp on their letters and do not have any literature to give out in the office. [REDACTED] personally wrote his name on a small slip of paper and also the name [REDACTED] and identified him as [REDACTED] of the Citizens Council of Greater New Orleans.

On 11/17/60 informant made available a reprint of an article regarding the stepped-up aims of the NAACP that was handed out at the Citizens Council Rally, 11/15.

On 11/28/60 informant made available blank copies of a petition of impeachment against Judge J. SKELLY WRIGHT which he obtained at the Citizens Council Office, Balter Building, as well as a copy of a letter addressed to Governor JAMES H. DAVIS, Baton Rouge, commending Governor DAVIS on his integration stand. This is a prepared letter needing only a signature. Informant also made available a receipt reflecting his application for membership in the Citizens Council of Greater New Orleans.

Informant was contacted 11/21/60 regarding the possible presence of [REDACTED] Ala. Knights of the KKK. Informant advised that [REDACTED] was known to him but had not contacted him. As information was received indicating that [REDACTED] had

departed from New Orleans on 11/20/60. Informant was instructed to make no contacts to attempt to locate him at New Orleans. Informant advised that at the next meeting he believes he will be able to obtain the purpose of [REDACTED] trip to New Orleans.

JUSTIFICATIONS

It is believed that this informant served a useful purpose in coming to New Orleans, La. in that he was in a position to advise this office of any possible influx of members of the KKK to New Orleans. In view of informant's presence in New Orleans and his contacts with leaders of the KKK in areas outside of the State of La. and his furnishing them information that the situation was being handled in New Orleans, it is possible that he prevented a number of this group from coming to New Orleans and causing trouble. The informant has developed valuable information regarding the National States Rights Party which will be useful for future investigations and it is believed that the fact that he was in New Orleans during the beginning of the school crisis he will be in a much better position to obtain future information regarding the activities of the KKK and possible future plans to come to New Orleans.
