

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

There was a Canadian Passport #5-605377, issued October 10, 1963, at New Orleans, Louisiana, and other documents showing his name as Albert Victor Emanuel Osborne, born November 12, 1888, Grimsby, England. Osborne was described as a white male, 5'10", blue eyes, and brown-gray hair. His occupation was shown as clergyman. According to Erickson, the passport photo of Osborne is the same man he knew as Bowen. His income was derived from importing Bibles, religious books, Christian literature and material from England.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

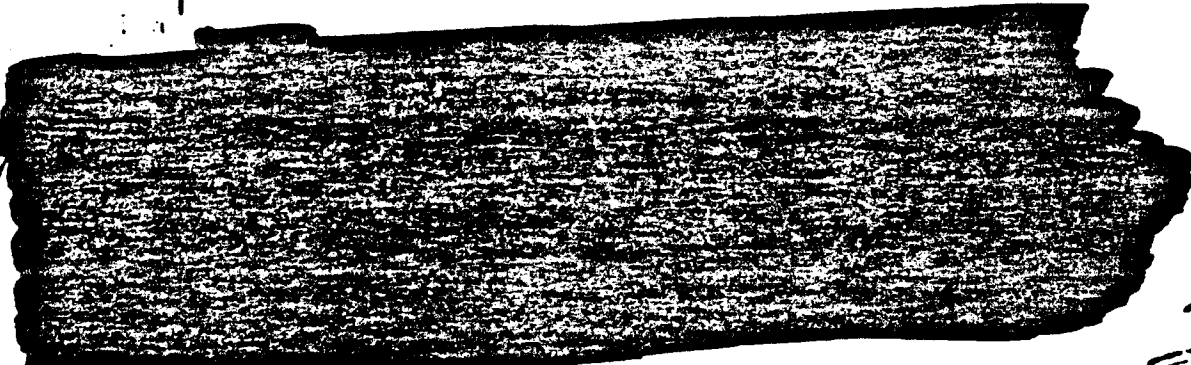

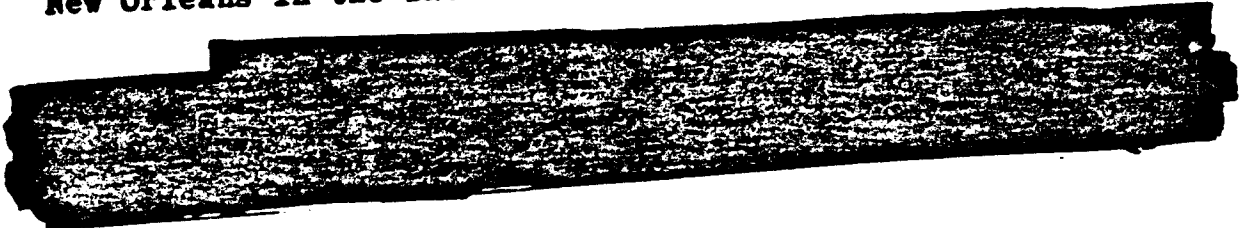

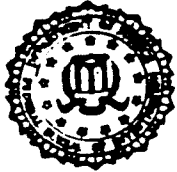

During late afternoon of 5/4/67, Mr. ROBERT STEVEN, the Administrative Assistant to the Ambassador, brought Mr. BERNARD DIEDERICH to my office. Mr. DIEDERICH is the representative in Mexico of Time-Life magazine.

Mr. DIEDERICH explained that his bureau chief at Time-Life headquarters had been pushing him on a lead previously sent down to him relative to a picture which had appeared in a previous issue of Esquire magazine in an article relating to the OSWALD case. That picture was a reproduction of one which had appeared in the Warren Report and the sub-caption was to the effect that "this was not OSWALD." The Esquire article, with which the Bureau is undoubtedly familiar, stated that this picture had been furnished to the FBI in Dallas by CIA on the day of President KENNEDY's assassination. The Time-Life bureau chief had instructed DIEDERICH to ascertain in Mexico the facts concerning this photo.

Mr. STEVEN explained that Mr. DIEDERICH felt that to satisfy his bureau chief he should make inquiries concerning this matter with the Embassy and Mr. STEVEN, therefore, brought him to my office.

Enclosed herewith are two Xerox reproductions of the Mexico City file copies of [redacted] memorandum dated 12/10/65, and the memoranda from this office to the Ambassador dated 12/27/65 and 2/23/66.

Background

[redacted] calls her, is a well known figure in Mexican political, social and literary circles. She was a playwright and well known to many officials of the Embassy including the then Ambassador FULTON FREEMAN, the then Deputy Chief of Mission CLARENCE A. BOONSTRA, and many others. All of those officials expressed to me on various occasions the opinion that [redacted] is a very interesting person and a scintillating conversationalist, but that she has a vivid imagination and frequently appears to be unable to distinguish between truth and fiction. Although interesting, they all considered her as highly unreliable as a source of information except for [redacted] who apparently placed consistent credence in what [redacted] said.

When [redacted] visited this office in November 1964, she claimed that she had seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD at a party given at the home of RUBEN DURAN on September 30, October 1, or October 2, 1963, as reported in Mexico City letterhead memorandum of 12/11/64. As previously reported, [redacted] claimed that her daughter, [redacted] who accompanied her at that party met for the [redacted] man later identified by her as [redacted]. Identification of this individual, who had [redacted]

merely been introduced at the party as [redacted] was made on the basis of correspondence received by her daughter from [redacted] after the party. [redacted] was insistent that her daughter had not met that young man prior to the party. When it was pointed out to her that the letter from [redacted] was dated 9/1/63 and postmarked 9/2/63, she merely commented that probably the communists have facilities for falsifying postmarks.

When [redacted] was interviewed, he was unable to fix the date of the party but he believed it was probably early in September and neither he nor the two acquaintances of his who accompanied him to the party could recall any Americans having been present.

On 12/10/65 while talking to former Foreign Service Officer [redacted] [redacted] claimed that the party where she had met [redacted] was held at the home of RUBEN DURAN "in September 1963, shortly after her return from abroad" as reported in [redacted] memorandum of 12/10/65.

In her conversation with [redacted] on 12/25/65 as reported in his memorandum of that date, [redacted] claimed that she believed the party was about September 2 or 3, 1963, "a few days before the visit of Soviet astronaut GAGARIN".*

Inasmuch as the Bureau is in possession of all of [redacted] memoranda concerning [redacted] story except his memorandum of 12/10/65 (his memoranda are dated the date of his conversations and not the date typed), copies of that memorandum are enclosed herewith for the completion of the Bureau's files. The Bureau will note that all the pertinent information contained therein is set forth in Mexico City cablegram of 12/17/65.

Observations

The following is submitted in response to the Bureau's request regarding my observations of [redacted] statements in his memorandum furnished to the Secretary of State:

* Mexico City newspapers show that Soviet astronaut GAGARIN was in Mexico from February 8 to 23, 1963.

(1) With regard to paragraph 3 in which he refers to his meeting with me and [REDACTED] then head of CIA, Mexico:

I first met [REDACTED] one of the officers assigned to the Political Section of the Embassy on 12/17/65, the day after I took over as Legal Attache, when [REDACTED] told me he had received a memorandum which he believed I should see. It was [REDACTED] memorandum dated 12/10/65. As originally prepared that memorandum was designated for the Ambassador, the Deputy Chief of Mission, the Political Section, Political Research (CIA), and the Central Biographic Department. He subsequently furnished this office a copy although that dissemination does not show on the Embassy file copy of his memorandum. In view of the nature of the information, [REDACTED] was asked to join [REDACTED] and me in a conference. Since the investigation of the OSWALD case had been handled by a previous Legal Attache, I remained non-committal about the allegations made by [REDACTED] but pointed out the Bureau's interest in that case. It was also pointed out to [REDACTED] that the information in his memorandum was incomplete in many respects, including the fact that [REDACTED] did not pinpoint the date of the alleged party but described it only as "in September 1963 shortly after her return from Europe". He stated that [REDACTED] was extremely reluctant to discuss the matter and doubted that she would discuss it with anyone else. He therefore volunteered to raise the subject again with her to obtain more details. He was thanked at that time for his cooperation.

(2) Regarding paragraph 5 in which [REDACTED] stated "he got no reaction from [REDACTED] regarding his memorandum of 12/25/65":

In view of the expressed interest of the Ambassador and the Deputy Chief of Mission who had received copies of [REDACTED] memoranda of 12/10 and 12/25/65 in the factualness of [REDACTED] story, they were advised by memoranda from this office dated 12/27/65 and 2/23/66, copies of which are enclosed, that in view of the fact that [REDACTED] allegations had previously been checked out without substantiation, no further action was being taken concerning her recent repetition of those allegations. Those memoranda were based on Buairtel 12/22/65 and Bulet 2/15/66. Both

memoranda were sent on a circulation basis to [redacted] superior, the Counselor for Political Affairs, who also had received a copy of [redacted] memoranda. It can only be concluded that the Counselor for Political Affairs did not route this office's memorandum of 2/23/66 to [redacted] or that [redacted] does not recall it.

(3) Regarding paragraph 6 concerning [redacted] interview with me relative to [redacted] again having changed the date of the alleged party to the end of September:

I never interviewed [redacted] alone. The first time I saw him was in the presence of [redacted]. When he visited my office I called the Agent to whom the case had been assigned to come in and sit in on the interview. I did not tell him that [redacted] had given the late September date "accurately" when she had come to the Embassy and made her first report. I did tell him that her newly revised date was the same time that she had given when she came to the Embassy in November 1964 to tell her story. The investigation conducted at that time, as reflected in Mexico City letterhead memorandum of 12/11/64, showed that the late September date was not accurate. Neither did I tell him that someone else who was at the party had stated that there were no Americans there. Frankly, although I had reviewed the file after this matter first came up in December 1965, I did not memorize all of the details and I did not recall this fact which I did not become aware of until my current review in connection with [redacted] recent allegations. Neither did I tell him that I considered the case "closed". I would not have considered it to be of concern to him whether the case was closed or not. I did tell him in response to his inquiry, that it would not be necessary for him to pursue this matter any further with [redacted] since we had heard her story before and it had been checked out without being substantiated and I therefore considered her story to be a closed issue.

(4) Regarding paragraph 9 in which [redacted] referred to Mr. ALLEN WHITE's alleged statement that the Federal Security Police' interrogation of the DURANS was unsatisfactory and comment, "This transcript may be the source of Mr. FERRIS' belief that [redacted] story had been checked out and found to be untrue".

This statement is uninformed speculation. I know nothing about Mr. WHITE's evaluation of the interrogation of the DURANS which so far as I know, had nothing to do with the story about the alleged party subsequently related by [REDACTED]. My "belief" was based on the investigation conducted by this office as reported in Mexico City letter and letterhead memorandum of 12/11/64, and the Bureau's concurring evaluation as set forth in Bureau airtel 12/22/65 and Bulet of 2/15/66.

(5) With regard to paragraph 10 in which [REDACTED] commented that "whereas the FBI has discounted [REDACTED] allegations, the CIA is still considerably disturbed by them":

I am aware of no foundations for this observation that CIA is "still considerably disturbed" by [REDACTED] story. [REDACTED] gave absolutely no indication of such reactions to me, but on the contrary indicated that he was well aware of [REDACTED] unreliability.

With regard to [REDACTED] claim that CIA may not have pressed further investigation for several reasons including "considering the sensitive overlap and subtle competition between two intelligence collection agencies, it had to yield to the FBI's jurisdiction":

This can only be described as a product of [REDACTED] imagination. During the period in question, relations between this office and CIA in Mexico were maintained on a friendly, mutually cooperative basis with respect for the authority and responsibilities of the two parent agencies. The principal function of CIA in Mexico in connection with the investigation of the OSWALD case was in checking out allegations concerning possible Cuban aspects through their established sources and confidential coverage. The remaining points covered by [REDACTED] under items 2, 3 and 4, paragraph 10, are extraneous to [REDACTED] story and appear to have been included gratuitously in his memorandum to the Secretary of State.

(6) With regard to [REDACTED] terminal comment in paragraph 13 that the records should show that a representative of a major American publication has at least some knowledge of [REDACTED] story:

MEX 105-3702

This office has no information indicating such to be a fact or that either [redacted] had given the story to such an individual or that [redacted] herself, in spite of her repeated protestations that she should not be revealed as the source of this information, had passed the story on to such an individual.

The significance is not known as to why the State Department disseminated [redacted] memorandum under the subject [redacted] investigation as [redacted] instead of under the LEE HARVEY OSWALD investigation as [redacted] captioned his memorandum.

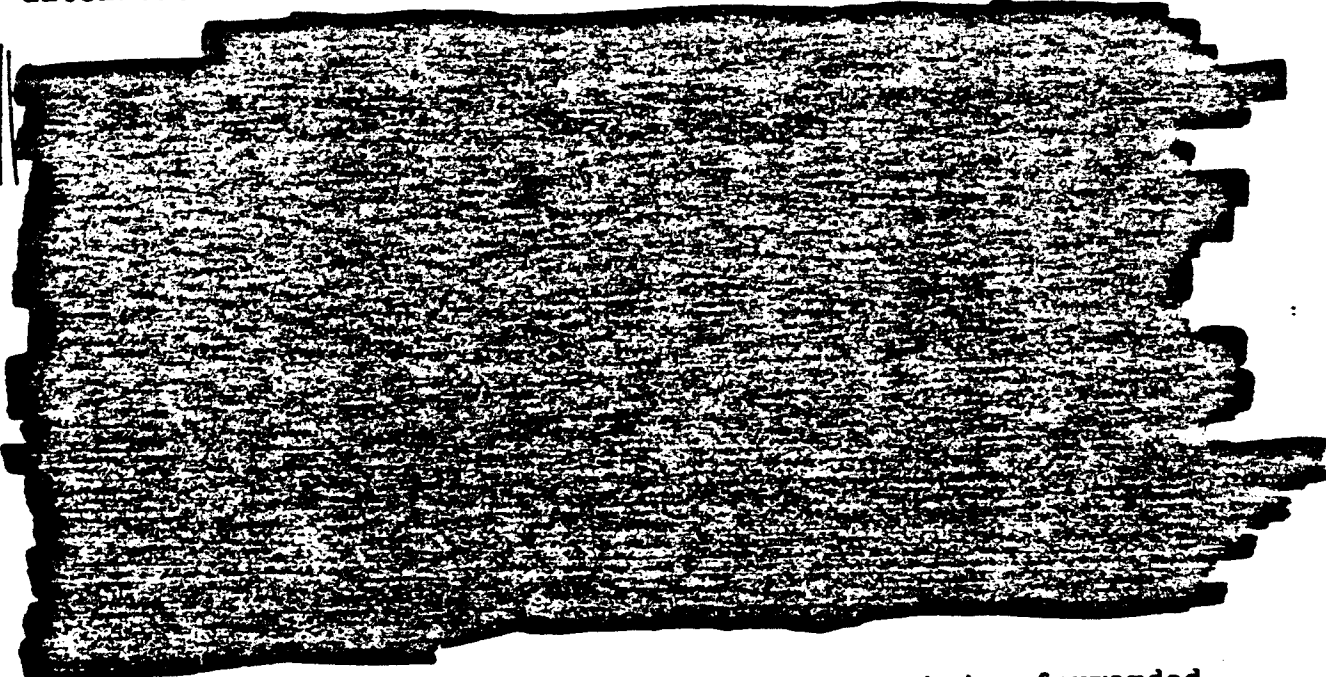
Character
It appears that [redacted] has undergone a change in attitude since his departure from Mexico which is difficult to understand. This may possibly be a reaction to his separation from Foreign Service. According to Embassy sources, [redacted] is believed to have been "selected out", a phrase used when an officer is "retired" after having been in one grade for the maximum period of time and is not considered qualified for promotion to a higher grade. This involuntary separation from the Foreign Service may account for his present attitude which otherwise is difficult to comprehend.

During the time after I took over as Legal Attache on 12/16/65 until his departure from Mexico in 1967, I and other personnel of this office had very limited contact with [redacted]. He was one of various officers assigned to the Political Section and although he was ostensibly friendly, his assignment had little in common with the work of this office and therefore our relations, both official and personal, were closer with other officers in the Political Section. The only official contact I had with him was in connection with instant matter. Although at that time he exhibited somewhat of a "detective complex" in desiring to probe into the story recounted by [redacted] he at no time demonstrated a desire to take over the OSWALD investigation from the authorized authorities.

[redacted] current attitude as set out in his letter and memorandum to the Secretary of State dated 7/25/69 is obvious from his statement, "Since I was the Embassy officer in Mexico

who acquired this intelligence information, I feel a responsibility for seeing it through to its final evaluation." It appears, therefore, that [REDACTED] has now decided that he and not the FBI or the Department of Justice is the one to decide how the story given by [REDACTED] is to be evaluated. The concept that every person who passes on to another government agency information relating to matters within the jurisdiction of that agency has the responsibility and authority to review and evaluate the action taken by that agency is, of course, untenable.

You were requested in relet to furnish your observations on the material which had been received from State Department and which was enclosed for you.

Reference is also made to telephone call from Mr. Nathan Ferris, wherein he pointed out that some of the handwriting on the State Department material was illegible. Mr. Ferris was advised an effort would be made to obtain better copies from the State Department.

Bureau Liaison has been advised by a representative of State Department that efforts to locate the original material or a more legible copy have been unproductive. The State Department representative advised that the original was prepared by [redacted] while the latter was political officer in Mexico in 1965. The State Department representative advised that the original is probably in the files of the American Embassy, Mexico City, if it has not already been destroyed. The State Department representative suggested that the Legal Attache attempt to obtain the original in the Embassy files in Mexico City. The State Department representative suggested that if the original was not in the files of the Embassy in Mexico City, the only remaining alternative would be to interview [redacted]. Bureau does not believe this warrants interview of [redacted] based on the information available to the Bureau.

██████████ a retired State Department employee formerly stationed in Mexico City at the American Embassy, furnished State Department information which he, ██████████ believed indicated the possibility of a conspiracy in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy. Bufiles reveal the allegations were investigated by Legat, Mexico City, before ██████████ ever heard of them, and determined to have no substance. We furnished the material which ██████████ gave State Department to Legat, Mexico City, for his observations. The ██████████ material was Xeroxed, and there is handwriting on the material which is illegible. Ferris asked if we could get legible copies, and Liaison Agent Rachner passed the inquiry on to Mr. Francis R. Tully, Office of Security, State Department, who furnished the information set out above.

The only remaining copies of [redacted] memoranda dated 12/10/65, 12/25/65 and 7/13/66 which are in file in the Embassy Records Section contain no handwritten notations. They are merely carbon copies and the originals of the memoranda are no longer available.

It is apparent from the copies furnished the Bureau by the State Department that [redacted] made available to the State Department reproductions of the Political Section copies of his memoranda of 12/10/65 and 7/13/66. The copy of his memorandum of 12/25/65 which he furnished to the State Department, as reproduced and made available to the Bureau by the State Department, does not indicate to whom the copy from which the reproduction was made, was designated. It is noted, however, that [redacted] made two copies of that memorandum for the Political Section where he was assigned and it would therefore appear probable that this was a reproduction of one of those copies which he may have made for his own use.

It is noted that in his memorandum furnished the Secretary of State under date of 7/25/69, [redacted] stated that he had not furnished a copy of memorandum dated 12/10/65, "to Washington". The file copies of these memoranda do not indicate he furnished copies of his other two memoranda to the State Department at the time they were written, which is logical, since they were all intra-Embassy memoranda. It would appear, therefore, that [redacted] may have taken either the Political Section copies of his memoranda of 12/10 and 12/25/65, or reproductions of those copies with him for his own personal use when he left Mexico and utilized them to make the reproductions he furnished the State Department subsequently.

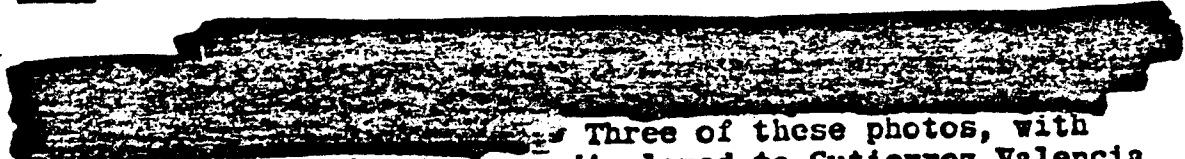

NUMBER THREE SEVEN SEVEN DATED FEBRUARY ONE FOUR, NINETEEN
SIXTY FOUR. THIS LATTER CABLE REFLECTS THE PHOTOS OF THE
UNSUB WERE SHOWN TO PEDRO GUTIERREZ VALENCIA AMONG SIXTEEN
MISCELLANEOUS PHOTOS AS MENTIONED ON PAGE NINE OF MEXICO CITY

ANSWER TO QUESTION TWO:

IT CAN ONLY BE ASSUMED AT THIS TIME THAT THE PHOTOS OF UNSUB SHOWN TOGETHER WITH THE MISCELLANEOUS PHOTOS WERE ALL RETURNED TO CIA, MEXICO CITY. THE COVER PAGE OF THE LHM DATED FEBRUARY SEVEN, NINETEEN SIXTY FOUR, REFLECTS THAT TWENTY TWO PHOTOS OF CUBAN EMBASSY EMPLOYEES WERE RETURNED TO CIA.

ANSWER TO QUESTION THREE:

THE PHOTOS FORWARDED TO CIA BY LEGAT MEMORANDUM DATED MAY FIFTEEN LAST ARE THE SAME AS FURNISHED TO THE BUREAU BY AIRTEL MAY TWENTY SIX LAST. THESE TWO CROPPED PHOTOS ARE THE ONLY ONES IN MEXICO CITY FILE THAT COULD POSSIBLY PERTAIN TO THE REQUESTED UNSUB PHOTOS AND THE UNCROPPED VERSIONS ARE NOT CONTAINED IN MEXICO CITY FILE.

AS FOR THE ORIGIN OF THESE TWO CROPPED PHOTOS, THE FILE INDICATES THEY WERE RECEIVED FROM CIA, MEXICO, ON NOVEMBER TWO THREE, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE, AND ARE PROBABLY PART OF THE SERIES OF PHOTOS TAKEN ON OCTOBER ONE, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE, AND

OCTOBER FOUR, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE, WHICH WERE BELIEVED POSSIBLY OF OSWALD BECAUSE OSWALD HAD CONTACTED THE RUSSIAN EMBASSY, MEXICO CITY, ON OCTOBER ONE, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE. THESE PHOTOS WERE FLOWN FROM MEXICO TO DALLAS BY SA ELDON RUDD ON NOVEMBER TWENTY THREE, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE, AND ARE DESCRIBED IN MEMO OF SA RUDD TO SAC, DALLAS, DATED NOVEMBER TWENTY THREE, NINETEEN SIXTY THREE.

MEXICO CITY FILE DOES NOT EXPLAIN WHY THE TWO PHOTOS OF UNSUB FURNISHED BY AIRTEL MAY TWENTY SIX LAST WERE COPIED AND RETAINED IN FILE, WHILE THE OTHERS OF THE QUOTE SERIES UNQUOTE WERE NOT COPIED AND RETAINED. LIKEWISE, THE FILE DOES NOT SPECIFY THAT TWO PHOTOS SUBMITTED WERE THOSE SHOWN TO GUTIERREZ OR WHETHER OTHER PHOTOS OF THE SERIES WERE SHOWN, THROUGH MEXICO CITY CABLE THREE SEVEN SEVEN SUPPORTS SHOWING OF SOME OF THE SERIES, VERY PROBABLY THOSE FURNISHED THE BUREAU SINCE THEY WERE THE ONLY ONES RETAINED IN THE ONE A SECTION WHEN PHOTOS WERE SHOWN TO GUTIERREZ ON JANUARY TWENTY NINE, NINETEEN SIXTY FOUR.

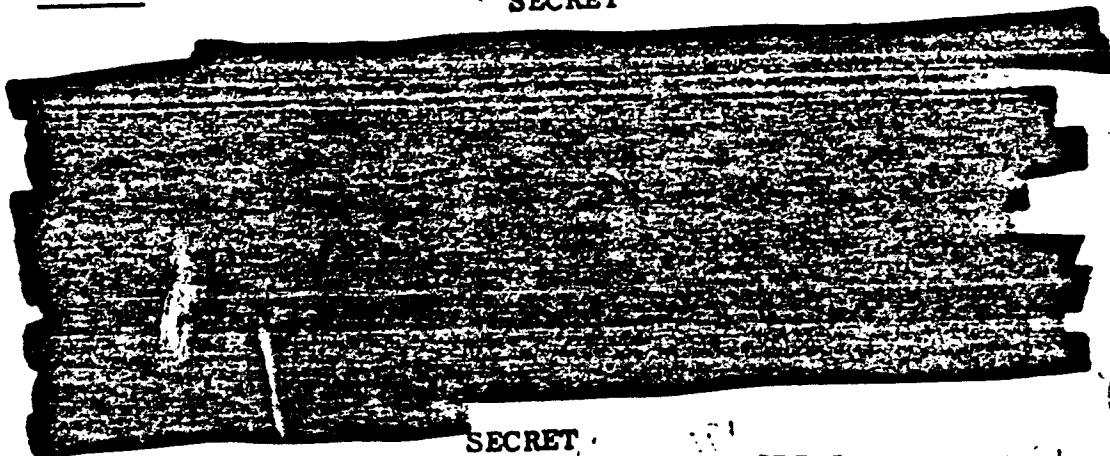

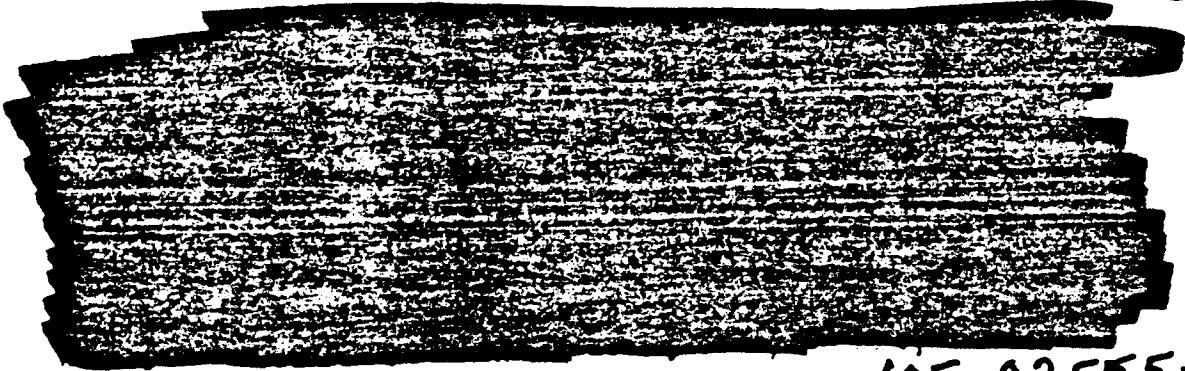
