IS THE MANIFEST IN QUESTION IDENTICAL WITH THE FORM REFERRED TO IN LAST PARAGRAPH, PAGE THREE, OF RE LETTERHEAD MEMORANDUM WHICH IS MAINTAINED ON CLIP BOARD? OBTAIN FURTHER SPECIFICS AS TO HOW THE MANIFEST WAS ACTUALLY LOCATED AT REQUEST OF THE MEXICAN PRESIDENTIAL STAFF. BUREAU DESIRES FURTHER SPECIFICS CONCERNING THE QUOTE TRASH UNQUOTE AMONG WHICH THE MANIFEST WAS LOCATED. ASCERTAIN HOW TRANSPORTES FRONTERA OFFICIALS WERE ABLE, SUBSEQUENT TO THE ASSASSINATION, TO FILL OUT THE TOP PORTION OF QUESTIONED MANIFEST. NOTE IN THIS CONNECTION THAT THE MONTH OF THE BUS TRIP IN QUESTION APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN ORIGINALLY WRITTEN ON MANIFEST AS QUOTE NOVEMBER UNQUOTE, WHICH NOTATION HAS BEEN CROSSED OUT AND MONTH QUOTE OCTOBER UNQUOTE WRITTEN IN. MANIFEST IS AUTHENTIC. ARE OTHER BUS MANIFESTS AVAILABLE FOR PERIOD IN EARLY OCTOBER ONE NINE SIX THREE? OBTAIN CLEAR-CUT STATEMENT FROM APPROPRIATE TRANSPORTES FRONTERA PEOPLE AS TO WHETHER OR NOT THE MANIFEST IN QUESTION IS AUTHENTIC. ENDEAVOR TO DETERMINE WHO UTILIZED SEATS ONE AND THREE DURING TRIP IN QUESTION WHICH WERE MANIFESTED UNDER TICKETS NUMBERS THREE NINE SIX THREE THREE AND THREE NINE SIX THREE FOUR ISSUED IN NAME OF THE DRIVER SAUCEDO. COULD IT HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE THAT QUOTE OSWALD UNQUOTE AND ANGEL PEREZ UTILIZED THESE SPACES? NOTE THAT DUTCH CITIZENS J. M. DE CUBA AND HIS WIFE WHO, ACCORDING TO MEXICAN IMMIGRATION RECORDS, WERE CHECKED OUT AT KILOMETER TWO SIX ON OCTOBER THREE LAST BY IMMIGRATION INSPECTOR CHAPA WHO HANDLED OSWALD'S EXIT, STATE THEY TRAVELED TO NUEVO LAREDO BY BUS, BELIEVED TO BE TRANSPORTES FRONTERA LINE. THEY EXPRESSED BELIEF THEY LEFT NUEVO LAREDO OCTOBER TWO LAST AND THEY ARE BEING REINTERVIEWED ON THAT POINT. MR. DE CUBA, WHILE DISCLAIMING ANY KNOWLEDGE OF OSWALD, RECALLS THAT THERE WAS A YOUNG MAN HE PRESUMED TO BE AN AMERICAN WHO RODE TO NUEVO LAREDO ON THE BUS IN WHICH DE CUBAS TRAVELED. on Transportes Frontera Company records. Incoming states that the manifest was found by bus company officials in the "trash" when Mexican Government instituted investigation. The names of "Oswald" and Angel Perez appear on manifest, however, no tickets were indicated for them and the bus officials now state that they believe these two individuals were not on the bus and their names appear on the manifest only as reservations, which were not picked up, must have been made in their names. The bus officials also state that the top of the manifest which identifies the bus and the date of the trip was not filled in when they located it among the "trash." This certainly suggests that the manifest may be a manufactured document of no value. It is, therefore, necessary to dig further into this.

NOTE:

Voorhees left Mexico on 10/3/63 at Nuevo Laredo being checked out by same immigration inspector who handled Oswald. This man was stationed at Kilometer 26 which we understand to be inspection point determining whether people traveling by car or by bus. We have doubts about authenticity of the bus manifest which showed only nine people on bus at arrival at Nuevo Laredo. Voorhees, if on the bus, may shed some light on the trip which will enable further evaluation as to authenticity of the manifest.

QUESTIONED MANIFEST IS IDENTICAL WITH FORM USED REGULARLY AND MAINTAINED ON CLIP BOARD, HAVING BEEN LOCATED FOR PRESIDENTIAL INVESTIGATORS IN BAGGAGE ROOM ON SHELF AS PART OF GUMMED BLOCK OF FORMS FOR MONTH OF OCTOBER. IT WAS IDENTIFIED AS TO DATE BY NUMBER "2" AT BOTTOM RIGHT CORNER AND FACT WAS CONNECTED WITH SIMILAR MANIFESTS FOR OTHER DATES, SOME OF WHICH CARRY OCTOBER DATE STAMPS. TICKET NUMBERS ON QUESTIONED MANIFEST APPEAR TO BE IN SEQUENCE WITH MANIFESTS FOR SUBSEQUENT TRIPS WHICH WERE LOCATED. THESE WILL BE FORWARDED BUREAU NEXT POUCH. MANIFESTS FOR TWO TRIPS OF OCTOBER 1 NOT LOCATED BUT STILL BEING SOUGHT.

FRANCISCO SAUCEDO HAS NO IDEA OF IDENTITY OF PERSONS USING SEATS ONE AND THREE BUT IS CERTAIN WERE NOT USED BY ANGEL PEREZ, OSWALD OR DE CUBAS, AS RESERVATIONS AND TICKETS OBTAINED BY HIM ONLY FOR CLOSE FRIENDS AND RELATIVES. HE DOES NOT KNOW DE CUBAS.

Referenced Dallas airtel set forth certain information, instructions, and requests of those offices which had conducted considerable investigation in captioned matter. Offices receiving instant airtel are being advised of certain information contained in referenced Dallas airtel as follows:

As Office of Origin, Dallas is setting forth the following information, instructions, and requests to those offices which have conducted considerable investigation in the above related matters in order that the various instructions and requests from the Bureau can be carried out and the Bureau's responsibilities fulfilled. It has become necessary to re-evaluate instructions issued during the early stages of this investigation with regard to reporting procedures. Initially, it was sufficient to submit certain information by Letterhead Memorandum as it was only necessary to disseminate such information to the U. S. Secret Service or one of the other government agencies. Since the establishment of the President's Commission, the Bureau desires that the Commission be furnished with the results of all investigation conducted in connection with the assassination. This of necessity includes individuals and situations having little or no direct connection with the assassination.

The above-captioned cases are in existence in the Dallas Office in connection with the assassination and subsequent events. In connection with the first captioned case above, every effort is being made to include in this file allegations alleging some person or persons other than OSWALD committed the assassination. This includes numerous complaints from persons of questionable mentality and who appear mentally unstable or disturbed. The Bureau has instructed that each of such allegations must be fully resolved and reported as the President's Commission has indicated a desire to receive all information pertaining to all investigation conducted concerning the assassination and related matters. In some instances, certain allegations are received that do not indicate a connection or reference to OSWALD, but upon checking into them it is determined such allegations do pertain to OSWALD. In such instances, such investigation may have been reported in the first of the above-captioned cases, but every effort is being made to avoid placing anything in the first captioned case which has to do with OSWALD or his connection with the assassination.

The Bureau in many instances has sent communications carrying the first caption above although the subject matter indicates it pertains to OSWALD and/or the evidence gathered in the investigation into the assassination, and the Bureau has requested that in replying to their communications, such

communications bear the same caption as the communication making the request. Dallas is abiding by this request but where the subject matter pertains to OSWALD or the evidence in connection with the assassination, Dallas is filing such communications in the second captioned case set forth above...

In many instances, auxiliary offices have reported the results of their investigation concerning a miscellaneous allegation not involving OSWALD or connected with OSWALD by Letterhead Memorandum and in some instances have included the results of such investigation in reports bearing the second caption above.

The most logical facility for advising the President's Commission of investigative results is by report. The Bureau has instructed Dallas, as Office of Origin, to coordinate the assembling and submission of reports under the first caption above. It is requested therefore that each office receiving this communication fully cooperate to enable Dallas to handle its responsibilities in this connection. Each office should continue to submit its own reports in matters pertaining to LEE HARVEY OSWALD and/or the assassination insofar as it relates to OSWALD.

Before Dallas can submit the reports requested by the Bureau in the first captioned case (Dallas 89-43), it will be necessary that all investigation previously reported by Letterhead Memorandum and other communications such as teletypes, airtels and letters be incorporated in appropriate FD-302s or inserts. All files relating to this matter must be thoroughly and meticulously reviewed to insure all investigation is logically resolved and 25 copies of inserts or FD-302s submitted to Dallas. It is recognized that considerable retyping will be required, but this retyping must be handled by each individual office receiving this communication in order that the retyping at Dallas is held to an absolute minimum. The day-to-day urgent requests of Dallas in connection with this matter are of such volume that for Dallas to handle the retyping of material submitted by other offices is not feasible. The investigative results which normally would have been prepared on FD-302s, but which were not so prepared in view of their incorporation in a Letterhead Memorandum, should now be retyped on a FD-302 where appropriate. The usual five-day dictation rule for FD-302s will of necessity have to be suspended for this particular project only and must be strictly adhered to in the future.

These investigations initiated as a result of the assassination, but of necessity reported under a different title and character than those reflected in this communication, such as Fraud Against the Government and Extortion cases, will have to be identified by each office receiving this communication and 25 copies of all FD-302s and inserts in connection with the investigation in these cases furnished to Dallas for inclusion in a subsequent Dallas report bearing the first caption above. It is suggested that in this respect that at the time a Fraud Against the Government, Extortion or other case arising out of the assassination is closed, that the complete results be forwarded to Dallas for inclusion in a Dallas report along with other allegations which have been completely resolved.

Separate inserts and FD-302s should be prepared in each instance where a specific allegation is concerned and a subject matter heading such as the name of the individual against whom the allegation is made or other appropriate identifying data should be included. In the case of the Fraud Against the Government, Extortion and other cases, the actual title used in such cases would be an appropriate heading. In all instances the complete resolving of the allegation is necessary before the insert can be included in the report. In connection with inserts prepared where the source has requested his identity be protected, it will be necessary to furnish Dallas an appropriate administrative insert reflecting the identity of the source. T symbols cannot be used in this report. A statement on the administrative insert such as: "The source who requested his identity not be divulged and who furnished information concerning JOHN DOE reflected in this report is BILL JONES, etc."

The investigative insert reflecting the information from such a source should begin with a statement such as: "On (date) an individual who requested his identity not be divulged, but who has furnished reliable information in the past (or who has furnished insufficient information in the past to determine his reliability), advised, etc."

Each office receiving this communication which received an allegation resulting in subsequent investigation must prepare an appropriate insert disclosing the "predication" or "basis" for the investigation. Where leads are indicated to completely resolve an allegation, the office developing same should set out the necessary leads to completely resolve the allegation.

Where an office has already included in a report under one of the above described captions, certain information relating to an allegation, it will be permissible to state in an insert for the details of the report being prepared by Dallas, a statement such as: "The following (or the foregoing) investigation supplements that contained on pages _____ of the report of SA _____, dated _____ at _____, captioned (title of report) concerning, etc."

This will enable the President's Commission and any other agency to whom such reports have been and are being disseminated to locate the results of investigation which completely resolve a particular allegation. However, every effort is now being made to report the complete results of investigation pertaining to a specific allegation in the same report.

It is pointed out that the submission of Letterhead Memoranda is a device being used by the Bureau for expeditiously furnishing certain results of investigation to the President's Commission or some other agency and does not preclude the necessity for submission in report form subsequent thereto in order that the continuity of a particular report will not be disjointed or not clear.

The Bureau has directed that the property statement not be included on Letterhead Memoranda where it is known such Letterhead Memoranda are going to be disseminated to the President's Commission.

The Bureau has strongly pointed out that all material contained in reports and other communications in the above captioned cases must be meticulously prepared with the utmost care given to grammar, spelling, punctuation, and sentence structure. Therefore, each office before forwarding Dallas 25 copies of any insert or FD-302 should make absolutely sure that such material is "letter perfect".

Each office receiving this communication should immediately commence preparation of the requested information in the proper form as described above and furnish same to Dallas as it is completed with respect to each specific allegation. The entire review and submission in appropriate form to Dallas must be completed by April 15, 1964.

 The Jacksonville office set forth the results of their interview with ROBERT LEE TARIN. In essence, TARIN claimed to have met his wife, MARY ELAINE, at her father's home in Atascosa, Texas, after 9/15/63 and moved to 620 Essex Street, San Antonio. Within several days thereafter he and his wife took a Greyhound bus from Laredo, Texas, to San Antonio, Texas, taking with them 7. → their three children. TARIN claimed he, his wife, and children crossed into Mexico on foot and denied he had ever had or applied for a Mexican tourist card. Later he said his wife and he crossed into Mexico by bus and still later denied he and his wife had been to Mexico at any time.

File

On 12/30/63 MARY ELAINE TARIN was interviewed at Atascosa, Texas. She advised she is the daughter of Mrs. WILLIAM C. STONE. She did not know any ELIZABETH TARIN; she had never been to Mexico with ROBERT L. TARIN and was not identical with anyone who entered the U. S. from Mexico on 10/3/63. She said the only trip she ever made with ROBERT L. TARIN was about 11/30/63 when she accompanied him from Texas to Orlando, Florida, in an automobile which he had stolen. She had not known TARIN had stolen the car until after they were both arrested in Orlando, Florida (report of SA JOHN M. KEMMY dated 2/28/64 at San Antonio, page 18). Inasmuch as MARY ELAINE TARIN's story conflicts with ROBERT LEE TARIN's story as set forth above, and due to the fact that ROBERT LEE TARIN contradicted himself several times during his interview, the following leads are being set forth:

LEADSJACKSONVILLEAT DELAND, FLORIDA:

Will re-interview ROBERT LEE TARIN at Volusia County Jail pursuant to instructions set forth in referenced airtel. During this interview it should be pointed out to him that he gave conflicting versions of his story during the last interview. During this interview bear in mind the possibility that he may have

crossed into Mexico with some other woman than MARY ELAINE TARIN since she has denied this trip and since the name ELISABETH TARIN appears on Mexican Immigration records.

SAN ANTONIO

AT ATASCOSA, TEXAS:

Will re-interview MARY ELAINE TARIN, daughter of Mrs. WILLIAM C. STONE, in accordance with instructions set out in referenced airtel. During this interview efforts should be made to resolve the question as to the identity of the person accompanying ROBERT LEE TARIN to Mexico in the fall of 1963. Bear in mind ROBERT LEE TARIN said he went with his wife and three children. Determine from MARY ELAINE TARIN if she is the mother of these three children and, if not, whether or not she knows who that person is. It is suggested that the Agent to whom this lead is assigned obtain the results of Jacksonville's interview with ROBERT LEE TARIN which are located in Jacksonville airtel to the Bureau dated 12/31/63 (San Antonio 105-2909-258).

the FM-11 is made. We want to assess the accuracy of the FM-11.
To do this Legat has examined all 79 tourist cards, has broken them
down into their two types and has reported their findings in comparing
75 of them against the FM-11. It is difficult to see the significance
of the findings as reported and, if we work more simply from the
FM-11, breaking the analysis into but the five categories of recorded
travel, the picture will be much clearer. Certainly there was nothing
unique in recording Oswald's travel on FM-11 as by auto and many
other errors will be readily seen if analysis reported as suggested.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

Reference is made to my letter to you of February 12, 1964 requesting information on the travel of Lee Harvey Oswald from Mexico City to Nuevo Laredo on or about October 2, 1963 and to your replies dated February 14 and March 6, 1964, the latter enclosing copies of the passenger manifest of the bus purportedly taken by Oswald and the reports of the investigations in connection therewith.

After review of the copies of the manifest and the two reports of investigation, we believe that further investigation is necessary to clarify, and possibly resolve, the questions raised in my letter of February 12, 1964. We believe it is necessary to make additional efforts to determine whether Oswald was in fact a passenger on Transportes Frontera Bus #340. Accordingly, we request that the following investigation be initiated:

1. An effort should be made to locate all of the passengers listed on the manifest, whether their destination was Monterrey or Nuevo Laredo and whether or not their names can be confirmed from the records of the Mexican Immigration Office at Nuevo Laredo. Once located, each passenger should of course be asked if he can identify Oswald, but, failing this, he should at least be asked if he can remember whether one of the passengers on the bus was an American of non-Spanish descent. This last question may be important because Oswald's name appears to be the only non-Spanish name on the entire passenger manifest.

2. All pertinent records of the United States Immigration Service, as well as the Mexican Immigration Service, at Laredo (or Nuevo Laredo) should be searched for the names of the passengers on the bus other than Oswald who are listed as having had a destination of Laredo. The search of American records should include the records of smallpox vaccinations, issuance of form "I-94's" and all other entry and departure documents which could reasonably relate to persons entering the United States from Mexico on or about October 3, 1963, the day upon which the bus was scheduled to arrive at Laredo.

3. An effort should be made to establish, by handwriting analysis or by re-interview of the Mexican ticketing officials, if practical, whether the name, "Oswald," on the passenger manifest was written by someone other than the person who wrote the names of the other passengers on the list or at least whether the person who wrote "Oswald" did not write most of the other entries on the list.

4. The reverse side of the passenger manifest contains some mathematical calculations. If their significance can be established we may be able to shed further light on whether Oswald was ever issued a ticket. In particular, if the price of the tickets involved could be ascertained, both in pesos and in dollars, perhaps this would explain the computations. In the event that your investigation indicates that Oswald was not a passenger on the bus, we desire that you conduct appropriate investigation to ascertain whether Oswald crossed the border into the United States in an automobile and, if so, the identity of the owner of the car and any passengers who accompanied Oswald.

The entire Mexican aspect of this investigation is one of particular interest to the Commission. In addition to the above investigation, we are also very interested in your continuing attempts to locate and question other guests at the Hotel del Comercio on the same floor as Oswald. It is very likely that representatives of the Commission will be

going to Mexico in the near future on this matter. For that reason we would appreciate your efforts to expedite this investigation.

NOTE FOR FBI LABORATORY:

Please refer to your 3/17/64 report to Legat, Mexico City, Laboratory Number D-444949. It is requested that specimen Q332 be re-examined against known specimens K68 and K69 to determine, if possible, which portions of the manifest were written by Alvarado, K68, and Medina, K69. We are particularly interested in the several lines at the top of the manifest which show the bus number, time and date of departure. According to Legat, the words "Transportes Frontera" at the top were written by an unknown official of the Mexican Police and not by bus company employees. Alvarado and Gilberto Lozano, no known specimens of latter available to date, have said "they" filled in the top two lines, except for the name of the bus company and that "they" wrote the name of the drivers at the bottom of the form. Medina admits writing the entries in line number 4 and lines numbers 1, 3 and 8, and possibly other items on manifest. Alvarado says that he prepared most of the writing on the manifest, although he denies writing the "Oswald" writing on line 4. If original of Q332 is needed to complete this examination, please request same from Legat, Mexico City. For Laboratory's information, Bucab to Legat 3/24/63 referred to indistinct stamped impressions which appear on bottom of manifest and Legat was instructed, if these markings appear reasonably distinct on the original and if the instrument thought to have made these markings can be located, the original manifest together with the marking instrument or specimens therefrom were to be submitted to Laboratory for further examination.

NOTE:

While name "Oswald" appears on line 4 of the bus company manifest, officials there now tell us he was not on board this bus. They say they found the manifest, which is not normally kept, in the trash when the Mexican Police came by to investigate after the assassination and that the top lines of the manifest were filled in when they found it. It appears that the day and month may have been altered, for on looking closely at manifest, it appears it may have originally been dated November 1 and, thereafter, changed to October 2, 1963. This causes us to suspect the manifest's authenticity and Legat is conducting extensive investigation to determine whether or not the manifest is authentic. The investigation requested by the Commission in its 3/18/64 letter is all underway, however, it is believed advisable to furnish copies of Commission's letter to Legat and San Antonio to insure that everything requested is covered.

Dallas, refer to pages four and five of Legat's 3/16/64 LHM and insure that if same has not already been done, leads are set forth to interview the De Mens and Norths. It will not be necessary for Dallas to rereport the facts in Legat's 3/16/64 LHM as amended copies of same will be furnished by Bureau to Commission.

NOTE:

Legat's 3/12/64 LHM stated that the manager of Transportes Del Norte Bus Terminal, Mexico City, said that his company maintains reservations and tickets sales manifest in duplicate, copy of which he had and which he checked together with representative of Mexican Police without finding record of Oswald. This clearly suggests that the company does have manifests and, at least so far as reservations are concerned, records ticket holder's name. Against this Legat's 3/16/64 LHM reports that according to Del Valle, Inspector of Mexican Ministry of Interior, the Transportes Del Norte Company does not prepare passenger lists and the only notation on the trip manifest is note to effect whether or not a seat is occupied. This is somewhat inconsistent and may cause question in Commission's mind. It is also necessary to clarify the different reporting of the name of Garza - Perez.

Re Legat airtel and letterhead dated March 16, 1964, setting forth list of individuals who entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo September 26, 1964, one copy of each of which is furnished to Dallas and two copies of which are enclosed to San Antonio.

The Bureau does not desire to set forth leads at this time for interview of all individuals listed in Legat's 3-16-64 letterhead; hence copies of referenced material have not been furnished to offices indicated in reairtel and leads are not being set forth for various suggested interviews to be conducted in foreign countries. Reason for this is that Oswald's mode of travel into Mexico on 9-26 has been established to have been by Red Arrow bus. Bureau desires to interview any individuals who entered Nuevo Laredo on 9-26-64 and who traveled to points inside Mexico on the same bus on which Oswald traveled. Note in this connection we do not have a passenger manifest of the Red Arrow bus and are limited in this regard to a baggage list. Legat's 3-12 letterhead referred to checking of manifest of Red Arrow Bus Line negatively for record of Oswald's departure on October 3. Legat ascertain if Red Arrow Line has passenger manifest for trip on 9-26-27-64 from Nuevo Laredo to Mexico City.

San Antonio ascertain the shift on which Mexican Immigration Inspector Felio Tuexi Maydon was employed on September 26 and identify all other inspectors who were engaged with him on this shift at the immigration station. Was this Kilometer 26? If not, describe the location of the station and ascertain the mode of travel in which employees there were engaged in handling. If this station handled

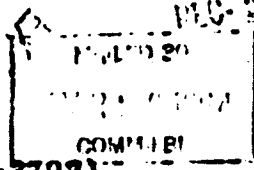

only travel on highway, as in case of Kilometer 28, so state. If station handled other modes of travel, endeavor to ascertain which inspectors on 9-28 were engaged solely in checking people entering Mexico on the highway.

Bureau notes that there is no record in the FM-11 covering entries at Nuevo Laredo 9-26-64 of any of the individuals listed in the Red Arrow Bus list beyond Lee and Oswald and those individuals who have already been interviewed. San Antonio endeavor through sources at Red Arrow, Nuevo Laredo, and through American Immigration records, Laredo, to identify other passengers on Red Arrow Bus. San Antonio and Legat submit letterhead earliest possible date.

NOTE:

Legat's 3-16 letterhead lists over 100 people who entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo 9-26. We do not intend to interview all of these people, most of whom entered by automobile as we know how Oswald traveled from Houston, Texas, to Mexico City (by bus). In effort to talk to fellow passengers on bus, particularly those destined to Mexico City, who may be able to shed some light on Oswald's activities there, it is necessary to know which immigration inspectors worked the three shifts and which inspectors were handling the highway travel, for with this information we can pick out of the long list just those individuals who could possibly have been on the bus when it was checked by Mexican Immigration.

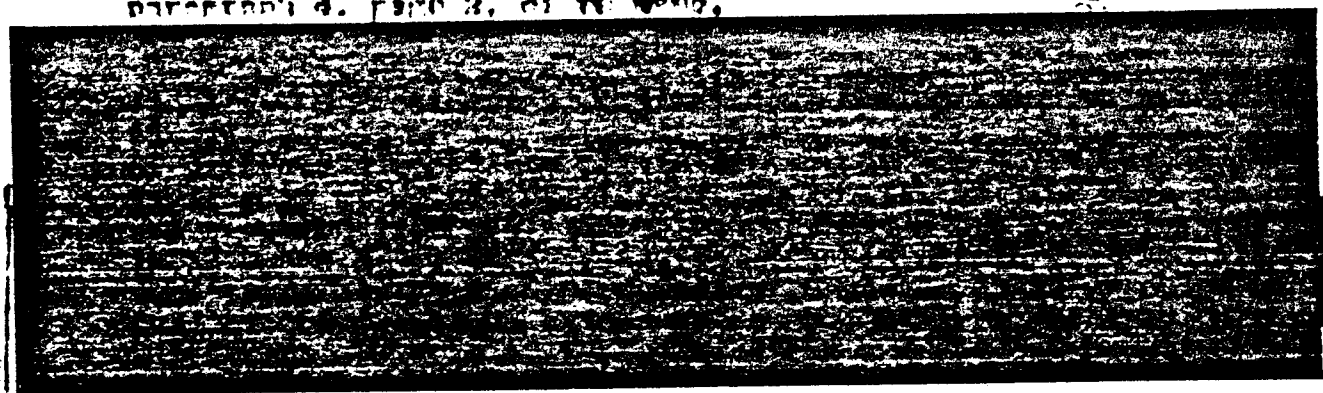

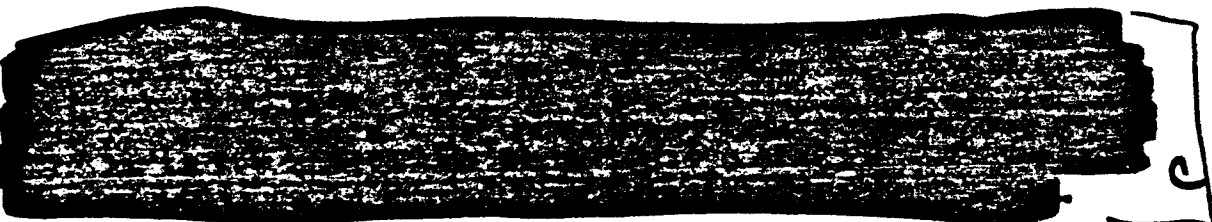

In paragraph 3, page 1, of re memo Mora reportedly spoke of subject's "activities before his trip to the Soviet Union." In paragraph 5, page 1, she spoke of his activities in New Orleans before he went to Russia. Subject left New Orleans in September, 1963, for Russia after spending a very short period of time there. No information has been developed that he engaged in any subversive activities while in New Orleans at that time. It is possible that although Mora spoke of Oswald's activities before he went to Russia, that what she meant was, before he went to Mexico. This point should be clarified. U

In paragraph 2, page 2, of re memo the question arises as to whether it was Mora, Mora's source or the Americans in Russia who believed that subject could not have undertaken simply to assassinate President Kennedy. U

Although Mora is a Mexican citizen, it is possible she will have to be interviewed eventually. Underlying all the information she furnished as set out in re memo, lies the question whether she met with subject while he was in Mexico. U



It is noted re memo is classified "Secret." When this memo is disseminated to the Commission questions may be asked about this classification and, therefore, you should in your next communication to the Bureau relating to Mora, fully detail your reasons for this classification. The Bureau is not questioning the correctness of the classification but merely asking that you set forth fully your reasons for it. U
