



The following information was supplied on November 24, 1964, by Mrs. ELENA GARRO DE PAZ and her daughter, ELENA PAZ GARRO.

They are residents of Mexico City, but declined to supply their home address. Mrs. PAZ stated she is a cousin of RUBEN, LIDIA, and HORACIO DURAN, the latter being the husband of <u>SILVIA TIRADO DE DUPAN</u>. She said she had not furnished previously the information set forth hereinafter because of fear of reprisals.

Mrs. PAZ said that on August 23, 1963, she attended a dinner at the home of a Mexican Communist whom she declined to identify. Among others present at this dinner were Cuban Consul EUSKBIO AZCUE and his wife. She had not previously known AZCUE. In conversation with him during the course of the evening she learned that he was surposed to roturn to Cuba on or about August 27, 1963. She later learned that he did not depart Mexico at that time.

According to Mrs. PAZ, she had infrequent contact with her cousins, the DURANS; however, on a date she fixed as Saturday, September 28, 1963, she received a telephone call from <u>RUBEN/DURAN</u>, who invited her and her daughter to attend a party at his house during the first part of the following week. She was unable to fix the exact date of this party, but felt it had been held on Konday, Tuesday, or Wednesday, September 30, October 1, and October 2, 1963, respectively, with the most likely possibility that it was held on the evening of October 1 or October 2, 1963.

9:00 a.m. on the date of the party she and her daughter wer picked up and taken to the party by LIDIA DURAN. Also sccompanying them was Mrs. PAZ' sister, <u>DEVA GARRO DE</u> GUERRERO GAVAN. She described this sister as a Communist who was expelled from the Party for being a Catholic.

She estimated that some thirty people attended the party, described as a "twist" party, at the home of RUBEN DURAN. Upon arrival at RUBEN's home she noted what appeared to be a young American couple near the door, but they left shortly thereafter.

At about 10:30 p.m. three young, white Americans arrived at the party. They were greeted by SILVIA DURAN and spoke only to her. They more or logg isolated thenselves from the rest of the party and insofar as she observed they had no conversation with anyone else at the party.

The three Americans appeared to be between twenty-two and twenty-four years of age. One of them was dressed in a sweater and dark trousers and appeared to be about five feet nine inches in height. The second one was about six feet tall, had blond, straight hair, a long chin, and was a bit "beatnik" in appearance although his dress included a coat. The third American wore no coat.

Mrs. PAZ said the American dressed in the substor and dark trousers resembled very much press photographs of LKE HARVEY OSWALD. Her daughter agreed with this observation. Photographs of OSWALD in various poses were exhibited to both Mrs. PAZ and her daughter at the time of the interview and they were unable to make a positive identification, but claimed he very much resembled the American at the party as they recall him.

Mrs. PAZ could not state how long the three Americans remained at the party nor did she observe them when they departed. She questioned HDRACIO DURAN as to the names of the Americans, and he told her they were friends of SILVIA DURAN. He did not give her thoir names, but did tell her they wore supposed to depart Moxico City the following morning. She added that this latter was not correct inzsmuch as she and her daughter, while driving in an automobile on Insurgentes Street the following morning, observed the three Americans walking near a furniture store on that street. It is to be noted that investigation has established that LEE HARVEY OSWALD departed Mexico City by bus at 8:30 a.m. on October 2, 1963, and could not have been identical with the American allegedly observed by Mrs. PAZ at the party if this party were held on the evening of October 1 or October 2, 1963.

Mrs. PAZ was questioned regarding the identity of other persons attending the party at the RUEEN DURAN home who might have been in a position to observe the three Americans. She said that in the course of the party her daughter met a young man named "ALEJANDRO" at the party and danced with him. He was apparently quite smitten with the daughter and tried to call her on several occasions after the party. The daughter did not take the calls and as a result "ALEJANDRO" wrote several letters to the daughter. Mrs. PAZ exhibited two of these letters, as well as a business card which identified the young man as ARIO ALEJANDRO LAVAGNINI STENIUS.

An examination of the letter which Mrs. PAZ said was the first directed to her daughter by the young man disclosed that it bears the date of September 1, 1053, and was postmarked at the Mexico City Post Office on September 2, 1963.

Questioned as to whether her daughter had known the young man prior to the party at the RUBEN DURAN home, Mrs. PAZ was most insistent that she had not. When it was pointed out to her that the first letter from the young man to her daughter bore a Mexico City postmark of September 2, 1963, she commented that probably the Communists have facilities for falsifying postmarks.

On November 27, 1964, ARIO ALEJANDRO LAVAGNINI BTENIUS, Martinez de Castro No. 19, Tacubaya, Mexico, D. F., Mexico, was interviewed. He advised that he is an employee of General Electric de Mexico and recalled attending a large party sometime in the latter half of 1963 at the apartment of RUBEN DURAN located on Herodoto Street in Mexico City. He was not a friend of the DURAN family, but had been invited to the party by Mrs. ISABEL NANSON, a divorcee who was formerly married to an American and a close friend of the wife of RUBEN DURAN. An Italian friend of his, MARCELLO FABRE, was also invited to the party by Mrs. NANSON. He, Mrs. NANSON, and FABRE went to the party together.

-

LAVAGNINI recalled that there were about thirty people at the party, few of whom he knew. At the party ba met a Mexican girl who had recently returned from living in France. He was unable to fix the date of the party, but felt it was probably early in September because of a heavy rain which occurred as they were leaving the party at about 2:00 a.m.

LAVAGNINI noted no Americans procent at this party. He was familiar with the appearance of LEE HARVEY OSWALD because of publicity following the assassination of President KENNEDY, but otherwise had no knowledge of him and had never seen him except for news photographs following the assassination.

He volunteered to consult his papers and attempt to fix the date of the party. On December 2, 1964, he advised that he recalled having been at two different parties at the DURAN home, one of these being the large party at which ho had met the Mexican girl who had formerly lived in France. He was unable to fix the date of this party.

LAVAGNINI said he had questioned Mrs. NANSON and MARCELLO FABRE, and they were unable to recall the date of the party nor could they recall that any Americans had been present at the party.

Mrs. PAZ was initially interviewed on 11/17/64 by SA ROLF L. LARSON. At that time she claimed to have seen OSWALD at a party in the home of RUBEN DURAN, but was unable to specify the date. She declined to furnish her home address, but stated she could be contacted through Mexico City telephone number 40-20-57. When asked by SA LARSON as to why she had not come forward with the information sooner, she indicated that she had been afraid to do so. At that time she declined to furnish further information unless she could be assured that it would not be made public. She also stated she wanted to do some further research in an effort to fix the date of the party. Mrs. PAZ and her daughter were interviewed in the Mexico City Office on 11/24/64 by Legat CLARK D. ANDERSON and SA RICHARD S. CLARK. The stories of both were inclined to be rambling and it was difficult to pin them down on details. some of the details of the Warren Commission Report, particularly those concerning OSWALD's activities while in Mexico City.

Mrs. PAZ and her daughter readily identified photographs of the members of the DURAN family and of EUSEBIO AZCUE. Photographs of OSWALD in different poses were exhibited to them along with photographs of several individuals completely unconnected with the OSWALD case. While they picked out some of the photographs of OSWALD as resembling the American, they saw at the party in the RUBEN DURAN home, they did not make a positive identification and it is to be noted it would have been quite easy to pick out the OSWALD photographs because of the numerous press photographs of him which appeared in Mexico City newspapers following the President's assassination.

Mrs. PAZ and her daughter appeared to be somewhat Bohemian. Mrs. PAZ, herself, while denying she was ever a Communist, stated that in former years she had taken an active part in promoting agrarian reform in the State of Morelos in order that poor peasants might be granted land. She mentioned the names of numerous Mexican liberals and leftists with whom she has been acquainted in the past.

As has been mentioned, Mrs. PAZ' conversation during the interview was quite rambling and the impression was gained by the interviewing agents that she might not be completely stable. Despite her request that her identity and that of her daughter be concealed, their names have been included in the letterhead memorandum since it is felt the memorandum would have no meaning if this were not done.

On May 31, 1965, T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the identification records maintained at the Monterrey Police Department and at the Nuevo Leon State Police Department, contained no references whatsoever to the name of MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS.

On June 11, 1965, T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he made discreet neighborhood inquiries concerning MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS, and he ascertained that FONSECA is a young man, reportedly employed A CALLER AND A CAL

as a waiter, who resides with his mother at Tecate 120, Colonia Las Mitras. He said neighbors appeared to know very little about FONSECA, contending that he was antisocial and had very little contact with anyone in the neighborhood. He stated the neighbors advised him FONSECA was employed as a waiter, but no one could furnish the name of the establishment where he worked. MEX-33 said FONSECA was considered in the neighborhood to be somewhat odd.


On June 22, 1955, T-2 advised that FONSECA was not listed as a member of the waiters' union in Monterrey, and he was not known to administrative officers of the union.

On July 31, 1965, T-3, who has furnished reliable Information in the past, reported that FONSECA and his mother live alone at Tecate 120, Colonia Las Mitras, and that neither of them has much contact with neighbors. He said it was the general consensus in the neighborhood that FONSECA was not well adjusted mentally and the neighbors avoided his company in the same manner that FONSECA appeared to detach himself from them. T-3 said that while it was generally believed in the neighborhood that FONSECA was employed as a waiter, he had encountered no one who could identify the establishment in which FONSECA worked. T-3 stated that no one in the neighborhood seemed able to furnish any background information concerning FONSECA, and all those he contacted commented upon FONSECA's alleged mental condition.

On August 31, 1965, T-3 advised that he had on August 20, 1965, located and interviewed MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS at the place of his employment, the Club Reno. He said FONSECA told him he had been previously employed at the Hotel Del Parque in Cuernavaca, Morelos, Mexico, and that he had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD at that hotel accompanied by the hotel owner, ENRIQUE PEREZ BONIN, PEREZ' son ENRIQUE PEREZ SANCHO, EZEQUIEL BENEDICTO, IZQUIERDO, and two other unidentified individuals. T-3 said FONSECA alleged that the individual believed by him to have been OSWALD was royally treated at the Hotel Del Parque, all of which appeared strange to FONSECA

T-3 said FONSICA advised he had reviewed the Warren Report relating to the assassination of President KENNEDY and when he had encountered no mention of OSWALD's alleged visit to Cuernavaca, he had written a letter to Washington, D. C. He said FONSICA advised he would welcome an opportunity to disclose all he knew of OSWALD's alleged visit to Cuernavaca to a properly authorized representative of the United States Government.

T-3 advised that FONSECA expressed great bitterness toward ENRIQUE PEREZ BONIN and the Hotel Del Parque. T-3 described FONSECA as having an effeminate, waspish and vindictive manner.

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available the following information on 9/29/65.

The following people were interviewed in Cuernavaca, Morelos, Mexico: ENRIQUE PEREZ BONIN, his son ENRIQUE PEREZ SANCHO, and Attorney GUILLERMO OROPEZA. PEREZ BONIN is the owner of the Hotel Del Parque located in the principal plaza in Cuernavaca. According to PEREZ BONIN, LEE HARVEY OSWALD had never been a guest in his hotel in Cuernavaca and so far as was known was never in the city of Juernavaca. OROPEZA, PEREZ BONIN, and PEREZ SANCHO all advised that they had never seen or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD prior to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY but, of course, after the assassination of President KENNEDY, due to the wide publicity involved, they all became aware of LEE HARVEY OSWALD as the assassin of President KENNEDY. PEREZ BONIN, PEREZ SANCHO, and OROPEZA all advised that if they had had any information relating to the assassination of President KENNEDY, they would have immediately advised the United States Government.

With regard to MIGUEL FONSECA RIVAS, PEREZ BONIN advised that FONSECA had for about a year managed another hotel, the Villa Galeana, which was the property of PEREZ BONIN. This was in 1962-1963; however, PEREZ BONIN became

aware of the homosexual activities of FONSECA RIVAS and the bad manner in which he had managed the Villa Galeana Hotel in Cuervavaca and had instructed his attorney GUILLERMO OROPEZA to institute investigation of FONSECA. This investigation revealed that FONSECA RIVAS had stolen a considerable quantity of money from the Hotel. Consequently, FONSECA RIVAS was relieved of his duties at his hotel and Mr. EZEQUIEL BENEDICTO IZQUIERDO had been named as manager of the Villa Galena Hotel. This was in May, 1963, and FONSECA was brought to trial on a charge of theft of funds, was convicted, and jailed on August 22, 1963. FONSECA remained in jail for about a year thereafter before being released. FONSECA never was employed at the Hotel Del Parque.



An elderly man he knew as John Howard Bowen, who had junviously visited the CSC from time to time since April, 1965, dvised Erickson on the night of August 29, 1966, that he, Baken, was very ill as the result of premit poisoning. Erickson immediately placed Bowen in the Medical Arts Hospital, San Antonio, where he died on the night of August 31, 1966.

In going through Bowen's personal effects to locate relatives or friends to notify, Erickson discovered Bowen appeared to be using two identities.

There was a Canadian Passport #5-605377, issued October 10, 1963, at New Orleans, Louisiana, and other documents showing his name as Albart Victor Emanuel Osborne. born November 12, 1888, Grimsby, England. Osborne was described as a white male, 5'10", blue eyes, and brown-gray hair. His occupation was shown as clergyman. According to Erickson, the passport photo of Osborne is the same man he knew as Bowen. His income was derived from importing Bibles, religious bcoks, Christian literature and material from England.


