Re Miami airtel to Bureau, 7/13/61;  
Birmingham letter to Bureau, 7/13/61 (Bufile 100-356570).

Re airtel stated Miami has been authorized to pay [redacted] up to \$60 per week for services, but that this does not appear adequate for period 7/4 - 12/61 while CI was in Birmingham Division and en route from and to Miami. Miami requested Birmingham to request Bureau authority for Miami to pay CI an amount commensurate with the risk involved and time consumed.

Birmingham is in agreement that payment at the rate of \$60 per week is inadequate for the services rendered by informant while in the Birmingham Division, and recommends that the Bureau authorize Miami to pay informant \$150. The following reasons are submitted in justification:

1) Informant volunteered to attend a national meeting at Anniston, Ala. on 7/8/61, and while there to attempt to develop information concerning the case entitled: [redacted] RM; DMV, CR."

2) To do this he was requested to associate with [redacted] the Dixie Klans, who is well known as a vindictive and dangerous person. Informant was also required to mingle with other members and delegates to

3) Informant furnished a statement made by [REDACTED] relating directly to the person responsible for throwing the bomb in the above described case, and also furnished information concerning a person who might have delivered the bomb.

4) Informant was the only source (known to the Birmingham Office at this time) who attended a closed meeting of all delegates on 7/9/61. He furnished details concerning the proceedings which occurred at this meeting, and a list of names, addresses, and organizational affiliation of attending delegates.

5) It appears that informant conducted himself well, that he made every effort to comply with his assignment, that he reported his observations in a most thorough manner, and that his services were of value to the Bureau.

On 8/25/61, [redacted] advised that captioned national meeting will begin with a free barbecue supper for all Klansmen at Taylor Brothers Landing, Lake Murray, S. C., on the afternoon of 9/9/61, after which the group will proceed to Orangeburg, S. C., where they plan to have a public speaking and march rally that night. He said that Klansmen have been advised they can obtain directions to Taylor Brothers Landing, Lake Murray, S. C., beginning at 11:00 AM 9/9/61, from persons in a car bearing a Confederate flag, which car will be parked in front of the Lexington County Courthouse, Lexington, S. C.

He said there will be a private meeting at the Skyline Club, West Columbia, S. C., on the afternoon of 9/10/61, and that his Klavern was instructed that only two delegates from each state can attend this meeting. Informant advised that it has not been announced who the delegates from South Carolina will be, but that he doubts he will be one of the two elected or appointed delegates.

[redacted] reported that the [redacted] Florida Klans, [redacted] had stated on 8/29/61 that he had visited William Sommerset (Miami informant [redacted] in Miami and had ascertained from Sommerset that there were a couple of spies in the Klan. [redacted] reported that Sommerset knew verbatim what had been said about his willingness to offer \$150 to someone to bomb Negro homes and that [redacted] would contact Sommerset in this matter. He also reported that Sommerset knew that the statement had been made that \$100 had been paid to Sommerset to take care of Martin Luther King. [redacted] further claimed that Sommerset had exhibited a Photostat of a letter [redacted] had written that he had a friend in the FBI in Miami through whom he was able to get a copy of the letter.

[redacted] instructed [redacted] De Land Klavern to announce that plans to bomb the Negroes' homes had been called off because there were spies in the organization. [redacted] plans to send a telegram to [redacted] of Atlanta and have [redacted] contact [redacted] to discuss the entire situation.

SUBJECT: SECURITY OF RACIAL INFORMANTS

SYNOPSIS:

[redacted] United Florida Ku Klux Klan [redacted] Florida, has reportedly made statements concerning the Bureau and its informants.

He is reported to have stated he is close to an FBI Agent in Daytona Beach and can get anything he wants.

We have checked this and found it to be untrue. The two Agents assigned to Daytona Beach have been interviewed and SA [redacted] has never been in contact with [redacted] and SA [redacted] has had only one contact with [redacted] that being in March, 1959.

[redacted] stated William Somerset had shown him a Photostat of a letter. Somerset, who is active in klan matters, is an informant of our Miami Office. [redacted] said the Photostat was of a letter he had sent to [redacted] and also said Somerset stated he got the Photostat from a friend in the FBI at Miami. [redacted] therefore, believes [redacted] must be an FBI informant.

This has also been found to be untrue since the Miami Office never had a Photostat of the letter and it was never discussed with or exhibited to Somerset by any Agent.

[redacted] believes there is a Bureau informant in his organization and [redacted] based on information he had obtained from Somerset. [redacted] reportedly stated Somerset had told him verbatim details of a Klan meeting [redacted] at which Somerset was not present.

Our investigation of this disclosed that a Miami Agent discussed with Somerset in very general terms two points in connection with the meeting in question. However, the substance of the meeting was not discussed with Somerset in detail and, based on this, he could not have reported verbatim what took place.

ACTION:

Since the allegations by [redacted] concerning Somerset were only heard by four persons, Somerset should not be questioned concerning this matter. [redacted]

[redacted] is not being straightened out concerning his statements about FBI Agents since to do so would jeopardize Somerset. [redacted] It appears [redacted] may be intentionally making baseless statements of the type set forth above to stir up apprehension in his own organization and scare out any possible informants.

Although there is no verification of [redacted] allegations, Miami is being instructed to assign the handling of Somerset to two Agents other than those presently assigned. This will provide opinions and impressions of additional Agents as a basis for evaluating Somerset. Miami is also being instructed to control Somerset closely. [redacted]

CI is a member of the Northern League, Florida States Rights Party, Inc., Honorary Member of the Association of South Carolina Klans, Temporary Adjutant of the National Ku Klux Klan (NKKK), a member of the Citizens Council of New Orleans, Louisiana, for the year 1961, and has also been assigned as the head of the Anti-Communist Klan of Miami. The Anti-Communist Klan was assigned to CI by leaders of the NKKK in order that CI could regularly attend meetings of the NKKK. Although there is no such Klan in Miami, it provides status for CI and he can select up to three delegates to attend meetings of the NKKK.

8) INFORMATION FURNISHED OF UNUSUAL VALUE.

Informant made a special trip to Chattanooga, Tennessee, and spent one week in the company of [redacted] the Dixie Klan. While in Chattanooga, informant developed valuable information regarding [redacted] and identified two possible leaks in the Chattanooga Police Department. [redacted]

Informant secured detailed information on the efforts of the various Klan leaders to consolidate under the NKKK. He provided coverage at these meetings at the request of other offices, where the coverage was deemed inadequate. He is a member of this organization and firmly entrenched with the Klan leadership.

A) Furnishes partial coverage on approximately ten Klan leaders throughout the State of Florida and approximately eight Klan leaders residing outside the State of Florida.

B) Furnishes coverage on four potential bombing suspects residing in Miami, Florida, and two residing in Belle Glade, Florida.


C) Furnishes coverage on approximately ten individuals who are not members of any Klan but are individuals opposed to integration.

10) INFORMANT'S POTENTIAL FOR ADVANCEMENT

Informant's potential is very good. He has a strong position in the NKKK, which has strengthened his effectiveness in Florida. As a result of the informant's strength within the Klan and using his position with the United Southern Employees Association, he is in a position to go to any one of several Southeastern States and obtain pertinent and confidential information of value to the Bureau.

This informant has also been utilized in developing intelligence information in the labor movement, as well as in hoodlum activities in Miami and Miami Beach.

Miami is aware that this informant does not attend Klan meetings on a regular basis, as is the case of most Klan informants; however, this informant is one of the few Klan informants who possesses the ability, availability, incentive, and appropriate cover to go anywhere in the Southeast section of the United States concerning Bureau matters. He is also personally acquainted with a large number of various political figures throughout the Southeast part of the United States, as well as a large number of Klansmen and hoodlums.

11) STABILITY AND RELIABILITY

He has not demonstrated or displayed any personal weaknesses, emotional instability, untrustworthiness or unreliability. He has no domestic or personal problems that would cause embarrassment to the Bureau.

12) INDOCTRINATION AGAINST DISCLOSURE

Every opportunity has been taken to properly indoctrinate this informant against making any disclosure of the relationship between him and the Bureau through any media. He is well aware of this.

13) ALL NECESSARY ACTION TAKEN ON INFORMATION FURNISHED

Information furnished by this informant is given prompt and necessary action and dissemination by the Miami Office.

MISCELLANEOUS

Informant continues to pick up information regarding criminal matters, and it is believed with increased expense money he will be able to substantially increase his activities and productivities in Miami and Miami Beach. It is expected he will be in a position to furnish considerable anti-racketeering information. This, of course, will be in addition to his work in the racial field.

Savannah is requested to immediately advise the Bureau if it is desirous of [redacted] attending the National Ku Klux Klan meeting at Savannah, Georgia, November 11-12, 1961, for the purpose of assisting and affording coverage of this meeting.

The Bureau is requested to advise Miami at the earliest possible date whether or not [redacted] is authorized to attend the National Ku Klux Klan meeting in Savannah and whether authority is granted for the payment of additional expenses of up to \$150.00 (expenses to be itemized by him) which he incurs in attending this meeting.

It should be noted that [redacted] has not attended the last two important Klan meetings, although invited, which were held at Columbia, South Carolina and Stone Mountain, Georgia.

"The settlement goes on to provide that U.S.E.A. Local #1 shall be dissolved and that all negotiation agreements with contractors and its members be cancelled. Also, that the U.S.E.A., so far as the operations complained of in Florida are concerned, be 'disestablished', which means that future organizational activities must not allow any locals to organize with employer members.

"As a matter of law, nothing contained in this stipulation of settlement can restrain or abridge the rights of U.S.E.A. members or any other persons to organize for collective bargaining purposes. These rights are guaranteed by the National Labor Relations Act and the Supreme Court of the United States.

"Freedom of self organization persists, however, notwithstanding the order of the Board commanding the employer to disestablish the company or independent union. The order will not prevent the same employees from immediately reorganizing themselves as an independent union, even though under the same constitution and with the same leaders, provided they do so freely, of their own choice, and are not influenced or overtly approved by the employer."

Informant goes on to say that in his opinion [redacted] NLRB, Miami, is trying to expose him and the U.S.E.A. as being Communist dominated and a front for the KKK. According to informant, [redacted] is doing this to aid and assist Local 349 which is in competition with U.S.E.A.

CI stated he believes 349 has "something" on [redacted] to make [redacted] do this. He said that [redacted] is presently contacting various contractors in the Miami area and advising them that the U.S.E.A. has been disestablished as a Labor Union in the State of Fla.
