Knoxville Division strongly recommends that Bureau permission be granted for [redacted] to visit [redacted] KKKK, Inc., Chattanooga, Tenn., in very near future to obtain all possible information concerning captioned case, any other acts of violence participated in by [redacted] and members of [redacted] KKKK, Inc., any information re future plans of [redacted] KKKK, Inc., and their close associates, and all possible information re new type explosives reportedly in their possession.

It is noted all information actually naming [redacted] and others as members of a "Den" who are responsible for violations captioned case has been received from [redacted] who was a former informant for detectives of the Chattanooga PD. Continual efforts have been made by Knoxville Division to verify this information re actual participation but investigation to date has met with negative results. Information furnished by [redacted] not relating to actual violence but relating to activities of [redacted] KKKK, Inc., has been verified by [redacted]

The most logical way to verify information furnished by [REDACTED] and other members of [REDACTED] KKKK, Inc., being responsible for captioned violations is through informants. Knoxville Division has attempted and is continually trying to develop one of the reported ten members of the "Den" or the two reported alternates to verify information received from [REDACTED]. It is believed the money spent in sending [REDACTED] to Chattanooga, Tenn., would be well worthwhile and at the present time is one of the few methods of verifying information previously received by Knoxville which has been basis for the concentration of investigation this case [REDACTED] and his associates.

SINCE UNSUBS UTILIZED EXPLOSIVES, THEY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

The following information is submitted for justification of continuance of payment of this informant in accordance with Section 107N of Manual of Instructions:

1. Recommendation

I recommend that authority be granted to increase payments to the above informant up to \$60.00 per week for services, plus up to \$25.00 per week for expenses actually incurred, for a period of four months, effective May 27, 1961.

2. Residence and Employment

No change.

3. Current Membership in Subversive Organizations

CI is a member of the Northern League, Florida States Rights Party, Inc., Honorary Member of the Association of South Carolina Klans, Temporary Adjutant of the National Ku Klux Klan (NKKK), a member of the Citizens Council of New Orleans, Louisiana, for the year 1961, and has also been assigned as the head of the Anti-Communist Klan of Miami. The Anti-Communist Klan was assigned to CI by leaders of the NKKK in order that CI could regularly attend meetings of the NKKK. Although there is no such Klan in Miami, it provides status for CI and he can select up to three delegates to attend meetings of the NKKK.

4. Summary of Information Furnished and/or Services Rendered During Pertinent Period

January 11, 1961

Informant made available a copy of the "Putnam Sun," which he received from [REDACTED] in reference to the "Freedom Fighters."

January 13, 1961

Re: [REDACTED]

This case was opened by Miami December 2, 1960, based on information furnished by informant concerning stolen blank American Express Company Money Orders. During the rating period, informant furnished additional information concerning this case on January 13 and 16, 1961, and February 1 and 2, 1961. Details of this information is set forth in Miami report of Special Agent [REDACTED] dated February 27, 1961.

[REDACTED] Numerous subjects and suspects have been developed, and this matter is under investigation by the Miami Office.

January 15, 1961

Informant was in contact with [REDACTED] Florida Ku Klux Klan (FKKK), [REDACTED] Florida, regarding description of Klan posters, postponement of KKK meeting in Texarkana, Texas, and comments concerning [REDACTED] FKKK (dissemination memo prepared).

January 18, 1961

Informant obtained information from [REDACTED] potential bombing suspect, regarding [REDACTED] (NSRP) and the Christian Knights of the KKK (dissemination memo prepared). Informant received telegram from [REDACTED] AAK, postponing NKKK meeting (dissemination memo prepared).

January 19, 1961

[REDACTED] FKKK, advised CI Louisiana meeting of NKKK postponed in view of scheduled "street walk" in Atlanta, Georgia, January 28, 1961. [REDACTED] requested to meet with CI in Atlanta on January 27, 1961.

Informant departed Miami by train en route to Jackson, Mississippi, to develop information regarding the "Hidden Hand, aka. Racial Matters."

While in Jackson, Mississippi, CI contacted [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] developing information regarding the "Hidden Hand." CI then proceeded to New Orleans, Louisiana, and contacted two individuals concerning the same matter, and then returned to Jackson and recontacted [REDACTED]

CI departed Jackson, Mississippi, on January 25, 1961, and arrived at Atlanta, Georgia, January 26, 1961, where he conferred with [REDACTED] of the U.S. Klans. They discussed integration at the University of Athens and what should be done. They also discussed the six Klansmen that were jailed as a result of trying to stop integration at the University of Georgia. (This matter was set forth in a report entitled, "School Desegregation, University of Georgia, Athens, Georgia. Obstruction of Court Order").

On January 28, 1961, informant [redacted] drove about the city of Atlanta, Georgia, watching the "street walk." That evening informant attended the open Klan meeting held at the Tower Theater. After the meeting, approximately 20 Klan officials met on the stage of the theater and discussed the forthcoming meeting of the NKKK and other Klan matters. (Information furnished interested offices). Informant also had private conversation with [redacted] Dixie Klan, who furnished confidential information with reference to the Klan activities in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

February 4, 1961

Informant furnished information regarding possible WSTA violation. A new case was opened and later closed when no Federal violation developed.

February 5, 1961

CI met with [redacted] admitted he and [redacted] had set off dynamite on a vacant lot in South Bay, Florida, on January 14, 1961. (Information disseminated to appropriate authorities). Two new potential bombing suspect files opened on [redacted]

[redacted] furnished CI a copy of a two page letter addressed to [redacted] This letter contained [redacted] views on segregation and related matters, listing the names of several individuals involved to some degree in segregation. [redacted] also made available to CI a two page letter [redacted] Copies of both letters were furnished to interested offices.

[redacted] furnished informant information concerning the Anti-Communist Association of America. [redacted] who has had little success in his efforts to organize.

February 6, 1961

Informant contacted [redacted] potential bombing suspect, Miami, and referenced a letter received from [redacted] and the Christian Knights of the KKK.

February 8, 1961

CI received letter from [redacted] Dixie Klan, KKK, Chattanooga, Tennessee, announcing the next meeting of the NKKK for February 11 - 12, 1961, at Shreveport, Louisiana. (Information furnished to interested offices).

February 11 - 12, 1961

CI attended the NKKK meeting at Shreveport, Louisiana, and Texarkana, Texas. He made a full report on the activities and identities of those present. (Dissemination memo prepared for Bureau and interested offices).

February 14, 1961

Upon returning to Miami from NKKK meeting, CI contacted [redacted] Atlanta, Georgia, and accompanied [redacted]

CI also contacted [redacted] regarding integration of University of Georgia at Athens. CI reported considerable unrest among U.S. Klan Officials and reported a strategy meeting was set for February 18, 1961, at College Park, Georgia. (Information furnished to interested offices).

February 23, 1961

Informant telephonically contacted [redacted] College Park, Georgia, concerning the split of the U.S. Klan. [redacted] also advised that those involved in the Athens incident expected to be contacted by the Federal authorities. (Appropriate dissemination made).

CI was contacted in reference to the [REDACTED]
case, Kansas City origin, at which time he furnished
background information regarding possible suspects.

March 5, 1961

Informant contacted [REDACTED] and obtained
information regarding [REDACTED] association with [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] the SKKK.

March 6, 1961

Background information obtained from CI concerning [REDACTED] potential bombing suspect, Tampa Division.

March 7, 1961

Informant was recontacted concerning [REDACTED] case and information obtained regarding background concerning suspect and [REDACTED]

Informant made available a letter he received from [REDACTED] U.S. Klans, in which [REDACTED] invited informant and other Klan representative to a meeting March 12, 1961, College Park, Georgia.

March 12, 1961

Informant attended meeting at College Park, Georgia, and furnished detailed report regarding splitting of U.S. Klans.

March 16, 1961

Informant contacted [REDACTED] potential bombing suspect, regarding [REDACTED] the Christian Knights of the KKK. #

March 17, 1961

Informant made available a letter received from [REDACTED] potential bombing suspect. [REDACTED] This letter set forth the history, purpose, and legal authority of this organization.

March 20, 1961

Informant contacted [REDACTED] potential bombing suspect, Miami, regarding [REDACTED] activities and his future plans.

March 23 - 24, 1961

CI telephonically contacted [REDACTED] Atlanta, Georgia, and obtained information regarding [REDACTED] trip to [REDACTED] Louisiana, [REDACTED]

March 24, 1961

Informant furnished information regarding [REDACTED] subject of Miami file 76-1889, closed. [REDACTED] passed two local checks using the name [REDACTED] (Information disseminated to appropriate local authorities and U.S. Probation Office).

March 26, 1961

Informant contacted [REDACTED] of St. Louis, Missouri, and obtained information regarding the "Hidden Hand, aka. Racial Matters." (Information furnished to Bureau and interested offices).

Informant conferred with [REDACTED] regarding [REDACTED] contact with Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY and also obtained information concerning [REDACTED] the Teamsters residing in St. Louis.

[REDACTED] contacted CI and stated [REDACTED] will head the FKKK Klavern in that area.

March 28, 1961

CI made available a letter from the Dixie Klan, Inc., Chattanooga, Tennessee, setting forth the minutes of the NKKK meeting held February 12, 1961, at Shreveport, Louisiana, and Texarkana, Texas. (Dissemination memo prepared).

March 30, 1961

Informant contacted [redacted] Florida, and obtained details concerning their activities. Two new 157 cases were opened on these individuals to determine if they should be placed on the potential bombing suspect list of the Miami Office.

April 3, 1961

Informant contacted [redacted] and obtained information that [redacted] intends to join [redacted] FKKK, and will help [redacted] organize the Klan in Belle Glade, Florida.

April 4, 1961

Informant received a letter from [redacted] FKKK, Winter Park, Florida, setting forth date and place of next meeting of the NKKK. (Dissemination memo prepared for Bureau and interested offices).

April 6 - 10, 1961

CI was in Fort Pierce, Florida. [redacted] and developed information regarding Klan activities in Fort pierce area.

April 12, 1961

[redacted] FKKK, visited CI in Miami. [redacted] furnished information regarding organizing the FKKK in [redacted] Florida.

April 13, 1961

CI furnished background information concerning officials of Painters Local No. 365, Miami.

April 15 - 16, 1961

CI attended NKKK meeting at Wakulla Springs, Florida, located near Tallahassee, Florida. He furnished identities of those present and details of the meeting. In addition, CI had private conversation with [REDACTED] Dixie Klan, Chattanooga, Tennessee.

[REDACTED] discussed problems in his area and invited CI to meet with him to obtain information relative to explosives.

CI also had private conversation [REDACTED] in reference to \$1,000.00 [REDACTED] received from the FKKK [REDACTED] (Appropriate dissemination made of the above information).

April 17, 1961

Informant furnished information regarding four individuals possibly involved in ITSP. New 87 case opened. Additional information regarding this matter furnished by CI on April 20, 1961.

April 20-23, 1961

Based on information that [REDACTED] Bond Default, and [REDACTED] Fugitive, [REDACTED] Bond Default, [REDACTED] Florida, CI spent considerable time in effort to locate these individuals with negative results.

His services were utilized in view of his contacts with the hoodlum element on Miami Beach. During this period, informant furnished a number of automobile licenses of vehicles believed to belong to the hoodlum element. These numbers are presently being checked out.

April 24, 1961

Informant was telephonically contacted by [REDACTED] United Klans, Fernandina Beach, Florida, and requested CI to meet him there and discuss legislative matters.

April 28 - 29, 1961

Informant met [redacted] Florida, and they discussed Klan legislation regarding teaching of anti-Communism in Florida schools. On April 29, 1961, CI met with [redacted]

It is believed CI was instrumental in clearing the air regarding the teaching of anti-Communism in Florida schools and stopped possible violence on the part of the Klan.

May 1, 1961

Informant attended the weekly meeting of the Florida States Rights Party. He identified several persons in attendance and furnished the principal topics of discussion.

May 2, 1961

CI made available a Klan bulletin [redacted] United Klans, which set forth proposed meetings of this Klan. (Appropriate dissemination made).

May 5, 1961

CI was in contact with [redacted] FKKK, [redacted] Florida. [redacted] furnished information relative to himself and Freedom Fighters headed by [redacted]

It is noted that the actual expenses incurred by the informant on all trips, except the trip to Atlanta, Georgia, February 2, 1961, were slightly in excess of the amount authorized by the Bureau. This informant has advised that since the amounts are negligible, he did not wish to be reimbursed for these minor additional expenses. It is also noted that in many cases, this informant has been paid the maximum of \$15.00 per week for expenses actually incurred. He has been advised that except in extraordinary circumstances, any expenses exceeding the \$15.00 limit would not be reimbursed to him and that he should try to keep his expenses within the \$15.00 limit.

6. Type and Number of Meetings Attended,
and Other Activity

Informant attended two meetings of the NKKK, one in Texas and one in Florida.

Informant personally contacted several people in Jackson, Mississippi, and New Orleans, Louisiana, concerning the "Hidden Hand, aka." Informant attended "street walk" and Klan rally in Atlanta, Georgia, on January 28, 1961.

Informant attended meeting of U.S. Klans, Inc., College Park, Georgia, March 12, 1961, and attended meetings in Fort Pierce, Florida, regarding FKKK on March 30 and 31, 1961.

CI held conference in Fort Pierce, Florida, with two new possible bombing suspects on April 6 - 10, 1961.

Informant attended meeting [redacted] regarding Klan sponsored legislature April 28 - 29, 1961.

CI attended meeting of Florida States Rights Party on May 1, 1961.

7. Number of Written and Oral Reports Submitted

59
Written reports - none; although CI furnished no written reports, he made available 10 letters and pamphlets which were appropriately disseminated and are not included as oral reports.

Oral reports - 49.

8. Information Furnished of Unusual Value

Informant secures detailed information on the efforts of the various Klan leaders to consolidate

under the NKKK. He provides coverage at some of these meetings at the request of other officers, where the coverage is deemed inadequate. He is now a member of this organization and firmly entrenched with the Klan leadership.

Informant also attended Klan meetings in Atlanta and College Park, Georgia, and Tallahassee, Florida, at the request of other divisions.

9. Appropriate Number of Persons on Whom Informant Furnished Coverage, and Their Importance

a. Furnishes partial coverage on approximately ten Klan leaders throughout the State of Florida, and approximately eight Klan leaders residing outside the State of Florida.

b. Furnishes coverage of four potential bombing suspects residing in Miami, Florida, and two residing in Belle Glade, Florida.

c. Furnishes coverage of approximately ten individuals, who are not members of any Klan, but are individuals opposed to integration.

10. Informant's Potential for Advancement

Informant's potential is very good. He has a strong position in the new NKKK, which has strengthened his effectiveness in Florida. As a result of the informant's strength within the Klan and using his position with the United Southern Employees' Association (USEA), he is in a position to go to any one of several southeastern states and obtain pertinent and confidential information of value to the Bureau.

It is believed that this informant can also be utilized in developing intelligence information in the

labor movement and hoodlum activities in Miami and Miami Beach. It is noted that CI is a personal friend of

[REDACTED] Informant is also a personal friend of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Informant also knows [REDACTED]

Miami is aware that this informant does not attend Klan meetings on a regular basis as is the case of most Klan informants; however, this informant is one of the few Klan informants that possesses the ability, availability, incentive, and appropriate cover to go anywhere in the southeast section of the United States concerning Bureau matters. He is also personally acquainted with a large number of various political figures throughout the southeast part of the United States, as well as a large number of Klansmen and hoodlums.

11. Stability and Reliability

He has not demonstrated or displayed any personal weaknesses, emotional instability, untrustworthiness or unreliability. He has no domestic or personal problems that would cause embarrassment to the Bureau.

12. Indoctrination Against Disclosure

Every opportunity has been taken to properly indoctrinate this informant against making any disclosure of the relationship between him and the Bureau through any media. He is well aware of this.

13. All Necessary Action Taken on Information
Furnished

Information furnished by this informant is given prompt and necessary action and dissemination by the Miami Office.

14. Miscellaneous

Informant has been picking up additional information regarding criminal matters, and it is believed with increased expense money, he will be able to substantially increase his activities and productivities in Miami and Miami Beach. It is expected he will be in a position to furnish considerable anti-racketeering information. This, of course, will be in addition to his work in the racial field.

Re BHairtel, 7/18/61, BUairtel, 6/20/61, your airtel, 7/13/61, and BHlet, 7/13/61, captioned "Knights of the Ku Klux Klan Incorporated, aka National Ku Klux Klan, National Meeting at Anniston, Alabama, July 8, 1961, Racial Matters."

Authority is granted to pay [redacted] the sum of \$150 for his services for the period 7/4-12/61, while informant was in the Birmingham Division and en route from and to Miami. This amount is not being paid informant for the risk involved and time consumed, but is based upon the value of the information which he elicited during this time, and the service he rendered.

Informant is presently authorized \$60 per week for services and \$25 per week for expenses actually incurred. In addition the Bureau by airtel 6/20/61 authorized an amount of \$225 for expenses actually incurred during this trip. That amount was over and above the usual expenses authorized and payments have to be supported by an itemized statement of expenditures from the informant.

This present authorization is actually only a \$90 addition to the \$60 he is ordinarily authorized.
